Campaign Legal Center ("CLC") respectfully submits this comment regarding the Commission's draft advisory opinions regarding Advisory Opinion Request 2022-24 (Allen Blue).

The Commission has long treated inter vivos trusts as pass-through entities for attribution purposes, with contributions by the trust attributed to the underlying individual. See Advisory Opinion 1999-19. Draft B improperly departs from this approach and, as detailed in the comment of Brendan Fischer, lacks any basis in law.

Thus, as between the two draft advisory opinions published for public consideration, CLC would prefer the approach outlined in Draft A.
