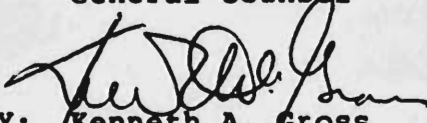

This matter was initiated by the Federal Election Commission (hereinafter "the Commission"), pursuant to information ascertained in the normal course of carrying out its supervisory responsibilities. The Commission found reason to believe that the Northern California Freeze Voter '84 committee and Frank W. Harris, as treasurer (hereinafter "Respondents"), violated 2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(4)(A)(ii).

NOW, THEREFORE, the Commission and Respondents, having participated in informal methods of conciliation prior to a finding of probable cause to believe do hereby agree as follows:

I. The Commission has jurisdiction over the Respondents, and the subject matter of this proceeding, and this agreement has the effect of an agreement entered pursuant to 2 U.S.C. § 437g(a)(4)(i).

II. Respondents have had a reasonable opportunity to demonstrate that no action should be taken in this matter.

III. Respondents enter voluntarily into this agreement with the Commission.

IV. The pertinent facts in this matter are as follows:

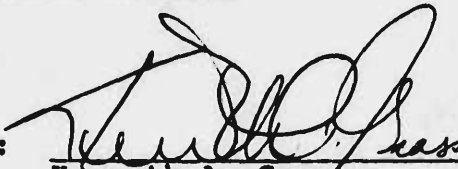

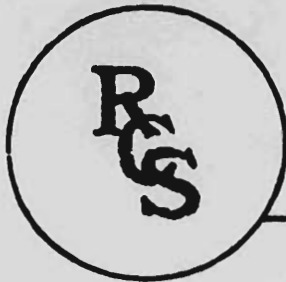

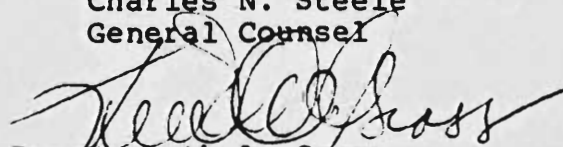

I. BACKGROUND

On July 29, 1985, the Commission found reason to believe that the Northern California Freeze Voter '84 committee violated 2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(4)(A)(ii) by failing to file in a timely manner its 1984 12 Day Pre General Election Report of Receipts and Disbursements late. By letter dated August 28, 1985, Mr. Harris requested that this matter be settled prior to a finding of probable cause to believe (Attachment I).

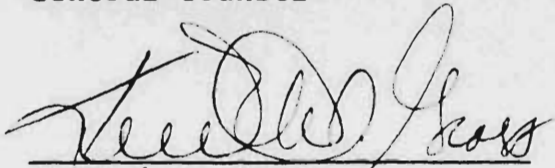

VI. Respondents will pay a civil penalty to the Treasurer of the United States in the amount of

pursuant to 2 U.S.C. § 437g(a)(5)(A).

VII. Respondents agree that they shall not undertake any activity which is in violation of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended, 2 U.S.C. § 431, et seq.

VIII. The Commission, on request of anyone filing a complaint under 2 U.S.C. § 437g(a)(1) concerning the matters at issue herein or on its own motion, may review compliance with this agreement. If the Commission believes that this agreement or any requirement thereof has been violated, it may institute a civil action for relief in the United States District Court for the District of Columbia.

IX. This agreement shall become effective as of the date that all parties hereto have executed the same and the Commission has approved the entire agreement.

X. Respondents shall have no more than thirty (30) days from the date this agreement becomes effective to comply with and implement the requirements contained in this agreement and to so notify the Commission.

XI. This Conciliation Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the Commission and the Respondents on the matters raised herein, and no other statement, promise, or agreement, any written or oral, made by any party or by agents of either party, that is not contained in this written agreement shall be valid.

The Northern California Freeze Voter '84 committee ("the Committee") was referred to the Office of General Counsel by the Reports Analysis Division for failing to file a 1984 12 Day Pre-General Report of Receipts and Disbursements by Election Day November 6, 1984.

SUMMARY OF ALLEGATIONS

The Committee was notified on October 1, 1984, that its 1984 12 Day Pre-General Report was due on October 25, 1984, if contributions and expenditures, which had not been previously reported, were made in connection with the the general election.

On November 15, 1984, the Committee filed its 12 Day Pre-General Report which covered the period October 1, through October 18, 1984. The report disclosed \$1,661 in contributions

to federal candidates and \$20,146.30 in independent expenditures.^{1/}

FACTUAL AND LEGAL ANALYSIS

Pursuant to 2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(4)(A)(ii), all political committees other than authorized committees of a candidate are required to file a pre-election report, which shall be filed no later than the 12th day before an election in which the committee makes a contribution to or expenditure on behalf of a candidate in such election and which shall be complete as of the 20th day before such election.

The Committee was required to file its 1984 12 Day Pre-General Report on October 25, 1984. The Committee filed its 12 Day Pre-General Report on November 15, 1984, 21 days late. Because the Committee failed to comply with the reporting requirements in a timely manner, it is the recommendation of the Office of General Counsel that the Commission find reason to believe that the Northern California Freeze Voter '84 committee and Brian J. McHugh, as treasurer, violated 2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(4)(A)(ii).

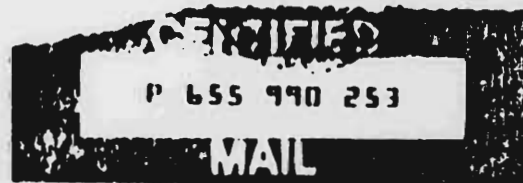

On , 198 , the Federal Election Commission determined that there is reason to believe that Northern California Freeze Voter '84 and you, as treasurer, violated 2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(4)(A)(ii), a provision of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended ("the Act"). The General Counsel's factual and legal analysis, which formed a basis for the Commission's finding, is attached for your information.

Under the Act, you have an opportunity to demonstrate that no action should be taken against you and the committee. You may submit any factual or legal materials which you believe are relevant to the Commission's consideration of this matter. Please submit any such materials, along with your answers to the enclosed questions, within fifteen days of your receipt of this letter.

In the absence of any additional information which demonstrates that no further action should be taken against your committee and you, as treasurer, the Commission may find probable cause to believe that a violation has occurred and proceed with conciliation.

If you are interested in pursuing pre-probable cause conciliation, you should so request in writing. See 11 C.F.R. § 111.18(d). Upon receipt of the request, the Office of General Counsel will make recommendations to the Commission either proposing an agreement in settlement of the matter or recommending declining that pre-probable cause conciliation be pursued. The Office of General Counsel may recommend that pre-probable cause conciliation not be entered into at this time so that it may complete its investigation of the matter. Further,

requests for pre-probable conciliation after briefs on probable cause have been mailed to the respondent will not be entertained.

Requests for extensions of time will not be routinely granted. Requests must be made in writing at least five days prior to the due date of the response and specific good cause must be demonstrated. In addition, the Office of General Counsel is not authorized to give extensions beyond 20 days.

If you intend to be represented by counsel in this matter, please advise the Commission by completing the enclosed form stating the name, address and telephone number of each counsel, and a statement authorizing such counsel to receive any notifications and other communications from the Commission.

The investigation now being conducted will be confidential in accordance with 2 U.S.C. §§ 437g(a)(4)(B) and 437g(a)(12)(A), unless you notify the Commission in writing that you wish the investigation to be made public.

SUMMARY OF ALLEGATIONS

The Committee was notified on October 1, 1984, that its 1984 12 Day Pre-General Report was due on October 25, 1984, if contributions and expenditures, which had not been previously reported, were made in connection with the the general election.

On November 15, 1984, the Committee filed its 12 Day Pre-General Report which covered the period October 1, through October 18, 1984. The report disclosed \$1,661 in contributions to federal candidates and \$20,146.30 in independent expenditures.^{1/}

FACTUAL AND LEGAL ANALYSIS

Pursuant to 2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(4)(A)(ii), all political committees other than authorized committees of a candidate are required to file a pre-election report, which shall be filed no later than the 12th day before an election in which the committee makes a contribution to or expenditure on behalf of a candidate in such election and which shall be complete as of the 20th day before such election.

^{1/} The Committee reported \$775,878 in receipts and \$769,064 in disbursements for the 1983-84 election cycle.

The Committee was required to file its 1984 12 Day Pre-General Report on October 25, 1984. The Committee filed its 12 Day Pre-General Report on November 15, 1984, 21 days late. Because the Committee failed to comply with the reporting requirements in a timely manner, it is the recommendation of the Office of General Counsel that the Commission find reason to believe that the Northern California Freeze Voter '84 committee and Brian J. McHugh, as treasurer, violated 2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(4)(A)(ii).
