- I. The Commission has jurisdiction over the respondents and the subject matter of this proceeding.
- II. Respondents have had a reasonable opportunity to demonstrate that no action should be taken in this matter.

- IV. The pertinent facts in this matter are as follows:
- 1. FTP-NEA is a labor organization pursuant to 2 U.S.C. \$441b(b)(1).
- 2. At all times relevant to this Agreement, FTP-PAC was a political committee pursuant to 2 U.S.C. \$431(d).
- 3. Pursuant to 2 U.S.C. §441b(a), it is unlawful for any labor organization to make a contribution to any candidate for federal office.
- 4. Pursuant to 2 U.S.C. §44lb, a political committee is prohibited from contributing any portion of money received from a labor organization to any candidate for federal office.
- 5. Pursuant to 2 U.S.C. §441b(b)(2), a loan is a contribution.
- 6. FTP-NEA loaned FTP-PAC \$15,000 on October 24, 1978, and FTP-PAC accepted it.
- 7. FTP-PAC contributed to two federal candidates subsequent to the receipt of this loan.

WHEREFORE, Respondent agrees:

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V. FTP-NEA violated 2 U.S.C. §441b by loaning \$15,000 to FTP-PAC, a portion of which was contributed by FTP-PAC to

candidates for federal office. PTP-PAC violated that Section by accepting that \$15,000, a portion of which was contributed to candidates for federal office.

VI. Respondents will pay an aggregate civil penalty to the Treasurer of the United States in the amount of five hundred dollars (\$500.00), pursuant to 2 U.S.C. \$437g(a)(6)(B).

GENERAL CONDITIONS

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VII. On request of anyone filing a complaint under

2 U.S.C. §437g(a)(l) concerning the matters at issue herein or by
its own motion, the Commission may review compliance with this
Agreement. If it believes that any requirement of this Agreement has been violated, it may institute a civil action for relief in the United States District Court for the District of Columbia.

VIII. This Agreement shall become effective when executed by all parties and approved by the Commission.

IX. Respondents shall have no more than thirty (30) days from the date this Agreement becomes effective to pay the civil penalty referred to in paragraph VI above/

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On November 6 , 1979, the Commission determined there was reasonable cause to believe that both the Florida Teaching Profession-National Education Association (FTP-NEA) and the Florida Teaching Profession-Political Action Committee (FTP-PAC) committed a violation of section 441b of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended, in connection with a \$15,000 loan from FTP-NEA to FTP-PAC.

The Commission has a duty to attempt to correct such violations for a period of 30 days by informal methods of conference, conciliation and persuasion, and by entering into a conciliation agreement. 2 U.S.C. §437g(a)(5)(A). If we are unable to reach an agreement during that period, the Commission may, upon a finding of probable cause to believe a violation has occurred, institute civil suit in United States District Court and seek payment of a civil penalty.

We enclose two conciliation agreements that this office is prepared to recommend to the Commission in settlement of this matter. If you agree with the provisions of the enclosed agreements, please sign and return them along with the civil penalties to the Commission within ten days. I will then recommend that the Commission approve the agreements. Please make the checks for the penalties payable to the U.S. Treasurer.

GENERAL COUNSEL'S REPORT

BACKGROUND

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On August 14, 1979, the Commission found reason to believe that the Florida Teaching Profession-National Education Association (the Association) and the Florida Teaching Profession-Political Action Committee (the Committee) may have violated 2 U.S.C. §44lb. A letter went out to Mr. Ronald Meyer, General Counsel for the Association, on August 16, 1979.

EVIDENCE

On August 27, 1979, we received a letter from Mr. Meyer asking for an extension of time. A phone call was placed to Mr. Meyer who said he would respond shortly. On September 11, 1979, a phone call was received from Mr. James M. Altman of the National Education Association. Mr. Altman said he would be handling the matter and asked if he could be given an extension of time to respond to our questions. Mr. Altman was told that an extension could not be granted and that a prompt response from him was expected.

As nothing was received in writing from Mr. Altman, a second letter was sent to Mr. Meyer on September 25, 1979

regarding a lack of reply on the respondents' behalf.

On October 5, 1979, a letter was received from

Robert H. Chanin of the National Education Association's

Office of General Counsel. Mr. Chanin explained that the

Committee was organized in 1975 to make contributions solely

in connection with elections to state and local office. How
ever, this policy was changed in August, 1978 and the Committee

started contributing to federal candidates. It made its last

contributions to federal candidates in October, 1978 and the

Committee terminated in May, 1979.

Concerning Ms. DeLee's statement (Ms. DeLee is the former treasurer of the Committee) that the source of the Committee's \$5,176.74 cash on hand was "membership dues", Mr. Chanin stated that that is the terminology used in Florida law to refer to voluntary contributions to political action committees. The term was not used in the context of the FECA.

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In regard to the \$15,000 loan from the Association to the Committee (the check was drawn on the Association's general treasury account), Mr. Chanin explained that at the time the loan was made the Committee had decided to terminate its involvement with federal elections and that the \$15,000 was to be used to make contributions to state and local candidates in the 1978 general election. However, after the loan was made the Committee contributed \$1,100 to two federal candidates.1/

^{1/} The two candidates were Claude Pepper (FL-14) and Dante Fascell (FL-15) who both won the general election.

As the balance in the Committee's checking account was \$683.13, apart from the \$15,000 loan, when the checks for \$1,100 were drawn, Mr. Chanin further contends that the loan was therefore only used to pay \$416.87 of the \$1,100. It should be noted that the loan was paid in full by March, 1979. ANALYSIS 2 U.S.C. §441b prohibits the making and receipt of union contributions in connection with any federal election. As a loan is included in the definition of a contribution, and in view of the fact that the loan was used by the Committee to N make contributions to federal candidates, the Office of General 0 Counsel recommends the Commission find reasonable cause to 0 œ believe that the Association and the Committee violated 2 U.S.C. §44lb. It should be noted that this is in accordance with the C Commission's policy regarding post-August 1978 corporate/union 4. contributions. 0 However, due to the small amount of federal contributions 0 involved and the fact that the committee terminated its involvement in federal elections subsequent to receipt of the loan, this office recommends a civil penalty of \$500 for each respondent. In regard to the two candidates who received contributions from the Committee's commingled account, this office recommends they not be required to refund the money. This recommendation is based on the view that neither candidate had reason to suspect these contributions were prohibited and that only the Committee will gain from the refunds.

RECOMMENDATION

- 1. Find reasonable cause to believe that the Florida



Washington, D.C. 20463 Re: MUR 1008 (79) Dear Ms. Tarrant: On August 16, 1979, William Oldaker, General Counsel of the Federal Election Commission (FEC), sent a letter to Ronald Meyer, General Counsel of the Florida Teaching Profession-National Education Association (FTP-NEA), stating that FEC "has found reason to believe that the [FTP-NEA] and the Florida Teaching Profession-Political Action Com-0 mittee (FTP-PAC) may have violated certain provisions of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended," Specifically, the letter identified two possible violations of Section 441b(a) of the Act: (1) the section may have been violated when, on October 24, 1978, FTP-NEA loaned FTP-PAC \$15,000; and (2) FTP-NEA dues may have been impermissibly "commingled" with FTP-PAC contributions. I have been authorized by FTP-NEA and FTP-PAC to represent them in regard to MUR 1008(79) and this letter constitutes their joint response. With reference to the comment in the August 16 letter vis-a-vis 2 U.S.C. §437g(a)(3)(B), FTP-NEA and FTP-PAC request that this matter be kept confidential. Before turning to the possible violations themselves, some background regarding FTP-PAC is appropriate. FTP-PAC was organized in the fall of 1975 and, as required by Florida law, registered with the Florida Secretary of State on December 15, 1975. Its purpose is to further FTP-NEA's objectives through political action, and to this end it collects voluntary contributions from FTP-NEA members. Other than for the period from August to October, 1978, it has been the policy of FTP-PAC to expend those contributions solely in connection with elections to state and local office. From August to October,

1978, FTP-PAC contributed a total of \$6,250 to candidates for federal office. As a result of these latter contributions, FTP-PAC registered with FEC as a political committee on August 31, 1978. Shortly thereafter, FTP-PAC decided to terminate its involvement in federal elections, and FEC was officially notified of this decision on May 25, 1979. It is against this backdrop that I turn now to the two possible violations raised in the August 16 letter.

FEC suggests that FTP-NEA treasury funds and voluntary contributions to FTP-PAC may have been "commingled" in FTP-PAC's checking account in violation of 2 U.S.C. §441b(a). The basis for this allegation is a letter from Ms. Debra DeLee, then FTP-PAC Treasurer, to Orlando Potter, FEC Staff Director, dated February 7, 1979, in which Ms. DeLee stated that the source of the \$5,196.74 in the FTP-PAC account on January 1, 1978, was "membership dues." The conclusion that you have drawn from Ms. DeLee's statement is incorrect. The money consisted of voluntary contributions to FTP-PAC and when Ms. DeLee referred to "membership dues" she simply was using the terminology which is used in Florida law to refer to voluntary contributions to a political action committee. See Florida Statutes (1978), \$106.04(1)(b). In short, the \$5,196.74 was not FTP-NEA "dues" within the meaning of the Act, and its inclusion in FTP-PAC's checking account did not constitute "commingling."

FEC indicates that a possible violation of 2 U.S.C. §441b(a) may have occurred on October 24, 1978, when FTP-PAC accepted a \$15,000 loan from FTP-NEA. Such a loan was in fact made, and the details of the transaction are set forth below.

- 1. On October 24, 1978, an FTP-NEA check in the amount of \$15,000 was deposited in the FTP-PAC checking account. The check was drawn on FTP-NEA's general treasury and represented a loan that was to be used by FTP-PAC to make contributions to state and local candidates in the 1978 general election.
- 2. On the date the loan was made, FTP-PAC already had decided to terminate its involvement in federal elections and to revert to its pre-August 1978 policy of contributing only to candidates for state and local office. Under Florida law, a labor organization (such as FTP-NEA) may loan money to a political action committe (FTP-PAC) for this purpose. See Florida Statutes (1978), \$106.011(1) & (3)(a).



- 4. Apart from the \$15,000 loan, the balance in the FTP-PAC checking account was \$683.13 when the checks for \$1,100 were drawn. Accordingly, the loan was used to pay \$416.87.
- 5. FTP-PAC has repaid the \$15,000 loan to FTP-NEA. The final payment of \$1,400 was made on March 9, 1979.

In sum, FTP-PAC expended in connection with federal elections, \$416.87 which had been loaned to it by FTP-NEA, and FTP-PAC and FTP-NEA are prepared to concede for present purposes that this constituted a violation of Section 441b(a) of the Act, albeit an inadvertent one. We submit, however, that no action should be taken against FTP-PAC or FTP-NEA for the following reasons:

1. FTP-PAC has repaid the loan, which was the course of action recommended to it by FEC in order to "cure" the violation. Thus, in his January 30, 1979 letter to FTP-PAC, Mr. Potter stated:

"The Commission recommends that if you have accepted a prohibited contribution [referring specifically to the \$15,000 loan] that you return the full amount to the donor."

2. FTP-PAC has completely terminated its involvement in federal elections (see May 25, 1979 letter from Ms. DeLee to Mr. Potter) and has no intention of altering its policy in this regard.

Please contact me after you have had an opportunity to review this letter so that we can discuss the steps that should be taken in order to dispose of MUR 1008(79).

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On , 1979, the Commission determined there was reasonable cause to believe that both the Florida Teaching Profession-National Education Association (FTP-NEA) and the Florida Teaching Profession-Political Action Committee (FTP-PAC) committed a violation of section 441b of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended, in connection with a \$15,000 loan from FTP-NEA to FTP-PAC.

The Commission has a duty to attempt to correct such violations for a period of 30 days by informal methods of conference, conciliation and persuasion, and by entering into a conciliation agreement. 2 U.S.C. \$437g(a)(5)(A). If we are unable to reach an agreement during that period, the Commission may, upon a finding of probable cause to believe a violation has occurred, institute civil suit in United States District Court and seek payment of a civil penalty.

We enclose two conciliation agreements that this office is prepared to recommend to the Commission in settlement of this matter. If you agree with the provisions of the enclosed agreements, please sign and return them along with the civil penalties to the Commission within ten days. Washington, D.C. 20463 MUR 1008 (79) Re: Dear Ms. Tarrant: On August 16, 1979, William Oldaker, General Counsel of the Federal Election Commission (FEC), sent a letter to Ronald Meyer, General Counsel of the Florida Teaching Profession-National Education Association (FTP-NEA), stating that FEC "has found reason to believe that the [FTP-NEA] and the Florida Teaching Profession-Political Action Committee (FTP-PAC) may have violated certain provisions of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended," Specifically, the letter identified two possible

violations of Section 441b(a) of the Act: (1) the section may have been violated when, on October 24, 1978, FTP-NEA loaned FTP-PAC \$15,000; and (2) FTP-NEA dues may have been impermissibly "commingled" with FTP-PAC contributions.

I have been authorized by FTP-NEA and FTP-PAC to represent them in regard to MUR 1008(79) and this letter constitutes their joint response. With reference to the comment in the August 16 letter vis-a-vis 2 U.S.C. \$437g(a)(3)(B), FTP-NEA and FTP-PAC request that this matter be kept confidential.

Before turning to the possible violations themselves, some background regarding FTP-PAC is appropriate. FTP-PAC was organized in the fall of 1975 and, as required by Florida law, registered with the Florida Secretary of State on December 15, 1975. Its purpose is to further FTP-NEA's objectives through political action and to this end it collects voluntary contributions from FTP-NEA members. Other than for the period from August to October, 1978, it has been the policy of FTP-PAC to expend those contributions solely in connection with elections to state and local office. From August to October,

Marybeth Tarrant -2-October 5, 1979 1978, FTP-PAC contributed a total of \$6,250 to candidates for federal office. As a result of these latter contributions, FTP-PAC registered with FEC as a political committee on August 31, 1978. Shortly thereafter, FTP-PAC decided to terminate its involvement in federal elections, and FEC was officially notified of this decision on May 25, 1979. It is against this backdrop that I turn now to the two possible violations raised in the August 16 letter. FEC suggests that FTP-NEA treasury funds and voluntary contributions to FTP-PAC may have been "commingled" in FTP-PAC's checking account in violation of 2 U.S.C. §44lb(a). The basis for this allegation is a letter from Ms. Debra DeLee, then FTP-PAC Treasurer, to Orlando Potter, FEC Staff Director, dated February 7, 1979, in which Ms. DeLee stated that the source of the \$5,196.74 in the FTP-PAC account on January 1, 1978, was "membership dues." The conclusion that you have drawn from Ms. DeLee's statement is incorrect. The money consisted of voluntary contributions to FTP-PAC and when Ms. DeLee referred to "membership dues" she simply was using the terminology which is used in Florida law to refer to voluntary contributions to a political action committee. See Florida Statutes (1978), \$106.04(1)(b). In short, the \$5,196.74 was not FTP-NEA "dues" within the meaning of the Act, and its inclusion in FTP-PAC's checking account did not constitute "commingling." FEC indicates that a possible violation of 2 U.S.C. §441b(a) may have occurred on October 24, 1978, when FTP-PAC accepted a \$15,000 loan from FTP-NEA. Such a loan was in fact made, and the details of the transaction are set forth below. On October 24, 1978, an FTP-NEA check in the amount 1. of \$15,000 was deposited in the FTP-PAC checking account. The check was drawn on FTP-NEA's general treasury and represented a loan that was to be used by FTP-PAC to make contributions to state and local candidates in the 1978 general election. On the date the loan was made, FTP-PAC already had decided to terminate its involvement in federal elections and to revert to its pre-August 1978 policy of contributing only to candidates for state and local office. Under Florida law, a labor organization (such as FTP-NEA) may loan money to a political action committe (FTP-PAC) for this purpose. See Florida Statutes (1978), \$106.011(1) & (3)(a).

Marybeth Tarrant October 5, 1979 Despite FTP-PAC's decision to terminate involvement in federal elections, it contributed \$1,100 to two candidates for federal office after receiving the \$15,000 loan. These contributions were made on October 24, 1978, and were designed to fulfill commitments which had been made previously by FTP-PAC. 4. Apart from the \$15,000 loan, the balance in the FTP-PAC checking account was \$683.13 when the checks for \$1,100 were drawn. Accordingly, the loan was used to pay \$416.87. FTP-PAC has repaid the \$15,000 loan to FTP-NEA. The final payment of \$1,400 was made on March 9, 1979. In sum, FTP-PAC expended in connection with federal elections, \$416.87 which had been loaned to it by FTP-NEA, and FTP-PAC and FTP-NEA are prepared to concede for present purposes that this constituted a violation of Section 44lb(a) of the Act, albeit an inadvertent one. We submit, however, that 0 no action should be taken against FTP-PAC or FTP-NEA for the following reasons: C œ 1. FTP-PAC has repaid the loan, which was the course of action recommended to it by FEC in order to "cure" the violation. Thus, in his January 30, 1979 letter to FTP-PAC, Mr. Potter stated: "The Commission recommends that if you have accepted a prohibited contribution [referring specifically to the \$15,000 loan] that you return C the full amount to the donor." 2. FTP-PAC has completely terminated its involvement in federal elections (see May 25, 1979 letter from Ms. DeLee to Mr. Potter) and has no intention of altering its policy in this regard. Please contact me after you have had an opportunity to review this letter so that we can discuss the steps that should be taken in order to dispose of MUR 1008(79). Sincerely, Robert W. Based on information ascertained in the normal course of carrying out its supervisory responsibilities, the Federal Election Commission has found reason to believe that the Florida Teaching Profession-National Education Association (FTP-NEA) and the Florida Teaching Profession-Political Action Committee (FTP-PAC) may have violated certain provisions of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended.

Specifically, it appears that a loan of \$15,000 was made by FTP-NEA, a labor organization, to FTP-PAC in violation of 2 U.S.C. §44lb. While we note the loan has been repaid, the Act was violated when the contribution was made and accepted. In addition, the FTP-PAC reflected an initial balance of \$5,196.74 in its report to the Commission of August 31, 1978. In the later correspondence from FTP-PAC's Treasurer, Ms. Debra DeLee, the source of these funds was identified as membership dues. If such dues were from union dues funds, an impermissible commingling of union treasury funds with voluntary PAC funds occurred, also in violation of 2 U.S.C. §44lb.

We have numbered this matter MUR #1003.

Under the Act, you have an opportunity to demonstrate that no action should be taken against FTP-NEA and FTP-PAC. Please submit any factual or legal materials which you believe are relevant to the Commission's analysis of this

matter. In this regard, we note your letter of February 12, 1979 to the Commission. While you stated in that letter that the \$15,000 was loaned "...in furtherance of our state political activities," when the FTP-PAC registered as a Federal political committee it became subject to the provisions of the Federal Election Campaign Act. The loan would appear to be in violation of 2 U.S.C. §44lb, regardless of whether it was, as you stated, made at "arm's length."

In addition to any other information you might wish to provide, please submit answers to the following questions. Where appropriate, statements should be submitted under oath.

- 1. Explain in detail the funding of FTP-PAC, specifying how money is transmitted from the locals to the state PAC. In this regard, please furnish us with copies of the authorization forms used for membership and/or payroll deductions.
- 2. In connection with the \$15,000 loan by FTP-NEA to FTP-PAC:
 - a. Describe the source of these funds.
 - b. State the purpose of the loan.
 - c. To what account, or accounts, were these funds deposited by FTP-PAC? What other funds were in these accounts?

The Commission is under a duty to investigate this matter expeditiously. Therefore, your response should be submitted within ten days after your receipt of this notification.

GENERATION OF MATTER

On July 16, 1979, the Florida Teaching Profession Political Action Committee (the Committee) was referred to the Office of General Counsel by the Reports Analysis Division (RAD) for failing to timely register and for receipt of funds from a labor organization.

EVIDENCE

On August 31, 1978, the Committee registered and filed its first report covering January 1, 1978 through August 31, 1978. As the report disclosed \$3,150 in Federal campaign contributions being made between August 12, 1978 and August 30, 1978, a Request for Additional Information (RFAI) was sent by RAD asking why the Committee had not registered earlier. Their response was that the Committee was originally organized to participate. in Florida political races only but that in August of 1978, the Board decided to support candidates for the U.S. House of Representatives.

In addition, the first report disclosed a cash-on-hand balance of \$5,196.74 as of January 1, 1978. Another RFAI was sent by RAD requesting information on the source of these funds. The Committee responded by saying it was from membership dues.

On a later report, the Committee disclosed receiving a loan of \$15,000, on October 24, 1978, from the Florida Teaching Profession-National Education Assocation (the Association) which is listed on the Committee's Statement of Organization as a connected organization. As this was believed to be a corporate contribution, a surface violation (SV) letter was sent to the Committee on January 30, 1979. The Committee's General Counsel responded on February 12, 1979, by saying the loan had been repaid in full (Committee reports show the last repayment was made on March 9, 1979).

EVIDENCE (continued)

He further stated that under Florida State law, a political action committee may receive loans and that a loan is included in the definition of a contribution. In addition, he claimed the Association is a voluntary unincorporated association and not a corporation. Subsequent to this letter, the Committee terminated.

PRELIMINARY ANALYSIS

In regard to the violations of 2 U.S.C. §§433 and 434, the Office of General Counsel recommends taking no further action as the amount of time involved is minimal.

In view of the Committee's response stating their source of funds as "membership dues" and the loan of \$15,000 from the Association, this Office recommends the Commission find reason to believe both respondents may have violated 2 U.S.C. §441b.

- Take no further action with regard to the Committee's violation of 2 U.S.C. §§433 and 434.
- 2. Find Reason to Believe the Committee and the Association may have violated 2 U.S.C. §441b.

The first issue of the relationship of the Florida Teaching Profession-Political Action Committee to the National Education Association has been clarified by the inclusion herein of an amended page 1 of FEC Form 1. The National Education Association has been identified as a connected organization.

With regard to the second issue in your communication, specifically, why FTP-PAC had not registered earlier, the following is provided.

The Florida Teaching Profession-Political Action Committee was organized and registered under Florida Law with the Secretary of State's office December 15, 1975 (copy of Charter attached) under a constitution and bylaws which included an affiliation with the National Education Association-Political Action Committee. FTP-PAC was organized to participate in Florida political races, and did so until August 1978. At a meeting of its Governing Board in August 1978, FTP-PAC voted to make contributions to candidates seeking positions in the U.S. House of Representatives. Following that decision, we secured the appropriate forms and filed with the Commission the initial registration. Because we had not anticipated earlier that we would be making contributions to Federal candidates in excess of \$1,000 in a calendar year, as specified in Sec. 102.1(a) of the Commission's regulations, we did not think we had to register with the Commission.

Thunk you for your assistance in helping us to comply with the requirements of the Federal Election Campaign Act.





The Commission recommends that if you have accepted a prohibited contribution that you return the full amount to the donor. The return of the contribution should be reported immediately by letter and should be reflected as a contribution refund on your next report of receipts and expenditures. If the identification of the source of this contribution is incomplete or incorrect, on the original report, please submit a statement which would clarify this particular matter for the public record. You may do so by amending your original report by letter.

Please notify the Commission within fifteen (15) days from the date of this letter of the determination made on this matter. Your recent correspondence directed to Ms. Debra DeLee, Treasurer of the Florida Teaching Profession - Political Action Committee, has been passed to this office for review and response.

Initially, let me state that the issue raised by your correspondence has been somewhat mooted. The "contribution" reflected on the reports in the initial amount of \$15,000 from the Florida Teaching Profession-National Liucation Association (FTP-NEA) to the Florida Teaching ! ofession-Political Action Committee has been repaid in its entirety. Pursuant to Florida Law (Florida Statutes Section 106.011 et seq) it is lawful for a political action committee to receive loans for the purpose of political activities. Toward that end, and in furtherance of our state political activities, the FTP-NEA loaned the sum of \$15,000 to the Political Action Committee for that purpose. Since Florida Statute 106.011(3) (a) defines "contribution" to include, inter alia a loan, we reflected such loan as a contribution on the appropriate state reports and chose also to do so in the interest of full disclosure in our report to the Federal Election Commission.

By way of information the FTP-NEA is a voluntary unincorporated association and not a corporation as alleged in your correspondence. Moreover, I am not pursuaded of your view that an arms length loan by the FTP-NEA to its separate segregated Political Action Committee is prohibited by the Act as long as reporting requirements are fulfilled. In that regard I would be happy to

receive your advise and justification for it with regard to future similar transactions.

If you have any further questions concerning this matter, please direct your inquiry to this office. Unless I hear to the contrary from you, I shall anticipate that this letter will satisfactorily conclude the issues posed by your January 30, 1979 correspondence.

Dear Mr. Meyer:

Based on information ascertained in the normal course of carrying out its supervisory responsibilities, the Federal Election Commission has found reason to believe that the Florida Teaching Profession-National Education Association (FTP-NEA) and the Florida Teaching Profession-Political Action Committee (FTP-PAC) may have violated certain provisions of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended.

Specifically, it appears that a loan of \$15,000 was made by FTP-NEA, a labor organization, to FTP-PAC in violation of 2 U.S.C. §44lb. While we note the loan has been repaid, the Act was violated when the contribution was made and accepted. In addition, the FTP-PAC reflected an initial balance of \$5,196.74 in its report to the Commission of August 31, 1978. In the later correspondence from FTP-PAC's Treasurer, Ms. Debra DeLee, the source of these funds was identified as membership dues. If such dues were from union dues funds, an impermissible commingling of union treasury funds with voluntary PAC funds occurred, also in violation of 2 U.S.C. §44lb.

We have numbered this matter MUR #1003.

Under the Act, you have an opportunity to demonstrate that no action should be taken against FTP-NEA and FTP-PAC. Please submit any factual or legal materials which you believe are relevant to the Commission's analysis of this

matter. In this regard, we note your letter of February 12, 1979 to the Commission. While you stated in that letter that the \$15,000 was loaned "...in furtherance of our state political activities," when the FTP-PAC registered as a Federal political committee it became subject to the provisions of the Federal Election Campaign Act. The loan would appear to be in violation of 2 U.S.C. \$441b, regardless of whether it was, as you stated, made at "arm's length."

In addition to any other information you might wish to provide, please submit answers to the following questions. Where appropriate, statements should be submitted under oath.

- Explain in detail the funding of FTP-PAC, specifying how money is transmitted from the locals to the state PAC. In this regard, please furnish us with copies of the authorization forms used for membership and/or payroll deductions.
- 2. In connection with the \$15,000 loan by FTP-NEA to FTP-PAC:
 - a. Describe the source of these funds.
 - b. State the purpose of the loan.
 - c. To what account, or accounts, were these funds deposited by FTP-PAC? What other funds were in these accounts?

The Commission is under a duty to investigate this matter expeditiously. Therefore, your response should be submitted within ten days after your receipt of this notification.

If you have any questions, please contact Ms. Marybeth Tarrant, the staff member assigned to this matter, at 202-523-4175.

This matter will remain confidential in accordance with 2 U.S.C. §437g(a)(3)(B) unless you notify the Commission in writing that you wish the investigation to be made public.

With regard to the second issue in your communication, specifically, why FTP-PAC had not registered earlier, the following is provided.

The Florida Teaching Profession-Political Action Committee was organized and registered under Florida Law with the Secretary of State's office December 15, 1975 (copy of Charter attached) under a constitution and bylaws which included an affiliation with the National Education AssociationPolitical Action Committee. FTP-PAC was organized to participate in Florida political races, and did so until August 1978. At a meeting of its Governing Board in August 1978, FTP-PAC voted to make contributions to candidates seeking positions in the U. S. House of Representatives. Following that decision, we secured the appropriate forms and filed with the Commission the initial registration. Because we had not anticipated earlier that we would be making contributions to Federal candidates in excess of \$1,000 in a calendar year, as specified in Sec. 102.1(a) of the Commission's regulations, we did not think we had to register with the Commission.

Specifically, you asked two questions: 1: May the Dental Society of the State of New York 10 and its district dental societies solicit voluntary contributions to the Empire Dental Political Action Committee by the inclusion 11 of a suggested political contribution on the membership dues statements of the societies? 12 May The Dental Society of the State of New York 13 and its district dental societies deposit into their corporate bank accounts checks from their members in payment of the dues statements; 14 portions of these checks may represent contributions to EDPAC, and such portion would . 15 then be transferred to EDPAC by separate check? 16 Regarding your first question, the solicitation of contributions to EDPAC by The Dental Society of the State of New York, a nonprofit 17 corporation, and its district dental societies is permitted by 2 U.S.C. 18 \$441b(b)(4)(C). The solicitation may be conducted in conjunction • 19 with the mailing of dues statements to members of the Dental Socie 20 See 11 CFR 114.7(f). 21 As to your second question, 2 U.S.C. 544lb(a) prohibits any 22 corporation from contributing to a candidate for Federal office on to a political committee established for the purpose of making contributions 23 to condidates for Foderal office. However, a separate segregated fund may be 24 established under 9441b(b)(2) and may accept voluntary contributions from 25

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committees subject, of course, to the contribution limits and other requirements of the Act and Commission regulations. EDFAC is regarded as the separate segregated fund of the Dental Society whose members may be solicited and make contributions to EDPAC. Such contributions may be included with the annual membersh: dues of the member and transmitted by a single check payable to the district dental society. This check may be deposited in a bank account of the State or district dental society. The dental societies may then remit the political contribution portion to EDPAC by separate check drawn on that same society bank account.

In concluding that the described procedure may be used, the Commission makes several assumptions on which it conditions its approval. First, the checks representing a combined dues and political contribution from a Society member are regarded as contributions received by the treasurer of EDPAC or his/her agent at the time the checks are received by any employee or representative of the State Society, or the district society in cases where it mails dues statements and receives combined dues and contribution checks directly. Thus, the political contribution portion of each member's check must be remitted into a checking account of a duly designated bank depository of EDPAC within 10 days after —57

The Commission understands, and assumes for purposes of this opinion, that combined dues and political contributions will be made by Society members as individuals on individual checks duam on personal bank accounts, not competate accounts including prefessional comporation accounts. Combined dues and political contributions duam on a competate account which is a non-repayable drawing account of an individual Society member are not considered prehibited competate contributions. (See the Commission's recent Notice on this subject, copy enclosed.)

Secondly, all records of society ball accounts in which combin dues and contributions are deposited must be made available upon Commission request pursuant to its audit authority and other general powers. 2 U.S.C. 55437d, 438(a)(8). Finally, the State and district societie must maintain and make available on Commission request usual and customary accounting records of members' dues payments and other appropriate records indicating those members who make political contributions in combination with dues payments. These records must be maintained for at least 3 years from the end of the year in which EDPAC reported a contribution from a member to whom the records relate. See 11 CFR 104.12(b)

This response constitutes an advisory opinion concerning the application of a general rule of law stated in the Act, or prescribed as a Commission regulation, to the specific factual situation set forth in your request. See 2 U.S.C. §437f.



Corporate contributions are prohibited by the Act, unless the contribution is made by a separate segregated fund established by the corporation. A copy of that portion of your report is attached for your review and clarification.

The Commission recommends that if you have accepted a prohibited contribution that you return the full amount to the donor. The return of the contribution should be reported immediately by letter and should be reflected as a contribution refund on your next report of receipts and expenditures. If the identification of the source of this contribution is incomplete or incorrect, on the original report, please submit a statement which would clarify this particular matter for the public record. You may do so by amending your original report by letter.

Please notify the Commission within fifteen (15) days from the date of this letter of the determination made on this matter. Your recent correspondence directed to Ms. Debra DeLee, Treasurer of the Florida Teaching Profession - Political Action Committee, has been passed to this office for review and response.

Initially, let me state that the issue raised by your correspondence has been somewhat mooted. The "contribution" reflected on the reports in the initial amount of \$15,000 from the Florida Teaching Profession-National Education Association (FTP-NEA) to the Florida Teaching Profession-Political Action Committee has been repaid in his entirety. Pursuant to Florida Law (Florida Statutes Section 106.011 et seq) it is lawful for a political action committee to receive loans for the purpose of political activities. Toward that end, and in furtherance of our state political activities, the FTP-NEA loaned the sum of \$15,000 to the Political Action Committee for that purpose. Since Florida Statute 106.011(3) (a) defines "contribution" to include, inter alia a loan, we reflected such loan as a contribution on the appropriate state reports and chose also to do so in the interest of full disclosure in our report to the Federal Election Commission.

By way of information the FTP-NEA is a voluntary unincorporated association and not a corporation as alleged in your correspondence. Moreover, I am not pursuaded of your view that an arms length loan by the FTP-NEA to its separate segregated Political Action Committee is prohibited by the Act as long as reporting requirements are fulfilled. In that regard I would be happy to

receive your advise and justification for it with regard to future similar transactions.

If you have any further questions concerning this matter, please direct your inquiry to this office. Unless I hear to the contrary from you, I shall anticipate that this letter will satisfactorily conclude the issues posed by your January 30, 1979 correspondence.

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
