To the Office of the General Counsel:

I write to respectfully request an advisory opinion regarding whether election law and regulations would allow the Jesse L. Jackson, Jr. For Congress Campaign Committee to hire my wife, Sandi Jackson, as a consultant.

In her capacity as a consultant, Sandi would provide critical fundraising and administrative support and services for my campaign organization and operations, which I am now in the process of restructuring. In my view, Sandi's considerable experience and expertise would give a considerable boost to my re-election and fundraising efforts.

Throughout her career, my wife has worked in various positions in both campaigns and government. In addition to her stints as Chief of Staff for former Congressman Cleo Fields and as Press Secretary for the late Representative Mickey Leland, Sandi has worked in national campaigns, including both the 1988 Dukakis and 1996 Clinton presidential bids. Most recently, Sandi served as Vice President of Congressional and External Affairs for the Export-Import Bank of the United States.

Considering her impressive qualifications and my interest in hiring Sandi, I seek the guidance and counsel of the Commission. Specifically, does hiring my wife raise any conflicts of interest? What documentation and disclosure are necessary to support such a contractual arrangement between my wife and my campaign committee? What documentation is necessary to support disbursements to my wife? What other issues should be considered to avoid any problems in the future? Please know that I want to make certain that all the terms of any future contract between my wife and my campaign committee comply with the Federal Election Campaign Act and Commission regulations.

Thank you in advance for your attention and consideration in this matter. I look forward to receiving your reply.
