Dear Mr. Baran:

On August 19, 2009, the Federal Election Commission (FEC/Commission) received a *sua sponte* submission from Verizon Communication Inc. Good Government Club and Taylor Craig, Treasurer admitting to certain violations of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended.

After considering the circumstances of this matter, the Commission has determined to exercise its prosecutorial discretion and take no action against the Respondents, Verizon Communication Inc. Good Government Club and Taylor Craig, Treasurer. In its memorandum to the Commission, dated October 5, 2009, this office stated:

Summary:

In this case, Verizon Communication Inc. Good Government Club and Taylor Craig, Treasurer (Respondents or the Committee) filed a *sua sponte* submission, acknowledging certain administrative errors discovered during an internal audit of the Committee's financial activity. The Committee contends that it took immediate action following a voluntary five year reconciliation of its bank account to the reports filed with the FEC. The matter should be dismissed and no further Commission resources expended because, following the discovery of the errors, Respondents filed amended reports to disclose the errors and omissions which corrected the record, and took significant steps to revise and strengthen their financial procedures.


Accordingly, the Commission closed its file in this matter on October 14, 2009.

The FEC is obligated by federal regulations to make a finding to terminate its proceedings public, as well as the basis therefore. 11 C.F.R. § 111.20(b). In addition, the Commission will also place on the record copies of the complaint, correspondence exchanged between Respondents and the Commission, and reports prepared for the Commission by this office to assist in its consideration of this matter. Accordingly, copies of documents relative to this matter will be forwarded shortly to the FEC's Public Information Office.

The Act allows a complainant to seek judicial review of the Commission's dismissal of this action. See 2 U.S.C. § 437g(a)(8).
