21	II. <u>BACKGROUND</u>		
22	This matter involves over \$3	million in illegal contributions, most of which originated	
23	with foreign national sources and was funneled through domestic conduits, and most of		
24	which was accepted by the Democratic National Committee ("DNC"). See 2 U.S.C.		
25	§§ 441e(a) and 441f; General Counsel's Briefs to the DNC dated October 12, 2000 and		
26	January 22, 2001.		
27	This Office previously advise	d the Commission of the respondents in this matter for	
28	whom we ultimately intended to recommend no further action, in many cases because they		
29	are individuals that are out of the country and beyond our reach or corporations that are		
30	defunct. See the General Counsel's F	Report dated May 8, 2000, page 6 and chart at	

1 this matter is proceeding toward completion, this Office now brings forth those

2 recommendations.

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III. ANALYSIS

- The respondents recommended for no further action and closing are listed on the chart
- 5 at pages 3-4, grouped together by contribution fact pattern. The chart sets out respondents'
- 6 reason to believe findings, 3 a short summary of their activity, sources of more detailed
- 7 information, i.e., General Counsel's Reports and Briefs, and the rationale for the no further
- 8 action recommendations.⁴

So far in this matter and the related MURs 4531, 4547, 4642 and 4909, the Commission has entered into thirteen conciliation agreements including with major respondents John Huang, Yah Lin "Charlie" Trie, Chien Chuen "Johnny" Chung, and the Hsi Lai Buddhist Temple.

The Commission made these reason to believe findings on June 17, 1997 and June 2, 1998. See the First General Counsel's Report dated May 30, 1997 and the General Counsel's Report dated May 4, 1998.

An additional overall rationale for the no further action recommendations is the statute of limitations. More than five years has passed since most of the activity by these respondents. Although there is an issue whether the statute of limitations is tolled while individuals are out of the U.S., in any event this Office does not recommend further pursuit of these respondents, in view of the difficulty of locating and serving them overseas and the desire to close the entire matter involving 1996 cycle activity in a reasonable time frame.
