Dear Ms. Vann:

The Federal Election Commission (FEC or Commission) referred a compliance issue to the FEC's Alternative Dispute Resolution Office (ADR Office) for processing. The referral by the Reports Analysis Division (RAD) was based on a review of reports filed by All Citizens for Mississippi which reflect a possible failure to comply with the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended.

The FEC established the ADR Program to provide an informal means for resolving matters that come before the Commission and to facilitate negotiations directly with All Citizens for Mississippi and Jacqueline Vann, Treasurer (Respondents or the Committee). The ADR Program provides Respondents with an opportunity to negotiate settlement of a matter that is mutually agreeable. The negotiations occur prior to any Commission consideration of whether there is reason to believe a violation has occurred. If negotiations are successful, the resulting settlement would conclude the matter.

The Commission, in referring the matter to the ADR Office, determined that the case is eligible for processing in the ADR program. If Respondents decide to participate in the ADR Program, you must: 1) indicate in writing a willingness to have your case submitted for ADR processing; 2) agree to participate in the bilateral interest based negotiations; and 3) waive the statute of limitations while the matter is being processed under the FEC's ADR program.

The issues referred to the ADRO, and the focus of our subsequent negotiations are summarized as follows:

RAD referred All Citizens for Mississippi and Jacqueline Vann, Treasurer (Respondents or the Committee) for failing to timely file four (4) 24-Hour Reports totaling \$26,775.71 to support five (5) independent expenditures disclosed on the 2014 July Quarterly Report.

On January 12, 2015, the Committee filed a Miscellaneous Electronic Submission (Form 99) in response to a Request for Additional Information and explained that the errors occurred due to the inexperience of the person preparing the report.
