Dear Commissioners:

I, Ben Jones, file this complaint charging violations of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended ("FECA" or "the Act"), 2 U.S.C. §§ 431 et seq., and related regulations of the Federal Election Commission ("FEC" or "the Commission"), 11 C.F.R. §§ 100.1 et seq., by GOPAC, a multicandidate political committee registered with the Federal Election Commission.

A cursory review of FEC disclosure reports by GOPAC reveals it has violated the law by using prohibited nonfederal funds to pay for expenses related to its operations as a federal political committee. The violation involves significant amounts of money, providing GOPAC with a substantial illegal advantage over other political committees that comply with the federal campaign laws.

The violations are of a continuing nature, so the Commission must investigate promptly and take all steps necessary not only to correct the past violations, but also to prevent the violations from continuing into the future, including injunctive relief for the imminent 1994 elections.

USE OF PROHIBITED FUNDS FOR FEDERAL ELECTION ACTIVITIES

GOPAC has repeatedly stated on the public record that it is not required to disclose to the public the majority of its contributors, the amounts that they contribute, or the majority of its spending because only a tiny portion of its activity relates to federal elections and must, therefore, be disclosed. GOPAC spokespersons have set out the following formula in the press to justify this position:

Of GOPAC's budget, only 1% is spent on candidates. And of this 1% amount, only 10% is contributed to federal candidates.

Regrettably, GOPAC refuses to disclose 90% of its activity. With out full disclosure, it is difficult to know exactly what portion of their activity is intended to influence federal elections. However, a review of their total spending indicates that GOPAC clearly is not complying with even their own stated ratio.

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Under the FEC's regulations, a committee may establish both a federal and nonfederal account. 11 C.F.R. 102.5(a). If the committee intends to use any nonfederal funds to pay for administrative expenses, however, it must allocate the payment of these expenses between the federal and nonfederal account according to a specific formula set out in the regulations. 11 C.F.R. § 106.5(c). This formula requires that the funds be allocated according to the ratio of funds spent on behalf of federal candidates to funds spent on behalf of all candidates. The calculation does not include operating expenditures or non-candidate contributions.

Under the public formulation set out by GOPAC, therefore, 10 percent of the Committee's operating expenditures should be paid from federal funds. The remaining 90 percent would be paid from funds not lawful for federal election purposes.

In the case of GOPAC, however, the numbers simply do not add up. According to FEC reports filed by GOPAC during the most recent complete election cycle, 1991-1992, neither GOPAC's own formulation, nor the formula required by the FEC, can explain the expenditures made by the Committee. GOPAC's FEC reports for this period show the following:

Total Receipts	\$4,057,258.88
Contributions to federal candidates	\$ 16,460.17

Applying GOPAC's own formulation to the reported figures, one percent of the total receipts (\$40,573) supposedly was spent on candidate contributions. If GOPAC was scrupulously following the 90/10 formulation, ten percent (\$4,057) would have been spent on federal candidate contributions. If GOPAC insists on their "one percent for candidates" rule, the numbers appear to show that they made four times the allowable amount of contributions to federal candidates. Either GOPAC's reports are seriously in error, or they are grossly exceeding the federal/nonfederal ratio they have set for themselves and illegally subsidizing federal elections with nonfederal funds.

GOPAC may argue that applying its stated formula to these numbers is unfair, but only they would know since they refuse to disclose their total activity. They might argue that the total receipts figure unfairly includes funds that are spent on operating expenditures. Operating expenses are not included in the allocation formula used for this purpose. But even if the operating expenditures reported by GOPAC for the 1991-1992 election cycle (\$3,967,600.61) are removed from the total receipts, the resulting numbers still do not come close to a ten percent federal allocation.

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Of course, it is impossible to know exactly how much GOPAC spends for nonfederal candidate support since it does not disclose this nonfederal activity. The public and the Commission can only assume that GOPAC is accurately portraying their candidate support activity at just one percent of their total receipts. But even granting GOPAC this assumption, their reports disclose something quite different.

There is another way to derive from GOPAC reports just how much they are spending on candidate activity. Since GOPAC does identify disbursements for operating expenses and federal candidate contributions, one can subtract the operating expenses from the total receipts to derive a fairly accurate estimate of the amount GOPAC actually spent on both federal and nonfederal candidates during the election cycle.

Total Receipts	\$4,057,258.88
Less Operating Expenses	<u>\$3,967,600.61</u>
	\$ 89,658.27

The \$16,460.17 total which GOPAC did disclose as federal candidate support constitutes 18 percent of this estimate of total candidate support. This is nearly double the 10 percent claimed by GOPAC. Applying GOPAC's formula to their own numbers, it is impossible to get their total federal contributions to be equal or less than 10 percent of total candidate support. Their claims do not add up.

These numbers indicate that GOPAC is illegally subsidizing federal candidate activities with prohibited nonfederal funds. As recent newspaper articles on GOPAC's funding sources have indicated, the funds received by GOPAC include both corporate funds and individual contributions far in excess of the \$5,000 per calendar year contribution limit. By understating the percentage of federal candidate contributions, GOPAC is also able to conceal from public scrutiny a much greater share of its contributors and spending than the law allows. Ostensibly because 90 percent of its activities relate only to nonfederal elections, they can hide 90 percent of their activity.

In fact, GOPAC's own numbers show that this nonfederal percentage is seriously overstated, resulting in a failure to publicly disclose the amounts that the Committee is legally obligated to place on the public record.

This is just part of the continuing pattern of GOPAC's resistance to disclosure of its activity. The FEC is currently suing GOPAC in U.S. District Court for failing to register as a federal political committee even though its activities were clearly designed to influence federal elections. Although GOPAC did eventually register, it is now apparently making every effort to keep as much information secret as possible -- an effort that has resulted in violations of the federal campaign laws.

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Just today, a fund raising appeal from GOPAC was made public which received notoriety for it's blatant linking of contributions to GOPAC with legislation before Congress. (Letter and press accounts attached.)

However, more significant is that the letter talks exclusively of raising funds to influence the campaigns for candidates running for the U.S. House of Representatives. The entire tone and focus of the letter betrays GOPAC's major mission to be the influencing of federal elections. The letter is almost a carbon copy of the 1989 GOPAC fund raising appeal which was the cause of the Commission's unanimous action to require GOPAC to register as a federal committee and disclose it's activities dating back to 1989.

GOPAC would have the Commission believe that they are spending less than \$20,000 a year on federal candidate support. At the same time, they would have their donors believe that by contributing to GOPAC they can affect a 40 seat shift of U.S. House seats from Democratic to Republican party control and influence the Republican legislative agenda in the next Congress. All this from just \$20,000 in federal activity.

This Commission knows best the amount of money that is spent in elections for the House of Representatives. It is clear that GOPAC can not be right in both instances. The evidence from their own reports presents a compelling case that GOPAC spending on federal races, including the illegal use of nonfederal funds, is substantially more than they are reporting to the Commission.

GOPAC's repeated pattern of abuse indicates a lack of respect for even the spirit, let alone the full letter, of the law. No better example exists than in the fact GOPAC calls itself a "national party committee". However, it does not even come close to complying with the nonfederal disclosure requirements imposed upon the actual party committees of the Republican party. It is just one more example of GOPAC claiming to be something it is not in order to gain some advantage or avoid revealing its true conduct.

CONCLUSION

GOPAC has cleverly engineered a complicated scheme to avoid full disclosure and compliance with federal and state election laws. Fortunately, the minimum disclosure they do provide opens enough of a window for the public to see that GOPAC is not complying with federal law. GOPAC itself has revealed in it's own reporting a series of violations of the Federal Election Campaign Act. The full extent of the violations is not clear because of a lack of full public disclosure of the information relating to the violations. The pattern of abuse of the campaign laws by GOPAC through the years

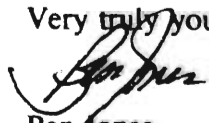

makes it imperative that the Commission act promptly to remedy the continuing violations. This action should include, as necessary, injunctive relief, to prevent GOPAC from benefiting during the 1994 election cycle from the illegal subsidy of its federal election activity.

On the basis of the foregoing, I request that the Commission:

1. Conduct on an expedited basis an investigation into the facts set out above to confirm the actual amount of funds received and spent in violation of the federal campaign laws;
2. Take all necessary action, including injunctive relief, to ensure that the illegal activity undertaken by GOPAC does not continue, especially for the imminent 1994 elections, and that past violations are remedied;
3. Impose any and all penalties ground in the violations set out in this complaint.

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GINGRICH FUND-RAISER

Letter promises influence on GOP agenda

Washington — Rep. Newt Gingrich (R-Ga.), the House minority whip, recently offered a deal to contributors to his political action committee, GOPAC: Donate money and you get to influence his congressional agenda and receive a "limited" silver gavel lapel pin "which you may have seen me wear on TV."

The fund-raising drive launched this summer is linked to an event scheduled Tuesday, when about 300 Republican candidates for the House are expected to gather on the Capitol steps and unveil a "contract with America."

The "contract" will outline the top legislative issues Republicans would promote — or at least vote on — if they win a House majority. People who donate to GOPAC get to participate in a survey that will rank the legislative priorities, according to the Gingrich letter. People who give at least \$40 are eligible for a lapel pin.

"What I'm asking you to do today is join

with me and my House Republican colleagues in a contract . . . that binds us to carry forward our legislative agenda next January and binds you to support us in this effort by helping us, through GOPAC . . .," Gingrich writes.

Rep. Vic Fazio of California, who heads the Democratic Congressional Campaign Committee, charged that the letter makes "clear who really wrote the contract with the Republican leadership." It was Newt Gingrich's undisclosed, unreported contributors to GOPAC who bought their way in.

Gingrich for years has refused to disclose the top donors to his committee, maintaining that 90 percent of GOPAC's money is spent on state and local candidates for training and recruitment.

In a letter that reads like a Publishers Clearing House "finalist" notice, complete with exclamation points, underlined sentences and ellipses, the congressman from Marietta writes, "If we pick up 40 seats, then come next January I would replace Tom Foley as speaker of the House and I believe we would pass our reform legislation as the first

order of business in the new Congress!"

In closing, Gingrich says, "Please make your pledge to help us by rushing your maximum contribution to GOPAC."

Lisa Nelson, GOPAC's executive director, denied that GOPAC contributors have undue influence in establishing the GOP's legislative priorities. "The process has been wide open to anyone interested," she said.

Robert Dahl, GOPAC's attorney, called the accusation of undue influence "preposterous. There are thousands of organizations sending out mailings, and this is no different."

In a related development, former Rep. Ben Jones, Gingrich's Democratic opponent, is expected to file a Federal Election Commission complaint today against GOPAC, alleging that the committee's assertion that it spends only 10 percent of its effort helping federal candidates is inaccurate.

Jones already has filed a complaint with the House ethics committee alleging improprieties in fund raising and the organizing of a course Gingrich taught at Kennesaw State College last year.

GOPAC Offer: Give Funds, Help 'Draft' GOP's Agenda

House Minority Whip Newt Gingrich (R-Ga.) raised funds for the political committee GOPAC by offering contributors an opportunity to influence the drafting of the House GOP's legislative agenda.

"Will you help me draft the Republican legislative agenda for the 104th Congress?" Gingrich asked potential contributors in a recent letter promoting the House Republican "Contract With America."

Gingrich asked donors "to help me today in two critical ways:

1) Make a financial contribution to assist GOPAC's 1994 campaign efforts, and;

2) Answer the 'Republican Legislative Agenda Survey' I've enclosed with my letter."

Democrats were quick to denounce the letter. "It's now crystal clear who really wrote the contract with the Republican leadership," Democratic Congressional Campaign Committee Chairman Vic Fazio (Calif.) said yesterday. "It was Newt Gingrich's undisclosed, unreported contributors to GOPAC who bought their way in."

But critics of political fundraising said it was just as likely the letter is making promises that won't be delivered.

"If you really believed the fundraising appeal, it would be sectioning off the legislative agenda," said Ellen Miller of the Center for Responsive Politics. But she said there is another explanation: "It's a cheap political fundraising technique which exacerbates public cynicism about politics."

Gingrich's fundraising practices

The solicitation surveys donors on legislative issues.

have been the subject of controversy on numerous occasions over the years. GOPAC is currently being sued by the Federal Election Commission for fundraising letters signed by Gingrich in 1989. Most recently, a story in Roll Call re-

ported that financial supporters of Gingrich's college course were allowed to influence the course's content (Sept. 15).

The solicitation surveys contributors on seven issues, including whether there should be an immediate "independent audit of all House financial transactions for the past 10 years," a one-third reduction in committee staff, and new legislation to make all laws passed by the House applicable to Congress. All three promises are expected to appear in the final contract, which is set to be unveiled Tuesday in an event on the Capitol steps to be attended by Republican Members and challengers.

Clinton Administration Won't Appeal Court Ruling for a Census Adjustment

Setting the stage for a potential readjustment of House seats and new redistrictings around the country, the Clinton Administration yesterday failed to file an appeal in a case involving the 1990 Census.

The Bush Administration, though challenged in a lawsuit by dozens of big cities and states to statistically adjust the 1990 headcount to compensate for the millions of

missed minorities and other residents, decided not to do so.

But this summer the US Court of Appeals for the 2nd Circuit decided that the Bush Administration hadn't demonstrated why there was a compelling reason to make the decision and ordered it back to a lower court, where a judge had already expressed strong misgivings about not using the statistically enhanced counts.

The Clinton Administration, in a political bind since President Clinton and Commerce Secretary Ron Brown had both backed adjustment, had until yesterday to appeal that ruling.

But yesterday's deadline came and went without any filing by the government, making it much more likely that the new numbers will — eventually — be used.

But Wisconsin, which had

joined the case on the Bush Administration's side, has filed a request for a rehearing by the appeals court, so the legal maneuvering isn't yet over.

And Jeff Wice, a Democratic attorney, said that if new lawsuits are filed seeking to redo Congressional reapportionment and redistricting, they probably would affect the 1996 or 1998 election cycles rather than 1994.

This letter is the response of GOPAC, Inc., and Lisa B. Nelson, as treasurer, to the complaint filed by Ben Jones in MUR 4061. As demonstrated by the attached documentation and a review of the legal issues presented, the allegations of the complaint are completely false as a matter of fact and law. GOPAC urges the Federal Election Commission ("FEC") to find no reason to believe GOPAC violated the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended ("FECA" or "the Act"), 2 U.S.C. § 431 et seq.

The allegations appear to be that GOPAC has applied an incorrect ratio for allocating the federal/non-federal share of administrative expenses for "mixed" activity, that GOPAC has used non-federal funds for federal political activity and that GOPAC has failed to properly or fully report the financial activity of its federal PAC account. Jones' assertions seem to be based upon his fundamental misunderstanding of the purpose and effect of the FEC's allocation regulations (see 11 C.F.R. § 106.6) and the relationship of these regulations to the FECA's general disclosure requirements.

Consequently, Jones' complaint is a jumble of factual and legal misinterpretation, employing a series of wildly misdirected comparisons and computations. In terms of mixing apples and oranges, his complaint is a veritable fruit salad.

ALLOCATION OF ADMINISTRATIVE EXPENSES

Section 106.6 of the FEC's regulations sets forth the requirements for allocating the expenses of separate segregated funds and non-connected political committees that jointly benefit both federal and non-federal candidates.¹ Non-connected committees are required to calculate the federal/non-federal allocation for their administrative expenses pursuant to the "funds

¹The term "non-connected committee" includes any political committee which conducts activities in connection with a federal election, but which is not a party committee, an authorized committee of a federal candidate, or a separate segregated fund. 11 C.F.R. § 106.6(a).

expended" method under subsection 106.6(c)(1), which provides:

... [E]xpenses shall be allocated based on the ratio of federal expenditures to total federal and non-federal disbursements made by the committee during the two-year federal election cycle. This ratio shall be estimated and reported at the beginning of each federal election cycle, based upon the committee's federal and non-federal disbursements in a prior comparable federal election cycle or upon the committee's reasonable prediction of its disbursements for the coming two years. In calculating its federal expenditures, the committee shall include only amounts contributed to or otherwise spent on behalf of specific federal candidates. Calculation of total federal and non-federal disbursements shall also be limited to disbursements for specific candidates, and shall not include overhead or other generic costs.

GOPAC has complied with the FEC's allocation requirements since registering as a federal political committee in May 1991. See 2 U.S.C. §431(4). As its FEC reports for 1991 and 1992 show (copies of year-end summary pages attached as Exhibit A), GOPAC's federal account contributed \$4404.73 to federal candidates in 1991 and \$12,055.44 to federal candidates in 1992. As reports to various state campaign finance authorities show (copies of relevant pages attached as Exhibit B)², GOPAC's non-federal contribution accounts gave \$45,005.23 to non-federal candidates in 1991 and \$119,490.00 to non-federal candidates in 1992.

Thus, for the 1991-2 election cycle, GOPAC contributed a total of \$16,460.17 to federal candidates and \$164,495.23 to non-federal candidates. Based upon these figures, GOPAC would have been entitled to identify its federal activity as 9% of its total disbursements for specific candidates in the 1992 election cycle ($\$16,460.17 \div [\$16,460.17 + \$164,495.23]$). As Exhibit A shows, GOPAC actually paid 10% of its total allocable expenses for the 1991-2 election cycle from its federal account -- \$359,539.94 from federal and \$3,235,849.62 from non-federal accounts. Therefore, GOPAC ended up the cycle tilting the ratio a bit more toward federal allocation than minimally required by its pattern of contributions to specific federal and non-federal candidates.

Jones inaccurately alleges GOPAC does not disclose its contributions to non-federal candidates. In fact, GOPAC complies with all campaign finance reporting requirements under the laws of the various states in which GOPAC makes contributions to state and local candidates. The complaint provides no evidence to suggest otherwise. The lack of a central depository for reporting all political activity at the state and local level is a consequence of federalism, and does not indicate avoidance of disclosure by GOPAC or any particular organization which is engaged in non-federal activity throughout the nation.

GOPAC anticipated about the same direct federal contribution activity relative to non-federal contributions in the 1994 election cycle. Accordingly, GOPAC has reported to the FEC and adhered to a 10% federal to non-federal ratio for allocating payments for administrative and other generic expenses for the current election cycle (copies of relevant pages of 1993 year-end and October 1994 reports [including 1994 year-to-date] enclosed as Attachment C). Thus, by any objective measure, GOPAC has complied with the letter and spirit of the FEC's allocation regulations.³ Jones' allegations to the contrary are obviously wrong.

PAYMENTS FOR FEDERAL POLITICAL ACTIVITY

Jones' complaint totally misconstrues and mischaracterizes GOPAC's financial activity. He begins by seizing on an estimate reportedly made by GOPAC officials of the proportion of all GOPAC programming devoted to direct candidate support -- said to be 1%. GOPAC has always acknowledged, however, that its primary mission is not to contribute to or make expenditures on behalf of specific candidates, unlike conventional "PACs." GOPAC raises some PAC money for contributing to candidates at the federal and state level, and maintains and reports separate accounts for such purposes. It also raises different funds for purposes wholly apart from direct candidate support.

The percentage of direct candidate support relative to overall disbursements (or receipts) of a political organization has no legal consequence or significance. Political organizations may spend however much they wish on administrative expenses, educational activity, issue advocacy and other political activity outside the candidate finance arena (some of which may be viewed as federal expenditures or require federal/non-federal allocation). How much of an organization's funds go to making direct contributions to candidates may be of interest to contributors or even be newsworthy, but it is not relevant to the legal issue of the allocation ratio. As the language of Section 106.6(c)(1) makes clear, activity that does not involve direct support for federal or non-federal candidates does not determine or affect a group's federal/non-federal allocation ratio. Instead, those disbursements that are not direct contributions to candidates include the very "mixed" activity whose proper federal/non-federal financing is determined by the ratio.

Jones, however, takes this unofficial and irrelevant figure of 1%, and GOPAC's 10% federal allocation formula, and applies both percentages to receipt and disbursement numbers to which they are wholly inapplicable. He first runs the percentages against the total FEC-reported receipts of GOPAC's federal account for the 1992 cycle -- including the transfers from the non-federal account to the separate (but federally reportable) allocation account for joint activity.

³If GOPAC's candidate support activity in the current campaign season results in a higher proportion of federal to non-federal contributions for the 1994 election cycle, GOPAC will adjust its allocation ratio and reconcile payments for administrative and other "mixed" expenses to insure an appropriate federal share, pursuant to 11 C.F.R. § 106.6(c)(2).

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He then draws erroneous conclusions about what GOPAC must have done or should have done regarding contributions to federal candidates during that time:

... [T]he numbers simply do not add up. According to FEC reports filed by GOPAC during the most recent complete election cycle, 1991-1992, neither GOPAC's own formulation, nor the formula required by the FEC, can explain the expenditures made by the Committee. GOPAC's FEC reports for this period show the following:

Total receipts	\$4,047,258.88
Contributions to federal candidates	\$ 16,460.17

Applying GOPAC's own formulation to the reported figures, one percent of the total receipts (\$40,573) supposedly was spent on candidate contributions. If GOPAC was scrupulously following the 90/10 formulation, ten percent (\$4,057) would have been spent on federal candidate contributions. If GOPAC insists on their "one percent for candidates" rule, the numbers appear to show they made four times the allowable amount of contributions to federal candidates. Either GOPAC's reports are seriously in error, or they are grossly exceeding the federal/non-federal ratio they have set for themselves and illegally subsidizing federal elections with nonfederal funds.

The numbers do not add up because his analysis is based on faulty legal interpretation and accounting.⁴ Transfers to the allocation account from the non-federal account, which the complaint adds to the computations, are for the non-federal share of "mixed" activity. Although reported to the FEC, those transfers are not "federal" receipts nor used for contributions to either federal or non-federal candidates. Jones appears to believe, however, GOPAC makes all contributions to federal and non-federal candidates from this pool of federal receipts plus non-federal transfers for "mixed" activity. Such a mistaken belief is the only way to explain his application of the 10% allocation ratio to 1% of these funds to identify what would have been the "allowable amount of contributions to federal candidates."

⁴Because he has the law confused, Jones is working from the wrong numbers. As Exhibit A shows, total contributions to GOPAC's federal account in the 1991-2 election cycle amounted to \$885,425.28. Direct contributions to federal candidates during that cycle, \$16,460.17, actually amounted to 1.86% of federal receipts -- not so far off from the reported guess by GOPAC officials, but of no legal significance nevertheless.

⁵As noted previously, the FEC's regulations provide that a committee's allocation ratio is to be calculated by total direct contributions to federal candidates over total direct contributions to federal and non-federal candidates. The ratio is then applied to certain types of "mixed" federal/non-federal expenses to determine the minimum federal share that must be

Jones' application of these percentages is nonsensical. It overlooks the fact virtually all of GOPAC's contributions to state and local candidates (90% of its contribution activity) are made from non-federal accounts whose financial activity is not reported on federal reports.⁶ These contributions are generally not made from the pool of funds he has chosen to isolate and mathematically manipulate. Despite having railed throughout the complaint about the absence of comprehensive disclosure of non-federal activity by political organizations operating nationally, Jones seems to have forgotten that key point in his analysis.

This explanation of Jones' fundamental error is reinforced by a review of his second attempt at proving his allegations. He suggests "one can subtract the operating expenses from the total receipts to derive a fairly accurate estimate of the amount GOPAC actually spent on both federal and non-federal candidates during the election cycle."⁷ Again, however, he has failed to recognize GOPAC makes few of its contributions to non-federal candidates from its federal account (and that contributions to non-federal candidates from the federal account would generally be itemized disbursements on FEC reports, and few entries for that purpose appear on GOPAC's reports).

funded by the federal account. The allocation ratio is not a figure to be applied to the entire federal account itself -- or any other amount -- to determine how much may be "permissibly" contributed to federal candidates. It does not create a prospective limit upon contributing to federal candidates. Exceeding the estimated proportion of federal to total candidate contributions does, of course, require adjusting the allocation ratio and retroactively paying a higher federal share of allocable "mixed" activity. Frequent or unreasonable underestimation and underpayment of the federal share of mixed expenses could invite legal challenge. But Jones' premise that GOPAC could somehow violate either self-imposed or FEC-determined limits on aggregate contributions to federal candidates is completely off-base.

⁶GOPAC occasionally makes contributions to state and local candidates from its federal account, as it is permitted to do, for ease of compliance with particular state campaign finance requirements. These contributions represent a small amount of GOPAC's non-federal activity, and are properly reported as "other disbursements" on FEC reports.

Jones uses the total "receipts" for GOPAC's federal account in the 1992 cycle from line 19 of the Detailed Summary Pages (which includes transfers from non-federal accounts to the allocation account for payment of "mixed" expenses) and subtracts the total operating expenses of the federal account in the 1992 cycle from line 21(c) (which includes the non-federal share of "mixed" expenses), and arrives at a figure of \$89,658.27. He incorrectly postulates that remainder (which is largely just cash-on-hand, including funds left over in the allocation account) to be the entire pool of funds from which GOPAC contributes to both federal and non-federal candidates. He then questions why GOPAC's contributions to federal candidates were not limited to 10% of that figure.

From these scrambled theories and arithmetic, Jones concludes "GOPAC is illegally subsidizing federal candidate activities with prohibited nonfederal funds." The charge is totally false, however, either with respect to GOPAC's making of contributions to federal candidates or its paying for the federal share of joint activity. Jones' logic is wrongheaded and his numbers are meaningless. The attached documentation fully refutes his allegations.

DISCLOSURE OF FEDERAL POLITICAL ACTIVITY

GOPAC files monthly reports of its federal account's receipts and disbursements. See 2 U.S.C. §434(a)(4)(B). GOPAC fully and accurately reports to the FEC all monies raised for and spent from its federal committee. Nothing in the complaint seriously contradicts that fact or identifies any instance of misreporting.

Jones appears to suffer under the mistaken and preposterous notion that GOPAC uses the federal/non-federal allocation ratio for payment of its administrative and generic expenses (discussed above) to determine how much activity it reports as federal activity to the FEC. The complaint does not and cannot cite a regulatory connection between the allocation ratio for payment of mixed federal/non-federal expenses and the basic obligation to report all activity of the federal account, or present any evidence that GOPAC has drawn such an erroneous conclusion. Yet (having wrongly challenged GOPAC's allocation ratio) Jones asserts:

By understating the percentage of federal candidate contributions, GOPAC is also able to conceal from public scrutiny a much greater share of its contributors and spending than the law allows. Ostensibly because 90 percent of its activities relate only to non-federal elections, they can hide 90 percent of their activity.

In fact, GOPAC's own numbers show that this nonfederal percentage is seriously overstated, resulting in a failure to publicly disclose the amounts that the Committee is legally obligated to place on the public record.

The idea that GOPAC arbitrarily selects and limits the activity subject to FEC reporting by applying some percentage to its overall political activity is ludicrous. GOPAC specifically solicits contributions to its federal account, pursuant to FEC fundraising requirements. See 11 C.F.R. 102.5(a). GOPAC's federal account contains only -- and all -- monies raised for use in federal political activity.⁵ Id. Expenditures for GOPAC's federal election activity are financed exclusively through the federal account. Id. All receipts going in and disbursements going out of the federal account are completely reported to the FEC.

⁵Of course, the federal account also reports periodic transfers to the allocation account from non-federal accounts. Those funds are used solely for purposes of covering the non-federal share of allocable expense payments, pursuant to 11 C.F.R. § 106.6(e)(1).

There is no connection between the allocation ratio (or any other percentage) and the scope of activity disclosed in GOPAC's FEC reports. Even if GOPAC had miscalculated its allocation ratio, or needed to revise its allocation ratio based upon an unanticipated pattern of contributions to federal and non-federal candidates in the 1994 cycle, nothing on the FEC reports would change except the relative share of federal/nonfederal expenses for mixed activity.

Thus, another basic premise of the complaint is seriously misguided as a matter of law and common sense. GOPAC fully discloses its federal political activity to the FEC.

CONCLUSION

In bringing these allegations, the complainant misrepresents the facts and misreads the FEC's allocation regulations and disclosure requirements. Furthermore, his assertion that the FEC must investigate GOPAC's non-federal activity to verify the accuracy of GOPAC's federal reporting is a transparent ploy. All political committees engaged in both federal and non-federal activity could be subject to the same speculative charge and vague suspicion. The FEC has no legitimate basis for doubting the correctness of GOPAC's federal reporting practices, nor any justification for going outside its jurisdiction and examining GOPAC's non-federal activity -- certainly not on the basis of the broad, confused and unsubstantiated allegations of Jones' complaint. GOPAC would strongly object to any FEC fishing expedition into its non-federal activity based upon a complaint so clearly reckless with the facts and ignorant of the law.

The complaint in MUR 4061 fails to properly state a cause of action under the FECA or provide an evidentiary basis to infer any violations of the Act. The foregoing discussion and supporting documentation clearly demonstrate the complainant's allegations are unfounded. GOPAC requests the Commission find no reason to believe GOPAC has violated the Act and dismiss this complaint.

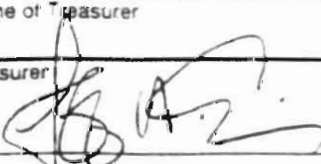

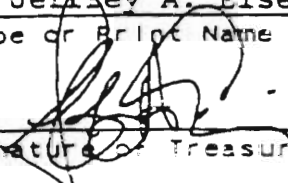

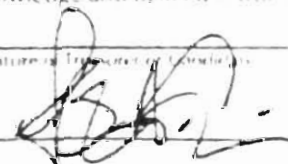

GENERAL COUNSEL'S REPORT

I. INTRODUCTION

In accordance with the objectives of the Enforcement Priority System ("EPS") adopted by the Commission in May 1993, the Office of the General Counsel has periodically recommended that the Commission not pursue cases that are stale or that, in comparison to other pending matters, do not appear to warrant the use of the Commission's limited resources. This General Counsel's Report recommends the Commission not pursue 43 cases that fall within these categories.

II. CASES RECOMMENDED FOR CLOSING

A. Cases Not Warranting Further Pursuit Relative to Other Cases Pending Before the Commission

A critical component of the Priority System is identifying those pending cases that do not warrant the further expenditure of Commission resources. Each incoming matter is evaluated using Commission-approved criteria and cases that, based on their rating, do not warrant pursuit relative to other pending cases are placed in this category. By closing such cases, the Commission is able to use its limited resources to focus on more important cases.

Having evaluated incoming matters, this Office has identified 24 cases which do not warrant further pursuit relative to other pending matters.¹ A short description of each case and the factors leading to assignment of a relatively low priority and consequent recommendation not to pursue each case is attached to this Report. Attachments 1-24. As the Commission has previously requested, we have also attached responses and referral materials where that information has not been circulated previously to the Commission. Attachment 25.

B. Stale Cases

Investigations are severely impeded and require relatively greater resources when the activity, and the evidence of the activity, are old. Accordingly, the Office of the General Counsel recommends that the Commission focus its efforts on cases involving more recent activity. Such efforts will also generate more impact on the current electoral process and are a more efficient allocation of our limited resources. To this end, this Office has identified 19 cases that

this Office believes are now too old to warrant the use of the Commission's resources

By closing the cases effective that day, CED and the Legal Review Team each will have the necessary time to prepare closing letters and case files for the public record.

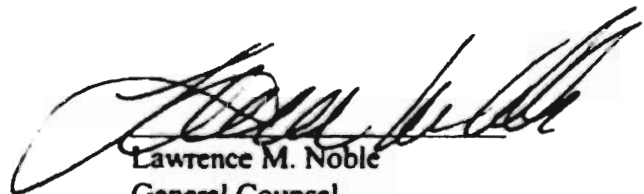
