Ms. Dillenseger:

Thank you for your call. In this email and a subsequent one that you are about to receive, I am providing you with the information we discussed.

As I explained, on January 31 OneAmerica Votes filed (or at least believed it filed) a Year-End and a 3rd Quarter report of its independent expenditures (Form 5). As you will see from the emails (one below and the other in the next email you will receive), OneAmerica Votes attempted to file the forms by fax (as permitted under the Commission's rules) and did so using an email-to-fax tool ("faxmail"). OneAmerica Votes apparently uses this tool to send faxes on a regular basis without problems, and it thus believed the faxes with the filings had been received by Commission when sent.

Now, however, given that those filings don't appear in the Commission's disclosure database and that you've been unable to track them down, it appears that something has gone awry. As you suggest, I will contact RAD and/or the Information Division to figure out the best way to make sure that these forms actually make it into the disclosure system. In the meantime, the two reports are attached to these two emails (the 3rd quarter report on this email and the year-end on the next), so at least you will be able to continue your review while I work with your colleagues on resolving the filing problem.

Regarding Washington CAN, the organization did not, apparently, file a Year-End Form 5. The organization's executive director is out this week, and I hope to have more information for you about this next week. If it turns out that the organization should have filed the report, I will work with the organization to get it filed (with a copy to you) promptly.

Regarding the information you requested about overall spending by the organizations, the total 2010 expenditures for the two organizations were as follows:

OneAmerica Votes: \$142,217
 Washington CAN: \$1,555,857

You had also asked about the status of the complaint against OneAmerica Votes that was filed with the Washington State Public Disclosure Commission. The organization's in-state counsel is handling the matter for the organization and had an initial contact with the PDC soon after the complaint was filed. Since then, neither the organization nor its local counsel have heard anything further about the matter from the PDC. It is, as far as we know, still pending.

I will be back in touch when I have further information about Washington CAN and its compliance with reporting requirements. (As noted, I expect that to happen next week.) In the meantime, please let me know if I can provide any further information to help resolve this matter.
