**CONCILIATION AGREEMENT**

This matter was initiated by the Federal Election Commission (hereinafter "the Commission"), pursuant to information ascertained in the normal course of carrying out its supervisory responsibilities. The Commission found reason to believe that the Beech Aircraft Political Action Committee and Jim Gregory, as treasurer, ("Respondent") violated 2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(4)(B) by failing to file its 1984 pre-general election report in a timely manner.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Commission and Respondent, having participated in informal methods of conciliation, prior to a finding of probable cause to believe, do hereby agree as follows:

I. The Commission has jurisdiction over the Respondent and the subject matter of this proceeding, and this agreement has the effect of an agreement entered pursuant to 2 U.S.C. § 437g(a)(4)(A)(i).

II. Respondent has had a reasonable opportunity to demonstrate that no action should be taken in this matter.

III. Respondent enters voluntarily into this agreement with the Commission.

IV. The pertinent facts in this matter are as follows:

1. Respondent, Beech Aircraft Political Action Committee, is a multicandidate political committee with Jim Gregory as treasurer.

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2. The 1984 Pre-General Election Report was due on October 25, 1984.

3. On November 19, 1984, the Respondent filed a Monthly Report covering the pre-general election period.

4. Respondent's 1984 Pre-General Report was filed 25 days late. Responent contends, however, that such late filing was inadvertent and unintentional.

V. 2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(4)(B) states that committees not authorized by a candidate shall file monthly reports in all calendar years which shall be filed no later than the 20th day after the last day of the month and shall be complete as of the last day of the month, except that, in lieu of filing the reports otherwise due in November and December of any year in which a regularly scheduled general election is held, a pre-general election report shall be filed . . .

VI. Respondent filed its 1984 Pre-General Report late in violation of 2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(4)(B).

VII. Respondent will pay a civil penalty to the Treasurer of the United States in the amount of One Hundred Seventy-Five dollars (\$175), pursuant to 2 U.S.C. § 437g(a)(5)(A).

VIII. Respondent agrees that it shall not undertake any activity which is in violation of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended, 2 U.S.C. § 431, et seq.

IX. The Commission, on request of anyone filing a complaint under 2 U.S.C. § 437g(a)(1) concerning the matters at issue herein or on its own motion, may review compliance with this

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agreement. If the Commission believes that this agreement or any requirement thereof has been violated, it may institute a civil action for relief in the United States District Court for the District of Columbia.

X. This agreement shall become effective as of the date that all parties hereto have executed same and the Commission has approved the entire agreement.

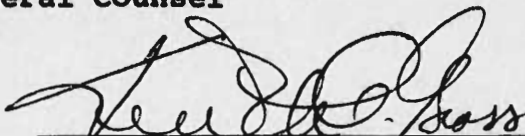
XI. Respondent shall have no more than thirty (30) days from the date this agreement becomes effective to comply with and implement the requirements contained in this agreement and to so notify the Commission.

XII. This Conciliation Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the parties on the matters raised herein, and no other statement, promise, or agreement, either written or oral, made by either party or by agents of either party, that is not contained in this written agreement shall be valid.

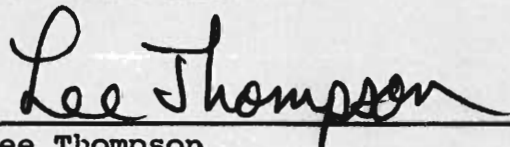

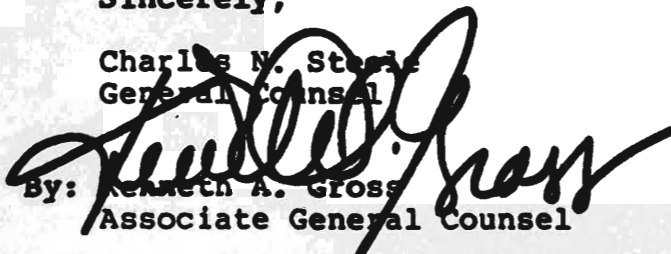
Dear Mr. Thompson:

BRIEF OF BEECHPAC

I. STATEMENT OF THE CASE AND RECITATION OF FACTS

This brief is filed on behalf of the Beech Aircraft Political Action Committee, "BEECHPAC" and its Treasurer, James M. Gregory, for the purpose of responding to the General Counsel's brief detailing the legal and factual issues of the case.

BEECHPAC previously submitted a letter dated March 26, 1985, stating that while the pre-general election report otherwise due October 25, 1984 was not filed, the information generated in and relevant to that period was fully reported in a regular monthly report filed by the Committee on November 19, 1984. Thus, upon the facts before the Commission, it appears that all information otherwise required to be disclosed in the pre-general election report was reported to the Commission although the date of filing of such a report was inadvertently erroneous: i.e. it was disclosed in a regular monthly report rather than a pre-general election report.

Attached hereto as Exhibit 1 is an Affidavit of James M. Gregory, Treasurer of the BEECHPAC, verifying that any violations

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of the reporting requirements of the Act were wholly inadvertent and unintentional. The Affidavit further specifies the considerable detail and extraordinary lengths to which the committee has gone to insure that no violation occurs in the future. We hereby request that this brief and the attached Affidavit be made a part of any file in connection with this action.

## II. REQUEST FOR PRE-PROBABLE CAUSE CONCILIATION

Based upon the available facts, BEECHPAC has previously requested pre-probable cause conciliation on the basis that it would admit to have inadvertently and unintentionally failed to file the pre-general election report in October, 1984; and, further, that it would agree to fully and completely comply with reporting requirements in the future.

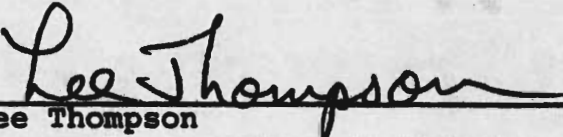
BEECHPAC is desirous of performing in full harmony and compliance with all federal, state and local laws, rules and regulations. Thus, BEECHPAC is willing to go to substantial lengths to assure the Commission that there has been no failure to disclose the substance of its activities; no material or intentional violation of the law; and that there will be no deviation from the reporting requirements of the Commission in the future.

III. CONCLUSION

This brief is submitted principally for the purpose of further elucidating the unintentional nature of any possible violation as to which the Commission is being asked to find probable cause; and further to support and undergird BEECHPAC's request for a pre-probable cause conciliation agreement.

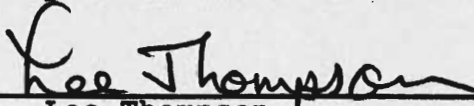

James M. Gregory, being duly sworn, on his oath states as follows:

My name is James M. Gregory. I served as Treasurer of the Beech Aircraft Political Action Committee (BEECHPAC) for a period in 1982 and 1983 and, then again from June 1, 1984 until the present.

As current Treasurer of BEECHPAC I received the "Reason to Believe" letter dated March 19, 1985 from the Federal Election Commission (the Commission) on March 25, 1985 and reviewed the General Counsel's Factual and Legal Analysis attached thereto. I also authored the letter dated March 26, 1985 to the Commission in which I stated that while BEECHPAC filed an accurate monthly report covering the period of October, 1984, it did not, apparently in error, file the pre-election report which covered the same time period. The failure to do so was wholly inadvertant and unintentional, there being no desire, need or intent to conceal any information which was fully reported a few weeks later.

Since receiving the letter dated March 19, 1985 regarding MUR 1930 from the Federal Election Commission, BEECHPAC has taken steps to insure that future pre-election reports will be filed in a timely manner. Desk calendars have been marked appropriately and we have placed adequate notices in the follow-up filing system for BEECHPAC to insure timely compliance in the future.

We have additionally instructed staff verbally and by memo that a pre-election report must be prepared in advance of the 1986 and 1988 general elections. We have notified all members of the BEECHPAC Board as authorized by our Bylaws that a report must be filed in a timely manner prior to the general elections. We have also notified Lee Thompson of the firm Martin, Pringle, Oliver, Triplett & Wallace that the BEECHPAC pre-general-election report must be filed to further assure that BEECHPAC will file timely reports. Additionally we have highlighted that portion of the Federal Election Code which discusses the timing for pre-election reports and have documented the appropriate reporting procedures for the 1986 general election.

I believe that BEECHPAC has taken every possible step to insure that violations of reporting requirements will not occur again.

**GENERAL COUNSEL'S BRIEF**

**I. STATEMENT OF THE CASE**

On March 13, 1985, the Commission found reason to believe that the Beech Aircraft Political Action Committee "(Beechpac" or the Committee") and Jim Gregory, as treasurer, violated 2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(4)(B) by failing to file on time its report covering the pre-election period for the 1984 general election.

The Reports Analysis Division referred the Committee to the Office of General Counsel for failure to file its pre-general election report due October 25, 1984. On November 19, 1984, the Committee submitted by certified mail, a regular monthly report covering the period October 1, through October 31, 1984, which included the period of the pre-general report (October 1 - October 17, 1984). For the month of October 1984, the report showed receipts of \$2,596.08 and disbursements of \$4,200.00. Ending cash on hand was reported as \$13,306.71.

**II. LEGAL ANALYSIS**

2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(4)(B) states that committees not authorized by a candidate shall file monthly reports in all calendar years which shall be filed no later than the 20th day after the last day of the month and shall be complete as of the last day of the month, except that, in lieu of filing the reports otherwise due in November and December of any year in which a

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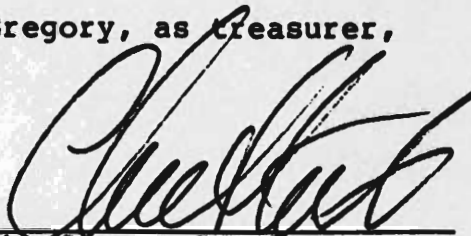
regularly scheduled general election is held, a pre-general election report shall be filed . . .

Beechpac's report covering the pre-general election period was 25 days late. The Committee's response to the reason to believe notice stated that it was "mistakenly unaware or oblivious to the requirement." The Committee also stated that it had modified procedures to ensure timely filing in the future. Because the 1984 pre-general report was filed late (in the Monthly report), this Office is prepared to recommend probable cause to believe that a violation of 2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(4)(B) occurred in this case.

### III. GENERAL COUNSEL'S RECOMMENDATION

Find probable cause to believe that the Beech Aircraft Political Action Committee and Jim Gregory, as Treasurer, violated 2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(4)(B).

Dear Mr. Gregory:

Based on information ascertained in the normal course of carrying out its supervisory responsibilities, the Federal Election Commission, on March 13, 1985, found reason to believe that the Beech Aircraft Political Action Committee and you, as treasurer, had violated 2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(4)(B), and instituted an investigation in this matter.

After considering all the evidence available to the Commission, the Office of the General Counsel is prepared to recommend that the Commission find probable cause to believe that a violation has occurred.

Submitted for your review is a brief stating the position of the General Counsel on the legal and factual issues of the case. Within fifteen days of your receipt of this notice, you may file with the Secretary of the Commission a brief (10 copies if possible) stating your position on the issues and replying to the brief of the General Counsel. (Three copies of such brief should also be forwarded to the Office of General Counsel, if possible.) The General Counsel's brief and any brief which you may submit will be considered by the Commission before proceeding to a vote of probable cause to believe a violation has occurred.

If you are unable to file a responsive brief within 15 days, you may submit a written request to the Commission for an extension of time in which to file a brief. The Commission will not grant any extensions beyond 20 days.

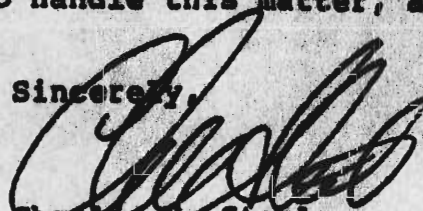
A finding of probable cause to believe requires that the Office of General Counsel attempt for a period of not less than thirty, but not more than ninety, days to settle this matter through a conciliation agreement.

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On June 5, 1985, Beechpac responded to the General Counsel's Brief, stating that "all information otherwise required to be disclosed in the pre-general election report was reported to the Commission ... in a regular monthly report rather than a pre-general election report." Beechpac asserts that any violation was "wholly inadvertent and unintentional." The response includes an affidavit from the treasurer specifying the measures taken to ensure timely filing in the future.

## II. LEGAL ANALYSIS

2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(4)(B) states that committees not authorized by a candidate shall file monthly reports in all calendar years which shall be filed no later than the 20th day after the last day of the month and shall be complete as of the last day of the month, except that, in lieu of filing the reports otherwise due in November and December of any year in which a regularly scheduled general election is held, a pre-general election report shall be filed . . .

Beechpac's report covering the pre-general election period was 25 days late. Therefore, the Committee's late filing constitutes a violation of 2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(4)(B).

## III. DISCUSSION OF CONCILIATION PROVISIONS AND CIVIL PENALTY

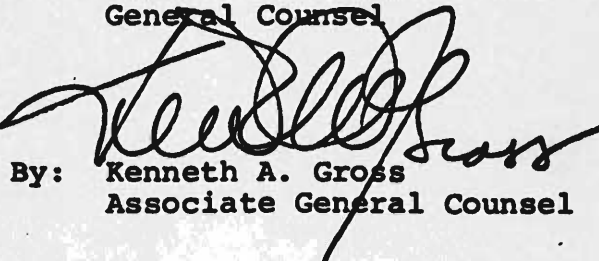

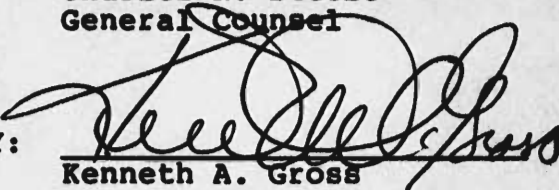

Following review of the information which generated the MUR, a recommendation on how to proceed on the matter, which shall include preliminary legal and factual analysis, and any information compiled from materials available to the Commission shall be submitted to the Commission. This initial report shall recommend either: (a) that the Commission find reason to believe that a possible violation of the Federal Election Campaign Act (FECA) may have occurred or is about to occur and that the Commission conduct an investigation of the matter; or (b) that the Commission find no reason to believe that a possible violation of the FECA has occurred and that the Commission close the file on the matter.

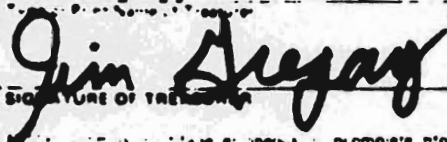
