GENERAL COUNSEL'S REPORT

BACKGROUND

On January 19, 1981, the Commission found reason to believe that the Committee for an Independent Judiciary ("Committee") violated 2 U.S.C. § 433(a) by failing to file a statement of organization with the Commission within 10 days of becoming a political committee and 2 U.S.C. § 441d by failing to provide a statement of candidate authorization or non-authorization on a newspaper solicitation which expressly advocated the election of a candidate for President.^{1/} In addition, the Commission found reason to believe that the Committee violated 26 U.S.C. § 9012(f) by incurring expenditures in excess of \$1000 in support of Jimmy Carter, an eligible candidate who received public funding in the 1980 general election for President.

Thereafter, the Office of General Counsel notified the Committee of the Commission's findings and requested the Committee to respond to questions and produce documents. On February 25, 1981, the Committee produced the documents and submitted answers to the questions. In its response, the

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Committee Treasurer acknowledged that Committee expenditures exceeded \$1000, but denied that they had been made knowingly and willfully.^{2/} The Committee Treasurer had previously acknowledged that the Committee had not registered as a political committee in a timely fashion, and apologized for the two-week delay. Finally, the Treasurer indicated that the Committee's failure to include the full disclaimer under section 44ld in one of its newspaper advertisements was inadvertent; as evidence of this, he included a copy of another advertisement which included the full disclaimer.

^{2/} According to reports filed with the Commission, the Committee expended a total of \$9,214 to further the election of Jimmy Carter.

DISCUSSION

The major issue in this matter involves 26 U.S.C. § 9012(f). On January 19, 1982, the Supreme Court affirmed by an equally-divided Court the finding by a three-judge District Court for the District of Columbia that 26 U.S.C. § 9012(f) is unconstitutional. Common Cause v. Schmitt; Federal Election Commission v. Americans For Change, 512 F. Supp. 489 (D.D.C. 1980) (three-judge court), aff'd by an equally divided court, 455 U.S. 129 (1982). The equally divided nature of the decision does not resolve the issue of the constitutionality of Section 9012(f) as a judgment entered by an equally divided Court is not "entitled to precedential weight." Trans World Airways v. Hardison, 432 U.S.C. 63, 73 n.8 (1977). See also, Neil v. Biggers, 409 U.S. 138 (1959); Inman v. Baltimore and Ohio Railroad Co., 361 U.S. 138 (1959); and Ohio ex rel Eaton v. Price, 364 U.S. 263 (1960). See Agenda Document #82-170.

With respect to this matter, the Commission must decide whether or not to proceed further against violations of 26 U.S.C. § 9012(f) committed during the 1980 election. The parties in FEC v. AFC made independent expenditures of \$3,754,599 to further the election of Ronald Reagan.^{4/} The Committee's expenditures,

^{4/} Based on reports filed with the Commission, the Fund for a Conservative Majority spent \$1,772,535 in independent expenditures, the Americans for an Effective Presidency spent \$1,270,208 and Americans for Change spent \$711,856.

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in contrast, were approximately 0.2% of this amount and consisted of several newspaper advertisements and a single mailing to a limited audience. While the General Counsel believes that the Commission may legally proceed against violations of 26 U.S.C. § 9012(f) committed during the 1980 election, this office does not recommend proceeding further in this matter. Given the unique situation of a deadlocked Supreme Court on the issue as raised in the 1980 election, the General Counsel believes that the Commission can consider avoidance of further litigation on this same issue as a valid exercise of the Commission's judgment in enforcing the law. The statutory provision remains in force, and those who wish to assert a Constitutional right to make such expenditures in 1984 can take steps to bring the issue before the courts. Accordingly, the General Counsel recommends that the Commission should not pursue this issue in this case.

In addition to section 9012(f), the Commission found reason to believe that the Committee violated 2 U.S.C. §§ 433(a) and 441d.

2 U.S.C. § 433(a) - The Committee failed to register within 10 days of becoming a political committee. After being notified that a complaint had been filed, the Committee registered with the Commission. Although the Committee registered approximately 2 weeks late, it subsequently filed all required reports.

2 U.S.C. § 441d - In one of its newspaper advertisements, the Committee did not fully comply with this provision. The

advertisement did indicate that the Committee had paid for it; since it was a solicitation, however, the advertisement should have also stated whether or not it was authorized by a candidate. The Committee also placed other advertisements which were identical to the one in question, except that they contained the required non-authorization notice. It appears, therefore, that this minor violation in this one instance was inadvertent.

Since this matter has been pending for some time, and since the Office of General Counsel believes that the violations of 2 U.S.C. §§ 433(a) and 441d are relatively minor, this office recommends that the Commission take no further action and close the file.


Recommendations

The Office of General Counsel recommends that the Commission:

1. Take no further action against the Committee for an Independent Judiciary for violations of 2 U.S.C. §§ 433(a) and 441d, and 26 U.S.C. § 9012(f).

2. Approve the sending of the attached letter to the Committee Treasurer.

The Federal Election Commission notified you on October 10, 1980, of a complaint which alleges that your committee violated certain sections of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended ("FECA") and Chapters 95 and 96 of Title 26, U.S. Code. A copy of the complaint was forwarded to you at that time.

Upon further review of the allegations contained in the complaint and information supplied by you, the Commission, on January 9, 1981, determined that there is reason to believe that the Committee for an Independent Judiciary violated 2 U.S.C. §§ 433(a) and 441b, provisions of the FECA of 1971, as amended, and section 9012(f) of Chapter 95 of Title 26 U.S. Code. Specifically, it appears that your committee violated 2 U.S.C. § 433(a) by failing to file a statement of organization with the Commission within 10 days of becoming a political committee pursuant to 2 U.S.C. § 431(4).

In addition, it appears that your committee violated 2 U.S.C. § 441d by failing to provide a statement of candidate authorization or nonauthorization on a communication (i.e., an advertisement appearing in the October 13th edition of the National Law Journal which expressly advocated the election of Jimmy Carter, a clearly identified candidate for President).

Finally, although not alleged in the complaint, the Commission has determined based upon review of reports on file, that your committee may have violated 26 U.S.C. § 9012(f) by incurring expenditures in excess of \$1000 on behalf of a candidate who was eligible to receive public matching funds. Specifically, it appears that your committee may have violated this provision by expending a total of \$5,376, in support of Jimmy Carter, for advertisements in the National Law Journal, Philadelphia Inquirer, and Legal Times; and by expending an additional \$3,568.79 in support of Jimmy Carter in connection with mailings, printing, xeroxing, and other related charges itemized on Schedule E of the 30 day Post-General Report. 1/

Your response to the Commission's initial notification of this complaint did not provide complete information regarding the matter(s) in question. Please submit responses to the enclosed Request for Answers to Questions and Production of Documents within 10 days of receipt of this letter. Where appropriate, statements should be submitted under oath.

The Office of General Counsel would like to settle this matter through conciliation prior to finding probable cause; however, in the absence of any information which demonstrates that no further action should be taken against your committee, the Office of General Counsel must proceed to the next compliance stage as noted on page 2, paragraph 2 of the enclosed procedures.





Candidate Eyes Political Screen Test for Nominees

Reagan Judges: In His Image?

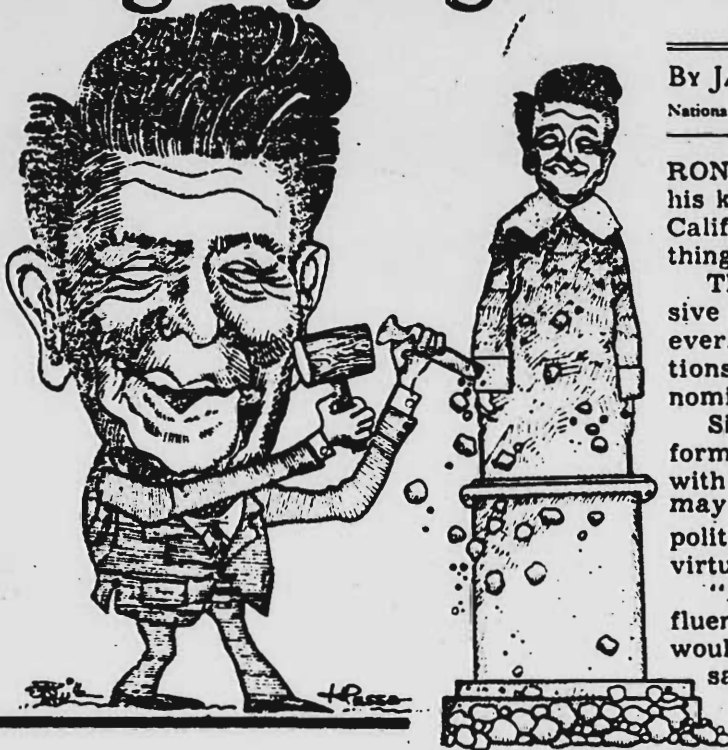
RONALD REAGAN feels he was betrayed by one of his key judicial appointees when he was governor of California, and his aides say he won't let the same thing happen again if he is elected president.

That resolve could lead to some of the most intensive political screening of federal judicial candidates ever, Reagan watchers say, and to uneasy confrontations between the president and senators over nominees.

Signals from Mr. Reagan's camp suggest that the former governor, determined to fill the federal bench with persons who share his conservative philosophies, may be ready to challenge a centuries-old system of political accommodation that has given U.S. senators virtual appointment power over federal judges.

"A senator from a given state would be very influential, but I'm quite certain that the senators wouldn't be the only source of recommendations," said William French Smith, Mr. Reagan's long-

time personal lawyer and adviser on judicial appointments. "We certainly wouldn't turn over [the selection process] to the present senators," Mr. Smith added, an apparent reference to Mr. Reagan's feelings that the Senate is overly influenced by liberals.

In California, Mr. Reagan's administration often would quiz potential appointees on the minutiae of their political thinking, and his aides suggest he would show no reluctance to institute a similar policy on a federal level.

'One Helluva Survey'

"Anybody Reagan as president would nominate for judge is going to have one helluva survey done on him," said one veteran California court observer.

Presumably, one of the issues Mr. Reagan will be most concerned with is the controversial Republican platform plank, which he has embraced, calling for the appointment of judges who "respect . . . the sanctity of human life."

Traditionally, most federal court appointments are made by the president upon the recommendation of the senior senator from his party in the state where the vacancy occurs. In the past, the president has almost invariably followed the senators' wishes. Where a state has no senators of the president's party, a compromise candidate is usually appointed. (Since 1978, under a directive from President Carter, federal appellate judges are recommended by special screening panels.)

Persons close to Mr. Reagan pointedly note that the former governor has shown no reluctance in the past to break with tradition in matters of judicial appointments. In his first week as governor in 1967, they said, he bucked convention in refusing to accept certain state senators' nominations for trial-level judgeships.

"They said it was tradition; Reagan said the tradition has ended," said state Supreme Court Justice William P. Clark Jr., once the governor's chief of staff.

Political Affront

Mr. Reagan's apparent determination to screen judicial candidates exhaustively to be certain that they mirror his conservatism appears to stem from a political affront he suffered at the hands of Donald Wright, the man he chose to be the state Supreme Court chief justice. It was Mr. Reagan's first Supreme Court appointment — and it turned into one of his biggest disappointments.

Mr. Wright was selected shortly after the retirement of the renowned Chief Justice Roger Traynor, who had been too much of a judicial activist for Mr. Reagan's tastes.

The governor was looking for what he termed a strict constructionist — a conservative who was hard on law-and-order issues and who took a dim view on expanding the rights of the accused. Above all, he wanted someone who would uphold the state's death penalty law, and he thought he had found such a man in Mr. Wright, an able trial court judge whom Mr. Reagan had elevated to an intermediate appellate bench in 1968.

But in 1972, two years after he became chief justice, Mr. Wright authored the 6-1 majority opinion that struck down the death penalty. The ruling in *People v. Anderson*, 6 Cal.3d 628, came four months before the U.S. Supreme Court's broad opinion invalidating state capital punishment laws, *Furman v. Georgia*, 408 U.S. 238. Justice Wright went on to join other liberal colleagues in expanding the

rights of the injured and the accused, and he apparently reneged on what some Reagan associates thought was a promise to retire in 1973. (He eventually retired in 1977.)

Mr. Reagan later said publicly that he regretted having appointed Mr. Wright.

The Wright affair spurred a dramatic change in the way Mr. Reagan made his judicial appointments. In his first term, before the death penalty case, judicial candidates often didn't even know they were being considered. Mr. Wright, for example, said the only background information he learned the administration had on him was a single page of biographical information. Robert S. Thompson, a trial judge elevated by Mr. Reagan in 1968 to an appellate bench, said he never even went through an interview. 20 Pages of Questions

But after the death penalty rebuff, a lengthy questionnaire — about 20 pages of inquiries seeking biographical data and information on past cases and philosophies — became standard fare before a judicial candidate was considered. Followup interviews with a battery of advisers were also required of appellate nominees.

"It was a comprehensive form, very detailed," said Court of Appeal Judge Robert K. Puglia, a well-regarded 1974 appointee known for his conservative stances. "The interviews were general questions about a person's life philosophy, judicial philosophy and views on topical issues," he said.

Several lawyers and judges in

California say the quality of Mr. Reagan's appellate court appointments dropped after his first term, and they attribute the change to his new screening process.

"In the initial period, the appellate appointments were OK, maybe a notch — and a small one at that — weaker than [former Gov. Edmund] Pat Brown's," said Edward Lascher, an appellate court practitioner and first chairman of the State Bar of California's commission on judicial appointments.

"Reagan seemed to be almost vengeful," Mr. Lascher said. "In the beginning, his judges were probably conservative but were proper craftsmen. Later, they were just conservative."

Mr. Thompson agrees that the quality of appellate appointments dropped in Mr. Reagan's second term, but attributes it more to the departure of Paul Haerle as the governor's appointments secretary.

He said Mr. Haerle, a San Francisco lawyer, "believed that partisan politics had no place in the selection of judges."

Mr. Haerle offered a different explanation.

"It could be that after a few years, all the right lawyers were already on the bench," he said. "Maybe the pickings were not as good."

No Bones About It

Aides to Mr. Reagan make no bones about — or apologies for — their willingness to ask prospective judges

about their views on major political issues.

Herbert E. Ellingwood, Mr. Reagan's legal affairs adviser, says "It's not only fair but reasonable" to ask judges about their political and judicial philosophies. "The judiciary," he said, "is not immune from accountability to the people."

Justice Clark agrees.

"Reagan was elected overwhelmingly and he felt that was a mandate from the voters to appoint generally those people of his same political philosophy somewhat across the board," he said.

'An Inpropriety'

But Bernard G. Segal, a former president of the American Bar Association who headed the first ABA commission on the federal judiciary, strongly criticizes such questioning of judicial prospects.

"It's an impropriety to give any view on a subject that may come before the candidate as a judge," he said. "It's custom not to ask anything about the substance of beliefs."

Merit Selection

Despite his insistence on politically compatible court choices, Mr. Reagan was the only California governor in recent years to actively support a merit selection system for judicial nominees. The bill, introduced twice, never was enacted.

Nevertheless, Mr. Reagan set up merit selection panels and never appointed anyone who received less than a qualified rating from the panels and the state bar.

Of course, merit selection didn't mean Mr. Reagan couldn't get judges who followed his conservative views.

Ralph Nutter, for instance, was a highly regarded jurist who left the bench in 1969 during a family emergency. When he later tried to get reappointed, he said, he was told by a

Reagan staff adviser that he was "too liberal."

Mr. Haerle said he used a lengthy questionnaire in cases where a resume or information on a prospective candidate was inadequate. Applicants were screened "on paper," he said, and the names sent to groups of lawyers, the state bar and the selection panels for advice.

The recommendations he got back would be in the form of ratings, and the highest-rated applicant usually got the seat, he said, so long as the candidate was qualified — and conservative.

'Generally Insipid'

In his eight years as governor, Mr. Reagan put 478 lawyers on the bench and elevated more than 150 sitting judges. Of his new appointments, 34 were minorities — about 7 percent — and 13 were women — about 2.6 percent. None went to the appellate bench or the Supreme Court.

His predecessor, Mr. Brown, put 399 lawyers on the bench, including roughly the same percentage of women and minorities.

San Francisco lawyer Melvin Belli characterized the Reagan appointees as "generally insipid without too much cerebellum or cerebrum."

But many other California lawyers said Mr. Reagan's judges were no better and no worse than his predecessor's appointments.

"Reagan's appointees are indistinguishable from those of Pat Brown," said noted California legal scholar B.E. Witkin of Berkeley, who has authored numerous texts and manuals and served as an appellate and Supreme Court research attorney for 18 years. "Very few governors go out of their way to pick bums for the court."

Besides Justices Wright and Clark, the only other Reagan appointee to the state Supreme Court is Frank Richardson, a moderate who is praised by lawyers across the political spectrum as an "excellent, incisive" judge who "doesn't let personal pique get into his opinions."

Mr. Richardson and Mr. Clark, a rock-hard conservative, accede to the Reagan belief that judges should follow the law, not make it. Both men are still on the bench.

Mr. Clark's appointment had been criticized because he had never finished law school and had flunked the bar examination the first time around. In fact, Mr. Wright, one of three state

officials who had to confirm the governor's choice, voted against the appointment.

Still, Justice Clark is gaining respect, even if some of the praise is going for his full-time research attorneys, one of whom had been with Justice Wright and the other with the liberal former Justice Raymond Peters.

Mr. Clark and Judge Puglia are considered likely U.S. Supreme Court nominees in a Reagan administration. **'Advice and Consent'**

Senators have pushed their choices for judicial nominees practically since the time the ink dried on the U.S. Constitution, which gives the president the power of judicial appointment "with the advice and consent" of the Senate.

By the end of the 19th century, senators had a shorthand way of indicating they didn't agree with a president's choice by stating on the Senate floor that the candidate was "personally obnoxious."

For the last 50 years or so, senators in the president's party recommended

nominees for vacancies in their district. With rare exceptions, presidents have agreed with them. In states where both senators are political adversaries of the president, judges are usually picked after delicate negotiations involving the president's power to appoint and the senator's power to block confirmation.

The 1978 Omnibus Judgeship Act, which created 152 judicial positions, gave the president authority to set up merit selection panels. President Carter's subsequent executive order set up panels picked by the president to find and screen candidates for the circuit courts of appeals. Senators from about half the states have set up merit selection panels to produce one name or a list of names to be sent to the president for district court nominations.

But in reality, most judges still come from the president's party; and any new president could easily do away with the Carter executive order.

"Sen. Bob Dole [R-Kan.], for instance, expects Democrats will be appointed to the bench in Kansas. He has no illusions about that," a Senate source said. And President Carter "has no illusion that he's going to get someone on the bench who is Dole's arch-enemy."



Mr. Thompson agrees that the quality of appellate appointments dropped in Mr. Reagan's second term, but attributes it more to the departure of Paul Haefle as the governor's appointments secretary.

He said Mr. Haefle, a San Francisco lawyer, "believed that partisan politics had no place in the selection of judges."

Mr. Haefle offered a different explanation.

"It could be that after a few years, all the right lawyers were already on the bench," he said. "Maybe the pickings were not as good."

No Bones About It

Asked if Mr. Reagan make no bones about — or apologizes for — their willingness to ask prospective judges

about their views on major political issues.

Herbert E. Ellingwood, Mr. Reagan's legal affairs adviser, says "it's not only fair but reasonable" to ask judges about their political and judicial philosophies. "The judiciary," he said, "is not immune from accountability to the people."

Justice Clark agrees.

"Reagan was elected overwhelmingly and he felt that was a mandate from the voters to appoint generally those people of his same political philosophy somewhat across the board," he said.

'An Impropriety'

But Bernard G. Segal, a former president of the American Bar Association who headed the first ABA commission on the federal judiciary, strongly criticizes such questioning of judicial prospects.

"It's an impropriety to give any view on a subject that may come before the candidate as a judge," he said. "It's custom not to ask anything about the substance of beliefs."

Merit Selection

Despite his insistence on politically compatible court choices, Mr. Reagan was the only California governor in recent years to actively support a merit selection system for judicial nominees. The bill, introduced twice, never was enacted.

Nevertheless, Mr. Reagan set up merit selection panels and never appointed anyone who received less than a qualified rating from the panels and the state bar.

Of course, merit selection didn't mean Mr. Reagan couldn't get judges who followed his conservative views.

Ralph Nathan, for instance, was a highly regarded jurist who left the bench in 1968 during a family emergency. When he later tried to get reappointed, he said, he was told by a

Reagan staff adviser that he was "too liberal."

Mr. Haerle said he used a lengthy questionnaire in cases where a resume or information on a prospective candidate was inadequate. Applicants were screened "on paper," he said, and the names sent to groups of lawyers, the state bar and the selection panels for advice.

The recommendations he got back would be in the form of ratings, and the highest-rated applicant usually got the seat, he said, so long as the candidate was qualified — and conservative.

'Generally Inispid'

In his eight years as governor, Mr. Reagan put 478 lawyers on the bench and elevated more than 150 sitting judges. Of his new appointments, 34 were minorities — about 7 percent — and 13 were women — about 2.6 percent. None went to the appellate bench or the Supreme Court.

His predecessor, Mr. Brown, put 399 lawyers on the bench, including roughly the same percentage of women and minorities.

San Francisco lawyer Melvin Belli characterized the Reagan appointees as "generally insipid without too much cerebellum or cerebrum."

But many other California lawyers said Mr. Reagan's judges were no better and no worse than his predecessor's appointments.

"Reagan's appointees are indistinguishable from those of Pat Brown," said noted California legal scholar B.E. Witkin of Berkeley, who has authored numerous texts and manuals and served as an appellate and Supreme Court research attorney for 18 years. "Very few governors go out of their way to pick bums for the court."

Besides Justices Wright and Clark, the only other Reagan appointee to the state Supreme Court is Frank Richardson, a moderate who is praised by lawyers across the political spectrum as an "excellent, incisive" judge who "doesn't let personal pique get into his opinions."

Mr. Richardson and Mr. Clark, a rock-hard conservative, accede to the Reagan belief that judges should follow the law, not make it. Both men are still on the bench.

Mr. Clark's appointment had been criticized because he had never finished law school and had flunked the bar examination the first time around. In fact, Mr. Wright, one of three state

officials who had to confirm the governor's choice, voted against the appointment.

Still, Justice Clark is gaining respect, even if some of the praise is going for his full-time research attorneys, one of whom had been with Justice Wright and the other with the liberal former Justice Raymond Peters.

Mr. Clark and Judge Puglia are considered likely U.S. Supreme Court nominees in a Reagan administration. 'Advice and Consent'

Senators have pushed their choices for judicial nominees practically since the time the ink dried on the U.S. Constitution, which gives the president the power of judicial appointment "with the advice and consent" of the Senate.

By the end of the 19th century, senators had a shorthand way of indicating they didn't agree with a president's choice by stating on the Senate floor that the candidate was "personally obnoxious."

For the last 50 years or so, senators in the president's party recommended

nominees for vacancies in their district. With rare exceptions, presidents have agreed with them. In states where both senators are political adversaries of the president, judges are usually picked after delicate negotiations involving the president's power to appoint and the senator's power to block confirmation.

The 1978 Omnibus Judgeship Act, which created 152 judicial positions, gave the president authority to set up merit selection panels. President Carter's subsequent executive order set up panels picked by the president to find and screen candidates for the circuit courts of appeals. Senators from about half the states have set up merit selection panels to produce one name or a list of names to be sent to the president for district court nominations.

But in reality, most judges still come from the president's party; and any new president could easily do away with the Carter executive order.

"Sen. Bob Dole [R-Kan.], for instance, expects Democrats will be appointed to the bench in Kansas. He has no illusions about that," a Senate source said. And President Carter "has no illusion that he's going to get someone on the bench who is Dole's arch-enemy."

Reagan Judges: In His Image?

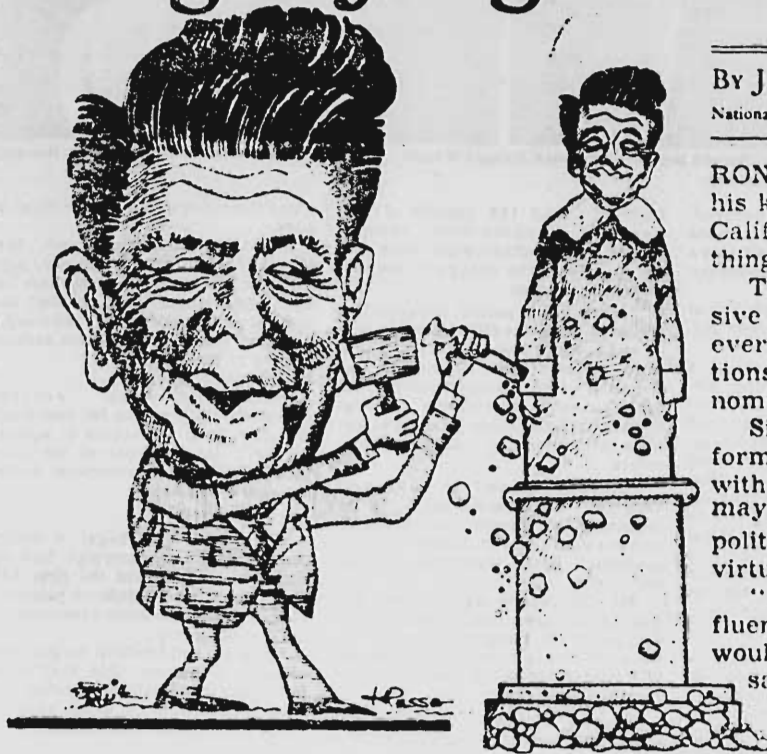
RONALD REAGAN feels he was betrayed by one of his key judicial appointees when he was governor of California, and his aides say he won't let the same thing happen again if he is elected president.

That resolve could lead to some of the most intensive political screening of federal judicial candidates ever, Reagan watchers say, and to uneasy confrontations between the president and senators over nominees.

Signals from Mr. Reagan's camp suggest that the former governor, determined to fill the federal bench with persons who share his conservative philosophies, may be ready to challenge a centuries-old system of political accommodation that has given U.S. senators virtual appointment power over federal judges.

"A senator from a given state would be very influential, but I'm quite certain that the senators wouldn't be the only source of recommendations," said William French Smith, Mr. Reagan's long-

SUMMARY OF ALLEGATIONS

On October 10, 1980 Loren Smith, Chief Counsel of the Reagan Bush Committee ("Reagan Bush"), filed a complaint with the Commission on behalf of Reagan Bush against the Committee for an Independent Judiciary ("Committee"), its treasurer and sixty named individuals. The complaint is based upon a full page advertisement which appeared in the National Law Journal of October 13, 1980, in which the Committee communicated its support for Jimmy Carter's presidential efforts and its misgivings with respect to the type of appointments Ronald Reagan might make to the Supreme Court were he to be elected President. (Attachment #1).

The complaint charges: that the Committee is a political committee within the meaning of 2 U.S.C. § 431(4); that an advertisement such as the one complained of costs \$1,850 (according to information purportedly received from the

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National Law Journal by the complainant); that the ad expressly advocates the election of a clearly identified candidate; that, at the time of the complaint, the Committee was not registered with the Federal Election Commission ("Commission"); and that the advertisement failed to state who paid for it and whether or not it was authorized by a candidate. Based on the above, the complaint indicates that there are violations of: 2 U.S.C. § 433(a) for the Committee's apparent failure to register within 10 days of becoming a political committee 1/; 2 U.S.C. § 434(b)(3) for the Committee's alleged failure to attempt to acquire contributor identification; and 2 U.S.C. § 441d for the Committee's alleged failure to disclose in the advertisement who paid for it and whether or not it was authorized by a candidate.

In addition, the complaint states the possibility that there have been violations of 2 U.S.C. §§ 434 and 441a and 26 U.S.C. § 9003(b)(2).

FACTUAL AND LEGAL ANALYSIS

A. The Committee

1. Registration

2 U.S.C. § 433(a) requires political committees to file a statement of organization within 10 days of becoming a political committee. A political committee is defined in 2 U.S.C. § 431(4) as "any committee, club, association or other group of persons which receives contributions aggregating in excess of \$1,000 during a calendar year or which makes expenditures aggregating in excess of \$1,000 during a calendar year. . . ." In its monthly report for the period ending September 30, 1980, the Committee disclosed that it had received contributions of \$1,445. (Attachment #3). Since the Committee did not register with the Commission until October 18, 1980, it appears to have violated 2 U.S.C. § 433(a) by not filing its statement of organization within the required 10 day period.

In its response to the Commission notification of receipt of the complaint, the Committee apologized for "the inadvertent delay in filing its Statement of Organization," indicating it had received contributions in excess of

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\$1000 on September 30 and contending that it had made no expenditures prior to that date. (Attachment #4, p.2). 2/

2. Disclaimer

2 U.S.C. § 441d(a) provides:

Whenever any person makes an expenditure for the purpose of financing communications expressly advocating the election or defeat of a clearly identified candidate, or solicits any contribution through any broadcasting station, newspaper, magazine, outdoor advertising facility, direct mailing, or any other type of general public political advertising, such communication --

(1) if paid for and authorized by a candidate, an authorized political committee of a candidate, or its agents, shall clearly state that the communication has been paid for by such authorized political committee, or

(2) if paid for by other persons but authorized by a candidate, an authorized political committee of a candidate, or its agents, shall clearly state that the communication is paid for by such other persons and authorized by such authorized political committee;

(3) if not authorized by a candidate, an authorized political committee of a candidate, or its agents, shall clearly state the name of the person who paid for the communication and state that the communication is not authorized by any candidate or candidate's committee.

The National Law Journal advertisement expressly advocated the election of a clearly identified candidate by stating that it "supports Jimmy Carter for President . . ." See Buckley v. Valeo, 424 U.S. 1, 44n. 52. Although the advertisement did indicate who paid for it, it did not state whether or not it had been authorized by a candidate. It appears, therefore, that the Committee is in violation of 2 U.S.C. § 441d with respect to this particular advertisement.

2/ Schedule E of the Committee's 30 day post general election report, however, indicates an expenditure of \$3,568.79 on August 17, 1980. (Attachment #8, p.4).

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In his response to the Commission, the Committee treasurer, Richard I. Beattie, has acknowledged the above-described deficiency, attributing it to an apparent oversight. (Attachment #4 p. 3) Enclosed with this response, however, was a copy of another advertisement which was carried in the New York Law Journal. The latter advertisement is identical in all respects to the first, except for its inclusion of the additional disclaimer language: "The Committee is not authorized by any candidate or any candidate's committee." (Attachment #5). 3/

Section 44ld appears to have been violated, although the circumstances support the Committee's contention that it was an oversight.

3. Reporting

2 U.S.C. § 434 details the reporting requirements for political committees. Subsection 434(b)(3) requires that each report filed must identify each "person . . . who makes a contribution. . . during the reporting period, whose contribution or contributions have an aggregate amount or value in excess of \$200 within the calendar year" A review of Committee reports does not suggest that there has been a violation of either this general section or the identification provision. In its monthly report for the period ending September 30, 1980, the Committee itemized one contribution in excess of \$200, and it contained the required identification. (Attachment #3, page 3). The Committee's 30 day post-general election report also shows one itemized contribution in excess of \$200 which contains the required identification (Attachment #8 p.3). At this time, therefore, it does not appear that there is reason to believe that the Committee violated 2 U.S.C. § 434.

4. Contribution Limits

2 U.S.C. § 441a imposes contribution limits on individuals and political committees. The Committee's Statement of Organization (Attachment #2) indicates that it is an unauthorized, single candidate committee, and its pre-general and post-general election reports have itemized its only reported expenditures on Schedule E, "Itemized Independent Expenditures" (Attachments #4, p.4 and #8 p.4, respectively). Since there is no other evidence suggesting that these expenditures are in fact excessive contributions, it does not appear at this time that the Committee has violated 2 U.S.C. § 441a.

3/ The same advertisement was also carried in Legal Times of Washington in its editions of October 13 and 20, 1980, and the full disclaimer was included. (Attachment #6).

5. Conditions For Eligibility

26 U.S.C. § 9003(b)(2) sets out conditions to which a major party candidate must certify, and cannot be violated as such. In any case, the Committee did not make such a certification. Accordingly, the Commission should find no reason to believe that the Committee has violated this provision.

6. Unauthorized Expenditures and Contributions

26 U.S.C. § 9012(f) provides:

[I]t shall be unlawful for any political committee which is not an authorized committee with respect to the eligible candidates of a political party for President and Vice President in a presidential election knowingly and willfully to incur expenditures to further the election of such candidates, which would constitute qualified campaign expenses, if incurred by an authorized committee of such candidates, in an aggregate amount exceeding \$1,000.

Although the complaint did not charge a violation of the above provision, it appears that the Committee has violated it. The pre-election report filed by the Committee on October 24, 1980 indicates that the Committee expended a total of \$2,150 in support of Jimmy Carter for advertisements in the National Law Journal (Attachment #7). In addition, the Committee filed a 24 hour independent expenditure report and a 30 day post-general election report which indicated further expenditures in support of Jimmy Carter (Attachments #8 and #9). It appears, therefore, that the Committee has violated 26 U.S.C. § 9012(f) by incurring expenditures in excess of \$1,000 on behalf of an eligible candidate.

Given the recent decision declaring 26 U.S.C. § 9012(f) unconstitutional, 4/ the Commission's future enforcement of the provision is brought into question. It is the view of this Office that the declaratory judgment must be given due consideration by the Commission, but that such consideration does not preclude the Commission from making an initial finding pending the outcome of the appeal. Accordingly, this Office recommends that the Commission find reason to believe that the Committee has violated 26 U.S.C. § 9012(f) by incurring

4/ Federal Election Commission v. Americans for Change, Nos. 80-1609, 80-1754 (D.D.C. September 30, 1980) (Three-Judge Court), notice of appeal filed with the United States Supreme Court on October 8, 1980.

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expenditures in excesss of \$1000 in behalf of candidate Jimmy Carter 5/.

B. The Sixty Named Individuals

The complaint was filed against the Committee, its treasurer and the "purported members" of the Committee. (Attachment #1, p.1) With the possible exception of the charge involving 2 U.S.C. § 441a, however, the violations complained of in the present circumstances are more properly directed at a committee - not officers or members of, or contributors to, a committee. Moreover, Committee reports on file with the Commission do not suggest that any of the sixty named respondents has exceeded his or her contribution limitations to the Committee under 2 U.S.C. § 441a.

For the foregoing reasons, the Office of General Counsel recommends that the Commission find no reason to believe that the sixty individual respondents named in the complaint, and the Committee treasurer, have violated the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended or Chapters 95 or 96 of Title 26, United States Code.

Recommendations

1. Find reason to believe that the Committee for an Independent Judiciary violated 2 U.S.C. §§ 433(a) and 441d, and 26 U.S.C. § 9012(f).

2. Find no reason to believe that the Committee for an Independent Judiciary violated 2 U.S.C. §§ 434, 441a or 26 U.S.C. § 9003(b)(2).

3. Find no reason to believe that the following individuals have violated the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended or Chapters 95 or 96 of Title 26, United States Code.

On behalf of the Reagan Bush Committee I am filing this complaint, pursuant to 2 U.S.C. § 437g against the Committee for an Independent Judiciary located at 209 E. 56th Street, Suite 1E, New York, New York 10022, its treasurer, Richard I. Beattie and the following individuals, who are the purported members of the committee: Floyd Abrams, John H. Adams, Terry Adamson, Barbara Allen Babcock, John Baker, Carole Bellows, James Bierman, Charles L. Black, Jr., Robert L. Bogomolny, Ernest Bonyhadi, William A. Borders, Jr., Wiley A. Branton, James Brosnahan, Michael A. Cardozo, Julius L. Chambers, William K. Coblentz, La Doris Corell, Lindsey Cowen, Sara-Ann Determan, Marian Wright Edelman, Bernard D. Fischman, Marvin E. This complaint is based upon a serious violation of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended. It involves violations of sections 433(a), 441d, 434(b)(3), of Title 2 of the U.S. Code as well as possible violations of 2 USC § 434 2 USC § 441a and 26 USC § 9003(b)(2).

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The basis of this complaint is an illegal independent expenditure made by an unregistered group which may be improperly coordinated with the Carter Reelection campaign. The October 13, 1980 issue of The National Law Journal carried an advertisement (see Exhibit A) using out-of-context and untrue statements to attack Governor Reagan's campaign and the Reagan judicial philosophy. The ad indicated that it was produced by The Committee for an Independent Judiciary and the above named persons. The ad also solicited funds for further such ads and for further anti-Reagan pro-Carter electoral activity.

The Committee for an Independent Judiciary calls itself a committee. It is a group that has apparently received contributions and it solicits contributions in this ad. The National Law Journal informed my office that a full page ad costs \$1850 and that the ad would have to have been placed no later than September 25, 1980. The ad expressly advocates the election of a clearly identified candidate--Jimmy Carter. The Committee for an Independent Judiciary is therefore a "political committee" as defined in 2 USC § 431(4).

2 USC § 433(a) requires all political committees to file a statement of organization within 10 days of becoming a political committee. The public records division of the FEC informed my office on October 8, 1980, that the Committee for an Independent Judiciary had not registered with the Commission.

2 USC § 441d requires any person who makes an expenditure "expressly advocating the election or defeat of a clearly identified candidate, or solicits any contribution through any ...magazine..." to include a disclaimer stating who paid for the advertisement and whether or not it is authorized by the candidate. The enclosed ad does not carry the required disclaimer.

The disclaimer provisions were originally included in the Act to prevent dirty tricks. The disclaimer is also necessary to warn contributors that they are contributing to a federal political committee. In this case contributors are not on notice that their contributions will count against their individual limits, possibly require disclosure and go to federal electoral activity. The solicitation makes no effort to acquire the contributor identification required by 2 USC § 434(b)3).

Since the ad carries no disclaimer we are unsure whether this is an independent expenditure, an unlawful contribution to the Carter/Mondale Committee, or an improper expenditure by the Carter/Mondale Committee.


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Since we do not know who is really behind this committee nor when it really was formed nor how much money it has raised or spent we do not know whether it has violated the disclosure provisions of 2 USC § 434, the limitations in 2 USC § 441a or the ban on private contributions to the Carter/Mondale Committee in 26 USC § 9003(b)(2).

We ask the Commission for an immediate action against these violations and a speedy investigation of the other possible violations. We request that the Commission seek to enjoin further illegal actions of this kind by this group. Since it is almost inconceivable that this group of attorneys was totally ignorant of the federal law we must assume that this ad was a knowing and willful violation of the law and should be dealt with as such.

Under penalty of perjury and subject to the provisions of section 1001 of title 18, United States Code, I swear that the above is true to the best of my knowledge.



To Those Concerned About A Possible Reagan Supreme Court:

WILL YOU join us in the Committee for an Independent Judiciary?

The Committee for an Independent Judiciary supports Jimmy Carter for President because the next President may appoint a majority of the Justices of the Supreme Court.

The possibility of Ronald Reagan's election presents the alarming prospect of a wide swing by the Court towards right wing ideology. On race relations, sex discrimination, freedom of speech and press, the rights of the accused, and on the environment, the Court has been a bulwark of liberty, decency and reason. We fear that a Reagan appointed majority on the Supreme Court would change the law for the worse in all these areas. And, this concern extends to all levels of the judiciary, as well.

The Republican platform pledges to work for the "appointment of Judges at all levels of the judiciary who respect traditional family values and the sanctity of innocent human life." Leaders of the bar who practice across the spectrum of legal issues have deplored the plank as an ideological test for judicial appointment. Former President of the American Bar Association, Leonard Janofsky said that it is "improper very dangerous and out of order. I would think there would be a lot of Republicans, including myself, who would be very much disturbed." The House of Delegates of the ABA has adopted a resolution condemning the plank. As Governor of California, Ronald Reagan made every effort to insure ideological purity in his judicial nominees. The National Law Journal reports that "[i]n California, Mr. Reagan's administration often would quiz potential nominees on the minutiae of their political thinking." His staff fed judicial selection panels a diet of blue chip, right of center white and male nominees.

On the other hand, there is near unanimity that Jimmy Carter's judicial appointments deserve high marks. In addition to having selected about 40 women and 50 members of minorities (more than all his predecessors combined) out of over 250 appointments, his choices have virtually all had backgrounds of professional excellence and high intellectual achievement. They include law school deans and professors, Wall Street type lawyers, sole practitioners, labor lawyers and public interest lawyers. Their performance generally has borne out the promise of their records.

Our Supreme Court decides not only disputes between adversaries, but sets rules of law and a moral tone for the country. Those who object to various Jimmy Carter policies and deeds have to ask not only whether Ronald Reagan would perform better. They must also ask whether a Reagan majority on the Supreme Court will help create the kind of America they want for the next generation, not merely the next four years.

The Committee will: 1) Send this letter to other lawyers and urge them to join. 2) Solicit contributions to pay for mailings, advertisements and related activity. 3) Urge its members to hold press conferences, write articles and letters to the editor, and appear on radio and television to express their views on this issue. 4) Urge undertaking related activity and formation of similar groups throughout the country. 5) Urge formation of student and faculty groups on campuses to express the views set forth in the statement.

The Committee will not take any position on other issues in the election.



We are writing in response to your letter of October 10, 1980, received by the Committee for an Independent Judiciary (the "Committee") on October 14, 1980, enclosing a copy of a complaint received by the Federal Election Commission (the "Commission") from the Reagan Bush Committee with respect to the activities of the Committee.

. The Reagan Bush Committee alleges that the Committee had not filed its Statement of Organization by October 8, 1980, apparently on the assumption that the Committee became a "political committee" on September 25, 1980. The Committee's Statement of Organization was not due by October 8, 1980. The Committee became a "political committee" subject to the reporting requirements under the Federal Election Campaign

October 29, 1980

Act, as amended (the "Act"), on September 30, 1980 when it received contributions in excess of \$1000. Contrary to the assertion of the Reagan Bush Committee, no expenditures had been made prior to that date.

A copy of the Committee's Statement of Organization, its monthly report for the month of September and its pre-election report, previously filed with the Commission pursuant to Sections 433 and 434 of the Act are enclosed for your convenience. The Committee apologizes for the inadvertent delay in filing its Statement of Organization.

. The Reagan Bush Committee alleges that the Committee, in its advertisement in the October 13, 1980 issue of The National Law Journal, published by the New York Law Publishing Company, failed to include a disclaimer "stating who paid for the advertisement and whether or not it is authorized by the candidate". Contrary to such assertion, the subject advertisement did include the disclaimer "Paid for by the Committee for an Independent Judiciary." The second part of the disclaimer, however, indicating whether the Committee is authorized by a candidate, was omitted



apparently as a result of an oversight. As evidence with respect thereto, the Committee's identical advertisement published in the New York Law Journal, also published by the New York Publishing Company, on October 7, 1980 (a copy of which is enclosed and marked Exhibit A) did contain the sentence: "The Committee is not authorized by any candidate or any candidate's committee."

. The Reagan Bush Committee alleges that the Committee's solicitation made "no effort to acquire the contributor identification required by 2 USC § 434 (b)3) (sic)." The Act does not require that a solicitation seek such information. However, as indicated on the enclosed reports, the Committee has obtained such information when required.

For the foregoing reasons, we believe the subject complaint of the Reagan Bush Committee should be dismissed.

The possibility of Ronald Reagan's election presents the alarming prospect of a wide swing by the Court towards right wing ideology. On race relations, sex discrimination, freedom of speech and press, the rights of the accused, and on the environment, the Court has been a bulwark of liberty, decency and reason. We fear that a Reagan appointed majority on the Supreme Court would change the law for the worse in all these areas. And, this concern extends to all levels of the judiciary, as well.

The Republican platform pledges to work for the "appointment of Judges at all levels of the judiciary who respect traditional family values and the sanctity of innocent human life." Leaders of the bar who practice across the spectrum of legal issues have deplored the plank as an ideological test for judicial appointment. Former President of the American Bar Association, Leonard Janofsky said that it is "improper . . . very dangerous and out of order. I would think there would be a lot of Republicans, including myself, who would be very much disturbed." The House of Delegates of the ABA has adopted a resolution condemning the plank. As Governor of California, Ronald Reagan made every effort to insure ideological purity in his judicial nominees. The National Law Journal reports that "[i]n California, Mr. Reagan's administration often would quiz potential nominees on the minutiae of their political thinking. . . . His staff fed judicial selection panels a diet of blue chip, right of center white and male nominees.



The Federal Election Commission notified you on October 10, 1980, of a complaint which alleges that your committee violated certain sections of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended ("FECA") and Chapters 95 and 96 of Title 26, U.S. Code. A copy of the complaint was forwarded to you at that time.

Upon further review of the allegations contained in the complaint and information supplied by you, the Commission, on January 9, 1981, determined that there is reason to believe that the Committee for an Independent Judiciary violated 2 U.S.C. §§ 433(a) and 441b, provisions of the FECA of 1971, as amended, and section 9012(f) of Chapter 95 of Title 26 U.S. Code. Specifically, it appears that your committee violated 2 U.S.C. § 433(a) by failing to file a statement of organization with the Commission within 10 days of becoming a political committee pursuant to 2 U.S.C. § 431(4).

Finally, although not alleged in the complaint, the Commission has determined based upon review of reports on file, that your committee may have violated 26 U.S.C. § 9012(f) by incurring expenditures in excess of \$1000 on behalf of a candidate who was eligible to receive public matching funds. Specifically, it appears that your committee may have violated this provision by expending a total of \$5,376, in support of Jimmy Carter, for advertisements in the National Law Journal, Philadelphia Inquirer, and Legal Times; and by expending an additional \$3,568.79 in support of Jimmy Carter in connection with mailings, printing, xeroxing, and other related charges itemized on Schedule E of the 30 day Post-General Report. 1/

Your response to the Commission's initial notification of this complaint did not provide complete information regarding the matter(s) in question. Please submit responses to the enclosed Request for Answers to Questions and Production of Documents within 10 days of receipt of this letter. Where appropriate, statements should be submitted under oath.

We are writing in response to your letter of October 10, 1980, received by the Committee for an Independent Judiciary (the "Committee") on October 14, 1980, enclosing a copy of a complaint received by the Federal Election Commission (the "Commission") from the Reagan Bush Committee with respect to the activities of the Committee.

. The Reagan Bush Committee alleges that the Committee had not filed its Statement of Organization by October 8, 1980, apparently on the assumption that the Committee became a "political committee" on September 25, 1980. The Committee's Statement of Organization was not due by October 8, 1980. The Committee became a "political committee" subject to the reporting requirements under the Federal Election Campaign

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October 29, 1980

Act, as amended (the "Act"), on September 30, 1980 when it received contributions in excess of \$1000. Contrary to the assertion of the Reagan Bush Committee, no expenditures had been made prior to that date.

A copy of the Committee's Statement of Organization, its monthly report for the month of September and its pre-election report, previously filed with the Commission pursuant to Sections 433 and 434 of the Act are enclosed for your convenience. The Committee apologizes for the inadvertent delay in filing its Statement of Organization.

. The Reagan Bush Committee alleges that the Committee, in its advertisement in the October 13, 1980 issue of The National Law Journal, published by the New York Law Publishing Company, failed to include a disclaimer "stating who paid for the advertisement and whether or not it is authorized by the candidate". Contrary to such assertion, the subject advertisement did include the disclaimer "Paid for by the Committee for an Independent Judiciary." The second part of the disclaimer, however, indicating whether the Committee is authorized by a candidate, was omitted


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apparently as a result of an oversight. As evidence with respect thereto, the Committee's identical advertisement published in the New York Law Journal, also published by the New York Publishing Company, on October 7, 1980 (a copy of which is enclosed and marked Exhibit A) did contain the sentence: "The Committee is not authorized by any candidate or any candidate's committee."

. The Reagan Bush Committee alleges that the Committee's solicitation made "no effort to acquire the contributor identification required by 2 USC § 434 (b)3) (sic)." The Act does not require that a solicitation seek such information. However, as indicated on the enclosed reports, the Committee has obtained such information when required.

For the foregoing reasons, we believe the subject complaint of the Reagan Bush Committee should be dismissed.

LINE 3 Only committees which have previously filed a Statement of Organization should fill in this block with the number which was originally assigned to the committee. All new committees will be assigned identification numbers when the completed statement has been received.

 - (b) The name of the highest level political committee sponsored by the parent organization.
Under "Relationship," write "affiliated."
- State party committees list any subordinate committees (i.e., any county, district or local committee) under the control or direction of the State committee.

Every political committee must have a treasurer and may designate an assistant treasurer who shall assume the duties and responsibilities of the treasurer, in the event the treasurer is unavailable. The Commission recommends that each political committee designate an assistant treasurer because no contribution or expenditure may be accepted or made by or on behalf of a political committee at a time when there is a vacancy in the office of the treasurer. No expenditure may be made for or on behalf of a political committee without the authorization of its treasurer or another agent authorized orally or in writing by the treasurer.

LINE 9 The committee must provide the name and mailing address of any bank, repository, or depository where the committee holds funds. Each political committee must have a checking account or transaction account at one of its depositories. All receipts of a political committee must be deposited into a designated campaign depository. All disbursements must be made by check or similar drafts drawn on an account at a designated campaign depository, except for expenditures of \$100 or less made from a petty cash fund.

TREASURER'S RESPONSIBILITIES

The treasurer of the political committee must preserve a copy of the Statement of Organization and each amendment for a period of not less than 3 years after the date of filing. The treasurer of the political committee is personally responsible for the timely and complete filing of this Statement and for the accuracy of any information contained in it.

Submit additional information on separate continuation sheets appropriately labeled and attached to this Statement of Organization. Indicate in the appropriate section when information is continued on separate page(s).

WHERE TO FILE

The original Statement of Organization (FEC FORM 1) and all amendments must be filed with the appropriate office as follows:

- The principal campaign committee of a candidate for the House of Representatives and political committees which support or oppose only candidates for the House file with the Clerk of the House, 1036 Longworth House Office Building, Washington, D.C. 20515.
- The principal campaign committee of a candidate for the Senate and political committees which support or oppose only candidates for the Senate file with the Secretary of the Senate, 119 D Street, N.E., Washington, D.C. 20510.
- An authorized committee which is not the principal campaign committee of a candidate files with the principal campaign committee which must forward a copy to the appropriate office listed herein.
- All other committees, including the principal campaign committee of a candidate for the office of President or Vice President, file with the Federal Election Commission, 1325 K Street, N.W., Washington, D.C. 20463.

Authorized committees of candidates for the House of Representatives and for the Senate must also file a copy of this Statement with the Secretary of State (or the appropriate State officer) of the State in which nomination or election is sought. Authorized committees of candidates for the office of President or Vice President must also file a copy of the Statement in each State in which the committee makes expenditures. Political committees other than authorized committees must also file a copy of this Statement in the State in which the committee has its headquarters.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR PREPARING SCHEDULE E

GENERAL

DEFINITION

The term "independent expenditure" means: "an expenditure for a communication by a person expressly advocating the election or defeat of a clearly identified candidate which is made without cooperation or consultation with any candidate, or any authorized committee or agent of such candidate, and which is not made in concert with, or at the request or suggestion of, any candidate, or any authorized committee or agent of such candidate."

WHO MUST FILE

Any political committee which makes independent expenditures must report these expenditures on Schedule E during the reporting period in which they were made.

Any independent expenditures aggregating \$1,000 or more made after the 20th day, but more than 24 hours, before 12:01 A.M. of the day of the election, must be reported within 24 hours after the independent expenditure is made. The report must include all of the information required on Schedule E and be filed with the appropriate office.

LINE BY LINE INSTRUCTIONS

For Schedule E, the committee must enter the full name of the committee and the FEC Identification Number in the appropriate boxes at the top of the page. For each person who receives a payment or disbursement during the calendar year aggregating in excess of \$200 in connection with an independent expenditure, the reporting committee must provide on Schedule E the full name, mailing address and zip code of the payee receiving any disbursement, the date and amount of any independent expenditure aggregating in excess of \$200, and the purpose of the independent expenditure (e.g., radio, television, newspaper). In addition, the committee must provide the name of the candidate, the office sought by the candidate (including State and Congressional District, where applicable), and whether the independent expenditure was in support of, or in opposition to, the candidate. A subtotal of itemized expenditures must be disclosed on Line (a) of the last

Schedule E filed. A subtotal of independent expenditures not required to be itemized must also be disclosed on Line (b) of the last Schedule E filed.

The total of all independent expenditures (Line (c)) is carried forward to the appropriate line of the Detailed Summary Page.

CERTIFICATION AND NOTARIZATION

The treasurer of any political committee which makes an independent expenditure must sign Schedule E and certify under penalty of perjury that the expenditure was in fact an "independent expenditure."

Additionally, Schedule E must be notarized.

NOTE: Any other person (other than a political committee) who makes an independent expenditure must file on FEC FORM 5.

WILL YOU join us in the Committee for an Independent Judiciary?

The Committee for an Independent Judiciary supports Jimmy Carter for President because the next President may appoint a majority of the Justices of the Supreme Court.

The possibility of Ronald Reagan's election presents the alarming prospect of a wide swing by the Court towards right wing ideology. On race relations, sex discrimination, freedom of speech and press, the rights of the accused, and on the environment, the Court has been a bulwark of liberty, decency and reason. We fear that a Reagan appointed majority on the Supreme Court would change the law for the worse in all these areas. And, this concern extends to all levels of the judiciary, as well.

The Republican platform pledges to work for the "appointment of Judges at all levels of the judiciary who respect traditional family values and the sanctity of innocent human life." Leaders of the bar who practice across the spectrum of legal issues have deplored the plank as an ideological test for judicial appointment. Former President of the American Bar Association, Leonard Janofsky said that it is "improper . . . very dangerous and out of order. I would think there would be a lot of Republicans, including myself, who would be very much disturbed." The House of Delegates of the ABA has adopted a resolution condemning the plank. As Governor of California, Ronald Reagan made every effort to insure ideological purity in his judicial nominees. The National Law Journal reports that "[i]n California, Mr. Reagan's administration often would quiz potential nominees on the minutiae of their political thinking . . ." His staff fed judicial selection panels a diet of blue chip, right of center white and male nominees.

On the other hand, there is near unanimity that Jimmy Carter's judicial appointments deserve high marks. In addition to having selected about 40 women and 50 members of minorities (more than all his predecessors combined) out of over 250 appointments, his choices have virtually all had backgrounds of professional excellence and high intellectual achievement. They include law school deans and professors, Wall Street type lawyers, sole practitioners, labor lawyers and public interest lawyers. Their performance generally has borne out the promise of their records.

Our Supreme Court decides not only disputes between adversaries, but sets rules of law and a moral tone for the country. Those who object to various Jimmy Carter policies and deeds have to ask not only whether Ronald Reagan would perform better. They must also ask whether a Reagan majority on the Supreme Court will help create the kind of America they want for the next generation, not merely the next four years.

The Committee will: 1) Send this letter to other lawyers and urge them to join. 2) Solicit contributions to pay for mailings, advertisements and related activity. 3) Urge its members to hold press conferences, write articles and letters to the editor, and appear on radio and television to express their views on this issue. 4) Urge undertaking related activity and formation of similar groups throughout the country. 5) Urge formation of student and faculty groups on campuses to express the views set forth in the statement.

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

On October 10, 1980, Loren Smith, Chief Counsel of the Reagan-Bush Committee ("Reagan-Bush"), held a press conference in front of Commission offices on K Street. At the conclusion of the press conference, Mr. Smith hand-delivered a complaint to the General Counsel's office.

Prior to his remarks, Reagan-Bush workers handed out Smith's prepared statement and a copy of an advertisement which appeared in the National Law Journal of October 13, 1980. (Attachments I and II). Attachment II was also included as the only exhibit to the complaint.

The complaint restates the allegations in Mr. Smith's statement, makes specific reference to provisions of the Federal Election Campaign Act ("FECA") and Title 26 of the United States Code, and names as respondents the Committee for an Independent Judiciary and the sixty individuals listed in the advertisement.

The Office of General Counsel sent a notification of receipt of complaint to all named respondents through Richard Beattie, identified in the advertisement as the committee treasurer. Individual follow-up notifications are to be sent to all respondents by close of business, October 14, 1980.

If, upon initial review and analysis, it appears to this office that there is no reason to believe that any of the respondents have violated FECA or Title 26, it will make an appropriate recommendation to the Commission by the end of this week. Otherwise, we will prepare a First General Counsel's Report after the expiration of 15 days from receipt of notification or after responses have been received.

STATEMENT BY LOREN SMITH

CHIEF COUNSEL, REAGAN-BUSH COMMITTEE

Today we are filing a complaint against the Committee for an Independent Judiciary and its members for violations of the federal election law. The committee has illegally solicited funds. It has failed to register with the Federal Election Commission. It has failed to file financial disclosure forms. And it may also be making illegal in-kind contributions to the Carter-Mondale Reelection Committee.

The facts of this complaint are as follows:

The committee, which is made up of members of the bar, who are presumed to know the law, has published an advertisement in The National Law Journal of October 13th which violates several provisions of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended. While the article makes false, distorted and out-of-context representations concerning Governor Reagan's judicial record, it displays its authors' true disregard for the law as well as the facts by its violations of the law. It is the kind of misleading political tactic the election law was passed to prohibit. And since this act was performed by members of the bar, it must be presumed that it was a knowing and willful violation by those individuals who prepared it.

The heart of this violation is a newspaper advertisement which contains misleading statements concerning Governor Reagan's record on judicial appointments, as well as his judicial philosophy. In the process, the authors of the ad quote former A.B.A. president

- more -

Leonard Janofsky in a way that implies he disapproves of Governor Reagan's record and intentions with respect to judicial selection. It is true that Mr. Janofsky disapproved of the Republican Party platform plank on judicial selection if that plank is interpreted as a litmus test on any particular issue. But, it is also true that Governor Reagan does not hold to such an interpretation.

In fact, the Governor has stated that he is vitally concerned with the quality of prospective appointees and that he will consider as an additional factor only a "broad compatibility" with his own judicial philosophy. Mr. Janofsky approves of Governor Reagan's position in this regard and also believes the Governor's appointments to the California bench were generally excellent. Thus, this illegal advertisement, which distorts Governor Reagan's position on judicial appointments, is apparently part of the Carter campaign of fear and divisiveness in its attempt to frighten members of the bar with the prospect of Reagan Supreme Court appointees.

This advertisement failed to carry a proper disclaimer indicating that it was an expenditure on behalf of the Carter candidacy. Federal law requires that the ad either indicate that it was authorized by the Carter campaign or that it was not authorized by any candidate.

The ad also solicited contributions for further efforts without putting contributors on notice that they would be contributing to a federal political committee. The ad asked individuals to spend money to further distribute the committee's election message without providing them with any indication that such distribution would constitute an independent expenditure or an illegal in-kind contribution to the Carter reelection effort.

Under the law, any group spending over \$1,000 to influence a federal election must register with the FEC within ten days of its creation, listing bank accounts and a treasurer. The Committee for an Independent Judiciary has not done this. We know The National Law Journal sells such advertising space as the committee bought for \$1,850 per page. We do not know how much other money they have spent in organizing efforts. They operate out of a blind letter drop in New York City.

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If the efforts of the committee were funded by the Carter campaign or operated in coordination with the Carter Committee, then another very serious violation of the contribution and disclosure laws is involved.

We are asking the FEC to investigate fully this matter as soon as possible. We are also asking the FEC to enjoin this group from further violations of the election law, and to remind them that as a group solely made up of lawyers, they have a special obligation to obey the law. As lawyers who seek to influence our legal system, they cannot claim ignorance of the law while purporting to instruct others in judicial policy. We feel the FEC should prosecute this complaint fully and immediately.

The Republican platform pledges to work for the "appointment of Judges at all levels of the judiciary who respect traditional family values and the sanctity of innocent human life." Leaders of the bar who practice across the spectrum of legal issues have deplored the plank as an ideological test for judicial appointment. Former President of the American Bar Association, Leonard Janofsky said that it is "improper . . . very dangerous and out of order. I would think there would be a lot of Republicans, including myself, who would be very much disturbed." The House of Delegates of the ABA has adopted a resolution condemning the plank. As Governor of California, Ronald Reagan made every effort to insure ideological purity in his judicial nominees. His staff fed judicial selection panels a diet of blue chip, right of center white and male nominees.

Their performance generally has borne out the promise of their records.

Our Supreme Court decides not only disputes between adversaries, but sets rules of law and a moral tone for the country. Those who object to various Jimmy Carter policies and deeds have to ask not only whether Ronald Reagan would perform better. 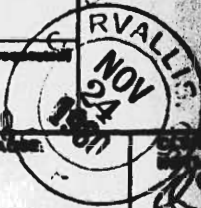

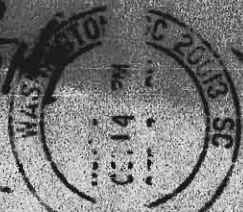

This letter is to notify you that on October 10, 1980, the Federal Election Commission received a complaint which alleges that you, your committee, and the individuals named in Attachment I violated certain sections of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended ("the Act") and 26 U.S.C. § 9003(b)(3). While this letter serves as notice to all the individuals named in the complaint, the Commission will attempt to notify each person separately. A copy of the complaint is enclosed. We have numbered this matter MUR 1308. Please refer to this number in all future correspondence.

Under the Act, you and the other respondents have the opportunity to demonstrate in writing, that no action should be taken against you or your committee in connection with this matter. Any party named in the complaint may respond to the allegations within 15 days of receipt of this letter. The complaint may be dismissed by the Commission prior to receipt of the response if the alleged violations are not under the jurisdiction of the Commission or if the evidence submitted does not indicate that a violation of the Act has been committed. Should the Commission dismiss the complaint, all parties will be notified by mailgram. If no response is filed within the 15 day statutory requirement, the Commission may take further action based on available information.

You are encouraged to respond to this notification promptly. In order to facilitate an expeditious response to this notification, we have enclosed a pre-addressed, postage-paid, special delivery envelope.


Please submit any factual or legal materials which you believe are relevant to the Commission's analysis of this matter. Where appropriate, statements should be submitted under oath.



On behalf of the Reagan Bush Committee I am filing this complaint, pursuant to 2 U.S.C. § 437g against the Committee for an Independent Judiciary located at 209 E. 56th Street, Suite 1E, New York, New York 10022, its treasurer, Richard I. The basis of this complaint is an illegal independent expenditure made by an unregistered group which may be improperly coordinated with the Carter Reelection campaign. The October 13, 1980 issue of The National Law Journal carried an advertisement (see Exhibit A) using out-of-context and untrue statements to attack Governor Reagan's campaign and the Reagan judicial philosophy. The ad indicated that it was produced by The Committee for an Independent Judiciary and the above named persons. The ad also solicited funds for further such ads and for further anti-Reagan pro-Carter electoral activity.

The Committee for an Independent Judiciary calls itself a committee. It is a group that has apparently received contributions and it solicits contributions in this ad. The National Law Journal informed my office that a full page ad costs \$1850 and that the ad would have to have been placed no later than September 25, 1980. The ad expressly advocates the election of a clearly identified candidate--Jimmy Carter. The Committee for an Independent Judiciary is therefore a "political committee" as defined in 2 USC § 431(4).

2 USC § 433(a) requires all political committees to file a statement of organization within 10 days of becoming a political committee. The public records division of the FEC informed my office on October 8, 1980, that the Committee for an Independent Judiciary had not registered with the Commission.

2 USC § 441d requires any person who makes an expenditure "expressly advocating the election or defeat of a clearly identified candidate, or solicits any contribution through any ...magazine..." to include a disclaimer stating who paid for the advertisement and whether or not it is authorized by the candidate. The enclosed ad does not carry the required disclaimer.

The disclaimer provisions were originally included in the Act to prevent dirty tricks. The disclaimer is also necessary to warn contributors that they are contributing to a federal political committee. In this case contributors are not on notice that their contributions will count against their individual limits, possibly require disclosure and go to federal electoral activity. The solicitation makes no effort to acquire the contributor identification required by 2 USC § 434(b) 3).

Since the ad carries no disclaimer we are unsure whether this is an independent expenditure, an unlawful contribution to the Carter/Mondale Committee, or an improper expenditure by the Carter/Mondale Committee.



Since we do not know who is really behind this committee nor when it really was formed nor how much money it has raised or spent we do not know whether it has violated the disclosure provisions of 2 USC § 434, the limitations in 2 USC § 441a or the ban on private contributions to the Carter/Mondale Committee in 26 USC § 9003(b)(2).

We ask the Commission for an immediate action against these violations and a speedy investigation of the other possible violations. We request that the Commission seek to enjoin further illegal actions of this kind by this group. Since it is almost inconceivable that this group of attorneys was totally ignorant of the federal law we must assume that this act was a knowing and willful violation of the law and should be dealt with as such.

Under penalty of perjury and subject to the provisions of section 1001 of title 18, United States Code, I swear that the above is true to the best of my knowledge.



To Those Concerned About A Possible Reagan Supreme Court:

WILL YOU join us in the Committee for an Independent Judiciary?

The Committee for an Independent Judiciary supports Jimmy Carter for President because the next President may appoint a majority of the Justices of the Supreme Court.

The possibility of Ronald Reagan's election presents the alarming prospect of a wide swing by the Court towards right wing ideology. On race relations, sex discrimination, freedom of speech and press, the rights of the accused, and on the environment, the Court has been a bulwark of liberty, decency and reason. We fear that a Reagan appointed majority on the Supreme Court would change the law for the worse in all these areas. And, this concern extends to all levels of the judiciary, as well.

The Republican platform pledges to work for the "appointment of Judges at all levels of the judiciary who respect traditional family values and the sanctity of innocent human life." Leaders of the bar who practice across the spectrum of legal issues have deplored the plank as an ideological test for judicial appointment. Former President of the American Bar Association, Leonard Janofsky said that it is "improper, very dangerous and out of order. I would think there would be a lot of Republicans, including myself, who would be very much disturbed." The House of Delegates of the ABA has adopted a resolution condemning the plank. As Governor of California, Ronald Reagan made every effort to insure ideological purity in his judicial nominees. The National Law Journal reports that "[i]n California, Mr. Reagan's administration often would quiz potential nominees on the minutiae of their political thinking. His staff fed judicial selection panels a diet of blue chip, right of center white and male nominees.

On the other hand, there is near unanimity that Jimmy Carter's judicial appointments deserve high marks. In addition to having selected about 40 women and 50 members of minorities (more than all his predecessors combined) out of over 250 appointments, his choices have virtually all had backgrounds of professional excellence and high intellectual achievement. They include law school deans and professors, Wall Street type lawyers, sole practitioners, labor lawyers and public interest lawyers. Their performance generally has borne out the promise of their records.

Our Supreme Court decides not only disputes between adversaries, but sets rules of law and a moral tone for the country. Those who object to various Jimmy Carter policies and deeds have to ask not only whether Ronald Reagan would perform better. They must also ask whether a Reagan majority on the Supreme Court will help create the kind of America they want for the next generation, not merely the next four years.

The Committee will: 1) Send this letter to other lawyers and urge them to join. 2) Solicit contributions to pay for mailings, advertisements and related activity. 3) Urge its members to hold press conferences, write articles and letters to the editor and appear on radio and television to express their views on this issue. 4) Urge undertaking related activity and formation of similar groups throughout the country. 5) Urge formation of student and faculty groups on campuses to express the views set forth in the statement.

The Committee will not take any position on other issues in the election.
