As New York Speakers Bureau, Inc, is David Duke's exclusive representative for speaking engagements, I am writing to request a 20-day expedited advisory opinion regarding an invitation to Mr. Duke from Vanderbilt University to speak on their campus in February, 1992 Mr Duke would speak on the history of Affirmative Action in America and its possible repercussions if similar policies were implemented in developing nations For many years Mr Duke's primary source of income has been derived from the lecture circuit

Mr Duke's speech would contain no mention of his candidacy, no mention of any of the other candidates, and no requests for campaign contributions or support Mr Duke has been offered an honorarium, and travel expenses, which he would receive as personal income Said fees would not be used for any purpose whatsoever relative to his campaign



Further to our telephone conversation on Friday, the additional information you require with respect to my request for a expedited advisory opinion on the David Duke/Vanderbilt University honorarium and expenses matter follows:


- a) Vanderbilt University's IMPACT Symposium, the host of the proposed lecture, is a student-led and populated group that hosts a series of lectures by national leaders on a variety of issues each February
- b) Historically, audiences at Vanderbilt University's IMPACT Symposium lectures are comprised of approximately 70% to 80% students and faculty and 20% to 30% general public
- c) The IMPACT Symposium invitation process includes announcements on campus radio, in campus newspapers, and on-campus posters. A brochure describing IMPACT and its lecturers is also available at various locations on-campus
- d) No David Duke volunteers or campaign personnel will be present at the proposed lecture.
- e) Neither David Duke nor his staff will do any advance advertising or promotion in conjunction with the proposed lecture.

- l) The proposed lecture will not feature banners or any other campaign-related stage decorations, flyers, buttons, and other promotional items, will not be distributed.
- g) Neither David Duke nor members of his staff will hold a press conference before or after the proposed lecture
- h) Vanderbilt University has historically paid honoraria and expenses to lecturers, including Nelson Mandella and other politically oriented speakers
- l) *IMPACT Symposium's source of funding is comprised of Student Activity monies from the University as well as from various fund-raising projects and donations from alumni and interested parents.*
- j) David Duke will make no campaign-related use of any videotapes of the proposed lecture
- k) David Duke will travel to Vanderbilt University directly from his home in Metairie, Louisiana, his arrival and departure to and from Nashville, Tennessee, will not be in conjunction with any campaign-related appearance or travel.
- l) David Duke will not participate in any rallies, lunches, or other separate events either before or after the proposed lecture.
