III. BACKGROUND:

Failure to File the 1986 October Quarterly and 12 Day Pre-General Reports by Election Day

The National Pro-Life Political Action Committee ("the Committee") failed to file the 1986 October Quarterly and 12 Day Pre-General Reports of Receipts and Disbursements by Election Day, November 4, 1986. The Committee was notified on September 19, 1986 that the October Quarterly Report was due on October 15, 1986 (Attachment 2). On September 29, 1986 the Committee was notified that a 12 Day Pre-General Report was due on October 23, 1986 if contributions and expenditures, made in connection with the general election, had not been previously reported (Attachment 3).

On November 4, 1986, a Non-Filer Notice was sent to the Committee for failure to file the 1986 October Quarterly Report (Attachment 4).

The Committee filed the 12 Day Pre-General Report on November 5, 1986. A cover letter which accompanied the report, as well as the Summary Page, indicated that this filing was an amendment to the original report (Attachment 5). The 1986 12 Day Pre-General Report disclosed a total of \$431.75 in independent expenditures on October 3rd and 14th indicating the report should have been filed by October 23, 1986.

On November 7, 1986, the Committee filed its 1986 October Quarterly Report which included a letter explaining

that the report was "...as best as I can determine, mailed on the due date of October 15." The letter further stated that the Committee's 12 Day Pre-General Report was "...also sent in one day late" and was subsequently amended (Attachment 6).

The Committee did not submit any evidence indicating that either the October Quarterly or 12 Day Pre-General Reports had been filed earlier than November 7 and 5, 1986, respectively.

On December 18, 1986, an amended October Quarterly Report was received. In a cover letter submitted with the Report, the treasurer stated that "the original Report we filed was mailed on or about October 15th,..." (Attachment 7). No evidence was submitted to indicate that the Report had been timely filed.

WHO MUST FILE

ALL Party Committees, Nonconnected Committees and Separate Segregated Funds, except those that file monthly (see below), must file a quarterly report by October 15, 1986.

WHAT MUST BE REPORTED

The report must disclose all financial activity that occurred from the close of books for the last report filed through September 30, 1986. Political committees that have not previously filed a financial disclosure report should report all financial activity through September 30, 1986.* For more detailed instructions, consult your campaign guide.

WHEN TO FILE

Reports sent by registered or certified mail must be postmarked no later than midnight October 15, 1986. Reports hand delivered or mailed first class must be received no later than close of business October 15, 1986.

WHERE AND HOW TO FILE

Committees should consult the instructions on the enclosed FEC Form 3X for details.

MONTHLY FILERS

Committees that file on a monthly schedule must file their next report by October 20, 1986, and disclose all financial activity from September 1 through September 30, 1986. (See Monthly Filers on the reverse side.)

COMPLIANCE

Political committees are fully liable for failure to file any report required under the Act. Failure to file in a timely fashion is also a serious violation. Offending committees are subject to enforcement action. Committees must also submit legible reports which can be clearly reproduced. Illegible reports and reports submitted on non-FEC forms will not be accepted, and committees filing such documents will be required to refile.

*The first report filed by a committee shall include all amounts received or disbursed prior to becoming a political committee, even if such amounts were not received or disbursed during the current reporting period. See 11 CFR 104.3(a) and (b).

REMINDERS**QUARTERLY FILINGS**

Committees that make contributions or expenditures (including independent expenditures) in connection with an election, and coordinated party expenditures in connection with a general election, must file a pre-election report if this activity has not been previously disclosed. See the January 1986 issue of the Federal Election Commission Record for primary and general election filing requirements.

MONTHLY FILINGS

Committees that are filing monthly must file a pre-general election report due on October 23, a post-general election report due on December 24, and a year-end report due January 31, 1987, instead of monthly reports on November 20, December 20 and January 20, 1987. See the schedule below.

WHAT MUST BE REPORTED

Quarterly filers must disclose all financial activity from the close of books of the last report, or from the date of registration* (whichever is later), through October 15, 1986. (Monthly filers must disclose all financial activity from October 1 or from the date of registration* (whichever is later), through October 15, 1986.) For more detailed instructions, consult your campaign guide.

WHEN TO FILE

Pre-general election reports sent registered or certified mail must be postmarked no later than midnight October 20, 1986. Reports hand delivered or mailed first class must be received no later than close of business October 23, 1986.

WHO MUST FILE THE POST-GENERAL ELECTION REPORT

ALL COMMITTEES must file the post-general election report due December 4, 1986, regardless of election activity.

WHAT MUST BE REPORTED

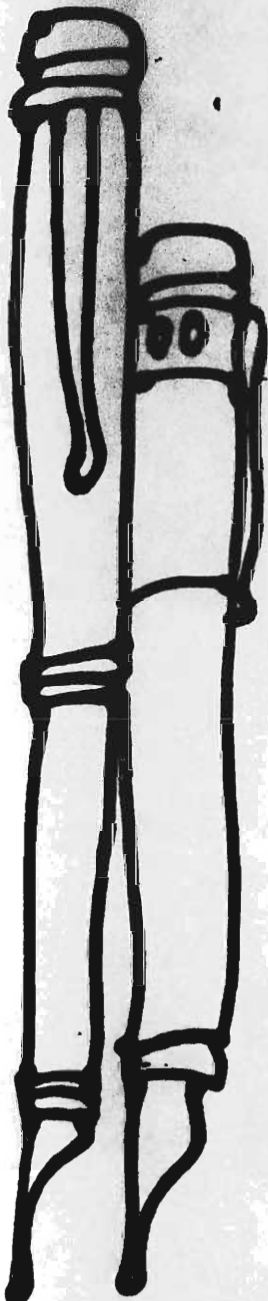
The report must disclose all financial activity from the close of books of the last report, or the date of registration* (whichever is later), through November 24, 1986.

WHEN TO FILE

Post-general election reports sent by registered or certified mail must be postmarked no later than midnight December 4, 1986. Reports hand delivered or mailed first class must be received no later than close of business December 4, 1986.

*The first report filed by a committee shall include all amounts received or disbursed prior to becoming a political committee, even if such amounts were not received or disbursed during the current reporting period. See 11 CFR 104.3(a) and (b).

The General Counsel's factual and legal analysis, which formed a basis for the Commission's finding, is attached for your information.

Under the Act, you have an opportunity to demonstrate that no action should be taken against you and the committee. You may submit any factual or legal materials which you believe are relevant to the Commission's consideration of this matter. Please submit any such materials within fifteen days of your receipt of this letter. Statements should be submitted under oath.

In the absence of any additional information which demonstrates that no further action should be taken against your committee and you, as treasurer, the Commission may find probable cause to believe that a violation has occurred and proceed with conciliation.

If you are interested in pursuing pre-probable cause conciliation, you should so request in writing. See 11 C.F.R. § 111.18(d). Upon receipt of the request, the Office of General Counsel will make recommendations to the Commission either proposing an agreement in settlement of the matter or recommending declining that pre-probable cause conciliation be

pursued. The Office of General Counsel may recommend that pre-probable cause conciliation not be entered into at this time so that it may complete its investigation of the matter. Further, requests for pre-probable cause conciliation will not be entertained after briefs on probable cause have been mailed to the respondent.

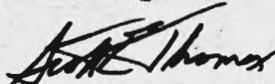

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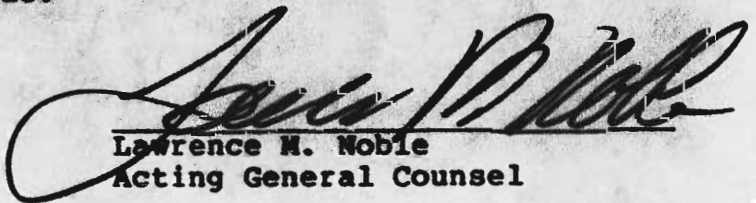

After considering all the evidence available to the Commission, the Office of the General Counsel is prepared to recommend that the Commission find probable cause to believe that a violation has occurred.

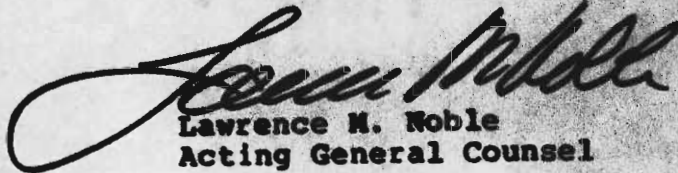

(Three copies of such brief should also be forwarded to the Office of the General Counsel, if possible.) The General Counsel's brief and any brief which you may submit will be considered by the Commission before proceeding to a vote of whether there is probable cause to believe a violation has occurred.

If you are unable to file a responsive brief within 15 days, you may submit a written request to the Commission for an extension of time in which to file a brief. The Commission will not grant any extensions beyond 20 days. All requests for extension of time must be submitted in writing five days prior to the due date. Further, good cause must be shown.

A finding of probable cause to believe requires that the Office of the General Counsel attempt for a period of not less than 30, but not more than 90 days, to settle this matter through a conciliation agreement.

unauthorized committees are also required to file a pre-election report no later than the 12th day before (or posted by registered or certified mail no later than the 15th day before) any election in which the committee makes a contribution or expenditure on behalf of a candidate in such election. This report must be complete as of the 20th day before the election. 2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(4)(A)(ii).

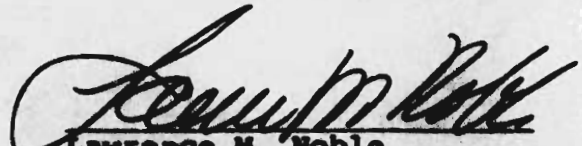
In the instant case the Committee failed to meet the Act's reporting requirements. The Committee was notified on September 19, 1986, that its October Quarterly Report was due on October 15, 1986. Nevertheless, the Committee did not file this report until November 7, 1986. Similarly, the Committee was notified on September 29, 1986, that it must file a pre-general election report if it had made contributions or expenditures in connection with the general election, if such activity had not been previously reported. The Committee filed this report that included independent expenditures made in connection with the general election on November 5, 1986. The Pre-General Report was required to be filed on October 23, 1986.

III. GENERAL COUNSEL'S RECOMMENDATIONS

1. Find probable cause to believe that the National Pro-Life Political Action Committee and Laura J. Halbmaier, as treasurer, violated 2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(4)(A)(i) and (ii).

CONCILIATION AGREEMENT

This matter was initiated by the Federal Election Commission ("the Commission"), pursuant to information ascertained in the normal course of carrying out its supervisory responsibilities. The Commission found probable cause to believe that the National Pro-Life Political Action Committee and Laura J. Halbmaier, as treasurer ("Respondents") violated 2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(4)(a)(i) and (ii).

NOW, THEREFORE, the Commission and the Respondents, having duly entered into conciliation pursuant to 2 U.S.C. § 437g(a)(4)(A)(i), do hereby agree as follows:

I. The Commission has jurisdiction over the Respondents, and the subject matter of this proceeding.

II. Respondents have had a reasonable opportunity to demonstrate that no action should be taken in this matter.

III. Respondents enter voluntarily into this agreement with the Commission.

IV. The pertinent facts in this matter are as follows:

1. Respondent, the National Pro-Life Political Action Committee, is a political committee within the meaning of 2 U.S.C. § 431(4).

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2. Respondent, Laura J. Halbmaier, is the treasurer of the National Pro-Life Political Action Committee.

3. Pursuant to 2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(4)(A)(i), Respondents were required to file a 1986 October Quarterly Report no later than October 15, 1986. Respondents did not file this report until November 7, 1986.

4. Pursuant to 2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(4)(A)(ii), Respondents were required to file a 1986 Pre-General Election Report no later than October 23, 1986. Respondents did not file this report until November 5, 1986.

V. Respondents failed to file their 1986 October Quarterly and Pre-General Election Reports in a timely manner in violation of 2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(4)(a)(i) and (ii).

VI. Respondents will pay a civil penalty to the Federal Election Commission in the amount of One Thousand ~~Two~~ Hundred (Two) dollars (\$ 1,200), pursuant to 2 U.S.C.

§ 437g(a)(5)(A).

VII. The Commission, on request of anyone filing a complaint under 2 U.S.C. § 437g(a)(1) concerning the matters at issue herein or on its own motion, may review compliance with this agreement. If the Commission believes that this agreement or any requirement thereof has been violated, it may institute a civil action for relief in the United States District Court for the District of Columbia.

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VIII. This agreement shall become effective as of the date that all parties hereto have executed same and the Commission has approved the entire agreement.

IX. Respondents shall have until no later than December 1, 1987 (with monthly payments of \$300 commencing on Sept. 1, 1987) to comply with and implement the requirements contained in this agreement and to so notify the Commission.

X. This Conciliation Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the parties on the matters raised herein, and no other statement, promise, or agreement, either written or oral, made by either party or by agents of either party, that is not contained in this written agreement shall be enforceable.

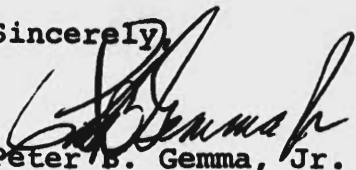
