Dear Mr. Simon:

On September 20, 2000, the Federal Election Commission and your clients, the Lincoln Club of Riverside County and Kathleen A. Daley, as treasurer, entered into a conciliation agreement in settlement of violations of 2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(4)(A)(i),(ii),(iii) and (iv). According to the agreement, your clients are required to pay a civil penalty in the amount of \$8,800. The conciliation agreement provides for installment payments, with the first payment due 30 days after the conciliation agreement was executed. Therefore, the first payment of \$2,800 was due on October 20th. The conciliation agreement further states that in the event that any installment payment is not received by the Commission within five days of the date it is due, the Commission may, in its discretion, accelerate the remaining payments and cause the entire amount to become due within ten days written notice to the respondents.

According to Commission records, your client's initial payment has not been received. Please submit that payment immediately. If you believe the Commission's records are in error, or if you have any questions, please contact me at (202) 694-1650.
