STATEMENT OF REASONS	
On January 9, 2001, by a vote of 5-0 ¹ , the Commission rejected the Office of General Counsel's recommendation to find probable cause to believe that Yah Lin "Charlie" Trie ("Trie") violated 2 U.S.C. 441e(a) with respect to a \$325,000 contribution solicited from a permanent resident, Yogesh Gandhi ("Gandhi") and made by a foreign national, Yoshio Tanaka ("Tanaka").	
The Commission concluded that Trie's solicitation was directed to Gandhi, a permanent resident, who could lawfully contribute. There was insufficient evidence that Trie knew or had reason to know that the true source of the funds would not be Gandhi, but another person, Tanaka, who was a foreign national. Therefore, we could not conclude that Trie had directed his solicitation to a foreign national.
