I. Factual Background

I am writing regarding the Federal Election Commission ("FEC") filings by Jim King, whose principal campaign committee is Jim King for Congress. King has filed a statement of candidacy and federal reports for the Fifth Congressional District in Florida. I am deeply concerned by Mr. King's FEC reports and his apparent refusal to comply with federal regulations and your directives.

King filed his October 2007 Quarterly Report with a letter stating that the campaign received contributions totaling \$35,900 from over 1,400 people in an amount less than \$50. As such, the campaign was not required to itemize any contributors or contributions. Similarly, King's 2007 Year-End Report discloses receiving contributions in the amount of \$11,035.00, yet only \$900.00 of this amount was itemized.

Moreover, I have to wonder if Mr. King is making a mockery of the FEC disclosure process. His April 2008 Quarterly report shows that he has an absurd amount of \$1,948,658. If Mr. King would file electronically, perhaps his FEC reports would be accurate and less confusing. More seriously though is the fact that he shows contributions of \$7,750.00, of which only a mere \$1,000 is itemized.

II. Potential Violations

FEC law clearly states that amounts over \$200 need to be itemized with name, address, occupation, and employer. It is beyond dubious that a candidate for congress can raise \$54,685.00 (not over \$1.9 million as his April 2008 Quarterly reports) and yet only itemize \$1,900.00. It is ridiculous to believe that Mr. King has so many small donors, and so few large donors, that itemizing his contributions is unnecessary. Does Mr. King honestly believe that he can get away with this fraudulent activity?

Even more disturbing is the fact that Mr. King bypasses FEC regulations regarding electronic filings. Committees that receive \$50,000 in any given calendar year must file all reports electronically. As of this date, Mr. King has not filed with the FEC electronically. King has the audacity to continue to ignore federal law, even when the FEC shut down his 2000 campaign account in 2006 after countless failure to file notices.

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This is not Mr. King's first time as a candidate, nor is it his first time violating campaign laws. After a disastrous running in the 2000 election, where failure to file notices flowed as freely as his non-itemized contributions, is it not time for Mr. King to begin following the law?

III. Conclusion

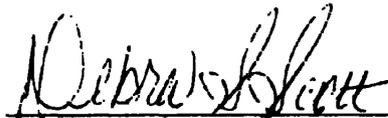
It seems that Mr. King intends to evade transparency and disclosure and has gone so far as to file fraudulent reports. Voters cannot trust the veracity of the campaign finance system if you allow this situation to remain unaddressed. I take Florida and Federal election law very seriously and I only want to see campaigns of the highest integrity conducted in my county. I am asking that you further investigate these claims, see that no fraud exists, and issue the proper remedies without delay.

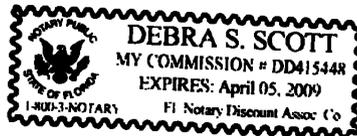
