On November 1, 2000, the Federal Election Commission received your complaint alleging certain violations of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended ("the Act").

After considering the circumstances of this matter, the Commission has determined to exercise its prosecutorial discretion and to take no action against the respondents. See attached narrative. Accordingly, the Commission closed its file in this matter on May 2, 2001. This matter will become part of the public record within 30 days.

Additionally, we are in receipt of the materials you provided the Commission on May 7, 2001. If you believe the materials you provided constitute a new violation of the Act you may submit a new complaint to the Commission as explained in the attached procedures.

The Act allows a complainant to seek judicial review of the Commission's dismissal of this action. See 2 U.S.C. § 437g(a)(8).
