Re: Advisory Opinion Request 2023-01 (Diaz Barragán)

Dear Chair Lindenbaum and Vice-Chair Cooksey:

The Committee has reviewed the April 12, 2023, comment provided by counsel for Rep. Diaz Barragán concerning her request for an advisory opinion from the Commission with respect to the use of campaign funds by an eligible congressional member organization.

While the Committee commends Ms. Diaz Barragán for her diligent efforts to comply with complex law, rules, and regulations in this space, I am compelled to write again to confirm that it is the Committee on House Administration that regulates eligible congressional member organizations (ECMOs), including their funding. Indeed, regardless of any action taken by the Federal Election Commission, no ECMO may use campaign funds to support the activities described in Advisory Opinion Request 2023-01 without subsequent action by the Committee on House Administration.¹

As acknowledged by the Committee in its April 4, 2023, correspondence, the Committee on Ethics (Ethics) is involved in determining for the whole House the official purposes for which campaign funds may be used. The Committee agrees with counsel for Ms. Diaz Barragán that the language used in the *Eligible Congressional Member Organizations Handbook* (*Handbook*) is simply an acknowledgement of Ethics' general operations in this space and not a unique exception to the regulations governing the operations of ECMOs.

In relevant portion, the *Handbook* states, "[e]xcept where authorized by the Committee on Ethics, campaign funds may not pay for an ECMO's official and representational expenses[]" (the "Ethics Exception"). Further, the *Handbook* notes that ECMOs may engage only in "official and representational" activities but not in any political, personal, or otherwise non-official activity.² Therefore, the restriction is clear: Except for the limited number of *official* activities laid out in the *House Ethics Manual*³ for which an ECMO may use a Member's campaign funds,⁴ an ECMO may not otherwise use campaign funds.

In fact, the *House Ethics Manual* repeats the Committee on House Administration's regulation in substantive portion:

Congressional Member Organizations ("CMOs") are *official* House entities that have no independent funding, and campaign funds may not be used to provide funding for, or otherwise directly support such organizations (other than food and beverage expenses at meetings)." However, Member or staff involvement in CMOs may be supported with the use of campaign funds, subject to the [limitations described on the previous pages].⁵

Indeed, as counsel notes, the *House Ethics Manual* permits the use of campaign funds to defray the "[e]xpenses of *[o]fficial* or *[o]fficially*-[r]elated travel."⁶ And the Committee on Ethics certainly could include in its *Manual* additional permissible uses of campaign funds for *official* activities.⁷

But neither the existing permissions nor additional permissions would control because it is the Committee on House Administration that determines whether an activity qualifies as "*official*" under its regulations.⁸ As detailed in the Committee's earlier correspondence, the Committee on House Administration has determined that travel by ECMOs is not an *official* activity.⁹

Therefore, <u>neither</u> the Ethics Exception in the *Handbook*, <u>nor</u> the cited provisions from the *House Ethics Manual* with respect to the use of campaign funds for *official* purposes apply.¹⁰ Both exceptions, as well as Rule XXIV of the Rules of the U.S. House of Representatives, apply only to the use of campaign funds for *official* activities. Travel by a Member on behalf of an ECMO is not *official*; therefore, no campaign funds may be used.¹¹

As noted in the *Eligible Congressional Member Organizations Handbook*, the Committee on House Administration stands ready to provide advice and guidance to Members of the House of Representatives on matters within its jurisdiction. The Committee is strongly committed to doing its part to ensure that each of the entities that regulate activity in this space work cooperatively so that Members and their staffs are not presented with conflicting or incomplete information. The Committee appreciates the Federal Election Commission's attention to and careful consideration of this matter.¹²

In each case, campaign funds may only be used in furtherance of "*official*" activities. As noted in the text, CHA has determined that travel by ECMOs is not "*official*" in nature, so the Ethics Exception does not apply.
