Re: Jude for Congress Committee

Dear Mr. Noble:

This letter constitutes a complaint against Tad Jude; the Jude for Congress Committee (the "Committee"); Robert F. Mannella, as treasurer; the Commissioner Tad Jude Campaign Fund ("the Fund")¹; and Diane Patnode, as treasurer, regarding several apparent violations of the Federal Election Campaign Act, as amended 2 U.S.C. §§ 431 *et seq.* ("FECA"). Tad Jude's reports filed with the Federal Election Commission ("FEC") raise numerous questions about his "pre-congressional campaign committee" activities and the use of funds that may be illegal under the FECA.

1. Failure to Report "Pre-congressional" Campaign Activity. On June 9, 1992, Tad Jude filed as a candidate for United States Congress from the Sixth District of Minnesota. See Exhibit A. But according to articles covering the Sixth District election, he may have launched his campaign in early May. See Exhibit B. FEC Regulations require an individual to file a Statement of Candidacy within fifteen days of becoming a candidate, 11 C.F.R. § 101.1(a), and a Statement of Organization no more than ten days later. 11 C.F.R. § 102.1(a). Tad Jude appears to have failed to meet this statutory deadline.

Even if Tad Jude was simply conducting exploratory activities in May and June, he was required to use federally permissible funds and report these activities. His Committee's FEC report does not reflect any of these early campaign activities, even though the FECA requires that all disbursements for this purpose be disclosed. See Exhibit C.

¹The Fund is Tad Jude's campaign committee organized under Minnesota law for purposes of his election as Hennepin County Commissioner.

Along with the Committee's first FEC report, the Treasurer submitted a statement that all "pre-congressional campaign activity consisted of discussions with advisors and constituents" and did not involve the expenditure of any monies other than those "used in the normal course of business as a County Commissioner." See Exhibit C. Such a statement raises questions of whether Tad Jude conducted campaign activity with monies from the Fund prior to registering and reporting with the FEC? Or, more importantly for the citizens of Hennepin County, was Tad Jude using his office and official funds as County Commissioner to conduct his Congressional campaign? And, what precisely were these "pre-campaign" activities? Did they trigger registration and reporting requirements under the FECA? Tad Jude should be required to answer these questions.

2. Use of Illegal Funds From His State Committee. In support of his candidacy, the Fund made numerous in-kind contributions, disclosed on the Committee's Schedule A, July 15 Quarterly Report. In addition, the Fund transferred \$15,000 to the Committee. While the Fund filed a report disclosing the transfer and in-kind contributions to the Committee, it failed to appropriately disclose the underlying receipts. See Exhibit D. Therefore, it is impossible to determine whether the Fund had federally permissible monies to make the contributions and transfers, or whether Tad Jude is using illegal funds raised for his state election in order to run for federal office.

FEC regulations require that a nonfederal committee transferring funds to a federal committee must report not only the lump sum transfer, but also the itemized receipts that make up the transfer identified on a last in-first out basis. 11 C.F.R. §§ 104.3(a)(4) and 110.3(c)(6)(iii). To date, the Fund has not filed such a report. The only record of receipts provided was the annual state report of the Fund previously filed in Minnesota covering a period through December 31, 1991. The transfer of funds, however, took place six months later, in June. Does this mean that Mr. Jude raised no money into his state committee between January and June, 1992? There is no indication that these were the most recent receipts to the Fund. For example, did Mr. Jude raise funds at his May 9 spaghetti dinner. See Exhibit E.

Moreover, only \$8,925 in cash contributions were disclosed on this report. The remaining receipts were in-kind

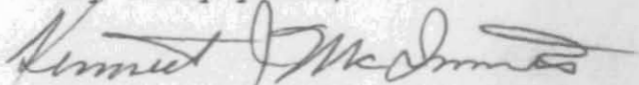

contributions. The total transferred or contributed to the Committee was \$17,000.

On the basis of this report, there is no way to confirm what monies were transferred and whether they are permissible under federal law. According to the state report, for example, the Fund received many contributions from political committees that may not be registered with the FEC. Mr. Jude also received funds from labor unions. Were these treasury funds, impermissible under federal law? It is not possible, based on the information provided, to determine whether the committees had federally permissible funds at the time they made those contributions or whether contributors to the Fund have exceeded their contribution limits to the Committee.

Tad Jude should be required to answer these questions on the public record. We respectfully request that the Commission investigate these issues and take whatever enforcement action is appropriate.

JUDE ANNOUNCES EXPLORATORY COMMITTEE FOR CONGRESS

Tad Jude, Maple Grove, announced today the creation of an Exploratory Committee for 6th District Congress. Jude, who is a Hennepin County Commissioner, stated that he is strongly considering running for Congress in the 6th Congressional District which includes all of Anoka, as well as Northern and Western Hennepin, and Washington Counties, and parts of Wright and Sherburne Counties.

Jude, who has served in both the Minnesota House and Senate and now represents the Western Hennepin County Commissioner district, stated that he is considering a challenge against 10-year incumbent Congressman Gerry Sikorski "because I believe there is currently a crisis of confidence in Congress and the House of Representatives. Too many members have demonstrated an arrogance that threatens the very foundations of representative democracy."

Jude stated that "in recent weeks and months, many DFL'ers, as well as concerned citizens of all political persuasions throughout the district have called and visited with me and encouraged me to run. The exploratory committee will further allow me to assess whether we can raise the necessary campaign funds, develop a broad-based organization, and be able to win both the primary and general election. We have been encouraged by people in the district expressing support for my candidacy, but I also recognize the fact that the current incumbent will have at least \$1 million to spend and that even bad incumbents faced with scandal can be difficult to defeat."

Jude continued, "However, should I decide to run, I am convinced that campaign money from the special interests and PAC's will not decide who wins this election. I am also convinced that opportunist incumbent congressmen who suddenly switched their positions on fundamental issues, who lack the courage of their convictions, and who put politics above and before principle will also not win re-election to the Congress. Indeed, this will be the year when the people -- not excessive use and abuse of the taxpayer financed Congressional mailing privilege -- will decide this election and a new direction for the Congress and the country."

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Jude emphasized his focus on local government. He said, "We who have worked in local and state governments have had to balance our budgets, no matter how difficult, yet Congress has not demonstrated fiscal responsibility and has burdened our children and future generations with today's debt. We balanced local governments budget not only because we wanted to, but because we had to. We must bring a common-sense perspective to Washington and a new Congress."

Jude concluded that he is convinced that Congress and too many of its members has lost touch with the citizens of this state and country. "The \$4 trillion national debt; the continuous deficits caused by unchecked Congressional spending, slight of hand unrecorded votes for pay raises, the generous perks and special privileges Congress provides for itself, the House banking scandal, and the Savings and Loan deregulation disaster, are all symptoms of the decay and stagnation taking place in Washington," Jude indicated. "We have got to change these disastrous policies of privilege and elitism Congress has created for itself and get to work to get this nation moving forward. Quite frankly, the system is broke and we need to fix it."

Jude ponders DFL challenge to Sikorski

County Board members Erhart, Langfeld on his exploratory committee

Jude is exploring a possible DFL primary challenge to 6th District Congressman Gerry Sikorski in the September primary election.

Jude, a Minneapolis County Commissioner, has formed an exploratory committee to consider a bid for the 6th District Congressional seat.

Jude, a former DFL state legislator from Maple Grove in both the Senate and House, filed in a press release this week that he is strongly considering running for Congress in the 6th District, which includes all of Anoka County, northern and western Hennepin and Washington counties and parts of Wright and Ramsey counties.

Members of the exploratory committee include Anoka County Commissioners Dan Erhart and Margaret Langfeld. Erhart is the County Board chairman and Langfeld is former president of the Minnesota Association of Counties.

Erhart said this week that the committee will meet for the first time this week to discuss Jude's

make an announcement within the week on whether he will challenge Sikorski in the primary.

Erhart said he became part of the committee because he is "looking to protect the seat with someone who will represent the needs of Anoka County."

"I am not anti-Sikorski," said Erhart. "He has done some good things and he was very helpful with the TV 610 project."

But Erhart believes Sikorski is vulnerable because of the check bouncing scandal at the House bank in Washington. Sikorski was listed as one of the major offenders and admitted to writing 600 bad checks at the House bank.

Sikorski still received the DFL endorsement for the Congressional seat at the May 9 6th District caucus. He won by one vote in the first ballot, beating off a challenge from State Rep. Alice Johnson, DFL-Spring Lake Park.

Rep. Gross, former KSTP-TV newscaster, is the independent Republican-endorsed candidate for the 6th District seat.

But Erhart said Gross, too, now has to deal with unfavorable publicity with revelations this week in a Minneapolis Star/Tribune story of business problems that Gross has been having, including debts and court fees and lawsuits that involve the home-building and real estate development company he owns.

Erhart is also bothered by Sikorski's switch from pro-life to pro-choice in the ongoing abortion debate. "I am tolerant of Mr. Sikorski's votes on some of these issues, but his open and aggressive courting of pro-choice delegates for the endorsement troubles me," he said.

Erhart said many of his supporters, particularly those with pro-life views, have been encouraging him more than a little to work on behalf of Jude, a man that Erhart said he has known and admired a long time as "a hard working, responsible, caring and capable individual."

Langfeld said Jude would be an excellent candidate and congressman. "We are looking at whether or not Congressman Sikorski's base of support has eroded to the point where he can't be elected," she said.

His Republicans, we are exploring the possibility of whether another DFLer can win if Sikorski can't win."

Langfeld said her decision to work with Jude was primarily a matter of credibility because Sikorski "had changed his tune about things."

In Langfeld's view, that is a sign of weakness, especially his switch from the pro-life to pro-choice position on the abortion issue. "People need to know where their elected officials stand," she said.

In his press release, Jude said there is currently a crisis of confidence in Congress and the House of Representatives. "Too many members have demonstrated an arrogance that threatens the very foundations of representative democracy," he said.

"In recent weeks and months, many DFLers, as well as concerned citizens of all political persuasions throughout the district have called and visited with me and expressed their interest in my running."

Jude said the exploratory committee will allow him to assess whether he can make the necessary campaign

paid funds, develop a broad-based organization and be able to win both the primary and general elections.

"We have been encouraged by people in the district expressing support for my candidacy, but I also recognize the fact that the current incumbent will have at least \$1 million to spend and that even had incumbents faced with scandal can be difficult to defeat," said Jude.

Jude said that should he decide to run, he is convinced that campaign money from the special interests and political action committees will not decide who wins this election.

"I am also convinced that opportunistic incumbent congressmen who suddenly switch their positions on fundamental issues, who lack the courage of their convictions, and who put politics above and before principle will also not be re-elected to the Congress," said Jude.

Dear Mr. McInnis:

This is to acknowledge receipt on August 10, 1992, of your letter dated July 31, 1992. The Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended ("the Act") and Commission Regulations require that the contents of a complaint meet certain specific requirements. One of these requirements is that a complaint be sworn to and signed in the presence of a notary public and notarized. Your letter was not properly sworn to.

In order to file a legally sufficient complaint, you must swear before a notary that the contents of your complaint are true to the best of your knowledge and the notary must represent as part of the jurat that such swearing occurred. The preferred form is "Subscribed and sworn to before me on this ____ day of ____, 19__." A statement by the notary that the complaint was sworn to and subscribed before her also will be sufficient. We are sorry for the inconvenience that these requirements may cause you, but we are not statutorily empowered to proceed with the handling of a compliance action unless all the statutory requirements are fulfilled. See 2 U.S.C. § 437g.

Enclosed is a Commission brochure entitled "Filing a Complaint." I hope this material will be helpful to you should you wish to file a legally sufficient complaint with the Commission. The file regarding this correspondence will remain confidential for a 15 day time period during which you may file an amended complaint as specified above. If the defects are not cured and the allegations are not refiled, no additional notification will be provided and the file will be closed.

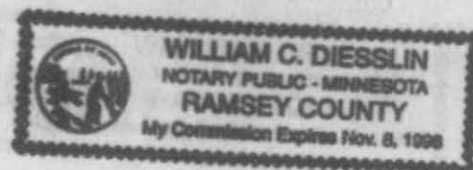

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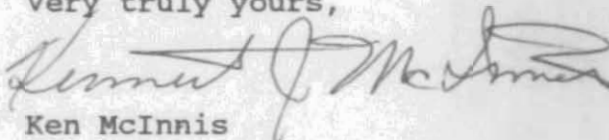

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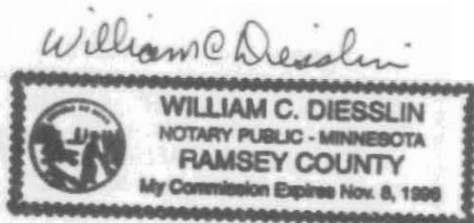

Dear Mr. Noble:

This letter provides additional information related to my complaint dated July 31, 1992, against Tad Jude; the Jude for Congress Committee (the "Committee") and Robert F. Mannella, as Treasurer; the Commissioner Tad Jude Campaign Fund (the "Fund") and Diane Patnode, as Treasurer. My original complaint requested that the Federal Election Commission investigate apparent violations of the Federal Election Campaign Act based on the use and transfer of resources from the Fund to the Committee.

Now it appears that Tad Jude is also using resources from his state senate committee, the State Senator Tad Jude Volunteer Committee (the "State Senate Committee") to promote his candidacy for Congress. His campaign has placed hundreds of "JUDE" yard signs through the Sixth Congressional district. The disclaimer on these signs reads: "Prepared and paid for by State Rep. Tad Jude for State Senate Volunteer Committee". The use of an improper disclaimer on these signs causes confusion among the general public and violates 2 U.S.C. § 441d(a). The Act requires that a committee use the full and official name of the committee as registered with the Commission on all materials which expressly advocate the election or defeat of a candidate.

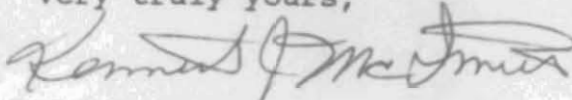
Moreover, it is impossible to determine whether the State Senate Committee organized under Minnesota law, has federally permissible funds to make such in-kind contributions to Tad Jude's Congressional campaign. The State Senate Committee has never registered with the Commission or reported its contributions under 11 C.F.R. §§ 104.3(a)(4) and 110.3(c)(6); See also Advisory Opinion 1980-14, 1 Fed. Election Camp. Guide (CCH) ¶ 5473.

We therefore request that the Commission investigate whether Tad Jude is using yet another state committee to illegally finance his Congressional campaign. This

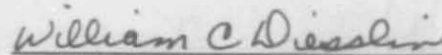

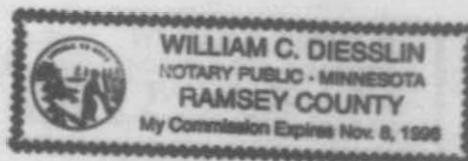

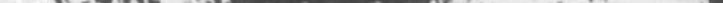

Jude stated that "in recent weeks and months, many DFL'ers, as well as concerned citizens of all political persuasions throughout the district have called and visited with me and encouraged me to run. The exploratory committee will further allow me to assess whether we can raise the necessary campaign funds, develop a broad-based organization, and be able to win both the primary and general election. We have been encouraged by people in the district expressing support for my candidacy, but I also recognize the fact that the current incumbent will have at least \$1 million to spend and that even bad incumbents faced with scandal can be difficult to defeat."

Jude continued, "However, should I decide to run, I am convinced that campaign money from the special interests and PAC's will not decide who wins this election. I am also convinced that opportunist incumbent congressmen who suddenly switched their positions on fundamental issues, who lack the courage of their convictions, and who put politics above and before principle will also not win re-election to the Congress. Indeed, this will be the year when the people -- not excessive use and abuse of the taxpayer financed Congressional mailing privilege -- will decide this election and a new direction for the Congress and the country."

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Jude emphasized his focus on local government. He said, "We who have worked in local and state governments have had to balance our budgets, no matter how difficult, yet Congress has not demonstrated fiscal responsibility and has burdened our children and future generations with today's debt. We balanced local governments budget not only because we wanted to, but because we had to. We must bring a common-sense perspective to Washington and a new Congress."

Jude concluded that he is convinced that Congress and too many of its members has lost touch with the citizens of this state and country. Jude ponders DFL challenge to Sikorski

County Board members Erhart, Langfeld on his exploratory committee

Jude is exploring a possible primary challenge to 6th District Congressman Gerry Sikorski in the September primary election.

Jude, a Hennepin County Commissioner, has formed an exploratory committee to consider a bid for the 6th District Congressional seat.

Jude, a former DFL state legislator from Maple Grove in both the Senate and House, said in a press release, "I think that he is strongly considering running for Congress in the 6th District, which includes all of Anoka County, northern and western Hennepin and Washington counties and parts of Wright and Sherburne counties."

Members of the exploratory committee include Anoka County Commissioners Dan Erhart and Margaret Langfeld. Erhart is the board chairman and Jude is former president of the Minnesota Association of Counties.

Erhart said this week that the committee is working to see if Jude would be expected to

make an announcement within the week on whether he will challenge Sikorski in the primary.

Erhart said he became part of the committee because he is "looking to protect the seat with someone who will represent the needs of Anoka County."

"I am not anti-Sikorski," said Erhart. "He has done some good things and he was very helpful with the TTH 618 project."

But Erhart believes Sikorski is vulnerable because of the check bouncing scandal at the House bank in Washington. Sikorski was listed as one of the major offenders and admitted to writing 687 bad checks at the House bank.

Sikorski still received the DFL endorsement for the Congressional seat at the May 9 6th District convention. He won by one vote on the first ballot, beating off a challenge from State Rep. Alice Johnson, DFL-Spring Lake Park.

Rod Grams, former KNSP-TV newscaster is the Independent-Republican-endorsed candidate for the 6th District seat.

But Erhart said Grams, too, now has to deal with unfavorable publicity with revelations this week in a Minneapolis StarTribune story of business problems that Grams has been having, including debts and court liens and lawsuits that involve the home-building and real estate development company he owns.

Erhart is also bothered by Sikorski's switch from pro-life to pro-choice in the ongoing abortion debate. "I am tolerant of Mr. Sikorski's votes on some of these issues, but his open and aggressive courting of pro-choice delegates for the endorsement troubles me," he said.

Erhart said many of his supporters, particularly those with pro-life views, have been encouraging him, more than a little, to work on behalf of Jude, a man that Erhart said he has known and admired a long time as "a hard working, responsible, caring and capable individual."

Langfeld said Jude would be an excellent candidate and congressman. "We are looking at whether or not Congressman Sikorski's base of support has eroded to the point where he can't be elected," she said.

Erhart said the committee will allow him to assess whether

the Republicans, we are exploring the possibility of whether another DFLer can win if Sikorski can't win."

Langfeld said her decision to work with Jude was primarily a matter of credibility because Sikorski "had challenged his time about things."

In Langfeld's view, that is a sign of weakness, especially his switch from the pro-life to pro-choice position on the abortion issue. "People need to know where their elected officials stand," she said.

In his press release, Jude said there is currently a crisis of confidence in Congress and the fitness of Representatives. "Too many members have demonstrated an arrogance that threatens the very foundations of representative democracy," he said.

"In recent weeks and months, many DFLers, as well as concerned citizens of all political persuasions throughout the district have called and visited with me and encouraged me to run."

Jude said the exploratory committee will allow him to assess whether

Sikorski may face
Jude in primary

Look for Hennepin County Commissioner Ted Jude to announce next month that he will challenge U.S. Rep. Gerry Sikorski in the 6th District DFL primary Sept. 15. Jude, a former state senator from Maple Grove, says he will announce his intentions the first week in June, but political allies say he has already decided to jump in.

Jude is convinced Sikorski can't be re-elected after he wrote 697 bad checks on the defunct House bank. Jude, who is staunchly anti-abortion, also hopes to benefit from discontent over Sikorski's recent switch to become an abortion rights supporter.

Jude's commission district covers about one-third of the 6th District, which arcs across the northern suburbs from Afton on the east to Orono on the west.

Urban League not invited

When nearly 60 government, business and minority leaders gathered at the residence of Gov. Arne Carlson last week to discuss increasing minority employment, a major player, the Urban League, was not there. Its representatives weren't invited.

The governor's press secretary, Cyndy Brucato, called the omission "a whoops," meaning it was inadvertent. The governor's office apologized to the league and asked it to participate in follow-up sessions. The league has agreed.

"We're big enough to overlook this obvious mistake," said Gary Sudduth, interim president of the Minneapolis Urban League.

Goswitz asks about seat

Some St. Paul city officials were amazed that Roger Goswitz, who was ousted from the City Council by Karl Neid in Novem-

ber, was at City Hall talking about procedures for filling the seat just hours after Neid's death.

Neid died in his sleep early May 8. Goswitz said he had appointments at City Hall that morning

and, while he was there, he discussed with city officials the process of appointing a new council member for the 6th Ward. He visited council offices, the mayor's office and the city attorney's office.

Goswitz, who has applied for several city positions since his defeat, said he is unsure whether he will run for the seat in November.

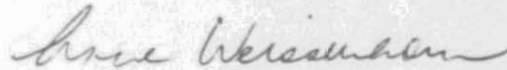

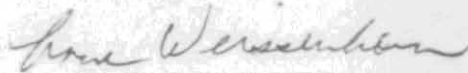

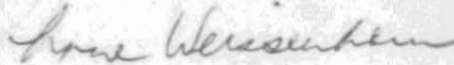

This letter is in response to your correspondence, dated September 18, 1992, which we received September 24, 1992, regarding a Complaint filed by Ken McInnis against the Jude for Congress and Commissioner Tad Jude Campaign Fund political committees. This response is being offered jointly by Robert Mannella as Treasurer for the Jude for Congress Committee and Diane Patnode as Treasurer for the Commissioner Tad Jude Campaign Fund.

The Complaint against these two committees alleges pre-congressional activity by Mr. Jude and a claim that Mr. Jude illegally used campaign funds from his Commissioner's political committee for his Congressional campaign.

First, the Complaint alleges that Tad Jude became a candidate for Congress in the Sixth Congressional District in Minnesota in May of 1992. This assertion is based on media reports that Mr. Jude had set up a "exploratory committee" to assess whether or not he should enter the race. The second allegation is that once this exploratory committee was formed Mr. Jude expended campaign funds without properly filing with the Federal Election Commission (hereafter referred to as FEC) and for using illegal funds from his Commissioner's campaign committee.

In response to the first allegation, the exploratory committee that was formed by Mr. Jude in May of 1992 was simply a collection of associates of the candidate. The goal of the individuals on this committee was to discuss the idea of Mr. Jude's candidacy among their own social circles and among their individual

constituencies in order to get a feel for whether a campaign for Congress by Mr. Jude might be successful. This exploratory committee raised no money nor did they expend any money. They only engaged in general conversations with people that they knew in an effort to determine what type of popular support might be available for Mr. Jude. As soon as a decision was made by Mr. Jude to run in the Sixth Congressional Primary and contributions were received, the Jude for Congress Committee was formed and the appropriate documents were filed with the FEC and with the Minnesota Secretary of State.

Regarding the Complaint's second allegation that funds from the Commissioner Tad Jude Campaign Fund were illegally used by Mr. Jude's Congressional Campaign Committee, in the quarterly report of July 15, 1992, it was disclosed to the FEC that there had been a \$15,000 transfer of funds from the Commissioner Tad Jude Campaign Fund to the Jude for Congress Committee. In addition, that report stated the amounts of in-kind contributions from the Commissioner's Fund to the Jude for Congress Campaign Committee.

It was not until shortly before the July 15th filing deadline that we realized a separate itemization was required for the transferred funds over \$1,000. In order to meet that deadline it was decided that we should file the state report containing all itemizations of monies received by the Commissioner Tad Jude Campaign Fund. Our goal in doing this was to provide the FEC with all the information that we had regarding monies raised and expended and to be as open and compliant as possible. The time limitation precluded us from filing a Schedule A with these itemizations as we simply ran out of time.

As for the FEC's request, we are currently itemizing those previous contributions to the Commissioner Tad Jude Campaign Fund on Schedule A. The Complaint mentions a six-month gap in funds received by the Commissioner Tad Jude Campaign Fund from December 1991 to June 1992. What may seem unusual is that if the monies were raised by Mr. Jude during this period we were not made aware of them.

The two committees that are the subject matter of Mr. McInnis's Complaint have released or disclosed all of the financial information made available to them regarding both receipts and disbursements. In our desire to conform with the FEC's deadline we may have provided the information in a less than desirable format; but, nonetheless, the committees have been completely honest in providing information concerning our financial activities.

The Complaint by Mr. McInnis appears to be more closely related to an attempt to harass a rival campaign committee than any honest

effort or intention to uphold the spirit of the election contribution reporting laws. We intend to give our full cooperation to the FEC and will file the Amended Schedule A as quickly as possible.

In the meantime, both committees deny any wrongdoing or violation of the FEC's reporting laws. They request that the Complaint of Mr. McInnis be found to be without merit.
