Dear Mr. Noble:

Pursuant to 2 U.S.C. § 437g(a)(1) and 11 C.F.R. § 111.4, the American Conservative Union hereby files this Complaint against Handgun Control, Inc. ("HCI"), a 501(c)(4) not for profit corporation located at 1225 I Street, N.W., Washington, D.C. 20005; Handgun Control Voter Education Fund ("HCVEF"), a federally registered separate segregated fund connected to HCI; and the following principal authorized committees for Democratic candidates for the United States Senate: Robb for the Senate Committee, Virginia ("Robb"); Carnahan for Senate Committee ("Carnahan"); Bill Nelson for U.S. Senate Committee, Florida ("Nelson"); Stabenow for U.S. Senate, Michigan ("Stabenow"); and Gore/Lieberman, Inc., the principal campaign committee for Al Gore, Democratic candidate for President and Joseph Lieberman, Democratic candidate for Vice President ("Gore-Lieberman") (collectively "Respondents").

Complainant herein is the American Conservative Union ("ACU"), a non-profit corporation, the nation's oldest conservative lobbying organization.

**I. HANDGUN CONTROL INC.**

**A. Handgun Control, Inc.**

Handgun Control, Inc. ("HCI") is an organization presently exempt from taxation pursuant to Section 501(c)(4) of the Internal Revenue Code. *See* IRS Form 990, attached as Exhibit 1 (Section 501(c) organizations are required to file annually form 990, setting forth their revenues, expenses, and other information required by the Internal Revenue Service).

HCI was founded in 1974 to lobby for gun control legislation. *See* HCI's website: [www.handguncontrol.org](http://www.handguncontrol.org). HCI currently claims to have 400,000 members nationwide. *See id.* Specifically relevant to this Complaint, HCI does not qualify as non-profit corporation exempt from the prohibition on independent expenditures pursuant to 11 C.F.R. § 114.10.

**B. Handgun Control Voter Education Fund**

HCI maintains a separate segregated fund, known as the Handgun Control Voter Education Fund, (FEC registration number C00113449) ("HCVEF"). *See* Statement of Organization, 1979, Exhibit 2. During the calendar year 2000, through its Pre General Report, filed on October 26, 2000, HCVEF has reported that it has contributed \$272,408.41 to candidates and that it has made \$883,368.12 in independent expenditures. *See* Exhibit 3.

**1. Contributions to federal candidates by HCVEF**

Specifically relevant to the allegations in this complaint, HCVEF has contributed to the following Democratic candidates for the United States Senate:

### **C. Federal Candidate Respondents**

Respondents also include the following principal authorized committees for Democratic candidates for the United States Senate: Carnahan for Senate Committee ("Carnahan"); Robb for the Senate Committee, Virginia ("Robb"); Bill Nelson for U.S. Senate Committee, Florida ("Nelson"); and Stabenow for U.S. Senate, Michigan ("Stabenow"); and Gore/Lieberman, Inc., the principal campaign committee for Al Gore, Democratic candidate for President and Joseph Lieberman, Democratic candidate for Vice President ("Gore-Lieberman") (collectively "Respondents"). All are recipients of illegal and/or excessive contributions from HCI and / or HCVEF and all have failed to disclose the receipt of the referenced contributions

## **II. UNLAWFUL EXPRESS ADVOCACY COMMUNICATIONS BY HCI IN FLORIDA U.S. SENATE RACE**

### **A. The Florida Commercial**

HCI has produced and aired a commercial expressly advocating the defeat of Republican U.S. Senate candidate Bill McCollum in Florida. The commercial states:

<b>Female Voice:</b>	In 1990 you said you wanted a three day waiting period on handgun sales in Florida.
<b>Male Voice:</b>	But back in Washington Bill McCollum listened to the gun lobby and voted against a handgun waiting period, twice.
<b>Female Voice:</b>	In 1998 you said you wanted Florida's gun show loophole closed.
<b>Male Voice:</b>	But McCollum listened to the gun lobby again and voted against closing the loophole. And now Bill McCollum is gunning for the Senate and wants your vote.
<b>Female Voice:</b>	Why vote for him when he keeps voting against you.
<b>Male Voice:</b>	Don't send Bill McCollum to the Senate.

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The disclaimer on the commercial states: "Paid for by Handgun Control Inc. 1225 Eye Street, NW, Suite 1100, Washington, DC 20005." Exhibit 17.

This commercial has been aired in Florida in at least two media markets at a reported cost of \$250,000. *See William March, Ads Target McCollum's Voting Record on Gun Control Bills, TAMPA TRIB., Sep. 11, 2000 attached as Exhibit 18.*

**B. Violations of the FECA**

**1. Violation of 2 U.S.C. § 441b (prohibited corporate independent expenditure by HCI)**

The disclaimer in the commercial states that it is paid for by HCI. The expenditure(s) by HCI for the production and airing of such a commercial to the general public, whether through television or transmitted via the Internet, is a violation of 2 U.S.C. § 441b. Corporations are prohibited from making expenditures for express advocacy communications. *See 2 U.S.C. § 441b; 11 C.F.R. § 114.4.*

**2. Violation of 2 U.S.C. § 441d(a)(3) (defective disclaimer)**

The disclaimer in the commercial evidences various violations of federal law. First, if HCVEF in fact paid for the commercial, as claimed on its independent expenditure report filed with the FEC, *see* Exhibit 16, then the disclaimer on the ad being transmitted on the Internet improperly states that the commercial was paid for by HCI and violates the law regarding disclaimer(s) required for such communications. *See* Exhibit 17 and 11 C.F.R. § 110.11(a)

Further, the disclaimer does not indicate that the commercial was "not authorized by [a candidate]." An independent expenditure must be denoted as such through its disclaimer, as required by 11 C.F.R. §§ 109.3, 110.11(a)(1)(iii) ("Such communication...if made...in opposition to a candidate, but paid for by any other person and not authorized by a candidate,

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authorized committee of a candidate or its agent, shall clearly state that the communication has been paid for by such person and is not authorized by any candidate or candidate's committee."'). Failure by either HCI or HCVEF to indicate that the commercial was not authorized by the Nelson campaign renders it an in-kind contribution to the Nelson campaign. 11 C.F.R. § 109.1(c).

**3. The coordination between HCI and HCVEF with the Nelson campaign renders the expenditures illegal contributions.**

The evidence of the coordination between HCI and HCVEF with the Nelson campaign sufficient to treat the commercial as an in-kind contribution to the Nelson campaign is ample. On October 16, 2000, Jim and Sarah Brady appeared at a Florida news conference to endorse Nelson. *See* Media Release, *James and Sarah Brady Endorse Nelson* Exhibit 19; Jerney Milarsky and Vanessa Bauza, *Bradys Back Nelson: Gun Control Activists Help Candidate's Bid for U.S. Senate*, FT. LAUDERDALE SUN-SENT., Oct. 17, 2000 at 2B, Exhibit 20. The press release and newspaper article indicate that the Bradys appeared at the event on behalf of HCI. *See id.* Further, HCVEF has made \$7,500 in direct contributions to the Nelson campaign.

These facts demonstrate coordination as defined in 11 C.F.R. § 109.1(b)(4)(i). Upon evidence of coordination, an independent expenditure must be treated as an in-kind contribution to the candidate. *See* 11 C.F.R. § 109.1(c). As such, the approximately \$254,000 reported as an independent expenditure by HCVEF in Exhibit 16 (when added to the \$7,500 in contributions to the Nelson campaign) is an illegal excessive contribution to Nelson of approximately \$251,000. *See* 2 U.S.C. § 441a(a)(2)(A).

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**4. Failure of Nelson campaign to report HCI in-kind contribution**

Finally, the Nelson campaign has violated 2 U.S.C. § 434 by failing to report the in-kind contribution from either HCI or HCVEF.

**III. UNLAWFUL ACTIVITIES BY HCI THROUGH ITS WEB SITE(S)**

HCI has developed and administers a web site located on the Internet at www.handguncontrol.org. This site is registered to Handgun Control, Inc., 1225 Eye Street, NW, Suite 1100, Washington, DC 20005. See Exhibit 21. The technical contact is Keith R. Hall, Handgun Control Inc/Center to Prevent Handgun, 1225 Eye Street, NW, Suite 1100, Washington, DC 20005. See id.

**A. Handgun Control Inc.'s "Pop-Up" Screen**

**1. Content of the Screen**

When a visitor first "arrives" at HCI's web site, a "popup" window appears on the screen.

See Exhibit 22. The screen contains the following content:

"Now, [Al Gore is] saying 'I'm with you guys on guns.' In any other time or place you'd be looking for a lynching mob." The crowd cheered, "let's do it" and "I've got a rope."

-- *The Grand Rapids Press*, October 17, 2000 quoting NRA president Charlton Heston and describing audience reaction.

"These are the people who are endorsing and supporting Governor Bush.

Do you want a man in the White House whose most ardent supporters publicly call for violence?

NEITHER DO WE"

See id.

**2. The HCI web site violates the FECA.**

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The pop-up screen expressly advocates the defeat of George W. Bush. It references Governor Bush by name, it references his opponent by name, it asks whether "you want a man in the White House whose most ardent supporters publicly call for violence," and then answers "NEITHER DO WE". *See id.* There is no disclaimer appearing on this screen and the screen appears automatically whenever a person visits [www.handguncontrol.org](http://www.handguncontrol.org). Thus, it is a communication expressly advocating the defeat of George W. Bush, a candidate for president, paid for by a corporation. Such an expenditure is prohibited by 2 U.S.C. § 441b. Further, the communication lacks a disclaimer as required by 11 C.F.R. § 110.11(a)(1)(iii).

Neither HCI nor HCVEF have reported the costs of creating and maintaining the pop-up window as a disbursement as required of a political committee under 11 C.F.R. § 104.9. or as required by 11 C.F.R. § 109.2 for any express advocacy communication.

**B. "The Dangerous Dozen" Page(s) on Handgun Control Inc.'s Web Site**

On the first page of [www.handguncontrol.org](http://www.handguncontrol.org) is a link that alternates between the words "Handgun Control Presents Our Election 2000 Dangerous Dozen," Exhibit 23, "These men are the biggest threat to common sense gun laws this election season," Exhibit 24, and "Know the issue. Know the candidates. Make a difference on Nov. 7" Exhibit 25. When visitors click this link, they are taken to a page entitled: "The Dangerous Dozen."

The address of this page is [www.handguncontrol.org/ddozen/index.asp](http://www.handguncontrol.org/ddozen/index.asp), indicating that it is part of the HCI web site.<sup>1</sup>

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<sup>1</sup> The term "site" is used to describe all pages that appear with the same domain name. A page is a specific screen

1. Content of the web site

In large text, this page states:

Handgun Control presents its "Dangerous Dozen" list highlighting the particularly dangerous records of elected officials.

"This is the most critically important election we have ever faced," said Mrs. Brady. "When the votes are counted on November 7, we expect to gain some new supporters of sensible gun laws, and lose some adversaries who are out of touch with the American people." Know the issue. Know the candidates. On November 7, vote for common sense gun laws.

Exhibit 26.

Beneath this, the page says "IN A CLASS OF THEIR OWN Presidential candidate, Governor George W. Bush & Vice Presidential candidate, Dick Cheney." Exhibit 27. The page then presents a number of bullet points that discuss not only the gubernatorial record of George W. Bush and the legislative record of Dick Cheney, but also information about NRA endorsements and campaign contributions to both *candidate* Bush and *candidate* Cheney. See *id.*

Next, the site lists the "Dangerous Dozen 2000." *Id.* This includes a list of eleven federal candidates with information about those candidates' NRA endorsements, campaign contributions and campaign activities on their behalf, as well as providing to the general public

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within the site. For example, [www.handguncontrol.org](http://www.handguncontrol.org) is the site that contains a number of different pages. The first page of the [www.handguncontrol.org](http://www.handguncontrol.org) site is [www.handguncontrol.org](http://www.handguncontrol.org), while [www.handguncontrol.org/ddozen/index.asp](http://www.handguncontrol.org/ddozen/index.asp) is another page within [www.handguncontrol.org](http://www.handguncontrol.org). The section below, however, details separate sites that have different addresses, e.g. [www.bushhandguns.com](http://www.bushhandguns.com). In either case, the user clicks a link and is either taken to a new page or a new site. However, it is not apparent to the user that he/she has actually left one site for another. But since both sites are owned and operated by HCI, the site addresses are not material to and do not alter the substance of this Complaint.

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the names and information about *the opponents* in a favorable manner from which the only conclusion is that the *opponent* is the preferable federal candidate. *See id.*

Additionally, each "bad" candidate's picture appears on the page. *See id.* The candidates are:

1. John Ashcroft (R-MO Senate)
2. George Allen (R-VA Senate)
3. Spencer Abraham (R-MI Senate)
4. Bill McCollum (R-FL Senate)
5. Jim Rogan (R-CA-27 House)
6. Matthew Martinez (R<sup>2</sup>-CA-31 House)
7. Charlie Bass (R-NH-2 House)
8. Ernie Fletcher (R-KY-6 House)
9. Mark Baker (R-IL-17 House)
10. Adam Putnam (R-FL-12 House)
11. Jon Porter (R-NV-1 House)

*See id.* After the "Dangerous Dozen" (really eleven) federal candidates, the site then lists the "Dishonorable Mentions," which is comprised of another twelve federal candidates, all Republicans except one.

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<sup>2</sup> Rep Martinez is listed on the site as a Democrat, but he has changed his party affiliation and is now actually a Republican. Thus, *all* the "Dangerous Dozen" candidates are Republicans.

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*See id.* There is no disclaimer on this page, but it is clearly part of the HCI site.

**2. Expenditures for the Communications on the Page(s) Violate the FECA**

**a.) Prohibited corporate contribution**

The message of the page expressly advocates the defeat of the eleven clearly identified federal candidates. The page displays candidates who have been labeled "particularly dangerous" because of their legislative records against gun control laws. *See id.* The page contains the following message:

"Know the issue.  
Know the candidates.  
On November 7, vote for common sense gun laws."

*Id.*

Much like the communications found to be express advocacy in *Federal Election Comm'n v. Massachusetts Citizens for Life, Inc.*, 479 U.S. 238 (1986), which listed pro-life candidates and exhorted the readers to vote pro-life, *see id.* at 243, 249, the communication here presents candidates who have been deemed to oppose "commonsense gun laws" and then urges the reader to vote for "commonsense gun laws." As such, the communication is urging the reader to vote against the candidates listed. Therefore, the communication is one expressly advocating the defeat of the identified "dangerous" candidates. The "Dangerous Dozen" communication constitutes an illegal corporate contribution to each of the federal candidates listed, because it contains express advocacy communications to the general public and the expenditure(s) to produce the site and its content must be deemed to constitute expenditures in connection with a federal election. *See* 2 U.S.C. § 431(9) & 431(17). Because it is a corporation, HCI is prohibited from making such expenditures. *See* 2 U.S.C. § 441b.

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Further, pursuant to 11 C.F.R. § 114.4, HCI has not complied with the regulations of the Commission for making corporate expenditures beyond its membership to the general public. Permissible expenditures include voting records, voter guides, and endorsements. *See* 11 C.F.R. § 114.4(c)(4)-(6). A voting record may “not expressly advocate the election or defeat of a clearly identified candidate....” 11 C.F.R. § 114.4(c)(4). Because the web page contains express advocacy, it cannot be a voting record. A voter guide requires two or more candidates for the office to be featured, *see* 11 C.F.R. § 114.4(c)(5)(i), and prohibits providing “greater prominence” to one candidate. *See* 11 C.F.R. § 114.4(c)(5)(ii)(C). Here, only the candidate opposed by HCI has his credentials listed. Finally, it cannot be an endorsement because endorsements can only be communicated through a press conference and the attending press releases. *See* 11 C.F.R. § 114.4(c)(6)(i). Such press releases may be distributed “only to the representatives of the news media that the corporation...customarily contacts when issuing non-political press releases.” *Id.* Therefore, because the web page does not qualify as a press conference and its dissemination is not limited to members of the news media normally contacted by the corporation, it cannot be considered an endorsement.

**b.) No expenditures have been reported by HCI or HCVEF for the costs of these communications beyond the restricted class.**

Because these pages expressly advocate the defeat of clearly identified federal candidates, the costs of the pages *must* be reported by the entity paying for the communications. *See* 2 U.S.C. § 434(b). None of the reports filed by HCVEF include costs for these pages.

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**c.) No in-kind contributions have been reported by any of the recipient federal candidate committees.**

None of the principal authorized campaign committees of the federal candidates being supported by the HCI expenditures on these pages have reported any in-kind contributions from HCI or HCVEF to their campaigns. Because they have not reported the in-kind contributions, the campaign committees are also in violation of the law. *See* 2 U.S.C. § 434(b).

**d.) Contributions to the Stabenow, Carnahan and Robb committees exceed the applicable contribution limits because HCVEF has already contributed the maximum permissible amount.**

HCVEF has contributed the maximum permissible amount to Stabenow, Carnahan, and Robb committees for the general election. Therefore, *any* in-kind contribution from HCVEF for the costs of the specific web site exceeds the permissible limits. 2 U.S.C. § 441a. (a)(2)(a).

**C. The Web Sites Affiliated With, Owned and Administered By Handgun Control Inc.**

On the HCI web site's home page, the first section provides a pull-down option to "find out the records of the candidates." The only federal candidates listed on the pull-down option of the HCI web site are: **George W. Bush** (Republican candidate for President) and three Republican candidates for the United States Senate: **George Allen, Bill McCollum, and John Ashcroft.**<sup>3</sup> *See* Exhibit 28. When the visitor selects a candidate he is taken (unknowingly) to a separate web site with the domain name [www.\[candidate's last name\]andguns.com](http://www.[candidate's last name]andguns.com).<sup>4</sup>

Network Solutions reports the following domain name registrations for the affiliated sites: (Exhibits 29-32):

1. **Site: www.ashcroftandguns.com**

**a.) Content of the site**

The web site opposing U.S. Senate candidate John Ashcroft expressly advocates the defeat of John Ashcroft, stating: "It's time to say NO to John Ashcroft. Vote against John Ashcroft on Tuesday, November 7th." *See* Exhibit 33. The disclaimer states that it is "Paid for by the Handgun Control Voter Education Fund." *See id.* As evidenced above, however, the site is registered to HCI and an HCI employee is listed as the administrative contact for the site. No expenses associated with the site are reported by HCVEF as an independent expenditure. *See* Exhibit 15. Further, the contributions to the Carnahan campaign from HCVEF raise serious

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questions as to whether a subsequent expenditure by the same entity in opposition to Carnahan's opponent are in fact independent. As such, the expenditures must be deemed coordinated, in-kind, and therefore, illegal.

**b.) FECA violations**

Expenditures for the web site have not been reported by either HCI or by HCVEF, whether as an independent expenditure or as an in-kind contribution, in violation of 11 C.F.R. §§ 109.1(c), 109.2.

In addition, publicly available documents indicate the site is paid for and administered by HCI, which would constitute an illegal corporate contribution from HCI to the Carnahan campaign. See 2 U.S.C. § 441b; 11 C.F.R. § 114.2

If HCVEF paid for the sites as an in-kind contribution to the Carnahan campaign, such expenditures constitute an excessive contribution because HCVEF has already made the maximum permissible contributions from a political committee to the campaign. See 2 U.S.C. § 441a.

Finally, because the Carnahan campaign has not reported the receipt of the in-kind contribution, the Carnahan campaign is in violation of the FECA as well. See 2 U.S.C. § 434; 11 C.F.R. §§ 104.3, 104.13

**2. Site: [www.allenandguns.com](http://www.allenandguns.com)**

**a.) Content of the site**

The HCI web site opposing the candidacy of U.S. Senate candidate George Allen describes (1) how the *Washington Post* describes Allen's role in making Virginia a "holster heaven;" (2) how Governor Allen signed a law in Virginia allowing individuals to carry a

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handgun; and (3) how Governor Allen vetoed legislation that would limit where guns could be carried. *See* Exhibit 34. The bottom of the site proclaims "Tell George Allen kids and handguns don't mix." *Id.* The site specifically states that it is "Paid for by Handgun Control, Inc." *Id.* As indicated above, the link from HCI's homepage is in the same pull-down menu as the link to [www.ashcroftandguns.com](http://www.ashcroftandguns.com) and other sites that expressly advocate the defeat of clearly identified U.S. Senate candidates McCollum and Ashcroft. *See* Exhibit 25. The site is registered to HCI employee Keith Hall, who is also listed as the administrative contact, at 1225 Eye Street, N.W., the same as that of HCI.

**b.) FECA violations**

The message of the page / site expressly advocates the defeat of a clearly identified federal candidate, George Allen. The page presents the candidate in a light which is clearly intended to result in votes against Allen.

The discussion earlier regarding the "Dangerous Dozen" and the HCI communications regarding those candidates is applicable here as well. *See Federal Election Comm'n v. Massachusetts Citizens for Life, Inc.*, 479 U.S. 238 (1986). HCI's communications here meet the definition of express advocacy established by the Court in *MCFL*, but HCI is not a qualified non-profit corporation under 11 C.F.R. § 114.10. Thus, the expenditures for the communications establishing and operating [www.allenandguns.com](http://www.allenandguns.com) must be deemed to constitute expenditures in connection with a federal election pursuant to 2 U.S.C. § 431(9) & 431(17) and are an illegal corporate contribution to the Robb for Senate campaign.

Further, pursuant to 11 C.F.R. § 114.4, HCI has not complied with the regulations of the Commission for making corporate expenditures beyond its membership to the general public.

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Permissible expenditures include voting records, voter guides, and endorsements. *See* 11 C.F.R. § 114.4(c)(4)-(6). A voting record may “not expressly advocate the election or defeat of a clearly identified candidate....” 11 C.F.R. § 114.4(c)(4). Because the web page contains express advocacy, it cannot be a voting record. A voter guide requires two or more candidates for the office to be featured, *see* 11 C.F.R. § 114.4(c)(5)(i), and prohibits providing “greater prominence” to one candidate. *See* 11 C.F.R. § 114.4(c)(5)(ii)(C). Here, only the candidate opposed by HCI has his credentials listed. Finally, it cannot be an endorsement because endorsements can only be communicated through a press conference and the attending press releases. *See* 11 C.F.R. § 114.4(c)(6)(i). Such press releases may be distributed “only to the representatives of the news media that the corporation...customarily contacts when issuing non-political press releases.” *Id.* Therefore, because the web page does not qualify as a press conference and its dissemination is not limited to members of the news media normally contacted by the corporation, it cannot be considered an endorsement.

Neither HCI nor HCVEF have reported the expenditures associated with the development and operation of the [www.allenandguns.com](http://www.allenandguns.com) web site as required by law, either as an independent expenditure or as an in-kind contribution, in violation of 11 C.F.R. §§ 109.1(c), 109.2.

Publicly available documents indicate the site is paid for and administered by HCI or its agent / employee, which constitutes an illegal corporate contribution from HCI to the Robb campaign. *See* 2 U.S.C. § 441b; 11 C.F.R. § 114.2.

If HCVEF paid for the site as an in-kind contribution to the Robb campaign, the in-kind contribution constituted an excessive contribution because HCVEF has already contributed the maximum to the Robb campaign for the general election. *See* 2 U.S.C. § 441a.

Finally, because the Robb campaign has not reported the receipt of the in-kind contribution, the Robb campaign is in violation of the FECA as well. 2 U.S.C. 434; 11 C.F.R. §§ 104.3, 104.13.

**3. Site: [www.mccollumandguns.com](http://www.mccollumandguns.com)**

**a.) Content of the site**

This affiliated web site states "In 1990 & 1998, Florida families voted YES for common-sense gun laws. How did Bill McCollum vote in Washington?" Exhibit 35. After describing two bills that McCollum voted against, the site states "Why vote for him, when he keeps voting against you?" *Id.* The site also provides the user with the ability to view the Florida commercial described in Section II(a), *supra*, against Congressman McCollum. *Id.* The site has a button which, if clicked, plays the commercial that states: "And now Bill McCollum is gunning for the Senate and wants your vote. Why vote for him when he keeps voting against you. Don't send Bill McCollum to the Senate." The disclaimer on the commercial is "Paid for by Handgun Control, Inc." Exhibit 17. The disclaimer on the site, however, states: "Paid for by The Handgun Control Voter Education Fund." Exhibit 35. Yet, no expenditures by HCVEF to develop or administer this site appear on any of HCVEF's reports to the FEC, either as an in-kind contribution to the Nelson campaign or as an independent expenditure against Bill McCollum for U.S. Senate.

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**b.) FECA Violations**

Expenditures for the web site have not been reported by either HCI or by HCVEF, whether as an independent expenditure or as an in-kind contribution, in violation of 11 C.F.R. §§ 109.1(c), 109.2.

In addition, publicly available documents indicate the site is registered to the HCI address and administered by an employee of HCI. Use of HCI resources to maintain and operate the site constitutes an illegal corporate contribution from HCI to the Nelson campaign. *See* 2 U.S.C. § 441b; 11 C.F.R. § 114.2.

If HCVEF paid for the sites as an in-kind contribution to the Nelson campaign, unless the amount was less than \$2,500.00, such expenditures would constitute an excessive contribution because HCVEF has already contributed \$7,500 directly to the Nelson campaign. *See* 2 U.S.C. § 441a.

Finally, because the Nelson campaign has not reported the receipt of the in-kind contribution, the campaign is in violation of the FECA as well. *See* 2 U.S.C. § 434; 11 C.F.R. §§ 104.3, 104.13.

**4. Site: [www.bushandguns.com](http://www.bushandguns.com)**

**a.) Content of the site**

This HCI web site appears under the heading "What is the George W. Bush record on guns?" Exhibit 36. Next, the site contains a quote from the National Rifle Association ("NRA") stating "if we win, we'll have a President where we work out of their office." *Id.* The site allows the user to view a commercial that states "Tell Governor Bush that the White House is our house and it shouldn't belong to the NRA." Finally, the site states, "Tell Governor Bush the

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White House shouldn't belong to the gun lobby." *Id.* The site is "Paid for by Handgun Control, Inc." *Id.* Again, the link to this site is in the same pull-down menu as others which expressly advocate the defeat of clearly identified federal candidates. As indicated above, the site is registered to HCI employee Keith Hall, at HCI's address. Mr. Hall's name also appears as the administrative contact for the site.

**b.) FECA Violations**

Complainant adopts and incorporates by reference its recitation of authority regarding the "Dangerous Dozen" pages of HCI's web site and the similar discussion regarding the www.allenandguns.com web site. The legal authority cited there is applicable here as well. *See supra* pp. 15-18.

Additionally, there is evidence that HCI/HCVEF has coordinated its efforts with the Gore-Lieberman campaign. In February 2000, James Brady appeared in a commercial paid for by the Gore 2000 primary campaign, the predecessor of Gore-Lieberman Inc. *See James Brady Praises Gore's Leadership on Gun Control*, U.S. NEWswire, Feb. 25, 2000 Exhibit 37. Mr. Brady has appeared at a number of events to endorse candidates *on behalf of Handgun Control Inc.* *See infra* § IV. Such appearances are evidence that Mr. Brady acts as a spokesperson for HCI. Additionally, Mr. Brady is on the board of HCI's related organization, the Center to Prevent Handgun Violence. *See* <http://www.handguncontrol.org/home/jim.asp>, attached as Exhibit 38. Further, his biography describes his activities as "lobbying with his wife Sarah, Chair of Handgun Control, Inc.(HCI), for stronger gun laws." *Id.* Such close connections with HCI demonstrate that he is in a position to influence HCVEF's decisions to make communications with the general public. *Cf* AO 1979-80 ("[T]he Commission is of the opinion

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that Mrs. A would not be an 'agent' merely due to her marriage to Mr. A. If, however, Mrs. A participates or assists in Mr. A's political consultant services or has a business relationship with Mr. A concerning his political services, [the committee would be] under the same constraints in hiring her as it is in hiring Mr. A.").

Appearing in a commercial for a candidate evidences the type of contacts necessary to establish coordination between a candidate and a committee. Contacts between a committee and the primary campaign are sufficient to demonstrate coordination with the general election committee. *See* AO 1979-80. Therefore, there is sufficient evidence that any expenditure made by HCI or HCVEF cannot be independent of the Gore-Lieberman campaign. As such, the communications of HCI or HCVEF would become in-kind contributions to the Gore-Lieberman campaign. *See* 11 C.F.R. § 109.1(c).

Such in-kind contributions to the Gore-Lieberman campaign are prohibited because the committee is accepting public funding. *See* 26 U.S.C. § 9012(f); 11 C.F.R. § 9003.3. Therefore, Gore-Lieberman has violated the FECA by accepting the contribution and HCI/HCVEF has violated the FECA by making the contribution.

**IV. ADDITIONAL ILLEGAL CORPORATE CONTRIBUTIONS BY  
HANDGUN CONTROL INC.**

**A. Public Endorsement Event on Behalf of Charles Robb for U.S. Senate  
Sponsored By Handgun Control, Inc.**

On September 12, 2000 HCI sponsored (and presumably paid for) a public event at which HCI Chairman Sarah Brady announced an endorsement of Charles Robb for the United States Senate seat in Virginia. *See* Robb for Senate web site located at: [www.robb2000.com](http://www.robb2000.com), Exhibit 39. The event was attended by Charles Robb, evidencing the coordination of the event with the

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Robb campaign. The letterhead on which the press release(s) are printed is that of HCI, *not* HCVEF. *See* Exhibit 40. Sarah Brady is identified as the Chairman of HCI. The 990 tax return filed by HCI reflects that Mrs. Brady works for HCI full time, 55+ hours per week. The event took place during regular business hours presumably when Mrs. Brady and other HCI employees were engaged in their employment by HCI. Such activities do not fall within the permissible corporate expenditures for HCI on behalf of its separate segregated fund, HCVEF. Further, no reimbursement to HCI by HCVEF for any costs associated with the event have been reported by HCVEF for the reporting period during which the event occurred. *See* Pre General Report Exhibit 42; October Monthly Report, Exhibit 41. In addition, the Robb for Senate campaign has failed to report the in-kind contribution from HCI for the amount of the event, notwithstanding the fact that the Robb campaign was fully aware of and involved in the event.

**B. Event for Public Endorsement By Handgun Control, Inc.  
of Bill Nelson for U.S. Senate**

According to the Nelson campaign's Media Release dated October 16, 2000, Jim and Sarah Brady "came to Miami today to endorse Nelson on behalf of Handgun Control, Inc., which is chaired by Sarah Brady." *See* Media Release, *James and Sarah Brady Endorse Nelson* Exhibit 19; Jerney Milarsky and Vanessa Bauza, *Bradys Back Nelson: Gun Control Activists Help Candidate's Bid for U.S. Senate*, FT. LAUDERDALE SUN-SENT., Oct. 17, 2000 at 2B, Exhibit 20.

Both the Nelson campaign's press release and the newspaper articles regarding the event state that the Bradys appeared at the event to announce *HCI's* endorsement of Nelson. *See id.* On the Nelson campaign website, it is HCI, *not* the Bradys, listed as endorsing Nelson for the United States Senate.

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Sarah Brady is identified as the Chairman of HCI in the press release(s) and the press accounts of the event. The 990 tax return filed by HCI reflects that Mrs. Brady works for HCI full time, 55+ hours per week. The Nelson event took place during regular business hours presumably when Mrs. Brady and other HCI employees were engaged in their employment by HCI. Such activities do not fall within the permissible corporate expenditures for HCI on behalf of its separate segregated fund, HCVEF. Further, no reimbursement to HCI by HCVEF for any costs associated with the event have been reported by HCVEF for the reporting period during which the event occurred. *See* Pre General Report Exhibit 42; October Monthly Report, Exhibit 41.

**C. Expenditures for the Events Violate the FECA**

11 CFR § 114.4 (6) specifies the appropriate manner in which an endorsement event to which the press and public are invited may be conducted by a corporation such as HCI. Specifically, the endorsed candidate may NOT be present if the corporation expends funds for the event. Clearly the Robb event constituted a communication to general public beyond the restricted class of HCI, being held in a public place with the press invited. No expenditures for the event were reported by HCVEF in its FEC report for the month of September and no reimbursement or in-kind contribution was reported by the Robb campaign for the costs associated with the event at which Robb was present. Furthermore, because HCVEF had already contributed the maximum amount for the general election, *no* funds of HCVEF could be spent for such an event with the Robb campaign.

With respect to the Nelson endorsement event, it appears that the event may have been sponsored by the Nelson campaign. However, unless the Nelson campaign paid all the expenses

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of the event, including payment for the travel expenses and lodging for Sarah and Jim Brady and reimbursement to HCI for Sarah Brady's time since she was presumably paid by HCI for the time spent travelling to and appearing with the Nelson campaign (which disbursements do not appear on any of the Nelson campaign's FEC reports) any HCI expenditures for the event would constitute an illegal corporate expenditure, coordinated with the Nelson campaign, in violation of 2 USC § 441b; 11 C.F.R. § 114.4(c)(6)(ii). Because HCVEF has contributed \$7,500 to Nelson, if HCVEF has paid any amount over \$2,500 for the event it will have made an excessive contribution in violation of 2 U.S.C. § 441a. Further, no itemized disbursements for the endorsement event appear on the HCVEF report and no in-kind contribution for the expenses from the event are reported by the Nelson campaign. Therefore, Nelson, HCI and HCVEF have each violated 2 U.S.C. § 434.

**V. HCI HAS RUN ADVERTISEMENTS THAT EXPRESSLY ADVOCATE THE DEFEAT OF GEORGE BUSH IN VIOLATION OF 2 U.S.C. § 441.**

HCI has paid for advertisements that expressly advocate the defeat of George Bush. The commercial states:

Hello I'm Martin Sheen. Between now and election day at least 2000 Americans will die from gunfire. Should the next President be a candidate of the gun lobby? Should he have signed a bill that allows hidden handguns in churches, hospitals, and amusement parks? Should he be someone of whom the NRA has said that if he is elected they'll be working right out of the oval office? That's governor Bush's record. Find out more at bushandguns.com. Somebody's life may depend on it.

Such language falls within the definition of express advocacy found at 11 C.F.R. § 100.22. The commercial is paid for by HCI. See Exhibit 43. Therefore, it is a prohibited corporate expenditure. See 2 U.S.C. § 441b. Furthermore, because of the coordination described between HCI and Gore-Lieberman, the commercial is an in-kind contribution. Because Gore-Lieberman

is accepting public financing, *any* in-kind contribution to the campaign is prohibited. *See* 26 U.S.C. § 9004(b). Finally, neither HCI nor Gore-Lieberman has reported the contribution.

**VI. HCVEF HAS RUN ADVERTISEMENTS ADVOCATING THE DEFEAT OF JOHN ASHCROFT THAT ARE EXCESSIVE IN-KIND CONTRIBUTIONS.**

HCVEF has paid for a commercial that expressly advocates the defeat of John Ashcroft in the Missouri Senate campaign. The ad states:

Sarah Brady: It happened so quickly. (Gun shots) In an instant President Reagan and Jim were shot.  
Background: Get the ambulance in here.  
James Brady: Our lives have never been the same.  
Sarah Brady: That's why we were so offended when John Ashcroft called Jim the leading enemy of gun owners. Last year John Ashcroft supported the Missouri referendum to allow carrying concealed handguns.  
James Brady: He even voted against child safety locks. It's time to vote no on John Ashcroft.

The commercial states that it is paid for by HCVEF. *See* Exhibit 44. It does not state that it is independent of the Carnahan campaign as it required by 11 C.F.R. §§ 109.3, 110.11(a)(1)(iii). If the commercial is not independent of the Carnahan campaign, then it is an in-kind contribution. *See* 11 C.F.R. § 109.1(c). As such, it is an excessive contribution from HCVEF to Carnahan in violation of 2 U.S.C. § 441a(a)(2)(A) and the Carnahan committee has accepted an excessive contribution in violation of 2 U.S.C. § 441a(f). Furthermore, the Carnahan committee has not reported the in-kind contribution.

**VII. HCVEF HAS VIOLATED THE FECA BY LISTING FALSE ADDRESSES FOR INDIVIDUAL DONORS.**

The FECA requires a political committee to obtain and report the mailing address of every individual donor who contributes an aggregate amount of \$200 or more during the

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calendar year. *See* 2 USC § 434(b)(3)(A) ; *see also* 11 CFR § 100.12; 11 CFR § 104.8. April Quarterly report for 2000 for HCVEF reflects eight (8) individual donors to HCVEF whose addresses are listed as the office address of HCI, including Victoria Reggie Kennedy. *See* Exhibit 45. Complainant believes that the referenced individual donor is the wife of a United States Senator whose mailing address is certainly not that of HCI.

While the FECA only requires "best efforts" to comply with its reporting provisions for contributor information, *see* 2 U.S.C. § 432(i); 11 C.F.R. § 104.7, it does not permit a committee to create addresses for donors. As such, HCVEF has evidenced *prima facie* that not only has it NOT made its "best efforts" to obtain the required information, but, more seriously, has deliberately filed false and misleading information with the Commission. Such deliberate action warrants criminal investigation and Complainants submit that the Commission should refer this matter to the Attorney General pursuant to 2 USC § 437g (a)(5)(C).

18 U.S.C. § 1001 provides that whomever knowingly and willfully "makes any false, fictitious, or fraudulent statement or representation," or "uses any false writing or document knowing the same to contain any materially false, fictitious, or fraudulent statement *or entry*" to the executive branch shall be fined or imprisoned. 18 U.S.C. § 1001(a)(2)-(3) (emphasis added). By entering false addresses on the report, the individuals involved made a false entry. Such entry must have been knowing and willful because the person had to have known that the contributors neither lived nor worked at HCI's offices.

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CONCLUSION

For the reasons stated, Complainant American Conservative Union, by and through its Campaign Reform Enforcement Project, hereby submits this Complaint against Respondents Handgun Control, Inc.; Handgun Control Voter Education Fund; Carnahan for Senate Committee, ("Carnahan"); Robb for the Senate Committee, Virginia ("Robb"); Bill Nelson for U.S. Senate Committee, Florida ("Nelson"); Stabenow for U.S. Senate, Michigan ("Stabenow"); and Gore 2000, Inc., the principal campaign committee for Al Gore, Democratic candidate for President ("Gore") for violations of the Federal Election Campaign Act, 2 U.S.C. § 431 *et seq.*, in the manner described above.

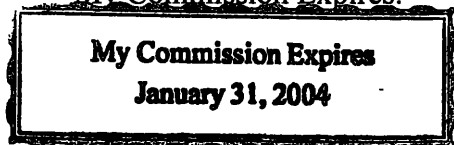

(b) Public Members. The "Public Members" of the Corporation shall include any person who has contributed at least fifteen dollars (\$15.00) to the Corporation within the preceding twenty-four (24) months. Public Members shall be entitled to elect one member of the Board of Trustees (the "Public Representative"), to remove the Public Representative, and to fill any vacancy created by the death, resignation or removal of the Public Representative, in accordance with the provisions of Article IV of these Bylaws.

(c) Contributing Members. The "Contributing Members" of the Corporation shall include any person who is not a Governing Member or a Public Member but has contributed funds to the Corporation within the last twenty-four (24) months. Contributing Members shall have the same rights as Public Members except that Contributing Members shall have no right to elect any member of the Board of Trustees.

SECTION 2.2. Place of Meetings. All meetings of the Public Members shall be held at any such place, either within or without the District of Columbia, as shall be designated from time to time by the Board of Trustees and stated in the notice of meeting or in a duly executed waiver thereof.

SECTION 2.3. Annual Meeting. The Public Members shall meet annually at such date and time as shall be designated from time to time by the Board of Trustees and stated in the notice of meeting.

SECTION 2.4. Special Meeting. Special meetings of Public Members, unless otherwise prescribed by statute, may be called at any time by the Board of Trustees or the Chairperson and shall be called by the Secretary upon the request in writing of Public Members having at least one-third of the votes entitled to be cast at such meeting.

SECTION 2.5. Notice of Meetings. Written notice of each annual and special meeting of Public Members stating the place, day and hour of the meeting, and, in the case of a special meeting, the purpose or purposes for which the meeting is called, shall be delivered not less than ten (10) nor more than one hundred (100) days before the date of the meeting, either personally or by mail by or at the direction of the persons calling the meeting, to each Public Member entitled mail to vote at such meeting. If mailed, such notice shall be deemed to be delivered when deposited in the United States mail addressed to the Public Member at his or her address as it appears on the records of the Corporation, with postage prepaid. If given by telegram, such notice shall be deemed to be delivered when delivered to the telegraph company.

SECTION 2.6. Organization. At each meeting of Public Members, the Chairperson or, in the absence of the Chairperson, another Governing Member chosen by a majority of the Governing Members present, shall act as chairperson of the meeting. The Secretary or, in the absence of the Secretary, any person appointed by the chairperson, shall act as secretary of the meeting and keep the minutes thereof.

SECTION 2.7. Order of Business. The order of business at all meetings of the Public Members shall be as determined by the chairperson of the meeting.

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SECTION 2.8. Voting. Each Public Member of the Corporation shall be entitled at each meeting of Public Members to one vote. Each Public Member entitled to vote at any meeting of Public Members may authorize another person or persons to act for him or her by a proxy signed by such Public Member or his or her attorney-in-fact, but no proxy shall be voted after eleven months from its date, unless the proxy provides for a longer period. Any such proxy shall be delivered to the secretary of the meeting at or prior to the time designated in the order of business for so delivering such proxies. When a quorum is present at any meeting, the vote of a majority of the Public Members, present in person or represented by proxy, shall decide any question brought before such meeting, unless the question is one upon which by express provision of statute or of the Article of Incorporation or of these Bylaws, a different vote is required, in which case such express provision shall govern and control the decision of such question. Unless required by statute, or determined by the chairperson of the meeting to be advisable, the vote on any question need not be by ballot. On a vote by ballot, each ballot shall be signed by the Public Member voting, or by his or her proxy, if there by such proxy. Voting on all matters, including the election of the Public Representative, may be conducted by mail.

### ARTICLE III

#### Board of Governors

SECTION 3.1. General Powers. The Board of Governors shall be entitled (i) to convene the annual meeting of the Public Members for the purpose of electing the Public Representative. The Board of Governors shall provide advice and policy guidance to the Board of Trustees, conduct fundraising activities, and assume such other responsibilities as the Board of Governors deems necessary and proper to the general oversight of the Corporation's affairs.

#### SECTION 3.2. Number, Qualification and Term of Office.

(a) The Board of Governors shall consist of the following persons:

- (1) each member of the Board of Trustees of the Corporation willing to serve in such capacity, ex officio;
- (2) each member of the Board of Trustees of Center to Prevent Handgun Violence, a District of Columbia nonprofit corporation, willing to serve in such capacity, ex officio;
- (3) a number of additional members (the "At-Large Governing Members") elected from time to time by the Board of Governors, provided that the total number of Governing Members shall not exceed fifty (50) or such other number as the Board of Governors may, from time to time, determine.

(b) The Chairperson of the Corporation shall serve as the Chairperson of the Board of Governors.

(c) Each At-Large Governing Member shall serve for a term of three years or until his or her successor shall have been elected or appointed and qualified, or until his or her earlier death, resignation or removal.

SECTION 3.3. Election. The At-Large Governing Members shall be elected by a majority vote of the Board of Governors at their annual meeting.

SECTION 3.4. Removal. Any At-Large Governing Member may be removed at any time with or without cause, by resolution of the Board of Governors.

SECTION 3.5. Resignation. Any At-Large Governing Member may resign at any time by giving written notice of his or her resignation to the Corporation. Any such resignation shall take effect at the time specified therein or, if the time when it shall become effective shall not be specified therein, immediately upon its receipt. Unless otherwise specified therein, the acceptance of such resignation shall not be necessary to make it effective.

SECTION 3.6. Vacancies. Any vacancy occurring in the Board of Governors, arising from the death, resignation or removal of any At-Large Governing Member, or an increase in the number of At-Large Governing Members shall be filled by the affirmative vote of a majority of the then remaining members of the Board of Governors, though less than a quorum. A Governing Member elected or appointed, as the case may be, to fill a vacancy shall be elected or appointed for the unexpired term of his or her predecessor in office.

SECTION 3.7. Quorum; Manner of Acting. One-third of the entire Board of Governors shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of any business at any meeting of the Board of Governors, and, except as otherwise required by law, the Articles of Incorporation or these Bylaws, the act of a majority of the Governing Members present at a meeting at which a quorum is present shall be the action of the Board of Governors, except where otherwise provided by law or by these Bylaws. In the absence of a quorum at any meeting of the Board of Governors, a majority of the Governing Members present thereat may adjourn such meeting to another time and place. Notice of the time and place of any such adjourned meeting shall be given to all of the Governing Members unless such time and place were announced at the meeting at which the adjournment was taken, in which case such notice shall only be given to the Governing Members who were not present thereat. At any adjourned meeting at which a quorum is present, any business may be transacted which might have been transacted at the meeting as originally called. The Governing Members shall act only as the Board of Governors and the individual Governing Members shall have no power as such.

SECTION 3.8. Place of Meetings. Meetings of the Board of Governors may be held, within or without the District of Columbia, at such place and time as the Board of Governors may from time to time determine or as shall be specified in the notice of any such meeting.

SECTION 3.9. Annual Meeting. The Board of Governors shall meet for the purpose of organization and the transaction of other business, as soon as practicable after each annual meeting of the Public Members.

SECTION 3.10. Regular and Special Meetings. The Board of Governors may provide by resolution the time and place, either within or without the District of Columbia, for the holding of regular meetings, other than the annual meeting, of the board without other notice than such resolution. The Chairperson may call, and upon written request signed by any three Governing Members, the Secretary shall call, special meetings of the Board of Governors. Such meetings shall be held at such time and place, and for such purposes, as may be designated in the notice of meeting by the person or persons calling the meeting.

SECTION 3.11. Notice of Meetings. Notice of each meeting of the Board of Governors shall be given by the Secretary as hereinafter provided in this Section 3.11, in which notice shall be stated the time and place of the meeting. Except as otherwise required by these Bylaws, such notice need not state the purposes of such meeting. Notice of each such meeting shall be mailed, postage prepaid, to each Governing Member, addressed to him or her at his or her residence or usual place of business, by first class mail, at least seven (7) days before the day, on which such meeting is to be held, or shall be sent addressed to him or her at such place by telegraph, cable, telex, telecopier or other similar means, or be delivered to him or her personally or be given to him or her by telephone or other similar means, at least twenty-four (24) hours before the time at which such meeting is to be held. Notice of any such meeting need not be given to any Governing Member who shall, either before or after the meeting, submit a signed waiver of notice or who shall attend such meeting, except when he or she shall attend for the express purpose of objecting, at the beginning of the meeting, to the transaction of any business because the meeting is not lawfully called or convened.

SECTION 3.12. Organization. At each meeting of the Board of Governors, the Chairperson or, in the absence of the Chairperson, another Governing Member chosen by a majority of the Governing Members present, shall act as chairperson of the meeting and preside thereat. The Secretary or, in the absence of the Secretary, any person appointed by the chairperson shall act as secretary of the meeting and keep the minutes thereof.

SECTION 3.13. Voting. Each Governing Member shall be entitled at each meeting of Board of Governors to one vote. When a quorum is present at any meeting, the vote of a majority of the Governing Members, present in person, shall decide any question brought before such meeting, unless the question is one upon which by express provision of statute or of the Article of Incorporation or of these Bylaws, a different vote is required, in which case such express provision shall govern and control the decision of such question. Unless required by statute, or determined by the chairperson of the meeting to be advisable, the vote on any question need not be by ballot. On a vote by ballot, each ballot shall be signed by the Governing Member voting. Voting on all matters may be conducted by mail.

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SECTION 3.14. Action Without Meeting. Any action required or permitted to be taken at a meeting of the Board of Governors may be taken without a meeting, if a consent in writing, setting forth the action so taken, shall be signed by all of the Governing Members.

SECTION 3.15. Compensation. Governing Members shall not receive any stated salaries for their services as such. However, by resolution of the Board of Trustees, expenses of attendance, if any, may be allowed Governing Members (other than any salaried officer of the Corporation) for attendance at regular or special meetings of the Board of Governors. Nothing herein contained shall be construed to preclude any Governing Member from serving the Corporation in any other capacity and receiving compensation therefor, provided that the nature of the engagement is fully disclosed to the Board of Governors. Such fixed sum, expenses and compensation shall not be excessive in amount and the services performed therefore must be reasonable and necessary for the Corporation's purposes.

## ARTICLE IV

### Board of Trustees

SECTION 4.1. General Powers. The affairs of the Corporation shall be managed by the Board of Trustees.

SECTION 4.2. Number, Qualification and Term of Office. The Board of Trustees shall have at least twelve (12) members consisting of the following persons:

- (1) the Public Representative; and
- (2) at least eleven (11) other persons (the "At-Large Trustees") elected by the Board of Trustees.

(b) The Public Representative shall be elected for a one-year term.

(c) The At-Large Trustees shall be divided into three classes, designated Class I, Class II and Class III and all classes shall be as nearly equal in number as possible. The initial At-Large Trustees elected by the Board of Trustees shall be elected to the following terms of office: (i) Class I trustees shall be elected for a term expiring at the second succeeding annual meeting of the Board of Trustees, (ii) Class II trustees shall be elected for a term expiring at the third succeeding annual meeting of the Board of Trustees, and (iii) Class III trustees shall be elected for a term expiring at the fourth succeeding annual meeting of the Board of Trustees. At each annual meeting of the Board of Trustees after such initial classification, At-Large Trustees elected to replace those whose terms expire at such annual meeting shall be elected to hold office until the third succeeding annual meeting of the Board of Trustees. If the number of At-Large Trustees is changed, any increase or decrease in At-Large Trusteeships shall be so apportioned among the classes as to make all classes as nearly equal in number as possible.

(d) Each trustee shall hold office until the expiration of his or her term and until his or her successor is elected and qualified or until his earlier death, resignation or removal. No person shall be permitted to serve as an At-Large Trustee for more than three (3) consecutive three-year terms, except that such limitation shall not apply to terms ending prior to January 1, 1997. Any person who has served as an At-Large Trustee for three consecutive three-year terms shall not be eligible to serve as an At-Large Trustee for a period of one year thereafter.

#### SECTION 4.3. Election.

(a) The At-Large Trustees shall be elected by the affirmative vote, taken at a meeting, by written consent, or conducted by mail, of a majority of the Board of Trustees. The Board of Trustees shall elect At-Large Trustees in such a manner that, at all times, a majority of the members of the Board of Trustees of the Corporation shall be persons who also serve as members of the Board of Trustees of Center to Prevent Handgun Violence, a District of Columbia nonprofit corporation.

(b) The Public Representative shall be elected in accordance with the procedures set forth below:

(1) The Board of Trustees shall annually designate a date for the election of the Public Representative (the "Election Date"). No later than thirty (30) days before the Election Date, the Secretary shall give notice thereof to the Public Members and shall solicit the nomination of candidates for Public Representative during such period as shall be specified in the notice. The Board of Trustees shall select as candidates no fewer than two persons so nominated, provided that such persons shall be Public Members in good standing and shall, in the discretion of the Board of Trustees, have demonstrated their commitment to the Corporation's governing principles and be otherwise qualified.

(2) No later than twenty (20) days before the Election Date, the Secretary shall give notice to the Public Members of the candidates selected pursuant to subparagraph (1) hereof and shall provide the Public Members with ballots for voting by mail.

(3) The candidate receiving a plurality of the votes cast by Public Members shall be elected as the Public Representative.

(4) Notice, as provided in subparagraphs (1) and (2) hereof, shall be mailed to each Public Member at her or his address as it appears on the most current membership list of the Corporation. Such notice shall be deemed given when deposited in the United States mail, with postage prepaid thereon.

SECTION 4.4. Removal. Any At-Large Trustee may be removed, with or without cause, by resolution of the Board of Trustees. The Public Representative may be removed, with or

without cause, by the affirmative vote of a majority of the votes entitled to be cast by the Public Members present or represented by proxy at a meeting at which a quorum is present.

SECTION 4.5. Resignation. Any trustee may resign from the Board of Trustees at any time by giving written notice of his or her resignation to the Corporation. Any such resignation shall take effect at the time specified therein or, if the time when it shall become effective shall not be specified therein, immediately upon its receipt. Unless otherwise specified therein, the acceptance of such resignation shall not be necessary to make it effective.

SECTION 4.6. Vacancies. Any vacancy occurring in the Board of Trustees arising from the death, resignation or removal of a trustee, or an increase in the number of At-Large Trustees, shall be filled (i) by a majority vote of the members of the Board of Trustees, or (ii) if the vacancy arises from the death, resignation or removal of the Public Representative, by the election of a successor Public Representative at a meeting duly called for that purpose. A trustee elected or appointed, as the case may be, to fill a vacancy shall be elected or appointed for the unexpired term of his or her predecessor in office, or until his or her successor is elected and qualified.

SECTION 4.7. Quorum; Manner of Acting. One-third of the entire Board of Trustees shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business at any meeting of the Board of Trustees, and, except as otherwise required by law, the Articles of Incorporation or these Bylaws, the act of a majority of the trustees present at a meeting at which a quorum is present shall be the act of the Board of Trustees. In the absence of a quorum at any meeting of the Board of Trustees, a majority of the trustees present thereat may adjourn such meeting to another time and place. Notice of the time and place of any such adjourned meeting shall be given to all of the trustees unless such time and place were announced at the meeting at which the adjournment was taken, in which case such notice shall only be given to the trustees who were not present thereat. At any adjourned meeting at which a quorum is present, any business may be transacted which might have been transacted at the meeting as originally called. The trustees shall act only as the Board of Trustees and the individual trustees shall have no power as such.

SECTION 4.8. Place of Meetings. Meetings of the Board of Trustees may be held, within or without the District of Columbia, at such place and time as the Board of Trustees may from time to time determine or as shall be specified in the notice of any such meeting.

SECTION 4.9. Annual Meeting. The Board of Trustees shall meet for the purpose of organization, the election of officers and the transaction of other business, at least once annually.

SECTION 4.10. Regular and Special Meeting. The Board of Trustees may provide by resolution the time and place, either with or without the District of Columbia, for the holding of regular meetings, other than the annual meeting, of the board without other notice than such resolution. The Chairperson may call, and upon written request signed by any three trustees, the Secretary shall call, special meetings of the Board of Trustees. Such meetings shall be held at such time and place, and for such purposes, as may be designated in the notice of meeting by the person or persons calling the meeting.

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SECTION 4.11. Notice of Meetings. Notice of each meeting of the Board of Trustees shall be given by the Secretary as hereinafter provided in this Section 4.11, in which notice shall be stated the time and place of the meeting. Except as otherwise required by these Bylaws, such notice need not state the purposes of such meeting. Notice of each such meeting shall be mailed, postage pre-paid, to each trustee, addressed to him or her at his or her residence or usual place of business, by first class mail, at least seven (7) days before the day on which such meeting is to be held, or shall be sent addressed to him or her at such place by telegraph, cable, telex, telecopier or other similar means, or be delivered to him or her personally or be given to him or her by telephone or other similar means, at least twenty-four (24) hours before the time at which such meeting is to be held. Notice of any such meeting need not be given to any trustee who shall, either before or after the meeting, submit a signed waiver of notice or who shall attend such meeting, except when he or she shall attend for the express purpose of objecting, at the beginning of the meeting, to the transaction of any business because the meeting, is not lawfully called or convened.

SECTION 4.12. Organization. At each meeting of the Board of Trustees, the Chairperson (or, in the absence of the Chairperson, another trustee chosen by a majority of the trustees present) shall act as chairperson of the meeting and preside thereat. The Secretary or, in the absence of the Secretary, any person appointed by the Chairperson shall act as secretary of the meeting and keep the minutes thereof.

SECTION 4.13. Action Without Meeting. Any action required or permitted to be taken at a meeting of the Board of Trustees (or any committee thereof) may be taken without a meeting, if a consent in writing, setting forth the action so taken, shall be signed by all of the trustees (or committee members).

SECTION 4.14. Meetings by Telephone. Any or all trustees may participate in a meeting of the Board of Trustees (or any committee thereof) by means of a conference telephone or by any means of communication by which all persons participating in the meeting are able to hear one another, and such participation shall constitute presence in person at the meeting.

SECTION 4.15. Committees.

(a) The Board of Trustees shall create an Executive Committee, which shall have eight (8) members. The Executive Committee shall have and may exercise all the powers and authority of the Board of Trustees in the management of the business and affairs of the Corporation, except that the Executive Committee shall not have the power or authority to (i) amend the Bylaws of the Corporation or (ii) designate one or more additional Committees of the Board.

(b) The Board of Trustees by resolution adopted by a majority of the trustees in office, may designate and appoint one (1) or more committees, each of which shall consist of two (2) or more trustees, which committees, to the extent provided in such resolution, in the Articles of Incorporation or in these Bylaws, shall have and exercise the authority of the Board

of Trustees in the management of the Corporation. Other committees not having and exercising the authority of the Board of Trustees in the management of the Corporation may be designated and appointed by a resolution adopted by a majority of the Trustees present at a meeting at which a quorum is present. The designation and appointment of any such committee and the delegation thereto of authority shall not operate to relieve the Board of Trustees, or any individual trustee, of any responsibility imposed upon it or him by law.

(c) The Board of Trustees may designate one or more trustees as alternate members of any committee, who may replace any absent or disqualified member at any meeting of the committee. In addition, in the absence or disqualification of a member of a committee, the member or members thereof present at any meeting and not disqualified from voting, whether or not the member or members constitute a quorum, may unanimously appoint another member of the Board of Trustees to act at the meeting in the place of any such absent or disqualified member.

(d) Each committee shall serve at the pleasure of the Board of Trustees, keep regular minutes of its meetings and report the same to the Board of Trustees.

#### SECTION 4.16. Chairperson of the Board of Trustees.

(a) The Board of Trustees shall elect a Chairperson. The Chairperson of the Board of Trustees shall also serve as the Chairperson of the Executive Committee. The Chairperson of the Board shall (i) appoint members to committees established by the Board of Trustees; (ii) plan the agenda of the Board of Trustees; (iii) foster communication among members of the Board of Trustees; (iv) monitor the plans of the committees established by the Board of Trustees; (v) ensure access to the basic information regarding the membership and composition of the Board of Trustees; (vi) oversee the orientation of new members to the Board of Trustees; (vii) coordinate governance issues; (viii) serve as the primary liaison between the Board of Trustees and its staff. The Chairperson of the Board of Trustees shall have such other powers and duties as shall be prescribed from time to time by, and shall be subject to the continuing direction and supervision of, the Board of Trustees.

(b) The Chairperson of the Board of Trustees may be removed, either with or without cause, at any time, by the Board of Trustees.

(c) The Chairperson of the Board of Trustees shall serve for a two-year term. There shall be no limit on the number of two-year terms that an individual serving as the Chairperson of the Board of Trustees may serve. The Chairperson of the Board of Trustees may serve consecutive terms.

(d) The Chairperson of the Board of Trustees may resign at any time by giving written notice of his or her resignation to the Board of Trustees. Any such resignation shall take effect at the time specified therein or, if the time when it shall become effective shall not be specified therein, immediately upon its receipt. Unless otherwise specified therein, the acceptance of such resignation shall not be necessary to make it effective.

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SECTION 4.17. Compensation. Trustees shall not receive any stated salaries for their services as such. However, but by resolution of the Board of Trustees, expenses of attendance, if any, may be allowed trustees (other than any salaried officer of the Corporation) for attendance at regular or special meetings of the Board of Trustees or any committee thereof. Nothing herein contained shall be construed to preclude any trustee from serving the Corporation in any other capacity and receiving compensation therefor, provided that the nature of the engagement is fully disclosed to the Board of Trustees. Such fixed sum, expenses and compensation shall not be excessive in amount and the services performed therefore must be reasonable and necessary for the Corporation's purposes.

## ARTICLE V

### Officers

SECTION 5.1. Number, Qualification and Term of Office. The officers of the Corporation shall be elected by the Board of Trustees and shall consist of a Chairperson, a President, a Secretary, and a Treasurer each to have such duties or functions as are provided in these Bylaws or as the Board of Trustees may from time to time determine. In its discretion, the Board of Trustees may also elect other officers (including one or more Vice Presidents, one or more Assistance Secretaries and one or more Assistant Treasurers) as may be necessary or desirable for the business of Corporation. One person may hold any two or more of the foregoing offices, except that no person may hold any two of the offices of Chairperson, President and Secretary. Each officer shall hold office until his or her successor shall have been duly elected or appointed and qualified or until his or her earlier death, resignation or removal.

SECTION 5.2. Removal. Any officer of the Corporation may be removed, either with or without cause, at any time, by the Board of Trustees.

SECTION 5.3. Resignations. Any officer of the Corporation may resign at any time by giving written notice of his or her resignation to the Corporation. Any such resignation shall take effect at the time specified therein or, if the time when it shall become effective shall not be specified therein, immediately upon its receipt. Unless otherwise specified therein, the acceptance of such resignation shall not be necessary to make it effective.

SECTION 5.4. Chairperson. The Chairperson of the Corporation shall serve as a principal advocate of the Corporation on the national, state and local levels and a principal source of policy advice to the Board of Trustees on matters affecting the goals and direction of the organization. The Chairperson shall conduct public appearances as a spokesperson of the Corporation, maintain strategic alliances with influential individuals and groups, advise the Board of Trustees on policies and initiatives designed to advance the long-term strategic interests of the Corporation, and provide fundraising assistance to the organization. The Chairperson shall have such other powers and duties as shall be prescribed from time to time by, and shall be subject to the continuing direction and supervision of, the Board of Trustees.

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SECTION 5.5. President. The President of the Corporation shall direct and supervise the execution, on behalf of the Corporation, of all decisions of or programs adopted by the Board of Trustees and shall have overall charge and supervision of the operations and affairs of the Corporation. The President shall conduct and administer the operation of those powers and duties which normally pertain to the office of President, including but not limited to the authority to execute contracts or other instruments on behalf of the Corporation, lease or rent office space for the Corporation, and hire (at reasonable compensation) and discharge employees. The President shall have such other powers and duties as shall be prescribed from time to time by, and shall be subject to the continuing direction and supervision of, the Board of Trustees. The President shall be a member of the Board of Trustees.

SECTION 5.6. Secretary. The Secretary shall keep or cause to be kept in one or more books provided for the purpose, the minutes of all meetings of the directors of the Corporation. He or she shall see that all notices of meetings are duly given in accordance with the provisions of these Bylaws. He or she shall be custodian of the records and seal of the Corporation and affix and attest the seal to any instrument of which execution under seal shall be required, unless some other officer or officer shall have been thereunto duly authorized. He or she shall maintain a record of the names and addresses of members of the Corporation at the Corporation's registered office or principal office in the District of Columbia. He or she shall perform all duties incident to the office of Secretary and such other duties as the Board of Trustees or the President may from time to time assign to him or her.

SECTION 5.7. Treasurer. The Treasurer shall take custody of all funds, gifts received and other assets of the Corporation; place them in accounts in the name of the Corporation in such banks or other depositories as the Board of Trustees may direct; disburse such funds or other assets upon direction from the Board of Trustees or the President; keep and maintain accurate and complete financial records of the assets, receipts and disbursement of the Corporation; collect all monies due the Corporation, pay routine bills and expenses of the Corporation without specific resolution of the Board of Trustees, but subject to ratification by the Board of Trustees; and perform such other duties as the Board of Trustees or the President may direct.

SECTION 5.8. Posting of Bond. The Board of Trustees may, in its discretion, require the Treasurer and/or any other officer to furnish a bond of a kind and in the amount required and approved by the Board of Trustees.

SECTION 5.9. Inspection of Books and Records. Both the Secretary and the Treasurer shall permit any trustee or his or her duly authorized attorney to inspect all books and records of the Corporation for any proper purpose at any reasonable time.

SECTION 5.10. Compensation. Salaries or other compensation of the officers may be fixed from time to time by the Board of Trustees provided that, such salaries and compensation shall not be excessive in amount and shall be for services which are reasonable and necessary for performance of the Corporation's purposes.

## ARTICLE VI

### Liability and Indemnification

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The trustees and Governing Members of the Corporation shall not be personally liable for its debts, obligations or liabilities; and the Corporation shall indemnify any trustee, Governing Member or officer or former trustee, Governing Member or officer of the Corporation or any person who may have served at its request as a trustee, Governing Member or officer of another corporation, whether for profit or not for profit, against expenses actually and necessarily incurred by him in connection with the defense of any action, suit, or proceeding in which he is made a party by reason of being or having been such trustee, Governing Member or officer, except in relation to matters as to which he shall be adjudged in such action, suit, or proceeding to be liable for gross negligence or willful misconduct in the performance of a duty. Such indemnification shall not be deemed exclusive of any other rights which such trustee or officer may be entitled, under any bylaw, agreement, vote of Board of Trustees or members, or otherwise.

## ARTICLE VII

### General Provisions

SECTION 7.1. Deposits. The funds of the Corporation not otherwise employed shall be deposited from time to time to the order of the Corporation in such banks, trust companies or other depositories as the Board of Trustees may select or as may be selected by any one or more officers or agents of the Corporation to whom such power may from time to time be delegated by the Board of Trustees.

SECTION 7.2. Checks, Drafts, etc. All checks, drafts and other orders for payment of money out of the funds of the Corporation, and all notes and other evidences of indebtedness of the Corporation shall be signed on behalf of the Corporation in such manner as shall from time to time be determined by the Board of Trustees. In the absence of such determination by the Board of Trustees, such instruments shall be signed by the Treasurer and countersigned by the President of the Corporation.

SECTION 7.3. Seal. The seal of the Corporation shall be in such form as shall be approved by the Board of Trustees.

SECTION 7.4. Fiscal Year. The fiscal year of the Corporation shall be determined by resolution of the Board of Trustees.

SECTION 7.5. Contracts. Except as otherwise provided by law, the Board of Trustees may prospectively or retroactively authorize any officer or agent of the Corporation, in the name



and on behalf of the Corporation, to enter into any contract or execute and satisfy any instrument, and any such authority may be general or confined to specific instances.

SECTION 7.6. Loans. The Board of Trustees may prospectively or retroactively authorize any officer or agent of the Corporation (i) to effect loans and advances at any time for the Corporation from any bank, trust company or other institution, or from any firm, corporation or individual, (ii) for such loans and advances, to make, execute and deliver promissory notes, bonds, or other certificates or evidences of indebtedness of the Corporation, and (iii) when authorized to do so, to pledge and hypothecate or transfer any securities or other property of the Corporation as security for any such loans or advances. Such authority conferred by the Board of Trustees may be general or confined to specific instances. No loans shall be made by the Corporation to any director or officer thereof.

SECTION 7.7. Grants. The Board of Trustees may prospectively or retroactively authorize any officer or agent of the Corporation, in the name and on behalf of the Corporation, to make any grants, contributions or to otherwise render financial assistance.

SECTION 7.8. Voting of Securities held by the Corporation. Stocks and other securities owned by the Corporation may be voted, in person or by proxy, as the Board of Trustees shall specify. In the absence of any direction by the Board of Trustees, such stocks and securities shall be voted as the President shall determine.

SECTION 7.9. Gifts. The Board of Trustees may accept on behalf of the Corporation any contribution, gift, bequest, or devise for the general purpose or for any special purpose of the Corporation.

SECTION 7.10. Books and Records. Correct and complete books and records of account and minutes of the proceedings of the Board of Trustees and the Executive Committee shall be kept at the principal office of the Corporation.

SECTION 7.11. Annual Audit. The Board of Trustees shall require that an audit by an independent Certified Public Accountant be made annually of the books and accounting records of the Corporation.

## ARTICLE VIII

### Amendments of Bylaws

The Board of Trustees shall have the power to alter, amend or repeal these Bylaws or adopt new bylaws.

Ads target McCollum's voting record on gun control bills

TAMPA - A gun control group is running ads in the Tampa Bay area against Bill McCollum, and he will respond.

Handgun Control Inc., one of the nation's best-known gun-control advocacy groups, is launching what its leaders describe as its biggest congressional campaign ever: to defeat Bill McCollum, Republican candidate for U.S. Senate.

Handgun Control will spend \$250,000 for TV ads that started Friday in the Tampa Bay and Palm Beach areas, saying McCollum voted against two control measures, a waiting period for handgun purchases and closing the "gun show loophole," that Florida voters overwhelmingly passed in referendums.

Handgun Control has a Web site at [www.mccollumandguns.com](http://www.mccollumandguns.com) that gives McCollum's voting history on gun legislation and includes video of the ad.

McCollum, who acknowledges he's a staunch advocate of gun ownership rights, doesn't dispute the facts in the ads.

But he says they don't tell the whole story.

He says he favors closing the loophole, but wants to avoid waiting periods if possible, and has voted for other restrictions, including a ban on armor-piercing bullets.

McCollum's campaign will run response ads starting today that don't directly mention the issue, but accuse "special interest supporters" of his opponent, Democrat Bill Nelson, of a campaign of "mud and distortions."

McCollum, a Republican House member from the Orlando area, and Nelson, state insurance

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commissioner, are running for the U.S. Senate seat being vacated by Connie Mack.

The ads say McCollum has voted twice against waiting periods for handgun purchases, even though Florida voters in 1990 approved a three-day waiting period 84 percent to 16 percent.

They say McCollum voted against closing the gun show loophole even though voters favored it 72 percent to 28 percent in 1998.

The loophole refers to unregulated sales by nondealers at gun shows, who don't have to follow laws such as background checks on buyers.

Sarah Brady of Handgun Control Inc., whose husband, Jim Brady, was shot and disabled when John Hinckley tried to kill President Reagan, says McCollum "has done more to undermine reasonable, common-sense gun laws than almost any other member of Congress."

Joe Sudbay, the group's political director, said the Florida ad campaign is a significant portion of the total \$4 million the group will spend in the 2000 election.

"It's not very big, but for us it's huge," he said.

McCollum aides showed reporters a tape of the ad last week and gave their response.

McCollum said he favors closing the gun show loophole, but wants to do it with computerized, instant background checks.

He introduced a bill to that effect, which didn't pass, he said.

His bill included waiting periods in cases where an instant check is impossible or shows an arrest record but not the outcome of the case, he said.

McCollum said he thought other loophole-closing legislation he voted against was excessive and aimed at ending gun shows.

McCollum said he has backed gun rights, including seeking to repeal the assault weapons ban, because of the Second Amendment.

He has voted to ban armor-piercing bullets and plastic guns, which are invisible to metal detectors, because they pose a danger to law officers and to society, he said.

McCollum said he does not accept contributions from the National Rifle Association, the leading gun rights lobbying group.

## JAMES AND SARAH BRADY ENDORSE NELSON

*Country's leading gun-safety advocates target Nelson's opponent*

**MIAMI** - Florida Treasurer and Insurance Commissioner Bill Nelson today won the endorsement of the country's leading gun-safety advocates, Sarah Brady, and her husband James, the former White House press secretary seriously wounded in the 1981 assassination attempt on President Ronald Reagan.

The couple came to Miami today to endorse Nelson on behalf Handgun Control Inc., which is chaired by Sarah Brady. Nelson is the leading candidate in the race for the U.S. Senate seat from Florida, and is running against Republican Bill McCollum.

"Bill Nelson will bring common-sense values to Washington to make our country safer," James Brady said today at a news conference in Miami. "Triggerman McCollum has done more than any member of Congress to undermine gun-safety laws."

Brady is especially well known and respected here, where officials in Miami-Dade County just adopted an ordinance requiring gun locks for firearms that could be within children's reach. The law's passage met with criticism from the National Rifle Association (NRA) and similar groups, but was supported by Brady and his wife.

On Monday, Brady cited Nelson's support of trigger locks to keep guns out of the hands of kids, and his advocacy for a waiting period for criminal background checks on purchasers of handguns as well as a ban on certain assault weapons.

While McCollum tries to portray himself as a supporter of gun control, Brady said, the archconservative legislator voted against gun-safety legislation named after Brady himself, the so-called Brady bill requiring a waiting period.

McCollum also voted against the repeal of the assault weapons ban and armor piercing bullets. And more recently, he sponsored an NRA-backed bill that exempts small gun shows from waiting periods on handgun sales.

Besides gun-safety advocates, Nelson has scooped up endorsements from many of the country's major law enforcement groups. These include sheriffs, the Florida Police Benevolent Association and the National Association of Police Organizations.

Nelson's visit to Miami will be followed this week with campaign travel to Fort Lauderdale, Orlando, Pinellas Park, West Palm Beach, Fort Myers, Sarasota and Tampa.

BRADYS BACK NELSON GUN CONTROL ACTIVISTS HELP CANDIDATE'S BID FOR  
U.S. SENATE

Keep smiling, get the right people for the right issues - and never let the other guy get away from his record.

That's been Bill Nelson's strategy in trying to pry Florida's open Senate seat from the Republican Party. On Monday, the issue was guns, the names were Jim and Sarah Brady and the talk was all about GOP candidate Bill McCollum's voting record on guns.

Nelson, who faces a closely contested campaign for U.S. Senate, staged a short media conference in Miami with Jim Brady, the former White House press secretary who was shot and seriously injured in a 1981 assassination attempt on President Reagan.

Brady and his wife, Sarah Brady, chairwoman of Handgun Control Inc., formally endorsed Nelson and strongly criticized GOP candidate Bill McCollum, who has an "archconservative" voting record on gun issues, they said.

"Make no mistake about it, Bill McCollum is extreme, not mainstream, on the issue of guns," Jim Brady said. "The gun lobby can always count on Bill McCollum to vote its way."

McCollum's campaign spokeswoman responded that Nelson has distorted McCollum's voting record in Congress. She painted McCollum, R-Longwood, as a mediator between the extreme left and right on gun issues.

"This is just another example of [Nelson] distorting his

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record," said Shannon Gravitte, McCollum's campaign spokeswoman. "McCollum supports common-sense gun legislation."

Gravitte said McCollum thrice voted against the Brady bill, which calls for a 5-day waiting period and background check before someone can purchase a handgun, because he favors a shorter waiting period.

Similarly, McCollum in 1998 voted against a bill to require a 5-day waiting period for gun-show sales and asked instead for a 3-day waiting period, Gravitte said. The gun-show bill failed.

Nelson advocates banning certain assault weapons and requiring trigger locks for handguns. He voted in favor of the Brady bill while in Congress.

Both campaigns seem to be focusing on the gun issue this week. Nelson seemed triumphant over getting the Bradys' endorsement. Today in Tampa, McCollum has planned an appearance with Elizabeth Dole, an unsuccessful candidate for the Republican presidential nomination who is seen as a gun-issue moderate in the Republican Party.

James S. Brady achieved a lifelong career goal with his appointment by President Ronald Reagan in January of 1981 to be Assistant to the President and White House Press Secretary. However, his service was interrupted on March 30, 1981, when John Hinckley attempted to assassinate the President, and shot both President Reagan, Mr. Brady, and two law enforcement officers. Although seriously wounded by the gunshot wound to the head, Mr. Brady remained the White House Press Secretary until the end of the Reagan Administration.

Since leaving the White House, Mr. Brady has spent much time lobbying with his wife Sarah, Chair of Handgun Control, Inc.(HCI), for stronger gun laws. On November 30, 1993, President Clinton signed the "Brady Bill", a bill named in Mr. Brady's honor, into law. The Brady law requires a national waiting period and background check on all handgun purchases through licensed dealers. Mr. Brady also serves on the Board of Trustees of the Center to Prevent Handgun Violence, HCI's sister organization, which is a 501 (3)(c) organization working to reduce gun violence through education, research, and legal advocacy. In addition, Mr. Brady serves as Vice Chairman of the National Head Injury Foundation as well as the Vice Chairman of the National Organization on Disability.

Prior to serving in the Reagan Administration, Mr. Brady was Spokesperson for the Office of the President-Elect and had served as Director of Public Affairs and Research for the Reagan-Bush Committee.

Mr. Brady's tenure in Washington began in 1973 when he moved from Chicago to serve as a Communications Consultant to a member of the U.S. House of Representatives. From late 1973 to 1975, he served as Special Assistant to the Secretary of Housing and Urban Development, which was followed by a position as the Special Assistant to the Director of the Office of Management and Budget from 1975 to 1976. He left OMB to serve as an Assistant to the Secretary of Defense from 1976 - 1977. He joined the Staff of Senator William V. Roth, Jr., (R-DE) in 1977, and left in 1979 to serve as Press Secretary to then-presidential candidate Gov. John Connally.



During 1961 - 62, Mr. Brady was a staff member in the Office of Senator Everett M. Dirksen, Minority Leader of the U.S. Senate. During the summer of 1962, he was an Honor Intern at the U.S. Department of Justice's Antitrust Division. Mr. Brady returned to Illinois, where he held the following positions: faculty member at Southern Illinois University, 1964 - 65; Assistant National Sales Manager and Executive Manager to the President, Lear-Seigler, 1965 - 66; Director of Legislation and Public Affairs for the Illinois State Medical Society, 1966 - 68; Whitaker and Baxter's Chicago Office Manager, 1968 - 69; Executive Vice President of James and Thomas Advertising and Public Relations, 1969 - 73.

Mr. Brady was born in Centralia, Illinois, August 29, 1940. He was graduated from the University of Illinois in 1962, where he earned a B.S. degree in Communications and Political Science.

Mr. Brady is the recipient of numerous honorary degrees. In addition, he received the Robert A. Taft Award for Outstanding Service to the Republican Party, the Significant Sigma Chi Award, and the Distinguished Eagle Award from the Boy Scouts of America. He and Mrs. Brady were the 1990 recipients of the Advancement of Communications Award given by the Annenberg Washington Program. He and Mrs. Brady were recipients of the Lenore and George W. Romney Citizen Volunteer Award. The Bradys were presented with the John W. Gardner Leadership Award by Independent Sector. In 1996, The Secretaries of State awarded Mr. and Mrs. Brady with the Margaret Chase Smith Award. The Jewish Community Relations Council of Greater Philadelphia presented the Bradys with the Jules Cohen Memorial Award. Mr. Brady was the recipient of the Lincoln Award for being a "National Hero".

On February 11, 2000, President Clinton officially named the White House Press Briefing Room "the James S. Brady Press Briefing Room" in Jim Brady's honor. A plaque honoring Mr. Brady for his service as White House Press Secretary now hangs in the room.

Mr. Brady and his wife, the former Sarah Kemp, reside in Delaware with their son, Scott. Mr. Brady also has a daughter, Melissa.

### **Robb Renews Commitment to Assault Weapons Ban**

(Arlington) Senator Chuck Robb today received the endorsement of Jim and Sarah Brady, and renewed his commitment to the ban on assault weapons.

At a rally for gun safety in Arlington today, Robb pledged to vote in favor of the assault weapons ban when it comes before the Senate for renewal in 2004. The ban, which was enacted on September 13, 1994, will expire on that date in 2004.

Jim Brady, the former White House Press Secretary wounded in the assassination attempt on President Reagan, endorsed Robb for his commitment to the ban and denounced George Allen for his opposition. "We need Senators who will make sure that law stays in effect," Brady told Robb during the rally. "We can count on you to do that. We can't count on George Allen. Repealing the assault weapons ban is a top priority for the gun lobby. And with George Allen, their wish is his command."

Brady's wife Sarah, who serves as chair of Handgun Control, Inc., also endorsed Robb for his approach to gun safety. "We have always been able to count on Senator Robb to do the right thing for American children and American families. He works endlessly to make Virginia a leader in gun safety and he refuses to bow to the NRA. If Virginia elects George Allen what we've worked so hard for over the years could disappear," she said.

"I've been in war. I know an AK47 for what it is – a weapon of war," Robb told the crowd. "Weapons of war have no place on our streets or in our schoolyards or in communities anywhere in America. And no brave law enforcement officer should have to be outgunned by an assault weapon in the dark of night."

"But when it comes to something as common sense as getting combat style assault weapons off our streets, George Allen said no," Robb continued. "More than a year before the federal ban was enacted, George Allen said he didn't support any additional restrictions on semiautomatic weapons."

"My friends, I will end today with this promise," Robb concluded. "When legislation to renew the assault weapons ban comes before the United States Senate in 2004, I will vote yes."

WASHINGTON, D.C. - Today, on behalf of the Handgun Control Voter Education Fund, Jim and Sarah Brady endorsed Chuck Robb for re-election to the United States Senate. Standing before the Arlington, Virginia, County Courthouse, the two longtime gun safety advocates praised Senator Robb for his unwavering support for common sense gun laws and compared his strong record of leadership on gun safety to the dubious one of his opponent, former Virginia Governor George Allen.

"This election - and this Senate seat - matter on the issue of preventing gun violence," said Sarah Brady. "Senator Robb voted for the Brady Bill, voted for the assault weapons ban, and voted to make America a safer place. Throughout his tenure in the Senate, Chuck Robb has been aggressively working to protect the people of Virginia and the people of this great nation from the scourge of gun violence. Jim Brady, former press secretary to President Ronald Reagan and the man for whom the Brady Bill is named, stressed the importance of this Senate race in the fight to reduce gun violence. We can't count on George Allen."

enforcement discretion from the process of issuing licenses to carry hidden handguns in most public places. Allen also offered an amendment to remove the prohibition on carrying handguns where alcohol was served. Furthermore, in 1997, Allen vetoed a bill that would have kept guns out of recreation centers in Fairfax County. Little wonder that the Washington Post wrote, "Given the Governor's lead role in a movement to establish Virginia as Holster Heaven, it is no surprise that he locked arms with leaders of the National Rifle Association..." (March 27, 1997).

"This election matters because George Allen says it's okay to bring deadly weapons into recreation centers," said Mrs. Brady. "How can allowing firearms into recreation centers keep our children safe? If George Allen wants to send guns into recreation centers in Virginia, I can't imagine what he will do for our country. Chuck Robb, on the other hand, shows tremendous leadership when he stands up to the gun lobby and he does so time after time."

## Jim and Sarah Brady endorse Robb; Allen touts record to sheriffs

ARLINGTON, Va. (AP) - Gun-control advocates Jim and Sarah Brady jumped into Virginia's U.S. Senate race Tuesday, endorsing Democratic incumbent Charles S. Robb at a gun-control rally.

Earlier, Republican challenger George Allen spoke to the Virginia Sheriffs' Association convention in Virginia Beach, touting his "record of accomplishment" on crime during his four-year term as governor.

Brady, the White House press secretary confined to a wheelchair since he was shot during an assassination attempt on President Reagan in 1981, said Robb must be re-elected because he'll vote to extend the ban on assault weapons that expires in 2004.

Robb, he said, "has always made gun violence prevention a top priority. George Allen is one of the best friends the (National Rifle Association) has ever had."

Robb said his support for an assault weapons ban didn't need justifying.

"I've been a Marine. I've been in war and I have faced an AK-47. I know what an AK-47 is meant to do. It is a weapon of war. And weapons of war have no place in our community," he told several hundred supporters outside the Arlington County Courthouse.

Allen spokesman Tim Murtaugh said Tuesday that Allen also would vote to extend the ban on assault weapons.

Mike Lane, chairman of the Arlington County Republican Committee, attended the rally and said "the fact that Chuck Robb is campaigning in September in Arlington shows that he's in trouble in northern Virginia," which is Robb's home base.

Robb said he simply attended the rally because it was close enough to Capitol Hill to do so without missing any legislative work.

"Once again they seem to misunderstand that I have a day job," Robb said.

In Virginia Beach, Allen told the sheriff's association that law enforcement would remain a priority for him if he is elected to the Senate.

He said Virginia's sheriffs helped him get reforms passed that made the state safer, such as abolishing parole, allowing juveniles who commit violent crimes such as rape or armed robbery to be tried as adults and increasing state funding to provide more sheriffs deputies.

"These are proven results and ideas that I want to bring to Washington," Allen said, adding his desire to focus on one of the chief causes of violent crime: illegal drugs.

Allen has proposed a federal anti-drug program, Project Drug Exile, that would be modeled after Project Exile, a federal-state crackdown on illegal possession of guns that began as an experiment in Richmond. The program would include tougher penalties, treatment and education.

Allen also said he has proposed a \$150 million initiative that would encourage states to collect DNA samples from all convicted felons and share the information with the FBI. It also would help states reduce a backlog of DNA samples awaiting analysis, he said.

Thank you for coming today. It's always a privilege for me to be with Jim and Sarah Brady. They constantly remind me that a single individual armed with courage and conviction really can change the world. Jim and Sarah, as a fellow Virginian, I'm personally grateful for all you've done to make the world that Lynda and I and our three daughters inhabit safer.

Ladies and gentlemen, I'm here today to talk about an issue that is of enormous importance to mothers and fathers in Virginia, and, indeed, to all those who seek an end to gun violence in our nation -- and that is the enactment of reasonable, common sense gun safety laws.

Jim and Sarah, I was proud to cosponsor the Brady Bill, which has already prevented over 536,000 felons, fugitives and stalkers from purchasing firearms in America. Since then, I've voted to extend the Brady Bill to guns sold over the Internet. And last year, I cast a critical vote to require background checks at gun shows. If I'd voted the other way, that amendment would have been defeated. While the bill may not make it out of Congress this year, much to my dismay, that provision could have prevented the sale of the guns used in the Columbine High School shootings last year -- and it shows the power of a single vote for responsible gun safety laws in the U.S. Senate.

To prevent six year olds from shooting each other in first grade classrooms, I've voted to require that trigger locks be sold with all new handguns. To stop gun trafficking, I've cosponsored legislation to limit gun purchases to one gun per month. Just like we do in Virginia.

In 1993, knowing that I would pay the price in Virginia during a very difficult election the next year against Oliver North, I voted for a ban on assault weapons. I'd been a Marine. I'd been in war. I had faced AK-47's. I knew an AK-47 for what it is -- a weapon of war. Weapons of war have no place on our streets or in our school yards or in communities anywhere in America. And no brave law enforcement officer should have to confront being outgunned by an assault weapon in the dark of night.

But when it comes to something as common sense as getting combat style assault weapons off



our streets, George Allen said no. More than a year before the federal ban was enacted, George Allen said he didn't support any additional restrictions on semiautomatic weapons.

This should not come as a surprise to anyone, because George Allen has held back, opposed, delayed and vetoed legislation that would keep weapons out of the hands of felons and children.

George Allen opposed waiting periods. He opposed the Brady Bill. He opposed limiting gun purchases to one gun per month. With the stroke of a pen, he signed legislation that would make it easier to carry concealed weapons. With the stroke of a pen, he vetoed bipartisan legislation that would have banned guns from police stations and recreation centers in Fairfax County.

George Allen said that the Brady Bill was "a gimmick". Well, that "gimmick", George, has stopped more than 536,000 people who have no business having a gun from buying one. That's more than a half a million criminals who couldn't purchase weapons to prey on our citizens and stalkers who couldn't purchase a weapon to terrorize women.

Earlier this year, George Allen said that the assault weapons ban was "toothless". Well, during the first eight months of 1995 - the ban was enacted in September, 1994 - there was an 18% drop in assault weapons traced to crimes. I don't think the men and women and children of America who were spared being the victims of those 18 percent of crimes that were never committed would ever call this law "toothless."

My friends, I will end today with this promise: when legislation to renew the assault weapons ban comes before the United States Senate in 2004, I will vote yes.

And when it comes to taking a stand on this critical issue, I hope that George will abandon his reluctance to oppose these weapons of war. They have no business on Virginia's streets. He should concede that the ban has worked. And again, I am committed to supporting the renewal of the assault weapons ban legislation. It is unquestionably the right thing to do.

# Candidates skirmish on gun ban

*Answering Robb, Allen  
vows to let law stand*

U.S. Sen. Charles S. Robb, D-Va., opened an aggressive offensive yesterday against challenger George Allen, spotlighting the Republican's opposition to a federal ban on assault weapons.

Just hours later, Allen broke with his allies in the gun lobby and abandoned his resistance to the ban, saying he would vote to continue the law if elected.

Robb, at a news conference in Arlington County, was endorsed by gun-control advocates James and Sarah Brady. He pledged to back extension in 2004 of a federal law outlawing 19 specific assault-style weapons.

After hoisting an assault rifle as a prop, Robb said, "When it comes to something as common sense as getting combat-style assault weapons off our streets, George Allen said no."

But later yesterday, the Allen cam-

paign issued a statement in which the Republican said, "I have taken a position that I would not repeal the existing ban. Therefore logically I would vote to continue the existing law."

Allen's views evolved in a fashion parallel to his thinking on Virginia's one-handgun-a-month proposal, an Allen spokesman said.

Allen opposed that proposal before he became governor, but once in office "saw it wasn't doing any great harm, so he did not attempt in any way to repeal that law," spokesman Tim Murtaugh explained.

"This is the difference between George Allen and Chuck Robb: the difference between principle and ideology," Murtaugh added.

Allen said in 1993 he would not support any further restrictions on the ability of law-abiding citizens in Virginia to buy semi-automatic weapons.

In May of this year, Allen aides said the former governor saw the federal ban as a "toothless" law that doesn't truly tackle getting illegal guns off the street.

Robb campaign manager James F. Mulhall Jr. said of Allen's reversal, "It would be humorous; it would be downright funny about George Allen's flexible positions on public policy. But one has to question his center of gravity if he can't make up his mind and keep it on something so fundamental as keeping machine guns off Virginia streets."

Also yesterday, the Democratic Party of Virginia unveiled another 30-second television commercial attacking Allen's education record. Conversely, the state

Republican Party, on Allen's behalf, began an ad criticizing Robb's record on Social Security.

The Democrats' spot features a former university president with close ties to Republican business leaders.

In the ad, George W. Johnson, president of fast-growing George Mason University from 1978 to 1996, says, "I know George Allen's record on education, and I want you to know the facts." Johnson goes on to say, "Even Republicans said Allen's cuts in education went too far."

The new Republican ad attacks Robb's record on Social Security and promotes Allen's Social Security views.

A variation of two previous ads attacking Robb, the ad criticizes Robb, then says that Allen,

while governor, signed into law a bill that repealed Virginia taxes on Social Security benefits and signed two other bills that benefited older Virginians.

The ad concludes:

"He [Allen] wants a Lock-Box to stop politicians from raiding Social Security.

"Chuck Robb's record? ... higher taxes."

Spokesmen for each campaign criticized the ads targeted at their candidate. The double-barreled Democratic assault on Allen could have particular appeal in Northern Virginia, where polls show voters strongly supporting additional education funding as well as restrictions on guns — issues on which the Republican is considered vulnerable.

With the latest Democratic

Party ad — the third run on Robb's behalf and subsidized by the Democratic Senatorial Campaign Committee — the senator's allies have spent nearly \$2 million on television commercials attacking Allen on taxes, the environment and education.

Robb has yet to dip into his campaign treasury to pay for broadcast advertising.

Allen alone has spent about \$1 million on TV spots. The National Republican Senatorial Committee has contributed another \$1 million or more to the air wars.

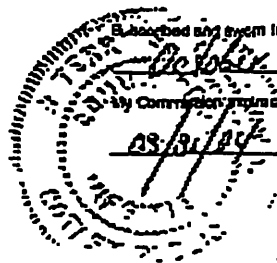
