Enclosed please find a second supplement of information in support of the request of the Natural Law Party of the United States of America for an advisory opinion confirming that it is a "national committee" of a political party for purposes of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended, and that its affiliated state party committees are "state party committees" under the Act. This submission covers the progress of the Party and its candidates from the date of our first supplemental submission filed on July 30, 1992, through this date. Please consider it together with the information provided in the first supplemental submission as well as in our initial letter of June 20, 1992, requesting an advisory opinion.

### Ballot Access

We would like to inform the Commission that, as of this date, the Natural Law Party or Natural Law Party candidates have met the ballot access requirements in 26 states and the District of Columbia.

The Party has met ballot access requirements as a party in Alaska, Connecticut, Illinois, Michigan, New Mexico, Vermont, Washington, and Wisconsin. Presidential candidate Dr John Hagelin and Vice Presidential candidate Dr Mike Tompkins, endorsed by the Party's Executive Committee and seeking nomination by the Party at our national convention on September 26th and 27th, have now met ballot access requirements as independent candidates in an additional 17 states and the District of Columbia. Of these states, Drs Hagelin and Tompkins will appear on the ballot with the Natural Law Party designation in Alabama, Arkansas, Colorado, the District of Columbia, Iowa, Louisiana, Massachusetts, Minnesota, Nebraska, New Hampshire, New Jersey, South Dakota, and Utah. Drs Hagelin and Tompkins will appear on the ballot simply as independent candidates in Kentucky, Mississippi, New York, Ohio, and Tennessee. As set forth in our first supplemental submission, ballot access has also been obtained in Hawaii for three

**Congressional candidates who will appear on the ballot with a single letter identifying the candidates' affiliation with the Natural Law Party**

**At present 69 candidates for the United States Congress are seeking election as Natural Law Party candidates in 24 states. Ballot access requirements for Congressional candidates have already been met in 14 states. These include Connecticut, Hawaii, Illinois, Iowa, Massachusetts, Michigan, Minnesota, Missouri, New Hampshire, South Dakota, and Washington, where the candidates will appear with the Natural Law Party designation. Natural Law Party candidates will also appear on the ballot simply as independent candidates in New York, Pennsylvania, and Tennessee.**

**For the states not listed above, the Presidential, Vice Presidential, and Congressional candidates are still in the process of gathering signatures for ballot access, or, with respect to remaining states where the deadlines for filing have passed, they are planning to seek election as write-in candidates where permitted by state law. In California, Kansas, and Nevada, lawsuits challenging state ballot access deadlines have been filed, and the Party is hopeful that, as a result, its candidates will be on the general election ballots in these states.**

**Official letters verifying ballot access have already been sent to you for Arkansas, Michigan, Minnesota, Tennessee, Washington, and Wisconsin. This submission includes**

additional verification letters from Alaska, Iowa, Kentucky, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, New Jersey, New Mexico, South Dakota, Tennessee, Utah, and Washington. We will be happy to provide you with verification letters from other states as ballot access requirements are met and official verifications are received.

The information provided above updates the material in the ballot access chart included in the July 30th submission, "Response to Question One". To the best of my knowledge, it is complete and accurate as of this date.

#### **Natural Law Party Political Committees and Organizations**

At present, 47 states and the District of Columbia have established Natural Law Party political committees or organizations. This includes 34 Natural Law Party state committees which have filed with the Commission. The following seven state party committees have filed since our last submission on July 30th:

#### **Publications and Productions**

As described in our July 30th submission, the Natural Law Party weekly newsletter is now being published. In addition, a brochure outlining the Party's positions on key issues has been printed to be distributed nationwide. Furthermore, the national party staff has prepared descriptive materials about the Party's platform and its candidates for use in official state election pamphlets, including those of Alaska, Illinois, and Washington.

**Press Coverage** -

The Natural Law Party and Party candidates have appeared in hundreds of press reports, radio shows, and TV spots to date. Dr Hagelin and Dr Tompkins have been giving between three and six press interviews on a typical weekday. In addition, press releases by the Party's Publicity Department are issued daily and faxed to the top 90 media around the country.

Press coverage of the Natural Law Party last week included airing by C-Span of a press conference in Washington, D C., during which Drs Hagelin and Tompkins spoke about the Party's innovative solutions to our national problems. C-Span also hosted a call-in television show with Dr Hagelin during which callers expressed their appreciation with C-Span for presenting to the public an alternative to the major party candidates. This past week also brought national media coverage by the Associated Press, National Public Radio, United Press International, and ABC and CBS national radio news.

**Meetings, Conventions, and Candidate Appearances**

As of this date, Presidential Candidate Dr Hagelin, Vice Presidential Candidate Dr Tompkins, or I have spoken to supporters and potential supporters in almost every state in the nation.

Dr Hagelin has made campaign swings through Texas, California, the Northeast, and the Midwest. He and Dr Tompkins are just completing another campaign tour of the East Coast which includes press conferences and interviews, and meetings with VIP's and other voters. Recent appearances in California include addresses to two groups of former Perot supporters. A tour of Western states is scheduled for mid-September, with additional focus on appearances at large public events, including student rallies at some of the major universities, and visits to schools, factories, environmental organizations, health agencies, and the like. More appearances are being planned daily. For example, on September 13th, Dr Hagelin is scheduled to address 17,000 Native Americans in North Dakota. During all of these appearances, voters and the press are introduced to the Natural Law Party and encouraged to support its goals, policies, and programs.

Dr Hagelin is also seeking to participate in the upcoming Presidential debates to present to the voters the policies and programs of the Natural Law Party. In this regard, letters have been sent on his behalf to the Commission on Presidential Debates and the heads of the major television networks in an attempt to secure a place for him on the podium. Furthermore, Natural Law Party candidates are pursuing the opportunity to participate in debates sponsored by the League of Women Voters in states where Party candidates are on the ballot.

In addition to the meetings set forth in the July 30th submission, a meeting is being planned for Natural Law Party leaders and supporters in early December to celebrate the successes in the November election, and begin to plan for the next election cycle.

**Voter Registration**

In addition to the voter registration activities described in the July 30th submission, Natural Law Party volunteers have begun voter registration drives in Hawaii, Iowa, and California.

Voter registration drives in other states where Party candidates are on the ballot are being planned.

**National Toll-Free Telephone Line**

As a result of the groundswell of public interest in the Natural Law Party and Dr Hagehn's candidacy, a toll-free telephone number has been established to receive calls, provide information and accept contributions. Another telephone line has been established which provides more in-depth information on the Party's positions on various issues of concern to the nation. Since the institution of these telephone lines, people have been calling from all over the country.

\* \* \*

We trust that the information provided in this letter, together with our prior submissions, will enable the Commission to determine that the Natural Law Party of the United States of America is clearly a national committee of a political party as defined in the Federal Election Campaign Act, and that our state party committees are official "state party committees" under the Act. We understand that our advisory opinion request is scheduled to be considered at the Commission's meeting on Thursday, September 17, 1992, at 10 00 A M. Representatives of our Party are planning to attend the meeting along with our Washington counsel, Robert Charrow, and look forward to meeting you at that time. I am pleased to report that we have completed our review of the qualifying petitions you submitted on behalf of the Natural Law Party of New Mexico and that we have found a sufficient number of valid signatures. This fact, together with our approval of your party rules and regulations, as amended, means that the Natural Law Party has met the legal requirements to become a qualified political party in New Mexico, able to offer candidates for president and vice president in the upcoming general election.

I should remind you, however, that we have not yet received a final printing of your rules and regulations as amended in our office on July 14. Nor have we received another copy of your party emblem suitable for reproduction on the ballot.

What follows is the information we have sent to the other parties qualified for the general election. Although you are receiving this information later than the others, which had qualified earlier, there is still time for your party to meet its legal obligations.

Your candidates for president and vice president must be nominated pursuant to Section 1-15-3 NMSA 1978: "Any qualified political party in New Mexico desiring to have candidates for president and vice president on the general election ballot in a presidential election year shall, at a state party convention held in the year of such election, choose from the voters of such party the number of presidential electors required by law and no more. The presidential electors shall be nominated by the state convention according to the rules of that party on file with the secretary of state."

Once these electors are chosen, the chairman and secretary of the convention are to certify to the Secretary of State the names and addresses of the nominees not less than fifty-six days prior to the election. This year that deadline falls on September 8, as indicated on the enclosed calendar of the general election.


Furthermore, Subsection A of Section 1-10-8.1 NMSA 1978 directs the Secretary of State to determine the time and manner in which the various qualified political parties are positioned by lot on the general election ballot. Subsections B and C of this same section further stipulate that the major political parties shall be listed first followed by the minor political parties.

To implement the provisions of this section, Secretary of State Rule No. 79-2 (Amendment No. 1) provides that the drawing by lot be held on the first Wednesday in September in the year of a general election. For the general election of 1992, that date is September 2; the time is 3:00 p.m.; and the location is the Office of the Secretary of State, Room 420 in the State Capitol.

This same rule also provides a method for conducting the drawing. Capsules containing numbers one through the number equivalent to the total number of major political parties participating in the general election shall be placed in a suitable container. Then the state chairman of each major political party or a designated representative with written authorization from the chairman shall draw a capsule, the number in which shall determine that major party's position on the ballot. The same procedure shall then be followed in a separate drawing for the ballot positions of minor political parties. If a political party, major or minor, is not represented at this drawing, the Secretary of State will draw for that party.

Congratulations to you and the other party officials on your new status as a qualified political party in New Mexico. I will look forward to seeing you or another party representative at the drawing on Wednesday, September 2. If you have any questions about the procedures discussed in this rather lengthy letter, please let us know.

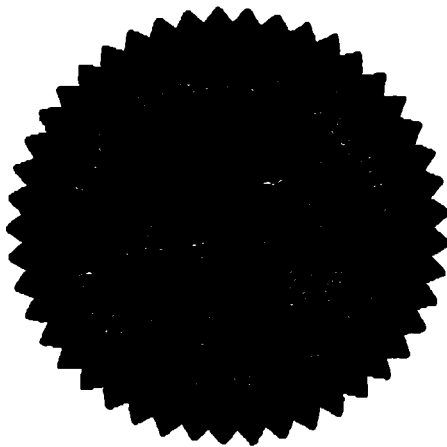

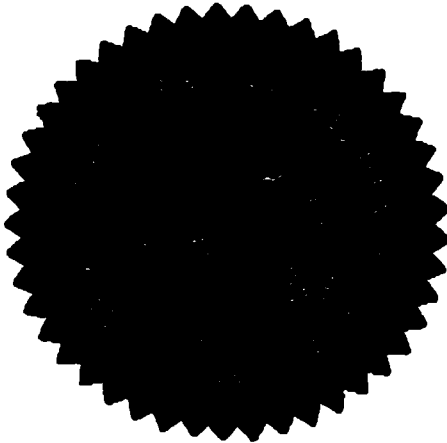


