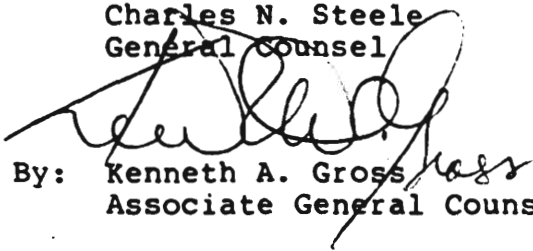

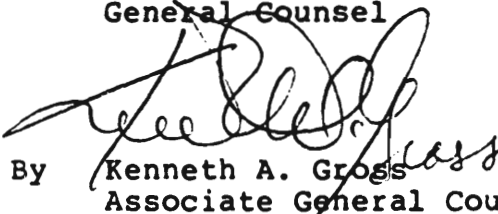

SUMMARY OF ALLEGATIONS

The complainant, E.A. Jaksha, alleges that the Vickers for the People Committee ("Vickers Committee") and its treasurer, Ruth K. Rothmeyer, violated 2 U.S.C. § 441b by accepting a corporate contribution (in-kind) from the Omaha Suburban Area Council of Schools ("OSACS"), an incorporated entity, in the amount of \$410. The in-kind contribution was reported by the Vickers Committee on its 12 Day Pre-Primary report. The report noted that the in-kind contribution was received for "Testing the waters" on December 2, 1983.

Letters notifying the respondents of the filing of the complaint were sent on September 24, 1984. The treasurer responded on behalf of the Vickers Committee and herself on October 15, 1984. On October 9, 1984, OSACS requested a two week extension. The extension was granted; and a response filed on October 26, 1984.

FACTUAL AND LEGAL ANALYSIS

The Vickers Committee responded to the complaint by submitting a copy of a refund check payable to OSACS dated October 10, 1984. The letter states that the refund will be reported on the Committee's Pre-General Election Report. The Vickers Committee states that good faith inquiries had been made to determine whether OSACS was incorporated. The Committee had determined that OSACS was not incorporated and therefore did not refund the money. However, the Vickers Committee states that upon notification that OSACS was incorporated, the money was refunded.

The response from OSACS states that it paid a hotel bill for Mr. Vickers in the amount of \$410. OSACS did not consider this payment to be an in-kind contribution to Vickers' federal campaign. The response notes OSACS's receipt of a check in the amount of \$410 from the Vickers Committee and deposit of the money to OSACS's account.

Pursuant to 2 U.S.C. § 441b, a corporation is prohibited from making a contribution or expenditure in connection with a federal election and a political committee is prohibited from knowingly accepting or receiving any contribution in violation of this section. The report filed by the Vickers Committee indicates that the contribution was received for "Testing the Waters." 11 C.F.R. § 101.3 requires that funds received prior to an individual becoming a candidate, which are not in compliance with the Act once the individual becomes a candidate, shall be returned to the contributor within ten days after the individual becomes a candidate.

Pursuant to 11 C.F.R. § 101.3, the \$410 should have been returned to OSACS within ten days after Mr. Vickers became a federal candidate. Mr. Vickers filed a Statement of Candidacy with the Commission on April 23, 1984. Using this date as the date he became a candidate under the Act, the Vickers Committee should have refunded the \$410 by May 3, 1984.

The Regulations place the responsibility for returning illegal funds received prior to becoming a candidate with the committee. The corporation in this matter paid for Vickers' room before he achieved candidate status and under the "testing of the waters" provision of the Act. Such activity by a corporation is not prohibited. Thus, the Office of General Counsel recommends finding reason to believe the Vickers Committee violated 2 U.S.C. § 441b by failing to return the contribution within 10 days after Vickers became a candidate (11 C.F.R. § 101.3). However, since the amount of the violation is \$410 and the money has now been refunded, it is recommended that no further action be taken against the Vickers Committee. It is also recommended that no reason to believe be found against OSACS and the closing of the file.

RECOMMENDATION

1. Find reason to believe Vickers for People and its treasurer, Ruth Rothmeyer, violated 2 U.S.C. § 441b and take no further action.
2. Find no reason to believe Omaha Suburban Area Council of Schools violated the Act.
