Failure to File Reports in a Timely Manner

The Californians for a Strong America committee ("the Committee") failed to file three (3) reports in a timely manner during the 1985-1986 election cycle (see Chart and Attachments). The reports were filed between twenty-one (21) and sixty-seven (67) calendar days late.

The Committee was notified on March 21, 1986 that the 1986 April Quarterly Report was due on April 15, 1986 (Attachment 4). A Non-Filer Notice was sent to the Committee on May 7, 1986 (Attachment 6).

On May 30, 1986, the Reports Analysis Division ("RAD") analyst contacted Mr. Nick Sirokin, the Executive Director of the Committee, concerning the non-filing of the 1986 April Quarterly Report. Mr. Sirokin stated that he was going to mail the report that day (Attachment 7).

On June 6, 1986, the RAD analyst attempted to contact Mr. Sirokin, as the report had still not been filed. Mr. Sirokin's secretary stated that he was on vacation and would not be in the office until Monday, June 9, 1986 (Attachment 8). The RAD analyst contacted Mr. Sirokin on June 9, 1986 and inquired about the 1986 April Quarterly Report. Mr. Sirokin said that he had not sent it in and that he was still working on it. The RAD analyst advised Mr. Sirokin to file the report as soon as possible (Attachment 9).

On June 13, 1986, a Chronic Late Filing Notice was sent to the Committee for failure to file the 1985 Year End and the 1986 April Quarterly Reports in a timely manner (Attachment 10). The Notice advised the Committee that any additional late filing of reports may result in legal enforcement action.

The Commission received the Committee's 1986 April Quarterly Report on June 24, 1986. The report had been sent by registered mail on June 21, 1986 (Attachment 12).

Subsequent to the receipt of the Chronic Late Filing Notice, the Committee failed to file the 1986 July Quarterly Report in a timely manner. On August 11, 1986, the Commission received the Committee's 1986 July Quarterly Report which had been sent by certified mail on August 5, 1986 (Attachment 13).

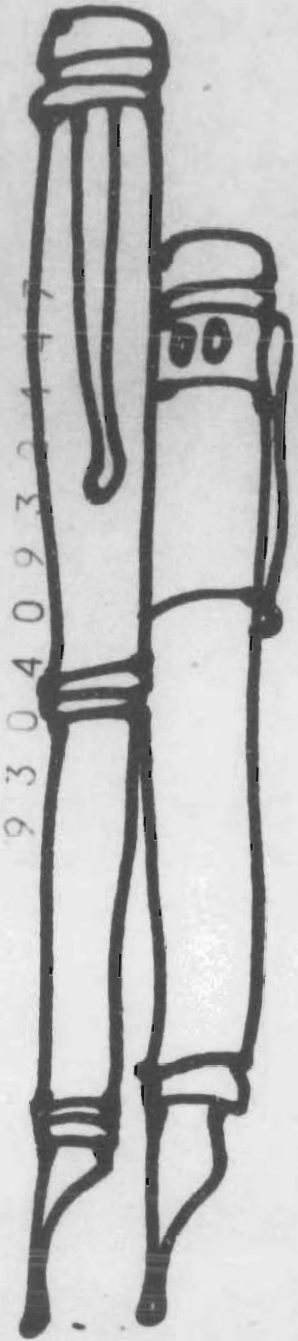

**1986 FILING REQUIREMENTS**

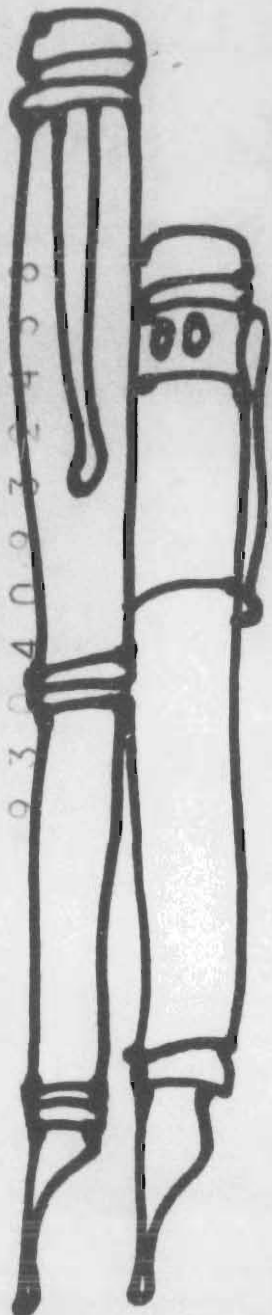

The Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended  
(hereinafter, "the Act") requires that political committees which  
elect to file quarterly reports shall file their reports no later  
than the fifteenth day after the last day of each calendar  
quarter. 2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(4)(A)(i). Thus, the Quarterly Report  
for the first quarter of 1986 was due on April 15, 1986. The  
Quarterly Report for second quarter of 1986 was due on July 15,  
1986.

The Act also provides that in a calendar year in which there

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is no general election, political committees shall file a report covering the period beginning July 1 and ending December 31, which shall be filed no later than January 31 of the following calendar year. Thus, the Year-End Report for 1985 was due on January 31, 1986.

Californians for a Strong America is a political committee registered with the Commission. RAD reported that the Committee filed three reports late as follows:

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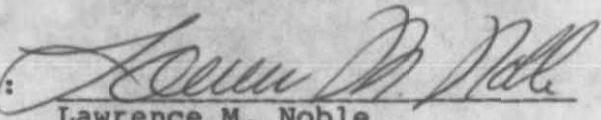

On October 9, 1986, the Federal Election Commission determined that there is reason to believe that Californians for a Strong America and you, as treasurer, violated 2 U.S.C. §§ 434(a)(4)(A)(i) and (iv), provisions of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended ("the Act"). The General Counsel's factual and legal analysis, which formed a basis for the Commission's finding, is attached for your information.

Under the Act, you have an opportunity to demonstrate that no action should be taken against you and the committee. You may submit any factual or legal materials which you believe are relevant to the Commission's consideration of this matter. Please submit any such materials within fifteen days of your receipt of this letter. Statements should be submitted under oath.

In the absence of any additional information which demonstrates that no further action should be taken against your committee and you, as treasurer, the Commission may find probable cause to believe that a violation has occurred and proceed with conciliation.

If you are interested in pursuing pre-probable cause conciliation, you should so request in writing. See 11 C.F.R. § 111.18(d). Upon receipt of the request, the Office of General Counsel will make recommendations to the Commission either proposing an agreement in settlement of the matter or recommending declining that pre-probable cause conciliation be pursued. The Office of General Counsel may recommend that pre-probable cause conciliation not be entered into at this time so that it may complete its investigation of the matter. Further, requests for pre-probable cause conciliation will not be entertained after briefs on probable cause have been mailed to the respondent.

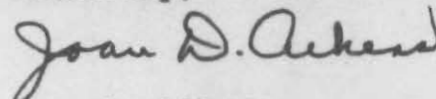

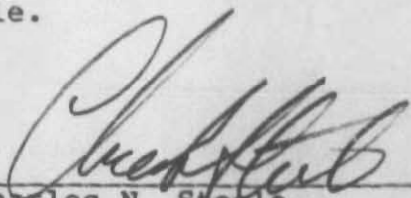

The Commission will not grant any extensions beyond 20 days. All requests for extensions of time must be submitted 5 days prior to the due date and must be in writing. Further, good cause must be shown.

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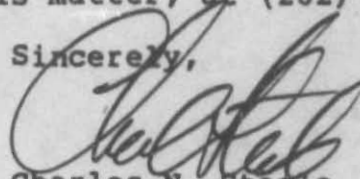

GENERAL COUNSEL'S BRIEF

I. STATEMENT OF THE CASE

This matter arose as a referral from the Reports Analysis Division (hereinafter, "RAD"). RAD indicated that the Californians for a Strong America committee, and Albert J. Cook, as treasurer (hereinafter, "Respondents") failed to file three reports in a timely manner.

On October 9, 1986, the Commission found reason to believe that Respondents violated 2 U.S.C. §§ 434(a)(4)(A)(i) and (iv). A letter notifying Respondents of the Commission's finding was mailed on October 14, 1986 by certified mail, return receipt requested. The certified mail receipt card was never returned. However, on December 2, 1986, during a telephone conversation with a representative of the General Counsel's Office, Respondents admitted that they had received the notification.

II. LEGAL ANALYSIS

The Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended (hereinafter, "the Act") provides that in calendar years in which a regularly scheduled general election is held, all political committees which elect to file quarterly reports (other than the

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authorized committees of a candidate) shall file quarterly reports which shall be filed no later than the 15th day after the last day of each calendar quarter. 2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(4)(A)(i). Thus, for calendar year 1986, quarterly reports were due on April 15, 1986 for the first quarter and July 15, 1986 for the second quarter.

Respondents failed to file their 1986 April Quarterly report in a timely manner. The report was due on April 15, 1986, but was not filed until June 21, 1986. Therefore, the report was 64 days late, and Respondents violated 2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(4)(A)(i).

Respondents also failed to file their 1986 July Quarterly Report in a timely manner. The report was due on July 15, 1986, but was not filed until August 5, 1986. Therefore, the report was 21 days late, and Respondents violated 2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(4)(A)(i).

The Act further provides that in a year in which no regularly scheduled federal election is held, all political committees (other than the authorized committees of a candidate) shall file a report covering the period beginning July 1 and ending December 31, which shall be filed no later than January 31 of the following calendar year. 2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(4)(A)(iv). Thus, the 1985 Year End Report was due on January 31, 1986.

Respondents failed to file their 1985 Year End Report in a timely manner. The report was due on January 31, 1986, but was

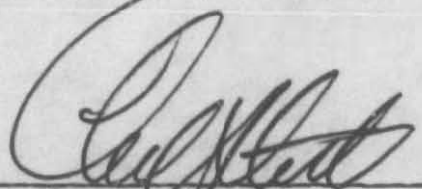
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not filed until March 25, 1986. Therefore, the report was 53 days late, and Respondents violated 2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(4)(A)(iv).

However, your request for pre-probable cause conciliation was not submitted in a timely manner. In prior conversations and correspondence, you were advised that such a request must be received by December 19, 1986. Because your request was not received on that date, this Office proceeded to file its brief in this matter. A copy of that brief was mailed to Albert Cook, the treasurer of your committee.

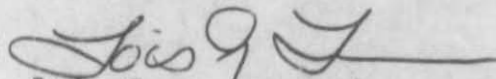
Under the circumstances, this Office will recommend that the Commission grant pre-probable cause conciliation. If granted, this procedure will provide thirty days for the negotiation of a mutually-acceptable conciliation agreement and civil penalty in settlement of this matter. However, please be advised that if a conciliation agreement is not reached within thirty days, this Office will recommend that the Commission find probable cause to believe that the alleged violations occurred. No additional time for reply to the General Counsel's Brief will be granted. GENERAL COUNSEL'S REPORT

I. BACKGROUND

On October 9, 1986, the Commission found reason to believe that the Californians for a Strong America committee, and Albert Cook, as treasurer (hereinafter, "Respondents" or "the Committee") violated 2 U.S.C. §§ 434(a)(4)(A)(i) and (iv) by failing to file three reports in a timely manner. Notification of this finding was sent by certified mail on October 14, 1986. The certified mail receipt was never returned, and no response was received from the Committee. On December 2, 1986, this Office contacted Nick Sorokin, the executive director of the Committee. Mr. Sorokin admitted that he had received the Commission's notification and that he had failed to respond to it. Pre-probable cause conciliation was discussed, and Mr. Sorokin stated that he would file a request promptly. No request was received.

On December 12, 1986, this Office again contacted Mr. Sorokin, who admitted that he had failed to submit a request. Mr. Sorokin agreed to a deadline of December 19, 1986, with the understanding that if no request were received by that date, this Office would proceed to the next stage of the enforcement process by filing the General Counsel's Brief. A confirming letter was sent to Mr. Sorokin on December 15, 1986. Attachment I.

The brief was mailed to respondents on December 30, 1986, and copies were circulated to the Commission on the same day.

This Office's usual practice is that requests for pre-probable cause conciliation will not be entertained after briefs on probable cause have been mailed to the respondent. Respondent was so advised in this matter. However, in view of the fact that Respondent's request and the brief in this matter crossed in the mail, this Office decided to recommend pre-probable cause conciliation under the circumstances.

On January 6, 1986, this Office contacted Mr. Sorokin by telephone and explained to him that this request had been received and that this Office would recommend that the Commission grant pre-probable cause conciliation. However, this Office also advised Mr. Sorokin that in the event that a conciliation agreement was not reached within the thirty day period, this Office would proceed to recommend that the Commission find probable cause to believe that the alleged violations had

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occurred based on the General Counsel's Brief, and that no additional time would be granted. This Office sent a confirming letter to Mr. Sorokin. Attachment III.

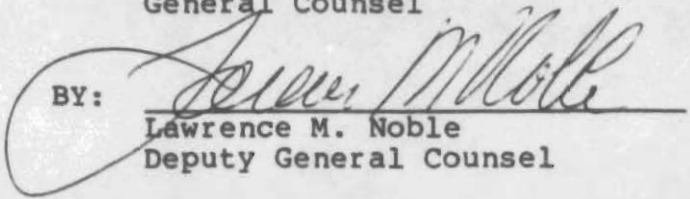

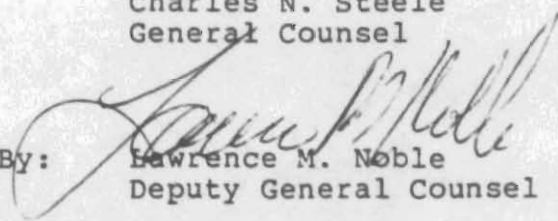

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**GENERAL COUNSEL'S REPORT**

**I. BACKGROUND**

This matter arose as a referral from the Reports Analysis Division ("RAD"). On October 7, 1986, the Commission found reason to believe that the Californians for a Strong America committee, and Albert J. Cook, as treasurer violated 2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(4)(A)(i) and (iv) by failing to file three reports in a timely manner. A letter notifying Respondents of the Commission's finding was mailed on October 14, 1986 by certified mail, return receipt requested.

The certified mail receipt card was never returned. On December 2, 1986, this Office contacted the Executive Director of the committee, Nick Sorokin. (Mr. Sorokin's name was suggested by RAD as the "responsible person" at the committee.) Mr. Sorokin admitted that he had received the notification letter. He also admitted that he had not responded to it, but stated that he intended to do so. Pre-probable cause conciliation was discussed, and Mr. Sorokin stated that he would file a request.

On December 12, 1986, this Office again contacted Mr. Sorokin, who admitted that he had failed to submit a request. Mr. Sorokin agreed to a deadline of December 19, 1986, with the understanding that if no request were received by that date, this

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Office would proceed to the next stage of the enforcement process by filing the General Counsel's Brief. A confirming letter was sent to Mr. Sorokin on December 15, 1986.

No request or other communication was received by the deadline of December 19, 1986, and therefore, this Office prepared its brief. On December 23, 1986, this Office received a request for pre-probable cause conciliation. Due to this Office's agreement with Mr. Sorokin that the request would be filed by December 19, and also due to staff absences for the holidays, this request was not considered in time to hold the mailing of the General Counsel's Brief. The brief was mailed to respondents on December 30, 1986, and copies were circulated to the Commission on the same day.

This Office's usual practice is that requests for pre-probable cause conciliation will not be entertained after briefs on probable cause have been mailed to the respondent. Respondent was so advised in this matter. However, in view of the fact that Respondent's request and the brief in this matter crossed in the mail, this Office decided to recommend pre-probable cause conciliation under the circumstances.

On January 6, 1986, this Office contacted Mr. Sorokin by telephone and explained to him that his request had been received and that this Office would recommend that the Commission grant pre-probable cause conciliation. However, this Office also advised Mr. Sorokin that in the event that a conciliation

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agreement was not reached within the thirty day period, this Office would proceed to recommend that the Commission find probable cause to believe that the alleged violations had occurred based on the General Counsel's Brief, and that no additional time would be granted. This Office sent a confirming letter to Mr. Sorokin on January 9, 1987.

On January 28, 1987, the Commission decided to enter into pre-probable cause conciliation with Respondents. On February 3, 1987, this Office mailed a proposed conciliation agreement approved by the Commission to Respondents by certified mail. However, the certified mail receipt card was not received.

On February 26, 1986, this Office contacted Mr. Sorokin by telephone. Mr. Sorokin acknowledged that he had received the proposed agreement on February 9, 1987. Mr. Sorokin was advised that the thirty day period for pre-probable cause conciliation began on February 9, the date of his receipt of the proposed agreement.

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In view of the facts that Respondent has previously been served with the General Counsel's Brief, has failed to respond to it, and that Respondent was specifically advised that no additional time for further proceedings would be granted if pre-probable cause conciliation were unsuccessful, this Office believes that this matter is ripe for a finding of probable cause by the Commission.

## **II. LEGAL ANALYSIS**

This Office set forth its analysis of this matter in the General Counsel's Brief, signed December 30, 1986. No additional information has been discovered to alter this analysis.

Respondent has submitted no reply to the General Counsel's Brief.

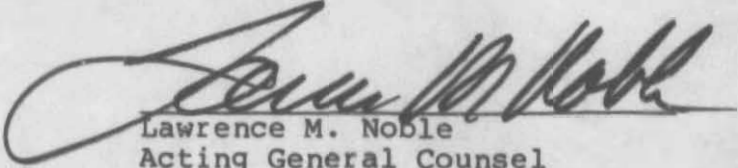

On April 22, 1987, the Federal Election Commission found that there is probable cause to believe that the Californians for a Strong America and Albert J. Cook, as treasurer, violated 2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(4)(A)(i) and (iv), provisions of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended, in connection with the failure to file required reports in a timely manner.

As you were advised by letter dated January 9, 1987, the Commission granted pre-probable cause conciliation for a period of thirty days notwithstanding the fact that you had previously been served with the General Counsel's Brief in this matter. Our records indicate that the thirty day conciliation period began on February 9, 1987, when you received the letter containing the proposed agreement, and expired on March 11, 1987. Allowing 3 days for mailing, as required by 11 C.F.R. § 111.21, your response was due no later than March 16, 1987, accounting for weekends. No response of any kind was received from you in that time, or at any time since. Therefore, the Commission considers that pre-probable cause conciliation negotiations with you were unsuccessful.

The Commission has a duty to attempt to correct such violations for a period of 30 to 90 days by informal methods of conference, conciliation, and persuasion, and by entering into a conciliation agreement with a respondent. If we are unable to reach an agreement during that period, the Commission may institute a civil suit in United States District Court and seek payment of a civil penalty.

Enclosed is a conciliation agreement that the Commission has approved in settlement of this matter. If you agree with the provisions of the enclosed agreement, please sign and return it, along with the civil penalty, to the Commission within 10 days.

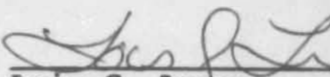

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GENERAL COUNSEL'S REPORT

I. BACKGROUND

On April 22, 1987, the Commission found probable cause to believe that the Californians for a Strong America and Albert J. Cook, as treasurer, violated 2 U.S.C. §§ 434(a)(4)(A)(i) and (iv). The Commission mailed the notification letter and proposed conciliation agreement to Respondents on April 28, 1987.

1/ Nick Sorokin is the Executive Director of the Committee. His name was suggested by RAD as the "responsible person" at the Committee.

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Mr. Sorkin's failure to submit any written counterproposal or to further communicate with this Office has resulted in a breakdown of post-probable cause conciliation negotiations.<sup>2/</sup>

In view of the above, and the fact that the ninety-day period for negotiating an agreement after probable cause to believe has passed, it is recommended that the Commission authorize this Office to file a civil suit.

<sup>2/</sup> It should be noted that Mr. Sorokin is following a pattern he established in pre-probable cause conciliation. On October 7, 1986, the Commission found reason to believe. Notice was sent to Respondents on October 14, 1986; however, there was no response. On December 2, 1986, this Office contacted Nick Sorokin to discuss pre-probable cause conciliation. Mr. Sorokin stated that he would file a request. No request was submitted; therefore, on December 12, 1986, Mr. Sorokin was contacted again and given a deadline of December 19, 1986, with the understanding that if no request for pre-probable cause conciliation or response to reason to believe were received by that date this Office would proceed with the next stage of enforcement. On December 23, 1986 the Respondents' request for pre-probable cause conciliation was received. On January 28, 1987, the Commission decided to enter into pre-probable cause conciliation with Respondents. On February 3, 1987 the proposed conciliation agreement was mailed to Respondents. On February 26, 1987, this Office contacted Mr. Sorokin who acknowledged he had received the conciliation agreement on February 9, 1987.

On April 22, 1987, the Commission found probable cause. Negotiations for probable cause conciliation have been identical to that for pre-probable cause conciliation.

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**II. RECOMMENDATIONS**

1. Authorize the Office of the General Counsel to file a civil suit for relief in the United States District Court against the Californians for a Strong America and Albert J. Cook, as treasurer.
2. Approve the attached letter.

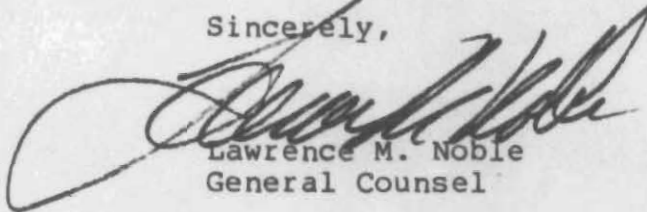
Dear Mr. Sorokin:

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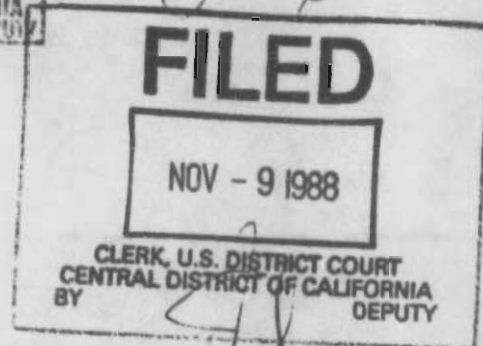
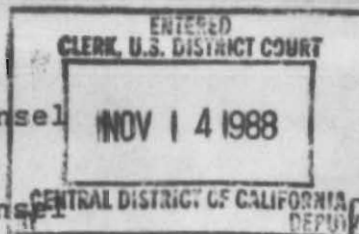

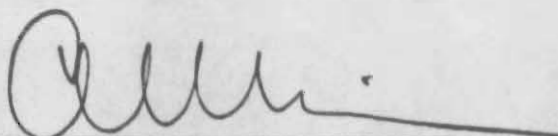
