Dear Sir/Madam;

We have been referred to you by Mr. Stanley Zalen, Chief Enforcement Counsel of the New York State Board of Elections.

The signers of this letter, all present or former members of the Warren County Democratic Committee and several elected public officials of the City of Glens Falls, New York, have had a complaint before the New York State Board of Elections for some time. We only recently were told by the State Board that they did not feel they were the appropriate venue for the most serious of our complaints; the lesser charges they declined to pursue due to the lack of records.

The core of the matter which we understand will be of interest to the FEC is an illegal diversion of funds of the Warren County Democratic Committee in a Congressional campaign to evade Federal spending limits.

Specifically, in the 1994 election campaign of Robert Lawrence of Cleverdale, N.Y. for Congress, representing this area, funds of the Warren County Democratic Committee were funneled through county committees in Essex and Saratoga Counties, New York, to evade spending limits.

The Warren County Democratic Committee originally gave Mr.
Lawrence (without the knowledge or consent of the Committee as a whole) \$4,000 for his campaign. Mr. Lawrence's campaign shortly later returned the check to the County Chairman, Mr. William Montfort, who then knowingly illegally diverted the funds through

the Essex and Saratoga County Democratic Committees.

Remarkably, Mr. Montfort confirmed this transfer was illegal and knowingly done to evade Federal law during open discussion at the September, 1995 organizational meeting of the Warren County Democratic Committee.

This diversion was also later confirmed in a written report by Mr. Daniel Martindale, a member of the Warren County Committee and the new Chairman of the Glens Falls Democratic Committee.

The financial affairs of the Warren County Democratic
Committee have been an issue with committee members and local
elected officials since the Spring of 1995. Although a series of
highly lucrative fund raisers had been held over the previous several
years, it was discovered by several committee members who were
also elected officials that over ten thousand dollars were essentially
unaccounted for in the County Committee's treasury.

These officials, who included the elected City Treasurer of Glens Falls, NY, (who is a C.P.A.), the Glens Falls City Council President (the highest elected Democratic official in Warren County, N.Y.), two Democratic members of the City Council of Glens Falls, also County Committee members, the then Chair of the Glens Falls Democratic Committee and the Secretary/Treasurer of the Glens Falls Democratic Committee and others sought a financial accounting from Mr. William Montfort, the County Chair.

What followed is too involved to recap in this letter, but is well covered in the attached copies of our complaints sent to the New York State Board of Elections.

In short, Mr. Montfort organized an attack on these individuals and their family members in an all out effort to either intimidate them into silence or discredit them. Serious professional harm was done to some of these individuals, particularly to Ralph Farrell, the husband of Councilmember Margaret Farrell, who, thanks to Mr. Montfort's actions, was illegally terminated from his job with the

New York State Department of Environmental Conservation. (Mr. Farrell's termination is currently under litigation.) In an effort to deprive committee members of the support of the Glens Falls Democratic Committee, Mr. Montfort also challenged the nominating petition of the first black woman to seek membership of the Warren County Democratic Committee. We regard Mr. Montfort's actions to silence those questioning Committee financial affairs as further, though circumstantial, proof of his guilt. We believe they may also constitute Obstruction of Justice or other criminal offenses in and of themselves. We also believe they give you an better understanding of the general background; Mr. Montfort's illegal diversion of funds was but one part of a pattern of illegal or grossly abusive uses of County Committee funds. O 0 The financial disclosure forms filed with the New York State S Board of Elections will confirm the illegal transfers to the election effort of Mr. Robert Lawrence. This has also been extensively 373 investigated by the New York State Board. The facts of the matter are not in dispute. 00 N Accordingly, we are submitting to you: M Copies of our complaints and correspondence with the New York State Board of Elections. Copies of financial disclosure forms submitted to the the N.Y.S. 00 Board of Elections by Mr. Montfort and the Warren County ON Democratic Committee. A copy of a report on County Committee finances by the Chairman of the Glens Falls Democratic Committee, Mr. Daniel Martindale. Miscellaneous notes and records. We will try to highlight what we believe are important sections for your attention. 3

We should note that the report issued by Mr. Martindale was yet another effort by Mr. Montfort to evade accountability and deny qualified members of the Committee (specifically our CPA City Treasurer) access to County records. Obviously, it backfired badly. We would also like to point out the the signers of this letter are mainly elected public officials who have sworn an Oath of Office to uphold the laws of the State of New York. The signers who are also City Council members of the City of Glens Falls are also legally Peace Officers. They feel they cannot look the other way in such a grave matter, and that a criminal complaint and investigation is called for. We are available for any further questions or requests for information by the FEC. We are confident you will find the actions detailed in this complaint as unlawful and unacceptable as we do. Dear Mr. Kazinsky; Due to the information received by us through your recent conversation with Lawrence A. Dudley, Secretary/Treasurer of the Glens Falls Democratic Committee, the undersigned members of the Glens Falls and Warren County Democratic Committees and all the elected Democratic public officials of the City of Glens Falls who are committee members, would like to officially request that the New York State Board of Elections conduct a formal audit of the finances of the Warren County Democratic Committee. This request is a result of a lengthy series of very troubling irregularities and actions by the Chairman of the Warren County Democratic Committee, Mr. William Montfort of Johnsburg, and the Treasurer of the Warren County Democratic Committee, Mr. William McCarthy of Queensbury. To summarize: 3 · The Warren County Democratic Committee, to the knowledge of the signers, has never had an audit. · Approximately three or four years ago, Mr. Robert Fuller, then Chairman of the Queensbury Democratic Committee, became disturbed at the lack of accountability and the vagueness of reports concerning the Warren County Democratic Committee's finances. Aware of the fiduciary responsibility of all committee members, Mr. Fuller brought the subject up at an ON official meeting of the Warren County Democratic Committee. Despite protests from Mr. Montfort that an audit was not necessary, the Committee adopted a resolution, by a majority, to conduct an audit. When Mr. Fuller tried to carry through on this resolution, however, he was told by Mr. Montfort that a quorum did not exist at the meeting, and therefore the resolution was never legally adopted. This despite the fact an official meeting was held with a standard roll call. A quorum, in fact, had existed. Mr. Fuller continued for 18 months to try and see the Warren County Committee's books and financial records, absolutely without success. In the end, he simply gave up. · Financial statements or Treasurer's reports are never routinely presented at Warren County Democratic Committee meetings. In fact, the Treasurer of the Warren County Democratic Committee, Mr. Page 1 of 7

William McCarthy, who is elderly and retired, spends the majority of the year living in retirement in Florida, leaving before Winter, returning only in late Spring or summer. In order that the absence of a Treasurer to conduct the Warren County Democratic Committee's finances does not cause the County Committee to suspend operations for the lack of funds, Mr. McCarthy leaves behind a a stack of signed official checks of the Warren County Democratic Democratic Committee in the custody of County Chairman Mr. William Montfort, who is empowered to co-sign checks with the County Treasurer. In practice, Mr. Montfort can sign checks and expend funds of the Warren County Democratic Committee on his sole authority. · Over the last several years the Warren County Democratic Committee raised fairly substantial sums of money due to several highly successful fund raisers. At one point in 1994 the Warren County Democratic Committee had approximately \$14,000 in its treasury. · There were no local, that is City, Town or County races last year that would have prompted large expenditures of money. · Early last spring, several members of the Glens Falls Democratic Committee who are signatories of this letter discussed with Mr. Montfort another issuing of the Warren County Democrat, the County Committee's official newspaper, which in the past was issued before elections. The release of such a paper would cost less than \$4,000. After initially being told there was enough money in the treasury to cover what had always been the relatively modest cost of this newspaper, they were suddenly told not enough money was left. · After mulling over the problem for several months, it was decided to pursue checking out the exact state of the Warren County Democratic Committee's finances. At the regular June meeting of the Warren County Democratic Committee, several of the signers of this letter and other County Committee members asked for a financial accounting. At the meeting Mr. Montfort stated that he could not give an accounting of the County Committee's finances at that time. The signers of this letter and other members of the County Committee demanded and received a promise by Mr. Montfort that a full accounting would be made. · At the July meeting an extremely terse financial statement was issued by Mr. Montfort and Mr. McCarthy. According to this report, which was read aloud since no copies were available for members of the County Committee, several thousand dollars had been expended in the last year ON on "operating expenses" of a committee in an off election year. Furthermore, another, separate large sum was spent on repair or maintenance of a copy machine and other equipment, in fact, larger than such equipment would normally cost new. However, there were no details of any kind on what these large sums represented. Other funds seemed to be unaccounted for as well. Uncertain of the details of this verbal report, several of the signers of this letter asked for their own written copies. After a considerable delay, Lawrence Dudley, the Secretary/Treasurer of the Glens Falls Democratic Committee, received a single page copy, printed in extremely large type to fill up the page. The contents of this report, however, would fill a standard 3x5 card. · We would like to note in passing that Mr. Montfort treated all of the above requests with great resentment and hostility. candidates or those who file their petitions of any problems and how to correct them. Another signer of this letter brought the petition to Mrs. Montfort at her office and no effort was made by her to review the petition for any problems. We later learned that a Mr. Buell Brayton, a fellow Democrat, challenged that petition. When Richard Dudley, who circulated the petition for Ms. James, called him, Mr. Brayton would not give him any explanation and added that he had not even seen the petition. In sum, it would appear a concerted effort was made to prevent the Glens Falls Democratic Committee from having any additional seats on the County Committee. In addition, Mrs. Montfort, without consulting with the Glens Falls Committee, moved committee members to wards and districts where they would have a smaller weighted vote. All this was done to prevent elected officials in Glens Falls and the Glens Falls Committee from having the votes to investigate the state of the County Committee's finances. You can imagine our frustration in trying to build the Glens Falls Committee with members who would add significantly to our Committees, only to have these efforts thwarted by Mr. and Mrs. Montfort. · On August 16 a letter was drafted and sent by Glens Fall Democratic Committee Chair Margaret Farrell asking to see the County Committee's books, registers and check stubs. Mrs. Farrell, who works an irregular MY schedule at night as supervisor of the pediatric critical care unit at Glens Falls Hospital, asked that the records be brought by Mr. Montfort's spouse, Mrs. Lois Montfort, the Warren County Commissioner of Elections for the Democratic Party, to the Warren County Municipal Center. She has never received a reply. Some of the committee members of the Warren County Democratic Committee undoubtedly would prefer that this matter, no matter how serious, be swept 00 under the rug. However, the signers of this letter, who are mainly elected public officials, have sworn an Oath of Office to uphold the laws of the State N) of New York. The signers who are also City Council members of the City of Glens Falls are also legally peace officers. They feel they cannot look the other way in such a grave matter. It is our belief the New York State Board of Elections can hardly do so either, given the mass of material presented in this letter. We feel that because of the upcoming biannual election of officers required after the ON primary, the State Board of Elections should pursue the requested audit as soon as possible. Thank You. Dear Mr. Zalen;

Thank you for your last letter, your advice and your prompt response to this situation.

You will find enclosed copies the financial disclosure statements of the Warren County Democratic Committee covering the financial reporting period from July 1994 to July 1995.

Although we had no luck in securing these forms directly from Mrs. Montfort, the wife of County Chairman William Montfort, the principal figure in creating this situation, we were able to secure these forms through the intervention of the <u>Post-Star</u> newspaper of Glens Falls, N.Y, probably because they have lawyers on retainer. Although necessarily cursory in character, we believe these forms raise many extremely serious questions, which we will detail in an attached memorandum.

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However, our principal concern at this moment is a series of actions, some of which we believe represent further serious illegalities, taken by Mr. William Montfort, the Warren County Democratic Chairman, to prevent an accounting of the finances of the Warren County Democratic Committee.

We have learned that on August 27 or 28, a secret and we believe illegal meeting of the Warren County Democratic Committee was held at the Hibernian Hall in Glens Falls, N.Y. All the signers of this letter, including all the party officers of the Glens Falls Democratic Committee and all the elected Democratic public officials of the City of Glens Falls who are members of the Warren County Democratic Committee and the Glens Falls

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Democratic Committee, were deliberately not informed of this meeting by Mr. Mortfort. Not a single one received the required notification in the mall. That one, or possibly two members might not receive such a notice in the mail due to the vagaries of the Post Service might be understandable, but as far as we can determine at this moment, at least 14 or 15 members of the Warren County and Glens Falls Democratic Committees were deliberately not informed of this meeting, in violation, as we understand it, not only of the by-laws of the Warren County Democratic Committee, but also the New York State Democratic Committee and the Election Law of the State of New York.

We believe the purpose of this secret meeting, held before the primary election, but including new members not yet on the Committee, was to suborn or arrange a fraudulent election of officers for the Glens Falls Democratic Committee in an attempt to block their legitimate request for a proper financial accounting of the Warren County Democratic Committee. Mr. Montfort called, organized and planed this meeting. At this secret meeting, a carefully orchestrated effort was organized to obtain proxy votes, possibly under false pretenses, to fraudulently overthrow the existing leadership of the City Democratic Committee. In addition, towards that end, charges were apparently made to those attending this secret meeting against those individuals who were seeking an accounting of the Warren County Committee's finances, which they, obviously, could not correct or defend themselves against because they were deliberately excluded.

It is likely some of those attending this secret meeting may not have been as fully aware as they should have been as to the true nature of the situation; the absence of so many other committee members may have been explained away in some manner. However, as always, ignorance of the law is no excuse.

A new slate of officers was prepared, including Mr. Daniel Martindale of Glens Falls, a young, recently graduated law student, for City Chair. At the present time, we believe that Mr. Martindale, in effect, was a "patsy" in this affair, unaware of the larger ramifications of what going on, i.e. that he was participating in a cover-up and general effort to forestall an accounting of the Warren County Democratic Committee's fiances. After

learning of these larger ramifications, Mr. Martindale became extremely concerned also, partly over concern of his own potential culpability in a cover-up, and has been cooperating with the signers of this letter.

Information concerning this meeting was conveyed to the signers of this letter on the date of the organizational meeting of the Warren County Democratic Committee, September 27, 1995: Colleen Daly, a committee member from Glens Falls, admitted to Lawrence A. Dudley that she had received the letter after the Glens Falls Committee's picnic in late August and that the meeting was held about two or three weeks earlier. Bret and Ray Blanchard, County Committee members from Stoney Creek, admitted to Margaret Farrell and her husband Ralph Farrell that the secret meeting had been held at the Hibernian Hall. Daniel Martindale of Glens Falls admitted to Margaret Farrell and Lawrence Dudley that the meeting was held.

We would note several aspects of this secret meeting; at the recent organizational meeting of the County Committee, there was a limited Treasurer's Report to the effect that the Warren County Democratic Committee now had \$2,462 in its account. At the time of the statutory filing date on July 15, that number stood at \$3,150 — that is \$688 dollars was expended in about two months time. The State Board needs to be aware that it is probable that a significant portion of these funds were spent for the purpose of electioneering for party elections, which we understand is a violation of the Election Law and a misdemeanor. Furthermore, rent may have been paid to the Hibernian Hall, which would also fall into this same category of prohibited expenditures. We have been told by sources close to the management of the Hibernian Hall that the hall was rented and paid for with a check.

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It appears this meeting was planed and coordinated with other actions referenced in earlier letters or in different actions; i.e. the effort to prevent new members like Ms. Rickhoff and Ms. James to acquire seats on the Warren County and Glens Falls Committees, and the effort to challenge Paul and John Kemnitzer's nominating petitions, who are represented by Counsel and are undertaking action before your Board in separate actions. These efforts were made to subvert, in a general sense, the legitimate inquiry being made by Glens Falls Democratic Committee members into

the County Committee's finances by personally discrediting those making these inquiries and subverting the Glens Falls Democratic Committee as a necessary and proper forum to investigate these matters. Ironically, after Mr. Martindale became aware of the full situation facing the Warren County Democratic Committee, he, at the request of the signers of this letter, and because of his concern over the issue of his own potential complicity in this matter, volunteered to sponsor a resolution at the Warren County Democratic Committee's organization meeting calling for the opening of the County Committee's books, which would allow an audit. Predictably, this motion failed, 30-21, proxy votes figured in. However, a weakened version of this motion calling for opening and inspection of all books and records by the County Executive Board (composed of certain of Mr. Montfort's appointees and the City and Town 0 Chairs) did pass. It remains to be seen whether or not this measure will vield any revelation or not, given this board's restricted composition. We should also note in passing, that Mr. William McCarthy, of OU Oueensbury, the former Treasurer of the Warren County Democratic Committee, abruptly refused to accept renomination as treasurer. We 00 believe this was because the information contained on the financial disclosure forms was circulated at the Glens Falls Democratic Meeting the previous night. The signers of this and the previous letters have not regarded Mr. McCarthy as the principle figure in this matter. Although he may have 00 information useful to the State Board of Elections, we do not feel Mr. 0 McCarthy, who is retired and spends most of the year in Florida, should be regarded as a potential target for investigation. The principal figure is Mr. Montfort. All this leads to several important questions: Does the calling of this secret meeting by Mr. Montfort in this manner for this purpose render the elections in the Glens Falls Democratic Committee and possibly in the Warren County Democratic

Committee null and void? If so, can new elections be ordered or held? If fraud or other illegalities occurred in this matter, can Mr. Montfort and other be removed from the Committee by the State Board of Elections? Can they be criminally prosecuted for this matter, separate from the issue of financial improprieties? Although our initial concern in this entire matter was what we believe was the appearance of serious illegalities in the finances of the Warren County Democratic Committee, we believe these new events are also so serious as to merit, in effect, an entire separate investigation. We are also concerned about one other matter concerning the Glens Falls Committee. The members of the Glens Falls Democratic Committee charged with control of the Glens Falls Committee's finances, Margaret Farrell and Lawrence Dudley, feel it would be inappropriate and probably a serious legal breach of their fiduciary responsibilities to hand over control of the Glens Falls Committees finances, however meager (\$359), if any of these concerns set forth in this letter are correct. CV2 ON Perhaps the State Board of Elections should consider immediately 00 freezing the Glens Falls Democratic Committee's finances until these questions are fully resolved. One final matter: we believe the State Board of Elections should carefully investigate the conduct and financial arrangements of a banquet/raffle held by the Warren County Democratic Committee in the 00 Spring of 1994 and 1993, and in several previous years. These raffles 0 featured a \$100 ticket including a dinner. Typically, 250 tickets were sold. What may be potential irregularities in regard The prize was \$10,000. to these raffles, including the final drawing of prizes, sale of tickets and patterns of prize winners, may be the most explosive issue in regard to the Warren County Democratic Committee's finances. I.e. There may be a possibility at least one at least one or more of these raffles may have been rigged or debauched in some manner or form. It is also our experience individuals around the raffle are those showing the most resistance to any financial accountability.

We would like to note that the elected officials of the City of Glens Falls who are signatories of this letter were so concerned about the propriety of elected public officials selling such tickets to people living in their jurisdiction, that they refused to sell any to people in upstate New York, only buying tickets for themselves and selling a few to personal friends in New York City. Again, let us express our appreciation to you for your prompt attention to these matters. Thank you. CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

Pursuant to the resolution passed on September 27, 1995 at a meeting of the Warren County Democratic Committee, a full disclosure of the County Committee finances was made to the Executive Committee thereof on November 29, 1995. On December 10, 1995, Executive Committee members were given a second opportunity to inspect the cancelled checks, bank statements, check registers, receipts, and state financial disclosure statements from July 13, 1993 (7/13/93) to the present.

This report will cover four separate disclosure periods, coinciding with the financial disclosure statements, and a reconciliation for the statement to be filed by January 15, 1996. As background information, all receipts were in the form of what the general public would recognize as a receipt, or invoices. There were no bills of lading, bills of sale, etc. present.

Also, there is a \$.25 use fee charged with each check that is written. However, the way this fee is accounted for in the check register has changed with the ascension of Tom O'Dea as Treasurer. Former Treasurer Bill McCarthy recorded checks in the register with the \$.25 transaction fee included in the check amount. In other words, the amount on the face of the check and the amount recorded in the check register would differ by \$.25. However, the register and the bank statement would be accurate and the balances would match. The current treasurer has decided that the amount written on the face of the check will be the amount that is reflected in the check register. The aggregate amount of the

check charges will be deducted from the register quarterly, upon receipt of the quarterly bank statement. This change is merely one of method, and no discrepancies should arise therefrom.

PERIOD 1: JULY 13,1993 - JAMUARY 12, 1994 (7/13/\$3-1/12/94)

During this time period, there were no events such as raffles or dinners. The major expense for this period was the County Democratic headquarters located in Glens Falls, where a majority of the candidates were running for office. During this time period, there were four checks issued for which there are no receipts:

- 1. A check in the amount of \$ 300.00 issued to the New York State Democratic Committee.
- A check in the amount of \$ 214.74 issued for payment of utilities at County Headquarters.
- 3. A check in the amount of \$ 318.74 issued to Raplh Farrell for the phone bill at the County Headquarters.
- 4. A check in the amount of \$ 208.65 issued to Dick and Pat Dudley for decorations and refreshments associated with the County Headquarters.

There are no checks regarding the rent of the space used for the headquarters because the space was given rent-free. Also of interest was check # 2374. This check was in the amount of \$

500.00 issued to the Meeta for Supreme Court campaign committee.

This check was voided because it was returned by the Meeta

Committee.

The total receipts for the period of July 12, 1993 through January 13, 1994 totalled \$ 2,745.50. This figure is confirmed by the disclosure statement, bank statement, and the check register.

PERIOD 2: JANUARY 13, 1994 - JULY 12, 1994 (1/13/94-7/12/94)

There were two major events during this disclosure period. The first was the retirement dinner for former Mayor Frank O'Keefe. This event took place at the Queensbury Hotel. The total deposits and funds raised for this dinner were \$ 3,875.00. The total expenses for the event totalled \$ 2,460.37, leaving a total profit of \$ 1,414.63. After this event, two checks were issued for which no receipts were given. One check was for \$ 1,300.00, and the other was for \$ 200.00. Both checks were issued to former Mayor Frank O'Keefe.

The difference between the total profit of \$ 1,414.63 and the \$ 1,500.00 given to Frank O'Reefe was due to a billing error by the Queensbury Hotel. The Queensbury originally sent a bill for \$ 2,320.92. However, this bill did not include any tax. Thus, the original profit from the dinner was \$ 1,554.08. An amended bill was then sent which included tax in the amount of \$ 139.45. The new bill arrived after the aforementioned checks had been issued to former Mayor O'Keefe. At that point, it would have been

inappropriate to ask the former Mayor to return funds from his own retirement dinner.

The other major event for that period was a raffle. Total deposits for the raffle were \$ 24,271.00, which came from the sale of 240 raffle tickets at \$ 100.00 each, plus a guest fee of \$ 12.00 for the dinner associated with the raffle. The expenses were \$ 11,300.00 in prizes, and \$ 1,925.00 for meals at the Colonial Arms, for a grand total of \$ 13,225.00. There were no receipts given for the checks issued as raffle prizes, nor was there a receipt given for the Colonial Arms bill. The question is, is \$ 1,925.00 a reasonable expense for dinners for 120 people. This averages out to \$ 16.04 per person. The total profit from this fundraiser was \$ 11,046.00.

The total receipts for this period totalled \$ 28,146.00. This figure matches the disclosure statement, check register and bank statement. After expenses, the balance was \$ 9,870.85.

PERIOD 3: JULY 13, 1994 - JANUARY 12, 1994 (7/13/94-1/12/95)

For this disclosure period, there were four checks for which there are no receipts:

- 1) check # 2431 in the amount of \$ 100.00 issued to the Hearts and Flowers Committee.
- 2) check # 2445 in the amount of \$ 100.00 issued to the Hearts and Flowers Committee.
- 3) check # 2438 in the amount of \$ 510.00 issued to the Colonial Arms for the 1994 dinner rally.
 - 4) check # 2435 in the amount of \$ 52.20 to the postmaster.

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Receipts from the Hearts and Flowers committee are not to be expected, since it is a subcommittee of the County Committee.

The question is, is it reasonable to spend \$ 100.00 on floral arrangements and cards for sick, injured, or hospitalized Democrats? It would seem so.

The postmaster receipt of \$ 52.50 would cover the postage for two (2) mailings to the County Committee membership, plus approximately thirty more envelopes, which with two weeks to go before the gubenatorial election is not unreasonable.

The major fundraiser during this period was a dinner at the Colonial Arms. The dinner was attended by 55 people. Total deposits for this dinner were \$ 1,330.00. The expenses were \$ 510.00, thus leaving a total profit of \$ 820.00. The total price of the dinners averages out to be \$ 9.27 per person, which is not an extravagant amount.

The bank statement shows a balance of \$ 3,406.20. This figure matched the check registers and receipts. However, there was a \$ 2,000.00 variance on the original disclosure sheet. The disclosure sheet showed an amount of \$ 1,406.20.

The variance arose out of a contribution to the Bob Lawrence for Congress campaign. A \$ 4,000.00 check was sent by the County Committee to the Lawrence Campaign as a contribution. \$2,000.00 was returned, since federal election law does not allow contributions of more than \$ 2,000.00. Two separate checks of \$ 1,000.00 each were then issued: #2436 was issued to the Essex County Democratic Committee and #2437 was issued to the Saratoga County Democratic Committee, which subsequently gave this money to

the Lawrence Campaign. Inter-County transfers such as these are not uncommon.

For the purposes of expediency, the checks were shown as \$4,000.00 going out in three checks, which is what was actually spent, but the \$2,000.00 that was returned by the Lawrence Campaign was never shown as a deposit, since it was immediately sent back out to the aforementioned County committees. This was simply a matter of accounting. However, the campaign disclosure form has since been amended to reflect the \$2,000.00 as a deposit. The amended statement was filed on December 11, 1995 and all statements, disclosures, registers, and receipts now reflect the figure of \$3,406.20.

Furthermore, check #2436, which was issued to the Essex County Democratic Committee was lost by that committee after the transfer had been made. On December 9, 1994, a stop check order was issued, with a fee of \$ 15.00 charged for doing so. That same day, check #2441 was issued to the Essex County Democratic Committee. Thus, there is no discrepancy.

PERIOD 4: JANUARY 13,1995 - JULY 12, 1995 (1/13/95-7/12/95)

During this period, no fundraisers were held by the COunty Committee. For this reporting period, there were two checks for which there are no receipts:

Check #2454 in the amount of \$ 86.40 to the Postmaster.

Check #2452 in the amount of \$ 100.00 to the Warrensburg

Chamber of Commerce.

The check issued to the Chamber of Commercewas an expense

related to the World's Largest Garage Sale, which was held the weekend of September 30 / October 1, 1995. This fundraiser raised \$ 885.43 after expenses. The check to the postmaster was issued at the beginning of the petition circulation period. Also, there were two County Committee meetings, one in May and one in July, for which notices had to be sent. Thus, it would seem that a bill of \$ 86.40 is not unreasonable.

The campaign disclosure sheet shows that \$ 615.71 in deposits were made. This figure is also shown in the check register, but nothing appears on the bank statement. The figure is not shown on the bank statement because the \$ 615.71 came from outstanding checks, some which dated as far back as 1988, which were retired by former Treasurer Bill McCarthy. Because teh checks were never cashed, no funds were ever withdrawn from the bank account. Although there is the slight chance that these checks may be cashed, the prospects of this event occurring are not likely. These retired checks are listed as deposits on the disclosure statement because there is no area on the disclosure sheet where retired debts should be listed. Therefore, former Treasurer McCarthy listed these retired checks as deposits.

As of the last bank statement, September 15, 1995, the checkbook showed a balance of \$ 2,647.12, while the bank statement showed a balance of \$ 2,642.37, for a discrpancy of \$ 4.75, which considering the amount of money that has been transferred in and out of this account is de minimus,

Since that time, there was the aforementioned garage

sale, an election weekend rally at the Hibernian Hall, and contributions to political candidates. The balance as of December 10, 1995 was \$ 995.19, based upon the deposits and receipts, then subtracting ther outstanding checks. The actual balance is \$ 990.94, which is due to the \$.25 check charge and how it is reflected. Former Treasurer McCarthy, when doing the checkbook register, added \$.25 to the amount of each check to cover the bank charge. In other words, there would be a \$.25 difference between the check amount written in the register and the face amount of the check.

The new Treasurer, Tom O'Dea, will instead enter the same amount into the register as is written on the face of the check. The bank charges will be aggregated and subtracted from the register quarterly, to coincide with the bank statement. This is merely a change of method and no discrepancies should arise from the different system of accounting.

Finally, for information purposes, the next financial disclosure form is due to be filed by January 15, 1996.

After my review of the bank statements, cancelled checks, receipts, check registers, and financial disclosure statements of the Warren County Democratic Committee, I have found all expenses, deposits, and records to be accurate, reasonable, and legitimate.

This is to acknowledge receipt on September 25, 1997, of your letters dated September 12, 1997. The Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended and Commission Regulations require that the contents of a complaint meet certain specific requirements. One of these requirements is that a complaint be sworn to and signed in the presence of a notary public and notarized. Your letter did not contain a notarization on your signature and was not properly sworn to.

In order to file a legally sufficient complaint, you must swear before a notary that the contents of your complaint are true to the best of your knowledge. The notary must represent as part of the jurat that such swearing occurred. The preferred form is "Subscribed and sworn to before me on this _____ day of _____, 19__." A statement by the notary that the complaint was sworn to and subscribed before him/her also will be sufficient. We regret the inconvenience that these requirements may cause you, but we are not statutorily empowered to proceed with the handling of a compliance action unless all the statutory requirements are fulfilled. See 2 U.S.C. § 437g.

Please note that this matter will remain confidential for a 15 day period to allow you to correct the defects in your complaint. If the complaint is corrected and refiled within the 15 day period, the respondents will be so informed and provided a copy of the corrected complaint. The respondents will then have an additional 15 days to respond to the complaint on the merits. If the complaint is not corrected, the file will be closed and no additional notification will be provided to the respondents.

Enclosed is a Commission brochure entitled "Filing a Complaint." We have been referred to you by Mr. Stanley Zalen, Chief Enforcement Counsel of the New York State Board of Elections.

The signers of this letter, all present or former members of the Warren County Democratic Committee and several elected public officials of the City of Glens Falls, New York, have had a complaint before the New York State Board of Elections for some time. We only recently were told by the State Board that they did not feel they were the appropriate venue for the most serious of our complaints; the lesser charges they declined to pursue due to the lack of records.

The core of the matter which we understand will be of interest to the FEC is an illegal diversion of funds of the Warren County Democratic Committee in a Congressional campaign to evade Federal spending limits.

Specifically, in the 1994 election campaign of Robert Lawrence of Cleverdale, N.Y. for Congress, representing this area, funds of the Warren County Democratic Committee were funneled through county committees in Essex and Saratoga Counties, New York, to evade spending limits.

The Warren County Democratic Committee originally gave Mr.
Lawrence (without the knowledge or consent of the Committee as a whole) \$4,000 for his campaign. Mr. Lawrence's campaign shortly later returned the check to the County Chairman, Mr. William Montfort, who then knowingly illegally diverted the funds through

the Essex and Saratoga County Democratic Committees.

Remarkably, Mr. Montfort confirmed this transfer was illegal and knowingly done to evade Federal law during open discussion at the September, 1995 organizational meeting of the Warren County Democratic Committee.

This diversion was also later confirmed in a written report by Mr. Daniel Martindale, a member of the Warren County Committee and the new Chairman of the Glens Falls Democratic Committee.

The financial affairs of the Warren County Democratic Committee have been an issue with committee members and local elected officials since the Spring of 1995. Although a series of highly lucrative fund raisers had been held over the previous several years, it was discovered by several committee members who were also elected officials that over ten thousand dollars were essentially unaccounted for in the County Committee's treasury.

These officials, who included the elected City Treasurer of Glens Falls, NY, (who is a C.P.A.), the Glens Falls City Council President (the highest elected Democratic official in Warren County, N.Y.), two Democratic members of the City Council of Glens Falls, also County Committee members, the then Chair of the Glens Falls Democratic Committee and the Secretary/Treasurer of the Glens Falls Democratic Committee and others sought a financial accounting from Mr. William Montfort, the County Chair.

What followed is too involved to recap in this letter, but is well covered in the attached copies of our complaints sent to the New York State Board of Elections.

In short, Mr. Montfort organized an attack on these individuals and their family members in an all out effort to either intimidate them into silence or discredit them. Serious professional harm was done to some of these individuals, particularly to Ralph Farrell, the husband of Councilmember Margaret Farrell, who, thanks to Mr. Montfort's actions, was illegally terminated from his job with the

New York State Department of Environmental Conservation. (Mr. Farrell's termination is currently under litigation.) In an effort to deprive committee members of the support of the Glens Falls Democratic Committee, Mr. Montfort also challenged the nominating petition of the first black woman to seek membership of the Warren County Democratic Committee, We regard Mr. Montfort's actions to silence those questioning Committee financial affairs as further, though circumstantial, proof of his guilt. We believe they may also constitute Obstruction of Justice or other criminal offenses in and of themselves. believe they give you an better understanding of the general background; Mr. Montfort's illegal diversion of funds was but one part of a pattern of illegal or grossly abusive uses of County Committee funds. 10 The financial disclosure forms filed with the New York State Board of Elections will confirm the illegal transfers to the election effort of Mr. Robert Lawrence. This has also been extensively 20 investigated by the New York State Board. The facts of the matter are not in dispute. 00 Accordingly, we are submitting to you: 19 Copies of our complaints and correspondence with the New York 0 State Board of Elections. Copies of financial disclosure forms submitted to the the N.Y.S. 00 Board of Elections by Mr. Montfort and the Warren County ON Democratic Committee. · A copy of a report on County Committee finances by the Chairman of the Glens Falls Democratic Committee, Mr. Daniel Martindale. Miscellaneous notes and records. We will try to highlight what we believe are important sections for your attention. 3

We should note that the report issued by Mr. Martindale was yet another effort by Mr. Montfort to evade accountability and denu qualified members of the Committee (specifically our CPA City Treasurer) access to County records. Obviously, it backfired badly. We would also like to point out the the signers of this letter are mainly elected public officials who have sworn an Oath of Office to uphold the laws of the State of New York. The signers who are also City Council members of the City of Glens Falls are also legally Peace Officers. They feel they cannot look the other way in such a grave matter, and that a criminal complaint and investigation is called for. We are available for any further questions or requests for information by the FEC. We are confident you will find the actions detailed in this complaint as unlawful and unacceptable as we do. 5 Thank you for your time and attention. Sincerely,

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

CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

Pursuant to the resolution passed on September 27, 1995 at a meeting of the Warren County Democratic Committee, a full disclosure of the County Committee finances was made to the Executive Committee thereof on November 29, 1995. On December 10, 1995, Executive Committee members were given a second opportunity to inspect the cancelled checks, bank statements, check registers, receipts, and state financial disclosure statements from July 13, 1993 (7/13/93) to the present.

This report will cover four separate disclosure periods, coinciding with the financial disclosure statements, and a reconciliation for the statement to be filed by January 15, 1996. As background information, all receipts were in the form of what the general public would recognize as a receipt, or invoices. There were no bills of lading, bills of sale, etc. present.

Also, there is a \$.25 use fee charged with each check that is written. However, the way this fee is accounted for in the check register has changed with the ascension of Tom O'Dea as Treasurer. Former Treasurer Bill McCarthy recorded checks in the register with the \$.25 transaction fee included in the check amount. In other words, the amount on the face of the check and the amount recorded in the check register would differ by \$.25. However, the register and the bank statement would be accurate and the balances would match. The current treasurer has decided that the amount written on the face of the check will be the amount that is reflected in the check register. The aggregate amount of the

check charges will be deducted from the register quarterly, upon receipt of the quarterly bank statement. This change is merely one of method, and no discrepancies should arise therefrom.

PERIOD 1: JULY 13,1993 - JANUARY 12, 1994 (7/13/93-1/12/94)

During this time period, there were no events such as raffles or dinners. The major expense for this period was the County Democratic headquarters located in Glens Falls, where a majority of the candidates were running for office. During this time period, there were four checks issued for which there are no receipts:

- 1. A check in the amount of \$ 300.00 issued to the New York State Democratic Committee.
- 2. A check in the amount of \$ 214.74 issued for payment of utilities at County Headquarters.
- 3. A check in the amount of \$ 318.74 issued to Raplh Farrell for the phone bill at the County Headquarters.
- 4. A check in the amount of \$ 208.65 issued to Dick and Pat Dudley for decorations and refreshments associated with the County Headquarters.

There are no checks regarding the rent of the space used for the headquarters because the space was given rent-free. Also of interest was check # 2374. This check was in the amount of \$

500.00 issued to the Meeta for Supreme Court campaign committee.

This check was voided because it was returned by the Meeta

Committee.

The total receipts for the period of July 12, 1993 through January 13, 1994 totalled \$ 2,745.50. This figure is confirmed by the disclosure statement, bank statement, and the check register.

PERIOD 2: JANUARY 13, 1994 - JULY 12, 1994 (1/13/94-7/12/94)

There were two major events during this disclosure period. The first was the retirement dinner for former Mayor Frank O'Keefe. This event took place at the Queensbury Hotel. The total deposits and funds raised for this dinner were \$ 3,875.00. The total expenses for the event totalled \$ 2,460.37, leaving a total profit of \$ 1,414.63. After this event, two checks were issued for which no receipts were given. One check was for \$ 1,300.00, and the other was for \$ 200.00. Both checks were issued to former Mayor Frank O'Keefe.

The difference between the total profit of \$ 1,414.63 and the \$ 1,500.00 given to Frank O'Keefe was due to a billing error by the Queensbury Hotel. The Queensbury originally sent a bill for \$ 2,320.92. However, this bill did not include any tax. Thus, the original profit from the dinner was \$ 1,554.08. An amended bill was then sent which included tax in the amount of \$ 139.45. The new bill arrived after the aforementioned checks had been issued to former Mayor O'Keefe. At that point, it would have been

inappropriate to ask the former Mayor to return funds from his own retirement dinner. The other major event for that period was a raffle. Total deposits for the raffle were \$ 24,271.00, which came from the sale of 240 raffle tickets at \$ 100.00 each, plus a guest fee of \$ 12.00 for the dinner associated with the raffle. The expenses were \$ 11,300.00 in prizes, and \$ 1,925.00 for meals at the Colonial Arms, for a grand total of \$ 13,225.00. There were no receipts given for the checks issued as raffle prizes, nor was there a receipt given for the Colonial Arms bill. The question is, is \$ 1,925.00 a reasonable expense for dinners for 120 people. This averages out to \$ 16.04 per person. The total profit from this fundraiser was \$ 11,046.00. The total receipts for this period totalled \$ 28,146.00. N ON This figure matches the disclosure statement, check register and 0 bank statement. After expenses, the balance was \$ 9,870.85. M PERIOD 3: JULY 13, 1994 - JANUARY 12, 1994 (7/13/94-1/12/95) 0 For this disclosure period, there were four checks for ON which there are no receipts: 1) check # 2431 in the amount of \$ 100.00 issued to the Hearts and Flowers Committee. 2) check # 2445 in the amount of \$ 100.00 issued to the Hearts and Flowers Committee. 3) check # 2438 in the amount of \$ 510.00 issued to the Colonial Arms for the 1994 dinner rally. 4) check # 2435 in the amount of \$ 52.20 to the postmaster.

Receipts from the Hearts and Flowers committee are not to be expected, since it is a subcommittee of the County Committee. The question is, is it reasonable to spend \$ 100.00 on floral arrangements and cards for sick, injured, or hospitalized Democrats? It would seem so.

The postmaster receipt of \$ 52.50 would cover the postage for two (2) mailings to the County Committee membership, plus approximately thirty more envelopes, which with two weeks to go before the gubenatorial election is not unreasonable.

The major fundraiser during this period was a dinner at the Colonial Arms. The dinner was attended by 55 people. Total deposits for this dinner were \$ 1,330.00. The expenses were \$ 510.00, thus leaving a total profit of \$ 820.00. The total price of the dinners averages out to be \$ 9.27 per person, which is not an extravagant amount.

The bank statement shows a balance of \$ 3,406.20. This figure matched the check registers and receipts. However, there was a \$ 2,000.00 variance on the original disclosure sheet. The disclosure sheet showed an amount of \$ 1,406.20.

The variance arose out of a contribution to the Bob Lawrence for Congress campaign. A \$ 4,000.00 check was sent by the County Committee to the Lawrence Campaign as a contribution. \$2,000.00 was returned, since federal election law does not allow contributions of more than \$ 2,000.00. Two separate checks of \$ 1,000.00 each were then issued: #2436 was issued to the Essex County Democratic Committee and #2437 was issued to the Saratoga County Democratic Committee, which subsequently gave this money to

the Lawrence Campaign. Inter-County transfers such as these are not uncommon.

For the purposes of expediency, the checks were shown as \$ 4,000.00 going out in three checks, which is what was actually spent, but the \$ 2,000.00 that was returned by the Lawrence Campaign was never shown as a deposit, since it was immediately sent back out to the aforementioned County committees. This was simply a matter of accounting. However, the campaign disclosure form has since been amended to reflect the \$ 2,000.00 as a deposit. The amended statement was filed on December 11, 1995 and all statements, disclosures, registers, and receipts now reflect the figure of \$ 3,406.20.

Furthermore, check #2436, which was issued to the Essex County Democratic Committee was lost by that committee after the transfer had been made. On December 9, 1994, a stop check order was issued, with a fee of \$ 15.00 charged for doing so. That same day, check #2441 was issued to the Essex County Democratic Committee. Thus, there is no discrepancy.

PERIOD 4: JANUARY 13,1995 - JULY 12, 1995 (1/13/95-7/12/95)

During this period, no fundraisers were held by the COunty Committee. For this reporting period, there were two checks for which there are no receipts:

Check #2454 in the amount of \$ 86.40 to the Postmaster.

Check #2452 in the amount of \$ 100.00 to the Warrensburg

Chamber of Commerce.

The check issued to the Chamber of Commercewas an expense

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related to the World's Largest Garage Sale, which was held the weekend of September 30 / October 1, 1995. This fundraiser raised \$ 885.43 after expenses. The check to the postmaster was issued at the beginning of the petition circulation period. Also, there were two County Committee meetings, one in May and one in July, for which notices had to be sent. Thus, it would seem that a bill of \$ 86.40 is not unreasonable.

The campaign disclosure sheet shows that \$ 615.71 in deposits were made. This figure is also shown in the check register, but nothing appears on the bank statement. The figure is not shown on the bank statement because the \$ 615.71 came from outstanding checks, some which dated as far back as 1988, which were retired by former Treasurer Bill McCarthy. Because teh checks were never cashed, no funds were ever withdrawn from the bank account. Although there is the slight chance that these checks may be cashed, the prospects of this event occurring are not likely. These retired checks are listed as deposits on the disclosure statement because there is no area on the disclosure sheet where retired debts should be listed. Therefore, former Treasurer McCarthy listed these retired checks as deposits.

As of the last bank statement, September 15, 1995, the checkbook showed a balance of \$ 2,647.12, while the bank statement showed a balance of \$ 2,642.37, for a discrpancy of \$ 4.75, which considering the amount of money that has been transferred in and out of this account is de minimus,

Since that time, there was the aforementioned garage

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sale, an election weekend rally at the Mibernian Hall, and contributions to political candidates. The balance as of December 10, 1995 was \$ 995.19, based upon the deposits and receipts, then subtracting ther outstanding checks. The actual balance is \$ 990.94, which is due to the \$.25 check charge and how it is reflected. Former Treasurer McCarthy, when doing the checkbook register, added \$.25 to the amount of each check to cover the bank charge. In other words, there would be a \$.25 difference between the check amount written in the register and the face amount of the check.

The new Treasurer, Tom O'Dea, will instead enter the same amount into the register as is written on the face of the check. The bank charges will be aggregated and subtracted from the register quarterly, to coincide with the bank statement. This is merely a change of method and no discrepancies should arise from the different system of accounting.

Finally, for information purposes, the next financial disclosure form is due to be filed by January 15, 1996.

After my review of the bank statements, cancelled checks, receipts, check registers, and financial disclosure statements of the Warren County Democratic Committee, I have found all expenses, deposits, and records to be accurate, reasonable, and legitimate.

Dear Mr. Kazinsky; Due to the information received by us through your recent conversation with Lawrence A. Dudley, Secretary/Treasurer of the Glens Falls Democratic Committee, the undersigned members of the Glens Falls and Warren County Democratic Committees and all the elected Democratic public officials of the City of Glens Falls who are committee members, would like to officially request that the New York State Board of Elections conduct a formal audit of the finances of the Warren County Democratic Committee. This request is a result of a lengthy series of very troubling irregularities and actions by the Chairman of the Warren County Democratic N Committee, Mr. William Montfort of Johnsburg, and the Treasurer of the Warren County Democratic Committee, Mr. William McCarthy of Queensbury. To summarize: 19 · The Warren County Democratic Committee, to the knowledge of the signers, has never had an audit. · Approximately three or four years ago, Mr. Robert Fuller, then Chairman of the Queensbury Democratic Committee, became disturbed at the lack of 0 accountability and the vagueness of reports concerning the Warren County Democratic Committee's finances. Aware of the fiduciary responsibility 0 of all committee members, Mr. Fuller brought the subject up at an ON official meeting of the Warren County Democratic Committee. Despite protests from Mr. Montfort that an audit was not necessary, the Committee adopted a resolution, by a majority, to conduct an audit. When Mr. Fuller tried to carry through on this resolution, however, he was told by Mr. Montfort that a quorum did not exist at the meeting, and therefore the resolution was never legally adopted. This despite the fact an official meeting was held with a standard roll call. A quorum, in fact, had existed. Mr. Fuller continued for 18 months to try and see the Warren County Committee's books and financial records, absolutely without success. In the end, he simply gave up. · Financial statements or Treasurer's reports are never routinely presented at Warren County Democratic Committee meetings. · In fact, the Treasurer of the Warren County Democratic Committee, Mr. Page 1 of 7

William McCarthy, who is elderly and retired, spends the majority of the year living in retirement in Florida, leaving before Winter, returning only in late Spring or summer. · In order that the absence of a Treasurer to conduct the Warren County Democratic Committee's finances does not cause the County Committee to suspend operations for the lack of funds, Mr. McCarthy leaves behind a a stack of signed official checks of the Warren County Democratic Democratic Committee in the custody of County Chairman Mr. William Montfort, who is empowered to co-sign checks with the County Treasurer. In practice, Mr. Montfort can sign checks and expend funds of the Warren County Democratic Committee on his sole authority. · Over the last several years the Warren County Democratic Committee raised fairly substantial sums of money due to several highly successful fund raisers. At one point in 1994 the Warren County Democratic Committee had approximately \$14,000 in its treasury. · There were no local, that is City, Town or County races last year that would have prompted large expenditures of money. · Early last spring, several members of the Glens Falls Democratic Committee who are signatories of this letter discussed with Mr. Montfort another issuing of the Warren County Democrat, the County Committee's official newspaper, which in the past was issued before elections. The 0 release of such a paper would cost less than \$4,000. After initially being told there was enough money in the treasury to cover what had 00 always been the relatively modest cost of this newspaper, they were suddenly told not enough money was left. · After mulling over the problem for several months, it was decided to pursue checking out the exact state of the Warren County Democratic Committee's finances. At the regular June meeting of the Warren County Democratic Committee, several of the signers of this letter and other County Committee members asked for a financial accounting. At the 0 meeting Mr. Montfort stated that he could not give an accounting of the 3 County Committee's finances at that time. The signers of this letter and other members of the County Committee demanded and received a promise by Mr. Montfort that a full accounting would be made. · At the July meeting an extremely terse financial statement was issued by 0 Mr. Montfort and Mr. McCarthy. According to this report, which was read aloud since no copies were available for members of the County Committee, several thousand dollars had been expended in the last year on "operating expenses" of a committee in an off election year. 0 Furthermore, another, separate large sum was spent on repair or maintenance of a copy machine and other equipment, in fact, larger than such equipment would normally cost new. However, there were no details of any kind on what these large sums represented. Other funds seemed to be unaccounted for as well. Uncertain of the details of this verbal report, several of the signers of this letter asked for their own written copies. After a considerable delay, Lawrence Dudley, the Secretary/Treasurer of the Glens Falls Democratic Committee, received a single page copy, printed in extremely large type to fill up the page. The contents of this report, however, would fill a standard 3x5 card. · We would like to note in passing that Mr. Montfort treated all of the above requests with great resentment and hostility. · Paul Kemnitzer, a member of the Glens Falls and Warren County Committees, was particularly disturbed at these turns of events, and volunteered his professional services. Besides being a Committee member, Mr. Kemnitzer is also a Certified Public Accountant, the present incumbent City Treasurer of the City of Glens Falls, the Treasurer of the Glens Falls Industrial Development Agency and a member of the Glens Falls Local Development Corporation. At the July 14, 1995 meeting of the Warren County Democratic Committee Mr. Kemnitzer asked if he could see the County Committee's books. As the only CPA on the County Committee and the City Treasurer of Glens Falls, he regarded this as a normal and routine request. He even offered to go to Mr. McCarthy's house at a time of Mr. McCarthy's convenience. Instead of responding directly to this perfectly reasonable and routine request Mr. McCarthy silently turned to Mr. Montfort for instructions. Then Mr. McCarthy replied they would have to get the permission of the Finance Committee of the County Committee for such a request, which they regarded as something extraordinary, not routine. There was a vague commitment to honor Mr. Kemnitzer's request, which he took at face value. never heard from Mr. McCarthy. · The Finance Committee of the Warren County Democratic Committee is composed of Mr. Montfort, Mr. McCarthy and Mr. Mark Morgan, a committee member who lives down the road from Mr. Montfort in a very rural area of Johnsburg in the northern part of Warren County. Obviously, Mr. Montfort and Mr. McCarthy could have agreed on the spot to Mr. Kemnitzer's request. · Sometime later in August, Mr. Kemnitzer discovered that a highly irregular challenge had been made to the petitions of his and his father, Mr. John Kemnitzer, a former Councilman of the City of Glens Falls. Since the New York State Board of Elections has been made aware of this matter in detail through other actions taken by Mr. Kemnitzer, who has retained Counsel, this letter will not delve into this matter in detail. However, to summarize the matter briefly, it is felt this situation was created in a deliberate attempt to force Mr. Kemnitzer from the Warren County Committee in an effort to prevent his reviewing the Warren County Democratic Committee's finances by denying him eligibility. · In addition, efforts were made by Mr. Montfort or at his behest, to prevent other residents of the City of Glens Falls from securing open, uncontested seats on the Warren County Democratic Committee, or running in primaries. Five calls were made to Ms. Jean Rikhoff of Glens Falls, a recently retired professor at Adirondack Community College, to dissuade her from running in a primary. She agreed to withdraw with the understanding she would be placed in another seat; however she was not informed that she would lose her vote at the organizational meeting. In addition, other petitions were challenged under suspicious circumstances. A petition was circulated for Ms. Florida James of Glens Falls, also a recently retired professor at Adirondack Community College and the only African-American candidate for the County Committee, by two of the singers of this letter. Her petition appeared to be irregularly challenged. It is our understanding from reading the Charter of the County Committee, it is the responsibility of Mrs. Montfort to inform Page 3 of 7

candidates or those who file their petitions of any problems and how to correct them. Another signer of this letter brought the petition to Mrs. Montfort at her office and no effort was made by her to review the petition for any problems. We later learned that a Mr. Buell Brayton, a fellow Democrat, challenged that petition. When Richard Dudley, who circulated the petition for Ms. James, called him, Mr. Brayton would not give him any explanation and added that he had not even seen the In sum, it would appear a concerted effort was made to prevent the Glens Falls Democratic Committee from having any additional seats on the County Committee. In addition, Mrs. Montfort, without consulting with the Glens Falis Committee, moved committee members to wards and districts where they would have a smaller weighted vote. All this was done to prevent elected officials in Glens Falls and the Glens Falls Committee from having the votes to investigate the state of the County Committee's finances. You can imagine our frustration in trying to build the Glens Falls Committee with members who would add significantly to our Committees, only to have these efforts thwarted by Mr. and Mrs. Montfort. · On August 16 a letter was drafted and sent by Glens Fall Democratic Committee Chair Margaret Farrell asking to see the County Committee's books, registers and check stubs. Mrs. Farrell, who works an irregular OI schedule at night as supervisor of the pediatric critical care unit at Glens Falls Hospital, asked that the records be brought by Mr. 00 Montfort's spouse, Mrs. Lois Montfort, the Warren County Commissioner of Elections for the Democratic Party, to the Warren County Municipal Center. She has never received a reply. 34 Some of the committee members of the Warren County Democratic Committee 0 undoubtedly would prefer that this matter, no matter how serious, be swept 00 under the rug. However, the signers of this letter, who are mainly elected public officials, have sworn an Oath of Office to uphold the laws of the State 3 of New York. The signers who are also City Council members of the City of Glens Falls are also legally peace officers. They feel they cannot look the other way in such a grave matter. 0 It is our belief the New York State Board of Elections can hardly do so either, given the mass of material presented in this letter. We feel that 00 because of the upcoming biannual election of officers required after the primary, the State Board of Elections should pursue the requested audit as soon as possible. Thank You. Firstly, we will attempt to comply with your request for the Financial O Disclosure Statements of the Warren Democratic Committee, although, 00 frankly, we feel this is an investigative responsibility best handled by the State Board of Elections. N But we are puzzled at the idea, implicit in your request, that these statements may have any bearing whatsoever on reality or that one could expect to learn anything from looking at them. If possible wrong doing is occurring, is one to seriously expect truthful statements from possible 2 wrong doers on what they have been doing? Such a Financial Statement would constitute proof under law against such possible wrong doers. No 0 possible wrong doer is likely to incriminate themselves in such a manner. In short, the request seems to be a pointless diversion. Only a direct examination of the County Committee's books, check stubs and registers. 2 etc., can possibly yield any light on this matter. Furthermore, we must point out that these Financial Disclosure Statements are in the custody of the spouse of one of the individuals who is a central figure in this situation. Surely you must recognize how this greatly complicates matters. For instance, if she refuses to let us see them, is the State Board going to tell us to get a FOIL while more time is needlessly lost? 1 of 4

Beyond that, there seems to us to be a real danger that such a request, or the Civil Proceeding you have suggested, is likely to prompt a destruction of records by possible wrong doers, who might well decide that the consequences of destroying records would be significantly less severe than those for other misdeeds which intact records might reveal. We are also troubled by what seems to be an implication in your letter that a Criminal Investigation can only stem from a Civil Proceeding. If true, this is a novel concept in law enforcement. Finally, exactly what bearing does 16-114 have on the reporting of finances of the Warren County Democratic Committee? 16-114 speaks only of candidates and campaign expenditures - not Constituted Committees, which, according to the manual on Financial Disclosure of the State Board of Elections, are held to somewhat different standards, for just one example, on the reporting of what are called "housekeeping expenditures," etc. 00 On your letter's final point, we did not state that Mrs. Montfort changed petitions after they were filed. The point we made is that 20 committee members in Glens Falls discovered they had been moved without their knowledge when they received their petitions, and also 00 without any notification to the Glens Falls Democratic Committee, into different wards and election districts, which would force them into primaries if they wanted to run for their original seats. These actions are part of a consistent overall pattern of actions to prevent any financial accountability, like trying to force the only Certified Public Accountant on the County Committee off the Committee when he asked to see the books. 0 Finally, we would like to pose an additional question. We understand the State Election Law requires the election of officers within 19 days of the Primary Election. Given the possible irregularities in the Warren County Democratic Committee, are there any circumstances under which this election may be postponed? It seems to us that due diligence and speed is required in this matter. We thank you for your prompt attention to this grave and serious matter. 2 of 4

Thank you for your last letter, your advice and your prompt response to this situation.

You will find enclosed copies the financial disclosure statements of the Warren County Democratic Committee covering the financial reporting period from July 1994 to July 1995.

Although we had no luck in securing these forms directly from Mrs. Montfort, the wife of County Chairman William Montfort, the principal figure in creating this situation, we were able to secure these forms through the intervention of the <u>Post-Star</u> newspaper of Glens Falls, N.Y, probably because they have lawyers on retainer. Although necessarily cursory in character, we believe these forms raise many extremely serious questions, which we will detail in an attached memorandum.

However, our principal concern at this moment is a series of actions, some of which we believe represent further serious illegalities, taken by Mr. William Montfort, the Warren County Democratic Chairman, to prevent an accounting of the finances of the Warren County Democratic Committee.

We have learned that on August 27 or 28, a secret and we believe illegal meeting of the Warren County Democratic Committee was held at the Hibernian Hall in Glens Falls, N.Y. All the signers of this letter, including all the party officers of the Glens Falls Democratic Committee and all the elected Democratic public officials of the City of Glens Falls who are members of the Warren County Democratic Committee and the Glens Falls

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Democratic Committee, were deliberately not informed of this meeting by Mr. Mortfort. Not a single one received the required notification in the mail. That one, or possibly two members might not receive such a notice in the mail due to the vagaries of the Post Service might be understandable, but as far as we can determine at this moment, at least 14 or 15 members of the Warren County and Glens Falls Democratic Committees were deliberately not informed of this meeting, in violation, as we understand it, not only of the by-laws of the Warren County Democratic Committee, but also the New York State Democratic Committee and the Election Law of the State of New York.

We believe the purpose of this secret meeting, held before the primary election, but including new members not yet on the Committee, was to suborn or arrange a fraudulent election of officers for the Glens Falls Democratic Committee in an attempt to block their legitimate request for a proper financial accounting of the Warren County Democratic Committee. Mr. Montfort called, organized and planed this meeting. At this secret meeting, a carefully orchestrated effort was organized to obtain proxy votes, possibly under false pretenses, to fraudulently overthrow the existing leadership of the City Democratic Committee. In addition, towards that end, charges were apparently made to those attending this secret meeting against those individuals who were seeking an accounting of the Warren County Committee's finances, which they, obviously, could not correct or defend themselves against because they were deliberately excluded.

It is likely some of those attending this secret meeting may not have been as fully aware as they should have been as to the true nature of the situation; the absence of so many other committee members may have been explained away in some manner. However, as always, ignorance of the law is no excuse.

A new slate of officers was prepared, including Mr. Daniel Martindale of Glens Falls, a young, recently graduated law student, for City Chair. At the present time, we believe that Mr. Martindale, in effect, was a "patsy" in this affair, unaware of the larger ramifications of what going on, i.e. that he was participating in a cover-up and general effort to forestall an accounting of the Warren County Democratic Committee's flances. After

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learning of these larger ramifications, Mr. Martindale became extremely concerned also, partly over concern of his own potential culpability in a cover-up, and has been cooperating with the signers of this letter.

Information concerning this meeting was conveyed to the signers of this letter on the date of the organizational meeting of the Warren County Democratic Committee, September 27, 1995: Colleen Daly, a committee member from Glens Falls, admitted to Lawrence A. Dudley that she had received the letter after the Glens Falls Committee's picnic in late August and that the meeting was held about two or three weeks earlier. Bret and Ray Blanchard, County Committee members from Stoney Creek, admitted to Margaret Farrell and her husband Ralph Farrell that the secret meeting had been held at the Hibernian Hall. Daniel Martindale of Glens Falls admitted to Margaret Farrell and Lawrence Dudley that the meeting was held.

We would note several aspects of this secret meeting; at the recent organizational meeting of the County Committee, there was a limited Treasurer's Report to the effect that the Warren County Democratic Committee now had \$2,462 in its account. At the time of the statutory filing date on July 15, that number stood at \$3,150 — that is \$688 dollars was expended in about two months time. The State Board needs to be aware that it is probable that a significant portion of these funds were spent for the purpose of electioneering for party elections, which we understand is a violation of the Election Law and a misdemeanor. Furthermore, rent may have been paid to the Hibernian Hall, which would also fall into this same category of prohibited expenditures. We have been told by sources close to the management of the Hibernian Hall that the hall was rented and paid for with a check.

It appears this meeting was planed and coordinated with other actions referenced in earlier letters or in different actions; i.e. the effort to prevent new members like Ms. Rickhoff and Ms. James to acquire seats on the Warren County and Glens Falls Committees, and the effort to challenge Paul and John Kemnitzer's nominating petitions, who are represented by Counsel and are undertaking action before your Board in separate actions. These efforts were made to subvert, in a general sense, the legitimate inquiry being made by Glens Falls Democratic Committee members into

the County Committee's finances by personally discrediting those making these inquiries and subverting the Glens Falls Democratic Committee as a necessary and proper forum to investigate these matters. Ironically, after Mr. Martindale became aware of the full situation facing the Warren County Democratic Committee, he, at the request of the signers of this letter, and because of his concern over the issue of his own potential complicity in this matter, volunteered to sponsor a resolution at the Warren County Democratic Committee's organization meeting calling for the opening of the County Committee's books, which would allow an audit. Predictably, this motion failed, 30-21, proxy votes figured in. However, a weakened version of this motion calling for opening and inspection of all books and records by the County Executive Board (composed of certain of Mr. Montfort's appointees and the City and Town 17 Chairs) did pass. It remains to be seen whether or not this measure will yield any revelation or not, given this board's restricted composition. We should also note in passing, that Mr. William McCarthy, of Queensbury, the former Treasurer of the Warren County Democratic Committee, abruptly refused to accept renomination as treasurer. We believe this was because the information contained on the financial disclosure forms was circulated at the Glens Falls Democratic Meeting the 3 previous night. The signers of this and the previous letters have not regarded Mr. McCarthy as the principle figure in this matter. Although he may have information useful to the State Board of Elections, we do not feel Mr. McCarthy, who is retired and spends most of the year in Florida, should be regarded as a potential target for investigation. The principal figure is Mr. Montfort. All this leads to several important questions: Does the calling of this secret meeting by Mr. Montfort in this manner for this purpose render the elections in the Glens Falls Democratic Committee and possibly in the Warren County Democratic

Committee null and void? If so, can new elections be ordered or held? If fraud or other illegalities occurred in this matter, can Mr. Montfort and other be removed from the Committee by the State Board of Elections? Can they be criminally prosecuted for this matter, separate from the issue of financial improprieties? Although our initial concern in this entire matter was what we believe was the appearance of serious illegalities in the finances of the Warren County Democratic Committee, we believe these new events are also so serious as to merit, in effect, an entire separate investigation. We are also concerned about one other matter concerning the Glens Falls Committee. The members of the Glens Falls Democratic Committee charged with control of the Glens Falls Committee's finances, Margaret Farrell and Lawrence Dudley, feel it would be inappropriate and probably a serious legal breach of their fiduciary responsibilities to hand over control of the Glens Falls Committees finances, however meager (\$359), if any of these concerns set forth in this letter are correct. Perhaps the State Board of Elections should consider immediately 00 freezing the Glens Falls Democratic Committee's finances until these questions are fully resolved. One final matter: we believe the State Board of Elections should 0 carefully investigate the conduct and financial arrangements of a banquet/raffle held by the Warren County Democratic Committee in the 20 Spring of 1994 and 1993, and in several previous years. These raffles featured a \$100 ticket including a dinner. Typically, 250 tickets were sold. The prize was \$10,000. What may be potential irregularities in regard to these raffles, including the final drawing of prizes, sale of tickets and patterns of prize winners, may be the most explosive issue in regard to the Warren County Democratic Committee's finances. I.e. There may be a possibility at least one at least one or more of these raffles may have been rigged or debauched in some manner or form. It is also our experience individuals around the raffle are those showing the most resistance to any financial accountability.

We would like to note that the elected officials of the City of Glens Falls who are signatories of this letter were so concerned about the propriety of elected public officials selling such tickets to people living in their jurisdiction, that they refused to sell any to people in upstate New York, only buying tickets for themselves and selling a few to personal friends in New York City. Again, let us express our appreciation to you for your prompt attention to these matters. Thank you. We 0 are still trying to obtain additional information, particularly on the secret. and we believe illegal, meeting held by Mr. Montfort for the purposes of frustrating a financial disclosure of the Warren County Committee's N finances. Since our last letter we have learned the following, all of which we believe are further serious matters of concern: 00 · We have been told by Mr. Montfort repeatedly over the years that 3 weighted votes were only required at the biannual elections. We have since determined under our by-laws and, we believe, state law, 0 that this is in fact not the case. This means that the resolutions over the years requiring an accounting of the Warren County Democratic 00 Committee's finances almost certainly passed and were improperly frustrated. In particular, a roll-call vote was held at this year's organizational meeting. It failed on a straight-line vote of 30-21. However, those voting in favor of the resolution were entirely from the more heavily democratic districts in the City of Glens Falls while those opposed to it were mainly from the sparsely populated districts up county. We think it is inconceivable that given a weighted vote, this resolution would not have passed. It is Mr. Montfort's duty as Chairman to see that the by-laws of the Committee and the State Election Law is upheld. Instead, he has seriously abused this responsibility to prevent an accounting of the 1 of 4

Committee finances. · The by-laws of the Warren County Committee specify that the Finance Committee of the County Committee has the power on its own to "allocate funds to endorsed candidates." No mention is made is made of any other disbursements, i.e. operating or "housekeeping expenses". We believe it is clear that only the County Committee as a whole can authorize such expenditures. • Furthermore, the Finance Committee is exclusively appointed by the Chairman of the County Committee and serves exclusively at his pleasure. Clearly, the potential for abuse in such an arrangement is great. Because of these comments by Mr. Montfort regarding weighted voting, elections in the Glens Falls Democratic Committee and the various town committees (such as they are large enough to actually elect officers) were not conducted using weighted votes. This raises serious questions. Were the last elections in the Glens Falls C Democratic Committee legal? · Finally, Mr. Montfort told the membership of the Warren County Democratic Committee at this year's organizational meeting that bylaws had to be adopted every two years. It is now our 2 understanding that there is no such requirement. Further, on checking, we realized no by-laws were adopted at the 1993 organizational meeting of the Warren County Democratic Committee. However, at the organizational meeting Mr.Montfort claimed that by-3 laws were adopted two years ago and that the Committee was merely voting to renew the by-laws, which it ostensibly did. We are 0 concerned at what by-laws exactly have been filed with the State and County Boards. Since none were adopted at the 1993 meeting, 00 the only valid ones were the ones adopted in 1991. We believe ON there is a possibility of an attempt to register some other, essentially bogus or fraudulent document, which may be different from the ones legally in force, possibly for further frustrating a legitimate accounting of the Committee's finances or the additional purpose of a coverup. We hope this material is of further use to you. We will be looking forward to hearing from you on these matters and if you need any further information. 2 of 4

Thank you for your all your time and attention to this serious problem. Let us assure you, we, and the disgusted voters of Warren County, will appreciate it. 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This is to acknowledge receipt of your letter dated October 7, 1997. As we previously notified you on September 29, 1997, the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended and Commission Regulations require that the contents of a complaint meet certain specific requirements. Your most recent letter does not meet these requirements. Although your letter was signed in the presence of a notary public and notarized, it was not sworn to, as required.

In order to file a legally sufficient complaint, you must swear before a notary that the contents of your complaint are true to the best of your knowledge and the notary must represent as part of the jurat that such swearing occurred. The preferred form is "Subscribed and sworn to before me on this _____ day of _____, 19__." A statement by the notary that the complaint was sworn to and subscribed before her also will be sufficient.

Please note that this matter will remain confidential for a 15 day period to allow you to correct the defects in your complaint. If the complaint is corrected and refiled within the 15 day period, the respondents will be so informed and provided a copy of the corrected complaint. The respondents will then have an additional 15 days to respond to the complaint on the merits. If the complaint is not corrected, the file will be closed and no additional notification will be provided to the respondents.

We regret the inconvenience that these requirements may cause you, but we are not statutorily empowered to proceed with the handling of a compliance action unless all the statutory requirements are fulfilled. See 2 U.S.C. § 437g. If you have any questions concerning this matter, please contact me at (202) 219-3410.

St. NW Washington, D.C. 20463 Dear Sir/Madam: We have been referred to you by Mr. Stanley Zalen, Chief Enforcement Counsel of the New York State Board of Elections. The signers of this letter, all present or former members of the Warren County Democratic Committee and several elected public officials of the City of Glens Falls, New York, have had a complaint before the New York State Board of Elections for some time. We only recently were told by the State Board that they did not feel they were the appropriate venue for the most serious of our complaints; the lesser charges they declined to pursue due to the lack of records. ON The core of the matter which we understand will be of interest to the FEC is an illegal diversion of funds of the Warren County Democratic Committee in a Congressional campaign to evade Federal spending limits. Specifically, in the 1994 election campaign of Robert Lawrence of Cleverdale, N.Y. for Congress, representing this area, funds of the Warren County Democratic Committee were funneled through county committees in Essex and Saratoga Counties, New York, to evade spending limits. The Warren County Democratic Committee originally gave Mr. Lawrence (without the knowledge or consent of the Committee as a whole) \$4,000 for his campaign. Mr. Lawrence's campaign shortly later returned the check to the County Chairman, Mr. William Montfort, who then knowingly illegally diverted the funds through the Essex and Saratoga County Democratic 1 of 6

Committees. Remarkably, Mr. Montfort confirmed this transfer was illegal and knowingly done to evade Federal law during open discussion at the September, 1995 organizational meeting of the Warren County Democratic Committee. This diversion was also later confirmed in a written report by Mr. Daniel Martindale, a member of the Warren County Committee and the new Chairman of the Glens Falls Democratic Committee. The financial affairs of the Warren County Democratic Committee have been an issue with committee members and local elected officials since the Spring of 1995. Although a series of highly lucrative fund raisers had been held over the previous several years, it was discovered by several committee members who were also elected officials that over ten thousand dollars were essentially unaccounted for in the County Committee's treasury. These officials, who included the elected City Treasurer of Glens Falls, NY, (who is a C.P.A.), the Glens Falls City Council President (the highest elected Democratic official in Warren County, N.Y.), two Democratic members of the City Council of Glens Falls, also County Committee members, the then Chair of the Glens Falls Democratic Committee and the Secretary/Treasurer of the Glens Falls Democratic Committee and others sought a financial accounting from Mr. William Montfort, the County Chair. What followed is too involved to recap in this letter, but is well covered in the attached copies of our complaints sent to the New York State Board of Elections. In short, Mr. Montfort organized an attack on these individuals and their family members in an all out effort to either intimidate them into silence or discredit them. Serious professional harm was done to some of these individuals, particularly to Ralph Farrell, the husband of Councilmember Margaret Farrell, who, thanks to Mr. Montfort's actions, was illegally terminated from his job with the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation. (Mr. Farrell's termination is currently under litigation.) In an effort to deprive committee members of the support of the Glens Falls Democratic Committee, Mr. Montfort also challenged the nominating petition of the first black woman to seek membership of the Warren County Democratic Committee. We regard Mr. Montfort's actions to silence those questioning Committee financial affairs as further, though circumstantial, proof of his guilt. We believe they may also constitute Obstruction of Justice or other criminal offenses in and of themselves. We also believe they give you an better understanding of the general background; Mr. Montfort's illegal diversion of funds was but one part of a pattern of illegal or grossly abusive uses of County Committee funds. The financial disclosure forms filed with the New York State Board of Elections will confirm the illegal transfers to the election effort of Mr. Robert Lawrence. This has also been extensively investigated by the New York State Board. The facts of the matter are not in dispute. Accordingly, we are submitting to you: · Copies of our complaints and correspondence with the New York State Board of 2 of 6

 Copies of financial disclosure forms submitted to the N.Y.S. Board of Elections by Mr. Montfort and the Warren County Democratic Committee. · A copy of a report on County Committee finances by the Chairman of the Glens Falls Democratic Committee, Mr. Daniel Martindale. Miscellaneous notes and records. We will try to highlight what we believe are important sections for your attention. We should note that the report issued by Mr. Martindale was yet another effort by Mr. Montfort to evade accountability and deny qualified members of the Committee (specifically our CPA City Treasurer) access to County records. Obviously, it backfired badly. We would also like to point out the the signers of this letter are mainly elected public officials who have sworn an Oath of Office to uphold the laws of the State of New York. The signers who are also City Council members of the City of Glens Falls are also legally Peace Officers. They feel they cannot look the other way in such a grave matter, and that a criminal complaint and investigation is called for. We are available for any further questions or requests for information by the FEC. We are confident you will find the actions detailed in this complaint as unlawful and unacceptable as we do. 

CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

Pursuant to the resolution passed on September 27, 1995 at a meeting of the Warren County Democratic Committee, a full disclosure of the County Committee finances was made to the Executive Committee thereof on November 29, 1995. On December 10, 1995, Executive Committee members were given a second opportunity to inspect the cancelled checks, bank statements, check registers, receipts, and state financial disclosure statements from July 13, 1993 (7/13/93) to the present.

This report will cover four separate disclosure periods, coinciding with the financial disclosure statements, and a reconciliation for the statement to be filed by January 15, 1996. As background information, all receipts were in the form of what the general public would recognize as a receipt, or invoices. There were no bills of lading, bills of sale, etc. present.

Also, there is a \$.25 use fee charged with each check that is written. However, the way this fee is accounted for in the check register has changed with the ascension of Tom O'Dea as Treasurer. Former Treasurer Bill McCarthy recorded checks in the register with the \$.25 transaction fee included in the check amount. In other words, the amount on the face of the check and the amount recorded in the check register would differ by \$.25. However, the register and the bank statement would be accurate and the balances would match. The current treasurer has decided that the amount written on the face of the check will be the amount that is reflected in the check register. The aggregate amount of the

check charges will be deducted from the register quarterly, upon receipt of the quarterly bank statement. This change is merely one of method, and no discrepancies should arise therefrom. PERIOD 1: JULY 13,1993 - JANUARY 12, 1994 (7/13/93-1/12/94) During this time period, there were no events such as raffles or dinners. The major expense for this period was the County Democratic headquarters located in Glens Falls, where a majority of the candidates were running for office. During this S time period, there were four checks issued for which there are no CV receipts: 00 25 2 1. A check in the amount of \$ 300.00 issued to the New York 00 State Democratic Committee. 3 2. A check in the amount of \$ 214.74 issued for payment of V. utilities at County Headquarters. 0 3. A check in the amount of \$ 318.74 issued to Raplh Farrell for the phone bill at the County Headquarters. 4. A check in the amount of \$ 208.65 issued to Dick and Pat Dudley for decorations and refreshments associated with the County Headquarters. There are no checks regarding the rent of the space used for the headquarters because the space was given rent-free. Also of interest was check # 2374. This check was in the amount of \$

700.00 issued to the Meeta for Supreme Court campaign committee.

This check was voided because it was returned by the Meeta

Committee.

The total receipts for the period of July 12, 1993 through January 13, 1994 totalled \$ 2,745.50. This figure is confirmed by the disclosure statement, bank statement, and the check register.

PERIOD 2: JANUARY 13, 1994 - JULY 12, 1994 (1/13/94-7/12/94)

There were two major events during this disclosure period. The first was the retirement dinner for former Mayor Frank O'Keefe. This event took place at the Queensbury Hotel. The total deposits and funds raised for this dinner were \$ 3,875.00. The total expenses for the event totalled \$ 2,460.37, leaving a total profit of \$ 1,414.63. After this event, two checks were issued for which no receipts were given. One check was for \$ 1,300.00, and the other was for \$ 200.00. Both checks were issued to former Mayor Frank O'Keefe.

The difference between the total profit of \$ 1,414.63 and the \$ 1,500.00 given to Frank O'Keefe was due to a billing error by the Queensbury Hotel. The Queensbury originally sent a bill for \$ 2,320.92. However, this bill did not include any tax. Thus, the original profit from the dinner was \$ 1,554.08. An amended bill was then sent which included tax in the amount of \$ 139.45. The new bill arrived after the aforementioned checks had been issued to former Mayor O'Keefe. At that point, it would have been

sale of 240 raffle tickets at \$ 100.00 each, plus a quest fee of \$ 12.00 for the dinner associated with the raffle. The expenses were \$ 11,300.00 in prizes, and \$ 1,925.00 for meals at the Colonial Arms, for a grand total of \$ 13,225.00. There were no receipts given for the checks issued as raffle prizes, nor was there a receipt given for the Colonial Arms bill. The question is, is \$ 1,925.00 a reasonable expense for dinners for 120 people. This averages out to \$ 16.04 per person. The total profit from N this fundraiser was \$ 11,046.00. 03 The total receipts for this period totalled \$ 28,146.00. 172 This figure matches the disclosure statement, check register and 2 00 bank statement. After expenses, the balance was \$ 9,870.85. M PERIOD 3: JULY 13, 1994 - JANUARY 12, 1994 (7/13/94-1/12/95) 0 For this disclosure period, there were four checks for which there are no receipts: 1) check # 2431 in the amount of \$ 100.00 issued to the Hearts and Flowers Committee. 2) check # 2445 in the amount of \$ 100.00 issued to the Hearts and Flowers Committee. 3) check # 2438 in the amount of \$ 510.00 issued to the Colonial Arms for the 1994 dinner rally. 4) check # 2435 in the amount of \$ 52.20 to the postmaster.

The other major event for that period was a raffle.

retirement dinner.

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Receipts from the Hearts and Flowers committee are not to be expected, since it is a subcommittee of the County Committee. The question is, is it reasonable to spend \$ 100.00 on floral arrangements and cards for sick, injured, or hospitalized Democrats? It would seem so.

The postmaster receipt of \$ 52.50 would cover the postage for two (2) mailings to the County Committee membership, plus approximately thirty more envelopes, which with two weeks to go before the gubenatorial election is not unreasonable.

The major fundraiser during this period was a dinner at the Colonial Arms. The dinner was attended by 55 people. Total deposits for this dinner were \$ 1,330.00. The expenses were \$ 510.00, thus leaving a total profit of \$ 820.00. The total price of the dinners averages out to be \$ 9.27 per person, which is not an extravagant amount.

The bank statement shows a balance of \$ 3,406.20. This figure matched the check registers and receipts. However, there was a \$ 2,000.00 variance on the original disclosure sheet. The disclosure sheet showed an amount of \$ 1,406.20.

The variance arose out of a contribution to the Bob Lawrence for Congress campaign. A \$ 4,000.00 check was sent by the County Committee to the Lawrence Campaign as a contribution. \$2,000.00 was returned, since federal election law does not allow contributions of more than \$ 2,000.00. Two separate checks of \$ 1,000.00 each were then issued: #2436 was issued to the Essex County Democratic Committee and #2437 was issued to the Saratoga County Democratic Committee, which subsequently gave this money to

the Lawrence Campaign. Inter-County transfers such as these are not uncommon. For the purposes of expediency, the checks were shown as \$ 4,000.00 going out in three checks, which is what was actually spent, but the \$ 2,000.00 that was returned by the Lawrence Campaign was never shown as a deposit, since it was immediately sent back out to the aforementioned County committees. This was simply a matter of accounting. However, the campaign disclosure form has since been amended to reflect the \$ 2,000.00 as a deposit. The amended statement was filed on December 11, 1995 and all statements, disclosures, registers, and receipts now reflect the figure of \$ 3,406.20. ON Furthermore, check #2436, which was issued to the Essex 00 ON County Democratic Committee was lost by that committee after the transfer had been made. On December 9, 1994, a stop check order 0 was issued, with a fee of \$ 15.00 charged for doing so. That same day, check #2441 was issued to the Essex County Democratic Committee. Thus, there is no discrepancy. 0 00 PERIOD 4: JANUARY 13,1995 - JULY 12, 1995 (1/13/95-7/12/95) During this period, no fundraisers were held by the COunty Committee. For this reporting period, there were two checks for which there are no receipts: Check #2454 in the amount of \$ 86.40 to the Postmaster. Check #2452 in the amount of \$ 100.00 to the Warrensburg Chamber of Commerce. The check issued to the Chamber of Commercewas an expense 96043892830

related to the World's Largest Garage Sale, which was held the weekend of September 30 / October 1, 1995. This fundraiser raised \$ 885.43 after expenses. The check to the postmaster was issued at the beginning of the petition circulation period. Also, there were two County Committee meetings, one in May and one in July, for which notices had to be sent. Thus, it would seem that a bill of \$ 86.40 is not unreasonable.

The campaign disclosure sheet shows that \$ 615.71 in deposits were made. This figure is also shown in the check register, but nothing appears on the bank statement. The figure is not shown on the bank statement because the \$ 615.71 came from outstanding checks, some which dated as far back as 1988, which were retired by former Treasurer Bill McCarthy. Because teh checks were never cashed, no funds were ever withdrawn from the bank account. Although there is the slight chance that these checks may be cashed, the prospects of this event occurring are not likely. These retired checks are listed as deposits on the disclosure statement because there is no area on the disclosure sheet where retired debts should be listed. Therefore, former Treasurer McCarthy listed these retired checks as deposits.

As of the last bank statement, September 15, 1995, the checkbook showed a balance of \$ 2,647.12, while the bank statement showed a balance of \$ 2,642.37, for a discrpancy of \$ 4.75, which considering the amount of money that has been transferred in and out of this account is de minimus,

Since that time, there was the aforementioned garage

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sale, an election weekend rally at the Hibernian Hall, and contributions to political candidates. The balance as of December 10, 1995 was \$ 995.19, based upon the deposits and receipts, then subtracting ther outstanding checks. The actual balance is \$ 990.94, which is due to the \$.25 check charge and how it is reflected. Former Treasurer McCarthy, when doing the checkbook register, added \$.25 to the amount of each check to cover the bank charge. In other words, there would be a \$.25 difference between the check amount written in the register and the face amount of the check.

The new Treasurer, Tom O'Dea, will instead enter the same amount into the register as is written on the face of the check. The bank charges will be aggregated and subtracted from the register quarterly, to coincide with the bank statement. This is merely a change of method and no discrepancies should arise from the different system of accounting.

Finally, for information purposes, the next financial disclosure form is due to be filed by January 15, 1996.

After my review of the bank statements, cancelled checks, receipts, check registers, and financial disclosure statements of the Warren County Democratic Committee, I have found all expenses, deposits, and records to be accurate, reasonable, and legitimate.

Dear Mr. Kazinsky; Due to the information received by us through your recent conversation with Lawrence A. Dudley, Secretary/Treasurer of the Glens Falls Democratic Committee, the undersigned members of the Glens Falls and Warren County Democratic Committees and all the elected Democratic public officials of the City of Glens Falls who are committee members, would like to officially request that the New York State Board of Elections conduct a formal audit of the finances of the Warren County Democratic Committee. This request is a result of a lengthy series of very troubling 0 irregularities and actions by the Chairman of the Warren County Democratic Committee, Mr. William Montfort of Johnsburg, and the Treasurer of the Warren County Democratic Committee, Mr. William McCarthy of Queensbury. To summarize: · The Warren County Democratic Committee, to the knowledge of the signers, has never had an audit. · Approximately three or four years ago, Mr. Robert Fuller, then Chairman of the Queensbury Democratic Committee, became disturbed at the lack of 0 accountability and the vagueness of reports concerning the Warren County Democratic Committee's finances. Aware of the fiduciary responsibility of all committee members, Mr. Fuller brought the subject up at an official meeting of the Warren County Democratic Committee. Despite protests from Mr. Montfort that an audit was not necessary, the Committee adopted a resolution, by a majority, to conduct an audit. When Mr. Fuller tried to carry through on this resolution, however, he was told by Mr. Montfort that a quorum did not exist at the meeting, and therefore the resolution was never legally adopted. This despite the fact an official meeting was held with a standard roll call. A quorum, in fact, had existed. Mr. Fuller continued for 18 months to try and see the Warren County Committee's books and financial records, absolutely without success. In the end, he simply gave up. Financial statements or Treasurer's reports are never routinely presented at Warren County Democratic Committee meetings. In fact, the Treasurer of the Warren County Democratic Committee, Mr. Page 1 of 7

William McCarthy, who is elderly and retired, spends the majority of the year living in retirement in Florida, leaving before Winter, returning only in late Spring or summer. In order that the absence of a Treasurer to conduct the Warren County Democratic Committee's finances does not cause the County Committee to suspend operations for the lack of funds, Mr. McCarthy leaves behind a a stack of signed official checks of the Warren County Democratic Democratic Committee in the custody of County Chairman Mr. William Montfort, who is empowered to co-sign checks with the County Treasurer. In practice, Mr. Montfort can sign checks and expend funds of the Warren County Democratic Committee on his sole authority. · Over the last several years the Warren County Democratic Committee raised fairly substantial sums of money due to several highly successful fund raisers. At one point in 1994 the Warren County Democratic Committee had approximately \$14,000 in its treasury. · There were no local, that is City, Town or County races last year that would have prompted large expenditures of money. · Early last spring, several members of the Glens Falls Democratic Committee who are signatories of this letter discussed with Mr. Montfort another issuing of the Warren County Democrat, the County Committee's official newspaper, which in the past was issued before elections. The release of such a paper would cost less than \$4,000. After initially being told there was enough money in the treasury to cover what had always been the relatively modest cost of this newspaper, they were suddenly told not enough money was left. · After mulling over the problem for several months, it was decided to 201 pursue checking out the exact state of the Warren County Democratic Committee's finances. At the regular June meeting of the Warren County Democratic Committee, several of the signers of this letter and other County Committee members asked for a financial accounting. At the 0 meeting Mr. Montfort stated that he could not give an accounting of the MO County Committee's finances at that time. The signers of this letter and other members of the County Committee demanded and received a A. promise by Mr. Montfort that a full accounting would be made. · At the July meeting an extremely terse financial statement was issued by Mr. Montfort and Mr. McCarthy. According to this report, which was read aloud since no copies were available for members of the County 00 Committee, several thousand dollars had been expended in the last year on "operating expenses" of a committee in an off election year. Purthermore, another, separate large sum was spent on repair or maintenance of a copy machine and other equipment, in fact, larger than such equipment would normally cost new. However, there were no details of any kind on what these large sums represented. Other funds seemed to be unaccounted for as well. Uncertain of the details of this verbal report, several of the signers of this letter asked for their own written copies. After a considerable delay, Lawrence Dudley, the Secretary/Treasurer of the Glens Falls Democratic Committee, received a single page copy, printed in extremely large type to fill up the page. The contents of this report, however, would fill a standard 3x5 card. · We would like to note in passing that Mr. Montfort treated all of the above requests with great resentment and hostility. · Paul Kemnitzer, a member of the Glens Falls and Warren County Committees, was particularly disturbed at these turns of events, and volunteered his professional services. Besides being a Committee member, Mr. Kemnitzer is also a Certified Public Accountant, the present incumbent City Treasurer of the City of Glens Falls, the Treasurer of the Glens Falls Industrial Development Agency and a member of the Glens Falls Local Development Corporation. At the July 14, 1995 meeting of the Warren County Democratic Committee Mr. Kemnitzer asked if he could see the County Committee's books. As the only CPA on the County Committee and the City Treasurer of Glens Falls, he regarded this as a normal and routine request. He even offered to go to Mr. McCarthy's house at a time of Mr. McCarthy's convenience. Instead of responding directly to this perfectly reasonable and routine request Mr. McCarthy silently turned to Mr. Montfort for instructions. Then Mr. McCarthy replied they would have to get the permission of the Finance Committee of the County Committee for such a request, which they regarded as something extraordinary, not routine. There was a vague commitment to honor Mr. Kemnitzer's request, which he took at face value. never heard from Mr.McCarthy. · The Finance Committee of the Warren County Democratic Committee is composed of Mr. Montfort, Mr. McCarthy and Mr. Mark Morgan, a committee member who lives down the road from Mr. Montfort in a very rural area of Johnsburg in the northern part of Warren County. Obviously, Mr. Montfort and Mr. McCarthy could have agreed on the spot to Mr. Kemnitzer's request. 8 · Sometime later in August, Mr. Kemnitzer discovered that a highly irregular challenge had been made to the petitions of his and his father, Mr. John Kemnitzer, a former Councilman of the City of Glens Falls. Since the New York State Board of Elections has been made aware of this matter in detail through other actions taken by Mr. Kemnitzer, who has retained Counsel, this letter will not delve into this matter in detail. However, to summarize the matter briefly, it is felt this situation was created in a deliberate attempt to force Mr. Remnitzer from the Warren County Committee in an effort to prevent his reviewing the Warren County Democratic Committee's finances by denying him eligibility. · In addition, efforts were made by Mr. Montfort or at his behest, to prevent other residents of the City of Glens Falls from securing open, uncontested seats on the Warren County Democratic Committee, or running in primaries. Five calls were made to Ms. Jean Rikhoff of Glens Falls, a recently retired professor at Adirondack Community College, to dissuade her from running in a primary. She agreed to withdraw with the understanding she would be placed in another seat; however she was not informed that she would lose her vote at the organizational meeting. In addition, other petitions were challenged under suspicious circumstances. A petition was circulated for Ms. Florida James of Glens Falls, also a recently retired professor at Adirondack Community College and the only African-American candidate for the County Committee, by two of the singers of this letter. Her petition appeared to be irregularly challenged. It is our understanding from reading the Charter of the County Committee, it is the responsibility of Mrs. Montfort to inform Page 3 of 7

candidates or those who file their petitions of any problems and how to correct them. Another signer of this letter brought the petition to Mrs. Montfort at her office and no effort was made by her to review the petition for any problems. We later learned that a Mr. Buell Brayton, a fellow Democrat, challenged that petition. When Richard Dudley, who circulated the petition for Ms. James, called him, Mr. Brayton would not give him any explanation and added that he had not even seen the petition. In sum, it would appear a concerted effort was made to prevent the Glens Falls Democratic Committee from having any additional seats on the County Committee. In addition, Mrs. Montfort, without consulting with the Glens Falls Committee, moved committee members to wards and districts where they would have a smaller weighted vote. All this was done to prevent elected officials in Glens Falls and the Glens Falls Committee from having the votes to investigate the state of the County Committee's finances. You can imagine our frustration in trying to build the Glens Falls Committee with members who would add significantly to our Committees, only to have these efforts thwarted by Mr. and Mrs. Montfort. · On August 16 a letter was drafted and sent by Glens Fall Democratic Committee Chair Margaret Farrell asking to see the County Committee's books, registers and check stubs. Mrs. Farrell, who works an irregular schedule at night as supervisor of the pediatric critical care unit at Glens Falls Hospital, asked that the records be brought by Mr. Montfort's spouse, Mrs. Lois Montfort, the Warren County Commissioner of Elections for the Democratic Party, to the Warren County Municipal Center. She has never received a reply. Some of the committee members of the Warren County Democratic Committee undoubtedly would prefer that this matter, no matter how serious, be swept under the rug. However, the signers of this letter, who are mainly elected public officials, have sworn an Oath of Office to uphold the laws of the State of New York. The signers who are also City Council members of the City of Glens Falls are also legally peace officers. They feel they cannot look the other way in such a grave matter. It is our belief the New York State Board of Elections can hardly do so either, given the mass of material presented in this letter. We feel that because of the upcoming biannual election of officers required after the primary, the State Board of Elections should pursue the requested audit as soon as possible. Thank You. Firstly, we will attempt to comply with your request for the Financial Disclosure Statements of the Warren Democratic Committee, although, frankly, we feel this is an investigative responsibility best handled by the State Board of Elections. But we are puzzled at the idea, implicit in your request, that these statements may have any bearing whatsoever on reality or that one could expect to learn anything from looking at them. If possible wrong doing is occurring, is one to seriously expect truthful statements from possible wrong doers on what they have been doing? Such a Financial Statement would constitute proof under law against such possible wrong doers. No possible wrong doer is likely to incriminate themselves in such a manner. In short, the request seems to be a pointless diversion. Only a direct examination of the County Committee's books, check stubs and registers. 0 etc., can possibly yield any light on this matter. Furthermore, we must point out that these Financial Disclosure Statements are in the custody of the spouse of one of the individuals who is a central figure in this situation. Surely you must recognize how this greatly complicates matters. For instance, if she refuses to let us see them.

is the State Board going to tell us to get a FOIL while more time is needlessly lost?

Beyond that, there seems to us to be a real danger that such a request, or the Civil Proceeding you have suggested, is likely to prompt a destruction of records by possible wrong doers, who might well decide that the consequences of destroying records would be significantly less severe than those for other misdeeds which intact records might reveal. We are also troubled by what seems to be an implication in your letter that a Criminal Investigation can only stem from a Civil Proceeding. If true, this is a novel concept in law enforcement. Finally, exactly what bearing does 16-114 have on the reporting of finances of the Warren County Democratic Committee? 16-114 speaks only of candidates and campaign expenditures - not Constituted Committees, which, according to the manual on Financial Disclosure of the State Board of Elections, are held to somewhat different standards. for just one example, on the reporting of what are called "housekeeping expenditures," etc. On your letter's final point, we did not state that Mrs. Montfort changed petitions after they were filed. The point we made is that committee members in Glens Falls discovered they had been moved 3 without their knowledge when they received their petitions, and also without any notification to the Glens Falls Democratic Committee, into different wards and election districts, which would force them into primaries if they wanted to run for their original seats. These actions are part of a consistent overall pattern of actions to prevent any financial accountability, like trying to force the only Certified Public Accountant on the County Committee off the Committee when he asked to see the books. Finally, we would like to pose an additional question. We understand the State Election Law requires the election of officers within 19 days of the Primary Election. Given the possible irregularities in the Warren County Democratic Committee, are there any circumstances under which this election may be postponed? It seems to us that due diligence and speed is required in this matter. We thank you for your prompt attention to this grave and serious matter. 2 of 4

You will find enclosed copies the financial disclosure statements of 00 the Warren County Democratic Committee covering the financial reporting period from July 1994 to July 1995. 0 Although we had no luck in securing these forms directly from Mrs. N Montfort, the wife of County Chairman William Montfort, the principal figure in creating this situation, we were able to secure these forms 00 through the intervention of the Post-Star newspaper of Glens Falls, N.Y, probably because they have lawyers on retainer. Although necessarily 3 cursory in character, we believe these forms raise many extremely serious questions, which we will detail in an attached memorandum. 0 00 However, our principal concern at this moment is a series of actions, some of which we believe represent further serious illegalities, taken by Mr. William Montfort, the Warren County Democratic Chairman, to prevent an accounting of the finances of the Warren County Democratic Committee. We have learned that on August 27 or 28, a secret and we believe illegal meeting of the Warren County Democratic Committee was held at the Hibernian Hall in Glens Falls, N.Y. All the signers of this letter, including all the party officers of the Glens Falls Democratic Committee and all the elected Democratic public officials of the City of Glens Falls who are members of the Warren County Democratic Committee and the Glens Falls

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Democratic Committee, were deliberately not informed of this meeting by Mr. Mortfort. Not a single one received the required notification in the mail. That one, or possibly two members might not receive such a notice in the mail due to the vagaries of the Post Service might be understandable, but as far as we can determine at this moment, at least 14 or 15 members of the Warren County and Glens Falls Democratic Committees were deliberately not informed of this meeting, in violation, as we understand it, not only of the by-laws of the Warren County Democratic Committee, but also the New York State Democratic Committee and the Election Law of the State of New York.

We believe the purpose of this secret meeting, held before the primary election, but including new members not yet on the Committee, was to suborn or arrange a fraudulent election of officers for the Glens Falls Democratic Committee in an attempt to block their legitimate request for a proper financial accounting of the Warren County Democratic Committee. Mr. Montfort called, organized and planed this meeting. At this secret meeting, a carefully orchestrated effort was organized to obtain proxy votes, possibly under false pretenses, to fraudulently overthrow the existing leadership of the City Democratic Committee. In addition, towards that end, charges were apparently made to those attending this secret meeting against those individuals who were seeking an accounting of the Warren County Committee's finances, which they, obviously, could not correct or defend themselves against because they were deliberately excluded.

It is likely some of those attending this secret meeting may not have been as fully aware as they should have been as to the true nature of the situation; the absence of so many other committee members may have been explained away in some manner. However, as always, ignorance of the law is no excuse.

A new slate of officers was prepared, including Mr. Daniel Martindale of Glens Falls, a young, recently graduated law student, for City Chair. At the present time, we believe that Mr. Martindale, in effect, was a "patsy" in this affair, unaware of the larger ramifications of what going on, i.e. that he was participating in a cover-up and general effort to forestall an accounting of the Warren County Democratic Committee's flances. After

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learning of these larger ramifications, Mr. Martindale became extremely concerned also, partly over concern of his own potential culpability in a cover-up, and has been cooperating with the signers of this letter.

Information concerning this meeting was conveyed to the signers of this letter on the date of the organizational meeting of the Warren County Democratic Committee, September 27, 1995: Colleen Daly, a committee member from Glens Falls, admitted to Lawrence A. Dudley that she had received the letter after the Glens Falls Committee's picnic in late August and that the meeting was held about two or three weeks earlier. Bret and Ray Blanchard, County Committee members from Stoney Creek, admitted to Margaret Farrell and her husband Ralph Farrell that the secret meeting had been held at the Hibernian Hall. Daniel Martindale of Glens Falls admitted to Margaret Farrell and Lawrence Dudley that the meeting was held.

We would note several aspects of this secret meeting; at the recent organizational meeting of the County Committee, there was a limited Treasurer's Report to the effect that the Warren County Democratic Committee now had \$2,462 in its account. At the time of the statutory filing date on July 15, that number stood at \$3,150 — that is \$688 dollars was expended in about two months time. The State Board needs to be aware that it is probable that a significant portion of these funds were spent for the purpose of electioneering for party elections, which we understand is a violation of the Election Law and a misdemeanor. Furthermore, rent may have been paid to the Hibernian Hall, which would also fall into this same category of prohibited expenditures. We have been told by sources close to the management of the Hibernian Hall that the hall was rented and paid for with a check.

It appears this meeting was planed and coordinated with other actions referenced in earlier letters or in different actions; i.e. the effort to prevent new members like Ms. Rickhoff and Ms. James to acquire seats on the Warren County and Glens Falls Committees, and the effort to challenge Paul and John Kemnitzer's nominating petitions, who are represented by Counsel and are undertaking action before your Board in separate actions. These efforts were made to subvert, in a general sense, the legitimate inquiry being made by Glens Falls Democratic Committee members into

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the County Committee's finances by personally discrediting those making these inquiries and subverting the Glens Falls Democratic Committee as a necessary and proper forum to investigate these matters. Ironically, after Mr. Martindale became aware of the full situation facing the Warren County Democratic Committee, he, at the request of the signers of this letter, and because of his concern over the issue of his own potential complicity in this matter, volunteered to sponsor a resolution at the Warren County Democratic Committee's organization meeting calling for the opening of the County Committee's books, which would allow an audit. Predictably, this motion failed, 30-21, proxy votes figured in. However, a weakened version of this motion calling for opening and inspection of all books and records by the County Executive Board (composed of certain of Mr. Montfort's appointees and the City and Town Chairs) did pass. It remains to be seen whether or not this measure will 10 yield any revelation or not, given this board's restricted composition. 0 We should also note in passing, that Mr. William McCarthy, of N Oueensbury, the former Treasurer of the Warren County Democratic Committee, abruptly refused to accept renomination as treasurer. We believe this was because the information contained on the financial disclosure forms was circulated at the Glens Falls Democratic Meeting the previous night. The signers of this and the previous letters have not regarded Mr. McCarthy as the principle figure in this matter. Although he may have information useful to the State Board of Elections, we do not feel Mr. 0 McCarthy, who is retired and spends most of the year in Florida, should be regarded as a potential target for investigation. The principal figure is Mr. Montfort. All this leads to several important questions: Does the calling of this secret meeting by Mr. Montfort in this manner for this purpose render the elections in the Glens Falls Democratic Committee and possibly in the Warren County Democratic

Committee null and void? If so, can new elections be ordered or held? If fraud or other illegalities occurred in this matter, can Mr. Montfort and other be removed from the Committee by the State Board of Elections? · Can they be criminally prosecuted for this matter, separate from the issue of financial improprieties? Although our initial concern in this entire matter was what we believe was the appearance of serious illegalities in the finances of the Warren County Democratic Committee, we believe these new events are also so serious as to merit, in effect, an entire separate investigation. We are also concerned about one other matter concerning the Glens Falls Committee. The members of the Glens Falls Democratic Committee charged with control of the Glens Falls Committee's finances, Margaret 173 Farrell and Lawrence Dudley, feel it would be inappropriate and probably 10 a serious legal breach of their fiduciary responsibilities to hand over control of the Glens Falls Committees finances, however meager (\$359), if 0 any of these concerns set forth in this letter are correct. Perhaps the State Board of Elections should consider immediately freezing the Glens Falls Democratic Committee's finances until these questions are fully resolved. One final matter: we believe the State Board of Elections should carefully investigate the conduct and financial arrangements of a banquet/raffle held by the Warren County Democratic Committee in the 00 Spring of 1994 and 1993, and in several previous years. These raffles featured a \$100 ticket including a dinner. Typically, 250 tickets were sold. What may be potential irregularities in regard The prize was \$10,000. to these raffles, including the final drawing of prizes, sale of tickets and patterns of prize winners, may be the most explosive issue in regard to the Warren County Democratic Committee's finances. I.e. There may be a possibility at least one at least one or more of these raffles may have been rigged or debauched in some manner or form. It is also our experience individuals around the raffle are those showing the most resistance to any financial accountability.

We would like to note that the elected officials of the City of Glens Falls who are signatories of this letter were so concerned about the propriety of elected public officials selling such tickets to people living in their jurisdiction, that they refused to sell any to people in upstate New York, only buying tickets for themselves and selling a few to personal friends in New York City. Again, let us express our appreciation to you for your prompt attention to these matters. Thank you. At the organizational meeting, when questioned why we were funding these committees, Mr. Montfort stated that these checks actually went to Congressional candidate Bob Lawrence because 10 they could not be sent to him directly, since the Warren County 10 Committee had already given Mr. Lawrence \$2,000 directly. 00 Isn't this a violation of the Campaign Financing Act? Or other laws? Furthermore, if they genuinely were for campaign 1 purposes, why were they sent so late? 00 2. Please note that numbers for checks to Mr. Bob Lawrence. the Saratoga County Committee, and Mr. Rudy Meola, totaling 3 \$3,100, are not included on the forms. 4 0 3. Note there is a stop check fee on 12/9/94. Is it possible one of these three checks were stopped? If so, which checks were stopped and why, and how many checks were stopped? And ON why did a check have to be stopped? 4. Note that some check numbers are missing from the sequence -- #2429, 2436, 2437. Were they for Mr. Meola, Mr. Lawrence or the Saratoga County Committee? If so, why aren't they entered? 5. Note over \$2,980 in checks paid directly to Mr. Montfort. 6. Note numerous expenses bundled in together, including equipment repair expenses. Why weren't checks written

directly to repair service? 7. Note that more money appears to have been spent repairing a copier than it is possible to purchase one new. This may also be true of the item labeled "computer repair". 8. Note \$1,687.71 in phone bills in one years time. 9. Note \$1,102.60 in bundled phone bills and "repairs". 10. Note \$355.87 in total postage costs. There were never more than 72 members of the Warren County Committee, and no more than four or five meetings. We 10 are still trying to obtain additional information, particularly on the secret. and we believe illegal, meeting held by Mr. Montfort for the purposes of frustrating a financial disclosure of the Warren County Committee's N finances. Since our last letter we have learned the following, all of which 0 we believe are further serious matters of concern: We have been told by Mr. Montfort repeatedly over the years that weighted votes were only required at the biannual elections. We V have since determined under our by-laws and, we believe, state law, that this is in fact not the case. This means that the resolutions over the years requiring an accounting of the Warren County Democratic 00 Committee's finances almost certainly passed and were improperly 0 frustrated. In particular, a roll-call vote was held at this year's organizational meeting. It failed on a straight-line vote of 30-21. However, those voting in favor of the resolution were entirely from the more heavily democratic districts in the City of Glens Falls while those opposed to it were mainly from the sparsely populated districts up county. We think it is inconceivable that given a weighted vote, this resolution would not have passed. It is Mr. Montfort's duty as Chairman to see that the by-laws of the Committee and the State Election Law is upheld. Instead, he has seriously abused this responsibility to prevent an accounting of the 1 of 4

Committee finances. · The by-laws of the Warren County Committee specify that the Finance Committee of the County Committee has the power on its own to "allocate funds to endorsed candidates." No mention is made is made of any other disbursements, i.e. operating or "housekeeping expenses". We believe it is clear that only the County Committee as a whole can authorize such expenditures. · Furthermore, the Finance Committee is exclusively appointed by the Chairman of the County Committee and serves exclusively at his pleasure. Clearly, the potential for abuse in such an arrangement is great. Because of these comments by Mr. Montfort regarding weighted voting, elections in the Glens Falls Democratic Committee and the various town committees (such as they are large enough to actually elect officers) were not conducted using weighted votes. This raises serious questions. Were the last elections in the Glens Falls ON Democratic Committee legal? In Finally, Mr. Montfort told the membership of the Warren County Democratic Committee at this year's organizational meeting that by-00 laws had to be adopted every two years. It is now our understanding that there is no such requirement. Further, on checking, we realized no by-laws were adopted at the 1993 00 organizational meeting of the Warren County Democratic Committee. However, at the organizational meeting Mr. Montfort claimed that by-373 laws were adopted two years ago and that the Committee was 4 merely voting to renew the by-laws, which it ostensibly did. We are 0 concerned at what by-laws exactly have been filed with the State and County Boards. Since none were adopted at the 1993 meeting. 00 the only valid ones were the ones adopted in 1991. We believe there is a possibility of an attempt to register some other, essentially bogus or fraudulent document, which may be different from the ones legally in force, possibly for further frustrating a legitimate accounting of the Committee's finances or the additional purpose of a coverup. We hope this material is of further use to you. We will be looking forward to hearing from you on these matters and if you need any further information. 2 of 4

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
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In response to the complaint that you received I would like to first inform you that the Treasurer for the Warren County Democratic Committee ("Committee") for the time in question (Wm. C. McCarthy) has retired and given all of his records to the new Treasurer whose name is Thomas P. O'Dea. Mr. McCarthy is retired in Florida, is 75 years old and has a heart condition. He obviously doesn't need this aggravation. Our new Treasurer would be more than happy to bring all of our records to one of your officers and I would accompany him to answer any of your questions, if this can possibly be handled in this way to avoid upsetting Mr. McCarthy.

My position as Chair, as well as the Treasurer, and the rest of the committee members are volunteer positions. While, the past Treasurer and I are not Attorneys or CPAs, I believe that the Committees transactions during the election year of 1994 were not illegal and that there was not knowingly any intention to violate any laws either Federal or State. I would like to point out that those individuals included several letters of complaint (9/8/95,9/18/95,10/4/95,10/25/95) to the State Board in which along with their numerous allegations appeared the same complaint. However, they failed to include the State Board's Determination listing these same letters in which the State Board said "there is not reasonable cause to believe a crime has been committed and this matter is closed".

In Addition, I would like to inform you that our committee requested the State Board to review our financial records to confirm that there were no irregularity or wrongdoing. Enclosed labeled Document # 1 is Committees letter to State Board requesting review of our records. Also enclosed Document # 2 is State Board's Determination mentioned above. Also, when these individuals state" The Financial affairs of the Warren County Democratic Committee have been an issue with committee members and elected officials since the Spring of 1995" they are speaking only of themselves and no one else. All their allegations of patterns of illegal or abusive uses of Committee funds were proven unfounded not because there were no records but because we had receipts, canceled checks and had filed disclosures on record with a clear paper trail of where all of our funds went. We had nothing to hide then and we have nothing to hide now.

I would like to elaborate on their real motives that actually started back in the Spring of 1994. We had just finished a successful fund-raiser when Larry Dudley phoned inquiring how we made out when I told him his reply was good we can save that for when Dick (his brother) runs for Mayor. He was upset when I informed him that it had always been the policy of the Budget & Finance Committee to spend what we raise each year on the present campaigns and that it was their call and not his. I believe out of that conversation came the need for a plan to take over the committee so to control the money for their own future races.



Meanwhile, with no end of these assaults in sight and nothing to hide I contacted the State Board and requested they review all of our records. They needed to get a letter from our Treasurer and Secretary and get permission from their commissioners which they did and concluded their investigation on 2/26/97. These are Document # 1 & # 2. 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As you are aware our chairman Bill Montfort has been in contact with Associate Accountant, Carl Montanino of the Financial Disclosure Section, concerning a request by our chair for the State of New York Board of Elections to review the Warren County Democratic Committee's financial disclosures, and related documentation for every financial disbursement our committee has been involved with for the past two years.

As you can see from our County Committee's by-laws (on file with the State Board and which were adopted on September 25, 1991 and adopted again without any changes from the previous one on September 29, 1993 and September 27, 1995) that our Treasurer and our Budget and Finance committee oversee disbursements made by the county committee. Also our checks require two signatures; the treasurer and the chairman. I now need to fill you in on a little background as to why I am making this unusual request.

At our 5/31/95 regular meeting the Finance Committee Treasurer's Annual Report was made by Chairman, Montfort in the absence of Treasurer, McCarthy. A motion to accept the treasurer report was made and carried all yes with the exception of six abstentions from Glens Falls.

Organizational meeting 9/27/95: with 95% attendance, the following motion was passed: The County Committee Treasurer will make full disclosure to the Executive Committee of all disbursements & records for the period 7/12/93 to present and the Executive Committee will report their findings back to the full committee. The vote was all yes with the exception of one abstention from the County Treasurer to avoid any conflict of interest.

Executive meeting 11/29/95: The above resolution required our newly elected Treasurer, Tom O'Dea to demonstrate to, and answer questions from the entire Executive Committee, whose membership consist of the Chairman, the Vice-Chair, the Secretary, the Treasurer, all the Town Chairmen, the City Chairman, and the members of the State Committee who represent the county. Together, these community leaders compared the financial disclosures on file with the County Board of Elections, every financial disbursement, bank check issued, receipt received, and bank statement our committee has been involved with for the past two years. The Executive Committee of the Warren County Democratic Committee, have duly inspected the documentation of our committee's financial records as required by our county committee resolution of 9/27/95 and their procedure was in full compliance with that resolution, the by-laws of the Warren County Democratic Committee, which itself is in accord with New York State Election Law. They found no grounds for suspicions or unanswered questions about the finances of the Warren County Democratic Committee or the related involvement of Democratic Chair. Bill Montfort, our former treasurer, C. Wm. McCarthy, our Finance Committee members and arry or all other officers of the county committee both past and present.

Special meeting 1/5/96; Motion to accept the Executive Committee Report on the Financial Disclosure given on 11/29/95 carried the vote was yes with the exception of 7 abstentions, the treasurer and six individuals from Glens Falls. The acceptance of the executive committee's report in satisfaction of the motion should have concluded the review of the financial records in questions. However, we have had six individuals from Glens Falls who along with the six proxies they carry for their friends and relatives, trying to discredit our chair, our treasurer, as well as most of the committee, with their unfounded allegations concerning the committees finances. Their motive is not important but the damage to our reputation is important. This group had previously asked for finical records but had not followed by-laws or parliamentary procedure, and so were out of order. During the 9/27/95 meeting they said they would be fully satisfied with the county committee's acceptance of the report on committees finances from disclosure to the executive committee. The county committee has accepted the executive committee's report as fully satisfying the resolution of 9/27/95, therefore seemingly putting an end to the matter. But Montfort said McCarthy takes the committee's checkbook with him to Florida. When he needs money, Montfort said, he calls McCarthy, who signs a check for the right amount and mails it to

Montfort, who also signs it.

To save the 25-ceat per check charge, Montfort said the checks are made out to cover several expenses at once, something he admits "probably isn't the right thing to do."

Montfort believes there are receipts for all the transactions, except for money reimbursed to Dudley and his wrife, Pat, after the 1993 election for campaign headquarters expenses.

"These people would have been insulted if I asked for a receipt," Montfort said.

Friction between the city Democrats and Montfort has grown over the last arveral months because of personality conflicts and the feeling among some committee members that city Democrats are trying to rule the party. City Democrats deny that assertion.

GLENS FALLS — An internal review of Warren County Democratic Committee finances has uncovered no wrongdoing, but a prominent city Democrat said some suspicion remains about the actions of Chairman William M. Montfort.

City Treasurer Paul A. Kemnitzer doesn't question the findings that the committee's canceled checks match the receipts for expenses incurred since July 1993. But. Kemnitzer wants the opportunity for him or anyone else on the committee to look at the expenses to ensure they're legitimate.

"If I reviewed it and everything was fine, that would be the end of it," said Kemnitzer, a certified public accountant, on Thursday,

Kemnitzer and other city Democrats have raised questions about Montfort's handling of the committee's books, and asked the state Board of Elections in September to do an audit of the finances. That request is still pending, according to a state spokesman. Montfort has denied any mishandling of funds, and believes the questioning is fueled by personal animosity on the part of Kemnitzer and some other city Democrats.

When Montfort was re-elected as county chairman in September, the group agreed to have the finances reviewed by city and town Democratic chairmen, a group which doesn't include Kemnitzer.

The chairmen checked the documents at a meeting Wednesday night. The county committee's treasurer, Thomas P. O'Dea, told the full committee of the findings.

In an interview Thursday, O'Dea said although there weren't receipts for every transaction, he found nothing irregular about the records.

In some cases, he found no receipts for campaign contributions, but O'Dea said that's common since a donor often doesn't expect the candidate to write a receipt.

The donor is giving the money in part because he or she trusts the candidate, O'Dea said, so there's no reason for the receipt. In other cases, there was no receipt for checks made out to the post office.

"I don't think a reasonable person would say (having) no receipt for the postmaster (is an) irregularity." O Dea said.

Kemnitzer said he tried to make a motion to allow for inspection of the records by any committee member — with the oversight of Montfort and O'Dea — but, he said, Montfort stopped him.

"It creates suspicion in people's minds when he's so adamant not to let anyone look at it." Kemnitzer said

Montfort couldn't be reached for comment. The city Democratic chairman, Daniel S. Martindale, looked at the records and said everything was in order. Martindale said he'll be making a

Martindale said he'll be making a more complete report about the finances when the city committee meets later this month.

Daniel Johnson, a Democratic committeeman in Warren County as well as Glens Falls, worked for the Department of Environmental Conservation in Lake George every summer from 1981 to 1994, including the past five years as head manager, he said. "Every year in December," he said, I got an application in the mail from DEC. And every year, he filled it out, sent it in and was re-hired. This year, I didn't get the application until April." Also not rehired was Johnson's ausistant, Marjorie Mannix, who had worked at the beach every summer tince 1980, and his secretary, Sheila Healy, a college student who had held b for five years. Healy is the granddaughter of former Warren County Democratic Chairman Daniel

from James Martin, a labor relations specialist with the Civil Services Employees Association (CSEA) for District 4. He told The Chronicle, "We have asked our attorneys to take a good hard look at this case. Martin says the case is unusual in that three employees at the same facility were not re-hired despite a recommendation to the contrary.

The DEC has the right to determine which positions will be filled and who will fill them," Martin said. but added that CSEA takes the stand that if a qualified worker reapplies for a position, he or she should be reinstated. My understanding is that no grounds were given for not re-hiring these employees, Martin said.

The Republicans are quick to point out that the policy of "out with the old, in with the new is not something that their party has a monopoly on.

'Are you an enrolled Republican?'

Ken Parker, who recently stepped down from his position as Wanten County Republican Committee Chairman, said, "It's a fact of life that when the administration changes, so do many of the people working in the administration." He termed this good management practice, stating that administrators need to be sure that the people who are working for them are willing to carry out their policies. He said that he feels this aim applies to seasonal non policy-making jobs. Asked about a printed employment application of which The Chronicle

has a copy and which asks point blank, 'Are you an enrolled Republican? If under 18, are your parents enrolled Republicans?', Parker said. "It's a good way for a political party to be able to inventory prospective employees who are in need of a job."

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Parker was adamant in stating. however, that there is no intervention in the hiring process." He said that he knows about the form, but doesn't know where it comes from. He also admitted that he "probably" has handed some out, but explained that the forms are kept in a file and, when the party hears about job openings, it makes recommendations based on this file. He stressed that education and experience befitting the job are "imperative."

In the Cuome era

William Montfort, Warren County Democratic Chairman, claims that patronage was handled differently under the Chome administration. He said that county chairmen "would make recommendations for seasonal appointments' but that "we were told by the Appointments Office (in the Governor's Office) that we could not recommend anyone to replace someone else. We only made recommendations for open positionis."

Montfort says the mumber of uppointments was reduced after the Illinois Supreme Court ruled in 1990 that, for lower level, non policy making jobs, hiring or firing based on politics is discriminatory.

Even though this did not apply New York, Montfort said, "our g nor took it seriously. We started ge

atronage

agencies started hiring the people they wanted."

"Patronage isn't a bad thing." Montfort said. "What's important to me is that people get the jobs that they are qualified for and that appointments are only used to fill a vacancy, not to replace a qualified employee. If you use the appointment system right, then it isn't hurting anyone."

Montfort's rise & fall

Montfort himself seems, at once, to have been both a beneficiary and victim of the system. From last year until this past May, he held an appointed \$43,620-a-year job with the Governor's Traffic Safety Board. His wife Lois has been Democratic Commissioner of the Warren County Board of Elections since January 1981. It's a \$34,807 job that is one of a handful of county jobs filled by Democrats.

Montfort contends he lost his state job shortly after criticizing Glens Falls Republican Chairman Michael O'Connor's attack on Democratic Supervisors from Glens Falls. 'On May 26, I got called upstairs to meet the Deputy Commissioner,' Montfort said. 'I said, 'Glad to meet you' and he said 'No, you're not because we got a call from the second floor (the Appointments Office) and you're out of here.'

With last fail's change in administration, Montfort said, "A number of names that I used to put in for jobs changed their politics. I don't know if they were pressured or not. Most who did not change their politics are no longer working for the state." He admits, however, that some retained their jobs despite their Democratic affiliation.

Michael J. O'Connor, Glens Falls Republican Chairman who had been seeking to succeed Parker in the county's top GOP post, said, "it's traditional that the party does have some influence for summer employment. Probably there will be some employees who are Republicans and some who are Democrats." His position is that if two applicants are equally qualified, then it is valid to choose one based on his ir her political affiliation.

A former state employee remembers that he was often asked to hire seasonal employees simply because they were recommended by some politician. Some of them, he said, were worthless and drunks. On the other hand, he added, he also was not averse to using his influence to get



I have just returned to my office from an extended illness from which I am still recovering, and I have just reviewed the correspondence of Ms. Boyt's of December 9, 1997, granting me an extension to January 5, 1998, to respond in the above-referenced matter. I trust, in view of the foregoing, you can understand my inability to respond by this date.

I thought the best manner of responding to the voluminous materials you sent me was to set forth the simple facts of the Essex County Democratic Committee's contribution to the campaign of Bill Lawrence.

Sometime in the fall of 1994, I received a call from the Warren County Democratic Committee Chairman, Bill Montfort, asking the Essex County Democratic Committee to contribute on behalf of the candidacy of Bill Lawrence. I had been Chairman of the Party for less than a year, taking over from a lackadaisical administration that left our treasury with a few hundred dollars at best, and barely functioning.

I therefore explained to Mr. Montfort that his request was out of the question. He thereupon offered to donate \$1,000.00 to our Committee from his Committee, which he requested that we then donate to Mr. Lawrence's campaign. He stated that his purpose in requesting that we make this contribution was, I recall, to demonstrate a "broad base of support"





for Mr. Lawrence. At no time did he state or imply that he was asking us to do this to evade any spending limit, nor was I aware that the requested action might constitute a violation of any election law.

After speaking with Mr. Montfort, I called Matthew Dwyer, Treasurer of our Committee, and explained my conversation with Mr. Montfort, and we agreed that he should not write any check for Mr. Lawrence's campaign until he had received a check from the Warren County Democratic Committee. That was the end of my involvement in the matter: a few minutes on the phone with Mr. Montfort, and a few minutes with Matthew Dwyer.

I subsequently learned that the Warren County Democratic Committee did issue a check for \$1,000.00 which, however, bounced. Another one was issued later by the Warren County Democratic Committee, which did clear, whereupon Mr. Dwyer, our Treasurer, issued a check to the Lawrence campaign.

I trust that the foregoing is helpful in revealing the involvement of Essex County in what appears to be your investigation of Warren County financial matters. I am happy to assist you, as is Mr. Dwyer, our Treasurer. You should also know that I am being represented by Mr. William Greenawalt of Loselle, Greenawalt, Kaplan & Adler, 140 East 45th Street, 42nd Floor, New York, NY 10017. 

GENERAL COUNSEL'S REPORT

SENSITIVE

I. INTRODUCTION.

The cases listed below have been identified as either stale or of low priority based upon evaluation under the Enforcement Priority System (EPS). This report is submitted to recommend that the Commission no longer pursue these cases.

II. CASES RECOMMENDED FOR CLOSURE.

A. Cases Not Warranting Further Action Relative to Other Cases
Pending Before the Commission

EPS was created to identify pending cases which, due to the length of their pendency in inactive status or the lower priority of the issues raised in the matters relative to others presently pending before the Commission, do not warrant further expenditure of resources. Central Enforcement Docket (CED) evaluates each incoming matter using Commission-approved criteria which results in a numerical rating of each case.

Closing cases permits the

Commission to focus its limited resources on more important cases presently

pending before it. Based upon this review, we have identified 14 cases that do not warrant further action relative to other pending matters. The attachment to this report contains a factual summary of each case, the EPS rating, and the factors leading to assignment of a low priority and recommendation not to further pursue the matter.

B. Stale Cases

referrals to ensure compliance with the law. Investigations concerning activity more remote in time usually require a greater commitment of resources, primarily due to the fact that the evidence of such activity becomes more difficult to develop as it ages. Focusing investigative efforts on more recent and more significant activity also has a more positive effect on the electoral process and the regulated community. In recognition of this fact, EPS provides us with the means to identify those cases which remained unassigned for a significant period due to a lack of staff resources for effective investigation. The utility of commencing an investigation declines as these cases age, until they reach a point when activation of a case would not be an efficient use of the Commission's resources.

Closing these cases as of this date will permit CED and the Legal Review Team the necessary time to prepare closing letters and case files for the public record.

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

MUR 4699 WARREN COUNTY DEMOCRATIC COMMITTEE Members of the Warren County Democratic Committee (WCDC) collectively allege that the Committee unlawfully gave \$4,000 to Bob Lawrence for Congress in 1994. Of that \$4,000, Bob Lawrence for Congress refunded \$2,000 to WCDC, according to the complaint. The complainants further allege that WCDC then contributed \$1,000 each to Essex County Democratic Committee (Essex) and the Saratoga County Democratic Committee (Saratoga), with the understanding that they would contribute these amounts to Bob Lawrence for Congress. None of the county committees are registered with the FEC. Bob Lawrence for Congress terminated in 1996. Respondent Stuart H. Brody, Chairman of Essex, acknowledges that William A. Montfort, Chairman of WCDC, donated \$1,000 to Essex and asked it to contribute this amount to Lawrence's campaign committee. Mr. Brody states that he was not aware that the requested action might constitute a violation of one or more election laws. 00 Respondent Tom Bayly, Chairman of Saratoga, denies any wrongdoing in this matter, and points out the New York Board of Elections had already investigated and found no cause for action. Mr. William A. Montfort, Chair of WCDC, responds that the matter has already been reviewed by the New York Board of Elections which found no reasonable cause to believe a crime has been committed and this matter is closed. Mr. Montfort adds that WCDC requested State Board review of its financial records to confirm that there was no irregularity or wrongdoing generally. Mr. Montfort also asserts that the allegations are motivated by disagreements with WCDC on budget policy. This matter is less significant relative to other matters pending before the Commission.
