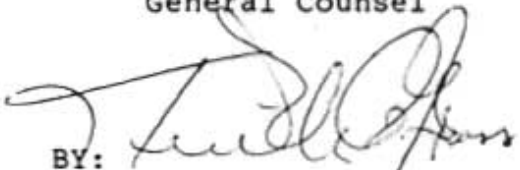

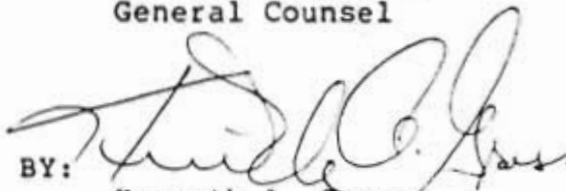

GENERAL COUNSEL'S REPORT

I. BACKGROUND

On January 29, 1982, the Commission found reason to believe that Life Amendment Political Action Committee, Inc. ("LAPAC") violated 2 U.S.C. § 434(b)(6)(B)(iii) and 11 C.F.R. § 104.3(b)(3)(vii)(B) by failing to correctly report independent expenditures totalling \$67,410.10 on its 1981 Mid-Year Report. Specifically, LAPAC in eleven independent expenditures failed to identify the name of the federal candidate supported or opposed as well as the office sought by the candidate and to allocate the expenditures by candidate. LAPAC was requested to file an amended report; however, as of June 1982, no amended report was filed. Subsequently, a General Counsel's Brief recommending that probable cause be found was forwarded to LAPAC on July 8, 1982.

On July 9, 1982, LAPAC submitted monthly reports amending its 1981 Mid-Year Report.

II. LEGAL ANALYSIS

The six monthly amendments submitted by LAPAC breakdown the independent expenditures previously reported by LAPAC as in

opposition to "Target Races." An amount of each independent expenditure is allocated to the candidate or candidates opposed by the expenditure and the office sought by the candidate is reported. The amendments have been reviewed by the Reports Analysis Division and were found adequate with regard to the reporting irregularities cited by the complainant.

The Office of General Counsel recommends taking no further action against Life Amendment Political Action Committee, Inc. and closing the file. The recommendation to take no further action is based on the fact that these independent expenditures had been reported to the Commission. LAPAC in reporting, however, failed to allocate as to the independent expenditures the candidates supported or opposed including the name of the candidate and the office sought by that candidate. The independent expenditures reported by LAPAC as "Target Races" were made in connection with a tabloid and a mailing which contained statements about 12 Senate candidates. The tabloid and mailing were submitted to the Commission by LAPAC.

LAPAC's initial response to the complaint expressed its willingness to report such information and suggested a footnote be added to an amended Schedule E showing the candidates involved in the "Target Races." The proposed footnote failed to allocate the independent expenditures per candidate and therefore was rejected by the Commission. Subsequently, a meeting was held with LAPAC officials and the amended reports filed.

III. RECOMMENDATION

1. Take no further action against Life Amendment Political Action Committee, Inc.
2. Close the file.
3. Send the attached letters.

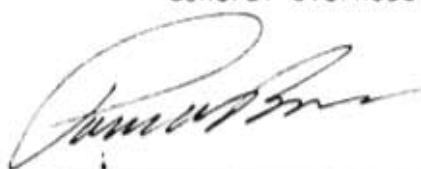

Based on a complaint filed with the Commission on November 2, 1981, and information supplied by your committee the Commission determined on January 29, 1982, that there was reason to believe that Life Amendment Political Action Committee, Inc. had violated 2 U.S.C. § 434(b)(6)(B)(iii), a provision of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended ("the Act"), and instituted an investigation of this matter.

After considering all the evidence available to the Commission, the Office of General Counsel is prepared to recommend that the Commission find probable cause to believe that a violation has occurred.

If you are unable to file a responsive brief within 15 days, you may submit a written request to the Commission for an extension of time in which to file a brief. The Commission will not grant any extensions beyond 20 days.

A finding of probable cause to believe requires that the Office of General Counsel attempt for a period of not less than thirty, but not more than ninety days to settle this matter through a conciliation agreement.

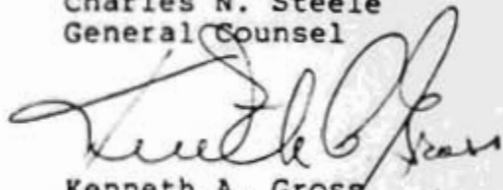

GENERAL COUNSEL'S BRIEF

I. Statement of the Case

Life Amendment Political Action Committee, Inc. ("LAPAC") failed to correctly report independent expenditures on its 1981 Mid-Year Report. Specifically, LAPAC reported fifteen independent expenditures on Schedule E. Of the fifteen independent expenditures, eleven expenditures totaling \$67,410.10 failed to identify the name of the federal candidate supported or opposed by the expenditure and the office sought by that candidate. LAPAC simply identified nine expenditures as "Target Races", one expenditure entry was left blank, and the remaining entry was identified as "Senate 1980." The complainant alleges that these entries violated 11 C.F.R. § 104.3(b)(3)(vii)(B).

II. Legal Analysis

The issue is whether LAPAC violated the Act and Regulations by failing to report on whose behalf each independent expenditure was made. The Act and Regulations require a committee to report the candidate's name and office sought by such candidate for each independent expenditure. (See 2 U.S.C. § 434(b)(6)(B)(iii))

LAPAC responded to the allegations in a letter signed by the treasurer, Paul Brown, and dated November 30, 1981. The Brown letter clarified the entry listed as "Senate 1980" and stated the Committee's reason for reporting most independent expenditures as "Target Races." Specifically, the "Senate 1980" entry, which were expenditures to MCI Communications totaling \$650, was in opposition to McGovern-Senate 1980. Mr. Brown's letter stated a typographical error was responsible for the deletion of "Mc Govern."

Mr. Brown further explained that LAPAC's reason for reporting independent expenditures as "Target Races" was that it was unsure "how to assign or itemize the costs" targeting twelve separate 1982 Senate elections. The expenditures reported by LAPAC as "Target Races" were made in connection with a tabloid and mailing which were submitted with the response. The response indicated that the expenditures reported as "Target Races" were in opposition to the twelve Senate candidates listed below:

LAPAC suggested that a footnote be used on an amended Schedule E to provide full disclosure of these expenditures.

The Regulation at 11 C.F.R. § 106.1 prescribes a general rule to use in allocating expenses. The Regulation reads:

Expenditures including independent expenditures, made on behalf of more than one candidate shall be attributed to each candidate in proportion to, and shall be reported to reflect, the benefit reasonably expected to be derived.

Additionally, in those instances where the expenditure is in opposition to a candidate, Schedule E requires that the expenditure be reported accordingly.

On January 29, 1982, the Commission found reason to believe LAPAC violated 2 U.S.C. § 434(b)(6)(B)(iii) and 11 C.F.R. § 104.3(b)(3)(vii)(B). The reason to believe notification letter to LAPAC referred the Committee to section 106.1 of the Regulations, requested that LAPAC review the independent expenditures marked as "Target Races", allocate the expenditures per candidate, and file an amended report disclosing the information.

LAPAC officials, Paul Brown and Jim Kapus, met with Commission staff on March 25, 1982. At the meeting, the allocation rule was discussed in relationship to LAPAC's reporting of independent expenditures. LAPAC officials agreed to allocate the expenses by candidate and file an amended report disclosing the information.

As it has been over two months since the March 25, 1982 meeting with LAPAC representatives and the 1981 Mid-Year Report amendment has not been filed by LAPAC, the Office of General

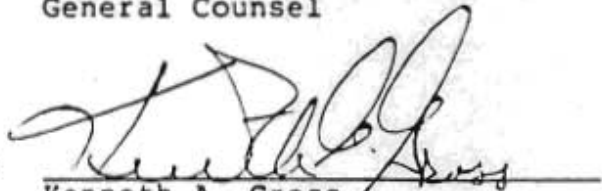

After considering all the evidence available to the Commission, the Office of General Counsel is prepared to recommend that the Commission find probable cause to believe that a violation has occurred.

If you are unable to file a responsive brief within 15 days, you may submit a written request to the Commission for an extension of time in which to file a brief. The Commission will not grant any extensions beyond 20 days.

A finding of probable cause to believe requires that the Office of General Counsel attempt for a period of not less than thirty, but not more than ninety days to settle this matter through a conciliation agreement.

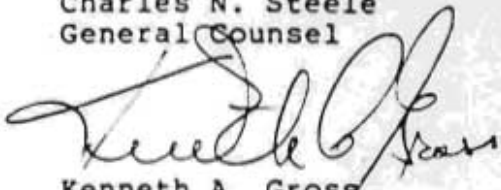

This is in regard to several matters currently pending with the FEC.

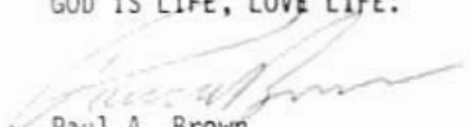

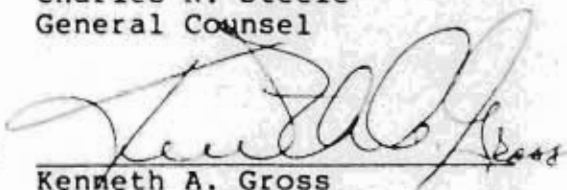

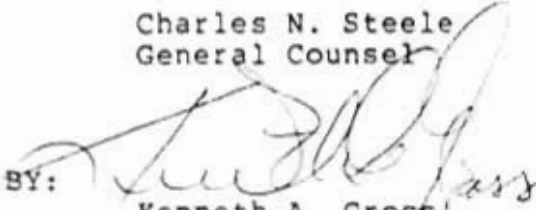

The complaint alleges that these entries violate 11 C.F.R. § 104.3(b)(3)(vii)(B).

A copy of the complaint was forwarded to Life Amendment Political Action Committee, Inc. Paul Brown responded to the complaint by letter which was received by the Office of General Counsel on November 30, 1981.

LEGAL AND FACTUAL ANALYSIS

The issue is whether LAPAC violated the Act and Regulations by failing to report on whose behalf each independent expenditure was made. The Act and Regulations require a committee to state the candidate's name and the office sought by such candidate for each independent expenditure. Expenditures including independent expenditures, made on behalf of more than one candidate shall be attributed to each candidate in proportion to, and shall be reported to reflect, the benefit reasonably expected to be derived.

Additionally, in those instances where the expenditure is in opposition to a candidate, Schedule E requires that the expenditure be reported accordingly.

As the independent expenditures were incorrectly reported on the 1981 Mid-Year Report, it is recommended that the Commission find reason to believe LAPAC violated the Act and Regulations. It is also recommended that a letter be sent to LAPAC referring the Committee to 11 C.F.R. § 106.1 and requesting an amendment be filed attributing the costs of the tabloid and mailing per candidate.

RECOMMENDATION

1. Find reason to believe that Life Amendment Political Action Committee, Inc. violated 2 U.S.C. § 434(b)(6)(B)(iii) and 11 C.F.R. § 104.3(b)(3)(vii)(B).
2. Send the attached letter.

COMPLAINT

1. The Federal Election Commission's ("Commission") records show that on or about August 3, 1981, the Life Amendment Political Action Committee ("LAPAC") filed a report with the Commission.

2. Said report includes four pages itemizing LAPAC's independent expenditures. (Copies of pages 1-3 are attached hereto as Exhibit A).

3. The Commission's regulations and Schedule E require persons to "provide a statement which indicates whether such independent expenditure is in support of, or in opposition to a particular candidate, as well as the name of the candidate and office sought by such candidate (including State and Congressional Districts, when applicable)..." (emphasis supplied) 11CFR Sec. 104.3 (b)(3)(vii).

4. I have examined LAPAC's independent expenditures and discovered that LAPAC has repeatedly failed to disclose the name

office sought by each candidate LAPAC has opposed with independent expenditures.

5. LAPAC lists expenditures totaling \$67,410.10 to eleven different persons or companies without disclosing the candidate(s) or office(s) sought by the candidate(s) it was opposing. Rather than disclosing the specific candidate(s) and office(s), LAPAC refers obliquely to "Target Races" (See Exhibit A at pages 1-3), "Target Races 82" (See Exhibit A at page 3) and "Senate 1980" (See Exhibit A at page 3). This clearly violates the letter and the spirit of the law.

Wherefore, I hereby request that the Commission initiate a compliance matter on this Complaint pursuant to 2USC Sec. 437g and 11CFR Part III.

I am in receipt of your letter advising me of the complaint filed against the Life Amendment Political Action Committee with regard to proper reporting.

By way of background, let me advise you that over the past years our organization has experienced some difficulties in the filing of FEC Reports. An audit of our organization just recently completed has been helpful to our staff in learning how to be more completely explicit in our filings. Unfortunately, that assistance from the Commission was not received at the time of our August 3rd report.

With respect to the complaint in question, in one instance in the fourth block of page 3 of Schedule E, there is an obvious typographical omission. The typist inserted "South Dakota '80" and "Senate 1980" "Oppose" but failed to type in McGovern.

With respect to the reference to "Target Races," I am enclosing a sample copy of our newsletter and of a mailing done (costs for which are cited in various places on the Schedule E as Target Races) as a part of our 1982 Target Race Program. As you can see the items are pegged to twelve separate U.S. Senate Races for 1982 which raises the Solomon's question of how to assign or itemize costs. Our solution was to "lump" these costs to the Target Race Program.

It is interesting to note that in conversations with two members of the FEC staff, neither could come up with a "correct" method of breaking out these costs! One, however, did suggest a "footnote" be placed somewhere within the report indicating the twelve Senate races which comprise the Target Race Program; but, even then, there was no assurance that such a method would be "correct" or even "more correct."

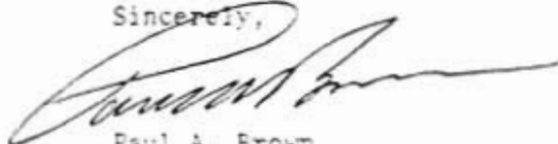

Reader Beware — Only LAPAC is LAPAC

At a press conference during the first week of June, a pro-life political action committee announced a "target list" of seven senators and representatives it planned to work against in 1982.

Will the Real Tip O'Neill Please Stand Up

Lies, Slander and Death to the Pre-Born

A few months ago an article appeared in a magazine called New York Magazine. It was written by a young man named Michael Novak. In the article the author credited me with a rather unkind remark about one of the leading baby killers in America. . . . Karen Mulhauser. Mrs. Mulhauser is President of the National Abortion Rights Action League (NARAL).

The alleged quote is but another example of shoddy journalism and how low some in the secular press will stoop for a "story." It was denied by me in a letter to the editor of New York Magazine. The magazine failed to print my demand for a retraction. When asked on a radio talk show by the host if he had my alleged remarks on tape, Mr. Novak stated that he did not. When asked if the rest of the interview was on tape the author said, "Yes." I find that a rather odd fact that he would have everything I said during the interview, on tape, but didn't have the "slandering remark."!!

About a month after the New York Magazine article my wife and I were interviewed by Time Magazine for over three hours. When the magazine appeared in print a few weeks later I was amazed to find that the only "quote" attributed to me in the story was a repeat of the New York Magazine lie. The fact is that during the three hour interview the alleged comment by me on Mrs. Mulhauser was never mentioned!!

A few days ago I received a phone call from a friend in North Carolina stating that a woman's group had repeated the false statement in an attack on LAPAC and myself in a half page newspaper ad. Needless to say I was not very surprised. The point that I stress in this article is that some of the press would love nothing better than to see the pro-life movement go away and to write and repeat a lie is nothing new to the shoddy anti-life press.

Recently in Washington, D.C. a reporter for the Washington Post was awarded the "Nobel Prize" for a story on a "eight-year-old heroin addict." Much to the chagrin of the editorial staff and owners of the Post, the truth surfaced that the story was indeed a lie and the reporter was fired and the prize returned. I could cite many more stories in which the press has been a bit short of truthful, but I think one more will do.

Nationally syndicated columnist Jack Anderson ran a story shortly after the 1980 elections in which he stated that LAPAC distributed flyers throughout the state of South Dakota with pictures of dead babies all over them. The truth was that indeed we did distribute hundreds of thousands of flyers, but none were like the ones described by Anderson. Add to that the fact that I had hand-delivered to Mr. Anderson's office a copy of everything we passed out in South Dakota and they still printed a lie and you will be closer to the truth. I should also state that the first part of that "lie" appeared in the New York Times.

Now please don't believe that this article is an attack on all of the press. Many good reporters still stick to the facts and write only the truth. Even Ms. Magazine, for whom this writer has been interviewed several times, has the decency to call and check "quotes" before they publish. That I find very commendable. The thing that irks me the most about these lies is that it is nothing more than a deliberate attempt on the part of some of the press to discredit not only me but the movement as a whole. Time magazine refused to print a retraction or even a letter denying the alleged quote. New York Magazine would not even reply to the same demand. And now as I predicted when it first happened, the abortionists are using it to their own advantage and in doing so they are trying as best they can to cover up the fact that they advocate killing and indeed kill babies.

Over the past few years we have documented time and time again the fact that the abortionists will lie and distort truth in an attempt to avoid the real horror of their actions. This is, then, but another example of what these people will do to further their cause. . . . DEATH. DEATH to the most helpless of all human beings, the pre-born child. . . . and covered with another lie called "freedom of choice" for everyone but the one killed by these butchers.

Michael Novak of New York Magazine . . . you are a liar.

Time Magazine . . . you repeated a lie.

DEFEAT THE DEADLY DOZEN

On Target

The Deadly Dozen . . .

Featured in this issue of LAFACtion are twelve Senators, who for the benefit of the pre-born child, must be defeated in the 1982 elections. All of these men have had low (20% to 0%) ratings from LAFAC.

A little over two years ago I had the pleasure of releasing LAFAC's target list of Senators to be defeated in 1980. The release was met with mixed reaction by both pro-life and anti-life groups combined. The anti-lifers all were repulsed that we would attempt to defeat the likes of: George McGovern, Birch Bayh, John Culver and others. Some in the pro-life movement shouted foul and claimed that the target list was wrong, poorly timed and denied any association with it.

The point to be stressed is that the pro-life movement has become a rather large political force and has the ability to carry through with its threats. Over the past two weeks I had the pleasure of watching my wife, Judie Brown, debate Karen Mulhauser who is President of NARAL. Being rather biased I think Judie bested her the first time and destroyed her the second. Most noteworthy, however, is an interesting line that Ms. Mulhauser is using over and over with the press. She is now stating that the "abortion issue is a moral issue and should be debated before the public on TV, etc." and then she adds: "Abortion is not and should not be a 'political issue.'" The opposition is running scared and with good reason. They want to avoid the political arena because they know one thing: we are beating them soundly at the ballot box and they don't like it one bit.

The deadly dozen for 1982 can and must be defeated — each and every one of them. LAFAC will lead the way and so long as these men continue to vote to kill babies we will oppose them. However, we hastily add, that at such time as any of these Senators renounces the anti-life, pro-death philosophy and agrees to vote for the Human Life Amendment we will gladly remove them from the list and replace them with another.

The opposition is running scared and with good reason.

North Dakota. Quentin Burdick.

In the previous Senate race of 1980, North Dakotans put themselves behind the pro-life movement by electing pro-life Congressman Mark Andrews (R) rather than pro-abortionist Kent Johannaeson for the seat left vacant by retiring Sen. Milton Young. But if a strong pro-life candidate does not appear soon, 1982 could turn out to be a different story.

One factor working against Sen. Quentin Burdick is his age. In 1982 he will be 74. But Sen. Young did not retire from the Senate until he was 80 years old. And Burdick is not unpopular owing to his constituent services, relatively low key non-abrasive style, and his name — his father was a popular member of the U.S. House for years.

The lone Congressman, freshman Al Byrum L. Dorgan (D) is not expected to mount a primary challenge though he would be interested in the race in the unlikely event that Burdick decided not to run for reelection. In any event Dorgan is no friend of the unborn.

Other possible candidates include Jim Smykowski who lost to Dorgan in 1980 and State Senators Jens Tenneson (Assistant GOP leader) and Bob Melland (Appropriations Committee Chairman).

On the positive side Mr. Burdick recently voted "pro-life" in the Senate vote to pass the Hyde Amendment and has also suggested a states rights amendment as a solution to abortion. Keep coming, Senator Burdick, and we will drop you from the list.

Maryland. A Major Effort

Already, two major organizations have begun an all out effort to defeat Maryland's pro abortion Senator Paul Sarbanes (D). (LAPAC rating zero.) One of these groups, the Maryland GOP, has sent out letters to 100,000 Republican homes criticizing Sarbanes for losing "touch" with the people of Maryland. The fundraising letter included an informal poll of possible candidates including former Senator J. Glenn Beall, former Congressman and current Prince Georges County Executive Larry Hogan, Cong. Marjorie Holt and Robert Pascal, County Executive of Anne Arundel County.

The other organization heavily involved is the National Conservative Political Action Committee (NCPAC) which plans to spend over \$400,000 in their effort to defeat Sarbanes whom they label the "biggest spender in Congress." Already NCPAC is running highly effective TV ads and conducting polls throughout the state on a regular basis. One such survey conducted by Arthur Finkelstein and Associates for NCPAC showed Sarbanes leading 4th district Republican Marjorie Holt in a hypothetical race by a narrow 43.7% - 37.5% lead with 18.8% undecided. Clearly Sarbanes is vulnerable. Marjorie Holt with a LAPAC rating of 40% is considered an early favorite. Prince Georges County executive Larry Hogan would also be a major contender should he choose to run for the office. A former congressman, he authored the Hogan amendment to curtail federal funding of abortions which is now called the Hyde amendment and is now leading the fight to stop abortions in hospitals owned or operated by the P.G. County government.

Ohio. An Early Start

Reelection won't come easy for Ohio's Senator Howard Metzenbaum (LAPAC rating of zero). Eleven term Cong. John Ashbrook with a perfect LAPAC rating has already been campaigning for an entire year for the Republican nomination and has been building a strong grassroots organization throughout the state. Multimillionaire Fred Lannon is serving as his finance director. And although he has not yet announced, Gov. Rhodes is reportedly considering the race himself. Rhodes was strongly supported by pro life groups in his 1978 gubernatorial race, and Ohio's Moral Majority Executive Director Joseph Lewis told a Cincinnati Post reporter that Rhodes and Ashbrook "may both be 100 percenters (according to Moral Majority)."

Gov. Rhodes is now in his fourth term as Governor which carries with it certain political liabilities and blessings. As a long standing politician he has built a following but inevitably he has taken positions which upset others. He does have proven vote getting ability in statewide races but in 1982 he will be 73. Other less well known figures may jump into the race if Rhodes decides not to. Even if the Republican primary is long and hard fought, the general election is expected to be even nearer.

LAPAC has endorsed Cong. Ashbrook.

Massachusetts. Yes, It's Possible

There's no doubt about it. The Kennedy name would be hard to beat in Massachusetts. But Ted Kennedy is far more leftist than his constituency in Massachusetts and he has a consistent pro abortion voting record which many of the pro life Catholics in the state are not aware of — hard as that may be to believe. Already the campaign to defeat Kennedy is well under way with the newly formed Massachusetts based political action committee Citizens Organized to Replace Kennedy (CORR) C.O.R.K. is headed by Mike Korbey who played a leading role in the successful passage of proposition 2 1/2 which few observers had given a chance of passage. Among Democrats considering a primary challenge, Arthur Clark, the mayor of Waltham, and Newman Flanagan, the very popular district attorney of Suffolk County, are the most mentioned. Flanagan, an Irish-Catholic, whose district includes the entire city of Boston where Kennedy is strongest would be the stronger candidate. Even if such a challenge were unsuccessful, it could divide Democrats enough to boost the chance of a Republican in the general election.

A frequently mentioned Republican is the well known regional TV personality Avi Nelson who narrowly lost a primary challenge to Senator Edward Brooke in 1978. Dr. Mudred Jefferson, a black female surgeon and past president of National Right To Life, has also been mentioned as have Raymond Shamie, a conservative businessman from Sharon, and State Representatives Leon Lombardi and Paul Gebhardt. Finally, Elliot Richardson awaits the results of Republican party polling before making up his mind.

New York. Let's Do It Again

After winning a big one in the 1980 Senate election, pro lifers in New York hope to repeat their success in 1981. And their hopes are not unfounded. A post election poll done by Market Opinion Research (MOR) shows pro abortion Senator Daniel Patrick Moynihan (LAPAC rating zero) in trouble. When voters surveyed were asked if they wanted Moynihan to be reelected a surprisingly low 34% said yes. When matched against the equally pro abortion (?) former Cong. Elizabeth Holtzman, Moynihan trailed 38-43% with two other possible Democratic primary opponents, 24th District Cong. Richard Ottinger (LAPAC rating zero) and NY City Council President Carol Bellamy running close. This could again divide the Democrats and give a pro-life Republican a better chance of winning in the general election.

Who runs as a Republican will depend a lot on the action taken by pro life Congressman Jack Kemp. His options include running for Governor, Senator or simply reelection to the House. The list of interested Republicans is growing and includes former Rep. Bruce Caputo (who received nationwide publicity for his role in the hearings on Korean influence peddling in the House) and Lewis Lehrman, an economist and President of the Rise Above drug chain.

California. Hayakawa Gets It From All Sides

The National Committee for an Effective Congress (NCEC), a leftist political action committee, and LAFAC finally have something in common: both have targeted 74 year old Senator Hayakawa for defeat albeit for different reasons. (Senator Hayakawa's dismal 30% LAFAC rating forced our hand.) But PACs aren't Hayakawa's only opposition. As far as candidates are concerned opposition comes from all ranges of the political spectrum and the race has begun in earnest. Voters are not all that enamored with the Senator either: indeed, some observers believe that support for Hayakawa is so shallow he may yet back out of his reelection bid.

On the Republican side there are 2 Congressmen in the running: McCloskey (12th congressional district) and Barry Goldwater, Jr. (30th C.D.) the son of Arizona's senior Senator. From a pro life standpoint Pete McCloskey with a LAFAC rating of zero would be a step backward while Barry Goldwater, Jr. would be an improvement (50% LAFAC rating). Other possible candidates include Maureen Reagan the President's daughter and Congressman Bob Dornan (27th C.D.) who is one of the best friends the pro-life movement ever had. If Maureen Reagan runs she can be expected to draw votes from the same group as McCloskey since both tend to be more "liberal" on the social issues.

A poll taken by Field and Associates earlier this year of 445 Republicans gave Goldwater the early lead with 32% favoring him for the nomination compared to Hayakawa with 19%, McCloskey with 16%, Maureen Reagan (8%), Bob Dornan (5%) and John Rousselot (5%).

On the Democratic side the outcome looks less uncertain. Governor Jerry Brown would be the odds on favorite should he decide to run, as expected. Another candidate, former State Senator Dennis Carpenter, has begun lining up support and may receive the endorsement of the well known State Senator "Bill" Richardson. Ted Bruinsma, Dean of Loyola Law School, is also raising money for a Senate bid.

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Florida. Pro Life Possibilities

A poll released on April 19th which was conducted by four state papers showed two term Democrat Senator Lawson Chiles (with a LAFAC rating of only 20) with a 60% job approval rating. The good news however is that in the same poll only 45% of the respondents said they would like to see Chiles reelected. Any incumbent below the 50% mark on that question is viewed as vulnerable, especially with an opposition at the present time. Chiles may also be in trouble for some of his votes including support of the Panama Canal treaty. The strong support for Reagan in the state might also prove a handicap. And as Chiles himself is keenly aware, Florida elected a Republican, Paula Hawkins, in the last election.

Given these results it would appear that Chiles could be beaten by a credible candidate who had the ability to raise money. No Democratic candidates have as yet surfaced but there are two major pro life possibilities on the Republican side — 6th district Cong. C. W. Bill Young (LAFAC rating 50%) and 10th district Cong. Skip Batista (LAFAC rating 50%). However, Young has not yet made a decision on whether he will run and observers believe Batista is more likely to run for Governor.

Some celebrities have been mentioned including former astronaut and current Eastern Airlines President Frank Borman as well as golfing pros Arnold Palmer and Jack Nicklaus.

Nevada. Showdown Likely

A bruising primary battle for the Democratic nomination for Senate appears to be shaping up. Four-term incumbent Sen. Howard Cannon (LAPAC rating of 80) who will be 70 years of age at the time of the election is trailing popular Congressman Al Jim Santini (LAPAC rating of 40 %) by as much as fifteen to twenty percentage points in polls done over the last sixteen months.

Sen. Cannon has lost his post as chairman of the Senate Commerce, Science and Transportation Committee with the change in party control and many Nevadans believe it is "time for a change." Cannon may also not be conservative enough for his constituency — for instance he voted in favor of the Panama Canal treaties. Geography might however work in his favor. Although Santini's home is in Las Vegas and he was an attorney and judge there, he is a native of northern Nevada. Since the other Senator, Paul Laxalt, is also from Northern Nevada, voters from Clark County might try to preserve regional representation by voting for Cannon.

On the Republican side the list of potential candidates is short. Possibilities include Gov. Robert List and State Senator Cliff McConnell, a conservative.

Connecticut. Weicker in Trouble

Senator Lowell Weicker, with a LAPAC rating of zero, is headed for trouble. Republicans in the state are in "open rebellion" owing to his voting record. The last straw appears to have been his opposition to Reagan's nomination of Alexander Haig. Frequently mentioned challengers to Weicker for the Republican nomination (which might turn out to be his biggest hurdle to re-election) include Robin Moore, author of *The Green Berets* and *The French Connection*. A committee is also being set up to draft Ann P. Unice, who served two terms as Mayor of Hartford before becoming director of the Office of Consumer Affairs for the U.S. Department of Transportation. Her profile — Catholic, Italian, and female — would serve her well in Connecticut. Prescott Bush, Jr., brother of the Vice President, is also considering the race. His father was a former Senator from the State but Prescott has never run himself. Prescott Bush is not likely to be the first choice of the State's so called "Reaganites."

Possible Democrat opponents include Congressman Toby Moffett (with a LAPAC RATING of zero), first term Congressman Sam Gejdenson, State Senator Joseph Lieberman, and John Downey, head of the Public Utility Control Authority.

West Virginia. Bye, Bye, Byrd.

As Senate Majority Leader, Robert Byrd looked invulnerable. But now that he no longer holds that position of power a number of individuals and committees agree with LAFAC that the pro-abortion Senator can be beaten. (Robert Byrd had a zero rating from LAFAC last year.)

Already an ad hoc committee known as Bye, Bye Byrd has been organized to defeat the Senator. This committee will be primarily involved in fundraising and is conducting polls to see if Byrd is as out of tune with W. VA. voters as many feel he is.

Possible contenders include former Governor Arch Moore who was defeated by millionaire Jay Rockefeller when he attempted to recapture the Governorship in 1990 and Walter Price, a former State Representative. Price has formed an exploratory committee and will announce his final decision this summer.

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The Human Life Bill It Isn't All Roses

In *Roe v. Wade* (1973) the U.S. Supreme Court indicated that the "preborn child" could not be considered a "person" within the meaning of the 14th Amendment to the U.S. Constitution, because that amendment did not explicitly define the preborn child as a person. However, Section 5 of the Amendment reads: "Congress shall have the power to enforce, by appropriate legislation, the provisions of this article", and since the Amendment does not explicitly define the preborn child as not a person, lawyer Stephen Galtsoff has suggested that under Section 5 Congress may define the preborn child as a person, especially since the U.S. Supreme Court deferred in *Roe v. Wade* by stating that it was incapable of resolving the question of when human life begins. Thus, only a simple majority of Congress would be required to pass a federal statute that would prohibit state involvement in abortion, and H.R. 900 / S. 156 at the time of this writing reads as follows:

The Congress finds that present day scientific evidence indicates a significant likelihood that actual human life exists from conception.

Upon the basis of this finding, and in the exercise of the powers of the Congress, including its power under Section 5 of the Fourteenth Amendment to the Constitution of the United States, the Congress hereby declares that for the purpose of enforcing the obligation of the states under the Fourteenth Amendment not to deprive persons of life without due process of law, human life shall be deemed to exist from conception without regard to race, age, health, defect, or condition of dependency, and for this purpose "person" shall include all human life as defined herein.

H.R. 900 / S. 156 are identical bills before both houses of Congress, and even though there are problems with the bills (e.g. use of the word, "conception," which is increasingly being defined as referring to the point or time of implantation, rather than the word "fertilization"), at the present time they are the only bills introduced. Another proposal, based upon a draft by law professor Joseph P. Witherspoon

of the University of Texas, is currently "on hold" being considered by members of Congress for possible sponsorship. The Witherspoon proposal is preferable to the bills above in that it not only contains the word, "fertilization," but it also contains the word "sex" ("gender" would be preferable), in the list of words after the phrase, "without regard to." In addition, the Witherspoon draft correctly handled the controversial "abortion to save the mother's life" concern not by providing that abortion was acceptable to save mothers' lives but by saying "No unborn person shall be deprived of life by any person. Provided, however, that nothing in this subsection shall prohibit medical procedures required to prevent the death of a pregnant woman when, in using them, every reasonable effort is made to preserve the life and health of the unborn person." This wording covers, for example, the difficulty encountered in the rare ectopic pregnancy in the event that an operation is necessary to save the woman's life. In such an event, an "abortion" is not the "least" of the operation, but rather an unfortunate indirect result of an operation necessary to save a life.

Professor Witherspoon has also contended that in support of a Human Life Bill we should use this opportunity to reargue that *groe v. Wade* incorrectly interpreted Congressional intent by finding that the word "person," in the Fourteenth Amendment did not include a preborn child. This, in effect, might provide the U.S. Supreme Court with a means of reversing itself on *Roe v. Wade* while ruling on the constitutionality of the Human Life Bill if it becomes law and were to be challenged in the courts. Although the Supreme Court is supposedly above being influenced by the "prevailing opinion of the times," such is not always the case, and given sufficiently convincing historical arguments, the Court may indeed reverse its earlier decision given the increasingly "pro-life" mood of the nation. In that regard, the reader should refer to this writer's article in the Winter 1981 issue of this journal where John Locke is quoted: "Therefore I doubt not but children by the exercise of their sense about objects, that affect them in the womb, receive some few ideas

before they are born." This existence of a human being prior to birth, coupled with Locke's concept of "natural rights," should then be considered in the context of this writer's article in the Summer 1979 issue of this journal.

Even though an analysis of Congressional intent as expressed by individuals such as John A. Bingham and George F. Edmunds who either drafted or supported the Fourteenth Amendment in the mid-Nineteenth Century, as well as an analysis of that Congressional intent by the noted U.S. Supreme Court Justice Stephen Field, should reveal the preborn child should be considered a person under the Fourteenth Amendment, the presently proposed Human Life Bill may face difficulty if challenged as a law before the current Supreme Court. Given the present Court's pro-abortion bias, it may choose to rule that a Congressional statute cannot override a Supreme Court's interpretation of a constitutionally inferred "right to privacy" which allows women the right to abortion. After all, the Court may argue it is the sole interpreter of the Constitution which is the "Supreme law of the land," and until the Constitution itself is altered, then the Court's interpretation that the word person in the Fourteenth Amendment does not include the preborn child still stands.

But let us say that the current Supreme Court agrees that Congress does have the right to define the preborn as persons. Would this then turn into a "states rights" issue, because the Fourteenth Amendment empowers states through due process to deny a person his or her life via capital punishment? Thus, while the Court may find that states may enact anti-abortion legislation, they may not be compelled to do so or to even protect the preborn from "private" acts of abortion as opposed to publicly funded abortions which a Human Life Statute naturally would disallow (an improvement over continually having to preserve the Hyde amendment). In addition, while such a Statute would stop the performing of abortions at publicly owned facilities, the Court might conclude that it cannot halt abortions at non-publicly owned facilities.

"What then happens, for example, if the Human Life Bill is passed and North Carolina votes to prohibit abortions but Massachusetts does not? Does Senator Edward Kennedy call upon states rights advocates Senator Jesse Helms 'not to impose a particular morality upon the people of Massachusetts'? Senator Kennedy might argue that Senator Helms would not want the people of Massachusetts imposing their will upon North Carolinians; therefore, if Senator Helms obtained the passage of a Human Life Bill which allowed North Carolina to prohibit abortions if it wanted to do so, Senator Kennedy might argue that this was an acceptable compromise, and that states' rights advocates such as Senator Helms should refrain from pursuing the imposition of a national morality via a Human Life Amendment to the Constitution.

"Of course, it can be argued that the Human Life Bill is a way to 'test the waters' and see if pro-life forces have the necessary 38 states required to pass a Human Life Amendment. It can also be argued that if we do not have the 38 states to pass the Amendment, at least we have provided a means whereby some states may prohibit abortions and thereby at least save a significant number of preborn children's lives.

"On the other hand, one must be careful that the Human Life Bill does not serve to diffuse support for the Amendment rather than serving as an impetus for the latter. We must be careful that we are not sacrificing principle for the seemingly expedient.

Besides possibly making abortion simply a matter of a woman's ability to find transportation to a state which chooses not to prohibit the taking of preborn children's lives, there are a number of other problems with the current Human Life Bill. For example, it does not specifically deal with the entire range of human existence, and thus does not prohibit euthanasia. Furthermore, as with any statute, there is always the eventual possibility that it may one day be amended or repealed, unlike a Human Life Amendment which could only be reversed by another constitutional amendment.

While the efforts of those supporting the present Human

Besides possibly making abortion simply a matter of a woman's ability to find transportation to a state which chooses not to prohibit the taking of preborn children's lives, there are a number of other problems with the current Human Life Bill.

Life Bill should be understood as a genuine attempt to help preserve human lives, this writer must regrettably decline to support any effort which might be construed as allowing any state to permit the killing of preborn children. Today, we have an excellent opportunity energetically to pursue the passage of a Human Life Amendment to the Constitution and the available vehicle is the Supreme Court's own *Roe v. Wade* decision. Almost invariably, I find that when the average citizen learns *Roe v. Wade* allows abortions at any time during the 9 months of pregnancy, they are appalled. While many of these people may disagree that a human being begins at fertilization, they understand that perhaps the only way *Roe v. Wade* can be reversed for sure is with a Human Life Amendment to the Constitution. Thus, because they feel it illogical for the Court to declare a child born prematurely 7 months after fertilization a "person" but a child 9 months after fertilization who

still happens to reside in his or her mother's womb "not a person," they are willing to entertain the proposal of a Human Life Amendment as perhaps the only conclusive remedy to what even some "pro-choice" advocates are concluding was a ridiculous decision by the Supreme Court in 1973. One other "vehicle" we might use to reverse, or at least reargue, *Roe v. Wade* is if a State Supreme Court were to uphold a State Constitution's "right to life" section concerning "persons" who are "created" by ruling that because "creation" occurs before birth, preborn children cannot be excluded from the constitutional meaning of the word, "person." The U.S. Supreme Court would almost surely have to hear an appeal of that decision since it would challenge *Roe v. Wade*.

But we in the pro-life movement must constantly guard against what appears to be the compromising of principle. For example, even though Secretary of Health and Human Services Richard Schweiker opposes the

use of federal funds in dispensing contraceptives, Marjory Mecklenburg (the new Director of Adolescent Pregnancy Programs under Schweiker), who was President of American Citizens Concerned for Life, said in *TIME* Magazine, March 16, 1981, page 37, that she sees "little to be gained by withholding contraception from sexually active adolescents." As most pro-lifers know, certain contraceptives such as the IUD and "Pill" (depending on estrogen level) are actually abortifacient. Therefore, when one tacitly condones contraception for sexually active adolescents, one is not only giving the possible impression of condoning fornication (see Hosea 4:14, Matthew 15:19, and Mark 7:21-23 for the wrongfulness of fornication), but one also gives the impression that abortions by the IUD and "Pill" at an early age in preborn children's lives are somehow not as heinous as abortions after implantation.

While this writer is not accusing anyone in the pro-life

movement of deliberately desiring the word "conception" instead of "fertilization" in the Human Life Bill so that abortifacient contraceptives will not be banned, and while only a small number in the movement may actually prefer a "states' rights" solution so that abortions in cases of rape or incest will not be banned, the important point here is one of principle. We in the pro-life movement must consistently adhere to the uncompromising principle that no abortion is acceptable, and we must vigorously pursue the passage of a Human Life Amendment rather than diverting our efforts toward a Human Life Statute. On the March 15, 1981, ABC Television program "Issues & Answers," Secretary Schweiker said that with the passage of the Human Life Bill supported by President Reagan, a Human Life Amendment "would not be necessary." This is far from a certainty, and all pro-lifers should make that known to Secretary Schweiker and the President.

Treading Water?? 1980 Elections —

During the past six months, our readers have received letters and phone calls from LAPAC saying essentially, "we made great gains in 1980, but we're still short of the 2/3 majority we need to get a HUMAN LIFE AMENDMENT through the Congress. So we're already working on 1982."

Some of the people getting this message reacted negatively

"If we spent all that money and all that time and all that effort and we're no closer to an HLA than we were before, why should I keep giving, or keep working?"

Some people overlook two things: the short term gains of 10 seats in the U.S. Senate, and the furthering of our educational effort in general to larger and larger sections of the populace.

They don't realize for any "special interest" group to hold

away over 10% of the U.S. Senate is a tremendous advantage. There are many special interest groups that would happily trade places with our "philosophical control" of the U.S. Congress.

But the real gain... the one most people overlook... is the growing edge of pro-life sentiment in the United States. *TIME*, *NEWSWEEK* and *U.S. NEWS & WORLD REPORT* recently carried major stories (cover story in *TIME*) on the life issue. Countless newspapers and TV stations across the country are starting to give life issues regular coverage. Reporters are regularly "checking in" with Paul Brown of LAPAC and Jude Brown of American Life Lobby to check the "pro-life, pro-family" side of their stories...

A few years ago, these same reporters didn't know the pro-life movement existed!

In the 1976 elections, the presence of abortion as a campaign issue came as a shock to

the voters as well as the major media reporters. After the elections Dick Clark was proclaimed the "first martyr of the pro-abortion cause" because the media simply couldn't find any other reason for his defeat!

But in 1980 there was hardly an election for dog-catcher to President in which abortion was not mentioned, and, thanks to LAPAC and a lot of hardworking local political action committees, there was NO Federal Election in which the candidate did not take a stand on abortion! We demanded to know their position on the life issues... and the candidates acknowledged our strength by coming down on one or the other side of the abortion issue almost immediately after announcing their candidacy!

That is real progress!

Every time we get the word "abortion" into a headline every time we get a newspaper story every time we can get a candidate to speak out his true stand on the

issue (whichever side of it) we are FORCING AMERICANS TO THINK ABOUT ABORTION! And every time we get Americans to think about abortion we are that much closer to a Human Life Amendment.

Americans don't like death; they don't like murder; but they are fond of things called "rights," "liberties," and "freedom." And the more we can FORCE Americans to think about abortion the more we can associate abortion with death and murder and the more we can re-affirm their beliefs in the "right-to-life" and the civil liberties of preborn children and the freedom from Government intervention in "family planning" and sex-instruction of minor children without parental knowledge or consent.

In short, our political action efforts have been the spearhead of a movement to win the "hearts and minds of our countrymen!"

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New Creatures and The New Politics

Every Christmas for 30 years the lights of the Los Angeles City Hall tower were lit up in celebration. But in 1978 the California Supreme Court ruled that this violated the separation of church and state. The reason: they were lit in the shape of a cross.

Other attacks on Christians and the Christian institutions of family and church have been far less amusing. In Dallas evangelist James Robinson was forced off the air for four months in 1979 for saying that homosexuality is immoral. In Ohio parents have been jailed for keeping their children in unlicensed Christian schools. Every year, high school students in New Jersey are given a questionnaire which assumes they fornicate. A new church applying for tax exemption in California was told by the I.R.S. to submit a "sample sermon." And only weeks ago two Christian servicemen were court-martialed for praying in front of an abortion clinic.

The sad part about this chapter in our history is that it is happening with the tacit assent of Bible believing Christians.

Last week a woman told me that the work of LAPAC on behalf of the unborn was "an abomination before the Lord." Why? Not because abortion isn't murder. She believed that also. Rather our sin lay in the fact that our work was political. And Christians shouldn't be involved in politics.

William Marshner points out the fallacy of this attitude in his compelling and easy to read pamphlet — *The New Creatures and the New Politics*. His perspective is both Biblical and historical.

We learn for example that Christian leaders and laymen have always been involved in politics. Indeed in the 19th century, pulpit support for the American Revolution was so strong that the patriots were dubbed the "Black Regiment" of the Continental Army.

Other revival preachers like Charles Grandison Finney stepped across the border of political neutrality by opposing the enslavement of blacks and the Dred Scott decision of the Supreme Court.

In fact the laws of the Supreme Being have always taken precedence over the laws of the Supreme Court or any other political power.

The great prophets of the Old Testament were never afraid to act politically by confronting those in high places with God's law. Nathan denounced David, Elijah "troubled Israel" against Ahab. Elisha prophesied against Jehoshaphat for a misstep in foreign policy. His private life was "right in the sight of the Lord" but his public policy was morally wrong. Similarly, it is not enough for politicians today to be "personally" opposed to abortion. They must also enforce God's prohibition against murder in the realm of public policy. Christians must realize that not only was Elisha's prophecy a political act, but his political act was an act of prophecy (see 2 Chronicles Ch. 20). And today, our political work is part of our Christian ministry.

William Marshner goes on to point out that in the New Testa-

ment Peter and Paul both taught that Christians are to fulfill their civil duties. In the autocratic days of the Roman rulers those civil duties were basically to obey the laws and pay taxes. But we live in a democratic society. Our government is "of the people" and "by the people." Therefore our civil obligations include participating in and shaping politics. We are part of the government ourselves and God requires us to act accordingly.

Jesus told His people the parable of the talents. A certain master left his servants with varying numbers of talents. While he was away one of the servants took his talent and buried it rather than taking the risk of losing it. When the master returned he threw that unfaithful servant into "outer darkness" for misusing his gift. If Jesus had

been speaking to Americans He might well have told the parable of the vote. We have each been entrusted with one vote. That vote is no less a gift from God. Are we faithful stewards when we bury that vote on election day?

Yes, politics is dirty. And it can corrupt. But we are the salt of the earth, and it's time we started acting like it.

If our faith can move mountains, then surely it can move Capitol Hill.

In the recent special election in Maryland, the very "threat" of a LAPAC presence prompted every candidate to run ads stating their position on abortion. 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Killing — A "Choice"

The following is a simulated interview with the "pro-choice" spokesman of the 1930s and 1940s. The year is 1942. The place is Berlin, Germany.

Journalist: Mr. Hitler, quite a "furor" has developed recently over some of your policies directed towards Jews and other minorities. Can you tell us why this is so?

Hitler: Well, it's really quite simple. Most people fail to understand the progressive level of thinking to which I have attained.

Journalist: What do you mean?

Hitler: Some reactionary elements in German Society have falsely represented me as being anti-life ... a murderer, if you will.

Journalist: And you feel that their conclusions are unjustified?

Hitler: Of course. Any person with a smattering of elitist sophistication can plainly see that I am not necessarily anti-life. I am merely "pro-choice."

Journalist: "Pro-choice." What do you mean by "pro-choice"?

Hitler: The people of Germany have entrusted themselves to my care. I believe that it is the right of every dictator to be able to make choices affecting his own "body" politic. Do you not agree?

Journalist: Well, ah...

Hitler: You must understand that the Jews pose a tremendous inconvenience to German society. As far as I am concerned they are human garbage and therefore should be treated as such.

Journalist: I see. But is it not true that some of your detractors feel that the Jews, as members of the human family, do have a right to life, just like you and I?

Hitler: I can see how some could perceive this falsehood to be true, but I feel that the Jews should also have a right to be wasted and cared for.

Journalist: Oh ... and you and your colleagues don't want them, is that correct?

Hitler: That is correct. And quite frankly I don't "care" for them much either.

Journalist: Then I must assume that you do not regard the torture and extermination of the handicapped, the mentally retarded, the aged, the Poles, the Jews and other members of the human family as being morally wrong.

Hitler: Morally wrong? Who is to say what is morally wrong?

Journalist: Well, I've noticed that a few members of the clergy have stepped forth and denounced your policies as being incompatible with Scripture.

Hitler: Ha! Religious bigots, all of them! These men are dangerous fanatics! They are superstitious reactionaries! But don't worry, I have taken steps to insure that they do not jeopardize the public welfare.

Journalist: Then you have exercised a "pro-choice" option in regards to some of their destinies also?

Hitler: Well, of course! Surely you cannot expect me to allow these despised bigots to infect society with their superstitious fairy tales, can you?

Journalist: Superstitious fairy tales?

Hitler: Yes, you know ... all this nonsense about the sanctity of human life, etc., etc.

Journalist: But I thought you represented yourself as a champion of the Christian faith, struggling against the Russian atheists.

Hitler: I am ... but one must remember that I support the Christian cause in as far as I perceive it. We have, in Germany, formulated a state religion that just by coincidence, neatly conforms to my own values. We have done away with many of the anachronisms of the historical Christian faith and have replaced it with a more contemporary system of belief.

Journalist: Such as "pro-choice"?

Hitler: Yes, that is part of it.

Journalist: But aren't there dangers in formulating systems of belief that are contrary to the natural order of things and tend to violate the conscience of man?

Hitler: Yes, of course. One has but to look at the Soviet government to see evidence of this. Their leaders are total liars. They will say anything in order to attain their goals and justify their system of government, no matter how idiotic it might be.

Journalist: But aren't you in danger of falling into the same trap?

Hitler: You misunderstand. What I envision for the world is a system that embraces the relative values of my own formulation. I am completely autonomous from any higher authority. I do not answer to anyone ... God or man. The truth, if taken to mean a system of absolutes, does not concern me.

Journalist: Then, if you do not acknowledge a system of absolutes originating from a higher authority, the murder of millions of Jews is acceptable if you think it is acceptable.

Hitler: You are correct. Not only is it acceptable, it is imperative. One must realize that the Jews, as so called "members of the human family," do not belong to God. The religious fanatics and reactionaries would have you believe this, but it is not true. They belong to me. Therefore, I may do with them whatsoever I wish.

Journalist: But how can you be so sure that the Jews belong to you?

Hitler: I think my situation can best be explained as parallel to the situation of the pregnant mother carrying an unwanted child. Just as that woman has the right to choose the fate of the unborn child, even so I have the right to choose the fate of the German populace. Do you now see why I consider myself to be "pro-choice"? Unwanted child, unwanted Jew ... need I say more?

Journalist: Well, ah...

Hitler: Actually I derived my initial inspiration for the "Final Solution" from an incident I shall never forget. One day as I was paying a call to Dr. Mengele in the hospital, I noticed something resembling a tiny human being about to be tossed into an incinerator. When I inquired of the orderly as to what he was doing, he explained the hospital's entire abortion policy and procedure to me. "Brilliant!" I thought to myself. Now I had a means whereby I could rid Germany of the unwanted Jew, the unwanted handicapped person, the unwanted mentally retarded person, etc. with relative ease ... in the same manner we rid ourselves of unwanted children ... up the chimney. Brilliant and progressive concept, don't you think?

Journalist: Well, ah ... I'm not sure I agree. [Pauses to think] In fact, I definitely do not agree. I think you're insane, Mr. Hitler, completely insane! You have twisted words and concepts in order to justify your own perverted ends! The taking of an innocent human life for purposes of "convenience" isn't "pro-choice" it's pro-murder! Let's cut out the mental garbage, Mr. Hitler, and call it like it is!

Hitler: Guard! [The guard marches in] Please give this young man a first hand demonstration of how ... perform a post-natal abortion.

Journalist: Post-natal abortion? You're MAD! You can't do that!

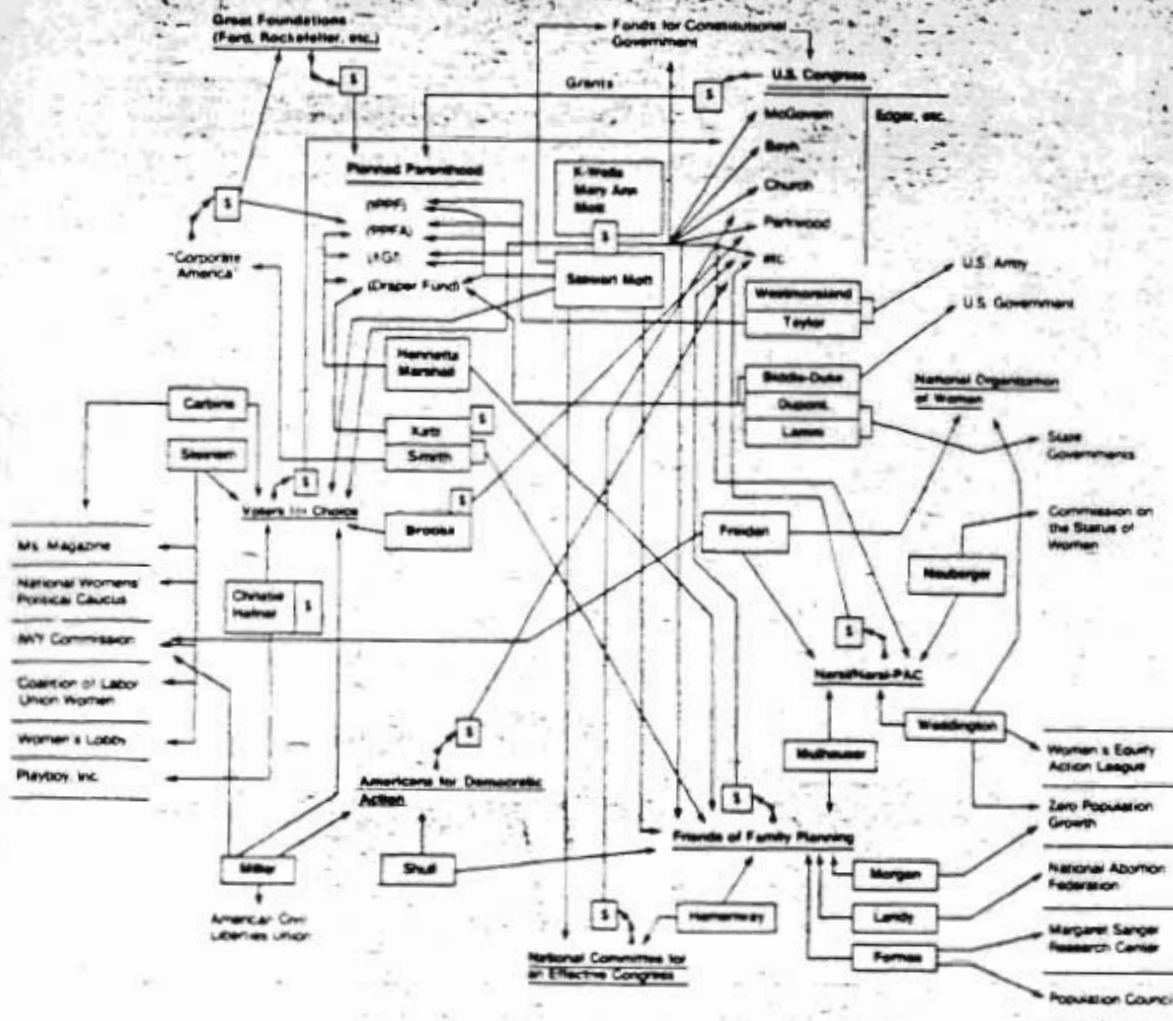
Hitler: Don't try to force your morality upon me, young man! Pre-natal or post-natal ... it matters little to me. As far as I'm concerned, you are just an overly mature product of conception.

Hitler: Rights? Since when did a product of conception ever have rights in an enlightened, progressive society?

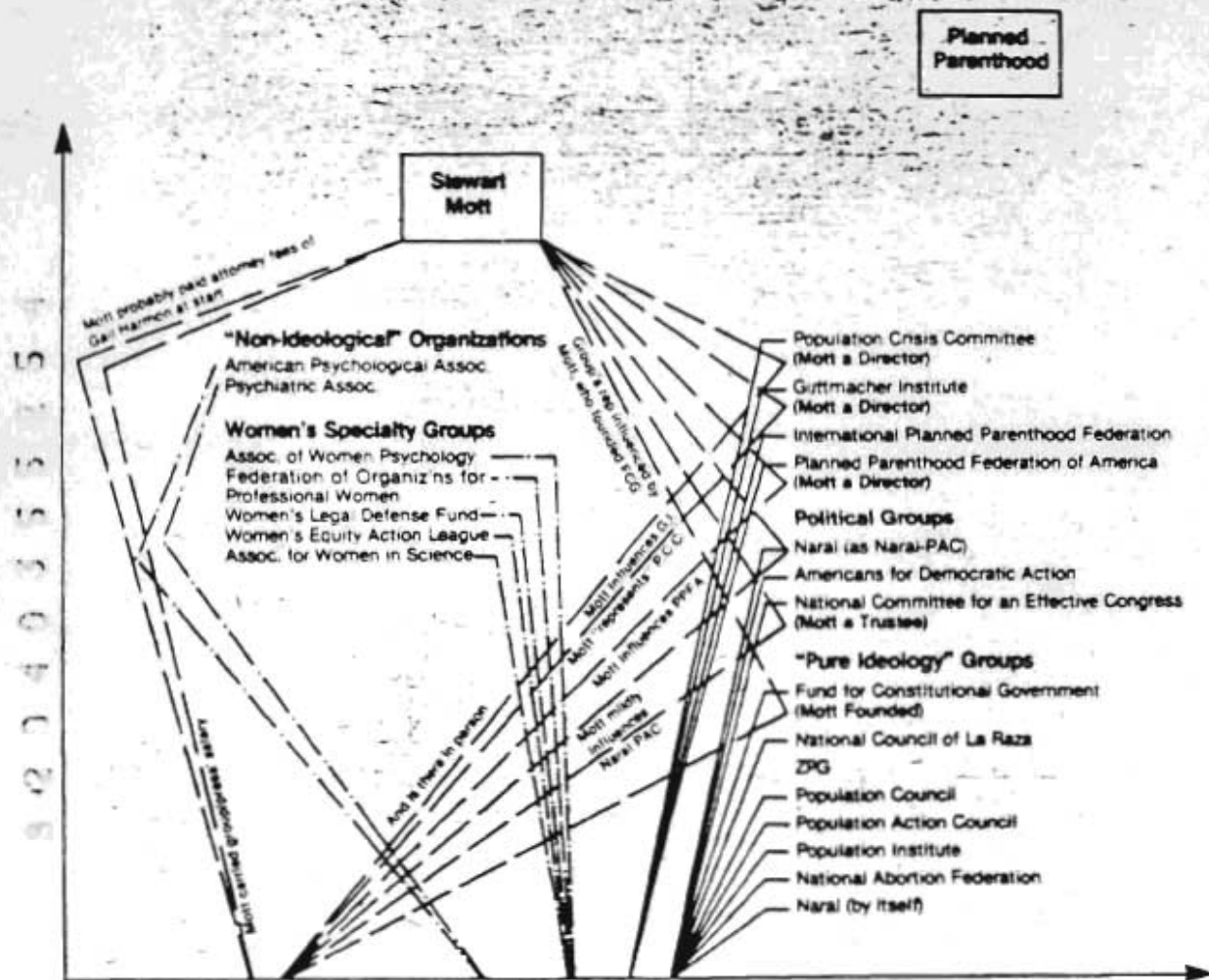


The Interconnections of the Anti-Life Movement's Structure

Height on chart denotes unvectored clout.

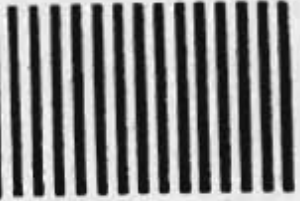
Power vector key:

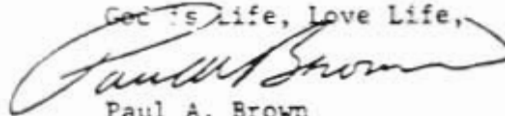

The Federal Election Commission previously notified you of a complaint which alleges that Life Amendment Political Action Committee, Inc. ("LAPAC") violated certain sections of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended ("the Act"). A copy of the complaint was forwarded to you at that time.

Upon further review of the allegations contained in the complaint and information supplied by you, the Commission on January 1, 1982, determined there is reason to believe LAPAC violated 2 U.S.C. § 434(b)(6)(B)(iii) and 11 C.F.R. § 104.3(b)(3)(vii)(B). Specifically, LAPAC failed to report the name of the candidate and office sought by such candidate for independent expenditures reported on the 1981-Mid-Year Report.

Your response to the Commission's initial notification stated that LAPAC reported the independent expenditures as "Target Races" because it was unaware of how to assign or itemize the costs of the expenditures targeted at twelve separate Senate elections. You also indicated that you would be willing to amend LAPAC's Schedule E by adding a footnote explaining LAPAC's activities. In this regard the Commission refer you to 11 C.F.R. § 106.1 which prescribes an allocation rule for expenditures among candidates. Thus, rather than adding a footnote the Commission requests that

I am in receipt of your letter advising me of the complaint filed against the Life Amendment Political Action Committee with regard to proper reporting.

By way of background, let me advise you that over the past years our organization has experienced some difficulties in the filing of FEC Reports. An audit of our organization just recently completed has been helpful to our staff in learning how to be more completely explicit in our filings. Unfortunately, that assistance from the Commission was not received at the time of our August 3rd report.

With respect to the complaint in question, in one instance in the fourth block of page 3 of Schedule E, there is an obvious typographical omission. The typist inserted "South Dakota '80" and "Senate 1980" "Oppose" but failed to type in McGovern.

With respect to the reference to "Target Races," I am enclosing a sample copy of our newsletter and of a mailing done (costs for which are cited in various places on the Schedule E as Target Races) as a part of our 1982 Target Race Program. As you can see the items are pegged to twelve separate U.S. Senate Races for 1982 which raises the Solomon's question of how to assign or itemize costs. Our solution was to "lump" these costs to the Target Race Program.

It is interesting to note that in conversations with two members of the FEC staff, neither could come up with a "correct" method of breaking out these costs! One, however, did suggest a "footnote" be placed somewhere within the report indicating the twelve Senate races which comprise the Target Race Program; but, even then, there was no assurance that such a method would be "correct" or even "more correct."
