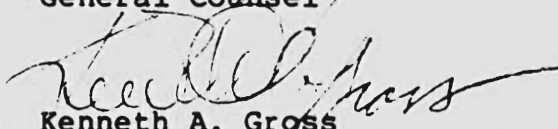

GENERAL COUNSEL'S REPORT

SENSITIVE

I. BACKGROUND

Complainant John Emmett Crow alleges that John Ray Harrison for Congress ("the Committee") and Michael Harrison, as treasurer, violated 2 U.S.C. § 434(b) by failing to report all receipts and disbursements in connection with a campaign fund raiser. The campaign fund raiser was held at "Gilley's", in Pasadena, Texas, on March 7, 1982. Complainant contends that at least \$50,000 was raised at the event and that these funds were not reported. Complainant further contends that performances of Mickey Gilley and his band were in-kind contributions and were not reported by the Committee.

After an initial problem notifying Respondent of the May 3, 1985 complaint in this matter, a copy of the complaint was transmitted to the Respondent on May 29, 1985. On June 18, 1985, a response to the notification of complaint was received by the Commission. (Attachment I.)

II. FACTUAL AND LEGAL ANALYSIS

2 U.S.C. § 434(b) requires, in part, a political committee to report the receipt of all contributions.

11 C.F.R. § 100.7(b)(3) provides that the value of services provided without compensation by any individual who volunteers on behalf of candidate or political committee is not a contribution.

In response to the complaint, Respondent has submitted campaign records which indicate that a total of \$18,300 was collected at the fund raiser at "Gilley's" in amounts of \$200 or less. In addition, Respondent submitted records which indicate that the Committee received an additional \$1,705 in contributions, not related to the fundraiser, in amounts of \$200 or less. These contributions were reported by the Committee in its 1982 April Quarterly Report as a memo entry for unitemized contributions totalling \$20,005. Therefore, the Office of General Counsel recommends that the Commission find no reason to believe that the Committee violated 2 U.S.C. § 434(b).

Complainant also contends that Mickey Gilley and his band were not paid for their performance at the March 7 fundraiser, resulting in an in-kind contribution to the Committee and subject to disclosure. Since the performance of Mickey Gilley and his band falls under the volunteer services exception at 11 C.F.R. § 100.7(b)(3), it is therefore not considered a contribution.

III. RECOMMENDATIONS

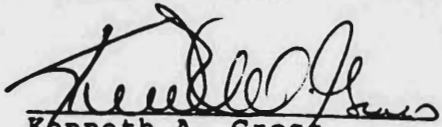
1. Find no reason to believe John Ray Harrison for Congress and Michael Harrison, as treasurer, violated 2 U.S.C. § 434(b).

This letter and the enclosed information is in response to an alleged complaint which your office received on May 3, 1985.

Before we get into the complaint itself, I would like to outline to the best of my abilities the reasons for the complaint and the events which lead to the complaint.

As treasurer for my father, John Ray Harrison, a candidate for Congress to the best of my knowledge we have complied with the Federal Election Code. I am sure that from time to time there might have been some technical mistakes but, if any, were unintended. John Ray Harrison, the former Mayor of Pasadena, filed for Mayor of Pasadena subject to the April 6, 1985 general election. At that time he was running against the incumbent Johnny Isbell. There were three other candidates in the race besides my father and Mr. Isbell. On April 6, 1985, my father lead all candidates by approximately 135 votes, not having a majority and leading the incumbent, Mr. Isbell, by 135 votes he was then thrown into a run-off. The third candidate in the race who received approximately 20% of the vote threw his support and endorsed my father.

Almost immediately Mr. Isbell began to run a negative campaign for the run-off election which was set for May 4, 1985. I am sure as both candidates tracked and polled our pollsters were showing that we were ahead of Mr. Isbell by a 58% to 60% margin. All of Mr. Isbell's radio media and derogatory ads apparently were not helping him in the polls. So on April 26, 1985, Mr. Isbell held a press conference with all the Houston and Pasadena newspapers and Houston television stations present and his press release dated April 26, 1985 in essence said he would like to reveal to all the citizens of Pasadena the true character of his opponent, John Ray Harrison. At that time he said my father had violated laws on every level, the federal election laws, the state election laws, the criminal code and city ordinances of Pasadena.

To support the violations of the Federal Election Laws there was an affidavit prepared by John Emmett Crow who was very active in Mr. Isbell's campaign and takes credit for alot of the negativism. The affidavit was dated April 24, 1985, two days before the press conference orchestrated to attack the character of my father. Also, on April 24, 1985, Mr. Johnny Isbell sent an affidavit to the District Attorney of Harris County, Texas, John Holmes, stating that my father had violated the local election code. This was mailed to the District Attorney's Office to support his press conference of April 26, 1985, as his complaint was mailed to your office and received on May 3, 1985. As you can see by his press release letter there are numerous accusations against

my father and he said the community had a right to know. Further, Mr. Isbell or his Chief of Police or someone in his campaign got from the Police Department an offense report of an incident that happened in 1968 which was unfounded and had a mug shot of my father and also the first page of the offense report.

I would further state to you on the complaint to the District Attorney's Office that the District Attorney's Office checked it out and my father appeared before the Grand Jury, the Grand Jury said that it was unfounded and to be very frank some of the Grand Jury members stated afterwards that the wrong person was before the Grand Jury inferring that Mr. Isbell should have been before the Grand Jury.

On May 1 and 2, 1985, Mr. Isbell had a mass mailing of 27,000 pieces of mail using the United States Postal Service to mail to the voters of Pasadena the Press Release, a copy of the Complaint to your office, a copy of the Complaint to the Office of the Harris County District Attorney, a copy of a Pasadena Police Department offense report, my father's mug shot and a piece of campaign literature from Mr. Isbell that stated that John Ray Harrison's crime record as Mayor was even worse than his personal record.

We are sending you these six pieces of mail or letters that were mailed in the same envelope just prior to the run-off election by Mr. Isbell using Mr. Isbell's bulk rate postage permit. We will mark these items as one, Respondent's Exhibit One. This will give you some background of why the complaint was filed with the Federal Election Commission in the first place and we will show that it is frivolous, was political, hearsay and a media stunt trying to discredit my father.

On May 4, 1985, my father, John Ray Harrison, beat the incumbent candidate Johnny Isbell by a margin of 54% to 46% of the vote and John Ray Harrison is now the Mayor of the City of Pasadena.

Certainly, I resent as does my father, someone trying to use our government agencies for their benefit.

By the way, the Federal Attorney is looking into the matter of the violations of the Federal Privacy Act by Mr. Isbell or his Police Chief or some of his agents taking from the Police Department, reproducing and mailing to the citizens of Pasadena for his on political gain the first page of the offense report and mug shot.

As stated in the letter we received, this matter will remain confidential in accordance with 2 U. S. C. Section 437G a (4) (b) and Section 437G (a) (12) (a) unless my father or myself notifies the commission in writing that we wish this matter to be made public. As you are aware, this matter has been made 100% public by the media, by Mr. Isbell and by the mass mailing of Mr. Isbell which is a violation, we consider, on Mr. Isbell's part.

Now to the alleged allegations and our explanation to the best of our ability.

As you can see in Respondent's One, a copy of a ticket John Ray Harrison for Congress to an event that was to be held at Gilley's on March 7, 1982. A brief background of the event, first the event was held on a Sunday afternoon, Gilley's was open to the general public, John Ray Harrison for Congress Committee did not have exclusive use of the premises between the hours of 1 p.m. and 5 p.m. There was an area so designated for the John Ray Harrison Committee to set up, serve Bar-B-Q and tea. The people coming to the John Ray Harrison for Congress function could buy beer at their own cost and expense. Johnny Lee and others did not show, the Urban Cowboy Band did not show, the local house band was there and would have been there anyway because Gilley's was open to the public, Mickey Gilley did appear and sang about four songs. If you will look at our report and our FCC ID # is 087386 and was signed by myself on April 12, 1982, and it shows itemized disbursements and shows a disbursement to Gene Enterprises, 4500 Spencer Highway, Pasadena, Texas, of \$2,000.00. Gene Enterprises is Mickey Gilley and this was the agreed price for the things printed on the ticket such as an appearance by Mickey Gilley and Johnny Lee and their Urban Cowboy Band. The people that should be complaining are the people that bought the tickets and a no show by Johnny Lee, the Urban Cowboy Band and the brief appearance of Mickey Gilley. Further, our disbursements on page four (4) of the same report shows that we paid R & E Catering \$1,399.00 for Bar-B-Q that our volunteers served. This was for meat preparation, etc. which was a turn-key job to R & E Catering. Further, to Gene Enterprises the \$2,000.00 was an agreed turn-key price.

In the complaint they alleged that Mr. Gilley's services were worth \$15,000.00 and our committee or no one else would pay Mr. Gilley this type of money and certainly we would not. That is a figure that Mr. Crow apparently arbitrarily and capriciously came up with.

There could have been a thousand people in attendance at Gilley's on that day. As we have stated it was open to the general public, alot of campaign volunteers and certainly alot of free tickets. The event was to raise money but also to draw a crowd.

As we refer back to the reporting period covering January 1st to March 31st, item 10 shows a \$20,000.00 loan that my father secured. The loan had been paid to \$10,000.00 by the end of the campaign but my father has paid out of his own pocket the note to the bank and the note is now reduced to approximately \$2,000.00. There have been no events for fund raising for my father since we have made our last report.

As you will see Item 16 shows the total receipts during this reporting period is \$66,705.00 of that \$20,000.00 was a loan which left the total contributions of \$46,705.00 which is reported on Item 6a, total contributions. You will further see in the report \$6,200.00 from political action committees which is reported. Further, you will see reported

from individuals itemized and identified the amount of \$20,500.00 which now leaves us with \$1,705.00 which are contributions under the amount that have to be identified and reported which had no connections with the Gilley fund raiser which now leaves us with the monies received from the Gilley's fund raiser which was \$18,300.00, tickets sold. These amount total \$46,705.00 in contributions during this reporting period. Further, when we add the \$20,000.00 bank loan our total receipt will then reflect \$66,705.00. I am sure that we would have liked to have made more money and especially money like the complainant has alleged. We are enclosing a copy of our records, marked Respondents Exhibit Two to reflect the \$18,300.00 that we received from tickets from the Gilley's Event and further we will mark as Respondent's Exhibit Three the \$1,705.00 of contributors which were unrelated and by law is reportable by the amounts in the total contribution column.

We feel that this is a frivolous political claim and at this time will not designate counsel but our willing to cooperate in this matter.

PRESS RELEASE

APRIL 26, 1985

I would like to make some revelations today which I believe will have a profound effect on the runoff election for Mayor of Pasadena on May 4th.

I'm making these disclosures because the voters of this city have the right to know the true character of my opponent, John Ray Harrison.

I will be discussing with you today Attorney Harrison's violations of the law at every level: (1) Federal Election Laws; (2) State Election Laws; (3) The Criminal Code and (4) City Ordinances.

John Ray Harrison has consistently disregarded the law. He established a pattern in 1968 and it has continued through the years.

Official police records document a series of bizarre events in February 1968 involving Attorney John Ray Harrison including unlawful entry, loitering, and aggravated assault on a woman in South Houston and Pasadena. He was arrested and charged. I have an official police document, which is a matter of public record, to substantiate my statement.

Attorney Harrison's pattern of disrespect for the law continued. Federal Elections Commission's reports filed in Washington following his unsuccessful campaign for Congress show serious discrepancies regarding a major fund-raising event at Gilley's on Sunday, March 7, 1982. Though it was a \$100 per couple party, no contributions were reported. Conservatively, a thousand people attended the party which equates to \$50,000.

At this same event, the services of Mickey Gilley and his band were donated but not reported -- a contribution worth at least \$15,000. These "omissions" were clearly violations of the federal election laws, subject to fines and imprisonment. I have a copy of the federal campaign report to back up my charge. I also have a copy of the formal complaint that was filed with the Federal Elections Commission.

And, as the news media has reported within the last week, Attorney Harrison has violated Texas law by soliciting and accepting a campaign contribution for his current race 10 months before he filed the required papers declaring his campaign committee and treasurer.

To top off his obvious disrespect for law and order, within the last month:

Attorney Harrison has vowed to remove our Police Chief because the Chief arrested his son for the destruction of property.

Attorney Harrison has intimidated and interfered with Senior Citizens trying to vote absentee at City Hall.

Attorney Harrison has violated City ordinances by having one of his campaign signs posted on the porch of City Hall.

And, Attorney Harrison has permitted his married daughter to vote absentee in the April 6th Pasadena election even though she lives in Houston. She voted under her maiden name and used her father's address.

I can't imagine the citizens of Pasadena electing a candidate with a police record and a history of law violations.

Knowing the facts about the character of John Ray Harrison, I'm confident the voters of this community will exercise their good judgement and vote against returning John Ray Harrison to this city's highest elective office.

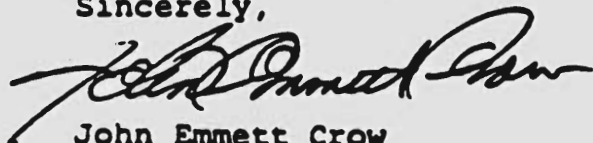
John Ray Harrison had a campaign fund raising party at Gilley's, a nationally known nightclub, Sunday, March 7, 1982, from 1:00 p.m. until 5:00 p.m. His FEC report shows Two Thousand Dollars (\$2,000.00) paid for leasing of the premises but nothing for the entertainment or ticket proceeds.

John Ray Harrison violated the Federal Elections Act because of his reporting DOES NOT show:

1. Any proceeds from approximately 1,000 tickets sold for One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) per couple for the event, estimated at Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00).
2. An "In-Kind" contribution by Mickey Gilley, of "Urban Cowboy" fame, and his band. Mickey Gilley and his band played for the event. A conservative, fair-market value at that time for Mickey Gilley and his band to perform would have been Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000.00). It has been verified that Mickey Gilley and his band did play at the event and were not paid; therefore, an "In-kind" contribution should have been reported by John Ray Harrison.

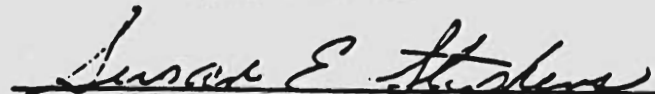

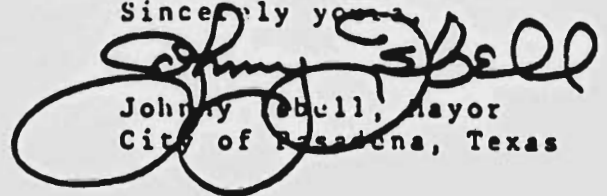

Please advise disposition of this case.

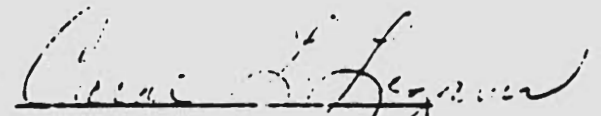

Ex-Rep Harrison Put Under Bond In Assault Case

John Ray Harrison, a former state representative and youth counselor for the City of Pasadena and the Pasadena school system, posted \$400 bond Wednesday on a charge of aggravated assault.

Mrs. Peggy Graybill filed the complaint in Justice of the Peace Dave Thompson's court, charging that Harrison beat her about the face and body Tuesday at his law office.

Harrison, a Pasadena attorney who represented District 24 in the Legislature in 1965-66, said Wednesday the incident resulted from a misunderstanding about a personal matter.

GENERAL COUNSEL'S REPORT

SENSITIVE

I. BACKGROUND

Complainant John Emmett Crow alleges that John Ray Harrison for Congress ("the Committee") and Michael Harrison, as treasurer, violated 2 U.S.C. § 434(b) by failing to report all receipts and disbursements in connection with a campaign fund raiser. The campaign fund raiser was held at "Gilley's", in Pasadena, Texas, on March 7, 1982. Complainant contends that at least \$50,000 was raised at the event and that these funds were not reported. Complainant further contends that performances of Mickey Gilley and his band were in-kind contributions and were not reported by the Committee.

After an initial problem notifying Respondent of the May 3, 1985 complaint in this matter, a copy of the complaint was transmitted to the Respondent on May 29, 1985. On June 18, 1985, a response to the notification of complaint was received by the Commission. (Attachment I.)

II. FACTUAL AND LEGAL ANALYSIS

2 U.S.C. § 434(b) requires, in part, a political committee to report the receipt of all contributions.

11 C.F.R. § 100.7(b)(3) provides that the value of services provided without compensation by any individual who volunteers on behalf of candidate or political committee is not a contribution.

In response to the complaint, Respondent has submitted campaign records which indicate that a total of \$18,300 was collected at the fund raiser at "Gilley's" in amounts of \$200 or less. In addition, Respondent submitted records which indicate that the Committee received an additional \$1,705 in contributions, not related to the fundraiser, in amounts of \$200 or less. These contributions were reported by the Committee in its 1982 April Quarterly Report as a memo entry for unitemized contributions totalling \$20,005. Therefore, the Office of General Counsel recommends that the Commission find no reason to believe that the Committee violated 2 U.S.C. § 434(b).

Complainant also contends that Mickey Gilley and his band were not paid for their performance at the March 7 fundraiser, resulting in an in-kind contribution to the Committee and subject to disclosure. Since the performance of Mickey Gilley and his band falls under the volunteer services exception at 11 C.F.R. § 100.7(b)(3), it is therefore not considered a contribution.

III. RECOMMENDATIONS

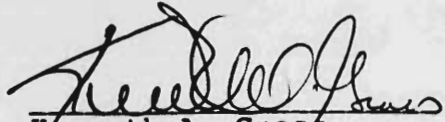

This letter and the enclosed information is in response to an alleged complaint which your office received on May 3, 1985.

GENERAL COUNSEL

Before we get into the complaint itself, I would like to outline to the best of my abilities the reasons for the complaint and the events which lead to the complaint.

As treasurer for my father, John Ray Harrison, a candidate for Congress to the best of my knowledge we have complied with the Federal Election Code. I am sure that from time to time there might have been some technical mistakes but, if any, were unintended. John Ray Harrison, the former Mayor of Pasadena, filed for Mayor of Pasadena subject to the April 6, 1985 general election. At that time he was running against the incumbent Johnny Isbell. There were three other candidates in the race besides my father and Mr. Isbell. On April 6, 1985; my father lead all candidates by approximately 135 votes, not having a majority and leading the incumbent, Mr. Isbell, by 135 votes he was then thrown into a run-off. The third candidate in the race who received approximately 20% of the vote threw his support and endorsed my father.

Almost immediately Mr. Isbell began to run a negative campaign for the run-off election which was set for May 4, 1985. I am sure as both candidates tracked and polled our pollsters were showing that we were ahead of Mr. Isbell by a 58% to 60% margin. All of Mr. Isbell's radio media and derogatory ads apparently were not helping him in the polls. So on April 26, 1985, Mr. Isbell held a press conference with all the Houston and Pasadena newspapers and Houston television stations present and his press release dated April 26, 1985 in essence said he would like to reveal to all the citizens of Pasadena the true character of his opponent, John Ray Harrison. At that time he said my father had violated laws on every level, the federal election laws, the state election laws, the criminal code and city ordinances of Pasadena.

To support the violations of the Federal Election Laws there was an affidavit prepared by John Emmett Crow who was very active in Mr. Isbell's campaign and takes credit for alot of the negativism. The affidavit was dated April 24, 1985, two days before the press conference orchestrated to attack the character of my father. Also, on April 24, 1985, Mr. Johnny Isbell sent an affidavit to the District Attorney of Harris County, Texas, John Holmes, stating that my father had violated the local election code. This was mailed to the District Attorney's Office to support his press conference of April 26, 1985, as his complaint was mailed to your office and received on May 3, 1985. As you can see by his press release letter there are numerous accusations against

my father and he said the community had a right to know. Further, Mr. Isbell or his Chief of Police or someone in his campaign got from the Police Department an offense report of an incident that happened in 1968 which was unfounded and had a mug shot of my father and also the first page of the offense report.

I would further state to you on the complaint to the District Attorney's Office that the District Attorney's Office checked it out and my father appeared before the Grand Jury, the Grand Jury said that it was unfounded and to be very frank some of the Grand Jury members stated afterwards that the wrong person was before the Grand Jury inferring that Mr. Isbell should have been before the Grand Jury.

On May 1 and 2, 1985, Mr. Isbell had a mass mailing of 27,000 pieces of mail using the United States Postal Service to mail to the voters of Pasadena the Press Release, a copy of the Complaint to your office, a copy of the Complaint to the Office of the Harris County District Attorney, a copy of a Pasadena Police Department offense report, my father's mug shot and a piece of campaign literature from Mr. Isbell that stated that John Ray Harrison's crime record as Mayor was even worse than his personal record.

We are sending you these six pieces of mail or letters that were mailed in the same envelope just prior to the run-off election by Mr. Isbell using Mr. Isbell's bulk rate postage permit. We will mark these items as one, Respondent's Exhibit One. This will give you some background of why the complaint was filed with the Federal Election Commission in the first place and we will show that it is frivolous, was political, hearsay and a media stunt trying to discredit my father.

On May 4, 1985, my father, John Ray Harrison, beat the incumbent candidate Johnny Isbell by a margin of 54% to 46% of the vote and John Ray Harrison is now the Mayor of the City of Pasadena.

Certainly, I resent as does my father, someone trying to use our government agencies for their benefit.

By the way, the Federal Attorney is looking into the matter of the violations of the Federal Privacy Act by Mr. Isbell or his Police Chief or some of his agents taking from the Police Department, reproducing and mailing to the citizens of Pasadena for his on political gain the first page of the offense report and mug shot.

As stated in the letter we received, this matter will remain confidential in accordance with 2 U. S. C. Section 437G a (4) (b) and Section 437G (a) (12) (a) unless my father or myself notifies the commission in writing that we wish this matter to be made public. As you are aware, this matter has been made 100% public by the media, by Mr. Isbell and by the mass mailing of Mr. Isbell which is a violation, we consider, on Mr. Isbell's part.

Now to the alleged allegations and our explanation to the best of our ability.

As you can see in Respondent's One, a copy of a ticket John Ray Harrison for Congress to an event that was to be held at Gilley's on March 7, 1982. A brief background of the event, first the event was held on a Sunday afternoon, Gilley's was open to the general public, John Ray Harrison for Congress Committee did not have exclusive use of the premises between the hours of 1 p.m. and 5 p.m. There was an area so designated for the John Ray Harrison Committee to set up, serve Bar-B-Q and tea. The people coming to the John Ray Harrison for Congress function could buy beer at their own cost and expense. Johnny Lee and others did not show, the Urban Cowboy Band did not show, the local house band was there and would have been there anyway because Gilley's was open to the public, Mickey Gilley did appear and sang about four songs. If you will look at our report and our FCC ID # is 087386 and was signed by myself on April 12, 1982, and it shows itemized disbursements and shows a disbursement to Gene Enterprises, 4500 Spencer Highway, Pasadena, Texas, of \$2,000.00. Gene Enterprises is Mickey Gilley and this was the agreed price for the things printed on the ticket such as an appearance by Mickey Gilley and Johnny Lee and their Urban Cowboy Band. The people that should be complaining are the people that bought the tickets and a no show by Johnny Lee, the Urban Cowboy Band and the brief appearance of Mickey Gilley. Further, our disbursements on page four (4) of the same report shows that we paid R & E Catering \$1,399.00 for Bar-B-Q that our volunteers served. This was for meat preparation, etc. which was a turn-key job to R & E Catering. Further, to Gene Enterprises the \$2,000.00 was an agreed turn-key price.

In the complaint they alleged that Mr. Gilley's services were worth \$15,000.00 and our committee or no one else would pay Mr. Gilley this type of money and certainly we would not. That is a figure that Mr. Crow apparently arbitrarily and capriciously came up with.

There could have been a thousand people in attendance at Gilley's on that day. As we have stated it was open to the general public, alot of campaign volunteers and certainly alot of free tickets. The event was to raise money but also to draw a crowd.

As we refer back to the reporting period covering January 1st to March 31st, item 10 shows a \$20,000.00 loan that my father secured. The loan had been paid to \$10,000.00 by the end of the campaign but my father has paid out of his own pocket the note to the bank and the note is now reduced to approximately \$2,000.00. There have been no events for fund raising for my father since we have made our last report.

As you will see Item 16 shows the total receipts during this reporting period is \$66,705.00 of that \$20,000.00 was a loan which left the total contributions of \$46,705.00 which is reported on Item 6a, total contributions. You will further see in the report \$6,200.00 from political action committees which is reported. Further, you will see reported

from individuals itemized and identified the amount of \$20,500.00 which now leaves us with \$1,705.00 which are contributions under the amount that have to be identified and reported which had no connections with the Gilley fund raiser which now leaves us with the monies received from the Gilley's fund raiser which was \$18,300.00, tickets sold. These amount total \$46,705.00 in contributions during this reporting period. Further, when we add the \$20,000.00 bank loan our total receipt will then reflect \$66,705.00. I am sure that we would have liked to have made more money and especially money like the complainant has alleged. We are enclosing a copy of our records, marked Respondents Exhibit Two to reflect the \$18,300.00 that we received from tickets from the Gilley's Event and further we will mark as Respondent's Exhibit Three the \$1,705.00 of contributors which were unrelated and by law is reportable by the amounts in the total contribution column.

We feel that this is a frivolous political claim and at this time will not designate counsel but our willing to cooperate in this matter.

I would like to make some revelations today which I believe will have a profound effect on the runoff election for Mayor of Pasadena on May 4th.

I'm making these disclosures because the voters of this city have the right to know the true character of my opponent, John Ray Harrison.

I will be discussing with you today Attorney Harrison's violations of the law at every level: (1) Federal Election Laws; (2) State Election Laws; (3) The Criminal Code and (4) City Ordinances.

John Ray Harrison has consistently disregarded the law. He established a pattern in 1968 and it has continued through the years.

Official police records document a series of bizarre events in February 1968 involving Attorney John Ray Harrison including unlawful entry, loitering, and aggravated assault on a woman in South Houston and Pasadena. He was arrested and charged. I have an official police document, which is a matter of public record, to substantiate my statement.

Attorney Harrison's pattern of disrespect for the law continued. Federal Elections Commission's reports filed in Washington following his unsuccessful campaign for Congress show serious discrepancies regarding a major fund-raising event at Gilley's on Sunday, March 7, 1982. Though it was a \$100 per couple party, no contributions were reported. Conservatively, a thousand people attended the party which equates to \$50,000.

At this same event, the services of Mickey Gilley and his band were donated but not reported -- a contribution worth at least \$15,000. These "omissions" were clearly violations of the federal election laws, subject to fines and imprisonment. I have a copy of the federal campaign report to back up my charge. I also have a copy of the formal complaint that was filed with the Federal Elections Commission.

And, as the news media has reported within the last week, Attorney Harrison has violated Texas law by soliciting and accepting a campaign contribution for his current race 10 months before he filed the required papers declaring his campaign committee and treasurer.

To top off his obvious disrespect for law and order, within the last month:

Attorney Harrison has vowed to remove our Police Chief because the Chief arrested his son for the destruction of property.

Attorney Harrison has intimidated and interfered with Senior Citizens trying to vote absentee at City Hall.

Attorney Harrison has violated City ordinances by having one of his campaign signs posted on the porch of City Hall.

And, Attorney Harrison has permitted his married daughter to vote absentee in the April 6th Pasadena election even though she lives in Houston. She voted under her maiden name and used her father's address.

I can't imagine the citizens of Pasadena electing a candidate with a police record and a history of law violations.

Knowing the facts about the character of John Ray Harrison, I'm confident the voters of this community will exercise their good judgement and vote against returning John Ray Harrison to this city's highest elective office.

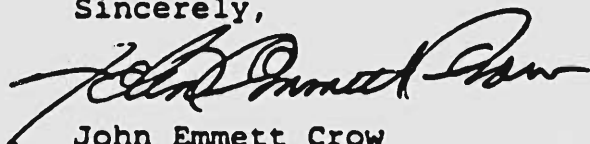
John Ray Harrison violated the Federal Elections Act because of his reporting DOES NOT show:

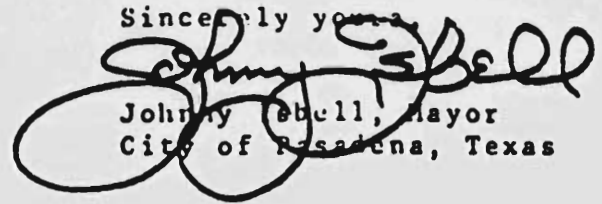

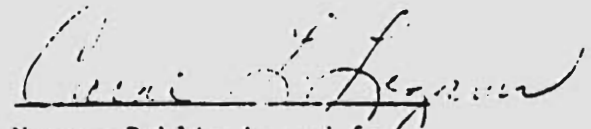

Harrison, a Pasadena attorney who represented District 24 in the Legislature in 1965-66, said Wednesday the incident resulted from a misunderstanding about a personal matter.

This letter and the enclosed information is in response to an alleged complaint which your office received on May 3, 1985.

Before we get into the complaint itself, I would like to outline to the best of my abilities the reasons for the complaint and the events which lead to the complaint.

As treasurer for my father, John Ray Harrison, a candidate for Congress to the best of my knowledge we have complied with the Federal Election Code. I am sure that from time to time there might have been some technical mistakes but, if any, were unintended. John Ray Harrison, the former Mayor of Pasadena, filed for Mayor of Pasadena subject to the April 6, 1985 general election. At that time he was running against the incumbent Johnny Isbell. There were three other candidates in the race besides my father and Mr. Isbell. On April 6, 1985, my father lead all candidates by approximately 135 votes, not having a majority and leading the incumbent, Mr. Isbell, by 135 votes he was then thrown into a run-off. The third candidate in the race who received approximately 20% of the vote threw his support and endorsed my father.

Almost immediately Mr. Isbell began to run a negative campaign for the run-off election which was set for May 4, 1985. I am sure as both candidates tracked and polled our pollsters were showing that we were ahead of Mr. Isbell by a 58% to 60% margin. All of Mr. Isbell's radio media and derogatory ads apparently were not helping him in the polls. So on April 26, 1985, Mr. Isbell held a press conference with all the Houston and Pasadena newspapers and Houston television stations present and his press release dated April 26, 1985 in essence said he would like to reveal to all the citizens of Pasadena the true character of his opponent, John Ray Harrison. At that time he said my father had violated laws on every level, the federal election laws, the state election laws, the criminal code and city ordinances of Pasadena.

To support the violations of the Federal Election Laws there was an affidavit prepared by John Emmett Crow who was very active in Mr. Isbell's campaign and takes credit for alot of the negativism. The affidavit was dated April 24, 1985, two days before the press conference orchestrated to attack the character of my father. Also, on April 24, 1985, Mr. Johnny Isbell sent an affidavit to the District Attorney of Harris County, Texas, John Holmes, stating that my father had violated the local election code. This was mailed to the District Attorney's Office to support his press conference of April 26, 1985, as his complaint was mailed to your office and received on May 3, 1985. As you can see by his press release letter there are numerous accusations against

my father and he said the community had a right to know. Further, Mr. Isbell or his Chief of Police or someone in his campaign got from the Police Department an offense report of an incident that happened in 1968 which was unfounded and had a mug shot of my father and also the first page of the offense report.

I would further state to you on the complaint to the District Attorney's Office that the District Attorney's Office checked it out and my father appeared before the Grand Jury, the Grand Jury said that it was unfounded and to be very frank some of the Grand Jury members stated afterwards that the wrong person was before the Grand Jury inferring that Mr. Isbell should have been before the Grand Jury.

On May 1 and 2, 1985, Mr. Isbell had a mass mailing of 27,000 pieces of mail using the United States Postal Service to mail to the voters of Pasadena the Press Release, a copy of the Complaint to your office, a copy of the Complaint to the Office of the Harris County District Attorney, a copy of a Pasadena Police Department offense report, my father's mug shot and a piece of campaign literature from Mr. Isbell that stated that John Ray Harrison's crime record as Mayor was even worse than his personal record.

We are sending you these six pieces of mail or letters that were mailed in the same envelope just prior to the run-off election by Mr. Isbell using Mr. Isbell's bulk rate postage permit. We will mark these items as one, Respondent's Exhibit One. This will give you some background of why the complaint was filed with the Federal Election Commission in the first place and we will show that it is frivolous, was political, hearsay and a media stunt trying to discredit my father.

On May 4, 1985, my father, John Ray Harrison, beat the incumbent candidate Johnny Isbell by a margin of 54% to 46% of the vote and John Ray Harrison is now the Mayor of the City of Pasadena.

Certainly, I resent as does my father, someone trying to use our government agencies for their benefit.

By the way, the Federal Attorney is looking into the matter of the violations of the Federal Privacy Act by Mr. Isbell or his Police Chief or some of his agents taking from the Police Department, reproducing and mailing to the citizens of Pasadena for his on political gain the first page of the offense report and mug shot.

As stated in the letter we received, this matter will remain confidential in accordance with 2 U. S. C. Section 437G a (4) (b) and Section 437G (a) (12) (a) unless my father or myself notifies the commission in writing that we wish this matter to be made public. As you are aware, this matter has been made 100% public by the media, by Mr. Isbell and by the mass mailing of Mr. Isbell which is a violation, we consider, on Mr. Isbell's part.

Now to the alleged allegations and our explanation to the best of our ability.

As you can see in Respondent's One, a copy of a ticket John Ray Harrison for Congress to an event that was to be held at Gilley's on March 7, 1982. A brief background of the event, first the event was held on a Sunday afternoon, Gilley's was open to the general public, John Ray Harrison for Congress Committee did not have exclusive use of the premises between the hours of 1 p.m. and 5 p.m. There was an area so designated for the John Ray Harrison Committee to set up, serve Bar-B-Q and tea. The people coming to the John Ray Harrison for Congress function could buy beer at their own cost and expense. Johnny Lee and others did not show, the Urban Cowboy Band did not show, the local house band was there and would have been there anyway because Gilley's was open to the public, Mickey Gilley did appear and sang about four songs. If you will look at our report and our FCC ID # is 087386 and was signed by myself on April 12, 1982, and it shows itemized disbursements and shows a disbursement to Gene Enterprises, 4500 Spencer Highway, Pasadena, Texas, of \$2,000.00. Gene Enterprises is Mickey Gilley and this was the agreed price for the things printed on the ticket such as an appearance by Mickey Gilley and Johnny Lee and their Urban Cowboy Band. The people that should be complaining are the people that bought the tickets and a no show by Johnny Lee, the Urban Cowboy Band and the brief appearance of Mickey Gilley. Further, our disbursements on page four (4) of the same report shows that we paid R & E Catering \$1,399.00 for Bar-B-Q that our volunteers served. This was for meat preparation, etc. which was a turn-key job to R & E Catering. Further, to Gene Enterprises the \$2,000.00 was an agreed turn-key price.

In the complaint they alleged that Mr. Gilley's services were worth \$15,000.00 and our committee or no one else would pay Mr. Gilley this type of money and certainly we would not. That is a figure that Mr. Crow apparently arbitrarily and capriciously came up with.

There could have been a thousand people in attendance at Gilley's on that day. As we have stated it was open to the general public, alot of campaign volunteers and certainly alot of free tickets. The event was to raise money but also to draw a crowd.

As we refer back to the reporting period covering January 1st to March 31st, item 10 shows a \$20,000.00 loan that my father secured. The loan had been paid to \$10,000.00 by the end of the campaign but my father has paid out of his own pocket the note to the bank and the note is now reduced to approximately \$2,000.00. There have been no events for fund raising for my father since we have made our last report.

As you will see Item 16 shows the total receipts during this reporting period is \$66,705.00 of that \$20,000.00 was a loan which left the total contributions of \$46,705.00 which is reported on Item 6a, total contributions. You will further see in the report \$6,200.00 from political action committees which is reported. Further, you will see reported

from individuals itemized and identified the amount of \$20,500.00 which now leaves us with \$1,705.00 which are contributions under the amount that have to be identified and reported which had no connections with the Gilley fund raiser which now leaves us with the monies received from the Gilley's fund raiser which was \$18,300.00, tickets sold. These amount total \$46,705.00 in contributions during this reporting period. Further, when we add the \$20,000.00 bank loan our total receipt will then reflect \$66,705.00. I am sure that we would have liked to have made more money and especially money like the complainant has alleged. We are enclosing a copy of our records, marked Respondents Exhibit Two to reflect the \$18,300.00 that we received from tickets from the Gilley's Event and further we will mark as Respondent's Exhibit Three the \$1,705.00 of contributors which were unrelated and by law is reportable by the amounts in the total contribution column.

We feel that this is a frivolous political claim and at this time will not designate counsel but our willing to cooperate in this matter.

I would like to make some revelations today which I believe will have a profound effect on the runoff election for Mayor of Pasadena on May 4th.

I'm making these disclosures because the voters of this city have the right to know the true character of my opponent, John Ray Harrison.

I will be discussing with you today Attorney Harrison's violations of the law at every level: (1) Federal Election Laws; (2) State Election Laws; (3) The Criminal Code and (4) City Ordinances.

John Ray Harrison has consistently disregarded the law. He established a pattern in 1968 and it has continued through the years.

Official police records document a series of bizarre events in February 1968 involving Attorney John Ray Harrison including unlawful entry, loitering, and aggravated assault on a woman in South Houston and Pasadena. He was arrested and charged. I have an official police document, which is a matter of public record, to substantiate my statement.

Attorney Harrison's pattern of disrespect for the law continued. Federal Elections Commission's reports filed in Washington following his unsuccessful campaign for Congress show serious discrepancies regarding a major fund-raising event at Gilley's on Sunday, March 7, 1982. Though it was a \$100 per couple party, no contributions were reported. Conservatively, a thousand people attended the party which equates to \$50,000.

At this same event, the services of Mickey Gilley and his band were donated but not reported -- a contribution worth at least \$15,000. These "omissions" were clearly violations of the federal election laws, subject to fines and imprisonment. I have a copy of the federal campaign report to back up my charge. I also have a copy of the formal complaint that was filed with the Federal Elections Commission.

And, as the news media has reported within the last week, Attorney Harrison has violated Texas law by soliciting and accepting a campaign contribution for his current race 10 months before he filed the required papers declaring his campaign committee and treasurer.

To top off his obvious disrespect for law and order, within the last month:

Attorney Harrison has vowed to remove our Police Chief because the Chief arrested his son for the destruction of property.

Attorney Harrison has intimidated and interfered with Senior Citizens trying to vote absentee at City Hall.

Attorney Harrison has violated City ordinances by having one of his campaign signs posted on the porch of City Hall.

And, Attorney Harrison has permitted his married daughter to vote absentee in the April 6th Pasadena election even though she lives in Houston. She voted under her maiden name and used her father's address.

I can't imagine the citizens of Pasadena electing a candidate with a police record and a history of law violations.

Knowing the facts about the character of John Ray Harrison, I'm confident the voters of this community will exercise their good judgement and vote against returning John Ray Harrison to this city's highest elective office.

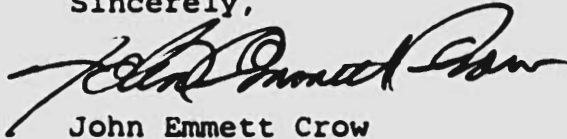
John Ray Harrison violated the Federal Elections Act because of his reporting DOES NOT show:

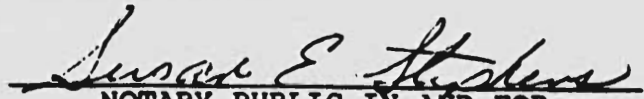

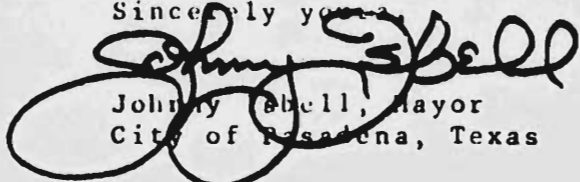

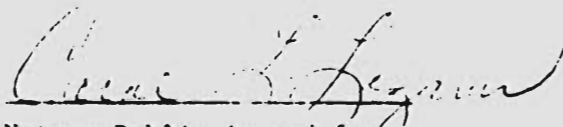

John Ray Harrison, a former state representative and youth counselor for the City of Pasadena and the Pasadena school system, posted \$400 bond Wednesday on a charge of aggravated assault.

Mrs. Peggy Graybill filed the complaint in Justice of the Peace Dave Thompson's court, charging that Harrison beat her about the face and body Tuesday at his law office.

Harrison, a Pasadena attorney who represented District 24 in the Legislature in 1965-66, said Wednesday the incident resulted from a misunderstanding about a personal matter.

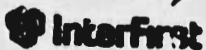

If John Ray has little regard for obeying the law himself, it's no wonder crime soared while he was Mayor.

During the Harrison years, 1973 to 1978, major crimes in Pasadena increased 37%.

By contrast, major crimes have dropped 16% since Johnny Isbell took office in 1981.

John Ray has announced his plans for the police department: fire the police chief, cut back on patrol cars and motorcycles and dissolve the helicopter division.

the police officer positions vacant and had no neighborhood crime watch program.
