Washington, D.C. 20463 0 Re: Hard Rock Cafe, Inc.; Hard Rock Cafe America, L.P.: Mr. Peter Morton Dear Mr. Noble: This office represents Hard Rock Cafe America, L.P. and Hard Rock Cafe, Inc. ("Hard Rock"), Melrose Corporation, and their principal Peter Morton. Mr. Morton is a financial supporter of various political campaigns and social causes. In recent years he was subjected to numerous solicitations for contributions to which he often responded. Mr. Morton, however, is not otherwise politically active and is not versed in election law and regulations. His donations were not subject to prior review by counsel. In December 1994, there was a review of corporate finances by the Nevada Gaming Control Board. As a result of the review, Hard Rock and Mr. Morton became aware that over several years they inadvertently may have violated certain federal election laws and retained counsel to assist them in bringing their affairs into compliance. Hard Rock Cafe America, L.P. is the successor of Hard Rock Cafe Investors Ltd. after a July 1992 reorganization. Hard Rock Cafe America, L.P. is a Delaware limited partnership owned principally by Peter Morton through a subchapter-S corporation. Hard Rock Cafe, Inc., a Delaware corporation, is the general partner of each Hard Rock Cafe restaurant owned principally by Peter Morton.

January 5, 1995 Page 2 Over the past three weeks Hard Rock and Mr. Morton have collected financial records pertaining to political contributions from 1987 to the present and counsel has reviewed these documents in an effort to achieve compliance with federal election law. Our factual and legal analyses are based on a review of these documents and are summarized on three charts attached as Exhibit 1 and explained below. Also enclosed as Exhibit 2 are financial records provided to counsel for the Commission's independent review.2 At the outset, our clients want to emphasize that any violations of federal election law were inadvertent. did not intend to circumvent any prohibitions. Indeed, they were wholly unaware that their activities might be illegal. The documents that they have provided confirm that they did not knowingly violate the law. The documents reflect no falsifications of business records to hide their activities, but do reflect ignorance of federal election laws. Such was the conclusion of the FEC's former head of enforcement, Kenneth A. Gross, who issued a letter to the Nevada Gaming Control Board. See Exhibit 3. The charts attached as Exhibit 1 indicate the following potential violations of federal election law from 1987 to 1994: 2 U.S.C. 5 441b The Hard Rock Cafe Investors, Ltd., a California limited partnership that no longer exists, reimbursed Peter Morton approximately \$8,750 for federal political contributions. The Hard Rock Cafe Investors, Ltd. II (of San Francisco), a California limited partnership that no longer exists, reimbursed Peter Morton \$1,000. The Hard Rock Cafe Investors, Ltd. VII (of San Diego), a California limited partnership that no longer exists, reimbursed Peter Morton \$1,000. Many of the documents we have been provided do not pertain to federal contributions or elections, but we are providing them here in the spirit of full disclosure. We have made every effort to make copies as legible as possible.

January 5, 1995 Page 3 The Hard Rock Cafe, a Delaware corporation, reimbursed Peter Morton approximately \$5,166.67 and Alan Mazursky, Chief Financial Officer, approximately \$500 for federal political contributions. The Hard Rock Cafe America L.P., a Delaware limited partnership, reimbursed Peter Morton approximately \$2,666.67 for federal political contributions. Melrose Corporation reimbursed Peter Morton approximately \$3,416.66 for federal political contributions. In total, Peter Morton and Alan Mazursky were reimbursed approximately \$22,500 from corporate entities from 1987 to 1994. 2 U.S.C. 5 441f Approximately \$22,000 in federal political contributions were reported from Peter Morton and Tarlton Morton, but reimbursements resulted in the contributions being from the Hard Rock Cafe Investors, Ltd., the Hard Rock Cafe, the Hard Rock Cafe America, L.P., and Melrose Corporation. Approximately \$500 in a federal political contribution was reported from Alan Mazursky, but reimbursement resulted in the contribution being from the Hard Rock Cafe. 2 U.S.C. 5 441a(a)(3) In 1992, FEC contributor records indicate that Peter Morton contributed \$30,800 to federal candidates and other federal committees. In light of my clients' discovery that these activities were prohibited by federal election law, they have done or will do the following to bring themselves into compliance: (1) they have conducted a thorough review of their records, produced the documents to counsel, and have requested disclosure of these documents to the Commission for its independent review;

January 5, 1995 Page 4 they have requested a review of their financial records by counsel to identify every possible error under federal election law; based on a review of the documents, my clients have requested counsel to disclose this information to the Federal Election Commission for appropriate review and enforcement; (4) Peter Morton will reimburse a total of \$22,000 to the appropriate entities that reimbursed his federal political contributions; Alan Mazursky will reimburse the Hard Rock Cafe (5) \$500: Each corporate entity has adopted new procedures to (6) prevent these occurrences in the future. See Exhibit 3. My clients regret these mistakes and are eager to O rectify this matter. Undersigned counsel is authorized to answer questions and our clients are prepared to cooperate fully in any proceeding initiated by the FEC. The California Legislature reconvened its 1989-90 session just five weeks ago. During the first half of this two-year cycle, legislators introduced 4,659 bills, and we expect at least that many to be introduced before the March 2 deadline for introduction of new bills!

The restaurant industry faces a number of critical challenges in 1990:

AB 2573 (Connelly) Alcohol Taxes This bill would impose an excise surtax of five cents for specified amounts of beer, wine, and distilled spirits. The surtaxes would be in addition to the excise taxes currently levied on alcohol beverages in the state. If passed, the surtax will be the largest California has experienced since 1965. This surtax would make California's alcohol beverage excise taxes among the highest in the U.S. It is poor public policy to place on the back of business, programs that government is no longer willing or able to support.

AB 77 (Moore) Family Leave Would make it an unlawful employment practice for an employer of 25 or more employees, working at the same location, to refuse to grant a request for leave by an employee with more than one year of continuous service. total of four months in a 24-month period of unpaid leave may be taken. The employee would remain eligible for all other benefits except the employer may request the employee to pay health and welfare benefit plan premiums.

AB 328 (Margolin) Health Insurance Would enact a gross payroll tax and an unemployment health insurance tax. Businesses can decide to either provide health insurance to employees or pay a gross payroll tax of an unspecified amount. The amount of the tax is to be based on the average percentage of gross payroll, which is

Solid statistical evidence exists to prove that more than 50% of the children under the age of five in Los Angeles County have not been immunized for the common childhood diseases of measles, mumps, rubella, tetanus, polic, diphtheria, pertussis, meningitis, and tuberculosis. The World Health Organization of the United Nations recently stated that in 1992, more children in third world countries will be immunized to prevent these diseases than in Los Angeles County.

I first learned about the Mobile Medical program from Paul Simon who asked me to make a \$150,000 contribution to his unit in New York as payment for a television performance he did for the Hard Rock. Peter Morton has asked me to examine certain political contributions and report those findings to you in connection with his application for a casino license. From 1980 to 1986, I was head of the enforcement division of the Federal Election Commission ("FBC"), the federal agency responsible for the enforcement of the federal campaign finance laws. For the last seven years, I have taught a course on campaign finance and ethics at the George Washington University graduate school. For your information, enclosed is a biography describing my extensive background in the area of campaign finance.

I have conducted a thorough examination of the records containing information concerning political contributions made by Mr. Morton and Hard Rock Cafe America, L.P. and related entities (collectively referred to as "Hard Rock Cafe"). Alan Mazursky, the Chief Operating Officer for Hard Rock Cafe, provided me with much of this information including a listing of contributions prepared by your office.

Based on that review, it appears that Mr. Morton and Hard Rock Cafe have inadvertently violated 2 U.S.C. 35-441b and 441f. These am provisions of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended, which prohibit corporate contributions to federal candidates and committees (2 U.S.C. § 441b) and contributions made



Mr. Stephen Pozzi December 16, 1994 Page 2 in the name of another (2 U.S.C. § 441f). Contributions made in the name of another occur when one person reimburses another person for a contribution that person has made, and the identity of the reimburser is not disclosed to the campaign receiving the contribution. Similar violations occurred under state and local campaign finance laws in California and in one instance in Chicago. Unlike federal law, however, California state and local campaign finance laws and Chicago's campaign finance law permit corporate political contributions. Therefore, the sole issue in California and Chicago relates to the prohibition on making a contribution in the name of another. Based on discussions with Mr. Morton and Mr. Mazursky about these contributions and a thorough review of the records, I have concluded that there was no willful or purposeful attempt to evade any law. Rather, Mr. Morton and other employees of the Hard Rock Cafe were ignorant of the applicable federal, state, and local campaign finance laws, and were unaware that they were violating any such laws. Indeed, there is ample evidence in the records you provided to support the same conclusion. For example, Mr. Morton's and the Hard Rock Cafe employees' ignorance of their violations of the campaign finance laws is corroborated by the documentary evidence which demonstrates that they undertook no effort to hide the purpose of the reimbursements. In addition to this documentary evidence, affidavits will be prepared for submission to the campaign finance enforcement authorities supporting the statements by Mr. Morton and Mr. Mazursky that they were unaware of the applicable provisions of law. Upon the preparation of these statements, we will submit them to you. As far as documentary evidence is concerned, the check stubs accompanying the reimbursement checks clearly state that the reimbursements were for political contributions. In other cases where individuals use reimbursement schemes to evade the prohibitions, limitations, or disclosure requirements of the campaign finance laws, they make efforts to conceal

the true purpose of the reimbursements. For instance. the reimbursements would be made in the form of salary bonuses or payments for seminars or dinner expenses to conceal the true purpose. Also, reimbursement cases where there is intentional misconduct usually involves efforts to evade the \$1,000 per candidate, per election limit on federal contributions. None of the instances involving reimbursements by the Hard Rock Cafe included situations where there was an effort to evade the contribution limits through corporate reimbursements. Purthermore, it is apparent that there was no effort to says Mr. Morton's personal funds by using corporate funds. fact, in one instance, Hard Rock Cafe made a \$100,000 contribution and Peter Morton reimbursed the corporation. Thus, the net consequence of the reimbursements resulted in the use of more personal money than corporate funds.

Based on my experience as a regulator, the likely and appropriate resolution of these violations will be through a civil conciliation agreement entered into between the FEC and the Hard Rock Cafe and Mr. Morton. Typically, that agreement will also name other individuals involved in making the reimbursed contributions. The agreement will likely include a civil penalty in an amount that should not exceed the amount of reimbursed contributions.

Mr. Morton and Hard Rock Cafe will be taking immediate steps to bring these unintentional violations to the attention of the FEC, do whatever is necessary to rectify the violations, and cooperate fully with the FEC in reaching a conciliation agreement. Also, Hard Rock Cafe is implementing procedures to ensure that no future violations occur when either the Hard Rock Cafe or Mr. Morton make political contributions. See enclosed form that will be used to implement this new procedure. Based on my experience with the FEC, however, it is unlikely that these violations will be resolved through a conciliation agreement before early February when Mr. Morton is scheduled for a hearing before the Nevada Gaming Commission regarding the casino license. Usually, cases such as these take several months to resolve even with the full cooperation of the respondents.

I.

INTRODUCTION

This case concerns political money laundering by Respondents Hard Rock Cafe America, L.P.; Hard Rock Cafe America (Los Angeles) L.P.; The Melrose Corporation; and Peter Morton ("Respondents"). Respondents concealed the true source of illegal contributions made to Los Angeles City Councilmembers, candidates for City elective office, officeholder and controlled committees during the period August 1987 through October 1992. The statute of limitations has run on the six contributions made by Respondents in 1987, 1988 and 1989 in violation of Los Angeles City Charter ("City Charter") sections 312 L, 312 C 5 and 312 C 8. Therefore, only the two remaining contributions, made in 1991 and 1992, and a third violation of the City Charter section 312 C 8 aggregate contribution limit are included as counts herein. For details of the 1987, 1988 and 1989 violations, see Exhibit 3.

During June 1991 through October 1992, individuals associated with Hard Rock Cafe America L.P.; Hard Rock Cafe America (Los Angeles) L.P.; and The Melrose Corporation made what appeared to be two individual contributions to the "Mike Woo for Mayor" committee and to the "Mike Woo's Officeholder Account" committee. The Councilman's campaign committee and officeholder committee recorded them in their campaign statements as contributions from the individuals. The Melrose Corporation and Hard Rock Cafe Investors. Ltd., however, each reimbursed the individuals for one of the contributions. The public was deprived of the knowledge of the true source of the contributions, and Hard Rock Cafe Investors

L.P.; The Melrose Corporation and Peter Morton, will usually be referred to herein collectively as "Respondents."

Where necessary, however, a respondent will be referred to individually. Hard Rock Cafe Investors, Ltd., which became Hard Rock Cafe America (Los Angeles), L.P. after a July 1992 corporate reorganization, will be referred to specifically by name throughout.

²The term "political money faundering" typically describes conduct of reimbursing another for making a contribution without disclosure to the public of the true source's identity.

Ltd. and The Melrose Corporation, by contributing monies indirectly through two individuals associated with the corporate entities, circumvented the City Charter contribution limitations.

Respondents' own documents show reimbursements to the individual contributors for the contributions they made to the Mike Woo committees, as well as for contributions to the other candidates that are now outside the statute of limitations. Respondents brought this matter to the attention of the City Ethics Commission after the illegal contributions were identified by the staff of the Nevada Gaming Control Board.

Respondents admit they violated the City Charter as follows:

COUNTS 1 AND 2 Making 2 contributions in violation of City Charter section 312 L.

COUNT 3 Making 5 contributions in violation of City Charter section 312 C 8.

II.

SUMMARY OF THE LAW

City Charter section 312 L provides that a contribution shall not be made, directly or indirectly, by any person or combination of persons, acting jointly in a name other than the name by which they are identified for legal purposes, nor in the name of another person or combination of persons.

City Charter section 312 C 8 provides that no person shall make a contribution in a single election that would cause the aggregate amount of contributions by that person to exceed a sum equal to \$500 multiplied by the number of City Council offices appearing on the ballot at that election, plus \$1,000 multiplied by the number of city-wide offices appearing on the ballot at that election. The aggregate limit for the April 1993 Primary Election, based on the above formula, was \$7,000.

III.

SUMMARY OF THE EVIDENCE

COUNTS 1 AND 2

VIOLATIONS OF SECTION 312 L

Respondents violated City Charter section 312 L with regard to two indirect contributions, without disclosing the true source of the contributions. The indirect contributions are detailed below:

COUNT 1

Contribution to "Mike Woo for Mayor" Committee

The "Mike Woo for Mayor" committee received a \$1,000 contribution from the Melrose Corporation on October 5, 1992. This check, number 9600, dated September 11, 1992, was reflected on the Melrose Corporation accounts as of August 23, 1993. Another \$1,000 contribution was received by the "Mike Woo for Mayor" committee on October 25, 1992 from Tarlton Morton, by personal check number 2302, dated September 25, 1992. The Committee's campaign statement for the period January 1, 1992 through December 31, 1992 listed Tarlton Morton as the contributor.

However, Tarlton Morton was reimbursed \$1,000 by check number 9611, dated September 25, 1992, by The Melrose Corporation, an entity owned in part by Peter Morton.

The Melrose Corporation was the true source of both the \$1,000 contributions.

COUNT 2

Contribution to Councilman Mike Woo's Officeholder Committee

Councilman Mike Woo's Officeholder committee received one \$5,000 contribution on June 22, 1991, made payable to "Councilman Mike Woo's Officeholder Account," from Peter Morton, by personal check number 4387, dated June 20, 1991. The Committee's campaign

statement for the period January 1, 1991 through June 30, 1991 listed Peter Morton as the 2 contributor. However, Peter Morton was reimbursed \$5,000 by check number 3544, dated the same 3 date, June 20, 1991, by Hard Rock Cafe Investors, Ltd... 4 5 Hard Rock Cafe Investors, Ltd. was the true source of the \$5,000 contribution. 6 COUNT 3 7 8 VIOLATION OF CITY CHARTER SECTION 312 C 8 9 Respondents violated City Charter section 312 C 8 by contributing monies in excess of 10 the \$7,000 aggregate contribution limit in the April 1993 Primary Election. 11 12 Count 3 Respondents made five contributions to candidates in the 1993 Primary Election totaling 13 14 \$9,250. On September 11, 1992, by check number 9600, The Melrose Corporation contributed 15 \$1,000 to "Mike Woo for Mayor." As detailed in Count 1 above, Tarlton Morton was reimbursed \$1,000 19 by The Melrose Corporation on September 25, 1992. On October 16, 1992, by check number 1158, Hard Rock Cafe America (Los Angeles) 20 L.P. contributed \$1,000 to "Nate Holden for Mayor." 21 22 On March 5, 1993, by check number 5972, Peter Morton contributed \$6,000 to "Mike 23 Woo for Mayor." 24 On March 15, 1993, by check number 1466, Hard Rock Cafe America (Los Angeles) 25 L.P. contributed \$250 to "Daniel Pritikin for City Council." 26 Respondents exceeded the City Charter section 312 C 8 aggregate limit for the 1993 27

Primary Election, which was \$7,000, by \$2,250, in violation of this section.

IV.

FACTORS IN AGGRAVATION

The laundering of campaign contributions is one of the most serious violations of the campaign finance provisions of the Los Angeles City Charter. Laundering manifests an intent to conceal from the public the true source of political contributions, and it allows for the circumvention of the campaign contribution limitations enacted by the voters of the City of Los Angeles. However, the Respondents do not admit that their violations of the campaign finance provisions of the Los Angeles City Charter were intentional.

The repeated nature of the violations by Respondents over a five year period displays a pattern of laundering activity rather than an isolated incident.³

V.

FACTORS IN MITIGATION

Respondents have no prior enforcement history.

Respondents, by letter from their attorney dated January 27, 1995, revealed their laundering activities to the City Ethics Commission and offered to cooperate fully in order to bring themselves into full compliance with Los Angeles law. They did so at the request of the staff of the Nevada Gaming Control Board. Respondents identified six Charter violations now outside the statute of limitations. In the course of the City Ethics Commission's ensuing investigation, Respondents furnished all documents and information necessary to promptly and completely resolve this matter.

VI.

CONCLUSION

This matter consists of three counts against Respondents. The total fine Respondents will pay in connection with this case is \$12,000. The failure of Respondents to comply with the limitations of the campaign finance provisions of the Los Angeles City Charter justifies the imposition of the agreed upon penalty.

I. GENERATION OF MATTER

This matter was generated from a sua sponte submission filed by Hard Rock Cafe, Inc., Hard Rock Cafe America, L. P., Melrose Corporation (collectively referred to as "Hard Rock"), and their principal, Peter Morton. See Attachment 1. According to the sua sponte submission, in December 1994, the Nevada Gaming Control

Board reviewed the finances of these corporate entities. As a result of that review, Hard Rock Cafe, Inc., Hard Rock Cafe

America, L. P., Melrose Corporation, Peter Morton, Alan Mazursky, and Tarlton Morton ("Respondents") became aware that over several years they may have violated certain provisions of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended ("the Act").

Specifically, Respondents note that the Hard Rock entities reimbursed Peter Morton, his wife, Tarlton Morton, and Chief Financial Officer Alan Mazursky for Federal political contributions, and that Peter Morton may have exceeded Section 441a(a)(3)'s limit in 1992.

II. FACTUAL AND LEGAL ANALYSIS

A. Contributions in the Name of Another

Section 441f of the Act provides that no person shall make a contribution in the name of another or knowingly permit his name to be used to effect such a contribution, and no person shall knowingly accept a contribution made by one person in the name of another person. 2 U.S.C. § 441f. Under the Act, it is unlawful for any corporation to make a contribution or expenditure in connection with a Federal election, or for any candidate, political committee, or other person knowingly to accept or receive any prohibited contribution, or for any corporate officer

or director to consent to any such contribution or expenditure.

2 U.S.C. \$ 441b(a). No person shall make contributions to any candidate and his authorized political committees with respect to any election for Federal office which, in aggregate, exceed \$1,000. 2 U.S.C. \$ 441a(a)(1)(A). No person shall make contributions to the political committees established and maintained by a national political party, which are not the authorized political committees of any candidate, in any calendar year which, in the aggregate, exceed \$20,000. 2 U.S.C. \$ 441a(a)(1)(B).

Respondents have submitted documentation that evidences contributions from corporate entities through Peter Morton, Alan Mazursky, and Tarlton Morton to Federal committees. See Attachment 1. From this documentation, it appears that sixteen Federal contributions made by Peter Morton, two contributions by Tarlton Morton, and one contribution by Alan Mazursky were reimbursed by Hard Rock during the period 1987 through 1994.

According to the FEC contributor index, Alan Mazursky has made only two political contributions during the time period, including the \$500 contribution admittedly reimbursed by Hard Rock Cafe, Inc. The contributor index reveals that Tarlton Morton made numerous contributions to Federal political committees, but our review of the record discloses that only her 1992 contributions to candidate Mel Levine were reimbursed by Peter Morton, who was in turn reimbursed by Hard Rock.

Respondents argue that they "were wholly unaware that their activities might be illegal," and impliedly claim that they believed that corporate contributions were legal in Federal elections, as they are in non-Federal elections in the state of California. Respondents' actions, however, are inconsistent with that claim. Records submitted show that when the Respondent corporate entities made contributions to City Council and other non-Federal election campaigns, they made the contributions in their own names. When using these same corporations' funds to make contributions in Federal elections, however, the contributions were always made in the names of individuals. If, as Respondents claim, they believed that corporate contributions

in Federal elections were legal, they would have made corporate contributions to Federal candidates in their own names as well, rather than making contributions through conduits such as Peter Morton, Tarlton Morton, and Alan Mazursky. The fact that they made corporate contributions without using conduits in non-Federal elections, but made certain to use conduits in Federal elections belies their argument that they did not know the reimbursement scheme served an illegal purpose. It appears, therefore, that Respondents were knowingly and willfully trying to conceal the origin of the contributions.

Peter Morton admits that he reimbursed Tarlton Morton for contributions that were not in turn reimbursed by Hard Rock entities. While these reimbursements do not appear to violate 2 U.S.C. § 441b because no corporate funds were involved, they nevertheless appear to violate 2 U.S.C. § 441f.

Hard Rock does not raise the issue of excessive contributions to individual candidates and committees, and the chart submitted shows all of Peter Morton's contributions to be within the limits of 2 U.S.C. §§ 44la(a)(1)(A) and 44la(a)(1)(B). However, a review of the contributor index and documents submitted by Hard Rock indicates that Mr. Morton reimbursed Tarlton Morton for her contributions to Lynn Yeakel for Senate 1992 -- \$1,000 for the primary election and \$1,000 for the general election.

Mr. Morton also contributed \$1,000 in both the primary and general elections to that campaign. Thus, Mr. Morton's contributions through Ms. Morton, combined with his own contributions to the

yeakel campaign, appear to have exceeded the limits of

Furthermore, Mr. Morton made several contributions to the Democratic Senatorial Campaign Committee ("DSCC") both directly as well as through Ms. Morton. Mr. Morton contributed \$10,000 on July 22, 1992, \$1,000 on July 29, 1992, and \$10,000 on September 17, 1992 to the DSCC. However, the DSCC's 1992 October Monthly report shows that the DSCC refunded \$1,000 to Mr. Morton on September 30, 1992, within the sixty days by which an excessive contribution is required to be refunded to the contributor pursuant to 11 C.F.R. § 103.3(b)(3). Shortly after the DSCC had refunded \$1,000 to Mr. Morton because it was excessive, Mr. Morton reimbursed Tarlton Morton for an October 17, 1992 contribution of \$3,000 to the DSCC, so he actually contributed \$23,000 to the DSCC during the calendar year of 1992.

Mr. Morton had already contributed the maximum allowable by law to the Yeakel Committee and the DSCC in his own name. The fact that Mr. Morton contributed to these committees through a conduit, Ms. Morton, after he had reached his contribution limit suggests that they both were aware of the limits of Sections 441a(a)(1)(A) and (B), and that they intended to circumvent the limits. Peter and Tarlton Morton's violations appear to be knowing and willful because they appear to have engaged in reimbursements for the purpose of concealing contributions they knew to be excessive.

Therefore, this Office recommends that the Commission find

reason to believe that Hard Rock knowingly and willfully violated 2 U.S.C. §§ 441b(a) and 441f. This Office recommends that the Commission find reason to believe that Peter Morton, as a corporate officer, knowingly and willfully violated 441b(a), and as an individual, knowingly and willfully violated 2 U.S.C. §§ 441a(a)(1)(A), 441a(a)(1)(B), and 441f. This Office further recommends that the Commission find reason to believe that Alan Mazursky and Tarlton Morton knowingly and willfully violated 2 U.S.C. § 441f.

B. Annual Contribution Limit

No individual shall make contributions aggregating more than \$25,000 in any calendar year. Any contribution made to a candidate in a year other than the calendar year in which the election is held with respect to which such contribution is made, is considered to be made during the calendar year in which such election is held. 2 U.S.C. § 441a(a)(3).

Respondents acknowledge that FEC contributor records indicate that Peter Morton contributed \$30,800 to Federal candidates and other Federal political committees in 1992. This Office's review of the contributor index and Respondents' admissions reveals that Mr. Morton, in his own name and through Ms. Morton, contributed \$38,800 to Federal candidates and Federal political committees for 1992. However, the original source of

many of the contributions comprising the \$38,800 was Hard Rock, not Mr. Morton. Hard Rock admits to reimbursing \$16,500 (\$14,500 contributed in Peter Morton's name and \$2,000 contributed in Tarlton Morton's name), resulting in only \$22,300 (including contributions of \$5,000 made in Tarlton Morton's name) in contributions from Peter Morton as an individual. Therefore, while it appears that Mr. Morton violated the Act as analyzed above, it does not appear that he violated \$441a(a)(3). This Office recommends that the Commission find no reason to believe that Peter Morton violated 2 U.S.C. § 441a(a)(3).

On August 1, 1995, the Federal Election Commission ("the Commission") found that there is reason to believe your clients violated various provisions of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended ("the Act"). The Commission found reason to believe that Hard Rock Cafe, Inc., Hard Rock Cafe America, L. P., and Melrose Corporation knowingly and willfully violated 2 U.S.C. §§ 441b(a) and 441f. The Commission also found reason to believe that Peter Morton, as a corporate officer, knowingly and willfully violated 2 U.S.C. § 441b(a), and as an individual, knowingly and willfully violated 2 U.S.C. §§ 441a(a)(1)(A), 441a(a)(1)(B), and 441f, but found no reason to believe that he violated 2 U.S.C. § 441a(a)(3). In addition, the Commission found reason to believe that Tarlton Morton knowingly and willfully violated 2 U.S.C. § 441f. The Factual and Legal Analysis, which formed a basis for the Commission's findings, is attached for your information.

You may submit any factual or legal materials that you believe are relevant to the Commission's consideration of this matter. Please submit such materials to the General Counsel's Office within 15 days of your receipt of this letter. Where appropriate, statements should be submitted under oath. In the absence of additional information, the Commission may find probable cause to believe that a violation has occurred and proceed with conciliation.

In order to expedite the resolution of this matter, the Commission has also decided to offer to enter into negotiations directed towards reaching a conciliation agreement in sattlement of this matter prior to a finding of probable cause to believe. Enclosed is a conciliation agreement that the Commission has approved.

If you are interested in expediting the resolution of this matter by pursuing preprobable cause conciliation and if you agree with the provisions of the enclosed agreement, please sign and return the agreement, along with the civil penalty, to the Commission. In light of the fact that conciliation negotiations, prior to a finding of probable cause to believe, are limited to a maximum of 30 days, you should respond to this notification as soon as possible.

Requests for extensions of time will not be routinely granted. Requests must be made in writing at least five days prior to the due date of the response and specific good cause must be demonstrated. In addition, the Office of the General Counsel ordinarily will not give extensions beyond 20 days.

For your information, we have attached a brief description of the Commission's procedures for handling possible violations of the Act. If you have any questions, please contact Andrea Low, the attorney assigned to this matter, at (202) 219-3400.

This matter was generated by a sua sponte submission filed with the Federal Election Commission (the "Commission") by Hard Rock Cafe, Inc., Hard Rock Cafe America, L. P., Melrose Corporation, and Peter Morton. The Respondents in this matter are Hard Rock Cafe, Inc., Hard Rock Cafe America, L. P., Melrose Corporation (collectively referred to as "Hard Rock"), Peter Morton, and Tarlton Morton.

Section 441f of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended, (the "Act") provides that no person shall make a contribution in the name of another or knowingly parait his name to be used to effect such a contribution, and no person shall knowingly accept a contribution made by one person in the name of another person. 2 U.S.C. § 441f. Under the Act, it is unlawful for any corporation to make a contribution or expenditure in connection with a Federal election, or for any candidate, political committee, or other person knowingly to accept or receive any prohibited contribution, or for any corporate officer or director to consent to any such contribution or expenditure.

2 U.S.C. § 441b(a). No person shall make contributions to any candidate and his authorized political committees with respect to any election for Federal office which, in aggregate, exceed \$1,000. 2 U.S.C. § 441a(a)(1)(A). No person shall make

contributions to the political committees established and maintained by a national political party, which are not the authorized political committees of any candidate, in any calendar year which, in the aggregate, exceed \$20,000. 2 U.S.C. g 441a(a)(1)(B).

Respondents have submitted documentation that evidences contributions from corporate entities through Peter Morton, Alan Mazursky, and Tarlton Morton to Federal committees. From this documentation, it appears that sixteen Federal contributions made by Peter Morton, two contributions by Tarlton Morton, and one contribution by Alan Mazursky were reimbursed by Hard Rock during the period 1987 through 1994.

The sua sponte submission admits to the following corporate reimbursements from:

According to the FEC contributor index, Alan Mazursky has made only two political contributions during the time period, including the \$500 contribution admittedly reimbursed by Hard Rock

^{1.} The various Hard Rock entities involved in this matter are or were either corporations or limited partnerships with corporations as partners. Hard Rock Cafe America, L. P. is the successor of Hard Rock Cafe Investors Ltd. after a July 1992 reorganization. Mr. Morton is identified as President of Hard Rock Cafe, Inc. and Melrose Corporation. Hard Rock America, L. P. is identified as a limited partnership owned principally by Mr. Morton through a subchapter-S corporation.

Cafe, Inc. The contributor index reveals that Tarlton Morton made numerous contributions to Federal political committees, but our review of the record discloses that only her 1992 contributions to candidate Mel Levine were reimbursed by Peter Morton, who was in turn reimbursed by Hard Rock.

Respondents argue that they "were wholly unaware that their activities might be illegal," and impliedly claim that they believed that corporate contributions were legal in Federal elections, as they are in non-Federal elections in the state of California. Respondents' actions, however, are inconsistent with that claim. Records submitted show that when the Respondent corporate entities made contributions to City Council and other non-Federal election campaigns, they made the contributions in their own names. When using these same corporations' funds to make contributions in Federal elections, however, the contributions were always made in the names of individuals. If, as Respondents claim, they believed that corporate contributions in Federal elections were legal, they would have made corporate contributions to Federal candidates in their own names as well, rather than making contributions through conduits such as Peter Morton, Tarlton Morton, and Alan Mazursky. The fact that they made corporate contributions without using conduits in non-Federal elections, but made certain to use conduits in Federal elections belies their argument that they did not know the reimbursement scheme served an illegal purpose. It appears, therefore, that Respondents were knowingly and willfully trying to conceal the origin of the contributions.

Peter Morton admits that he reimbursed Tarlton Morton for contributions that were not in turn reimbursed by Hard Rock

entities. While these reimbursements do not appear to violate 2 U.S.C. \$ 441b because no corporate funds were involved, they nevertheless appear to violate 2 U.S.C. \$ 441f.

contributions to individual candidates and committees, and the chart submitted shows all of Peter Morton's contributions to be within the limits of 2 U.S.C. §§ 44la(a)(1)(A) and 44la(a)(1)(B). However, a review of the contributor index and documents submitted by Hard Rock indicates that Mr. Morton reimbursed Tarlton Morton for her contributions to Lynn Yeakel for Senate 1992 -- \$1,000 for the primary election and \$1,000 for the general election.

Mr. Morton also contributed \$1,000 in both the primary and general elections to that campaign. Thus, Mr. Morton's contributions through Ms. Morton, combined with his own contributions to the Yeakel campaign, appear to have exceeded the limits of Section 44la(a)(1)(A).

Furthermore, Mr. Morton made several contributions to the Democratic Senatorial Campaign Committee ("DSCC") both directly as well as through Ms. Morton. Mr. Morton contributed \$10,000 on July 22, 1992, \$1,000 on July 29, 1992, and \$10,000 on September 17, 1992 to the DSCC. However, the DSCC's 1992 October Monthly report shows that the DSCC refunded \$1,000 to Mr. Morton on September 30, 1992, within the sixty days by which an excessive contribution is required to be refunded to the contributor pursuant to 11 C.F.R. \$ 103.3(b)(3). Shortly after the DSCC had refunded \$1,000 to Mr. Morton because it was excessive, Mr. Morton reimbursed Tarlton Morton for an October 17, 1992 contribution of \$3,000 to the DSCC, so he actually contributed \$23,000 to the DSCC during the calendar year of 1992.

Hr. Morton had already contributed the maximum allowable by law to the Yeakel Committee and the DSCC in his own name. The fact that Mr. Morton contributed to these committees through a conduit, Ms. Morton, after he had reached his contribution limit suggests that they both were aware of the limits of Sections 441a(a)(1)(A) and (B), and that they intended to circumvent the limits. Peter and Tarlton Morton's violations appear to be knowing and willful because they appear to have engaged in reimbursements for the purpose of concealing contributions they knew to be excessive.

Therefore, there is reason to believe that Hard Rock Cafe, Inc., Hard Rock Cafe America, L. P., and Melrose Corporation knowingly and willfully violated 2 U.S.C. \$\$ 441b(a) and 441f. There is reason to believe that Peter Morton, as a corporate officer, knowingly and willfully violated 441b(a), and as an individual, knowingly and willfully violated 2 U.S.C. \$\$ 441a(a)(1)(A), 441a(a)(1)(B), and 441f. There is also reason to believe that Tarlton Morton knowingly and willfully violated 2 U.S.C. \$ 441f.

This matter was generated by a sua sponte submission filed with the Federal Election Commission (the "Commission") by Hard Rock Cafe, Inc., Hard Rock Cafe America, L. P., Melrose Corporation (collectively referred to as "Hard Rock"), and Peter Morton.

Under the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended (the "Act"), no person shall make a contribution in the name of another or knowingly permit his name to be used to effect such a contribution. 2 U.S.C. § 441f. Under the Act, it is unlawful for any corporation to make a contribution or expenditure in connection with a Federal election. 2 U.S.C. § 441b(a).

Hard Rock Cafe, Inc., a corporation, admits that on October 14, 1992, it reimbursed Alan Mazursky \$500 for a contribution to Karen Shepherd for Congress, which he made on October 15, 1992. The Hard Rock entities argue that they "were wholly unaware that their activities might be illegal," and impliedly claim that they believed that corporate contributions were legal in Federal elections, as they are in non-Federal elections in the state of California. Their actions, however, are inconsistent with that claim. Records submitted show that when the Respondent corporate entities made contributions to City Council and other non-Federal election campaigns, they made the contributions in

their own names. When using these same corporations' funds to make contributions in Federal elections, however, the contributions were always made in the names of individuals. If, as the Hard Rock entities claim, they believed that corporate contributions in Federal elections were legal, they would have made corporate contributions to Federal candidates in their own names as well, rather than making contributions through conduits such as Mr. Mazursky. The fact that they made corporate contributions without using conduits in non-Federal elections, but made certain to use conduits in Federal elections belies their argument that they did not know the reimbursement scheme served an illegal purpose.

In light of the above, it appears that Alan Mazursky knowingly and willfully permitted his name to be used to effect a contribution, the original source of which was Hard Rock Cafa, Inc., and to conceal that source. Therefore, there is reason to believe Alan Mazursky knowingly and willfully violated 2 U.S.C. \$ 441f.

GENERAL COUNSEL'S REPORT

This matter involves a pattern of reimbursements for contributions to federal candidates from 1987 to 1994. Based on a sua sponte submission by respondents, it appeared that contributions were made in the name of others to circumvent limitations on individual contributions and prohibitions on corporate contributions. On August 1, 1995, the Federal Election Commission ("Commission") found reason to believe that Hard Rock Cafe, Inc. Hard Rock Cafe America, L.P., and Melrose Corporation knowingly and willfully violated 2 U.S.C. §§ 441b(a) and 441f. On the same date, the Commission also found reason to believe that Peter Morton knowingly and willfully violated 2 U.S.C. § 441b(a) and as an individual, knowingly and willfully violated 2 U.S.C. § 441a(a)(1)(A), § 441a(a)(1)(B), and § 441f. Furthermore, the Commission found reason to believe that Tarlton Morton knowingly and willfully violated 2 U.S.C. § 441f. In an effort to resolve this matter expeditiously, the Commission did not approve further investigation, but approved pre-probable cause conciliation.

After the Commission made its reason to believe findings, this Office met with counsel for respondents and received a written response. See Attachment. Respondents strongly resist the knowing and willful findings and have indicated that they do not want to participate in pre-

probable cause conciliation, but prefer to proceed to the probable cause stage. After examination of the response, it seems unlikely that additional discovery would confirm the Commission's knowing and willful findings. Considering the circumstances of this matter, therefore, and to conserve enforcement resources, this Office intends to move to the probable cause stage not based on knowing and willful violations.

Therefore, this Office has terminated pre-probable cause conciliation negotiations and is moving to the next stage of the enforcement process with respect to MUR 4240.

Based on your sua sponte submission filed with the Federal Election Commission ("Commission"), the Commission, on August 1, 1995, found that there was reason to believe that Hard Rock Cafe, Inc., Hard Rock Cafe America, L.P., and Melrose Corporation knowingly and willfully violated 2 U.S.C. § \$441b(a) and 441f. On the same date, the Commission also found reason to believe that Peter Morton knowingly and willfully violated 2 U.S.C. § 441b(a) and as an individual, knowingly and willfully violated 2 U.S.C. § 441a(a)(1)(B), and § 441f, and that Tarlton Morton knowingly and willfully violated 2 U.S.C. § 441f.

GENERAL COUNSEL'S BRIEF

I. STATEMENT OF THE CASE

This matter was generated by a sua sponte submission filed with the Federal Election

Commission (the "Commission") by Hard Rock Cafe, Inc., Hard Rock Cafe America, L. P., Melrose

Corporation, and Peter Morton. According to the sua sponte submission, in December 1994, the

Nevada Gaming Control Board reviewed the finances of these corporate entities. As a result of that

review, Hard Rock Cafe, Inc., Hard Rock Cafe America, L. P., Melrose Corporation, Peter Morton,

and Tarlton Morton ("Respondents") became aware that over several years they violated certain

provisions of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended ("the Act"). Specifically,

Respondents noted that the Hard Rock entities reimbursed Peter Morton, his spouse Tarlton Morton,

and Chief Financial Officer Alan Mazursky for Federal political contributions, and that Peter Morton

may have exceeded Section 441a(a)(3)'s limit in 1992. The Commission found reason to believe that

the Respondents knowingly and willfully violated 2 U.S.C. §§ 441a(a)(1), 441b(a), and/or 441f, and

no reason to believe that Peter Morton violated 2 U.S.C. § 441a(a)(3).

II. ANALYSIS

Section 441f of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended, (the "Act") provides that no person shall make a contribution in the name of another or knowingly permit his or

The various Hard Rock entities involved in this matter are or were either corporations or limited partnerships with corporations as partners. Hard Rock Cafe America, L. P. is the successor of Hard Rock Cafe Investors Ltd. after a July 1992 reorganization. Mr. Morton is identified as President of Hard Rock Cafe, Inc. and Melrose Corporation. Hard Rock America, L. P. is identified as a limited partnership owned principally by Mr. Morton through a subchapter-S corporation.

Respondents have submitted documentation that evidences contributions from corporate entities through Peter Morton, Alan Mazursky, and Tarlton Morton to Federal political committees. This documentation shows sixteen Federal contributions made by Peter Morton, two contributions by Tarlton Morton, and one contribution by Alan Mazursky, totaling \$22,500, that were reimbursed by Hard Rock. The contributions Hard Rock made through these individuals are as follows:

The Commission's initial knowing and willful findings principally were based on a pattern of the Hard Rock entities making direct corporate contributions without using conduits in nonfederal elections (where corporate contributions were permissible), but using individual conduits in federal elections, suggesting Respondents intended for the reimbursement scheme to conceal corporate contributions prohibited in federal elections. Indeed, although Mr. Morton claims that he did not

know corporate contributions to federal candidates were illegal, he received some solicitations which specifically stated that corporate contributions are prohibited.²

Counsel's response included materials and explanations strenuously arguing that the violations were not intentional. Respondents note that 31% of nonfederal contributions and 35% of federal contributions were reimbursed by Hard Rock entities even though corporate contributions are permitted in California. Respondents note that they could have made all of their contributions in California from corporate sources, but only made approximately the same proportion as with federal contributions, thus cutting against the inference that respondents made contributions in the name of another only when they knew they had to do so in order to circumvent legal prohibitions. Although questions remain about the contribution patterns at issue, it is unlikely that further investigation would fully resolve these questions. Under all the circumstances of this matter, this Office is prepared to recommend findings of probable cause to believe no longer based on knowing and willful violations.

Therefore, this Office is prepared to recommend probable cause to believe that Hard Rock Cafe, Inc., Hard Rock Cafe America, L. P., and Melrose Corporation violated 2 U.S.C. §§ 441b(a) and 441f by making corporate contributions and making contributions in the name of another; that Peter Morton violated 2 U.S.C. § 441b(a) by consenting to the corporate contributions and 2 U.S.C. § 441f by allowing his name to be used for the making of the contributions; and that Tarlton Morton violated 2 U.S.C. § 441f by allowing her name to be used.

Am additional issue raised in this matter involves Peter Morton's explanation that he reimbursed Tarlton Morton for contributions that were not in turn reimbursed by Hard Rock entities.

The following two contributions were made by Tarlton Morton and reimbursed personally by Peter Morton:

In response to the Commission's reason to believe findings, Respondents argue that the Commission's regulation at 11 C.F.R. § 110.1(i)(1) permits each spouse to contribute even if only one spouse has income, that Peter Morton is the only significant source of income, that Peter Morton's practice of regular payments to Tarlton Morton's account, including specific amounts to fund the campaign contributions, falls within this regulation, and that Tarlton Morton controlled the contributions made in her name.

This Office agrees that the regulation permits a non-income earning spouse to contribute. In light of the particular arrangement here, where there was a regular practice of spousal support and household payments and it appears Peter Morton funded all of Tarlton Morton's spending, where she personally signed the two contribution checks at issue drawn on her separate account, and counsel represents that she controlled these contributions, this Office does not intend to pursue the findings corresponding to these contributions with respect to Peter Morton or Tarlton Morton.³

This Office recognizes, however, that under certain circumstances the section 441a contribution limitation as well as the section 441f prohibition might apply to one spouse using the name of the other, where, for example, there is no regular practice of payments to the other spouse's separate account or where there is no donative intent by the other spouse.

III. GENERAL COUNSEL'S RECOMMENDATIONS

- 1. Find probable cause to believe that Hard Rock Cafe, Inc., Hard Rock Cafe America, L. P., and Melrose Corporation violated 2 U.S.C. §§ 441b(a) and 441f.
- 2. Find probable cause to believe Peter Morton violated 2 U.S.C. §§ 441b(a) and 441f.
- 3. Find probable cause to believe that Tarlton Morton violated 2 U.S.C. § 441f.

Washington, D.C. 20463 Re: MUR 4240 (Respondents' Brief) To the Commission: This letter will serve as the Respondents' Brief to the Commission in this matter pursuant to 11 C.F.R. § 111.16(c) and on behalf of our clients, Hard Rock Cafe, Inc., Hard Rock Cafe America, L.P., the Melrose Corporation, Peter Morton, and Tarlton Morton. Summary of Facts

Mr. Peter Morton is the President, Chairman, and principal owner of Hard Rock Cafe America, L.P. For a number of years, Mr. Morton was subject to regular solicitations for political contributions, and he responded to many of those solicitations. In late 1994, Mr. Morton was informed that certain of his political contributions may have violated unspecified campaign finance laws. At that time, he authorized this office to conduct a thorough investigation of all his political contributions to assess any possible violations by Hard Rock Cafe and affiliated entities and individuals. He instructed us to disclose to appropriate governmental agencies all contributions that could conceivably implicate federal, state or local campaign finance laws, including contributions that we did not consider illegal.

Pursuant to these instructions, this office made an extensive submission to the Commission on January 5, 1995. In that submission, we explained that various Hard Rock Cafe entities reimbursed a small number of political contributions by Hard Rock Cafe officers and employees, and that those reimbursements may have violated FECA. We emphasized, however, that those involved had no knowledge that the reimbursements might be illegal.

Soon thereafter, we made similar submissions to the California Fair Political Practices Commission and the Los Angeles Ethics Commission. In addition, we disclosed one

potentially improper contribution to the Illinois State Board of Elections and the Board of Ethics of the City of Chicago. By May 1995, all of the other agencies had investigated and settled these potential violations without any findings that any violations were intentional. Both the Illinois State Board of Elections and the Board of Ethics of the City of Chicago dismissed their investigations without taking any action against our clients.

In August 1995, however, the Commission found reason to believe that our clients "knowingly and willfully" violated FECA. In hopes of settling this matter without such a finding, we conferred with representatives of the General Counsel's office, and made another submission on September 12, 1995, explaining the evidence that the violations were not intentional. We brought to the General Counsel's attention (1) the fact that the Hard Rock Cafe officials involved have strenuously denied ever being aware that their contributions might be illegal; (2) the fact that Hard Rock Cafe would have had no reason to use reimbursements to save personal funds or to circumvent contribution limits; (3) the fact that company records made no attempt to hide these contributions; and (4) the fact of the similar pattern in Hard Rock Cafe's California (where corporate contributions are permitted) and federal contributions.

In addition, our September 12 submission addressed the Commission's finding of "reason to believe" that Tarlton Morton, Peter Morton's wife, violated FECA. The submission pointed out that, under Commission regulations, a spouse without independent income may make campaign contributions. Because Tarlton Morton controlled all of the contributions at issue, the submission noted that regular payments from Peter to Tarlton in connection with those contributions were not violative of FECA.

The General Counsel's Brief appears to have accepted these arguments and decided (1) not to recommend finding "knowing and willful" violations of FECA; and (2) to recognize that reimbursements from Peter to Tarlton Morton did not violate FECA. However, the General Counsel's Brief asserts that Tarlton violated FECA by "allowing her name to be used" in connection with two corporate contributions.

Copies of the final settlement agreements with the California Fair Political Practices Commission and the Los Angeles Ethics Commission are attached as Exhibits A & B.

As explained below, we believe the General Counsel's recommendation concerning Tarlton Morton to be insupportable and erroneous. In addition, we urge the Commission to take no further action in this matter beyond the finding of probable cause.

Argument

1. The Commission Should Not Find That Tarlton Morton Violated the Act

Though recognizing that spouses are fully capable of making political contributions in their own name regardless of whether they have an independent source of income, the General Counsel's Brief charges Tarlton Morton with violating § 441f. However, there is no basis for this proposition.

Apparently still at issue for Tarlton Morton are two \$1,000 contributions (one for the primary election and one for the general election) to Mel Levine's 1992 campaign for the United States Senate. These contributions were made on April 26, 1991, in the form of a check to "Mel Levine for Senate." On April 29, 1991, Peter Morton obtained reimbursements for these contributions from four different Hard Rock Cafe entitles.

While Peter Morton and Hard Rock Cafe have acknowledged that these reimbursements may violate §§ 441b(a) and 441f, Tarlton Morton had nothing to do with these reimbursements and never received any money from them. In fact, she has stated under oath that she was entirely unaware that the reimbursements ever took place. If Tarlton Morton did not know of the reimbursements, she certainly did not "allow[] her name to be used in connection with corporate contributions. Therefore, she did not violate § 441f.

When Mel Levine lost in the 1992 Senate primary, both Peter and Tarlton Morton redesignated their earlier contributions to his general election campaign to his 1994 Campaign Committee. Copies of Mr. Morton's check to the Levine campaign, stubs from four reimbursement checks from Hard Rock Cafe restaurants and the Melrose Corp., Mr. Morton's bank deposit slip for those reimbursements, and the Levine redesignation letter (all of which were included with our January 5, 1995, submission) are enclosed as Exhibit C.

A copy of a sworn affidavit from Ms. Morton on this issue is enclosed as Exhibit D. The original of that affidavit will be forwarded to the Commission as soon as it is received by this office.

2. Because the Violations at Issue Were Unintentional and Because of the Respondents' Extensive Disclosures, the Commission Should Take No Further Action in this Matter

Based upon the Respondents' forthright and comprehensive disclosures to the Commission, we request that the Commission take no action against them beyond the finding of probable cause against Hard Rock Cafe America, L.P., Hard Rock Cafe Inc., the Melrose Corporation, and Mr. Morton. Until learning of these potential violations, the Respondents were largely unaware of the intricacies of campaign finance regulations. These contributions were not subject to prior review by counsel, though Hard Rock Cafe has now instituted internal procedures to ensure that no such violations occur in the future.

In addition, the Commission should recognize that Hard Rock Cafe brought this matter to the attention of the Commission, made a full disclosure of all potentially relevant contributions, and has cooperated fully with the Commission's investigation. While the issue was first raised to Hard Rock Cafe because officials of the Nevada Gaming Commission quite accidentally discovered a small number of reimbursed contributions and suggested that Hard Rock Cafe take further action to remedy the problem, the Respondents certainly were not compelled to make such comprehensive disclosures to the Commission. As is clear from the history of this matter, Mr. Morton and Hard Rock Cafe disclosed to the Commission many contributions and reimbursements that they did not consider to be illegal, but that potentially could expose them to liability. To impose any significant penalties upon the Respondents in this case would not recognize the company's good faith reaction to learning of its violations, and would send a message that coming clean with the Commission will not be appropriately recognized. Therefore, we urge the Commission to consider not seeking any civil penalty under the distinct circumstances of this matter.

EXHIBIT I

INTRODUCTION

Hard Rock Cafe America (Los Angeles), L.P., is the operating partnership for the Los Angeles Hard Rock Cafe restaurant. It became the successor to Hard Rock Cafe Investors, Ltd., after a July 1992 corporate reorganization. Collectively they will be referred to as "Hard Rock Cafe." At all times relevant to this case, Peter Morton was the president of Hard Rock Cafe and the Melrose Corporation.

Hard Rock Cafe reimbursed Peter Morton for contributions that he made to candidates for state and local office. The Melrose Corporation reimbursed Peter Morton, and his wife, Tarlton Morton, for contributions that they made to candidates for state and local office.

The foregoing chain of activity is commonly referred to as "laundering." It undermines the campaign disclosure provisions of the Political Reform Act ("Act") 1/ by depriving the electorate of essential information regarding who is supporting or opposing a particular candidate or measure.

COUNTS 1 - 6: Hard Rock Cafe violated Government Code Sections 84300(c) and 84301 with regard to six contributions.

RESPONDENT: Hard Rock Cafe

COUNTS 7 - 8: The Melrose Corporation violated Government Code Sections 84300(c) and 84301 with regard to two contributions.

RESPONDENT: Melrose Corporation

SUMMARY OF THE LAW

The purpose of campaign reporting under the Act is that "receipts and expenditures in election campaigns should be fully and truthfully disclosed in order that the voters may be fully informed and improper practices may be inhibited." (Section 81002(a).) Timely and truthful disclosure of the source of campaign contributions is an essential part of the Act's mandate.

In order to obtain disclosure of the true source of campaign contributions, Section 84301 prohibits contributions made, directly or indirectly, by any person in a name other than that by which the contributor is identified for legal purposes. Section

The Political Reform Act is contained in Government Code Sections 81000 to 91015. All statutory references are to the Government Code unless otherwise indicated.

84300(c) prohibits contributions of \$100 or more unless they are made by way of a written instrument containing the names of both the donor and the payee.

Count 5 Contribution to Tom Hayden's 1992 State Senate Campaign

On March 23, 1992, Peter Morton wrote a \$1,000 contribution check to Tom Hayden's 1992 State Senate Campaign.

Hard Rock Cafe admitted to reimbursing Mr. Morton for his contribution and not disclosing to the committee that it was the true source of the contribution.

Count 6
Contribution to "Bob Tannenbaum for District Attorney"

On May 7, 1992, Peter Morton wrote a \$2,500 contribution check to "Bob Tannenbaum for District Attorney."

Hard Rock Cafe admitted to reimbursing Mr. Morton for his contribution and not disclosing to the committee that it was the true source of the contribution.

COUNTS 7 - 8:

The Melrose Corporation violated Government Code Sections 84300(c) and 84301 with regard to two contributions.

Count 7

Contribution to Cathy O'Neill's State Senate Campaign

On April 10, 1992, Peter Morton wrote a \$250 contribution check to Cathy O'Neill's State Senate Campaign.

The Melrose Corporation admitted to reimbursing Mr. Morton for his contribution and not disclosing to the committee that it was the true source of the contribution.

Count 8
Contribution to "Mike Woo for Mayor"

On September 25, 1992, Tarlton Morton wrote a \$1,000 contribution check to "Mike Woo for Mayor."

The Melrose Corporation admitted to reimbursing Ms. Morton for her contribution and not disclosing to the committee that it was the true source of the contribution.

FACTORS IN AGGRAVATION

The laundering of campaign contributions is one of the most serious violations of the Political Reform Act.

FACTORS IN MITIGATION

Respondents have no enforcement history.

Respondents disclosed these violations to the Commission after certain reimbursed contributions were identified by staff of the Nevada Gaming Control Board. Respondents identified to the Commission all of the contributions at issue in this Stipulation and offered to bring themselves into full compliance with law. Since that time, respondents have fully cooperated with the investigation and provided all requested documents.

Campaign contribution limit laws did not apply or limit seven of the eight contributions.

CONCLUSION

This matter consists of eight counts against respondents Hard Rock Cafe and the Melrose Corporation. The failure of respondents to comply with the requirements of the Political Reform Act justifies imposition of the agreed upon penalty of \$13,600.

The complainant, Ben Bycel, Executive Director of the Los Angeles City Ethics Commission ("City Ethics Commission") and Respondents, Hard Rock Cafe America, L.P.; Hard Rock Cafe America (Los Angeles) L.P.; The Melrose Corporation; and Peter Morton ("Respondents") hereby agree that this Stipulation will be submitted for consideration by the City Ethics Commission at its meeting on April 19, 1995, and that the agreements herein are contingent upon the approval of this Stipulation and the accompanying Decision and Order by the City Ethics Commission.

INTRODUCTION

This case concerns political money laundering by Respondents Hard Rock Cafe America, L.P.; Hard Rock Cafe America (Los Angeles) L.P.; The Melrose Corporation; and Peter Morton ("Respondents"). 1.2 Respondents concealed the true source of illegal contributions made to Los Angeles City Councilmembers, candidates for City elective office, officeholder and controlled committees during the period August 1987 through October 1992. The statute of limitations has run on the six contributions made by Respondents in 1987, 1988 and 1989 in violation of Los Angeles City Charter ("City Charter") sections 312 L, 312 C 5 and 312 C 8. Therefore, only the two remaining contributions, made in 1991 and 1992, and a third violation of the City Charter section 312 C 8 aggregate contribution limit are included as counts herein. For details of the 1987, 1988 and 1989 violations, see Exhibit 3.

During June 1991 through October 1992, individuals associated with Hard Rock Cafe America L.P.; Hard Rock Cafe America (Los Angeles) L.P.; and The Melrose Corporation made what appeared to be two individual contributions to the "Mike Woo for Mayor" committee and to the "Mike Woo's Officeholder Account" committee. The Councilman's campaign committee and officeholder committee recorded them in their campaign matements as contributions from the individuals. The Melrose Corporation and Hard Rock Cafe Investors, Ltd., however, each reimbursed the individuals for one of the contributions. The public was deprived of the knowledge of the true source of the contributions, and Hard Rock Cafe Investors

The Respondents in this action, Hard Rock Cafe America, L.P.; Hard Rock Cafe America (Lor Angeler) L.P.; The Metrose Corporation and Peter Morton, will usually be referred to hereig collectively as "Respondents." Where necessary, however, a respondent will be referred to individually. Hard Rock Cafe Investors, Ltd., which became Hard Rock Cafe America (Los Angeles), L.P. after a July 1992 corporate reorganization, will be referred to specifically by name throughout.

The term "political money laundering" typically describes conduct of reimbursing another for making a contribution without disclosure to the public of the true source's identity.

Ltd. and The Melrose Corporation, by contributing monies indirectly through two individuals associated with the corporate entities, circumvented the City Charter contribution limitations.

Respondents' own documents show reimbursements to the individual contributors for the contributions they made to the Mike Woo committees, as well as for contributions to the other candidates that are now outside the statute of limitations. Respondents brought this matter to the attention of the City Ethics Commission after the illegal contributions were identified by the staff of the Nevada Garning Control Board.

Respondents admit they violated the City Charter as follows:

COUNTS 1 AND 2 Making 2 contributions in violation of City Charter section 312 L.

COUNT 3 Making 5 contributions in violation of City Charter section 312 C 8.

II.

SUMMARY OF THE LAW

City Charter section 312 L provides that a contribution shall not be made, directly or indirectly, by any person or combination of persons, acting jointly in a name other than the name by which they are identified for legal purposes, nor in the name of another person or combination of persons.

City Charter section 312 C 8 provides that no person shall make a contribution in a single election that would cause the aggregate amount of contributions by that person to exceed a sum equal to \$500 multiplied by the number of City Council offices appearing on the ballot at that election, plus \$1,000 multiplied by the number of city-wide offices appearing on the ballot at that election. The aggregate limit for the April 1993 Primary Election, based on the above formula, was \$7,000.

III.

SUMMARY OF THE EVIDENCE

COUNTS 1 AND 2

VIOLATIONS OF SECTION 312 L

Respondents violated City Charter section 312 L with regard to two indirect contributions, without disclosing the true source of the contributions. The indirect contributions are detailed below:

COUNT 1

Contribution to "Mike Woo for Mayor" Committee

The "Mike Woo for Mayor" committee received a \$1,000 contribution from the Melrose Corporation on October 5, 1992. This check, number 9600, dated September 11, 1992, was reflected on the Melrose Corporation accounts as of August 23, 1993. Another \$1,000 contribution was received by the "Mike Woo for Mayor" committee on October 25, 1992 from Tarlton Morton, by personal check number 2302, dated September 25, 1992. The Committee's campaign statement for the period January 1, 1992 through December 31, 1992 listed Tarlton Morton as the contributor.

However, Tariton Morton was reimbursed \$1,000 by check number 9611, dated September 25, 1992, by The Melrose Corporation, an entity owned in part by Peter Morton.

The Melrose Corporation was the true source of both the \$1,000 contributions.

COUNT 2

Contribution to Councilman Mike Woo's Officeholder Committee

Councilman Mike Woo's Officeholder committee received one \$5,000 contribution on June 22, 1991, made payable to "Councilman Mike Woo's Officeholder Account," from Peter Morton, by personal check number 4387, dated June 20, 1991. The Committee's campaign

However, Peter Morton was reimbursed \$5,000 by check number 3544, dated the same date, June 20, 1991, by Hard Rock Cafe Investors, Ltd..

Hard Rock Cafe Investors, Ltd. was the true source of the \$5,000 contribution.

COUNT 3

VIOLATION OF CITY CHARTER SECTION 312 C 8

Respondents violated City Charter section 312 C 8 by contributing monies in excess of the \$7,000 aggregate contribution limit in the April 1993 Primary Election.

Respondents made five contributions to candidates in the 1993 Primary Election totaling \$9,250.

On September 11, 1992, by check number 9600, The Melrose Corporation contributed \$1,000 to "Mike Woo for Mayor." (See Count 1, above.)

On September 25, 1992, by check number 2302, Tarlton Morton contributed \$1,000 to "Mike Woo for Mayor." As detailed in Count 1 above, Tarlton Morton was reimbursed \$1,000 by The Melrose Corporation on September 25, 1992.

On October 16, 1992, by check number 1158, Hard Rock Cafe America (Los Angeles)

L.P. contributed \$1,000 to "Nate Holden for Mayor."

On March 5, 1993, by check number 5972, Peter Morton contributed \$6,000 to "Mike Woo for Mayor."

On March 15, 1993, by check number 1466, Hard Rock Cafe America (Los Angeles)

L.P. contributed \$250 to "Daniel Pritikin for City Council."

Respondents exceeded the City Charter section 312 C 8 aggregate limit for the 1993

Primary Election, which was \$7,000, by \$2,250, in violation of this section.

FACTORS IN AGGRAVATION

IV.

The laundering of campaign contributions is one of the most serious violations of the campaign finance provisions of the Los Angeles City Charter. Laundering manifests an intent to conceal from the public the true source of political contributions, and it allows for the circumvention of the campaign contribution limitations enacted by the voters of the City of Los Angeles. However, the Respondents do not admit that their violations of the campaign finance provisions of the Los Angeles City Charter were intentional.

The repeated nature of the violations by Respondents over a five year period displays a pattern of laundering activity rather than an isolated incident.³

V.

FACTORS IN MITIGATION

Respondents have no prior enforcement history.

Respondents, by letter from their attorney dated January 27, 1995, revealed their laundering activities to the City Ethics Commission and offered to cooperate fully in order to bring themselves into full compliance with Los Angeles law. They did so at the request of the staff of the Nevada Gaming Control Board. Respondents identified six Charter violations now outside the statute of limitations. In the course of the City Ethics Commission's ensuing investigation, Respondents furnished all documents and information necessary to promptly and completely resolve this matter.

CONCLUSION

This matter consists of three counts against Respondents. The total fine Respondents will pay in connection with this case is \$12,000. The failure of Respondents to comply with the limitations of the campaign finance provisions of the Los Angeles City Charter justifies the imposition of the agreed upon penalty.

GENERAL COUNSEL'S REPORT

I. BACKGROUND

Acting on a sua sponte submission, on August 1, 1995, the Commission found that there was reason to believe that Hard Rock Cafe, Inc., Hard Rock Cafe America, L.P., and Melrose Corporation ("Hard Rock entities") knowingly and willfully violated 2 U.S.C. §§ 441b(a) and 441f. On the same date, the Commission found reason to believe that Peter Morton, as a corporate officer, knowingly and willfully violated 2 U.S.C. § 441b(a) and, as an individual, knowingly and willfully violated 2 U.S.C. §§ 441a(a)(1)(A), 441a(a)(1)(B), and 441f. The Commission also found reason to believe that Peter Morton's spouse, Tarlton Morton, knowingly and willfully violated 2 U.S.C. § 441f.

Respondents were provided with the General Counsel's Brief on May 13, 1996, which is incorporated herein by reference. See General Counsel's Brief, dated May 9, 1996 ("GC Brief"). The GC Brief does not recommend that the Commission find probable cause to believe that any of the violations were knowing and willful, for reasons set forth therein. GC Brief at 3-4. Also for the reasons set forth in the GC Brief, this Office does not recommend pursuing Peter Morton with respect to the Section 441a findings. Id. at 4-5. However, the GC Brief recommends that the Commission find probable cause to believe that the Hard Rock entities and Peter Morton

violated 2 U.S.C. §§ 441b(a) and 441f. The GC Brief also recommends that the Commission find probable cause to believe Tarlton Morton violated 2 U.S.C. § 441f. Respondents submitted their Reply Brief on June 17, 1996. See Attachment 1.

II. ANALYSIS OF REPLY BRIEF

In their Reply Brief, respondents first request that the Commission not pursue Tariton

Morton with respect to the Section 441f violation which relates to \$2,000 in contributions given
to Mel Levine's 1992 Senate campaign. In support of this request, respondents have presented a
signed statement from Mrs. Morton asserting that she "maintained ultimate control over all
political contributions made in [her] name" and that she "had no knowledge" that the
corporations had reimbursed her husband, who in turn reimbursed her for these contributions.

Attachment 1 at 33. In the GC Brief this Office concludes that Peter Morton appears to have
provided regular financial support to Tarlton Morton. See GC Brief at 4-5. In light of that
conclusion and Mrs. Morton's signed statement claiming to have no knowledge regarding the
corporate source of the reimbursements, and given the unlikelihood of confirming these
assertions without further discovery, this Office recommends that the Commission take no
further action against Tarlton Morton with respect to the Section 441f finding and close the file
with respect to her.

The Reply Brief additionally requests that the Commission take no further action beyond the probable cause findings and seek no civil penalty against the Hard Rock entities or Peter Morton. In support of this request, respondents contend that: (1) they brought this matter to the Commission's attention; (2) they made "extensive disclosures" of "all potentially relevant contributions, and cooperated fully with the Commission's investigation;" (3) they "were largely

unaware of the intricacies of campaign finance regulations" and the violations were unintentional; and (4) the Commission should recognize "the company's good faith reaction to learning of its violations."

This matter involves serious violations, arising out of a pattern of making sizable corporate reimbursements over a number of years. In addition, as stated in the GC Brief, Mr. Morton's claim that he did not know corporate contributions to federal candidates were illegal is undermined by evidence that he received solicitations which specifically stated that corporate contributions are prohibited. GC Brief at 3-4. Although the factors set forth in the Reply Brief may be mitigating, they provide an insufficient basis to warrant no further action beyond probable cause findings. Accordingly, this Office recommends that the Commission find probable cause to believe that Peter Morton, Hard Rock Cafe, Inc., Hard Rock Cafe America, L.P., and Melrose Corporation each violated 2 U.S.C. §§ 441b(a) and 441f, and approve the attached proposed conciliation agreement which contains admissions of the violations and provides for a civil penalty. Attachment 2.

III. DISCUSSION OF CONCILIATION AND CIVIL PENALTY

IV. RECOMMENDATIONS

- 1. Find probable cause to believe that Hard Rock Cafe, Inc., Hard Rock Cafe America, L. P., and Melrose Corporation violated 2 U.S.C. §§ 441b(a) and 441f.
- 2. Find probable cause to believe that Peter Morton violated 2 U.S.C. §§ 441b(a) and 441f.
 - 3. Take no further action against Tarlton Morton and close the file as it pertains to her.
 - 4. Approve the attached conciliation agreement and appropriate letter.

On July 30, 1996, the Federal Election Commission found that there is probable cause to believe your clients violated various provisions of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended, ("the Act"). The Commission found probable cause to believe that Hard Rock Cafe, Inc., Hard Rock Cafe America, L.P., and Melrose Corporation violated 2 U.S.C. §§ 441b(a) and 441f. The Commission also found probable cause to believe that Peter Morton violated 2 U.S.C. § 441b(a) and 441f. In addition, the Commission decided to take no further action against Tarlton Morton and to close the file as it pertains to her.

The Commission has a duty to attempt to correct such violations for a period of 30 to 90 days by informal methods of conference, conciliation, and persuasion, and by entering into a conciliation agreement with a respondent. 

This letter responds to the correspondence received from the Commission regarding my involvement in the above referenced matter, including the August 7, 1995 letter from Vice Chairman Lee Ann Elliott and the Factual and Legal Analysis enclosed with that letter. While I appreciate the Commission's decision to take no action against me, I feel compelled to make two points concerning the Commission's position. The passage of time is in no way an indication of the profound conviction with which these points are made.

First, my understanding is that the Commission's finding of a "reason to believe" that I have violated 2 U.S.C. §44f is a preliminary finding and a statutory prerequisite to an investigation as to whether there is probable cause to believe a violation occurred. It is not, as I understand it, a legal or factual adjudication of a violation. Indeed, the Commission's action was taken without allowing me the opportunity to present any evidence concerning my side of the story.

Second, had the Commission undertaken a review of the circumstances of my single \$500 contribution to Karen Shepherd's 1992 campaign for Congress, I am confident that you would have seen that I did not "knowingly and willfully" violate the law in making this contribution. While my contribution was reimbursed by Hard Rock Cafe, I was unaware at the time that such a reimbursement was improper. As the Chief Financial Officer for Hard Rock Cafe, I have had very little involvement in the world of political contributions beyond

this case, and the contribution and reimbursement were not subject to prior review by counsel. Unfortunately, I viewed the contribution to the Shepherd campaign as a business expense at the time and treated it as such because it was solicited from me in my capacity as a Hard Rock Cafe official.
