GENERAL COUNSEL'S REPORT

Background

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С 0 On November 29, 1977, the Commission found reason to believe that the Andrew Young Campaign (Committee) may have violated 2 U.S.C. \$434(b) and \$441b.

On March 29, 1978, the Commission, by a vote of 3-3, declined to either adopt or reject the General Counsel's recommendation that the file be closed in this matter. In addition, the Commission, at that time, by a vote of 3-2 (with one abstention) failed to adopt a motion that would have required further investigation into the committee's campaign travel expenses by the Office of General Counsel. 1/

Thereafter, on May 24, 1978, the Commission reconsidered the matter and again, by a vote of 3-3 declined to adopt or reject the recommendation that the case be closed.2/

Reconsidering the matter again on September 20, 1978, the Commission directed the Office of General Counsel to send a letter to the Distributive Workers of America District #65 inquiring whether or not the organization has a PAC. 3/ The letter was sent on October 6, 1978 and on October 27, 1978 a response was received (attached for reference).

Analysis

The union does maintain a PAC, which is registered with the Commission. 4 However, the \$1,000 contribution to the Andrew Young Campaign, with which we are concerned, came from the "King-Osman Fund". This fund, according to the Controller of the union, "[is] sustained by voluntary contributions from our members for the purpose of supporting those educational, social and political causes that were the causes of the late Dr. Martin L. King, Jr. and of the founder of our Union, Arthur Osman." There is no evidence indicating the \$1,000 contribution to the Andrew Young Campaign consisted of any union treasury funds and thus, no violation of 2 U.S.C. \$441b appears to have occurred.

In light of the above, the Office of General Counsel renews its prior recommendation that this matter be closed.



EXECUTIVE SESSION

General Counsel's Report

BACKGROUND

On October 27, 1977, the General Counsel's Office received the Andrew Young Campaign (Committee) file from the Reports Analysis Division.

On November 29, 1977, the Commission found reason to believe the Committee violated 2 U.S.C. \$434(b) and \$441b.

The Committee responded to the Commission finding on January 3, 1978. The Commission sent a follow-up letter on January 28, 1978, the response to which was received on February 16, 1978.

ANALYSIS

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The Commission's finding of reason to believe regarding 2 U.S.C. §434(b) was based in the Committee's apparent failure to adequately list the occupation and principal place of business for contributors as required by §434(b)(2); its failure to disclose the receipt of 19 transfers to the Committee from other political committees as required by §434(b)(4); and its failure to adequately report its outstanding debts and obligations as of the time of the 1976 election as required by §434(b)(12).

>

- 2 -The Committee had neglected to list the occupation and/ or principal place of business for 28 contributors. 1 Its response to our finding provided the requested information for all 28. With regard to the unreported transfers from other political committees, the Committee has provided the requested information for 17 of the 19 unreported transfers and pointed out that it did not receive 2 of the transfers. The Committee has fully complied with the requirements 10 of 2 U.S.C. \$434(b)(2) and (4) and it is recommended that no further action be taken regarding these sections. :n With regard to the unreported debts and obligations, the debts were in fact reported but as expenditures on Form 3 rather than on Schedule C, as they should have been carried. Since this reporting error has been brought to the Young Committee's attention, the respondent has submitted a Schedule C report. The finding of reason to believe regarding 2 U.S.C. §44lb C was premised on the receipt of a \$250. contribution from the Boilermaker's Local 26 L.E.A.P., the receipt of a \$1,000. contribution from the Distributive Workers of America \$65 General Fund, $\frac{2}{}$ and the apparent extension of credit, possibly not in the ordinary course of business, by credit card companies. 1/On the First General Counsel's Report, this figure was misstated as 139. That calculation included 82 PAC transfers for which principal place of business and occupation information is not required and also included 29 contributors who had been double-counted. 2/Neither of the union committees are registered or reporting entities with the Commission. The \$1,000. contribution from the Distributive Workers of America presumptively indicates that it is a political committee within the meaning of the Act (2 U.S.C. \$431(d)). However, the \$250. contribution from the Boilermakers could be considered de minimus by the Commission , as there is no evidence that any other Federal candidate received funds from them.

In its response, the Committee's treasurer stated that the Committee had made inquiries and had been satisfied that the two contributions in question had been made from separate, segregated funds established by the union locals to accept voluntary political contributions from members and to make contributions to political candidates. There is no evidence to indicate otherwise.

The other possible 2 U.S.C. \$441b violation concerned the apparent extension of credit to the Committee by credit card companies, possibly not in the ordinary course of business. The Committee's reports indicated that \$9,483. in travel reimbursements was paid out for trips taken during 1976 in connection with the campaign.

These trips were charged on a number of credit cards. 3/

However, the evidence obtained during the Commission's investigation establishes that the credit card transactions were not between the credit card companies and the Committee, but rather were made by individual campaign volunteers, as well as Andrew Young himself. The Committee reimbursed these individuals through payments to their credit card accounts. It was this method of reimbursement, reflected in the Committee's reports, which on its face indicated a possible violation of \$441b. It is now evident that the credit card companies did not extend credit to the Committee, and thus there was no \$441b violation.

The fact that individual campaign workers charged these travel expenses on personal credit cards does raise possible 2 U.S.C.

\$441a violations if any of the individuals had unreimbursed expenses of over \$500 (the limit established by 2 U.S.C. \$431(e) (5) (D) and (I) and \$431(f)(4)(E)). However, the evidence indicates that the travel expenses incurred by the individuals have been reimbursed. There is no evidence indicating there are any outstanding unreimbursed travel expenses. Thus, there is no \$441a violation.

RECOMMENDATION

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- 1. The Commission should find no reasonable cause to believe a violation of 2 U.S.C. §44lb has occurred in this matter.
- 2. The Commission should take no further action regarding 2 U.S.C. \$434(b).
- 3. The Commission should refer the Distributive Workers of America District #65 to the Reports Analysis Division as a non-filer.

We acknowledge receipt of your December 30, 1977 letter written in response to our letter of December 19, 1977 notifying you of the various violations of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended (the Act), which may have been committed by The Andrew Young Campaign.

Although your letter responds to most of the matters raised in our December 19 letter, as David Federman of my office pointed out to you during a telephone conversation on January 12, 1978, a few issues remain.

As you will recall from our letter of December 19, the Commission found reason to believe The Andrew Young Campaign was in violation of several of the reporting requirements of § 434(b) of the Act (in addition to possible § 441b violations).

Attachments A and B to this letter ask you to provide additional information which is required by Sections 434(b)(2) and 434(b)(4). Section 434(b)(2) requires that the occupation and principal place of business, if any, be provided in committee reports for every contributor who gives in excess of \$100.00 for any calendar year. Section 434(b)(4) requires that every transfer of funds between political committees be reported, regardless of amount. Although your December 30 letter did report 12 of the 19 transfers detailed in our December 19 letter, 7 remain.



Section 434(b)(12) of the Act requires that all debts and obligations of a candidate or committee, outstanding as of the date of the election in question, be reported continuously until extinguished. Would you please forward to the Commission a list of all debts and obligations which your committee had outstanding as of the November 1976 election, noting which have been paid and when, and which are still unextinguished.

In order to expedite this inquiry and to insure that a decision in this matter will be based upon all the available information, please forward the information requested above and in the attachments, along with any other information which you feel is relevant to this inquiry, within ten (10) days of your receipt of this letter.

C - This letter is intended as an attempt to answer the questions raised in your letter of December 19, 1977 concerning the Andrew Young Campaign.

First I would like to say that the Andrew Young Campaign came into being for the express purpose of helping elect Andrew Young to the United States Congress from the Fifth Congressional District of Georgia in the year 1972. It was and is a group of friends of Andrew Young who took off time from their other responsibilities to help do something that was good for the City of Atlanta and the Fifth District. It would be accurate to describe all of the individuals involved as volunteers simply supporting a friend and trying to be of service to the community.

As you know, campaign law has evolved quite a bit since 1972, and all we attempted to do was run a clean and responsible campaign that was within the rapidly changing law. Without question we made a lot of mistakes, as has been pointed out; however, we kept good records up to the point when almost everything was disrupted to prepare for clearing out the congressional office and moving to At that point, everything was quickly New York City. thrown into boxes, some was carted off to Andrew Young's home, and other material to the National Records Center; consequently the handicap in responding to your inquiry.

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All of the items listed on Appendix B were payments on an account. The round figures do not represent specific itemized trips as such. During the period between January, 1976 and January, 1977, travel was purchased with credit cards that were held by individuals. (The Andrew Young Campaign has never owned any credit cards.) Example: If Andrew Young was planning to travel from Washington, D. C. to Atlanta and back, his secretary would purchase the ticket with one of his credit cards or mine (Stoney Cooks), based on which card was least likely to be confiscated at the ticket counter.

All credit cards must have monthly payments and American Express must be paid in full each month. In the case of then Congressman Andrew Young, his secretary would ask for payment on credit cards, and if there was a sufficient balance in the campaign account a payment would be made payable to the credit card company. However, rather than lose a credit card she would obviously make a payment from his personal account. The campaign would then make a payment to the card company when it could. Sometimes this was weeks or months later. The individuals traveling in this manner were: Andrew Young, Stoney Cooks, Tom Offenburger, Dr. Anne Holloway, Ms. Constance Grice, Mr. Julius Hollis, Ms. Lila Blake, Rev. Fred Bennette, and Mr. Richard Marcus.

In addition, I have enclosed some examples of approximate travel that was filed earlier. However, this is just that, approximate travel. These credit cards were used for travel, hotel accommodations, rent-a-cars, restaurant bills, etc. Receipts were mostly kept, and the campaign

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paid when it had the money and if it had the money. Andrew Young campaigned for fifty or more congressional candidates across the country, and on most of these trips either Tom Offenburger or I accompanied him.

There were no arrangements made for the payment of interest, however I am certain that the complete ledger would indicate that Andrew Young, Tom Offenburger or I could still claim contributions to the campaign for unreimbursed travel expense.

Concerning the contribution from the Distributive Workers of America - District 65 Voluntary Fund, the Andrew Young Campaign was told on October 25, 1976 that the contribution came from voluntary contributions to a King-Osman Fund which was established by the workers for such contributions. Likewise, when inquiring in the Fall of 1976 about the contribution from the Boilermakers Local 26 - L.E.A.P., we were told that this was the Boilermakers' volunteer contribution fund and L.E.A.P. represented a Legislative Education and Publicity Fund. If these funds came from the general treasury, then we certainly were not of the opinion that this was the case.

The April 10 report covering the period of January 1, 1977 thru March 31, 1977 should read \$8,380.59. Please recognize this change as an amendment to that report.

The discrepancy in the October 10, 1977 report is clearly a typographical error.

The October 9, 1975 report stating that the Committee's financial activity for the third quarter did not exceed \$1,000 was accurate. However, there was a serious discrepancy between the July 10 report disclosing an ending cash balance of \$2,877.48 and the bank statement of \$14.22. A report was filed amending several reports (which is enclosed) stating that two deposits had been entered as income and three uncollectible items had never been subtracted, thus the balance was accurate.

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The attached list of PAC contributors was not reported earlier because the individual contribution was not more than \$100.

The Machinists Non-Partisan Political League was reported in the thirty-day report for the period covering 10/19 thru 11/22/76; the Airline Pilots Association PAC was reported in the same report; the Lockheed Good Government Program was reported in the amended ten-day report covering 10/1 thru 10/18/76; the Good Government Group (Trust Company) was reported in the 1/3 thru 3/31/77 report (\$200); the Better Government Committee I check was never received, deposited, or cashed, and after contacting the BGC-I, they have agreed to stop payment on the check and to forward another.

Please accept this list and explanations as amendments to the appropriate reports.

This letter is to notify you that the Federal Election Commission, in the ordinary course of its supervisory duties has found reason to believe that violations of 2 U.S.C. §434(b) and §441b have occurred in connection with the Andrew Young Campaign.

This finding supplements the notice dated October 18, 1977 advising you that the Commission had found reason to believe you were in violation of 2 U.S.C. §434 for failure to amend your April 10, 1977 Report of Receipts and Expenditures filed by your committee. It is also intended to incorporate other apparent violations revealed in your records, about which the Commission has previously corresponded with you.

In order to avoid any possible confusion, a chronology of the correspondence (beginning on May 18, 1977) follows.

On May 18, 1977 the Commission sent a Request for Additional Information (RFAI) concerning the April 10, 1977 Report of Receipts and Expenditures via regular mail. This was sent to 701 G Street, S.E., Washington, D.C., the committee's address listed on the April 10 report. No



response was received and on June 16 a second request was sent via registered mail to the same address. This was returned to the Commission undelivered.

On July 13, 1977 the same RFAI was sent to P.O. Box 710, Atlanta, Georgia via regular mail, an address utilized by the committee during the 1976 campaign. However, the letter was returned to the Commission.

On July 22, 1977 the Commission received a 3a postcard for the 2nd Quarter of 1977 signed by Ms. Betty Sharp, listing 709 Massachusetts Avenue, N.W., Washington, D.C. as the Committee's address.

On that same date, Ms. Roberta Werfel of the Commission, spoke with you, at which time you gave her the 799 U.N. Plaza, New York, New York address.

The original RFAI of May 18 was then forwarded via regular mail to you on July 22 at the U.N. address.

As of August 25, 1977 we had not received a response to the RFAI, so on that date a second request was sent via registered mail. Unfortunately, it was sent to the P.O. Box in Atlanta and was returned to the Commission on September 1.

0

On October 18, still having received no response to the July 22 RFAI, and with the requested information not supplied on the amended July 10 or October 10 reports, Mr. Peter Kell of the Disclosure Division of the Commission spoke with you, at which time you requested that the RFAI be sent to you at the U.N. address, although the 709 Massachusetts Avenue address was listed on the October 10 report.

On October 20 Mr. Kell again spoke with you and in response to your inquiry, explained the compliance procedure. The second request dated October 18 was sent out on this date via registered mail to the U.N. address. Later on this date, Ms. Betty Sharp of the Andrew Young Campaign came to our offices and the situation was explained to her.

On October 28, a letter concerning a possible union contribution and additional RFAI's were sent to the U.N. address via registered mail.

On November 2 we received your letter dated October 26 in response to the October 18 second request concerning the April 10, 1977 report. Later on this date you spoke with Mr. Michael Filler and discussed the RFAI's sent to you on October 28.

On November 10 you again spoke with Mr. Filler at which time he asked you about a fundraiser which was held in June and any debts or obligations the committee might have.

The November 10 phone conversation is the last contact you have had with the Commission.

While we note that your letter of October 26 responds to some of the matters raised in correspondence between the Commission and yourself in connection with the Young Campaign, certain other matters remain unexplained.

On the 1976 and 1977 Young Campaign reports, the Young Campaign did not list the principal place of business for numerous contributors, as required by Section 434(b) (2) of Title 2, United States Code.

Additionally, your reports failed to itemize at least 19 Political Action Committee transfers to the Young Campaign in apparent violation of Section 434(b)(4) of Title 2, United States Code.

In 1977, the Young Campaign reports reveal numerous campaign expenditures, yet the 1976 reports show no debts or obligations. Section 434(b)(12) of Title 2, United States Code, as implemented by Section 104.8 of Chapter 11 of the Code of Federal Regulations, requires the continuous reporting of all debts and obligations which remain outstanding after the election. Additionally, Section 104.8 requires that any debt or obligation over \$500 be reported as of the date of the transaction.

The reports also reveal the possible knowing acceptance of union contributions which are unlawful under Section 441b (a) of Title 2, United States Code.


This section also prohibits the knowing acceptance of corporate contributions. The information presently available to us indicates that the Young Campaign may have accepted such contributions from the various airline and credit card companies who extended credit to the Campaign during 1976.

Under the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended, the Commission must consider such matters expeditiously. Accordingly, please submit within ten (10) days of receipt of this letter any factual or legal materials which you believe are relevant to the Commission's analysis of this matter. In addition to any such information you wish to provide, the Commission requests that you answer the questions on the attached sheet by way of a notarized statement. Please submit this information within ten (10) days. If you intend to be represented by counsel in this matter, please notify the Commission in writing.

This matter will remain confidential in accordance with 2 U.S.C. §437g(a)(3) unless you authorize the Commission, in writing, to make the investigation public. If you have any questions concerning this matter, please contact David Federman (202-523-4039), the attorney assigned to this case.

As of August 25, 1977 we had not received a response to the RFAI, so on that date a second request was sent via registered mail. Unfortunately, it was sent to the P.O. Box in Atlanta and was returned to the Commission on September 1.

On October 18, still having received no response to the July 22 RFAI, and with the requested information not supplied on the amended July 10 or October 10 reports, Mr. Peter Kell of the Disclosure Division of the Commission spoke with you, at which time you requested that the RFAI be sent to you at the U.N. address, although the 709 Massachusetts Avenue address was listed on the October 10 report.

On October 20 Mr. Kell again spoke with you and in response to your inquiry, explained the compliance procedure. The second request dated October 18 was sent out on this date via registered mail to the U.N. address. Later on this date, Ms. Betty Sharp of the Andrew Young Campaign came to our offices and the situation was explained to her.

On October 28, a letter concerning a possible union contribution and additional RFAI's were sent to the U.N. address via registered mail.

On November 2 we received your letter dated October 26 in response to the October 18 second request concerning the April 10, 1977 report. Later on this date you spoke with Mr. Michael Filler and discussed the RFAI's sent to you on October 28.

On November 10 you again spoke with Mr. Filler at which time he asked you about a fundraiser which was held in June and any debts or obligations the committee might have.

The November 10 phone conversation is the last contact you have had with the Commission.

While we note that your letter of October 26 responds to some of the matters raised in correspondence between the Commission and yourself in connection with the Young Campaign, certain other matters remain unexplained.

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On the 1976 and 1977 Young Campaign reports, the Young Campaign did not list the principal place of business for numerous contributors, as required by Section 434(b) (2) of Title 2, United States Code.

Additionally, your reports failed to itemize at least 19 Political Action Committee transfers to the Young Campaign in apparent violation of Section 434(b)(4) of Title 2, United States Code.

In 1977, the Young Campaign reports reveal numerous campaign expenditures, yet the 1976 reports show no debts or obligations. Section 434(b)(12) of Title 2, United States Code, as implemented by Section 104.8 of Chapter 11 of the Code of Federal Regulations, requires the continuous reporting of all debts and obligations which remain outstanding after the election. Additionally, Section 104.8 requires that any debt or obligation over \$500 be reported as of the date of the transaction.

The reports also reveal the possible knowing acceptance of union contributions which are unlawful under Section 44lb (a) of Title 2, United States Code.

This section also prohibits the knowing acceptance of corporate contributions. The information presently available to us indicates that the Young Campaign may have accepted such contributions from the various airline and credit card companies who extended credit to the Campaign during 1976.

Under the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended, the Commission must consider such matters expeditiously. Accordingly, please submit within ten (10) days of receipt of this letter any factual or legal materials which you believe are relevant to the Commission's analysis of this matter. In addition to any such information you wish to provide, the Commission requests that you answer the questions on the attached sheet by way of a notarized statement. Please submit this information within ten (10) days. If you intend to be represented by counsel in this matter, please notify the Commission in writing.

This matter will remain confidential in accordance with 2 U.S.C. §437g(a)(3) unless you authorize the Commission, in writing, to make the investigation public. If you have any questions concerning this matter, please contact David Federman (202-523-4039), the attorney assigned to this case.

SUMMARY OF ALLEGATIONS

On October 27, 1977, the General Counsel's office received the Andrew Young Campaign file from the Disclosure Division.

In a memorandum from the Assistant Staff Director for Disclosure to the General Counsel, it was indicated that the matter was being brought to the attention of the General Counsel due to the combination of disclosure problems and news dispatches involving the Young Campaign's finances.

Through an analysis of the file, the General Counsel's staff has discovered numerous inconsistencies and irregularities in the reports of the Andrew Young Campaign for Congress, which, if substantiated, constitute violations of several sections of the Act. The allegations in this complaint can be summarized as follows:

1. From January 1, 1976 through September 30, 1977, the Andrew Young Campaign itemized 185 contributions. On 139 of those, the Young Campaign neglected to provide the contributor's principal place of business, as required by 2 U.S.C. \$434(b)(2).

MUR 462 2. 2 U.S.C. \$434(b)(4) requires that reporting committees disclose "the name and address of each political committee from which the reporting committee ... received ... any transfer of funds, together with the amounts and dates of all transfers". Through a cross-check of the Young Campaign reports with the list of the committees contributing to the Young Campaign, it was found that at least 19 such transfers went unreported by the Young Campaign in violation of 2 U.S.C. \$434(b)(4). 1/ 3. Several inconsistencies became apparent when the 1976 year-end and quarterly reports are compared to the 1977 first, second, and third quarter reports. During 1976, the Young Campaign reported no outstanding debts or obligations, and the 1976 year-end report showed no indebtedness and a cash balance of over \$6,000. The 1977 quarterly reports contain numerous Dexpenditures, 2/ as well as at least \$6,000.00 in contributions from a June fundraiser. It appears that the travel expenditures, although not paid until 1977, were incurred during the course of the 1976 campaign. 3/ The Gune fundraiser, apparently, was held to pay off those debts. §434(b)(12) as implemented by 11 C.F.R. §104.8(a) requires the continuous Geporting of all debts and obligations which remain outstanding after the election. Moreover, 11 C.F.R. \$104.8(b) requires that any debt or obligation over \$500 be reported as of the time of the transaction. Since the Young Campaign reported no debts or obligations, these sections were apparently violated. The debts discussed in allegation (3) would normally be considered Extensions of credit and would be legal, if handled in the ordinary course of business. 11 C.F.R. \$114.10. However, the manner in which these debts were eventually paid may indicate that ordinary business practices were mot followed. The debts may present a possible 2 U.S.C. \$44lb (a) violation in that the credit extensions, if not extended in the ordinary course of business, may be construed as loans. Unpaid loans from the airline and credit card companies may be considered contributions from these companies [2 U.S.C. \$441b(b)(2)], and, hence, illegal acceptances of corporate contributions. 2 U.S.C. §441b(a). See Appendix A for list of transfers. See Appendix B. See letter of October 20, 1977, from Stoney Cooks (treasurer of the Andrew Young Campaign) to Peter Kell in which Cooks seems to acknowledge that certain travel expenses (reported in 1st quarter 1977) were incurred during 1976, but not paid until 1977. It is reasonable to conclude that similar expenses paid in the second and third quarters of 1977 were also incurred during 1976.

5. On July 20, 1976, the Andrew Young Campaign accepted a \$250.00 contribution from the Boilermaker's Local #26 - Legislative Education Action Program. As the committee is not registered, staff has no way of knowing whether this constitutes an unlawful acceptance of a union contribution under 2 U.S.C. \$441b or whether the contribution comes from a PAC. On October 25, 1976, the Young Campaign accepted a \$1,000.00 contribution from the Distributive Workers of America District 65, General Fund. Unless the General Fund qualifies as a segregated fund under 2 U.S.C. \$441b(b)(2)(C), the acceptance of this contribution violated 2 U.S.C. \$441b(a). RECOMMENDATION Find Reason to Believe the Andrew Young Campaign violated the following sections of the Act: 2 U.S.C. \$434(b) **S** 2 U.S.C. \$441b S And send attached letter with questions to the Andrew Young Campaign. O.

This letter is to notify you that the Federal Election Commission, in the ordinary course of its supervisory duties has found reason to believe that violations of 2 U.S.C. \$434(b) and \$441b have occurred.

This finding supplements the notice dated October 18, 1977 advising you that the Commission had found reason to believe you were in violation of 2 U.S.C. §434 for failure to amend your April 10, 1977 Report of Receipts and Expenditures filed by your committee.

Section 434(b)(2) of Title 2, United States Code, mandates the recipient committee to report in addition to other requirements, the full name and mailing address (including principal place of business, if any) of each person who has contributed in excess of \$100.

Section 434(b)(4) of Title 2, United States Code, requires that reporting committees disclose the name and address of each political committee from which the reporting committee received any transfer of funds, together with the amounts and dates of such transfers.

Section 44lb(a) of Title 2 of the United States Code prohibits any candidates, political committee or other person knowingly to accept or receive any contribution made by a corporation or labor organization in connection with an election.

NOTICE TO ALL CANDIDATES AND COMMITTEES

During the course of the review of reports of contributions and expenditures, the Commission has noted that some committees and candidates are failing to fully describe the purpose of itemized expenditures, see \$102.9 of the Commission's proposed regulations and 2 U.S.C. \$432(d).

As required by the statute, the "particulars" of each over-\$100 expenditure must be reported. Entries such as "advance to fieldman" or "travel" are not sufficient to meet the statutory requirement. An advance to staff is not an expenditure, but rather an intracommittee transfer. The actual use to which the advance is put must be itemized. For example, if a fieldman receives a \$500 advance and spends \$250 to rent a hall; \$125 on posters; and \$125 on meals and lodging, each of those expenditures must be specifically itemized. Expenditures of \$100 or less need not be itemized, but must be aggregated and reported as unitemized expenditures. Back-up material for these expenditures should be maintained.

The Commission notes that some committees and candidates are not maintaining receipted bills or invoices as back-up for expenditures. The proposed regulations permit a canceled check and a contemporaneous memorandum to be kept instead of a receipted bill. That type of back-up may be used only if a receipted bill is not available, since a canceled check/memorandum back-up usually does not provide as much information as a bill or invoice.

If you or your treasurer have questions about these matters, please contact the Commission's auditing section at (202) 382-6023. The Commission urges you to voluntarily comply with the points in this notice.
