Advisory Opinion Request

The Honorable Elizabeth Coulson, Illinois State Representative

Coulson for Congress

Coulson Campaign Committee

Dear Ms. Duncan:

Pursuant to 2 U.S.C. § 437f and 11 C.F.R. § 112.1, State Representative Elizabeth Coulson, Coulson for Congress ("CFC"), and Coulson Campaign Committee ("CCC") (collectively "Requestors"), through counsel, hereby submit this request for an Advisory Opinion. Specifically, Requestors are requesting an advisory opinion regarding the application of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended (the "Act"), and Federal Election Commission ("Commission") regulations to specific constituent programs sponsored by State Representative Elizabeth Coulson. In addition, we respectfully request that the Commission consider this Advisory Opinion Request on an expedited basis, because the activities described below are scheduled to occur in the near future.

State Representative Elizabeth Coulson has served the 17th state legislative district of Illinois since 1997. She filed her FEC Form 2 to declare her candidacy for the 10th congressional district of Illinois on August 22, 2009. CFC's FEC Form 1 was filed on August 22, 2009. The 17th state legislative district is one of several comprising the 10th congressional district. The Illinois congressional primary is scheduled to be held on February 2, 2010.

Representative Coulson maintains a state campaign committee, Coulson Campaign Committee ("CCC"), which is registered with and reports to the Illinois State Board of Elections ("ISBE"). In its semiannual report filed with ISBE on July 17, 2009, CCC reported cash-on-hand of \$101,827.05, no receipts during the relevant period, and a minor amount of disbursements.

A copy of CCC's semiannual report is attached as Exhibit A. In accordance with Illinois law, Representative Coulson receives an office allowance for the purpose of defraying official office, personnel and constituent services expenses, and she may also use state campaign funds to help defray such expenses. See 10 ILCS 5/9-8.10(c). There are no limits on the amount individuals, corporations, and labor unions may contribute to state campaign committees. See generally 10 ILCS 5/9. Representative Coulson has not solicited any donations to CCC since she became a federal candidate.

For the last eight years, Representative Coulson has sponsored a "seniors fair" in her state district at a local community seniors center. At the fair, local businesses set up exhibition booths where they provide information to the attendees about their goods or services. The businesses do not pay to participate. In the past, some businesses have distributed free samples and water bottles to the seniors displaying company logos. None of the water bottles or free samples reference Representative Coulson. In addition, a local hospital has traditionally provided free flu shots and cholesterol screening to seniors at the event.

In order to promote the event, Representative Coulson mails approximately 12,000 postcards to seniors residing in her state district informing them of the date, time and location of the fair. A copy of last year's mailing is attached as Exhibit B. The phone number listed in the mailer is Representative Coulson's district office, and not her state campaign. In the past, the mailings have been paid for by either Representative Coulson's state legislative office account or her state campaign in accordance with Illinois law. See 10 ILCS 5/9-8.10(c). The 2009 fair is scheduled for October 12, 2009, and the postcards are typically mailed two weeks before the event. Representative Coulson intends to pay for this year's mailing with funds from her official office account or CCC.

For the last four years, Representative Coulson has mailed a health care "legislative update" to health care professionals in her state district. The letter lists the various health care legislative proposals being considered by the Illinois legislature and updates constituents concerning Representative Coulson's legislative efforts on their behalf. The letters are sent to approximately 4,000 recipients in her district. In the past, this mailing has been paid for by either Representative Coulson's state legislative office account or her state campaign in accordance with Illinois law.

See 10 ILCS 5/9-8.10(c). A copy of one such mailing is attached for your review as Exhibit C. The 2009 mailing is scheduled to occur sometime in October, and will be paid for by Representative Coulson's official office account or CCC.

The purpose of these constituent activities is to support Representative Coulson in her state officeholder capacity, and not to promote her candidacy for federal office. Representative Coulson intends to continue serving in the state legislature while she campaigns for federal office, and these activities are important constituent programs. The mailings and event described above

have not, and will not, be used by Representative Coulson or her agents to solicit contributions for CFC. Similarly, at no point will the mailings or event be used to expressly advocate Representative Coulson's federal candidacy, or promote or support her federal candidacy or attack or oppose any of her federal election opponents. The mailings will be distributed only to Representative Coulson's state legislative constituents and no mailings will be distributed outside the district. Moreover, the scope and frequency of the mailings will be unchanged from previous years when Representative Coulson was not a federal candidate.

The Act, as amended by the Bipartisan Campaign Reform Act of 2002 ("BCRA"), regulates the activities of federal candidates, their agents, and entities directly or indirectly controlled by federal candidates when they raise or spend funds in connection with federal and non-federal elections. 2 U.S.C. § 441i(e); 11 C.F.R. §§ 300.60-300.65. These regulations prohibit federal candidates and their agents from spending or disbursing funds in connection with any state or local election, unless the funds comply the source prohibitions and amount limitations under the Act and applicable state law. 2 U.S.C. § 441i(e)(1)(B); 11 C.F.R. § 300.62.

In prior Advisory Opinions, the Commission has permitted federal candidates and officeholders to use their state campaign committees to pay for various state election expenses and activities. In FEC AO 2006-38 (Casey), the Commission permitted a federal officeholder to use funds that comply with both the Act and state law in his state campaign committee to pay for travel by the federal officeholder and his agents in connection with state and local candidate events and other state and local election activities. Likewise, in FEC AO 2007-26, the Commission permitted a federal candidate to use federally permissible funds in his state campaign committee to make donations to a state party committee's non-federal account and to state and local candidates. Finally, in Advisory Opinion 1999-11, the Commission held that the payment by a state officeholder's campaign committee for certain constituent activities did not result in an in-kind contribution to a state officeholder's federal campaign committee. Specifically, the Commission held that the weekly coffees held in various restaurants throughout the state senator's district and billboards advertising the coffees did not run afoul of the Act or Commission regulations.

Requestors seek to confirm that Representative Coulson's activities, as described above, comply with the Act and Commission regulations. Based on the foregoing, using Representative Coulson's state office account or the remaining funds in CCC to pay for the constituent programs described above does not violate the non-federal funds prohibition applicable to federal candidates and their agents, constitute an in-kind contribution to CFC, or coordinated

communications under 11 C.F.R. § 109.21. Requestors, however, seek to confirm that the following activities will not violate the Act or Commission regulations:

- 1. Representative Coulson's state office account or state campaign may pay for the mailing to constituents publicizing the "seniors fair" and the health care legislative update, in the same manner as when she was not a federal candidate;
- 2. Representative Coulson may sponsor the fair as a service to her constituents in her capacity as a state representative;
- 3. If the Commission determines that the activities described in paragraphs 1 and 2 are inappropriate, CCC may instead use a reasonable accounting method to identify donations permissible under the Act, Commission regulations and Illinois law to pay for all of the constituent services described above; and
- 4. If the Commission determines that the activities described in paragraphs 1, 2 and 3 are inappropriate, CFC may pay for constituent services described above.

Thank you in advance for your prompt attention to this request. Once again, we respectfully request that the Commission consider this Advisory Opinion Request on an expedited basis because the activities described below are scheduled to occur in the near future.

Dear DOCTOR,

As both your State Representative and a colleague in the health care field, I have made every effort to ensure that Illinois offers a climate where doctors can thrive. As many of you know, our state is facing immense challenges to survive, recover and grow in today's daunting economic conditions. Despite the volatile climate that has plagued Springfield during this past legislative session, I have remained committed to making progress for the residents of this State.

To bring necessary improvements and resources to the medical industry, I am proud to have supported several initiatives, all Illinois State Medical Society priorities, which have passed both chambers and await action by the Governor. These measures include the following:


- Medical Practice Fee Splitting (HB 496/SB 69) maintains the ban on the unethical fee
 splitting for patient referrals while allowing physicians to engage in everyday business practices like
 using billing services and allowing credit card payments.
- Durable Healthcare Surrogacy (SB 2258) designation of a health care surrogate is durable and moves with a patient or resident when he or she leaves a health care facility.
- Schedule II Drug Prescriptions (HB 488) any written prescription for a Schedule II controlled substance may be filled within 90 (rather than 7) days after issuance.
- Medical Staff Autonomy (HB 546) requires that, in the event that a hospital or the medical staff imposes a summary suspension, the Medical Executive Committee meet as soon as is reasonably possible to review the suspension and to recommend whether it should be affirmed, lifted, expunged, or modified if the suspended physician requests such review.

I also Co-Sponsored Senate Bill 1487, which will allow physician assistants to provide medical care in an emergency situation, including a state or local disaster. I believe this legislation was a critical and successful way to help ensure that those needing care in dire circumstances can receive it. Currently, there are physician assistants who are registered as emergency responders or members of triage teams who cannot provide first aid in a disaster because they would be in violation of state law. The bill seeks to clarify that in an emergency disaster setting, a physician assistant may render care without a supervising physician until the emergency disaster management teams arrive at the scene.

I will continue to look for innovative ideas to help improve the health care system in Illinois, as well as help improve the lives of those who need our care. As always, I welcome your ideas and input as many of my best proposals originate from constituents in the 17th district. Please do not hesitate to contact me at (847) 724-3233. Dear Mr. McGinley,

In our telephone conversation yesterday, you provided us with additional information regarding Illinois State Representative Coulson's request for an advisory opinion. We have set out below our understanding of certain points that you made during the conversation. Please review the statements below and either confirm their accuracy or correct any misperceptions.

- (1) At least some of the funds now available in State Rep. Coulson's State campaign committee account were raised from sources prohibited by FECA or received in excess of the FECA's amount limitations.
- (2) State Rep. Coulson is not a candidate for state office.
- (3) The senior fair will not include any Federal election activity as defined in 2 USC 431(20) and 11 CFR

100.24.

- (4) State Rep. Coulson does not plan to provide any information about the participants at the senior fair to her congressional campaign committee.
- (5) The mailings and the event described in the request will not be used to solicit any contributions.
- (6) The local community senior center that will hold the senior fair does not charge a fee for its use. The event accordingly will be free of charge to State Rep. Coulson as well as to any other sponsor or participant.

Once this information is confirmed by you, it will become part of the advisory opinion request and be made available to the public. We would appreciate your response by return email. If you have any questions please call me.
