ANSWERS TO INTERROGATORIES

1. I was working with Charles Dusseau, then Secretary of Commerce of Florida, looking for potential donors for the DNC and particularly a Presidential Gala in Miami on April 29th, 1996. Charles had contacted Mr. Eduardo Masfarrer, Chairman of the Board of Hamilton Bank, who was interested. I was asked to talk to him and give him more information, which I did, via telephone sometime late March or early April 1996. I also sent him a letter in my then capacity as a Director of the DNC National Finance Board. I had no further conversations, except with Charles Dusseau, who kept me posted as to the progress. I was informed by Charles Dusseau that the bank's lawyers had questioned whether the bank could make a contribution to a political party. This prompted the involvement of Jay Dunn, an employee of the DNC to speak with people at the bank and/or the bank's lawyers. He arranged a conference call between Joe Sandler, General Counsel for the DNC and the bank's lawyers. It was determined by all of those participating that the bank could make a contribution to the DNC Building Fund. I don't recall whether the check was sent to Jay Dunn, Charles Dusseau or me.
