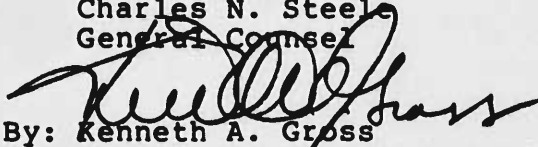
Dear Mr. Rosen:

CONCILIATION AGREEMENT

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This matter was initiated by the Federal Election Commission (hereinafter "the Commission"), pursuant to information ascertained in the normal course of carrying out its supervisory responsibilities. The Commission found reason to believe that the Hoffmann-LaRoche Good Government Committee and S. Chuck Rosen, as treasurer ("Respondents"), violated 2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(4)(A)(ii).

NOW, THEREFORE, the Commission and Respondents, having duly entered into conciliation pursuant to 2 U.S.C. § 437g(a)(4)(i) do hereby agree as follows:

I. The Commission has jurisdiction over the Respondents, and the subject matter of this proceeding.

II. Respondents have had a reasonable opportunity to demonstrate that no action should be taken in this matter.

III. Respondents enter voluntarily into this agreement with the Commission.

IV. The pertinent facts in this matter are as follows:

1. Respondent Hoffmann-LaRoche Good Government Committee is a political committee registered with the Federal Election Commission.

2. S. Chuck Rosen is the treasurer of the Hoffmann-LaRoche Good Government Committee.

3. Respondents were required to file a 1984 12 Day Pre-General Report of Receipts and Disbursements on October 25, 1984.

4. Respondents filed a report covering the period October 1, 1984-November 26, 1984, on January 8, 1985, 75 days late.

V. Pursuant to 2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(4)(A)(ii) all political committees other than authorized committees of a candidate are required to file a pre-election report, which shall be filed no later than the 12th day before an election in which the committee makes a contribution to or expenditure on behalf of a candidate in such election and which shall be complete as of the 20th day before such election.

VI. Respondents violated 2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(4)(A)(ii) by failing to file a 1984 12 Day Pre-General Report of Receipts and Disbursements in a timely manner. Respondent contends that the violation was neither knowing nor willful.

VII. Respondents will pay a civil penalty to the Treasurer of the United States in the amount of Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00) pursuant to 2 U.S.C. § 437g(a)(5)(A).

VIII. Respondents agree that it shall not undertake any activity which is in violation of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended, 2 U.S.C. § 431, et seq.

IX. The Commission, on request of anyone filing a complaint under 2 U.S.C. § 437g(a)(1) concerning the matters at issue herein or on its own motion, may review compliance with this

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agreement. If the Commission believes that this agreement or any requirement thereof has been violated, it may institute a civil action for relief in the United States District Court for the District of Columbia.

X. This agreement shall become effective as of the date that all parties hereto have executed the same and the Commission has approved the entire agreement.

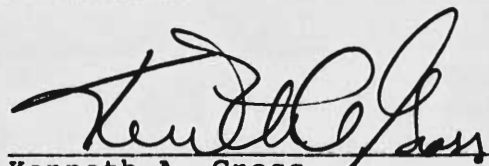
XI. Respondents shall have no more than thirty (30) days from the date this agreement becomes effective to comply with and implement the requirements contained in this agreement and to so notify the Commission.

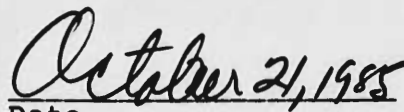

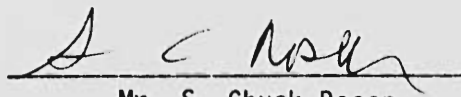

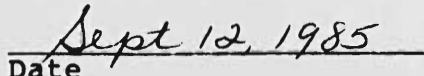

We have received your letter dated June 18, 1985 in which you have stated that the Federal Election Commission has determined that there is reason to believe that the Hoffmann-La Roche Good Government Committee violated U.S.C. Section 434 (a)(4)(A)(ii) by failing to file a 12 Day Pre-General Report of Receipts and Expenditures in a timely manner.

This is to advise you that the Committee inadvertently missed the filing date for the 12 day pre-election report. Upon notification to file the 30 day post-election report by way of a letter from the Commission dated December 28, 1984, the Committee promptly did so on January 8, 1985. Mr. Mike Tangney of the FEC advised Ms. Joyce Elgar of our office that since the post-election report reflected contributions made for the period October 1, 1984 through November 26, 1984, it would not be necessary to file retroactively the pre-election report, and that the filing of the post-election report would resolve the matter.

Also, the year end quarterly report covered the period November 27, 1984 through December 31, 1984. Effectively, all receipts and expenditures of the Committee for 1984 were reported by the Committee.

We recognize the importance of timely filings of all reports required to be filed under the Federal Election Campaign Act. We have always viewed this obligation very seriously, as evidenced by our attention and care in the past with regard to all FEC requirements.

We trust the information in this letter will serve to resolve this situation and that no further action will be necessary.

We wish to thank you for bringing this matter to our attention. The Committee wishes to assure the Commission that it will promptly respond in the future to all reporting requirements required by the Act.

Dear Mr. Rosen:

On June 7, 1985, the Federal Election Commission determined that there is reason to believe that the Hoffmann-LaRoche, Inc. Good Government Committee and you, as treasurer, violated 2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(4)(A)(ii), a provision of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended ("the Act"), by failing to file a 12 Day Pre-General Report of Receipts and Expenditures in a timely manner. The General Counsel's factual and legal analysis, which formed a basis for the Commission's finding, is attached for your information.

Under the Act, you have an opportunity to demonstrate that no action should be taken against you and the committee. Please submit any factual or legal materials which you believe are relevant to the Commission's consideration of this matter.

In the absence of any additional information which demonstrates that no further action should be taken against your committee and you, as treasurer, the Commission may find probable cause to believe that a violation has occurred and proceed with conciliation. Of course, this does not preclude the settlement of this matter through conciliation prior to a finding of probable cause to believe if so desired. See 11 C.F.R. § 111.18(d).

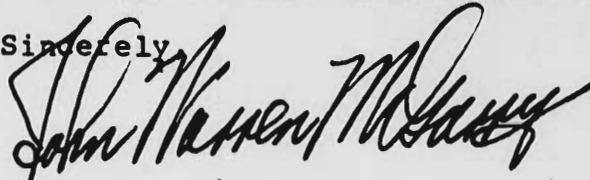

SUMMARY OF ALLEGATIONS

The Committee failed to file its 1984 12 Day Pre-Election Report which was due on October 25, 1984. Prior notice was sent to the Committee on October 1, 1984. The Committee, however, failed to file a 12 Day Report.

On December 28, 1984, a Non-Filer Notice was sent to the Committee for failing to file a 30 Day Post-General Election Report. The Committee filed the report on January 8, 1985, and listed coverage dates of October 1, 1984, through November 26, 1984.*/
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FACTUAL AND LEGAL ANALYSIS

Pursuant to 2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(4)(A)(ii), all political committees other than authorized committees of a candidate are required to file a pre-election report, which shall be filed no later than the 12th day before an election in which the committee makes a contribution to or expenditure on behalf of a candidate in such election and which shall be complete as of the 20th day before such election.

The Committee was required to file its 1984 12 Day Pre-General Report on October 25, 1984. The Committee filed a 30 Day

Post-General Election Report, which itemized financial activity through the period covered by the 12 Day Pre-General Report, on January 8, 1985, 75 days late. The Committee's failure to comply with the reporting requirement in a timely manner is a violation of 2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(4)(A)(ii). Thus, it is the recommendation of the Office of General Counsel that the Commission find reason to believe that the Committee violated 2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(4)(A)(ii).

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DESCRIPTION OF PRELIMINARY PROCEDURES
FOR PROCESSING POSSIBLE VIOLATIONS DISCOVERED BY THE
FEDERAL ELECTION COMMISSION

Possible violations discovered during the normal course of the Commission's supervisory responsibilities shall be referred to the Enforcement Division of the Office of General Counsel where they are assigned a MUR (Matter Under Review) number, and assigned to a staff member.

Following review of the information which generated the MUR, a recommendation on how to proceed on the matter, which shall include preliminary legal and factual analysis, and any information compiled from materials available to the Commission shall be submitted to the Commission. This initial report shall recommend either: (a) that the Commission find reason to believe that a possible violation of the Federal Election Campaign Act (FECA) may have occurred or is about to occur and that the Commission conduct an investigation of the matter; or (b) that the Commission find no reason to believe that a possible violation of the FECA has occurred and that the Commission close the file on the matter.

Thereafter, if the Commission decides by an affirmative vote of four (4) Commissioners that there is reason to believe that a violation of the Federal Election Campaign Act (FECA) has been committed or is about to be committed, the Office of the General Counsel shall open an investigation into the matter. Upon notification of the Commission's finding(s), within 15 days a respondent(s) may submit any factual or legal materials relevant to the allegations. During the investigation, the Commission shall have the power to subpoena documents, to subpoena individuals to appear for depositions, and to order answers to interrogatories. The respondent(s) may be contacted more than once by the Commission in its investigation.

SUBJECT: QUARTERLY FILERS (UNAUTHORIZED COMMITTEES) WHICH FAILED
TO SUBMIT TIMELY 1984 12 DAY PRE-GENERAL REPORTS

The attached list of unauthorized committees consists of twenty-three (23) quarterly filers, which failed to submit a 12 Day Pre-General Report by Election Day, November 6, 1984. According to the RAD Review and Referral Procedures for Unauthorized Committees (Standard 3), further examination is required by your office.

Unlike the mandatory reporting requirement placed upon monthly filers, 2 U.S.C. §434(a)(4)(A)(ii) requires quarterly filers to submit 12 Day Pre-General Reports only if the committees make contributions to or expenditures on behalf of Federal candidates involved in the general election.

The Party/Non-Party Branch conducted a thorough examination to identify quarterly filers disclosing contributions or expenditures between October 1 and October 17, 1984. The research revealed committees that submitted either:

- a) 12 Day Pre-General Reports in a untimely manner,
or
- b) 30 Day Post-General Reports indicating that 12 Day
Pre-General Reports should have been filed.

All unauthorized committees were sent prior notification concerning the pre- and post-general filing requirements on October 1, 1984. In addition, twelve (12) of the committees being referred were sent Non-Filer Notices on December 28, 1984 for failure to file the 30 Day Post-General Report covering October 1 through November 26, 1984.
