# NATIONAL REPUBLICAN CONGRESSIONAL COMMITTEE

Dear Mr. Noble:

This Complaint, by the National Republican Congressional Committee ("Complainant"), 320 First Street, S.E., Washington, D.C. 20003, against George Sangmeister and the Sangmeister for Congress Committee (FEC ID # C00124036), 2455 Glenwood Avenue, Joliet, Illinois 60435, is filed with Exhibits with the Federal Election Commission ("FEC") pursuant to 2 U.S.C section 437g(a) of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended ("the Act").

U.S. House of Representatives from Illinois' Fourth Congressional District, and the Sangmeister for Congress Committee (FEC ID # C00124036), Sangmeister's principal campaign committee ("the Sangmeister Committee"), have violated the Act by knowingly and willfully failing to register an authorized committee with the FEC; by failing to report the receipts and expenditures of the authorized committee; and by accepting illegal corporate contributions into the authorized committee.

### I. FACTS

In 1985, Sangmeister filed an Illinois State Board of Elections Form D-1, Statement of Purpose, establishing a campaign committee to support his candidacy for Lt. Governor of the State of Illinois. As a candidate for Lt. Governor, Sangmeister accepted contributions, including corporate contributions, into his campaign committee. (See, attached copy of Illinois State Board of Elections Form D-2 listing receipts and expenditures for Sangmeister's campaign for the period from 7/1/85 to 6/30/86; the report that established his surplus). In March of 1986, Sangmeister was defeated in the Democratic Primary for Lt. Governor.

On November 16, 1987, Sangmeister filed his Statement of Candidacy and Statement of Organization with the FEC. By perfecting such filings, Sangmeister became a federal candidate.

On July 27, 1988, Sangmeister filed his Illinois State

Board of Elections Form D-2 for the period from 7/1/87 to 6/30/88.

(A copy of the report is attached). A review of the Report reveals that expenditures were made from his state campaign committee at a time substantially after Sangmeister's state candidacy ended and at a time Sangmeister was a federal candidate.

However, in filing with the FEC Sangmeister failed to register his state campaign committee as an authorized committee.

Sangmeister has also failed to report the receipts and expenditures of his state campaign committee. Finally, Sangmeister has accepted illegal corporate contributions through his state campaign committee, and used such illegal money to support his federal candidacy. The above cited activity represents three separate violations of the Act.

### II. DISCUSSION

### A. FAILURE TO REGISTER AN AUTHORIZED COMMITTEE

The Act provides that a candidate may designate additional political committees to serve as authorized committees of such candidate. Such authorization shall be in writing and filed with the principal campaign committee of the candidate; which in turn shall file such information with the FEC. (2 U.S.C. sections 432(e)(1) and 422(f)).

As indicated above, funds from Sangmeister's state campaign committee were used to support his federal candidacy. As such, it is by definition an authorized committee of the Sangmeister Committee. (2 U.S.C. section 431(6)). Therefore, Sangmeister and the Sangmeister Committee were required to register the state campaign committee as an authorized committee. Such failure to register represents a violation of the Act.

### B. FAILURE TO REPORT RECEIPTS AND EXPENDITURES OF AN AUTHORIZED COMMITTEE

Each treasurer of a political committee shall file reports of receipts and disbursements with the FEC. (2 U.S.C. section 434(a)(1)). Additionally, each principal campaign committee shall consolidate in each report, those reports required to be filed with it. That is, such consolidated reports shall include: (1) Reports submitted to it by any authorized committees and (2) the principal campaign committee's own report. Such consolidated report shall be made on FEC Form 3-Z and shall be submitted with the reports of the principal campaign committee and with the reports, or applicable portions thereof, of the committees shown on the consolidated report. (11 C.F.R. section 104.3(f)).

As stated above, Sangmeister became a candidate on November 16, 1987 when he filed his Statement of Candidacy and Statement of Organization with the FEC. On January 29, 1988, the Sangmeister Committee filed their first report covering activity from November 14, 1987 to December 31, 1987. However, such Report tailed to list the contributions received or the expenditures made by Sangmeister's state campaign committee in support of his federal candidacy. Such failure represents a violation of the Act.

C. ACCEPTANCE OF ILLEGAL CORPORATE CONTRIBUTIONS

-5-Corporate contributions are specifically prohibited by the Act. It is unlawful for any national bank, or any corporation organized by authority of any law of Congress, to make a contribution or expenditure in connection with any election to any political office . . . . (2 U.S.C. section 441b(a)). The prohibition applies whether the contribution is in the form of money, goods, or services. The prohibition applies whether the contribution is a direct contribution or an inkind contribution. As discussed above, Sangmeister's state campaign committee received a number of contributions from corporations. Also as discussed above, the state campaign committee was used by Sangmeister to support his federal candidacy. As such, the state .7 campaign committee, an authorized committee of the Sangmeister Committee, has accepted illegal corporate contributions in violation of the Act. C III. CONCLUSION C By knowingly and willfully failing to register an authorized committee with the FEC; by failing to report the receipts and expenditures of the authorized committee; and by accepting illegal corporate contributions into the authorized committee, George Sangmeister and the Sangmeister for Congress Committee have violated the Act.

### IV. PRAYER FOR RELIEF

Complainant requests that the FEC investigate these violations and enforce the Federal Election Campaign Act and the Commission's regulations.

Complainant further requests that the FEC seek the maximum fines for each violation as set forth in 2 U.S.C. section 437g, and take all steps necessary, including civil and injunctive action, to prevent respondents from continuing their illegal activity.

### V. VERIFICATION

The undersigned swears that the allegations and facts set forth in this complaint are true to the best of his knowledge, information and belief.



Sangmeister and his principal campaign committee, Sangmeister for Congress, knowingly and willfully violated the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended ("the Act") by failing to register an authorized committee with the Commission, failing to report the receipts and expenditures of this authorized committee and by accepting illegal corporate contributions through this authorized but unregistered committee. Sangmeister is a candidate for the U.S. House of Representatives from the State of Illinois for the 1988 general election. Specifically, complainant contends that the state committee for Sangmeister's unsuccessful 1986 race for Lieutenant Governor, George E. Sangmeister¹ ("the state committee"), has been making expenditures in connection with Sangmeister's current campaign for Congress.

The candidate's name is the same as the name of the state political mittee. He is also the treasurer of the state political committee.

of candidacy with the Commission and there were no salary payments to Weinberger in any of Sangmeister for Congress reports. The only payment made by Sangmeister for Congress to Weinberger was for \$46.08 in office supplies on December 12, 1987. With the exception of a \$50 contribution to a federal committee, Friends of Lane Evans Committee, on November 4, 1987, the remainder of the payments by the state committee went to local organizations and the Internal Revenue Service.

A response from George Sangmeister and Sangmeister for Congress is necessary to make a determination regarding a possible violation of 2 U.S.C. § 432(f). It is also possible that even if the state committee was not an authorized committee, the Committee may have had an obligation to report the receipt of an in-kind contribution pursuant to 2 U.S.C. § 434(b) if the payment of Weinberger's travel expenses was campaign related. The complainant's allegations that the state committee's treasury contained corporate funds also raises the potential for a 2 U.S.C. § 441b violation if the aforementioned payment was campaign-related. Therefore, because it is not immediately clear whether Sangmeister for Congress received any contributions from the state committee, the Respondents must be given the opportunity to respond before the Office of General Counsel can make recommendations regarding this matter.

Obviously if the complainant has specific knowledge regarding any expenditures made by Mr. Sangmeister to support his Federal Candidacy such allegations should be specifically made and specifically made under oath as required by the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971.



#### I. GENERATION OF MATTER

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On October 12, 1988, the National Republican Congressional Committee filed a complaint alleging violations of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended ("the Act") by George E. Sangmeister and his federal and state committees. Respondents were notified of the complaint on October 14, 1988, and an Expedited General Counsel's Report was circulated on the same date. Sangmeister for Congress submitted a response to the complaint on November 7, 1988.

# II. FACTUAL AND LEGAL ANALYSIS

#### A. FACTUAL BACKGROUND

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Complainant contends that George E. Sangmeister¹ and his principal campaign committee, Sangmeister for Congress, knowingly and willfully violated the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended ("the Act") by failing to register an authorized committee with the Commission, failing to report the receipts and expenditures of this authorized committee and by accepting illegal corporate contributions through this authorized but unregistered committee. Specifically, complainant contends that the state committee for Sangmeister's unsuccessful 1986 race for Lieutenant Governor, George E. Sangmeister² ("the state committee"), has been making expenditures in connection with Sangmeister's 1988 congressional campaign.

The treasurer of Sangmeister for Congress, James Harvey, submitted a signed and sworn statement in response to the complaint stating that he has no knowledge regarding any funds from the state committee which were used to support Sangmeister's federal candidacy. He further challenges the complainant to specifically identify any expenditures which he believes were made to assist Sangmeister's campaign for Congress.

A review of the state committee's annual report covering the

period July 1, 1987 through June 30, 1988, reveals only one

possible campaign-related expenditure - \$293 for Peter
Weinberger's travel expenses. With the exception of a \$50
contribution to a federal committee, Friends of Lane Evans
Committee<sup>3</sup>, on November 4, 1987, the remainder of the payments by
the state committee went to the Internal Revenue Service, local
organizations or state candidate committees for tickets. It is
not known at this point whether Weinberger even worked for
Sangmeister for Congress or whether his travel was
campaign-related. There were no salary payments to Weinberger in
any of the Sangmeister for Congress reports. Moreover, this
payment for travel expenses was made on November 2, 1987, two
weeks before Sangmeister filed a statement of candidacy with the
Commission.

#### B. LEGAL ANALYSIS

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C.

Pursuant to 2 U.S.C. § 432(e), a candidate for Federal office must designate a political committee to serve as his or her principal campaign committee. The candidate may also designate additional political committees to serve as authorized committees. Such designation must be in writing and filed with the principal campaign committee, although there is no obligation on the candidate to authorize other committees. The Act requires that all authorized committees report their receipts

and disbursements to the candidate's principal campaign committee, which, in turn, must file such reports, statements and designations with the Commission. 2 U.S.C. § 432(f).

A committee will not become an authorized committee merely by crossing a monetary threshold; rather, the test is whether it is specifically designated as such. An committee may, however, become a political committee and incur obligations to register and report where it receives contributions or makes expenditures in excess of \$1,000 during a calendar year. See 2 U.S.C.

\$\$ 431(4), 433 and 434. The Act requires every political committee to file reports with the Commission of its receipts and disbursements pursuant to 2 U.S.C. \$ 434(a) and to identify all receipts from political committees pursuant to 2 U.S.C.

\$\$ 434(b)(3)(B).

The essence of the complaint is that Sangmeister's state committee has become an authorized committee by making expenditures to assist Sangmeister's campaign for Congress and that Sangmeister was, therefore, obligated to designate this committee as an authorized committee. However, the complainant has presented no evidence that the state committee was making expenditures in connection with Sangmeister's campaign for a congressional seat. Rather, it merely asserts that since the state committee made expenditures well after Sangmeister's state

candidacy ended, at a time when he was a federal candidate, these expenditures must have been made in connection with Sangmeister's federal candidacy.

As stated above, a review of the state committee's records only indicates one \$293 payment which may have been related to Sangmeister's candidacy for Congress. Even assuming that this payment was for travel expenses related to Sangmeister's federal candidacy, the making of such an expenditure would not, by itself, make the state committee an authorized committee of Sangmeister for Congress.

If the state committee did in fact make an in-kind contribution to Sangmeister for Congress, the Committee would have had an obligation to report it pursuant to 2 U.S.C. § 434(b)(3)(B). However, the complainant has not presented sufficient evidence to support such a finding. Although it is possible that the payment of Weinberger's travel expenses was related to Sangmeister's congressional campaign, the complainant has made no specific allegation to that effect and the Committee has submitted a categorical denial. Therefore, this Office recommends that the Commission find no reason to believe that Sangmeister for Congress and James B. Harvey, as treasurer, violated any statute within the Commission's jurisdiction in connection with this complaint. This Office also recommends that the Commission find no reason to believe that George Sangmeister (state committee) and George Sangmeister, as treasurer, violated any statute within the Commission's jurisdiction with respect to this complaint.

-6-As there is no obligation on the part of a candidate to designate any particular committee as an authorized committee beyond the designation of a principal campaign committee and there is no specific evidence that the state committee was making expenditures in connection with Sangmeister's federal candidacy, this Office also recommends that the Commission find no reason to believe that George E. Sangmeister violated any statute within the Commission's jurisdiction in connection with this complaint. III. RECOMMENDATIONS 1. Find no reason to believe that Sangmeister for Congress and James B. Harvey, as treasurer, violated any provision of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended, on the basis of the complaint filed in MUR 2721. 2. Find no reason to believe that George Sangmeister (state committee) and George Sangmeister, as treasurer, violated any provision of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended, on the basis of the complaint filed in MUR 2721. 3.
