Dear Mr. Savage:

This is in reference to the matter involving Future Tech International, Inc. ("Future Tech") and Juan Ortiz, Louis Leonardo, Leonard Keller and Gregorio Narvasa, which your office referred to the Federal Election Commission by letters dated January 25 and February 4, 1999.

On March 16, 1999, the Commission found reason to believe that Future Tech, Mark Jimenez, Juan Ortiz, Louis Leonardo, Leonard Keller and Gregorio Narvasa each knowingly and willfully violated 2 U.S.C. §§ 441b(a) and 441f, provisions of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended. The Commission also found reason to believe that Future Tech violated 2 U.S.C. § 441e.

The Commission has now entered into a joint conciliation agreement with these respondents

A copy of this agreement is enclosed for your information.

On the same date the Commission closed MUR 4884. Accordingly, the confidentiality provisions at 2 U.S.C. § 437g(a)(12) no longer apply and MUR 4884 is now public.

We appreciate your cooperation in helping the Commission meet its enforcement responsibilities under the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended.
