To Whom it May Concern:

I write to you to ask that your office investigate a compliant against the campaign of Janice D. Schakowsky, candidate for United States Congress in Illinois' 9th Congressional District. It appears as though Ms. Schakowsky is in violation of section 110.11 of the code of federal regulations.

According to the code that deals with advertising, "whenever any person makes an expenditure for the purpose of financing a communication that expressly advocates the election or defeat of a clearly identified candidate, a disclaimer shall appear and be presented in a clear and conspicuous manner to give the reader, observer or listener adequate notice of the identity of persons who paid for and, where required, who authorized the communication."

I have enclosed an ad from an event held on October 27th that lacks this disclaimer. It would seem that directly contradicts with your regulations.

I would appreciate the commission's attention to this matter and hope that you will keep me informed of the results of your investigation. I thank you in advance for your assistance.

Mrs. Robert Adams (Peggy) Carr

first became active in the birth control movement in 1941 as a member of the Illinois Birth Control League. Serving as its last president, she helped guide the organization through its transition to the Chicago Affiliate of the Planned Parenthood Federation of America. Since helping to raise the first annual budget of \$14,000 for the new affiliate, Peggy Carr has been a constant in the struggle to raise the funds needed to bring family planning services to the women of Chicago. She served as co-chair of Planned Parenthood's recent capital campaign that raised \$8 million and has been an active volunteer and board member for many organizations including Children's Memorial Hospital, Chicago Botanic Garden and the Chicago Child Care Society. She was the recent recipient of Planned Parenthood's Margaret Sanger Award for Lifetime Achievement.

Roger Pascal

has been the head of the Litigation Group of Chicago's venerable Schiff Hardin & Waite law firm for more than a decade. Sensitized long ago by his spouse and daughters to the exigence of reproductive privacy, he has counseled Personal PAC and many other organizations. Within the last year, he defended Planned Parenthood's Near North Health Center against an eviction action brought by the center's landlord. As General Counsel of ACLU of Illinois for many years, Pascal has been responsible for general oversight of its legal staff and a strong supporter of the ACLU's highly effective Reproductive Rights Project. He has been an officer or director of the Public Interest Law Initiative, Legal Assistance Foundation of Chicago, and the Fund for Justice of the Chicago Council of Lawyers and is an adjunct professor of law at Northwestern University Law School.

GENERAL COUNSEL'S REPORT

I. INTRODUCTION.

The cases listed below have been identified as either stale or of low priority based upon evaluation under the Enforcement Priority System (EPS). This report is submitted to recommend that the Commission no longer pursue these cases.

II. CASES RECOMMENDED FOR CLOSURE.

A. Cases Not Warranting Further Action Relative to Other Cases Pending Before the Commission

EPS was created to identify pending cases which, due to the length of their pendency in inactive status or the lower priority of the issues raised in the matters relative to others presently pending before the Commission, do not warrant further expenditure of resources. Central Enforcement Docket (CED) evaluates each incoming matter using Commission-approved criteria which results in a numerical rating of each case.

Closing cases permits the

Commission to focus its limited resources on more important cases presently

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pending before it. Based upon this review, we have identified 16 cases that do not warrant further action relative to other pending matters.¹ The attachment to this report contains summaries of each case, the EPS rating, and the factors leading to assignment of a low priority and recommendation not to further pursue the matter.

B. Stale Cases

Effective enforcement relies upon the timely pursuit of complaints and referrals to ensure compliance with the law. Investigations concerning activity more remote in time usually require a greater commitment of resources, primarily due to the fact that the evidence of such activity becomes more difficult to develop as it ages. Focusing investigative efforts on more recent and more significant activity also has a more positive effect on the electoral process and the regulated community. In recognition of this fact, EPS provides us with the means to identify those cases which remained unassigned for a significant period due to a lack of staff resources for effective investigation. The utility of commencing an investigation declines as these cases age, until they reach a point when activation of a case would not be an efficient use of the Commission's resources.

We have identified cases which have remained on the Central Enforcement Docket for a sufficient period of time to render them stale. We recommend 27 of these cases be closed.³ Nine of these cases were part of the so-called "Major 96" cases that have not been able to be activated due to a lack of resources to effectively pursue them in a timely fashion.⁴ Since the time period rendering them stale has now passed, we recommend their closure at this time.

We recommend that the Commission exercise its prosecutorial discretion and direct closure of the cases listed below, effective February 24, 1998. Closing

Terry Cosgrove, Executive Director of Personal PAC, states that the annual awards luncheon program book is open to any individual, business, organization or candidate wishing to place an ad. He further opines that compliance with the law regarding disclaimers and other issues is the responsibility of the individual advertisers, not of Personal PAC.

This matter is less significant relative to other matters pending before the Commission.
