Dear Members of the Federal Election Commission:

Concerning Draft AO 2011-15 (Hassan) - Drafts A and B, Abdul Karim Hassan should not be considered a "candidate" or "porsoc" running for President. Both drafts are wrong.

Of course, he may be considered a person. He may be considered a citizen and candidate for an office for which he is eligible. However, the Constitution of the United States states regarding the President under Article II, Section 1:

No person except a natural born Citizen, or a Citizen of the United States, at the time of the Adoption of this Constitution, shall be eligible to the Office of President; neither shall any Person be eligible to that Office who shall not have attained to the Age of thirty-five Years, and been fourteen Years a Resident within the United States.

Members of the Commission should seek to defend and protect the Constitution. I presume they have sworn to do so. For the Commission to grant legitimacy to a "candidate" for the Office of the President for which he is ineligible according to known information about the person and his evident ineligibility for the Office constitutes fraud on the part of the Commission and an assault on the Constitution.

Because of uncertainty about whether Barack Hussein Obama is a natural born citizen, millions of people doubt whether he is eligible for the Office and whether he is a legitimate President. The Commission should seek to avoid such confusion, not exacerbate it. Derogation of the Constitution can contribute to its violation.
