This letter responds to your letter received on June 5, 2019, requesting an advisory opinion on behalf of Price for Congress. The purpose of this letter is to inform you that the Commission has concluded its consideration of your advisory opinion request without issuing an advisory opinion.


The Commission publicly released four draft advisory opinions in response to your request. The drafts were identified as Agenda Document No. 19-33-A (released on July 17, 2019) and Agenda Document Nos. 19-33-B, 19-33-C, and 19-33-D (released on August 9, 2019). These agenda documents are available on the Commission's website at www.fec.gov.

At its Open Meeting of August 22, 2019, the Commission considered but did not approve any of the draft advisory opinions. The Commission voted 2-2 on Agenda Document Nos. 19-33-A and 19-33-B. The affirmative vote of four members of the Commission is required to render an advisory opinion under the Federal Election Campaign Act. *See* 52 U.S.C §§ 30106(c), 30107(a)(7); *see also* 11 C.F.R. § 112.4(a). Thus, the Commission was unable to render an opinion in this matter.
