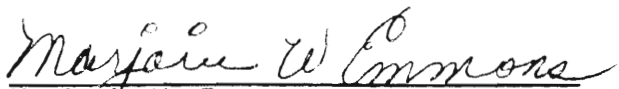

GENERAL COUNSEL'S REPORT

I. Allegations

Complaint, filed June 17, 1976, alleged that James Lawrence for Congress Committee accepted a \$525 in-kind contribution from a labor organization in violation of 2 U.S.C. §441b.

II. Evidence

The Ten Day Pre-Election report filed by respondent committee on May 13, 1976, showed a \$525 in-kind contribution from Local 761 I.U.E. made on April 10, 1976. The entry does not indicate that such funds came from a separate segregated fund.

The attorney for the labor union wrote to the Commission on June 23, 1976 to inquire into the nature of the allegations. In response to our preliminary inquiry, the attorney submitted a letter to the Commission with an explanation of the contribution. According to the letter, dated July 28, 1976, the cost of the in-kind contribution was included in a

bill to the Union from the printing company with other printing expenses incurred by the Union. The total amount of this bill was inadvertently paid out of the Union's General Fund. The attorney supplied a copy of the check, dated May 5, 1976, paying the total bill due to the printing company, and a copy of a check dated July 1, from the Union's Committee on Political Education Fund to General Fund reimbursing the General Fund for the amount of the in-kind contribution.

III. Analysis and Recommendation

The bill sent to the Union by the printing company included other work for the labor union; thus, it is entirely likely that payment by the General Fund was inadvertent. In view of the fact that the political fund of the labor organization has reimbursed the General Fund it appears that full compliance has been achieved.

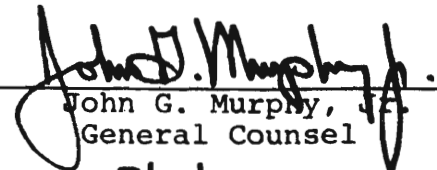
The candidate, James Lawrence, responded that his treasurer failed to indicate that the contribution was from the Union's Committee on Political Education Fund. The contribution in-kind was reported by the candidate and although it was not reported as being from a separate segregated fund, this appears to have been a reporting error which is cleared up by the explanation of the labor organization.

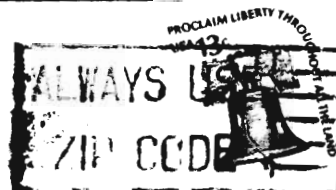

PRELIMINARY LEGAL ANALYSIS

(1) Evidence supplied by the complainant indicates that "Citizens for
Lawrence" expended over \$1,000 and there is no record of its filing
a statement of organization or reporting any expenditures. However,
the expenditures were made after the period for the pre-election
report and the candidate's post election report has not yet been
received. "Citizens for Lawrence" and "James Lawrence for Congress"

RECOMMENDATION

Hold action until the candidate's post election report is received. Further
inquiry will be necessary re the labor union contribution. Send attached

Please be advised that the undersigned has been retained by the "R. L. Mazzoli Campaign Fund", principal campaign Committee for Romano L. Mazzoli, Member of Congress, Third District, Kentucky.

After investigating facts and events surrounding the Democratic Primary Election for Kentucky's Third Congressional District seat, which was held on May 25, 1976, there is reason to believe that the Political Committee, "Citizens for Lawrence", 2510 Ranelle Court, Louisville, Kentucky 40216, Reverend William Diersen, Chairman, Reverend Joseph Mouser, Co-Chairman, is in violation of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended May 11, 1976.

Section 433 (a) of said Act requires each political committee to file a statement of organization within 10 days after its organization when said committee anticipates receiving contributions or making expenditures in excess of \$1,000 during the calendar year, or, if already organized within 10 days after the time the committee receives information which would lead it to believe it will receive contributions or expend in excess of \$1,000.

When dealing with committees other than the principal campaign committee, Section 433 (e) of said act requires the reports and notifications required under Section 433 to be "filed instead with the appropriate principal campaign committee."

The "Citizens for Lawrence" Committee paid for three newspaper advertisements as well as extensive radio and television advertising on behalf of the candidacy of James Lawrence for Congress. The advertising occurred during the several days preceding the Primary Election hereinabove mentioned.

Attached are copies of the newspaper advertisements as well as a summary of the media spending which was compiled from the "public inspection files" of the broadcast stations listed. As can readily be seen, the "Citizens for Lawrence" Committee has expended well in excess of \$1,000 and comes within the purview of the Federal Election Campaign Act.

From the information available, it appears "Citizens for Lawrence" has not filed the required "Statement of Organization" with the Clerk of the U.S. House of Representatives nor with "James Lawrence for Congress", the principal campaign committee of James E. Lawrence, as Mr. Lawrence's reports filed with your Commission make no mention of "Citizens for Lawrence".

Further, it appears that "Citizens for Lawrence" is also in contravention of Section 434 (a) (1) and 434 (a) (2) in that no reports of receipts and expenditures have been filed with the Clerk of the U. S. House of Representatives or with Mr. Lawrence's principal campaign Committee.

Therefore, it appearing that the "Citizens for Lawrence" Committee has violated the Federal Election Campaign Act, on behalf of the "R. L. ROME—Pope Paul VI installed 20 new cardinals yesterday, including the archbishop of Hanoi, whose selection had been kept secret until the ceremony.

In the new Hall of Audiences behind St. Peter's Square, the Pope placed red birettas on the heads of the new cardinals and gave a special welcome to the Vietnamese, Joseph Marie Cardinal Trin Nhu-Khue. The 78-year-old pontiff, who had remained seated as the other 19 cardinals knelt before him, rose to his feet as the 20th, the Vietnamese, climbed the steps to the papal throne.

The Pope then opened his arms in greeting and the 6,000 invited guests in the hall joined in loud applause. The 78-year-old Vietnamese cardinal, who arrived in Rome late Sunday night, was dressed in purple bishop's vestments because he had not had time to obtain red robes worn by the others.

The name of Hanoi's archbishop was not among the cardinals whose appointments were announced a month ago. He was one of two whose designations had been kept by the Pope "in pectore"—in secret.

Vatican sources, who would not reveal the name of the second secret cardinal, said disclosure of the Vietnamese's elevation came only after he had been assured of getting a visa to travel to Rome. The Vatican has no diplomatic relations with Hanoi and often has worked through French channels in its contacts with the Vietnamese.

Some sources close to the Vatican also suggested that it hoped that the selection of the Hanoi archbishop would serve as a signal to Hanoi of the church's continuing interest in the plight of Roman Catholics in North and South Vietnam. Vatican officials have indicated concern over the many Catholics who remained in the south after the fall of Saigon.

The announcement of the Vietnam-

ese's appointment was greeted with enthusiasm by the crowd in the great hall. A small, frail man, the Vietnamese cardinal showed no emotion.

After the Pope placed the birettas, on four-cornered hats, on each of the new cardinals, they bowed and then walked over to greet the other members of the Sacred College of Cardinals.

The formalities yesterday, which included a secret papal consistory before the public ceremony, brought to 120 the number of cardinals who are under 80 years old and thus eligible to elect the next pope.

Although Italians still form the largest single national group among cardinals, their proportion has been shrinking and has generated speculation about the possibility of the election of a non-Italian pope.

Among those installed yesterday were William Wakefield Cardinal Baum, who

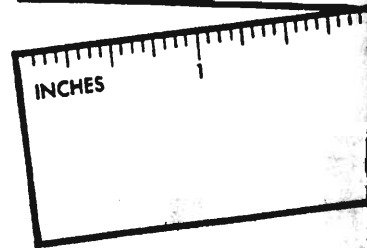

MR. MAZZOLI'S VOTING RECORD

1. Against Prayer in School: Kentucky's only Congressman to vote against HJR 191 to restore prayer in school (November 8, 1971).
2. For Federalizing all Private & Church Camps: Voted for HR 46 on May 17, 1975, which would bring all church camps under Federal regulations which would close thousands of small camps overnight for lack of funds to comply.
3. Land Use Planning & Regulation: This Bill (HR 1110) would give the Federal Government power to determine how all private and church owned land would be used. It was defeated. Mazzoli was for it.
4. Parental Inspection of Federally-Funded Textbooks: Mazzoli voted against HR 4723 which would have required Local School Boards to hold public hearings on the adoption and use of federally funded textbooks and educational courses, and to make the contents available for inspection to parents.
5. Absentee Paternity: Mazzoli supported HR 8598 which would enable a mother, in pursuit of welfare benefits, to refuse to disclose who the father of her children is. This would not only provide a wide-open loophole for welfare fraud, but it encourages the further increase of absentee paternity and sexual license.
6. For Forced Busing: On June 8, 1973, he made his 3rd Pro-busing vote and his 4th on July 31, 1974. HR 11450 allocated gasoline to bus students beyond the school nearest their home. Although he changed his position after being overwhelmed by his constituents opposition in September, Mazzoli has failed to demonstrate his own opposition.
7. For Gun Control: On February 24, 1976, he voted for HR 1193 which will ban 71% of all handguns according to the Treasury Department. Also for HR 6844 giving a non-elected commission jurisdiction controlling firearms and ammunition.
8. Against Internal Security: Voted for HR 9701 which would publicize in detail all C.I.A. operations and expenditures. Voted for HR 5 which abolished the House Internal Security Committee - the only Congressional voice for investigating Terrorist and Communist activity.
9. Against Military Superiority: Voted for HR 9286 cutting the Defense Budget by 949 Million Dollars. Voted for HR 8687 banning the critically needed B-1 manned bomber. Voted for HR 11731 which scrapped the Navy's F-14 Fighter.
10. Child and Family Services Act: HR 2066 was vetoed by President Nixon in 1971 saying, It "would commit the vast moral authority of the National Government to the aide of communal approaches to childrearing." 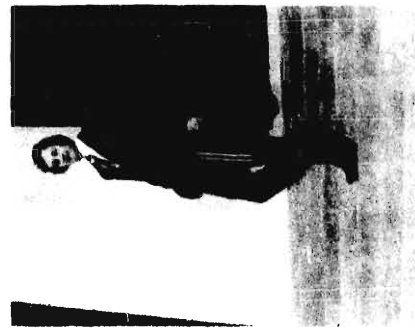
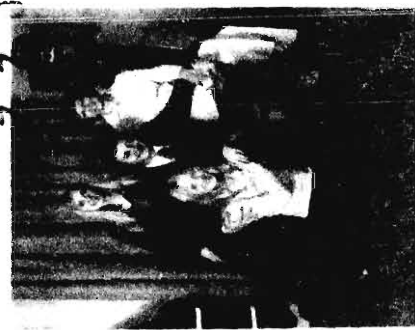

He voted against the Navy's F-14 Fighter (HR 11731), against the Air Force F-111 Fighter (HR 3260), against the B-1 Bomber (HR 3337), and to reduce our "Front Line" defense of overseas troops by 100,000 (HR 14542).

Mazzoli voted to Abolish the House Internal Security Committee (HR 5) which investigated Communist and terrorist groups such as the Symbionese Liberation Army. Furthermore, he voted to strip the CIA of secrecy (HR 9661).

2. TO RAISE HIS SALARY

Mazzoli made his 4th PRO Busing vote on July 31, 1974. HR 11450 allocated gasoline to bus students beyond the nearest school. He opposes legislation now in his Judiciary Committee (HR 12365) which would allow Congress by a simple majority vote to remove the power of the federal courts to order forced busing.

5. AGAINST PRAYER IN SCHOOL

Mazzoli has the dubious distinction of becoming Kentucky's only Congressman to vote against HJR 191 to Restore Voluntary Prayer.

6. FOR DETENTE WITH COMMUNIST COUNTRIES

Mazzoli's blind faith in a one-sided Detente surrenders the military position of the U.S. and the freedom of those living in captive nations. Mazzoli supported most favored nation treatment and export credits to Communist nations which deny their citizens the right to emigrate. (Trade Reform Act)
Mazzoli voted for the Atlantic Union Delegation (HJR 205) which would fund U.S. delegates to a convention to begin preparations toward merging the U.S. into a European dominated parliament.
