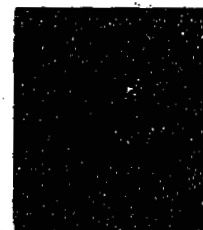

And Bill Clinton's liberal plan to restrict tobacco as a drug will cause a loss of jobs and money for North Carolina. That's wrong!

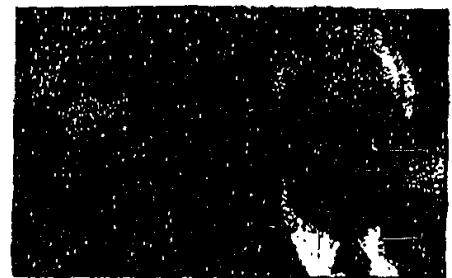

In 1993, Nelson Cole voted for the liberals' criminal sentencing law which actually reduced prison sentences given to criminals.

Nelson Cole voted with the liberals to cut the prison sentence for the possession of nearly one gram of cocaine from 5 years to only 120 days. And he voted to cut the sentence for first-degree rape from life to 9 years.
