Dear Mr. McKay:

Referring to your letter of August, 1975, and the hearing of September 9, 1975, I am submitting this letter as an answer of record.

On February 25, 1975, the last day of filing for the primary, John G. Fary was selected by the members of the 5th District Regular Democratic Organization. Since the primary was set for April 17, 1975, several members immediately set in motion a campaign committee, which in turn, ordered printed material. Shortly after, the Board of Elections cancelled the primary and we cancelled the printed material.

The committee was officially organized on the 11th day of March 1975, and at that time its main purpose was to organize a fund raising campaign. We tried to incorporate many sincere and faithful friends and groups into ours, but each felt they would help out on an individual basis. Some material was reordered from the original order with a date change. By the time the court ordered a new primary date set at the date originally scheduled for the special election and the special election was then set for July 8, 1975.

At the time of the court deliberations, I took firm control over the campaign as one could with so many splinter groups. All the newspaper advertising was handled by me and all was according to the rules.

During the hearing in Washington, I presented the printed material that the civic committee issued and as noted the corrections were made to abide by the rules.

Our only fund raiser was a testimonial banquet and the invitations and collection procedures were promoted according to the rules. I presented the special insert card at the hearing that was mailed with all invitations. All corporate checks were returned immediately and the senders were informed again of the rules.

There were many block organizations that formed rallies. I was never notified as to the formation, but only by letter of invitation to have the candidate present for a rally. I must say this has become a common practice in many wards. Whatever printed material was ordered by these groups, I cannot take responsibility for its composition. Although I did admonish several over-zealous campaigners.

As the campaign was coming into its last two weeks, the Ward Committeemen insisted that they needed more material for the precinct workers. They put in orders to the printer and afterwards it was agreed that we pay for the orders, since they are used as an aid to induce the voters to come out.

I believe that I explained verbally how my authority as campaign manager was effective, but limited, and the rules that a candidate must adhere too as a member of a well organized Democratic Party in Cook County.

We ran a low key campaign just extolling the virtues of our candidate, and at no time did we ever mention our opponent. State Representative Fary was serving in the state legislature, whose sessions at that time were on a 12 hour - 6 day schedule. The session adjourned July 2, 1975 and Mr. Fary had 6 days left to campaign.

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Though there is nothing unusual about special elections, this election's outcome was difficult to predict as to the amount of votes.

Both the primary and special elections were scheduled at holiday weekends. You can imagine each of the 13 Ward Committeemen somewhat concerned with absentees and voter apathy and very little publicity by the news media. This was the chief reason for the last minute printing demands.

I have managed all of the late Congressman Kluczynski's campaigns and have never violated ethical rules. None of the discrepancies you noted had any effect and were honestly beyond my control. I can only make this promise that those infractions will not occur again, because the civic committee has solidified and responsibility will be with the manager only.

If I failed to clarify some things, please feel free to write and I will comply with your requests.

On September 9, 1975, at 1:00 PM, Mr. Edward Pinzak, Administrative Assistant to Congressman Fary, met with AID relative to leaflets allegedly distributed in behalf of Congressman Fary's campaign for election to the United States Congress from the Fifth Congressional District of Illinois in violation of 18 U.S.C. Section 612.

Mr. Pinzak denied that Exhibits #1 and #2 were published or distributed by the Civic Committee for John Fary. He stated that the Democratic Party in Chicago published and distributed same without the control of the Civic Committee for John Fary. However, he did acknowledge that Exhibit #3 was original campaign literature published and distributed (approximately 1,000 pieces) on behalf of Congressman Fary by the Civic Committee for John Fary prior to being aware of 18 U.S.C. Section 612 violations. He contends that the failure to print the appropriate information on the literature was an oversight and not a willful violation of the law. Mr. Pinzak stated that procedures were initiated prior to the July 8, 1975 Special Election to ensure compliance with the Federal Election Campaign Laws and that subsequent publication of the campaign literature contained the appropriate data. Copies of this new literature can be found in AID investigatory files. Furthermore, Mr. Pinzak assured AID that any further publication or distribution of campaign literature will be in accordance with 18 U.S.C. Section 612. He agreed to send the Commission a letter reiterating the aforementioned and voluntary compliance.

The meeting adjourned at 1:40 PM.

Recommendation

It is our view that Congressman Fary and the Civic Committee for John Fary has voluntarily complied with 18 U.S.C. 612 and that no further action should be taken pending Mr. Pinzak's letter. Upon receipt of same, CA-004-75 should be closed. Upon receipt of Mr. Pinzak's letter, it is recommended that this matter be forwarded to Justice for information, similar to the Udall matter.

Dear Mr. McKay:

As a result of my conversation with your office,
I will explain the various ways we issued printed
material.

I assume any responsibility on whatever we directly
ordered printed from our office. With a Court decision
to have the Board of Elections run a Primary, we had
printed material ordered by phone very similar, if not
duplicate, of what the late Congressman John Kluczynski
issued. Two companies were involved - Progress Printers
and Central Printers.

In most cases, a member of the democratic organization
would order material for distribution into his ward and
we would endorse the request. If some of this material
did not have the necessary phraseology, it was an oversight
with no intention to conceal the amount of printed matter.
Under normal circumstances with a well disciplined committee,
it would not happen and I assure you it will not occur
again.

There was other printed material which we were not
responsible for, since there were small individual groups
organizing rallies without official sanction by the main
committee. They felt that they would help out in their own
way.

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One point I want to make is that the Congressman had very little control over the campaign since he was serving as a representative in the General Assembly and their closing schedule was hectic - 6 days a week, 14 hours a day. They adjourned July 2nd, six days before the election.

I will be in Washington when Congress returns September 3, and remain there for two weeks. I will bring along copies of advertising that remain on hand. Some of which I claim no responsibility. Also, I will have with me the complete statements concerning our printing.

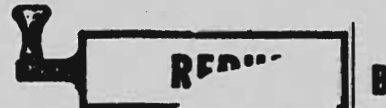

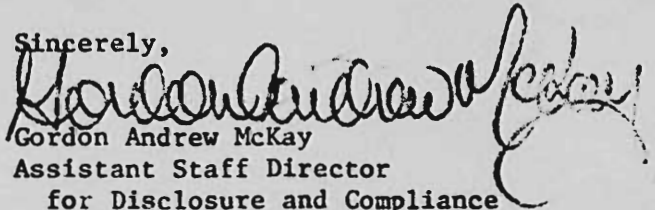
The attention of the Federal Election Commission has been drawn to several leaflets which were allegedly distributed in your behalf in connection with your campaign for election to the United States Congress from the 5th Congressional District of Illinois. The Commission has copies of these leaflets which on their face fail to contain the names of the persons, associations, committees, or corporations which may be responsible for the publication or distribution of them.

Under Title 18, United States Code, Section 612, willful publication or distribution of such leaflets without such information is prohibited. While the Federal Election Commission does not have direct jurisdiction over apparent violations of 18 U.S.C. Section 612, the Commission is required under Title 2, United States Code, Section 438(a)(9) to report apparent violations of law to appropriate law enforcement authorities, which in this case would be the United States Department of Justice.

The Commission does have jurisdiction, as you know, over the filing and reporting requirements of candidates for Federal office under the 1971 Federal Election Campaign Act as amended. Under 2 U.S.C. Section 434 each Treasurer of a political committee supporting a candidate and each candidate for election to Federal office must file reports of receipts and expenditures on forms prescribed or approved by it. The expenditure involved in the printing and distribution of the leaflets to which we have referred above should be duly reported by the committee or person making the payment.

Your cooperation will be appreciated.

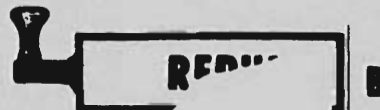
