



On January 31, 2011, the Committee amended their 2010 30 Day Post-General report, originally filed on December 2, 2010, to disclose \$7,990.50 in additional disbursements. On April 20, 2011, the Committee amended their 2011 March Monthly Report, originally filed on March 18, 2011, to disclose \$5,000 in previously undisclosed disbursements. On July 20, 2011, the Committee amended their 2011 June Monthly Report, originally filed on June 20, 2011, to disclose \$5,561.50 in receipts omitted from the original report. On December 6, 2012, the Committee amended their 2012 October Monthly Report, originally filed on October 20, 2012, to disclose \$91,473.79 in additional disbursements. On December 2, 2011, the Committee also amended their 2012 12 Day Pre-General Report, originally filed on October 25, 2012, to disclose \$23,046.78 in disbursements not included on the original report.

If after reviewing this letter and the enclosed ADR Frequently Asked Questions, which describe the ADR program, Respondent(s) would like to participate in ADR processing, you need to affirmatively indicate that on the enclosed Commitment to Submit Matter to ADR form. **Failure to respond affirmatively within fifteen (15) business days of receipt of this letter will be taken as a notice of disinterest in the program and your case will be dropped from further consideration for ADR.** In that event, your case will be sent to the FEC's Office of General Counsel for further processing, and the likelihood that the Committee will be audited during the next election cycle will increase.
