COMPLAINT

1. Citizens for Responsibility and Ethics in Washington, Melanie Sloan, John Clark and Jan Peterson bring this complaint before the Federal Election Commission ("FEC") seeking an immediate investigation and enforcement action against Musgrave for Congress and Brent Eskew, Treasurer, for direct and serious violations of the Federal Election Campaign Act ("FECA")

Complainants

2. Complainant CREW is a non-profit corporation, organized under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. CREW is committed to protecting the right of citizens to be informed about the activities of government officials and to ensuring the integrity of government officials. CREW is dedicated to empowering citizens to have an influential voice in government decisions and in the governmental decision-making process. CREW uses a combination of research, litigation, and advocacy to advance its mission.

3. In furtherance of its mission, CREW seeks to expose unethical and illegal conduct of those involved in government. One way CREW does this is by educating citizens regarding the integrity of the electoral process and our system of government. Toward this end, CREW monitors the campaign finance activities of those who run for federal office and publicizes those who violate federal campaign finance laws. Through its website, press releases and other methods of distribution, CREW also files complaints

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with the FEC when it discovers campaign finance violations of the FECA. Publicizing campaign finance violators and filing complaints with the FEC serves CREW's mission of keeping the public informed about the individuals and entities who violate campaign finance law and deterring future violations of campaign finance law.

4. In order to assess whether an individual, candidate, political committee or other regulated entity is complying with federal campaign finance law, CREW needs the information contained in receipts and disbursements reports that political committees must file pursuant to the FECA, 2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(2); 11 C.F.R. § 104.1. CREW is hindered in its programmatic activity when an individual, candidate, political committee or other regulated entity fails to disclose campaign finance information in reports of receipts and disbursements required by the FECA.

5. CREW relies on the FEC's proper administration of the FECA's reporting requirements because the FECA-mandated reports of receipts and disbursements are the only source of information CREW can use to determine if a candidate, political committee or other regulated entity is complying with the FECA. The proper administration of the FECA's reporting requirements includes mandating that all reports of receipts and disbursements required by the FECA are properly and timely filed with the FEC. CREW is hindered in its programmatic activity when the FEC fails to properly administer the FECA's reporting requirements.

6. Complainant Melanie Sloan is the executive director of Citizens for Responsibility and Ethics in Washington, a citizen of the United States and a registered voter and resident of the District of Columbia. John Clark is a citizen of the United States and a registered voter and resident of the 4th Congressional District of Colorado.

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Jan Peterson is a citizen of the United States and a registered voter and resident of the 4th Congressional District of Colorado. As registered voters, Ms. Sloan, Mr. Clark and Mr. Peterson are entitled to receive information contained in reports of receipts and disbursements required by the FECA, 2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(2); 11 C.F.R. § 104.1. Ms. Sloan, Mr. Clark and Mr. Peterson are harmed when a candidate, political committee or other regulated entity fails to report campaign finance activity as required by the FECA. See FEC v. Akins, 524 U.S. 11, 19 (1998), quoting Buckley v. Valeo, 424 US 1, 66-67 (political committees must disclose contributors and disbursements to help voters understand who provides which candidates with financial support). Ms. Sloan, Mr. Clark and Mr. Peterson are further harmed when the FEC fails to properly administer the FECA's reporting requirements, limiting their ability to review campaign finance information.

Respondents

7. Marilyn Musgrave is a member of Congress representing the 4th congressional district of Colorado. Musgrave for Congress is the principal campaign committee for Rep. Musgrave's 2006 campaign. Brent Eskew is the treasurer of Musgrave for Congress, and served as treasurer at the time of the events described in this complaint.

Factual Allegations

8. On August 8, 2006, the FEC asked Musgrave for Congress to provide additional information regarding the identity of the contributors included in its July Quarterly Report or, alternatively, to demonstrate that Musgrave for Congress engaged in "best efforts" to secure the identity of all contributors during the reporting period. Letter

from Jennifer E. Pittman, Senior Campaign Finance Analyst, FEC to Brent Eskew, Treasurer Musgrave for Congress (August 8, 2006) (attached as Exhibit A). The FEC set a date of September 8, 2006 for Musgrave for Congress to respond. Id. at 1. Musgrave for Congress submitted an amended July Quarterly Report on September 8, 2006. Musgrave for Congress, FEC Form 3, September 8, 2006 (attached as Exhibit B).

9. On November 30, 2006, the FEC asked Musgrave for Congress to provide additional information reporting the identity of the contributors included in its October Quarterly Report or, alternatively, to demonstrate that Musgrave for Congress engaged in “best efforts” to secure the identity of all contributors during the reporting period. Letter from Jennifer E. Pittman, Senior Campaign Finance Analyst, FEC to Brent Eskew, Treasurer Musgrave for Congress (November 30, 2006) (attached as Exhibit C). At the same time, the FEC notified Musgrave for Congress that it had failed to file 48-hour notices with the FEC for five contributions received during the reporting period. Id. at 2. Further, the FEC informed the campaign committee that it is subject to civil and criminal penalties for failing to file the 48-hour notices, and that it should amend the original report. Id. The FEC set a date of January 2, 2007 for the campaign committee to respond. Id. at 1. On February 1, 2007, Musgrave for Congress responded to the FEC request, stating that it was unable to fully identify some contributors because of a “data error” and that the contributions that should have been disclosed in 48-hour reports had been “overlooked.” Letter from Amy Carlson, Musgrave for Congress to Jennifer E. Pittman, Senior Campaign Finance Analyst, FEC (February 1, 2007) (attached as Exhibit D).

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10. Also, on November 30, 2006, the FEC asked Musgrave for Congress to provide additional information regarding the identity of its contributors in its 12 Day Pre-General Report or, alternatively, to demonstrate that the campaign committee engaged in “best efforts” to secure the identity of all contributors during the reporting period. Letter from Jennifer E. Pittman, Senior Campaign Finance Analyst, FEC to Brent Eskew, Treasurer Musgrave for Congress (November 30, 2006) (attached as Exhibit E). The FEC set a date of January 2, 2007 for the campaign committee to respond. Id. at 1. Musgrave for Congress submitted an amended 12 Day Pre-General Report on February 5, 2007. Musgrave for Congress, FEC Form 3, February 5, 2007 (attached as Exhibit F).

11. On January 9, 2007, the FEC asked Musgrave for Congress to provide additional information regarding the identity of its contributors in its 30 Day Post-General Report or, alternatively, to demonstrate that Musgrave for Congress engaged in “best efforts” to secure the identity of all contributors during the reporting period. Letter from Jennifer E. Pittman, Senior Campaign Finance Analyst, FEC to Brent Eskew, Treasurer Musgrave for Congress (January 9, 2007) (attached as Exhibit G). At the same time, the FEC notified Musgrave for Congress that it had failed to file a 48-hour notice with the FEC for one contribution received during the reporting period. Id. at 2. Further, the FEC notified the campaign committee that it is subject to civil and criminal penalties for failing to file the 48-hour notice, and that it should amend the original report. Id. The FEC set a date of February 9, 2007 for the campaign committee to respond. Id. at 1. Musgrave for Congress submitted an amended 30 Day Post-General Report on February 7, 2007. Musgrave for Congress, FEC Form 3, February 7, 2007 (attached as Exhibit H).

COUNT I

12. The FECA requires political committees to file reports of receipts and disbursements signed by the committee's treasurer. 2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(2); 11 C.F.R. § 104.1. Those reports must include any itemized contributions from persons other than committees, including contributions from individuals in excess of \$200. 2 U.S.C. § 434(b); 11 C.F.R. § 104.3(a)(4)(i).

13. The FECA requires political committees to file quarterly reports no later than the 15th day following the close of the immediately preceding calendar quarter. 2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(2)(A)(iii); 11 C.F.R. § 104.5(a)(1)(i).

14. The FECA requires political committees to file pre-election reports no later than 12 days before any primary or general election in which a candidate seeks election. 2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(2)(A)(i); 11 C.F.R. § 104.5(a)(2)(i)(A).

15. The FECA requires political committees to file post-general election reports no later than 30 days after any general election in which a candidate seeks election. 2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(2)(A)(ii); 11 C.F.R. § 104.5(a)(2)(ii)(A).

16. In its July Quarterly Report, its October Quarterly Report, its 12 Day Pre-General Report and its 30 Day Post-General Report, Musgrave for Congress has repeatedly and systematically failed to disclose its 2006 general election contributors to the FEC prior to the relevant filing deadlines. Musgrave for Congress has also flouted FEC authority by filing an amended 12 Day Pre-General Report on February 5, 2007, over a month after the FEC's January 2, 2007 deadline. See Exhibit F. By failing to properly disclose its contributors, Musgrave for Congress is in violation of 2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(2).

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COUNT II

17. The FECA requires political committees that receive contributions in excess of \$1,000 between two and twenty days prior to an election to notify the FEC in writing within 48 hours. 2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(6)(A); 11 C.F.R. § 104.5(f).

18. Musgrave for Congress masked the identities of large last-minute contributors by failing to file 48-hour contribution notices in violation of 2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(6)(A).

CONCLUSION

WHEREFORE, complainants request that the Federal Election Commission conduct an investigation into these allegations, declare the respondents to have violated federal campaign finance laws, demand that respondents submit amended reports of receipts and disbursements to report all expenditures, contributions and the identities of contributors as required by the FECA, impose sanctions appropriate to these violations and take such further action, as may be appropriate.

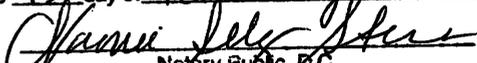

This letter is prompted by the Commission's preliminary review of the report(s) referenced above. This notice requests information essential to full public disclosure of your federal election campaign finances. An adequate response must be received at the Commission by the response date noted above. An itemization of the information needed follows:

-Commission Regulations require that a committee disclose the identification of all individuals who contribute in excess of \$200 in an election cycle. (11 CFR § 104.3(a)(4)(i)) Identification for an individual is defined as the full name (initials are not acceptable), complete mailing address, occupation and name of employer. (11 CFR § 100.12) Your report discloses contributions from individuals for which the identification is not complete.

You must provide the missing information, or if you are unable to do so, you must demonstrate that "best efforts" have been used to obtain the information. To establish "best efforts," you must provide the Commission with a detailed description of your procedures for requesting the information. Establishing "best efforts" is a three-fold process.

First, your original solicitation must include a clear and conspicuous request for the contributor information and must inform the contributor of the requirements of federal law for the reporting of such information. (11 CFR § 104.7(b)(1)) See 11 CFR § 104.7(b)(1)(B) for examples of acceptable statements regarding the requirements of federal law.

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Second, if the information is not provided, you must make one follow-up, stand alone effort to obtain this information, regardless of whether the contribution(s) was solicited or not. This effort must occur no later than 30 days after receipt of the contribution and may be in the form of a request via mail, e-mail or telephone documented in writing. (11 CFR § 104.7(b)(2)) Follow-up requests should be done, if necessary. These requests must be documented clearly in the form of written records. The requests must:

- clearly ask for the missing information, without soliciting a contribution;
- inform the contributor of the requirements of federal law for the reporting of such information, and
- if the request is written, include a pre-addressed post card or return envelope.

Third, if you receive contributor information after the contribution(s) has been reported, you should either a) file with your next regularly scheduled report, an amended memo Schedule A listing all the contributions for which additional information was received; or b) file on or before your next regularly scheduled reporting date, amendments to the report(s) originally disclosing the contribution(s). (11 CFR § 104.7(b)(4))

Please amend your report to provide the missing information and a detailed description of your procedures for requesting the information. For more information on demonstrating "best efforts," please refer to the Campaign Guide for Congressional Committees and Candidates.

-Commission Regulations define the term "purpose" to mean a brief statement or description of why a disbursement was made. Examples are "dinner expense", "media", "salary", "polling", "travel", "party fees", "phone banks", "travel expenses", "travel expense reimbursement" and "catering costs". Examples of election day and voter registration activity include "exit polling", "door-to-door get out the vote", "get out the vote phone calls" and "driving voters to the polls". Unacceptable descriptions, which require additional clarification, include but are not limited to "advance", "consulting", "commission", "contract labor", "retainer", "election day expense", "expenses", "invoice", "support", "expense reimbursement", "miscellaneous", "professional services", "get-out-the-vote", "voter registration". (11 CFR § 104.3(b)(4)(A)) Please

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amend Schedule B of your report to correct the descriptions that do not meet the requirements of the Regulations.

Please note you will not receive an additional notice from the Commission on this matter. Adequate responses received on or before this date will be taken into consideration in determining whether audit action will be initiated. Requests for extensions of time in which to respond will not be considered. Failure to provide an adequate response by this date may result in an audit of the committee. Failure to comply with the provisions of the Act may also result in an enforcement action against the committee. Any response submitted by your committee will be placed on the public record and will be considered by the Commission prior to taking enforcement action.

Electronic filers must file amendments (to include statements, designations and reports) in an electronic format and must submit an amended report in its entirety, rather than just those portions of the report that are being amended. -Schedule A of your report indicates that your committee may have failed to file one or more of the required 48 hour notices regarding "last minute" contributions received by your committee after the close of books for the Amended 12 Day Pre-Primary report (see attached). A principal campaign committee must notify the Commission, in writing, within 48 hours of any contribution of \$1,000 or more received between two and twenty days before an election. These contributions are then reported on the next report required to be filed by the committee. To ensure that the Commission is notified of last minute contributions of \$1,000 or more to your campaign, it is recommended that you review your procedures for checking contributions received during the aforementioned time period. The failure to file 48-hour notices may result in civil money penalties or legal

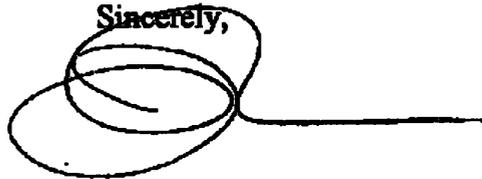
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enforcement action. If any contribution of \$1,000 or more was incorrectly reported, you must amend your original report with the clarifying information. (11 CFR § 104.5(f))

Please note you will not receive an additional notice from the Commission on this matter. Adequate responses received on or before this date will be taken into consideration in determining whether audit action will be initiated. Requests for extensions of time in which to respond will not be considered. Failure to provide an adequate response by this date may result in an audit of the committee. We will be amending our report to include some missing information, including missing first names that were reported as initials. At times, we are unable to obtain the information but due to a data error, some donors were reported with only a first initial.

You also had questions regarding our 48 Hour notices. Donations made by Time Trumble (7/30/2006) and Andres Fanjul (7/29/2006) were made via our website by credit card. The donations were simply overlooked. We will review our procedures for reporting during the 48 Hour periods to ensure this does not happen again. The donation from Build PAC of the National Association of Home Builders was incorrectly reported to be received on 7/24/2006 however the check, while dated 7/24/2006, was received in our office on 9/06/2006. A check reported from the Growth and Prosperity PAC was actually a check made out to another Committee but received in our office. The check was forwarded to the correct Committee but was entered in error. No donation should have been reported. Lastly, the In-Kind donation form the SBA List Candidates Fund was not known to us until August 30 when the SBA List Candidates Fund notified us of the expenditure.

The Musgrave for Congress campaign takes seriously the requirements of federal law to report all required information. Our best efforts are made to acquire and report all required information. Thank you for your efforts and your assistance.

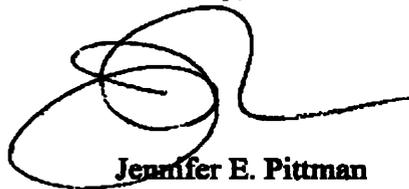
