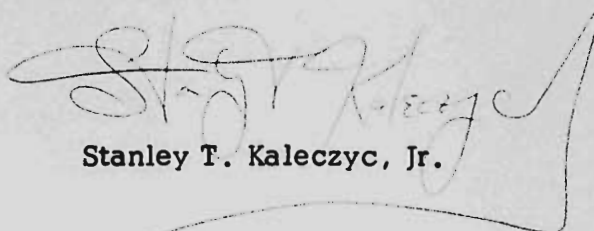

This Directory has been compiled by the Chamber of Commerce of the United States in response to numerous inquiries from its members who desire to know which companies, trade associations, and other business-oriented groups have availed themselves of the opportunity to form political committees, as provided by 18 U.S.C. §§610 and 611. This Directory is made available to you for that purpose and that purpose alone: to wit, to apprise you of the activities of other business persons in establishing and registering with the Federal Election Commission separate, segregated funds which receive voluntary contributions to be used for political purposes.

Please note that 2 U.S.C. §438(a)(4) states that "any information copied from . . . reports and statements (filed with the Federal Election Commission and available for public inspection) shall not be sold or utilized by any person for the purpose of soliciting contributions or for any commercial purpose."

Accordingly, Federal law prohibits the use of this Directory, inter alia, as a source list of potential contributors to political campaigns or as a list of potential customers or business prospects.

Violations of Title 2 of the Federal Election Campaign Act, as amended, shall be punishable by a fine of not more than \$1000 or imprisonment of not more than one (1) year, or both.

ALLEGATION:

The Chamber of Commerce of the United States of America sold information copied from reports and statements filed with the Federal Election Commission in violation of 2 U.S.C. 438(a)(4).

REPORT:

After being notified of the allegation, the Assistant General Counsel of the Chamber of Commerce met with Commission Staff (See attached memorandum and letter from the Chamber of Commerce).

RECOMMENDATION:

Although the Chamber of Commerce has not conceded an apparent violation with regard to sale of these publications, they have agreed to no longer sell or offer for sale the publications. Having achieved voluntary compliance, it is moved that the case be closed.

This is to confirm our meeting yesterday in your office and to reiterate the discussion and the understandings reached.

As you know, this meeting took place in response to an invitation from Mr. Gordon McKay, Assistant Staff Director for Disclosure and Compliance, directed to John A. Kochevar, Director of the Public Affairs Department of the Chamber of Commerce, in a letter dated October 22.

This letter made reference to the following publications of the National Chamber: a "National Directory of Business Political Action Committees of Associations" and a "National Directory of Business Political Action Committees of Individual Companies." Reference was also made to 2 U.S.C. §438(a)(4) (1975) which contains the proviso that information contained in the official records of the Federal Election Commission shall not be "sold or utilized...for the purpose of soliciting contributions or for any commercial purpose."

The concluding paragraph of the letter stated: "Therefore, the Commission invites your organization to submit any information which would clarify, explain, or correct the matter referred to above."

As we discussed, the aforementioned publications have not in the past nor are presently being distributed by the National Chamber for the "purpose of soliciting contributions." In fact, the Board Rules and Administrative Policies of the National Chamber specifically prohibit any involvement of the Chamber in partisan political activities.

The lists contained in these publications were compiled in response to numerous inquiries from our member companies who desired to know which other incorporated organizations had established separate, segregated funds as authorized by 18 U.S.C. §610. These inquiries, in turn, were prompted by the renewed interest in the establishment of such separate, segregated funds generated as a result of the 1974 amendment which clarified 18 U.S.C. §611. Our publications, therefore, are intended solely as a means of advising corporate and association executives concerning which other organizations have availed themselves of §610. These publications are not intended for use in conjunction with partisan political solicitations.

Furthermore, it is our view that publication of these lists has not been for a "commercial purpose." In this regard, "commercial" normally connotes an activity undertaken for purposes of making a profit. Where there is no intent to use the list as part of a profit-making venture, it is our view that no "commercial purpose" can be said to exist. In light of the foregoing statements concerning the purpose for the compilation of the lists and their intended use, no "commercial purpose" did exist or presently does exist in relation to these publications.

In this regard, it should also be noted, as I indicated yesterday, that our accountant has advised me that no profit has been made in conjunction with the distribution of these lists and, in fact, we are absorbing a loss in this endeavor.

(For the record, I would also like to state that in our view 2 U.S.C. §438(a)(4) does not prohibit sale of information from the public records per se, as you had suggested, but sale for purposes of making a solicitation or for commercial purposes. Otherwise, it would be impossible for private organizations like the Chamber to recover the cost of compiling and distributing such information, which is already part of the public record, as a service to its members.)

Notwithstanding this last observation, and in conformity with the agreement reached yesterday, please be advised that the Chamber shall, with respect to the subject publications, take the following action:

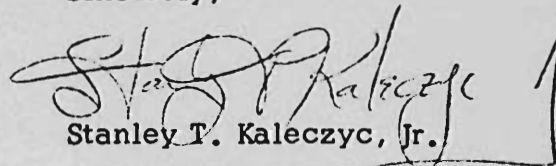
- (1) Delete any price from the publications;
- (2) No longer sell or offer for sale the publications either alone or in conjunction with other materials;
- (3) Make a specific reference to 2 U.S.C. §438(a)(4) and the prohibitions contained therein;
- (4) State in the publications that they are being distributed at no charge;
- (5) By separate cover memorandum or as part of the publications, briefly reiterate the proscriptions contained in §438(a)(4).

As I indicated yesterday, the Chamber has already implemented items 1, 2 and 3 above, and will, as soon as practicable, implement items 4 and 5. As soon as it is available, I will send a copy of item 5 marked to your attention.

It is my further understanding that this action is satisfactory to the Commission, that the action is prophylactic in effect in order to forestall any further questions which might arise at a later date, and that it is not considered to be an admission of wrongdoing by the Chamber. Therefore, it is my understanding that the file on this question shall be closed by the Commission.

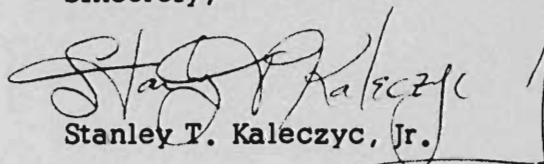

On November 17, 1975, a meeting was held at my office to discuss the above compliance action. Present at the meeting were Stanley T. Kaleczyc, Jr., Associate General Counsel, Chamber of Commerce of the United States, Neal Janey, FEC Staff Attorney, Gordon Robertson, FEC Investigator, and myself.

Mr. Kaleczyc explained that the publications in question were compiled to inform member companies (of the Chamber of Commerce) which other corporations had established political action committees. The publications, according to Mr. Kaleczyc, were not intended for the purpose of soliciting contributions.

Apparently, the directories were sold in order to recoup the costs of preparation. Mr. Kaleczyc stated that approximately six directories were sold before the Chamber of Commerce became aware of the Commission's concern.

Mr. Kaleczyc agreed that the publications would no longer be sold, and that the cover page of the directory would make specific reference to 2 U.S.C. 438(a)(4). In addition, if the directories were made part of a larger publication which was for sale, the Chamber of Commerce would specify that the cost of the directories was not included in the sale price.

Mr. Kaleczyc agreed to send a letter to the Commission affirming the above discussion.

Stanley T. Kaleczyc, Assistant General Counsel of the Chamber of Commerce, came in to talk with the staff about the Directory. He said that the Directory was prepared as part of a package of materials on political action committees. These materials were distributed at first only to members of the Chamber. The Chamber had intended that its members would use the Directory only as a guide to determine which corporations had set up political action committees.

Mr. Kaleczyc advised that directories were later sold in order to recoup the costs of preparing the directories. To his knowledge only six directories were sold. When the Commission expressed some concern over the sale of the directories, no more were sold.

Mr. Kaleczyc has now agreed to a procedure for making further distributions of directories in order to satisfy any objections under the law. This procedure was described as follows:

- (a) Directories will be distributed only to members of the Chamber at no charge.
- (b) Members will be advised to use the directories only for the purpose of determining which corporations have established political action committees.
- (c) A notice will appear on the directories advising that "Federal law prohibits the use of this information for solicitation or commercial purposes." (Exhibit A) Members will be advised not to sell the directories or use them for solicitation or commercial purposes.
- (d) Either a separate memorandum or legend for the title page of the directories will be prepared for circulation to members describing these procedures in some detail.

Mike Hershman and I agreed that if the Chamber adopts this procedure, it would be in compliance with the law. The law could be violated by recipients of the directories. But, Mike and I felt that the Chamber would not be responsible for these violations if it followed these procedures.

Mr. Kaleczyc assured us that these procedures would be followed. He will send us copies of any explanatory material circulated to members of the Chamber.

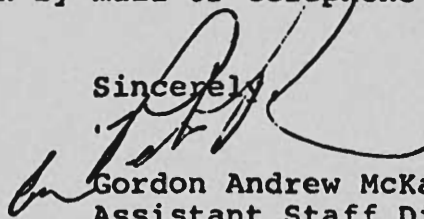

Mr. NELSON. Mr. President, will the Senator yield?

Mr. BELLMON. I yield.

Mr. NELSON. I could not hear the Senator from Oklahoma, and I did not understand exactly what he is doing with the list under the amendment.

Mr. BELLMON. Mr. President, the amendment is self-explanatory. I shall read it again. It provides that "any information copied from such reports and statements shall not be sold or utilized by any person for the purpose of soliciting contributions or for any commercial purpose."

In the State of Oklahoma, our own tax division sells the names of new car buyers to list brokers, for example, and I am sure similar practices are wide-spread elsewhere. This amendment is intended to protect, at least to some degree, the men and women who make contributions to candidates or political parties from being victimized by that practice.

Mr. NELSON. Do I understand that the only purpose is to prohibit the lists from being used for commercial purposes?

Mr. BELLMON. That is correct.

Mr. NELSON. The list is a public document, however.

Mr. NELSON. And newspapers may, if they wish, run lists of contributors and amounts.
