**I. GENERATION OF MATTER**

The Reports Analysis Division ("RAD") referred the American Society of Consultant Pharmacists PAC and its treasurer, ("Committee") to the Office of the General Counsel on January 5, 1999. The basis for the RAD referral is the failure of the Committee to timely file their 1998 April Quarterly Report.

**II. FACTUAL AND LEGAL ANALYSIS**
