Dear Mr. Turley:

This is submitted in response to your letter of February 24, 1998, forwarding a copy of a complaint submitted to the FEC by Mr. Michael R. Cys concerning the above-captioned matter.

The charges raised in Mr. Cys' letter are factually inaccurate, misleading and totally without merit. As such, the Commission should take no action on this complaint and dismiss it immediately.

At the outset of this response, it is important to identify the party complaining. Mr. Cys is the campaign manager of the Fitzgerald for U.S. Senate Committee. He apparently believes that when the Fitzgerald campaign needs publicity -- he can create a press release and depending on the reaction to it, convert it into a complaint with the FEC. Attached is a copy of the press release authored by Mr. Cys that was converted into the complaint referenced by your February 24 letter (Exhibit 1.) For the purpose of those press release/complaints, Mr. Cys is less interested in fact than he is in press coverage. It is unfortunate that the Fitzgerald for Senate Committee believes that it should use the FEC process to bolster their campaign efforts. Moreover, it is particularly disturbing that as part of the Fitzgerald U.S. Senate Committee's desperate attempt to obtain press coverage, they have maligned the owners and employees of American Sightseeing Tours.

The entire package submitted by Mr. Cys is suspect. With his letter, he includes a document entitled, "The Loleta Cruiser, Who Paid For It." He describes this document as "a true and complete copy of which is attached hereto as Group Exhibit 'A.'" A true and complete copy of what? This document was produced by Mr. Cys and the Fitzgerald for U.S. Senate Committee to support a fictitious argument. It offers no facts.

The complaint is based upon the use of a bus by the Didrickson for U.S. Senate Committee ("Committee"). The bus was leased by the Committee from American Sightseeing Tours. In order to find a bus for use on various days over a several month period, Committee officials contacted a number of bus companies to secure the best arrangement. The Committee decided to accept the proposal submitted by American Sightseeing Tours. The contractual arrangement with American Sightseeing Tours was as follows:

Use of bus for 12-hour day	\$ 500.00 per day ¹
Add'l Hour above 12 hours	40.00 per hour
* * *	
Advertising Fee for "Wrapped Bus"	3,360.00 per month
(Monthly charge for advertising whether or not bus was used by Committee)	

(See Exhibit 2 for the American Sightseeing Tours Advertising Invoices.)

The Committee paid separately for the signage on the bus. The signs were prepared by the Ace Sign Company at a cost of \$4,040.00. (See Exhibit 3). The Committee also paid to have the signs removed. (See Exhibit 4).

The Committee utilized the bus for a total of six days from November through February 18, 1998. Those six days were:

November 5-8, 1997; February 7 and February 14, 1998
(The invoices for those six days are attached as Exhibit 5).

Except for those six days, on all other days during the months of November, December, January, and February, the bus was in the possession of American Sightseeing Tours.² It is the Committee's understanding that American Sightseeing leased the "wrapped" bus to other clients during that same period of time.

¹ In arranging for a contractual rate for the daily use of the bus, the Committee had two options -- pay a fee for a 24-hour daily rental or pay for the standard 12-hour bus rental rate with an additional charge for each hour the bus was used over 12-hours on any given day. Since the Committee planned to use the bus less than 12 hours on most days, the 12-hour fee option was selected.

² In the Cys press release, he claims that the Committee should pay for the bus even on days it did not use it. This is a totally ludicrous claim that is inconsistent with industry practice.

The agreement between the Committee and American Sightseeing was canceled effective on February 19, 1998. (See Exhibit 6).


The agreement entered into between the Committee and American Sightseeing was consistent with standard industry agreements. Advertisers of all kinds frequently place ads on a bus and pay a set monthly fee, regardless of whether they use the bus or not. The fee is for advertising. It is standard industry practice to charge separate fees for use of a bus as opposed to fees charged for advertising on that bus. The advertising on the bus does not prevent use of the bus.

As to the question raised concerning the reporting of the November American Sightseeing Tours' bill, that bill was reported and paid. As can be seen from the attached letter from Wolf & Company, CPA's for the Committee, the failure to report some accounts payable was an inadvertent oversight that was corrected. (See Exhibit 7).

It is unfortunate that some believe that campaign tactics should include false and misleading charges. In this case, the Fitzgerald for U.S. Senate Committee has taken those tactics a step further by attempting to utilize the FEC to be part of that effort. On behalf of the Committee, we thank you for your quick attention to this matter and trust that the information provided will allow you to dismiss the complaint and move on to real issues.³

³ In Mr. Cys' letter, he also states that the bus invoice was sent to the Illinois State Comptroller's office and as a result he speculates that "the contract was signed for by Loleta Didrickson in her official capacity." Mr. Cys again has difficulty in separating fact from fiction. Although the contract was inadvertently sent to the Comptroller's office, it was immediately forwarded to the campaign headquarters where it was processed. After that date, all correspondence was sent to the campaign headquarters. As can be seen by the attached invoices, those invoices were mailed to the Committee.

Fitzgerald to file FEC complaint against Didrickson campaign **Illegal Loleta cruiser bus at center of controversy**

Palatine, IL... Charging that Loleta Didrickson has accepted an illegal \$122,000 corporate campaign contribution and broken federal election laws by failing to report a bright red, shrink-wrapped bus, the Fitzgerald for Senate campaign will file on Tuesday an official complaint with the Federal Election Commission in Washington.

A Daily Herald investigation last week turned up evidence that the Didrickson campaign had not reported on its Federal Election Commission disclosure forms any expenses for the \$24,000 per month luxury cruiser bus Didrickson has been using on her campaign since at least last November. "Didrickson's acceptance of this illegal corporate campaign contribution, and her subsequent failure to report it, is inexcusable," said Fitzgerald. "Her campaign has had the bus since November and, according to her campaign reports, she has never paid a dime for it. No other customer could walk in off the street and use that bus exclusively for three-and-a-half months without paying anything for it, not even a deposit. This is clearly a serious and willful violation of federal campaign law."

Last week, the Didrickson for Senate campaign issued conflicting statements about the bus. Initially, Didrickson said there was nothing wrong with the fact that no payment appeared on her Senate campaign finance report. Later, the campaign said the bill had been mistakenly submitted for payment to the state Comptroller's office. Still later, the campaign's accountant issued a statement taking the blame for the error and said the Didrickson campaign would pay the cost of the bus and issue an amended FEC disclosure form. As of Monday morning, no FEC amendment had been filed.

Incredibly, although the bus has been shrink-wrapped and set aside for her exclusive use since November, once she was caught by the Daily Herald, Didrickson claimed she only has to pay for the days she actually drove it. The complaint will seek to compel her to pay fair market

values for the bus for the entire period it has been under her control. The complaint will also seek the imposition of fines in the amount double the illegal corporate contribution.

"Didrickson is running an illegal operation and we will continue to make her account for her illegal activities," said Fitzgerald. "The Didrickson campaign has not filed an amended Federal Election Commission report disclosing the bus. Her campaign still has not released the contract showing the terms and conditions of the bus rental and that makes it obvious that she is seeking to hide the illegal corporate contribution."

The Didrickson campaign still has not released to the public an amended FEC disclosure form, or the bus contract showing rate schedules, or invoices of any kind.

Bus companies charge anywhere between \$675 and \$800 a day, up to \$24,000 a month, for chartered luxury cruise buses plus additional charges including a \$10,000 fee for shrink-wrapping the bus with "Loleta" in bright red letters. Another \$4,500 in advertising fees per month is charged, company representatives have said.

The Didrickson campaign used the bus over the weekend during campaign stops in the western suburbs of Chicago. This would bring the total bill to more than \$122,000.

"Through continued use of the illegal Loleta cruiser, Didrickson is blatantly flouting the laws," said Fitzgerald. "With her blatant disregard for federal election regulations, Didrickson is beginning to make even Carol Mosley-Braun look like a saint." Mosley Braun has been dogged by scandals involving campaign finance irregularities since she was first elected in 1992.

The Fitzgerald for Senate campaign is preparing additional FEC complaints as well, documenting other violations, including but not limited to, Didrickson's illegal use of state employees to promote her Senate campaign. "We will be very aggressive in litigating these complaints before the FEC," said Fitzgerald. "The Didrickson campaign is a textbook example of the use of prohibited money and resources in a federal election, and we will vigorously prosecute her illegal activities. Didrickson will be explaining herself for years to come."

The FEC may not take up the case for several months but Didrickson will be expected to file a prompt response to the complaint.

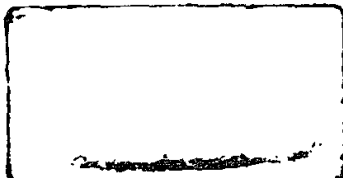

Dear Mr. Turley:

We are replying with the information requested for an alledged complaint against our bus company for rendering services to the Loleta Didrickson's campaign headquarters.

Enclosed is a list of the invoices for the six (6) day's usage of actual bus charters by the Campaign and the invoices for the advertising on our coach for November, 1997 through February, 1998.

Our contract rate per day is the normal price for services for use up to twelve hours in the Chicago bus carriers' market of \$500.00. Additional hours of service is \$40.00 per hour.

It is customary for any bus carrier to carry advertising on its equipment and be paid for a term of service from a client at a contracted cost.

However, it is, also, customary that we use and hire out to the general public at a fixed cost a charter with advertising on the same bus. Therefore, during the dates of November 5 to 8 and February 7 and 14, the bus was in sole use for the day by the Loleta Didrickson's campaign. But, all other days through today, our firm has used this coach for its other clients and has been in possession of our coach.

Since the bus was not used by the Campaign on other dates, it was not charged for use of the bus.

I hope this information is sufficient for a reply to this complaint.
