OPEIU JB Moss Voice Of The Electorate (Vote) and Mary Mahoney, Treasurer

Dear Ms. Mahoney:

The Federal Election Commission (FEC or Commission) referred a compliance issue to the FEC's Alternative Dispute Resolution Office (ADR Office) for processing. The referral by Audit Division (Audit) was based on a review of reports filed by OPEIU JB Moss Voice Of The Electorate which reflect a possible failure to comply with the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended

The FEC established the ADR Program to provide an informal means for resolving matters that come before the Commission and to facilitate negotiations directly with OPEIU JB Moss Voice Of The Electorate (Vote) and Mary Mahoney, Treasurer (Respondents or the Committee). The ADR Program provides Respondents with an opportunity to negotiate settlement of a matter that is mutually agreeable. The negotiations occur prior to any Commission consideration of whether there is reason to believe a violation has occurred. If negotiations are successful, the resulting settlement would conclude the matter.

The Commission, in referring the matter to the ADR Office, determined that the case is eligible for processing in the ADR program. If Respondents decide to participate in the ADR Program, you must: 1) indicate in writing a willingness to have your case submitted for ADR processing; 2) agree to participate in the bilateral interest based negotiations; and 3) waive the statute of limitations while the matter is being processed under the FEC's ADR program.

The issues referred to the ADRO, and the focus of our subsequent negotiations are summarized as follows:

Audit referred the OPEIU JB Moss Voice of the Electorate (formerly known as the Office and Professional Employees International Union – Voice of the Electorate) and Mary Mahoney, Treasurer (Respondents or the Committee) for underreporting disbursements by \$171,938 during calendar years 2007-2008. Audit determined that a major portion of the underreporting occurred during the Committee's Post-General reporting period for

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2008. In addition, Respondents discovered the problem, and on their own initiative, filed amended reports which materially corrected the underreporting.

If after reviewing this letter and the enclosed ADR Frequently Asked Questions, which describe the ADR program, Respondent(s) would like this case selected for ADR processing, you need to affirmatively indicate that on the enclosed Commitment to Submit Matter to ADR form. **Failure to respond affirmatively within fifteen (15) business days of receipt of this letter will be taken as a notice of disinterest in the program and your case will be dropped from further consideration for ADR.** In that event, your case will be sent to the FEC's Office of General Counsel for further processing, and the likelihood that the Committee will be audited during the next election cycle will increase.
