Dear Eleanor Collinson:

The Federal Election Commission (FEC or Commission) referred a compliance issue to the FEC's Alternative Dispute Resolution Office (ADR Office) for processing. The referral by the Reports Analysis Division was based on a review of reports filed by Legislative Majority PAC which reflect a possible failure to comply with the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended.

The FEC established the ADR Program to provide an informal means for resolving matters that come before the Commission and to facilitate negotiations directly with Legislative Majority PAC and Eleanor Collinson, Treasurer (Respondents or the Committee). The ADR Program provides Respondents with an opportunity to negotiate settlement of a matter that is mutually agreeable. The negotiations occur prior to any Commission consideration of whether there is reason to believe a violation has occurred. If negotiations are successful, the resulting settlement would conclude the matter.

The Commission, in referring the matter to the ADR Office, determined that the case is eligible for processing in the ADR program. If Respondents decide to participate in the ADR Program, you must: 1) indicate in writing a willingness to have your case submitted for ADR processing; 2) agree to participate in the bilateral interest based negotiations; and 3) waive the statute of limitations while the matter is being processed under the FEC's ADR program.

The issues referred to the ADRO, and the focus of our subsequent negotiations are summarized as follows:

RAD referred Legislative Majority PAC and Eleanor Collinson, Treasurer (Respondents for the Committee) for failing to disclose all financial activity on its 2017 Mid-Year Report, filed July 31, 2017. On January 25, 2019, the Committee filed an Amended 2017 Mid-Year Report including \$363,767.47 in additional receipts and \$348,033.94 in additional disbursements.

The Committee filed a Form 99 (Miscellaneous Electronic Submission) on September 19, 2018 stating that the failure to disclose all financial activity was a result of a comprehensive review of past filings completed by the Committee dating back to 2016 and explained that it had filed the amendments to correct the public record. The Committee later filed an additional Form 99 (Miscellaneous Electronic Submission) on January 25, 2019 further clarifying that the Committee's reconciliation process had uncovered certain debts reported after the 2016 General Election that were based on estimates and outlined the discrepancies between the originally reported debts and subsequent payments.

If after reviewing this letter and the enclosed ADR Frequently Asked Questions, which describe the ADR program, Respondent(s) would like to participate in ADR processing, you need to affirmatively indicate that on the enclosed Commitment to Submit Matter to ADR form. **Failure to respond affirmatively within fifteen (15) business days from the date of this letter will be taken as a notice of disinterest in the program and your case will be dropped from further consideration for ADR.** In that event, your case will be sent to the FEC's Office of General Counsel for further processing, and the likelihood that the Committee will be audited during the next election cycle will increase.
