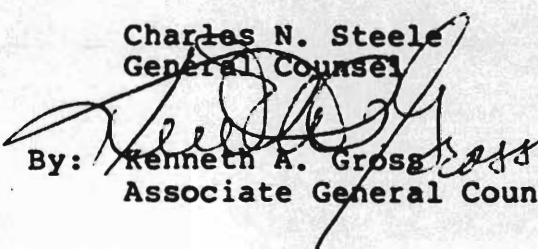

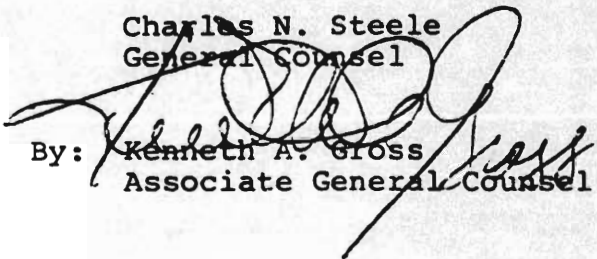

STATEMENT OF THE CASE

John T. Dolan on behalf of the National Conservative Political Action Committee ("NCPAC") filed a complaint with the Commission on August 31, 1984, alleging that Governor Hunt and his principal campaign committee, the Jim Hunt Committee ("Hunt Committee"), violated 2 U.S.C. § 441d. NCPAC submitted a copy of a letter signed by Governor Hunt, on the stationery of the Office of the Governor of North Carolina, which solicits contributions to the Governor's election to the United States Senate. It is alleged that the solicitation fails to contain the appropriate disclaimer required by 2 U.S.C. § 441d.

The solicitation letter submitted by NCPAC is three pages long and encloses a contributor card, a return envelope, and a

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newspaper article. The letter does not have a disclaimer on it; the reply card has the Jim Hunt Committee's name printed on the bottom followed by the Committee's address; and, the return envelope is addressed to the Jim Hunt Committee.

FACTUAL AND LEGAL ANALYSIS

The Hunt Committee responded to the complaint on September 28, 1984. The response indicates that the Hunt Committee contracts with the firm of Craver, Matthews and Smith for its direct mail service. The letter which is the subject of this matter was prepared by Cravers, Matthews and Smith. The Hunt Committee's response states that the Committee decided to include a statement on the front page of the letter which stated "Not paid for at government expense. Authorized and paid for by the Jim Hunt Committee." This directive to the direct mail firm was done by phone on June 28, 1984.

Subsequently, an electronically transmitted copy of the letter was approved by the Committee for printing. The transmitted copy, submitted by the respondent, contained the disclaimer language on the first page which had been phoned to Craver, Matthews, and Smith on June 28, 1984.

The respondent also submitted a copy of the proof of the letter from Craver, Matthews and Smith which it received after the filing of complaint. The proof, attached to the response, also includes the disclaimer.

The response concludes that the disclaimer may have been left off the final printed version of the copy due to technical failure of the equipment used by the subcontractor or slippage of

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the type from the art board in the printing process.

On October 18, 1984, Governor Hunt responded to the complaint. The response states that the letter was not printed at government expense and was not mailed from a government office. The response, concurring with the Hunt Committee response, states that the letter had been prepared by a private direct mail company under contract with the Hunt Committee and that an appropriate disclaimer had been inadvertently omitted by the mail service. The Governor denies that he or the State of North Carolina were involved in any manner with the production or mailing of the letter.

2 U.S.C. § 441d(a)(1) requires that a solicitation letter paid for and authorized by a candidate, an authorized committee of the candidate or its agent shall clearly state that the communication has been paid for by the authorized committee.

In A0-1980-145, the Commission determined that a solicitation letter consisting of a letter, contributor card, and return envelope, which contained a disclaimer on the contributor card alone was sufficient to meet the requirements of 2 U.S.C. § 441d.

In this letter the contributor card, which is part of the mailing, contained only the name of the Committee and its address. It failed to have the words "Paid for.." preceding the Committee's name and address. The letter when printed in final did not have a disclaimer. However, copies of the proofs from the Committee and Craver, Matthews and Smith contained an appropriate disclaimer. It, therefore, appears that the

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disclaimer was left off inadvertently; that the Jim Hunt Committee had no reason to believe that the appropriate disclaimer was not printed on the final copy and had taken action to include an appropriate disclaimer. Therefore, the Office of General Counsel recommends finding reason to believe that the Hunt Committee violated 2 U.S.C. § 441d and to take no further action.

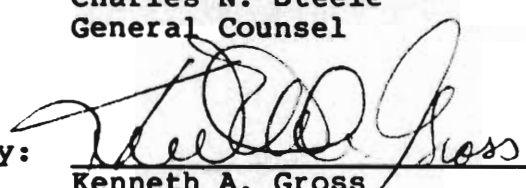
As all costs incurred with the letter were paid by the Hunt Committee, it is recommended that the Commission find no reason to believe Governor Hunt violated 2 U.S.C. § 441d and the closing of the entire file.

RECOMMENDATION

1. Find reason to believe the Jim Hunt Committee and its treasurer, Maylon C. Little, violated 2 U.S.C. § 441d, and take no further action.
2. Find no reason to believe Governor James B. Hunt violated 2 U.S.C. § 441d.
3. Close the file.
4. Send the attached letters.

The Jim Hunt Committee and its Treasurer, Maylon E. Little (hereafter Committee), respectfully request that the Federal Election Commission dismiss the complaint of John T. Dolan, Chairman, National Conservative Political Action Committee (MUR 1771). After careful review of the allegations in the complaint, the Committee concludes that its actions indicate a conscious intention to abide fully by the Federal Election Campaign Act and that the matters complained of arise from technical problems in the printing process despite the good faith efforts of the Committee. To support the request that no action be taken by the Commission, the Committee submits the following:

BACKGROUND AND ARGUMENT

The Jim Hunt Committee contracts for direct mail services with Craver, Mathews and Smith (hereafter Craver, Mathews), a firm situated in Virginia. The text of the subject letter as drafted by Craver, Mathews was provided to the Committee in draft form on or about June 21, 1984. It was reviewed by the Committee and certain changes made in the text which were called in to Mr. Michael McLeod of Craver, Mathews on or about June 28, 1984.

Thereafter, the art work, including placement of text on a draft of the proposed letter stock, was prepared by Craver, Mathews and on or about July 9th was transmitted electronically to the Committee and received by the Committee in the form contained in the attached Exhibit A.

In this regard, it is important to note that among the changes made by telephone on or about June 28, 1984 was the decision by the Committee to include on the face of the

letter of Governor Hunt the language "Not paid for at government expense. Authorized and paid for by the Jim Hunt Committee". This language was proposed by the Hunt Committee because the letter stock to be used in the mailing contained the Seal of the State of North Carolina and the address of the Office of the Governor of North Carolina and it was the intention of the Committee to make clear to recipients of the correspondence that the letter was not printed at government expense and was an authorized expenditure of the Jim Hunt Committee.

Upon examination of the electronically transmitted copy (Exhibit A) which on its face contains the appropriate disclaimer language, the Committee indicated its approval to the style and content of the correspondence and approved the printing of the letter by further contact with Craver, Mathews.

Thereafter, Craver, Mathews provided its art work to a printing and mailing subcontractor which actually prepared the mailing which was mailed for Craver, Mathews on or about July 21, 1984.

At all times during the review and examination by the Jim Hunt Committee and, on information and belief, by Craver, Mathews, agent of the Committee, the letter contained the disclaimer language "Not printed at government expense. Authorized and paid for by the Jim Hunt Committee".

Upon receipt of the complaint by the Committee, the Committee requested a copy of Craver, Mathews' proof (Exhibit B) which also includes the proper disclaimer.

It has at all times been the express intention of the Jim Hunt Committee to comply, in every respect, with the disclaimer requirements contained in 2 USC §441d(a). In fact, every effort was made by the Jim Hunt Committee to assure full compliance with these requirements.

Furthermore, the Jim Hunt Committee has standing instructions with Craver, Mathews that each piece of direct

mail contain an appropriate disclaimer. It appears to the Committee that in each and every instance other than this one, Craver, Mathews has fully complied with the standing instructions of the Jim Hunt Committee and in each instance an appropriate disclaimer has been contained in the correspondence of the Jim Hunt Committee.

It appears from the copy of the letter received along with the complaint that the disclaimer may have, by technical failure of the equipment used by the subcontractor of Craver, Mathews or by slippage of the type from the art board in the printing process the appropriate disclaimer was not contained in the final printed version of the letter. Nevertheless, at every stage of the drafting and review process the best efforts of the Jim Hunt Committee and Craver, Mathews were employed to assure full and complete compliance with 44ld(a).

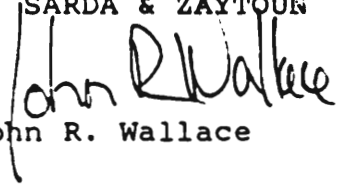
CONCLUSION

Wherefore, the Jim Hunt Committee and Maylon E. Little, Treasurer, respectfully request that the Commission find no reason to believe that any violation of 44ld(a) has occurred or that if the Committee shall find reason to believe that a violation occurred, that such violation was an inadvertent error on the part of subcontractors of Craver, Mathews, direct mail contractor of the Committee and that such error was made in good faith and despite the best efforts and good faith of the Committee and Craver, Mathews in seeking full compliance with the Federal Election Campaign Act.

The Jim Hunt Committee and its Treasurer, Maylon E. Little (hereafter Committee), respectfully request that the Federal Election Commission dismiss the complaint of John T. Dolan, Chairman, National Conservative Political Action Committee (MUR 1771). After careful review of the allegations in the complaint, the Committee concludes that its actions indicate a conscious intention to abide fully by the Federal Election Campaign Act and that the matters complained of arise from technical problems in the printing process despite the good faith efforts of the Committee. To support the request that no action be taken by the Commission, the Committee submits the following:

BACKGROUND AND ARGUMENT

The Jim Hunt Committee contracts for direct mail services with Craver, Mathews and Smith (hereafter Craver, Mathews), a firm situated in Virginia. The text of the subject letter as drafted by Craver, Mathews was provided to the Committee in draft form on or about June 21, 1984. It was reviewed by the Committee and certain changes made in the text which were called in to Mr. Michael McLeod of Craver, Mathews on or about June 28, 1984.

Thereafter, the art work, including placement of text on a draft of the proposed letter stock, was prepared by Craver, Mathews and on or about July 9th was transmitted electronically to the Committee and received by the Committee in the form contained in the attached Exhibit A.

In this regard, it is important to note that among the changes made by telephone on or about June 28, 1984 was the decision by the Committee to include on the face of the

letter of Governor Hunt the language "Not paid for at government expense. Authorized and paid for by the Jim Hunt Committee". This language was proposed by the Hunt Committee because the letter stock to be used in the mailing contained the Seal of the State of North Carolina and the address of the Office of the Governor of North Carolina and it was the intention of the Committee to make clear to recipients of the correspondence that the letter was not printed at government expense and was an authorized expenditure of the Jim Hunt Committee.

Upon examination of the electronically transmitted copy (Exhibit A) which on its face contains the appropriate disclaimer language, the Committee indicated its approval to the style and content of the correspondence and approved the printing of the letter by further contact with Craver, Mathews.

Thereafter, Craver, Mathews provided its art work to a printing and mailing subcontractor which actually prepared the mailing which was mailed for Craver, Mathews on or about July 21, 1984.

At all times during the review and examination by the Jim Hunt Committee and, on information and belief, by Craver, Mathews, agent of the Committee, the letter contained the disclaimer language "Not printed at government expense. Authorized and paid for by the Jim Hunt Committee".

Upon receipt of the complaint by the Committee, the Committee requested a copy of Craver, Mathews' proof (Exhibit B) which also includes the proper disclaimer.

It has at all times been the express intention of the Jim Hunt Committee to comply, in every respect, with the disclaimer requirements contained in 2 USC §441d(a). In fact, every effort was made by the Jim Hunt Committee to assure full compliance with these requirements.

Furthermore, the Jim Hunt Committee has standing instructions with Craver, Mathews that each piece of direct

mail contain an appropriate disclaimer. It appears to the Committee that in each and every instance other than this one, Craver, Mathews has fully complied with the standing instructions of the Jim Hunt Committee and in each instance an appropriate disclaimer has been contained in the correspondence of the Jim Hunt Committee.

It appears from the copy of the letter received along with the complaint that the disclaimer may have, by technical failure of the equipment used by the subcontractor of Craver, Mathews or by slippage of the type from the art board in the printing process the appropriate disclaimer was not contained in the final printed version of the letter. Nevertheless, at every stage of the drafting and review process the best efforts of the Jim Hunt Committee and Craver, Mathews were employed to assure full and complete compliance with 441d(a).

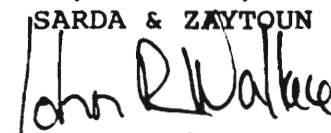
CONCLUSION

Baker ad rings hollow

Jesse Helms' obstructive legislative tactics have made the North Carolina senator a thorn in the side of the Republican majority leader, Sen Howard Baker of Tennessee. Yet, as Baker serves out his final months in the Senate, he has made a television commercial lauding Helms as the savior of the federal tobacco program and praising his value as chairman of the Senate Agriculture Committee.

Baker's willingness to give the right-wing Republican a re-election plug — paid for and aired monotonously by the Helms for Senate Committee — has a simple enough explanation. The Tennessean aspires to his party's post-Reagan presidential nomination. Having announced his retirement, Baker seeks to build a base for his campaign and looks to the far-right wing of his party as part of that base — not just to get the nomination but to maintain the Senate's thin Republican majority.

Thus, Baker extols Helms as the first chairman of the Senate Agriculture Committee from North Carolina in 150 years and urges his return. Understandably, Baker does not add that during the years of Helms' chairmanship, American farm foreclosures have tripled. The increase in farm failures has come even though the approximately \$21 billion bill to the taxpayers for the costs of commodity programs is four times higher than when he took over.

Helms can't be blamed for all of that surge in spending any more than he can claim all the credit or

"saving" the tobacco price-support program. But as the bulk of that huge outlay of federal money has gone to producers of dairy products, rice, cotton, wheat, corn and feed grains in general, the price support program for flue-cured tobacco has encountered stormy fiscal weather — exports are down, imports of foreign tobacco are up, supplies of unsold tobacco have increased. Certainly, Helms has contributed to keeping some kind of tobacco program in effect, but he has laid no healing hands on it.

In the commercial, Baker dwells on returning Helms to the Agriculture chairmanship. But there is an even worse prospect should Sen. Charles Percy, R-Ill., be defeated for re-election. That could put Helms in position to chair the Senate Foreign Relations Committee. In view of the meddling he and his staff have done in Central America and elsewhere, it's likely that Helms wouldn't take long to shake the dust of Agriculture from his heels and move into the chairman's seat in Foreign Relations. Will he deny that this is his true intention?

If that thought occurred to Baker before agreeing to Helms' request for a testimonial, it's surprising that Baker got his breath back in time to deliver it.
