Dear Mr. Velasquez:

This refers to your letter dated November 6, 1992, requesting an advisory opinion concerning application of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended, and Commission regulations to the making of expenditures under 2 U.S.C. §441a(d) in connection with the Georgia run-off election for the office of United States Senator that will be held on November 24, 1992.

Enclosed is a copy of a document entitled Final Draft of Advisory Opinion 1992-39 which was proposed by this office and circulated to the Commission for tally voting. The Commission considered this draft but did not approve it by the required affirmative votes of four members. See 2 U.S.C. §437c(c). The certified vote of 3-3 was filed on November 19, 1992. No other draft was before the Commission for voting.

Also enclosed are two separate statements for the record on this AOR by Commissioners Potter and Thomas. These statements will be made part of the public file and record for Advisory Opinion Request 1992-39.
