Dear Mr. Gill:

The Federal Election Commission (FEC or Commission) referred a compliance issue to the FEC's Alternative Dispute Resolution Office (ADR Office) for processing. The referral by the Reports Analysis Division (RAD) was based on a review of reports filed by the University of Hawaii Professional Assembly which reflect a possible failure to comply with the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended.

The FEC established the ADR Program to provide an informal means for resolving matters that come before the Commission and to facilitate negotiations directly with the University of Hawaii Professional Assembly and Robert V. Cooney, Treasurer (Respondents or the Committee). The ADR Program provides Respondents with an opportunity to negotiate settlement of a matter that is mutually agreeable. The negotiations occur prior to any Commission consideration of whether there is reason to believe a violation has occurred. If negotiations are successful, the resulting settlement concludes the matter.

The Commission, in referring the matter to the ADR Office, determined that the case is eligible for processing in the ADR program. If Respondents decide to participate in the ADR Program, you must: 1) indicate in writing a willingness to have your case submitted for ADR processing; 2) agree to participate in the bilateral interest based negotiations; and 3) waive the statute of limitations while the matter is being processed under the FEC's ADR program.

The issues referred to the ADRO, and the focus of our subsequent negotiations, are summarized as follows:

SUMMARY: RAD referred the University of Hawaii Professional Assembly and Robert V. Cooney, Treasurer for not disclosing all financial transactions on the Committee's 2012 July Quarterly Report and 2012 12 Day Pre-Primary Report. The Committee filed the original 2012 July Quarterly Report on July 15, 2014. An amended 2012 July

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Quarterly Report was filed on December 13, 2012 to reflect additional receipts of \$67,699.68. The Committee filed its original 2012 12 Day Pre-Primary Report on July 30, 2012. An amended 2012 12 Day Pre-Primary Report was filed on December 14, 2012 to disclose additional receipts of \$151,507. Respondents contend in a miscellaneous electronic message that the omissions were inadvertent, and occurred due to a lack of familiarity with the filing process.

If after reviewing this letter and the enclosed ADR Frequently Asked Questions, which describe the ADR program, Respondents would like to participate in ADR processing, you need to affirmatively indicate that on the enclosed Commitment to Participate in ADR form. **Failure to respond affirmatively within fifteen (15) business days of receipt of this letter will be taken as a notice of disinterest in the program and your case will be dropped from further consideration for ADR.** In that event, your case will be sent to the FEC's Office of General Counsel for further processing, and the likelihood that the Committee will be audited during the next election cycle will increase.
