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STATUTES, REGULATIONS AND CASES

STATUTES

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STATEMENT OF THE CASE

On September 28, 1998, the Democratic Senatorial Campaign Committee filed a Complaint (the "Complaint") with the Federal Election Commission naming the Boozman for U.S. Senate Campaign Committee, Inc. ("Boozman Campaign"), the Republican Party of Arkansas (the "Party" or the "State Party") and other contributors to the Boozman Campaign as violating the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971. The Complaint was not properly notarized as it was missing the State and county designation as well as a notarial seal. The Complaint alleged that Boozman's July 1998 Mid-Year Report showed contributions by the Republican Party of Arkansas and "affiliated" committees in excess of the \$5,000.00 limit permitted by 2 U.S.C. §§ 431 *et seq.*, and 11 C.F.R. §§ 100.1 *et seq.* The Boozman Campaign and the accused contributors received the Complaint on October 5, 1998.

Following the Arkansas primary elections of May 19, 1998, 28 independent organizations and the Republican Party of Arkansas made contributions to the Boozman Campaign. The Complaint alleged that this constituted a conspiracy to evade the \$5,000.00 limit because all of the independent committees were either established, maintained, controlled or financed by the Republican Party of Arkansas or were subordinate State party committees. 11 C.F.R. § 110.3(b)(3). Alternatively, the Complaint alleged that the contributions should be aggregated because they were made "in concert" with the Republican Party of Arkansas. 11 C.F.R. § 110.3(b)(3)(i)-(ii).

ISSUES

- I. THE COMPLAINT FAILS TO DIFFERENTIATE STATEMENTS BASED UPON INFORMATION AND PERSONAL BELIEF, FAILS TO REVEAL THE SOURCE OF THE FINANCIAL INFORMATION UPON WHICH THE COMPLAINT IS BASED, FAILS TO PROVIDE SOURCE INFORMATION FOR A STATEMENT NOT BASED UPON PERSONAL KNOWLEDGE, AND WAS NOT NOTARIZED PROPERLY.
- II. CONTRIBUTIONS BY ORGANIZATIONS THAT ARE NOT POLITICAL COMMITTEES CANNOT BE CONSIDERED FOR PURPOSES OF AGGREGATION OF CONTRIBUTIONS WITH THOSE OF THE STATE PARTY.
- III. CONTRIBUTIONS BY POLITICAL COMMITTEES THAT ARE NOT ESTABLISHED, FINANCED, MAINTAINED OR CONTROLLED BY THE STATE PARTY CANNOT BE AGGREGATED WITH THE CONTRIBUTIONS OF THE STATE PARTY.
- IV. CONTRIBUTIONS NOT MADE IN COOPERATION, CONSULTATION OR CONCERT WITH, OR AT THE REQUEST OR SUGGESTION OF THE STATE PARTY OR A POLITICAL COMMITTEE ESTABLISHED, FINANCED, MAINTAINED OR CONTROLLED BY THE STATE PARTY CANNOT BE CONSIDERED FOR PURPOSES OF AGGREGATION OF CONTRIBUTIONS WITH THOSE OF THE STATE PARTY.

SUMMARY OF ARGUMENT

Not all organizations listed as making improper contributions in the Complaint were served with the Complaint and, therefore, are not bound to respond to the Complaint. As a result, they have not retained the undersigned counsel to so respond for them. Of the remaining contributing organizations, not all of them have retained the undersigned counsel to so respond for them. Those that have retained counsel for the purpose of presenting this joint response are indicated on the title page of this response and their Statements of Designation of Counsel are attached hereto. See **Composite Exhibit "A"** attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference.

Counsel believes that the facts presented herein will be typical as to all of the contributing organizations. Counsel further believes that the legal precepts applicable to the respondents represented in the instant Response will likewise be applicable to all contributing organizations listed in the Complaint, whether represented herein or not.

The Complaint is materially defective in that it fails to differentiate between statements based upon knowledge and those made on personal belief. Additionally, the Complaint was improperly notarized. The source of the financial information serving as the foundation of the Complaint is not revealed. Nor is the source for the allegation of a conspiracy between the various organizations and the State Party other than the coincidence of timing of the various contributions. Because all of the material, pertinent facts and law presented herein are of public record, it can only be assumed that the

Complaint was lodged without a reasonable inquiry or basis in fact and was, in fact, lodged in bad faith.

Contributions by organizations that are not "political committees" within the meaning of 2 U.S.C. § 431(4) and 11 C.F.R. § 100.5 may not be considered for aggregation with contributions of the State Party. Of the contributors listed in the Complaint, many do not fall within the definition of a Political Committee.

Assuming, *arguendo*, that the remaining organizations are Political Committees, they are not established, financed, maintained or controlled by the State Party. Nor did they make the questioned contributions "in cooperation, consultation or concert with, or at the request or suggestion of any other party unit or Political Committee established, financed, maintained or controlled by another party unit." 11 C.F.R. § 110.3(b)(3)(i)-(ii).

Accordingly, none of the questioned contributions to the Boozman Campaign are subject to aggregation with the contribution of the State Party.

ARGUMENT

- I. THE COMPLAINT FAILS TO DIFFERENTIATE STATEMENTS BASED UPON INFORMATION AND PERSONAL BELIEF, FAILS TO REVEAL THE SOURCE OF THE FINANCIAL INFORMATION UPON WHICH THE COMPLAINT IS BASED, FAILS TO PROVIDE SOURCE INFORMATION FOR A STATEMENT NOT BASED UPON PERSONAL KNOWLEDGE, AND WAS NOT NOTARIZED PROPERLY.

According to 11 C.F.R. § 111.4(c) (2 U.S.C. § 437g(a)(1)), a complaint should differentiate between statements based upon personal knowledge and those based on information and belief. Although unstated, on its face the Complaint is devoid of all references to facts based upon personal knowledge. Assuming that the Complaint is grounded in information, it should reveal the source of said information. 11 C.F.R. § 111.4(d)(2). The Complaint's addendum entitled "Political Party Committees Contributions to Boozman for U.S. Senate Committee in June," which serves as the basis for this Complaint, fails to cite a source for this information.

Moreover, the Complaint concludes that concerted action existed between the contributing organizations and the State Party, but no supporting information is given. It is entirely speculation, not information and belief. The regulations do not permit such speculation and this constitutes bad faith. The close "timing" of contributions occurred shortly after the State primary elections held on May 19. Any politically astute individual in Arkansas knows that both the Republican and Democrat Parties wait until shortly after the primaries and then quickly fund their respective federal candidates.

More importantly, immediately following the May 19 primary election, Dr. and Mrs. Boozman contacted the County Republican Committees and Republican Women's groups asking for contributions. These groups had to wait to approve any contributions until their next meeting, which would have occurred in mid- to late-June. Contributions were sent to the Campaign at various times in June 1998, but generally were entered on the Boozman Campaign's books by the Campaign Treasurer in batches on the dates received by the Campaign. See Exhibits "B" and "C" attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference.

Finally, a complaint must be properly notarized. 11 C.F.R. § 111.4(b)(2). This Complaint was not. The notary neglected to include his State and county designation and there is no notarial seal. Documents are notarized in order to guarantee authenticity and truthfulness. The validity of this notary can not be assumed. Without the missing information, nothing in the Complaint can be accepted as authentic or truthful. The Complaint is facially void and should be struck.

II. CONTRIBUTIONS BY ORGANIZATIONS THAT ARE NOT POLITICAL COMMITTEES CANNOT BE CONSIDERED FOR PURPOSES OF AGGREGATION OF CONTRIBUTIONS WITH THOSE OF THE STATE PARTY.

A committee is considered a "political committee" if it receives contributions or makes expenditures aggregating in excess of \$1,000.00 in a calendar year for the purpose of influencing a federal election. 2 U.S.C. § 432(4)(c). In absence of evidence that the contributors listed in the Complaint have met the \$1,000.00 threshold, they can

not be characterized as Political Committees for aggregate purposes. First General Counsel's Report-MUR # 2729, p.7. On information and belief, none of the contributors listed in the Complaint are registered with the F.E.C. as Political Committees.

Respondents have made inquiry and have received financial information from many, but not all, of the contributors establishing that they are not Political Committees, to wit:

2. Boone County Republican Committee
3. Faulkner County Republican Women
4. Jefferson County Republican Organization
5. Jefferson County Republican Women
6. Johnson County Republican Women
7. Montgomery County Republican Committee
8. Northwest Arkansas Republican Women

10. Saline County Republican Women
11. Sharp County Republican Committee
12. Siloam Springs Republican Women
13. Twin Lakes Federation of Republican Women
14. Washington County Republican Committee
15. Washington County Republican Women

See **Composite Exhibit "D"** attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference.

III. CONTRIBUTIONS BY POLITICAL COMMITTEES THAT ARE NOT ESTABLISHED, FINANCED, MAINTAINED OR CONTROLLED BY THE STATE PARTY CANNOT BE AGGREGATED WITH THE CONTRIBUTIONS OF THE STATE PARTY.

11 C.F.R. § 110.3(b)(3) presumes that all contributions made by Political Committees established, financed, maintained or controlled by the State Party are to be aggregated. In the instant case, the fact is that the contributors listed in the Complaint are not established, financed, maintained, or controlled by the State Party. The contributor organizations fall into two broad categories: (1) Local women's groups; and (2) Local county committees.

The contributor women's groups are separate organizations with locally written by-laws and locally elected officers. See **Composite Exhibit "E"** attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference. They are established when enough interested women in a county or local area meet and decide to form a group. The dues for membership in the local women's groups also convey membership in the State and National Republican Federations of Republican Women, with which the local organizations are affiliated. The women's organizations are maintained and controlled by the voting membership. Moreover, none of the contributor women's organizations received funds from the State Party. See **Composite Exhibit "F"** attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference.

Although, the rules of the State Party do incorporate the women's groups into the State organization, nothing beyond voting membership in most of the party bodies is mentioned. See **Exhibit "G"** attached hereto and incorporated herein by this

reference. Specifically see, Art. I, Sect. 2; Art. III, Sect. 2; Art. IV, Sect. 2; Art. V, Sect. 2; Art. VI, Sect. 2.

These local women's groups seem to be auxiliary organizations of the independent county committee. *Id.* Art. II, Sect. 8. But auxiliary organizations have been eliminated by the Republican National Committee in its 1996 Republican National Convention Rules. See **Exhibit "H"** attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference. To permit the continued existence of such auxiliaries on the county and local level violates the State party rules. *Id.* Art. II, Sect. 11(A) (No rules shall be established by a County Committee that are contrary to the rules of the Republican National Committee ...). Consequently, the women's organizations must conform to the status given them by the Republican National Committee.

The contributor women's organizations are not therefore, established, financed, maintained or controlled by the State Party. Assuming *arguendo* that they were, the presumption for aggregation is defeated by the financial reports of the State Party (**Exh. "F"**) which indicate that no funds were distributed to any of the women's organizations and by the lack of all but circumstantial evidence that contributions were made in concert with, or at the suggestion of any other party organization. This circumstantial evidence fails in the light of post-primary election, candidate funding previously discussed.

The contributor county committees likewise are funded by local dues and fundraisers. With these also, there is no evidence of monetary disbursements by the

State Party or of any action in concert with or at the suggestion of any other party organization. As with the women's groups, contributions to the Boozman Campaign were a post-primary event. Unlike the women's groups however, the county committees are a creation of State statute and are at most procedurally guided by some rules of the State Party. See **Exhibit "I"** attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference.

A.C.A. §§ 7-3-104 and 7-3-105 specifically provide that the members of the county committee and delegates to the county convention shall be elected by a majority of votes cast at the party primary elections. Further, the county chairman must be registered with the Arkansas Secretary of State and all committee members become election officials under the law. A.C.A. § 7-3-106 requires that the county party hold a convention at a specified time. A.C.A. § 7-7-203(j). The county convention officially receives the official list of nominated candidates, committee members, and delegates and selects delegates and alternates to all conventions held by the political party.

The county committee is only procedurally guided by some of the rules of the State Party in the following areas: number of meetings, order of business, election of officers, filling vacancies, removal of committee members, and that county by-laws must not be contrary to National or State Republican Committee Rules or to federal or state law. Rules, Art. II. The rules of the State Party do not control what is done at the county party level, how funds are raised, how much county dues are charged, who is elected as an officer or which candidate is supported, or how the daily county operation

functions. See **Composite Exhibit "J"** attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference. Consequently, the Republican Party of Arkansas does not control the contributing county committees.

IV. CONTRIBUTIONS NOT MADE IN COOPERATION, CONSULTATION OR CONCERT WITH, OR AT THE REQUEST OR SUGGESTION OF THE STATE PARTY OR A POLITICAL COMMITTEE ESTABLISHED, FINANCED, MAINTAINED OR CONTROLLED BY THE STATE PARTY CANNOT BE CONSIDERED FOR PURPOSES OF AGGREGATION OF CONTRIBUTIONS WITH THOSE OF THE STATE PARTY

The only evidence put forward by the Democratic National Senatorial Committee in support of its allegation that the subject contributions were made in concert with one another is the coincidental timing of those contributions. Any serious student of Arkansas politics knows that local party organizations are reluctant to commit their scarce resources to candidates in contested primary elections, as was the case with the Boozman race. It was not until after May 19, 1998 that Dr. Boozman emerged as the winner of the primary election against Tom Prince.

As the Democratic National Senatorial Committee doubtless knew when making this baseless complaint, where, as here, it can easily be shown that the local contributing organizations are not "established, maintained, financed or controlled" by the State Party, the contributions of political committees can still be aggregated with the State Party's contributions where it can be shown that the local contributions were made in cooperation, consultation or concert with, or at the request or suggestion of the State Party or a Political Committee established, financed, maintained or controlled by the

State Party. In other words, by simply alleging that timing alone was indisputable evidence of a concerted fund-raising campaign by the State Party, the opposition party felt safe in alleging a violation of the federal campaign finance laws had occurred.

The public record available to the Democratic National Senatorial Committee at the time it drafted and submitted its Complaint to this body establishes that the State Party did not give money to any county committees or to any Republican Women's groups in Arkansas and that none of the contributing organizations listed in the Complaint were Political Committees. Hence, it is apparent that the sole fact supporting the Complaint is the timing of the contributions. As has already been discussed, if none of the contributing organizations are Political Committees, then even the timing would be irrelevant. This is irrefutable evidence that at the time the Democratic National Senatorial Committee filed its Complaint there was no set of facts available to it from the public record which could support the Complaint.

CONCLUSION

The facts available to the Democratic National Senatorial Committee at the time it filed this Complaint provide no basis upon which the Complaint could be supported. This body should proceed to sanction the Democratic National Senatorial Committee for wasting the Commission's time and resources as well as the time and resources of the respondents.

Moreover, there is no basis upon which the Complaint might be justified based upon the evidence present in this case. This case should be closed as being without merit.





ARTICLE I NAME

Section 1. The name of this organization shall be
**NATIONAL FEDERATION OF
REPUBLICAN WOMEN.**

ARTICLE II Objectives

The objectives of this Organization shall be:

- to promote an informed public through political education and activity
- to increase the effectiveness of women in the cause of good government.
- to facilitate cooperation among the National and state federations of Republican women and Republican women's clubs
- to foster loyalty to the Republican party and to promote its principles and candidates in all elections, including non-partisan elections.
- to support the objectives and policies of the Republican National Committee and to work for the election of Republican Party nominees.

ARTICLE III Membership

Preface to Section 1:

An individual active member in good standing is one whose current dues are paid in an NFRW affiliated unit club. A unit club in good standing is one whose current dues and service charge are paid

Section 1. Eligibility:

Membership in the National Federation shall be extended to individual women, unit clubs, states, and the District of Columbia. The District of Columbia shall be considered a state for the purpose of these bylaws.

(a) State federations—Where there is a state federation affiliated with the National Federation, no other federation shall be eligible for membership.

(b) Unit clubs—Clubs become members in the National Federation only through membership in the state federation.

(c) Individual membership—Membership shall be only through clubs affiliated with the state and National Federation and includes membership in all three. Membership in clubs in unfederated states includes membership in the National Federation. Individuals may join their federation directly if no intervening organization or unit club is available to them, providing that single members shall be represented at state conventions by the same delegate accreditation proportions as those applying to unit clubs within the state.

(1) Associate Membership—Republican men may be eligible for associate membership only, upon payment of required annual dues. Republican women who are regular members of a unit club and who wish to support other unit clubs may be eligible for associate membership upon payment of required annual dues. They may attend meetings, but cannot make motions, have a voice or a vote, be on committees, hold office, or be counted for the purpose of determining the number of delegates to national or state federation meetings or conventions. As associate members, they do not become members of the state or National Federation.

(2) (a) National Associate Membership—A person who contributes money directly to the National Federation is a National Associate Member with-

out a voice at any federation meeting.
The membership cannot be counted in a state's representation for a state or National Federation convention. This member will receive the official publication of the NFRW and other educational material.

- (b) Membership in this classification does not preclude an individual from privileges of regular membership if she is also a member in good standing of a unit club.
- (c) U.S. citizens living in foreign countries may affiliate with the National Federation of Republican Women through unit clubs with a voice but no vote at any National Federation meeting.

Section 2. Qualifications.

- (a) A state federation or a club may be admitted to and continued in membership if the state bylaws are not in conflict with the National bylaws and its objectives; and if the club bylaws are not in conflict with the state and National bylaws and objectives. Neither a state federation nor a club shall be admitted to nor continued in membership that advocates a split party ticket or supports a candidate running on an opposition ticket.
- (b) State federations shall include in their bylaws:
 - that new clubs shall be accepted to membership only after approval of their bylaws by the state executive committee, or governing board and payment of dues and service charge, and that this provision will be enforced. (Ref. Sec. 3, Application for New Clubs.)
 - procedures for the election of the state

nominating committee.

- the establishment of a uniform date with in each of the several state federations for the election of unit club presidents
 - procedures and reasons for removal from and reinstatement of unit clubs to membership.
 - that a member shall be counted from one club only for the purpose of delegate representation to a state or National Federation meeting or convention. She may not serve as a delegate or alternate from any other club.
 - that only an active, voting member of a federated club is eligible to be a delegate or alternate to a state or National meeting or convention.
- (c) Unit clubs shall consist of ten or more women who form a permanent organization adopt bylaws, pay dues and service charge, and hold at least five meetings within a twelve-month period. The latter shall apply only to clubs where unusual circumstances prohibit more frequent meetings.
 - (d) Name—The word Republican shall be included in the title of all clubs. The word Federation shall not be used in the title of a club.

Section 3. Application for New Clubs:

- (a) There shall be no limit as to the number of clubs that can be organized within any area. A club must be in good standing for at least six months prior to the NFRW Biennial Convention to be eligible for representation. The six month period will begin as of the date the state president notifies the National President that the club's bylaws have been approved by the state's governing body. This notification shall be immediate and shall be

ARTICLE III Membership

Membership in the National Federation shall be extended to individual women, unit clubs, states, and the District of Columbia. The District of Columbia shall be considered a state for the purpose of these bylaws.

(a) State federations—Where there is a state federation affiliated with the National Federation, no other federation shall be eligible for membership.

(b) Unit clubs—Clubs become members in the National Federation only through membership in the state federation.

(c) Individual membership—Membership shall be only through clubs affiliated with the state and National Federation and includes membership in all three. Membership in clubs in unfederated states includes membership in the National Federation. Individuals may join their federation directly if no intervening organization or unit club is available to them, providing that single members shall be represented at state conventions by the same delegate accreditation proportions as those applying to unit clubs within the state.

(1) Associate Membership—Republican men may be eligible for associate membership only, upon payment of required annual dues. Republican women who are regular members of a unit club and who wish to support other unit clubs may be eligible for associate membership upon payment of required annual dues. They may attend meetings, but cannot make motions, have a voice or a vote, be on committees, hold office, or be counted for the purpose of determining the number of delegates to national or state federation meetings or conventions. As associate members, they do not become members of the state or National Federation.

(2) (a) National Associate Membership—A person who contributes money directly to the National Federation is a National Associate Member with-

Section 6. *Removal from and Reinstatement of Membership*

The NFRW Executive Committee shall have jurisdiction over removal from membership. A two-thirds vote of those present and voting is required.

(a) A state federation or a club in an unfederated state may be removed from membership for any of the following reasons:

--bylaws which are in conflict with national bylaws.

--non-payment of dues for the full membership and current service charge

--failure to support the Party ticket, advocating a split ticket, supporting a candidate on an opposition ticket, failure to support bylaws of the National Federation.

--failure to maintain a minimum of 10 members, and hold at least five meetings within a twelve month period.

--affiliation with any political organization which is not officially recognized as a part of the NFRW, and the Republican National Committee

(b) State Federations and local clubs shall not be continued in membership if they affiliate with any political organization which is not officially recognized as a part of the NFRW and the Republican National Committee. This applies to state federations and local clubs as entities and not to individual members.

(c) Assets, and Name Use

(1) The assets, upon dissolution of a state or local club, shall be distributed to the superior body. None of the assets shall be distributed to any member or officer of the organization.

(2) The right to use of the name of a dissolved club shall revert to the superior body.

(d) A state federation or a club in an unfederated state, removed from membership for any

cause, may be reinstated by filing an application with the NFRW Executive Committee. A two-thirds vote of those present and voting is required for reinstatement.

(e) A club desiring reinstatement on a continuing basis must pay all back dues.

Section 7. *Intermediate Organizations*

In order to expedite its work, a state federation may, in its bylaws, provide for intermediate organizations within its state structure (county, region, district, division, or any other title).

ARTICLE IV
Officers and Their Duties

Section 1. *Eligibility*

Each selected or appointed officer and members of standing and special committees shall be active members in good standing in a unit club.

Section 2. *Officers*

Elected officers of the NFRW shall be a President, a First Vice President, a Second Vice President, a Third Vice President, a Fourth Vice President, a Recording Secretary, a Treasurer, and three Members-at-Large.

Section 3. *Term*

The officers, with the exception of the three members at large, shall be elected at the Biennial Convention for a term of two years. The Members-at-Large will be elected by the Board of Directors, following the Biennial Convention, for a term of two years. No officer or member at large shall serve more than one term in the same office.

(a) The term of office shall be from January 1st following election through December 31st two years hence, regardless of when installation takes place. They shall serve until their successor takes office.

- (3) An officer candidate may not simultaneously run for more than one office.

Section 4. *Duties of the President*

The duties of the president shall be:

- (a) to preside at all meetings of the Federation, the Board of Directors, and the Executive Committee.
- (b) to represent the Federation at all times or to designate someone as representative in her absence or inability to do so.
- (c) to be the liaison officer between the National Federation and the Republican National Committee and to serve on its Executive Committee and the Chairman's Executive Council, *ex officio*, as long as Rule 24 (a) and (d) of that committee is in effect.
- (d) to appoint all standing and special committees except the nominating committee. The appointment of chairmen and vice chairmen of standing committees shall be approved by the Executive Committee.
- (e) to issue a Call to all Board Meetings at least 30 days prior to such meeting.
- (f) to prepare a program of action after consultation with the chairmen of standing committees for presentation to the Executive Committee and approval by the Board of Directors.
- (g) to prepare an annual budget and present it to the Executive Committee for approval and recommendations to the Board of Directors.
- (h) to appoint a Registered Parliamentarian.
- (i) to be an *ex officio* member of all committees except the nominating committee.
- (j) to employ such personnel as may be necessary to carry on the work of this Federation.
- (k) to instruct and supervise the finance director in the collecting and depositing of all funds in a bank which is either a member of the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation or the Federal Savings and Loan Insurance Corporation, approved by the Executive Com-

mittee; and in maintaining accurate financial records and sending of notices of unpaid dues to member federations and clubs in states where there is no state federation.

- (l) to co-sign checks with the Treasurer or another officer authorized by Executive Committee, in the inability of the Treasurer to sign, as directed by the Executive Committee in accordance with the annual budget adopted by the Board of Directors.
- (m) to obtain complete membership lists from state federation unit clubs; and, to place such lists under irrevocable trust for the exclusive use of the National Federation of Republican Women, as authorized by the Executive Committee for Federation communications.
- (n) to obtain the names of all clubs, club presidents, their addresses, zip codes, and the number of members in each club whose dues are paid and mailed to the National Federation President, post-marked at least 90 days preceding the Biennial Convention.
- (o) to mail the Call for the Biennial Convention postmarked at least 60 days prior to the Convention.
- (p) to prepare records of historical significance, as well as any pamphlets, manuals, educational material, periodic house organs, etc., with the help of the Historian, to be sent to the National Archives every two years; and upon retirement from office, prepare a written history of her administration, including a report of the political climate of the times, to be kept on file at the NFRW headquarters for future reference.
- (q) to reside in the metropolitan area of Washington, D.C. during her term of office.

Section 5. *Duties of the Vice Presidents*

The Vice Presidents in their order shall perform the duties of the President in her absence, and they shall perform such other duties as may be assigned to them by the President.

Section 6. *Duties of the Recording Secretary:*

- (a) to keep the minutes of all meetings of the National Federation, the Board of Directors, the Executive Committee, with the exception of the Biennial Convention, and to serve as chairman of the committee to approve minutes of the Biennial Convention.
- (b) to perform such other duties as may be assigned to her by the President.

Section 7. *Duties of the Treasurer:*

- (a) to have general supervision of all expenditures by reviewing monthly financial statements from the national office to insure that expenditures are within the approved budget.
- (b) to give bond sufficient to cover the maximum amount of money likely to be held by the Federation, the cost of such bond to be paid by the Federation.
- (c) to disburse funds as directed by the Executive Committee or the Board of Directors in accordance with the annual budget adopted by the Board of Directors.
- (d) to submit books for an annual audit by a certified or registered public accountant as approved by the Executive Committee.
- (e) to be *ex officio* member of the Credentials Committee on the NFRW Biennial Convention.
- (f) to provide written reports of receipts and disbursements for all meetings, and as directed by the President.

Section 8. *Officers' Records:*

All officers and all committee chairmen and vice chairmen shall deliver all records, files, and properties of the Federation to their successors.

ARTICLE V

Board of Directors and Executive Committee

Section 1. *Board of Directors:*

- (a) The voting body of the Board of Directors shall be the elected officers, the immediate past president of the NFRW, the president of each state federation including the District of Columbia and the territories, and the chairmen of the standing committees or their vice chairmen in the absence of their chairman.

The non-voting members of the Board shall be the Chairman and Vice Chairman of the Special Committees and the Chaplain, Historian, *Parliamentarian* and *Sergeant-at-Arms*.

(b) *Proxy Voting:*

A president of a state federation which has clubs in at least 75% of the congressional districts may appoint a member of the governing board as her proxy with a voice and a vote. Forms for proxies shall be provided by the National Federation. In the absence of a chairman of a standing committee, the vice chairman shall have the same privileges as the standing committee chairman at a NFRW Board meeting. Proxies from states in other classifications must be members of affiliated clubs.

(c) *Representation at Board Meetings:*

- (1) In a state where there is a state federation with clubs in at least 75% of the congressional districts, the representative shall be the state president, or in her absence a member of the state governing body.
- (2) A state federation having clubs in at least 50% of the congressional districts in the state shall be entitled to a representative or her proxy at meetings of the Board of Directors with voice but no vote.

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- (3) In a state where there is no state federation, the National Committeewoman and the State Vice Chairman shall arrange means by which the unit clubs may elect one representative of said state to represent them at meetings of the Board of Directors with voice but no vote. The proxy shall be a member in good standing of a unit club.

Section 2 *Duties of the Board of Directors*

The Duties of the Board of Directors shall be:

- (a) to be the governing body of the National Federation between conventions
- (b) to elect at the Board of Directors meeting immediately following the Biennial Convention three women who have served, or are serving as state federation presidents to serve as members-at-large on the Executive Committee with a voice and a vote, whose term shall run concurrently with that of the officers elected at the convention, but who shall serve for not more than one term.
- (c) to consider for approval the program of action as presented by the President to the Board of Directors.
- (d) to select the site of the Biennial Convention from recommendations made by the Executive Committee.
- (e) to approve the official program and order of business of the Biennial Convention which will include the hours the polls are to be opened and closed
- (f) to approve any Standard Operating Procedures giving specific implementation for the article in the bylaws to which they refer.
- (g) to adopt the annual budget
- (h) to elect a nominating committee of seven members and two alternates from its own membership, at the first meeting held in the calendar year in which the Biennial Convention is held, provided there is at least a 90 day period between the meeting and the

Convention. An alternate member shall be called into service by rank only in the absence, inability to serve, or resignation of a member of the Committee.

Section 3 *Meetings of the Board of Directors*

Meetings of the Board of Directors shall be as follows:

- (a) a spring board meeting shall be held in the year in which there is a Biennial Convention.
- (b) within 24 hours preceding the opening of Convention at the convention city.
- (c) within 24 hours after the adjournment of Convention.
- (d) special meetings may be called by the President or shall be called at the written request of 12 members of the Board of Directors.
- (e) at least 30 days' notice shall be given to each member for all Board meetings except emergency meetings when a 7 day notice shall be required.
- (f) in the even-numbered year the Board of Directors shall meet in the spring and fall at a time and place designated by the Executive Committee. As required in the Articles of Incorporation, the fall meeting shall be the annual meeting of the NFRW. The NFRW elected officers, state presidents, and standing committee chairmen shall represent the members at the meeting.

Section 4 *Quorum*

Twenty (20) members shall constitute a quorum for all meetings of the Board of Directors, providing two are officers elected by the Convention.

Section 5 *Executive Committee*

The Executive Committee shall consist of the elected officers and the immediate past president of the NFRW

Section 6. *Duties of the Executive Committee*

- (a) to have jurisdiction over membership applications and removal from and reinstatement to membership of state federations and clubs in unfederated states.
- (b) to set the date of the Biennial Convention and to recommend more than one site for the Convention to the Board of Directors.
- (c) to approve the President's recommendations of chairmen and vice chairmen for standing committees.
- (d) to recommend the annual budget to the Board of Directors.
- (e) to direct the Treasurer to disburse funds in accordance with the annual budget adopted by the Board of Directors.
- (f) to approve the bank or banks which are members of the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation or the Federal Savings and Loan Insurance Corporation where funds are to be deposited.
- (g) to meet on call of the President, or on written request of six members.
- (h) to provide a headquarters office as well as a residence in the metropolitan area of Washington, D.C. in which the President shall reside, unless she provides her own residence within this area.
- (i) to remove from office or duties by a two thirds vote of the Executive Committee any officer, member-at-large, standing committee chairman or vice chairman, or any National appointee who does not support the National Federation, its policies and objectives. If she is a state president at the time, such action shall not preclude her representation of that state on the Board of Directors.

Section 7. *Meetings of the Executive Committee*

- (a) The Executive Committee shall meet at the call of the President or upon written request of six members of the Executive Committee.

- (b) The Executive Committee shall meet immediately preceding and following each meeting of the Board of Directors. At Biennial Conventions they shall meet following the conclusion of the Convention.

Section 8. *Quorum*

Six members shall constitute a quorum for all meetings of the Executive Committee

ARTICLE VI Standing Committees

Section 1. *There shall be the following standing committees:*

Bylaws, Campaign, Fund Raising, Legislation and Research, Membership, Program and Public Relations. The Chairmen and vice chairmen of the committees shall be appointed by the President subject to the approval of the Executive Committee.

Section 2.

The standing committees shall prepare programs of action in their respective fields for consideration by the President and the Executive Committee.

ARTICLE VII Nominations and Elections

Section 1. *Nominations:*

- (a) A nominating committee of seven members and two alternates shall be elected from its own membership by a majority vote of the Board of Directors present and voting at the first meeting in the calendar year in which the Convention is to be held, provided there is at least a 90 day period between the Board meeting and the Convention. The members of this committee shall elect a chairman and a secretary from their own number.

(b) The nominating committee shall submit one nominee for each office, in a report to be sent out to all members of the Board of Directors and clubs, with the Call for the Biennial Convention.

(c) Nominees shall be members in good standing of the NFRW and shall be in accord with the objectives, bylaws, and policies of this Organization, the Republican Party and its platform.

(d) Nominations may be made from the floor following the report of the nominating committee, provided the nominee has given written consent to the President to serve if elected.

Section 2. Elections

(a) Election shall be by ballot and a majority of all votes cast shall constitute an election. Where there is only one candidate for an office, election may be by voice.

(b) The chairman of credentials shall give to the chairman of elections not less than eight hours before the polls open, a list of the names and number of certified delegates entitled to vote. At intervals thereafter she will notify the chairman of elections of any change in the number of voting delegates. She shall report to the Convention as requested.

(c) Polls shall be open and closed at hours determined by the Board of Directors.

Section 3. Vacancies:

A vacancy in an elective office shall be filled by election by the Board of Directors at the next meeting following the vacancy. Notice of such vacancy shall be given to the members of the Board of Directors with the Call for the meeting.

ARTICLE VIII Dues and Service Charge

Section 1. Dues:

(a) Annual dues for a state federation or a club where there is no state federation shall be computed as \$5.00 per capita for the full membership.

(b) Current per capita dues shall be remitted to NFRW as received by each state federation or unit club where there is no state federation.

Section 2. Service Charge:

(a) To be in good standing, a club shall pay a service charge of \$10.00 to be included with their first dues remittance to the NFRW for which it will receive all mailings and other services of the NFRW.

(b) A club dropped from good standing for non payment of the service charge may be reinstated at any time upon payment of the service charge, provided dues are current.

Section 3. New Clubs:

Upon application to a state federation, the per capita dues of five dollars (\$5.00) and the ten dollars (\$10.00) service charge per club, shall be paid to the state federation and then forwarded directly to the National Federation. Thereafter, the \$10.00 service charge may be paid to the state federation or sent directly to the National Federation as provided in the bylaws of the state.

Section 4.

State federations or clubs where there is no state federation that fail to pay per capita dues by December 31st of the current year may be removed from membership by a two-thirds vote of the NFRW Executive Committee present and voting.

Section 5. Fiscal Year

- (a) The fiscal year of this Federation shall be from January 1st through December 31st.
- (b) The fiscal year of each state Federation shall be from January 1st through December 31st in all transactions with the National Federation.

**ARTICLE IX
Conventions**

Section 1. Time and Place

- (a) A convention should be held biennially in the fall of the odd-numbered year at a time determined by the Executive Committee and at a place selected by the Board of Directors from recommendations made by the Executive Committee.
- (b) A Call to the Convention shall be mailed and postmarked at least 60 days prior to the date of the Convention.

Section 2. Eligibility

- (a) A club must be in good standing to be eligible for representation at a Biennial Convention. The same shall apply to a state federation. A continuing unit club shall have paid the previous year's dues and service charge and maintained its current dues and service charge. A state's delegate representation shall be based on the current dues received at NFRW headquarters post-marked no later than ninety days before the Convention.
- (b) New clubs must be in good standing for at least six months prior to the Convention to be eligible for representation (Article III, Sec 3(a)).
- (c) Delegates and alternates to the Biennial Convention must be members in good standing of a unit club affiliated with the state federation.

Section 3. Representation

- (a) The voting body of the Convention shall be:
 - (1) one delegate from each club
 - (2) five delegates-at-large from each state federation, and one additional delegate at-large for each 500 members or major fraction thereof in the state federation based on the payment to the National Federation of the current year's dues, post-marked 90 days before the Biennial Convention
 - (3) presidents of state federations
 - (4) national officers
 - (5) chairmen of standing committees, or in the absence of a chairman, the vice chairman of the committee as her alternate
 - (6) former presidents of the National Federation
- (b) A club and a state federation are entitled to an alternate for each elected delegate. There shall be no alternates for National officers or state presidents.
- (c) At least 90 days preceding the Biennial Convention each state federation president shall certify to the National President the names of the clubs which are in good standing, the number of members in each club, the names, addresses, including zip codes, of the club presidents. Only certified clubs shall be entitled to representation. (New Clubs See Article III, Sec. 3)
- (d) Delegates and alternates shall be selected in a manner determined by the state federation or club. The club president shall send the names, addresses and zip codes of the delegate and alternate to the state and National presidents, on credential forms furnished by the National Federation, postmarked no later than 30 days before the Biennial Convention. Any emergency change necessary after the filing date must be in writing or by telegram to the National President. Mail must be post-marked and telegrams sent no later than 10 days prior to the Convention.
- (e) The names, addresses (with zip codes) of the

state delegates-at-large and alternates-at-large shall be postmarked to the National President by the state president, on credential forms provided by the National Federation, no later than 20 days prior to the Convention. Emergency changes necessary after the filing date must be in writing or by telegram postmarked or sent no later than 10 days prior to the Convention.

Section 4. *Voting.*

The Convention shall be open to all members of the National Federation and visitors but only accredited delegates shall be entitled to vote, offer motions and debate. Delegates are defined as those persons included in Article IX, Sec. 3 - Representation. Each delegate is entitled to one vote. There shall be no proxy voting.

Section 5. *Quorum.*

A majority of the delegates attending and credentialed at a Convention shall constitute a quorum for the Convention.

ARTICLE X Parliamentary Authority

Robert's Rules of Order, Newly Revised, or the latest edition thereof shall govern the National Federation in all instances where they are applicable and in which they are not inconsistent with these bylaws.

ARTICLE XI Amendments

Section 1.

These bylaws may be amended at a Biennial Convention by a two-thirds vote, provided that the proposed amendment or amendments shall have been sent to each member of the Board of Directors and to each unit club president with the Call to the Convention and further provided that the proposed amendments shall have been

approved by a two-thirds vote of the Board of Directors before being submitted to the Convention for consideration.

Section 2.

In an emergency as determined by the NFRW Board of Directors, revision may be accomplished by a majority vote taken by mail of the state federations after a vote of their Board of Directors or conventions.

ARTICLE XII INDEMNIFICATION

The officers and directors of the NFRW may be indemnified for the expenses of defending actions arising against either the organization or themselves by virtue of their connection to the organization, as long as they are found to be innocent or, though found guilty of improper conduct, acted in good faith.

ARTICLE XIII DISSOLUTION

In the event of a dissolution of this organization, all of its assets remaining after payment of all costs and expenses of such dissolution shall be distributed to the Republican National Committee. None of the assets shall be distributed to any member or officer of this organization (NFRW).

BY LAWS

ARKANSAS FEDERATION OF REPUBLICAN WOMEN - BY LAWS

ARTICLE I - NAME

The name of this organization shall be Arkansas Federation of Republican Women.

ARTICLE II - OBJECTS

The objects of this organization shall be:
To promote an informed electorate through political education.
To increase the effectiveness of women in the cause of good government through active participation.
To facilitate cooperation among women's Republican clubs;
To foster loyalty to the Republican Party and to promote its ideals;
To work for the election of Republican Party's nominees;
To unite all of our efforts toward the establishment of a two-party system in the State of Arkansas.

ARTICLE III - MEMBERSHIP

Section 1:

Membership in this organization shall be open to any Republican Women's Club of ten (10) or more members whose bylaws provide for at least five (5) meetings a year, annual dues, and whose provisions do not conflict with the bylaws of this federation

Section 2:

Individual women may be federated and have all the privileges and responsibilities of the federation under the following conditions
A There is no club in her area
B She will pay her dues to a federated club of her choice.
C She will make every effort to establish a federated club in her area and report her efforts to District Director, yearly.

Section 3:

All applications for membership shall be sent to the State Federation headquarters on blanks furnished for that purpose. Certificates of membership will be forwarded as soon as application has been approved by the membership and executive committee. A copy of the club's bylaws shall accompany application for active membership

Section 4:

Associate Membership:

Republican men may be eligible for associate membership only, upon payment of required dues. They may attend meetings, but cannot make motions, have a voice or vote, be on committees, hold office, or be counted for the purpose of determining the number of delegates to national or state federation meetings or conventions. As associate members, they do not become members of the state or national federation. Dues shall be set by the individual club and shall remain in the club treasury.

Section 5:

Removal from Membership:

A club may be removed from membership by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the Executive Committee for the following reasons:

- (a) Non-payment of dues by the March deadline
- (b) Supporting an opposition candidate or supporting a candidate running on an opposition ticket
- (c) Failure to hold at least five (5) meetings within a twelve (12) month period
- (d) Failure to fulfill duties outlined in state bylaws

Section 6:

Reinstatement of Membership:

A club, removed from membership for any cause, may be reinstated by filing an application and by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the Executive Committee.

ARTICLE IV - OFFICERS AND THEIR DUTIES

Section 1:

The Officers of this organization shall be: President, First vice-president, Second vice-president, Third vice-president, Secretary, Treasurer, all of whom shall be elected at the Biennial Convention, and two district directors from each of the four congressional districts, who shall be elected in their respective districts by the clubs within the district.

Section 2:

Duties of the Officers:

- (a) The duties of the President shall be:
To preside at all meetings of the organization, the Board of Directors and Executive Committee.
To appoint all committees except the Nominating Committee, the appointment of chairman of standing committees to be approved by the Executive Committee.
To be an ex officio member of all committees except the Nominating Committee.
To prepare a program of action after consultation with the chairman of standing committees for presentation to the Board of Directors.
To appoint a Parliamentarian.
To issue the Call for the Biennial Convention at least sixty (60) days prior to the Convention.
To sign checks, in emergency, and by vote of the Executive Committee, in the inability of the Treasurer to do so.
To represent in the organization at all times or to designate someone as representative in her absence or inability to do so.
- (b) The Vice-presidents, in their order, shall perform the duties of the President in her absence or inability to serve. They shall perform such other duties as may be assigned to them.
- (c) The Secretary shall keep and read the minutes of all meetings of the Federation, the Board of Directors and the Executive Committee. She shall be custodian of all records and papers of the Federation, except those that pertain to some other office or committee.
- (d) The Treasurer shall be custodian of all funds of the organization and shall disburse them only on written authorization. She shall keep an accurate account of all receipts and disbursements and shall give a full report at the annual meeting as ordered by the President. The books of the Treasurer shall be audited annually between the dates May 15-June 15 by an auditing committee appointed by the Executive Committee.

- (e) The Congressional District Directors shall promote the work of the Federation generally in their districts, under the direction of the President. She shall take the initiative in organizing new clubs and shall visit each club in her section of the district at least once a year.

Section 3:

Term of Office:

The term of office for officers and chairmen shall be two (2) years and no officer or chairman may serve in the same position for more than two (2) consecutive terms. The term of service shall begin at the conclusion of the Biennial Convention at which the officers are elected.

Section 4

Qualification:

Any state officer or appointee must be a dues-paying member of a bona fide federated club of this state whose state and national dues are paid.

Section 5:

Removal of Officers:

An Officer may be removed from office by two-thirds (2/3) vote of the Board of Directors for the following reasons:

- Failure to qualify as a dues-paying member as stated in Article IV, Section 4
- Supporting an opposition candidate
- Failure to attend Board of Directors' meetings without good and proper reason
- Failure to fulfill duties as outlined in the AFRW Bylaws

ARTICLE V - BOARD OF DIRECTORS & EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

Section 1:

The Board of Directors of the State Federation shall consist of the elected officers, chairmen standing committees, the immediate past state president, and the president of each club in good standing. The Republican National Committeewoman and the State Vice-Chairman shall be members of the Board of Directors.

Section 2:

Duties of the Board of Directors:

The Board of Directors shall have authority to transact the business of the Federation between Biennial Conventions, to fill vacancies in elective offices that occur between Biennial elections.

Section 3:

Executive Committee:

The Executive Committee shall consist of the elected officers of the State Federation and the immediate past State President, the Republican National Committeewoman, and the State Vice-Chairwoman.

Section 4:

Duties of the Executive Committee:

The Executive Committee shall have complete jurisdiction over membership, to approve the appointments of the President of chairman of standing committee. To recommend the annual budget to the Board of Directors.

Direct the disbursement of funds.

Approve the bank or banks where funds are to be deposited.

To meet on Call of the President or written request of four (4) members.

ARTICLE VI - MEETINGS

Section 1:

(a) Biennial Conventions

The Biennial Convention of this Federation shall be held in May of odd-numbered years at such place and place as shall be determined by the AFRW Board of Directors. The Call for the Biennial Convention shall be sent to all member clubs at least 60 days prior to the Convention.

(b) Voting Body

The voting body of a convention shall be

- Two (2) Delegates from club and for each fifteen (15) members one additional Delegate (an equal number of alternates) based on per capita dues paid on

- membership on December 31 of previous year
- (2) Clubs organized and filing for membership before May 1 of convention year will be entitled to two (2) voting Delegates and two (2) Alternates
- (3) Members of the Board of Directors
- (4) Past State Presidents
- (c) The Delegates shall be selected in such a manner as their respective clubs shall prescribe; the selection shall be made not less than two (2) weeks prior to the convention and names shall be sent to State Federation headquarters on blanks provided for that purpose and as prescribed in the Call for the convention.
- (d) In the Absence of a Delegate, an Alternate may vote There shall be no proxy voting

Section 2:

Board of Directors Meeting

The Board of Directors shall meet three (3) times per year in conjunction with the Executive Committee at such time and place as shall be determined by the Executive Committee. Other meetings of the Board of Directors may be called by the President, or upon written request of at least four (4) members of the Executive Committee. The Call for all Board of Directors meetings shall be sent to all members of the Board of Directors at least two (2) weeks before the meeting

Section 3:

Executive Committee Meetings:

The Executive Committee shall meet four (4) times a year at such time and place as shall be determined by the President. Other meetings may be called by the President, or upon written request of at least four (4) members of the Executive Committee. The Call for all Executive Committee meeting shall be sent to all members of the Executive Committee at least one (1) week before the meeting

ARTICLE VII - DUES

Section 1: Per Capita Dues:

Each club in the Federation shall pay an annual per capita of five dollars (\$5.00) which shall include dues to the State and National Federations. Dues shall be payable January 1 and shall be delinquent after March 1.

Section 2: Supply Charge:

Each club in good standing will receive all mailings and other services of the Arkansas Federation after payment of annual dues and supply charge of the following amounts:

- Clubs with membership of 10-20 members \$10.00
- Clubs with membership of 21-50 members \$15.00
- Clubs with membership of 51-75 members \$20.00
- Clubs with membership of 76-125 members \$25.00
- Clubs with membership of 126 or over \$30.00

Section 3:

Fiscal Year:

The fiscal year of the Federation shall be January 1 to December 31

Section 4:

Only clubs whose dues are paid thirty (30) days prior to the Biennial Convention, shall be entitled to representation in the convention.

Section 5:

Service Charge of \$10.00 shall be forwarded with per capita tax to the State Treasurer for transmittal to the National Federation

ARTICLE VIII - NOMINATIONS AND ELECTIONS

Section 1: Nominations:

A Nominating Committee of four (4) members shall be elected, one (1) from each congressional district by the clubs in such district at the preceding Biennial Convention. This committee shall elect its own chairman from one of its number. The Nominating Committee shall submit one or two nominees for each office in a report to be sent out to the members of the Board of Directors and to all member clubs with the Call for the Biennial Convention. Nominations may also be made from the floor of the convention following the report of the nominating committee to the convention. No one shall be nominated who has not given consent to serve if elected.

Section 2: Election:

Election shall be held at the Biennial Convention and election shall be by secret ballot except where there is only one (1) candidate for office, if only one (1) candidate for an office, election may be by voice. A plurality vote shall elect.

Section 3:

Elections Committee:

An Elections Committee of not less than three (3) members shall be appointed by the President at the Board of Directors meeting prior to convention. This committee shall provide all election materials and shall act as tellers for the election.

Section 4:

No one shall serve on the Nominating Committee for more than two (2) consecutive terms

ARTICLE IX - COMMITTEES

Section 1:

The standing committees of the Federation shall include: Campaign Activities, Membership, Public Relations, Finance, Program, Revisions, and Scholarships

Section 2: Duties of the Committee: The Duties of the standing committees shall be prescribed by the Board of Directors.

Section 3: Special Committees: Special Committees may be appointed by the President as deemed advisable.

ARTICLE X - QUORUM

Section 1: Biennial Convention:

A quorum at the Biennial Convention shall consist of a majority of the Delegates attending the convention

Section 2: Board of Directors:

A quorum at any meeting of the Board of Directors shall consist of a majority of the members of the committee.

Section 3: Executive Committee:

A quorum at any meeting of the Executive Committee shall be a majority of the members of the committee

Section 4: Committees:

Quorums for meetings of any committee shall be a majority of the members of the committee.

ARTICLE XI - PARLIAMENTARY AUTHORITY

Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised, shall govern all proceedings except where inconsistent with the provisions of the Bylaws of this organization.

ARTICLE XII - AMENDMENTS

These Bylaws may be amended by a majority vote of Delegates present at any meeting of the Board of Directors, provided that notice of proposed amendments has been sent to each member of the Board of Directors and to each club at least thirty (30) days prior to the meeting, and provided further that amendments shall go into effect after ratification by the succeeding Biennial Convention or be a majority vote, taken by mail, of congressional districts or a majority of the clubs.

**BY-LAWS
BELLA VISTA REPUBLICAN WOMEN**

ARTICLE I

NAME: The name of this organization shall be *The Bella Vista Republican Women (B.V.R.W.) of Arkansas.*

ARTICLE II

OBJECTIVES: The objective of this Organization shall be:

- a. to promote an informed public through political education and activity.
- b. to increase the effectiveness of women in the cause of good government.
- c. to facilitate cooperation among Republican women.
- d. to foster loyalty to the Republican party and to promote its principles and candidates in all elections, including nonpartisan elections.
- e. to work for the election of the Republican party's nominees.
- f. to unite all our efforts towards the establishment of a two-party system in Arkansas.

ARTICLE III

MEMBERSHIP:

Section 1 This organization shall be a member of the National Federation of Republican Women (N.F.R.W.) and the Arkansas Federation of Republican Women (A.F.R.W.).

Section 2 Membership shall consist of:

- a. *Active:* Membership in this organization shall be open to any Republican woman who pays the required dues and believes in the principles of the Republican Party.
- b. *Dual:* A woman who maintains active membership in another unit may join B.V.R.W. by paying the required dues. She may attend meetings, but cannot make motions, have a voice, vote or hold office. A dual member cannot be counted in the total membership number, or for the purpose of determining delegates to N.F.R.W. or A.F.R.W. meetings or conventions. Dual dues shall remain in the B.V.R.W. treasury.
- c. *Associate:* Republican men are eligible for associate membership by paying the required dues. He may attend meetings, but cannot make motions, have a voice, vote or hold office. An associate member cannot be counted in the total membership number, or for the purpose of determining delegates to A.F.R.W. or N.F.R.W. meetings or conventions. Associate dues shall remain in the B.V.R.W. treasury.

Section 3 Membership shall lapse if dues are 60 days in arrears. Membership may be reinstated upon payment of dues.

ARTICLE IV

DUES:

- Section 1* Membership dues shall be as recommended by the Executive Board, approved by the general body and are payable annually.
- Section 2* Membership dues shall include per capita dues for the N.F.R.W. and the A.F.R.W.
- Section 3* The treasurer shall pay the annual fee required to receive the educational material from the N.F.R.W. and the A.F.R.W.
- Section 4* Annual dues are payable when member joins and are renewable on the first of January each year.
- Section 5* The fiscal year shall be from January 1 to December 31.

ARTICLE V

OFFICERS AND EXECUTIVE BOARD:

- Section 1* OFFICERS: shall be the President, First Vice-President, Second Vice-President, Recording Secretary, Corresponding Secretary, and Treasurer.
- Section 2* The term of office for all officers shall be for a period of one year. No officer may serve in the same position for more than two consecutive terms.
- Section 3* DUTIES OF OFFICERS:
- a PRESIDENT:
 - * shall preside at meetings and Executive Board meetings.
 - * shall prepare a budget with the help of the Finance Committee (Authorized by the Executive Board) and present it to the membership for approval or change at a regular meeting.
 - * shall appoint chairmen of all committees as authorized by the bylaws, the Executive Board and the Membership.
 - * shall attend Benton County Republican Committee meetings.
 - * shall serve as ex-officio member of all committees except nominating committee.
 - * shall be authorized by the Executive Board or Membership to sign checks in the event the Treasurer is unavailable.
 - * shall serve on the A.F.R.W. Board of Directors.
 - * shall appoint a three member auditing committee to audit the records of the Treasurer annually.
 - * shall serve on the Republican Party of Arkansas (R.P.A.) State Committee.
 - b FIRST VICE-PRESIDENT
 - * shall perform the duties and responsibilities of the President when she is absent or unable to serve.

- * shall be Program Chairman and supervise the monthly programs.
- * shall serve on the R.P.A. Regional / District Committee.

c. SECOND VICE-PRESIDENT

- * shall perform the duties and responsibilities of the President or Vice-President when she is absent or unable to serve, and other duties the President may designate.
- * shall advise Committee Chairmen to prepare annual reports for presentation at the November annual meeting.

d. RECORDING SECRETARY

- * shall prepare, maintain and read minutes of all meetings.

e. CORRESPONDING SECRETARY

- * shall handle all official correspondence.
- * shall serve as Recording Secretary when she is absent or unable to serve.

f. TREASURER

- * shall receive and be custodian of all funds and shall pay all bills authorized and approved by the Executive Board or Membership.
- * shall maintain a procedure book and keep an account of all monies received and disbursed.
- * shall serve as Chairman of the Finance Committee.
- * shall maintain a current membership list and pay annual dues and service charges to the N.F.R.W. and the A.F.R.W.
- * shall report in full at the annual meeting and at regular meetings as required by the President.

Section 4.

EXECUTIVE BOARD:

- * shall consist of the elected officers, the immediate Past President, and Chairmen of Standing Committees, with the Parliamentarian serving as an ex-officio member..

Section 5.

DUTIES OF THE EXECUTIVE BOARD.

- * shall have the authority to transact any necessary business between meetings, to make policy recommendations, to advise the president, and to fill vacancies that occur between elections.
- * shall approve the appointments of standing committee chairmen appointed by the President.

ARTICLE VI

MEETING:

Section 1.

The annual meeting shall be held in November for the annual committee reports and for the election of officers.

Section 2

The regular meeting shall be held on the fourth Monday of each month unless otherwise ordered by the Executive Board. The social time shall begin at 9:30 a.m. with meeting beginning at 10:00 a.m.

- Section 3* Special meetings shall be held at the call of the President or upon written request signed by a 2/3 majority of the members. The purpose of the meeting shall be stated in the call and no other business shall be transacted.
- Section 4* Regular meetings of the Executive Board shall meet quarterly at such time and place as may be determined by the President.
- Section 5* Special meetings of the Executive Board may be called by the President or upon written request signed by a majority of the members of the Executive Board. The purpose of the meeting shall be stated in the call and no other business shall be transacted.

ARTICLE VII

NOMINATIONS AND ELECTIONS:

- Section 1* A Nominating Committee of not less than three members from the general body and two from the Executive Board shall be recommended by the President and elected by the Board. The Nominating Committee shall elect its own chairman.
- Section 2* The slate of officers selected by the Nominating Committee shall include one nominee for each office. The membership shall be notified in writing of the slate of officers presented by the Nominating Committee at least 10 days prior to the November Meeting. Consent of nominee is required before presentation of the slate.
- Section 3* Election shall be held at the Annual Meeting. After the slate of officers selected by the Nominating Committee has been presented, nominations from the floor shall be allowed. Where there is only one candidate for an office, election may be by voice. Where there is more than one nominee, vote shall be by secret ballot. A plurality vote shall elect. Newly elected officers assume their responsibilities on the first of January.

ARTICLE VIII

COMMITTEES:

- Section 1.* **STANDING COMMITTEES:**

Hospitality
Legislative
Publicity
Sustaining
Telephone
Ways / Means / Finance
Yearbook

Section 2 The standing committee shall prepare programs of action in their respective field for consideration by the President and the Executive Board.

Section 3. Special or Subcommittees may be established by the President as deemed advisable.

ARTICLE IX

QUORUM:

Section 1. A quorum for a meeting shall be 10 percent of membership.

Section 2. A quorum for a meeting of the Executive Board shall be 1/3 of the membership.

ARTICLE X

POLICY:

Section 1. This organization, the President and First Vice-President shall not endorse any candidate for office in contested Republican primaries, with the exception of President of the United States.

Section 2. This organization and officers may not issue statements or pass resolutions on controversial issues in the name of B.V.R.W. without first polling the members and obtaining a 2/3 vote.

Section 3. Any material distributed, circulated or sold at meeting, with the exception of authorized Republican material, must be approved by the President.

Section 4. All public announcements at meetings shall be approved by the President.

ARTICLE XI

AMENDMENTS:

These bylaws may be amended by a 2/3 vote of members present and voting. Notice of proposed amendments must be read at the meeting prior to the meeting of the vote, and/or submitted in writing to the membership at a previous meeting.

STANDING RULES:

Standing rules... are rules (1) which are related to the details of administration rather than to parliamentary procedure, and (2) which can be adopted or changed upon the same conditions as any ordinary act of the organization.

BYLAWS

BENTON COUNTY REPUBLICAN WOMEN

ARTICLE I — NAME

The name of this organization shall be BENTON COUNTY REPUBLICAN WOMEN (B.C.R.W.), ARKANSAS.

ARTICLE II — OBJECTIVES

- To promote an informed electorate through political education.
- To increase the effectiveness of women in the cause of good government through active political participation.
- To facilitate cooperation among Republican Women.
- To foster loyalty to the Republican Party and to promote its ideals.
- To work for the election of the nominees of the Republican Party.
- To take part in civic projects in order to promote a better community.

ARTICLE III — MEMBERSHIP

Section 1 This organization shall be a member of the National Federation of Republican Women (N.F.R.W.) and the Arkansas Federation of Republican Women (A.F.R.W.)

Section 2 Membership shall consist of:

- a. *Active:* Membership in this organization shall be open to any Republican woman who pays the required dues and believes in the principles of the Republican Party.
- b. *Associate:* Republican men may be eligible for associate membership only upon payment of required annual dues. Republican women who are regular members of a unit club and who wish to support other unit clubs may be eligible for associate

membership upon payment of required annual dues. Associate members may attend meetings, but cannot make motions, have a voice or a vote, be on committees, hold office, or be counted for the purpose of determining the number of delegates to national or state federation meetings or conventions. As associate members they do not become members of the state or National Federation. Associate dues shall remain in the B.C.R.W. treasury.

- Section 3 Membership shall lapse if dues are 60 days in arrears. Member may be reinstated upon payment of dues.

ARTICLE IV — DUES

- Section 1. Membership dues shall be as recommended by the Executive Board, approved by the general body and are payable annually.
- Section 2 Membership dues shall include per capita dues for the N.F.R.W. and the A.F.R.W.
- Section 3 The Treasurer shall pay the annual fee required to receive the educational material from the N.F.R.W. and the A.F.R.W.
- Section 4 Annual dues are payable when member joins and are renewable on the first of January each year.
- Section 5 The fiscal year shall be from January 1 to December 31.

ARTICLE V — OFFICERS AND EXECUTIVE BOARD

- Section 2 The term of office for all officers shall be for a period of one year. No officer may serve in the same position for more than two consecutive terms.

- shall appoint a three member auditing committee to audit the records of the Treasurer annually.
- shall serve on and be a voting member of the Republican Party of Arkansas (R.P.A.) State Committee.

b. FIRST VICE-PRESIDENT:

- shall perform the duties and responsibilities of the President when she is absent or unable to serve, and other duties the President may designate.
- shall be Program Chairman and supervise the monthly programs.
- shall serve on and be a voting member of the R.P.A. Regional/District Committee.

c. SECOND VICE-PRESIDENT:

- shall perform the duties and responsibilities of the President or First Vice-President when she is absent or unable to serve, and other duties the President may designate.
- shall call Executive Board members for meetings.
- shall advise Committee Chairmen to prepare annual reports for presentation at the November annual meeting.

d. RECORDING SECRETARY:

- shall prepare, maintain and read minutes of all meetings.

e. CORRESPONDING SECRETARY:

- shall handle all official correspondence.
- shall serve as *Recording Secretary* when she is absent or unable to serve.

f. TREASURER:

- shall receive and be custodian of all funds and shall pay all bills authorized and approved by the Executive Board or membership.
- shall maintain a procedure book and keep an account of all monies received and disbursed.
- shall serve as Chairman of the Finance Committee.
- shall maintain a current membership list and pay annual dues and service charges to the N.F.R.W. and the A.F.R.W.
- shall report in full at the annual meeting and at regular meetings as required by the President.

Section 4**EXECUTIVE BOARD:**

- shall consist of the elected officers, the immediate Past President, and Chairmen of Standing Committees.

Section 5**DUTIES OF THE EXECUTIVE BOARD**

- shall have the authority to transact any necessary business between meetings, to make policy recommendations, to advise the president, and to fill vacancies that occur between elections.
- shall approve the appointments of standing committee chairmen appointed by the President.

ARTICLE VI — MEETING**Section 1.**

The annual meeting shall be held in November for the annual committee reports and for the election of officers.

Section 2.

The regular meeting shall be held on the third Tuesday of each month unless otherwise ordered by the Executive Board.

Section 3

The time and place of the meeting shall be determined by the Executive Board.

Section 4

Special meetings shall be held at the call of the President or upon written request signed by a majority of the members.

The purpose of the meeting shall be stated in the call and no other business shall be transacted.

- Section 5 Regular meetings of the Executive Board shall be held prior to the regular meetings at such time and place as may be determined by the President.
- Section 6 Special meetings of the Executive Board may be called by the president or upon written request signed by a majority of the members of the Executive Board. The purpose of the meeting shall be stated in the call and no other business shall be transacted.

ARTICLE VII — NOMINATIONS AND ELECTIONS

- Section 1 A Nominating Committee of not less than three members from the general body and two from the Executive Board shall be recommended by the President and elected by the Board. The Nominating Committee shall elect its own chairman.
- Section 2 The slate of officers selected by the Nominating Committee shall include one nominee for each office. The membership shall be notified in writing of the slate of officers presented by the Nominating Committee at least 10 days prior to the November Meeting. Consent of nominee is required before presentation of the slate.
- Section 3. Election shall be held at the Annual Meeting. After the slate of officers selected by the Nominating Committee has been presented, nominations from the floor shall be allowed. Where there is only one candidate for an office, election may be by voice. Where there is more than one nominee, vote shall be by secret ballot. A plurality vote shall elect. Newly elected officers assume their responsibilities on the first of January.

- Section 4 All public announcements at meetings shall be approved by the President or Chair.
- Section 5 Upon the death of a member or former member, a \$10.00

memorial shall be donated to the Douglas Tyler Burton Scholarship Fund. The memorial shall be in addition to the regularly budgeted contribution. The Executive Board has the authority to approve additional memorials.

ARTICLE XI — PARLIAMENTARY AUTHORITY

Robert's Rules of Order, Newly Revised, shall govern all proceedings except where inconsistent with the provisions of the bylaws of this organization.

ARTICLE XII — AMENDMENTS

These bylaws may be amended by a 2/3 vote of members present. Notice of proposed amendment must be read at the meeting prior to the meeting of the vote, and/or submitted in writing to the membership 10 days before the vote.

JEFFERSON COUNTY REPUBLICAN WOMEN BYLAWS REVISED

I. NAME

The Official name of this organization shall be the Jefferson County Republican Women; hereafter referred to as JCRW.

II OBJECTIVES

Provide a forum in which women voters can become informed, educated, and active in the causes of good government and community involvement.

Provide support needed to advance the cause of the Republican Party, its candidates and the two-party political system of government.

To increase the effectiveness of women in the cause of good government through active participation.

III MEMBERSHIP

Section 1: Active Membership

A. Membership in the JCRW shall be open to registered women voters who will support and work for the objects of the organization.

B. Membership shall require payment of dues which will be renewed annually on or before December 1 of each calendar year.

C. Membership dues include dues for the Arkansas Federation of Republican Women (AFRW) and National Federation of Republican Women (NFRW).

Section 2: Associate Membership

Associate members - Republican men may be eligible for associate membership only upon payment of required annual dues. Republican women who are regular members of a club and who wish to support other clubs may be eligible for associate membership upon payment of required annual dues. Both may attend meetings, but cannot make motions, have a voice or vote, be on committees, hold office, or be counted for the purpose of determining the number of delegates to national or state federation meetings or conventions. Associate dues remain in the JCRW treasury.

Section 3: Removal from Membership - A member may be removed from membership for the following reasons:

- (a) Non-payment of dues by March 1.
- (b) Failure to fulfill duties outlined in the bylaws

Section 4: Reinstatement of Membership - A member, removed from membership for any cause, may be reinstated by request, payment of dues (if in arrears) and a two-thirds vote of the Executive Committee.

IV DUES

Section 1: Membership dues shall be as recommended by the Executive Board, approved by the general body, and are payable annually.

Section 2: All members of the JCRW will pay annual dues. These dues are to be collected each year before December 1st and the fees required submitted by the club Treasurer to the AFRW and NFRW by December 31st.

Section 3: The fiscal year of the JCRW is to be January 1 to December 31.

Section 4: Dues paid to the JCRW include membership in the AFRW and NFRW and will also include a newsletter to be sent out periodically.

Section 5: Annual dues are payable upon joining and are renewable on or before December 1st. of each calender year.

V MEETINGS

Section 1: Meetings of the JCRW shall be held regularly with no less than five (5) meetings per calender year.

Section 2: Special meetings of the general membership may be called by the President or a majority of the Executive Committee. The purpose of the meeting shall be stated in the call and no other business shall be transacted.

Section 3: Only members in good standing with dues paid will be allowed as voters and only those voters will be eligible to be delegates or alternates at the State and National meetings or conventions.

VI ELECTION OF OFFICERS

Section 1: The elected officers of the JCRW shall be President, First Vice-President, Second Vice-President, Recording Secretary, Corresponding Secretary, and Treasurer. Each officer shall be a member in good standing of the JCRW at the time of her election.

Section 2: Election of Officers shall be held during the annual business meeting, usually held in November. Terms of office shall be for one year or until successors have been duly elected. The offices of President and First and Second Vice-President shall be restricted to no more than two consecutive terms. Should a vacancy occur in the office of President, the First Vice-President shall assume the duties of President and the Second Vice-President shall assume the duties of the First Vice-President. Installation of officers will take place at the last meeting of the calendar year (usually December).

Section 3: A Nominating Committee of at least three (3) members shall be elected no later than the September meeting of the year by a majority of voting members present. The committee will make a report during the October business meeting to nominate one or more persons for consideration for each officer position. Nominations may then be taken from the floor. No one shall serve on the Nominating Committee for more than two consecutive terms. Notice of the names nominated for each office will appear in the November newsletter prior to the annual meeting.

Section 4: The supervision and responsibility of all elections is placed upon the President who will preside over the proceedings. Secret ballots may be used upon the request of any eligible voting member.

Section 5: Where there is only one candidate for an office, election may be by voice. Where there is more than one nominee, vote shall be by secret ballot. Consent of all nominees is required before presentation.

VII EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

Section 1: The executive committee of the JCRW shall be composed of the duly elected officers and the immediate Past President.

1. The primary function of the Executive Committee is to administer such business as shall occur between regular meetings of the JCRW and make recommendations as to policies and procedures not specified in the bylaws.

2. To meet on call of the President or written request of four (4) members.

3. The Executive Committee shall approve appointments of the President and fill vacancies which occur by the resignation of an officer.

4. The Executive Committee shall prepare an annual budget with the Treasurer and shall report to the membership of the JCRW for approval.

Section 2: President

1. The President shall serve as the official spokesperson for the JCRW, shall preside over general meetings and Executive Committee meetings; may co-sign checks with the Treasurer or First Vice-President; and generally supervise all activities, programs, and the general welfare of the JCRW and its members.

2. With the approval of the Executive Committee, she may appoint the chairmen of all standing committees and may dismiss any chairmen who, in her judgement, is not acting in or for the best interest of the organization or not fulfilling her duties. She shall be an ex-officio member of all committees, except the Nominating Committee.

3. The President shall represent the JCRW at political functions and on any committee or organization designated by the AFRW, NFRW, or official County, State, or National Republican Party organization. She shall be a voting member of the Republican Party of Arkansas State Committee and serve on the AFRW Board of Directors.

4. The President shall appoint a Parliamentarian

5. The President shall appoint a *three (3) member committee* to audit the records of the Treasurer annually.

Section 3: First Vice-President

1. The responsibilities of the First Vice-President includes contacting speakers and co-ordinating programs for the JCRW. She shall, upon the absence of the President, assume all the duties of the office and upon the resignation of the President, shall succeed to that office. She may co-sign checks with the President or Treasurer.

2. The First Vice-President shall represent the JCRW at political functions and on any committee or organization designated by the AFRW, NFRW, or official County, State, or National Republican Party organizations. She shall be a voting member of the Republican Party of Arkansas Regional/District Committee.

Section 4: Second Vice-President

1. The Second Vice-President shall co-ordinate social and campaign activities including fundraisers, receptions for candidates, membership drives, etc., and represent the JCRW at political functions as required.

2. The Second Vice-President shall, upon the promotion or resignation of the First Vice-President, assume all the duties of that office.

3. The Second Vice-President shall be responsible for collecting and reporting all volunteer hours by members of the JCRW.

Section 5: Past President

The Past President shall perform the duties of the President in her absence or inability to serve in the event that the First and Second Vice Presidents are also unable to serve. She shall also perform such other duties as may be assigned to her.

Section 6: Recording Secretary

The Recording Secretary shall keep and read accurate minutes of all general and Executive Committee meetings of the JCRW. She shall record attendance, maintain a roster of membership and serve as Historian Committee Chairman. She shall be custodian of all records and papers of the organization.

Section 7: Corresponding Secretary

The Corresponding Secretary shall be responsible for notifying the membership of the date, time, and place of all meetings and special activities and handle official mailings and correspondence of the JCRW. She shall serve as Recording Secretary when she is absent or unable to serve.

Section 8: Treasurer

1. The Treasurer shall pay all bills authorized and approved by the Executive Committee or general membership.

2. The Treasurer shall be custodian, collector, and depositor of all funds; send notices of unpaid dues to members; may co-sign with the President or 1st Vice-President and make regular Treasurer's Reports to the membership.

3. She shall make the books available for audit immediately following the annual meeting by a committee appointed by the Executive Committee. She shall serve as chairman of the Finance Committee.

4. She shall maintain a current membership list and pay annual dues and service charges to the NFRW and the AFRW.

Section 3: Removal from Membership - A member may be removed from membership for the following reasons:

The term of office for officers and chairpersons shall be two years. The term of service shall begin at the beginning of next year following Novembers election.

g) Qualification.

Any officer or appointee must be a dues paying member of the JCRW.

h) Removal of Officers.

An officer may be removed from office by 2/3 vote of the JCRW for the following reasons:

- i) Failure to qualify as a dues-paying member as stated in ARTICLE III, Section 2.
- j) Supporting an opposition candidate.
- k) Failure to attend meetings, without good and proper reason.
- l) Failure to fulfill duties as outlined in the By-Laws.

ARTICLE V – EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

Section 1. The Executive Committee shall consist of the President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer and Parliamentarian.

Section 2. The Executive Committee shall have complete jurisdiction over membership, to approve the appointments of the Presidents or the chairpersons of standing committees; to recommend the annual budget to the JCRW; direct disbursement of funds; approve the bank or banks where funds are to be deposited; to meet on call of the President or written request of four members.

ARTICLE VI – MEETINGS

Section 1. The JCRW must meet at least five times a year to be in good standing with the state federation.

Section 2. The Fiscal Year.

The fiscal year of the JCRW shall be January 1 to December 31.

ARTICLE VIII – NOMINATIONS AND ELECTIONS

Section 1. Nominations.

A nominating committee of our members shall be elected in October every

Exhibit E

Section 9: Parliamentarian

The Parliamentarian will serve as a sergeant-at-arms for meetings and call attention to any deviation from the general rules of parliamentary procedure which may occur.

VIII COMMITTEES

Section 1: Committees for the JCRW shall be appointed at the discretion of the President or a majority of the Executive Committee as needed to help the objectives of the organization. The standing committees for the AFRW and NFRW include: Campaign Activities/Membership, Public Relations, Bylaws Revision, Finance, Fundraising, Program, Scholarships/Awards, Americanism/Essays, Telephone and Community Service.

Section 2: Special committees may be appointed by the President as deemed advisable.

Section 3: The standing committees shall prepare programs of action in their respective fields for consideration by the President and the Executive Board.

IX QUORUM

Section 1: A quorum for a meeting shall be a majority of regular monthly attendance.

Section 2: A quorum for a meeting of the Executive Board shall be a majority of the membership.

X POLICIES

Section 1: This organization and officers may not issue statements or pass resolutions on controversial issues in the name of JCRW without first polling the members and obtaining a 2/3 vote of approval of the total membership.

Section 2: Any material distributed, circulated or sold at meetings, with exception of authorized Republican material, must be approved by the President or chair.

Section 3: All public announcements at meetings shall be approved by the President or chair.

XI PARLIAMENTARY AUTHORITY

Roberts Rules of Order, Newly Revised, shall govern all proceedings of the JCRW, except where inconsistent with the provisions of these Bylaws and Bylaws of the AFRW and /or NFRW.

BY-LAWS

NORTHWEST ARKANSAS REPUBLICAN WOMEN

ARTICLE I

NAME: THE NAME OF THIS ORGANIZATION SHALL BE NORTHWEST ARKANSAS
REPUBLICAN WOMEN (N.W.A.R.W.).

ARTICLE II

PURPOSE: THE PURPOSE OF THIS ORGANIZATION SHALL BE

- A TO PROVIDE A CHANNEL OF POLITICAL INVOLVEMENT FOR WOMEN WHO SHARE
THE REPUBLICAN PHILOSOPHY;
- B TO ENCOURAGE THE EXPANSION OF A POLITICALLY TRAINED AND INVOLVED
COMMUNITY;
- C TO ENCOURAGE WOMEN TO RUN FOR OFFICE;
- D TO CULTIVATE LOYALTY TO THE REPUBLICAN PARTY AND TO ADVANCE ITS
IDEALS
- E TO ENCOURAGE A STRONGER AND MORE ASSERTIVE LOBBYING GROUP;
- F TO JOIN ALL OUR EFFORTS TOWARDS THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A TWO-PARTY
SYSTEM IN ARKANSAS;

ARTICLE III

POLICY

- SECTION 1. THIS ORGANIZATION, ITS PRESIDENT, AND CAMPAIGN ACTIVITIES
CHAIRMAN SHALL NOT ENDORSE ANY CANDIDATE FOR OFFICE IN
CONTESTED REPUBLICAN PRIMARIES.
- SECTION 2. INDIVIDUAL MEMBERS OF THIS ORGANIZATION, WITH THE EXCEPTION
OF THE PRESIDENT AND CAMPAIGN ACTIVITIES CHAIRMAN, CAN WORK
FOR ANY CANDIDATE OF THEIR CHOICE IN CONTESTED PRIMARIES, BUT
MAY NOT ACT IN THE NAME OF THE ORGANIZATION.
- SECTION 3. THIS ORGANIZATION AND ITS OFFICERS MAY NOT ISSUE STATEMENTS OR
PASS RESOLUTIONS ON CONTROVERSIAL ISSUES IN THE NAME OF NWARW
WITHOUT FIRST POLLING ITS MEMBERS AND OBTAINING A 2/3 VOTE OF
APPROVAL OF THE TOTAL MEMBERSHIP.

ARTICLE IV

MEMBERSHIP

- SECTION 1. OPEN TO ALL WOMEN WHO HAVE FAITH IN THE PRINCIPLES OF THE
REPUBLICAN PARTY AND HAVE THE GOAL TO SUPPORT ITS CANDIDATES.
- SECTION 2. SHALL INCLUDE FOUR CLASSES. ACTIVE, ASSOCIATE, PATRON, AND
HONORARY MEMBERS.
 - A. ACTIVE MEMBERS ARE THOSE WHO ARE ACTIVELY OCCUPIED IN THE
WORK OF THE CLUB AND DUES ARE PAID IN FULL.

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- B. ASSOCIATE MEMBERS ARE SPOUSES OF MEMBERS, THOSE LIVING OUTSIDE THE AREA, AND THOSE WOMEN BELONGING TO OTHER NFRW CLUBS WHO WISH TO AID OUR CLUB BY PAYING ANNUAL DUES. ASSOCIATE MEMBERS ARE NOT ELIGIBLE TO HOLD OFFICE OR VOTE. THEY MAY ATTEND MEETINGS, BUT CANNOT MAKE MOTIONS, HAVE A VOICE, BE ON COMMITTEES, OR BE COUNTED FOR THE PURPOSE OF DETERMINING THE NUMBER OF DELEGATES TO NATIONAL OR STATE FEDERATION MEETING OR CONVENTIONS. ASSOCIATE MEMBERS DO NOT BECOME MEMBERS OF THE STATE OR NATIONAL FEDERATION.
- C. ASSOCIATE MEMBER DUES SHALL REMAIN IN THE N.W.A.R.W. TREASURY PATRONS ARE THOSE MEMBERS PAYING AT LEAST TEN DOLLARS OVER THE AMOUNT OF DUES.
- D. HONORARY MEMBERS ARE THOSE TO WHOM THE MEMBERSHIP WISHES TO EXTEND SPECIAL HONOR AND SHALL BE ELECTED BY THE UNANIMOUS VOTE OF THE QUORUM PRESENT.

ARTICLE V

OFFICERS AND EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

- SECTION 1. THE OFFICERS OF THIS ORGANIZATION SHALL BE A PRESIDENT, FIRST VICE-PRESIDENT, SECOND VICE-PRESIDENT, RECORDING SECRETARY, CORRESPONDING SECRETARY, AND TREASURER.
- SECTION 2. QUALIFICATIONS OF OFFICERS
- A. IN ORDER TO BE ELECTED AS AN OFFICER, A NOMINEE MUST HAVE BEEN A MEMBER OF THIS ORGANIZATION FOR ONE FULL YEAR PRIOR TO HER NOMINATION IN SEPTEMBER.
- B. NOMINEES FOR OFFICES OF PRESIDENT AND 1ST VICE PRESIDENT MUST HAVE SERVED ON THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS PRIOR TO THEIR NOMINATION IN SEPTEMBER.
- SECTION 3. THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE SHALL INCLUDE THE PRESIDENT, IMMEDIATE PAST PRESIDENT, AND ALL ELECTED OFFICERS.
- SECTION 4. THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS SHALL INCLUDE THE PRESIDENT, THE IMMEDIATE PAST PRESIDENT, ALL ELECTED OFFICERS, AND THE CHAIRMEN OF PERMANENT COMMITTEES.

ARTICLE VI

DUTIES OF OFFICERS

SECTION 1.

- A. THE PRESIDENT SHALL CHAIR ALL MEETINGS OF THE ASSOCIATION, THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE, AND THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS, AND SHALL GIVE GENERAL SUPERVISION OF THE WORK OF THE CLUB. SHE SHALL APPOINT ALL PERMANENT COMMITTEES. SHE SHALL SERVE AS A VOTING MEMBER OF THE AFRW BOARD OF DIRECTORS AND THE REPUBLICAN PARTY OF ARKANSAS STATE COMMITTEE.
- B. 1ST VICE-PRESIDENT SHALL, IN THE ABSENCE OF THE PRESIDENT, EXECUTE THE DUTIES OF THE PRESIDENT AND ALSO SERVE AS PROGRAM CHAIRMAN. SHE SHALL ALSO SERVE AS A VOTING MEMBER OF THE REGIONAL AND DISTRICT COMMITTEES.

- C 2ND VICE-PRESIDENT SHALL, IN THE ABSENCE OF BOTH THE PRESIDENT AND 1ST VICE-PRESIDENT, SHALL CARRY OUT THE DUTIES OF THE PRESIDENT SHE SHALL SERVE AS MEMBERSHIP CHAIRMAN AND WILL SEND OUT POST CARDS TO ALL MEMBERS WHO HAVE NOT RENEWED THEIR MEMBERSHIP FOR THE CURRENT YEAR BY JANUARY 15.
- D RECORDING SECRETARY SHALL RECORD AND READ THE MINUTES OF ALL MEETINGS AND BE GUARDIAN OF ALL RECORDS OF THE CLUB
- E CORRESPONDING SECRETARY SHALL ATTEND TO ALL CLUB CORRESPONDENCE, SEND OUT NOTICES OF SPECIAL MEETINGS AND ACT IN THE ABSENCE OF THE RECORDING SECRETARY.
- F TREASURER SHALL RECEIVE AND BE GUARDIAN OF ALL FUNDS OF THE CLUB AND SHALL PAY ALL BILLS UPON AUTHORIZATION OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE, BOARD OF DIRECTORS, OR MEMBERSHIP. SHE SHALL KEEP AN ACCOUNT OF ALL MONIES RECEIVED AND DISBURSED, AND SHALL REPORT IN FULL AT REGULAR MEETINGS AS REQUIRED BY THE PRESIDENT. SHE SHALL KEEP AN UP-TO-DATE LIST OF THE MEMBERSHIP OF THE CLUB. SHE SHALL WORK WITH THE MEMBERSHIP CHAIRMAN GIVING HER A LIST OF UNPAID MEMBERS.

SECTION 2 DUTIES OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE:
THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE SHALL HAVE POWER TO TRANSACT ANY NECESSARY BUSINESS BETWEEN MEETINGS. TO MAKE RECOMMENDATIONS AS TO POLICIES OF THE CLUB, TO COUNSEL THE PRESIDENT. AND TO FILL VACANCIES THAT RESULT BETWEEN ELECTIONS

SECTION 3. THE TERM OF OFFICE FOR OFFICERS AND CHAIRMAN SHALL BE ONE YEAR AND NO OFFICER/CHAIRMAN MAY SERVE IN THE SAME POST FOR MORE THAN TWO CONSECUTIVE TERMS.

SECTION 4 EACH OFFICER SHALL DELIVER ALL RECORDS, FILES, ETC. TO HER SUCCESSOR ON OR BEFORE DECEMBER 15 FOLLOWING INSTALLATION.

ARTICLE VII

MEETINGS

SECTION 1. THE ANNUAL MEETING AND THE ELECTION OF OFFICERS SHALL BE HELD IN NOVEMBER. THE INSTALLATION OF OFFICERS SHALL BE HELD DURING THE DECEMBER MEETING.

SECTION 2. THE REGULAR MEETING OF THIS CLUB SHALL BE HELD THE SECOND MONDAY OF THE MONTH

SECTION 3. SPECIAL MEETINGS SHALL BE HELD AT THE CALL OF THE PRESIDENT OR UPON THE REQUEST OF SIX MEMBERS. THE AIM OF THE MEETING TO BE STATED IN THE CALL.

SECTION 4. THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE SHALL MEET AT LEAST 6 TIMES A YEAR AT SUCH TIME AND PLACE AS MAY BE DECIDED BY THE PRESIDENT.

SECTION 5. THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS SHALL MEET AT LEAST 3 TIMES A YEAR AT SUCH TIME AND PLACE AS MAY BE DECIDED BY THE PRESIDENT.

SECTION 6. SPECIAL MEETINGS OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS MAY BE CALLED BY THE PRESIDENT OR UPON REQUEST OF THREE MEMBERS OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS, THE PURPOSE OF THE MEETING TO BE ESTABLISHED IN THE CALL AND NO OTHER BUSINESS TO BE TRANSACTED.

ARTICLE VIII

DUES

SECTION 1. MEMBERSHIP DUES SHALL BE AS RECOMMENDED BY THE EXECUTIVE BOARD, APPROVED BY THE GENERAL BODY, AND ARE PAYABLE ANNUALLY. DUES SHALL INCLUDE THE COST OF MEMBERSHIP IN THE NFRW AND AFRW.

SECTION 2. ANNUAL DUES ARE PAYABLE WHEN MEMBER JOINS AND ARE RENEWABLE ON THE FIRST OF JANUARY EACH YEAR.

SECTION 3. THE FISCAL YEAR OF THIS ORGANIZATION SHALL BE FROM JANUARY FIRST TO DECEMBER THIRTY-FIRST.

ARTICLE IX

NOMINATIONS AND ELECTIONS

SECTION 1. A NOMINATING COMMITTEE OF NOT LESS THAN THREE MEMBERS SHALL BE ELECTED AT A REGULAR MEETING IN MAY. THIS NOMINATING COMMITTEE SHALL ELECT ITS CHAIRMAN AND SHALL REPORT ONE NOMINEE FOR EACH OFFICE AT THE OCTOBER MEETING. ADDITIONAL NOMINATIONS MAY BE MADE FROM THE FLOOR.

SECTION 2.

A. ELECTION SHALL BE HELD AT THE ANNUAL MEETING IN NOVEMBER. WHEN THERE IS ONLY ONE CANDIDATE FOR AN OFFICE, ELECTION MAY BE BY VOICE; OTHERWISE THE VOTE MUST BE BY WRITTEN BALLOT. A MAJORITY VOTE SHALL ELECT. THE CORRESPONDING SECRETARY WILL SEND TO EACH MEMBER A COPY OF THE NOMINATING COMMITTEE'S SLATE OF OFFICERS.

B. TO BE ELIGIBLE TO VOTE, A MEMBER'S DUES MUST BE PAID IN FULL FOR THE CURRENT YEAR.

SECTION 3.

A. DELEGATES TO THE BIENNIAL CONVENTION OF THE ARKANSAS FEDERATION OF REPUBLICAN WOMEN SHALL BE ELECTED AS FOLLOWS: ANY MEMBER IN GOOD STANDING IS ELIGIBLE TO BE A DELEGATE OR AN ALTERNATE.

B. THE ELECTION OF DELEGATES SHALL NOT BE LESS THAN THIRTY DAYS PRIOR TO THE STATE CONVENTION. THE PRESIDENT SHALL ANNOUNCE THE NUMBER OF DELEGATES ALLOTTED TO THE CLUB. NOMINATIONS FOR DELEGATES SHALL BE MADE FROM THE FLOOR AND ALL NOMINEES MUST BE ON THE ROSTER OF QUALIFIED CANDIDATES. A MAJORITY VOTE SHALL ELECT.

ARTICLE XIII

AMENDMENTS

THESE BY-LAWS MAY BE AMENDED BY A TWO-THIRDS (2/3) VOTE OF THE MEMBERS PRESENT AT ANY REGULAR MEETING OF THE CLUB, PROVIDED THE AMENDMENT HAS BEEN SUBMITTED IN WRITTEN FORM AT A PRIOR MEETING.

STANDING RULES

"STANDING RULES . . . ARE RULES THAT MAY BE ADOPTED WITHOUT PRIOR NOTICE BY A MAJORITY VOTE AT ANY BUSINESS MEETING. A VOTE ON THEIR ADOPTION OR AMENDMENT MAY BE RECONSIDERED BEFORE OR AFTER ADOPTION. THEY MAY BE SUSPENDED BY A MAJORITY VOTE AT ANY MEETING, OR MAY BE AMENDED OR RESCINDED BY A TWO-THIRDS VOTE. THEY ARE GENERALLY ADOPTED AS NEEDED RATHER THAN AT THE ORGANIZATION OF A SOCIETY. . . ROBERT'S RULES OF ORDER NEWLY REVISED, "STANDING RULES" (1993)

1. MEMBERSHIP DUES FOR ACTIVE MEMBERS SHALL BE FIFTEEN (\$15.00) DOLLARS EACH YEAR, PAYABLE JANUARY FIRST AND DELINQUENT MARCH FIRST. DUES SHALL INCLUDE COSTS OF MEMBERSHIP IN THE NATIONAL AND STATE FEDERATION.

DUES FOR ASSOCIATE MEMBERS SHALL BE \$7.50.
DUES FOR PATRONS SHALL BE AT LEAST \$25.
2. ANY MATERIAL DISTRIBUTED, CIRCULATED, OR SOLD AT MEETINGS, WITH THE EXCEPTION OF AUTHORIZED GOP MATERIAL, MUST BE APPROVED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS.
3. THE PERSON TO INSTALL AND FORMAT OF INSTALLATION OF OFFICERS SHALL BE AT THE DISCRETION OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE.
4. A YEARBOOK, WHICH INCLUDES A ROSTER OF ALL CURRENT OFFICERS AND MEMBERS AND OTHER INFORMATION, WILL BE DISTRIBUTED IN MARCH.
